The old, old story so off repeated and yet with repetition losing none of its rejuvenating quality-is so alluring and so beautiful-

"Now upon the first day of the week, very early in the morning. they came unto the sepulchre . . . And they found the stone rolled away from the sepulchre. And they entered in, and found not the body of Jesus. And it came to pass, as they were much perplexed thereabout, behold two men stood by them in shining garments . . . They said unto them. Why seek ve the living among the dead? He is not here, but is risen.

What makes the oft-told story so beautiful and so alluring? Is it not because the great Truth is so ingenuously given that it fails to offend gross mortal sense? It is the truth that the sons and daughters of men do not die and there are no dead.

A Cloud of Witnesses

I know, verily, that there are literally millions who ask for and earnestly believe in a very different interpretation of this story. Verily, it is the age-old struggle between old ideas and the new. But for me the story's enrichment is that none die.

Betrayed by Judas, denied by Peter, deserted by the Apostles and all whom he had greatly loved and to whom he had ministered. Jesus was condemned, crucified. Joseph of Arimathaea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus and carried the body to a new tomb he had prepared for himself, and Nicodemus brought myrrh and aloes to embalm it. Then--

Very early on the Sunday while it was yet dark" — Mary Magdalene, greatest of all women lovers but despised by libertines and hypocrites, hastened to the eleven Apostles who in fear and trembling had fled-hastened with the story that was wonderful. Her heart was overflowing with awe and love and gladness; she told them the stone had been rolled away from the tomb. They could not believe what they had heard. Loving little Mary stood sobbing outside the tomb. But in spite of her grief. I think she must have understood-her heart told her! She got a glimpse of that which we all are just now beginning to know—there is no death!

Yes, it IS a wonderful story, and it has beauty, but we get that which is far more lovely-wonderful as beauty is-from that great thing that was written at the tomb. where loving little Mary stood

Spiritualists have got an inkling of that part which is true, knowing it is possible for a body to dematerialize in an instant.

But a far more wonderful part is the coming back of Jesus. It is not too great a miracle for The Survivalists to bear: they know of too many instances in which men and women have risen from the dead! I say it not in lack of reverence for The Master, but in gratitude and love that he pointed

They Cannot Understand

It takes not from his divinity that others, too, have materialized. For his signs and wonders were for us all to understand; and his mighty works become so simple and understandable in the light of what we in modern times have misnamed Spiritualism.

And, behold, two of them went that same day to a village called Emmaus: and they talked together of all things which had happened. And it came to pass, that, while they communed together and reasoned. Jesus himself drew near and went with them . . . And . . . as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, and blessed it, and brake, and gave to them.

And their eyes were opened, and they knew him: and he vanished out of their sight.

Will we--can't we--ever, ever understand? In his little book. "That Reminds Me," Ernest Oaten tells us that he has seen a materialized individual eat food and after the spirit had vanished there was not the slightest trace of food!

Miracles are happening every day - in New York and London

and elsewhere-and still we will not believe even though one rose from the dead. What ails the sons and daughters of men that they will not, perhaps because they can not, understand? Is it because truth is so simple and obvious? I am awaiting the answer as to why they do not see the truth: I have waited long years.

Mount of Olives

Jesus came to earth many times after his crucifixion. That is the wonderful and beautiful part. His coming back is resplendent truth. "He appeared to Peter, to the eleven, to five hundred disciples at once, to James, to all the apostles. and to me also," observes St. Paul. Luke declares, "With abundant proofs he showed himself to them ALIVE AFTER HIS DEATH."

Jesus kept coming back under varying conditions that he might give ample proof that there is no death for him or for any son of man. The final manifestation was to his disciples on the Mount of Olives, where he was received up into heaven and where a cloud withdrew him from their sight. That was the final glorious achievement that has been emulated by others even in this day of disbelief and confusion and wars.

Resurrection Misunderstood

Nothing, indeed, can defeat the life principle. Even in gross earth life the divine spark remains supreme. For millions of years life was threatened by climatic changes, lack of food, ferocity of beast and fellow-creatures. Heat, cold. flood. drought and earthquake have no power over the lifeprinciple. We have struggled upward, stage by stage. Wars and cataclysms are only a challenge to

If it is not possible to extinguish the spark within the soul in earth-struggles, how much more so shall we march invincible beyond those portals men call death! I tell you, these impulses and urges of life are inexhaustible. We are not born to die but to live.

The Resurrection of The Christ is a beautiful illustration that shows us what we may do in our own lives. There is a resurrection for all beyond and also here. For life is filled with pulsating energy. Hear the command of The Christ: "Arise! Come forth from the tomb." And we must obey.

Where Is Your Faith?

Let us give heed then to that Voice that speaks with authority and power. Roll away the stone of misconception and ignorance. You, too, can arise with the Risen Christ. Cast away that fear! And when you do. faith comes.

Stop talking about your plagues. Roll away those stones that The Christ within you may arise. Look about you at Nature-is this which I tell you not the manner of all life? Plants and flowers and shrubs and trees toil not, neither do they spin-they grow. And in the act of growth they gain faith.

The Christ is indeed calling to this age. He is calling to you. Consciously live in the power of the resurrection of Spirit. Lilies and all accept the resurrection of life. Can you not also? Where is thy faith?

It is natural to have faith in God or gods, natural to worship, to believe in angels and spirits. Bearing in memory all my travels. all the monuments, ruins, inscriptions, shrines and Bibles I have seen. I count them as dross-poor perishable dross-when compared with the tiny Rochester rap, that echo of eternal life, demonstrating beyond the vestige of a doubt that momentous fact, of a future conscious existence.

Modern Spiritualism

Modern Spiritualism was not a modern invention by either spirit or mortal, but a discovery—the rediscovery of a fact, old in one sense, as Babylonia or Akkadia, ancient as the faded ages of remotest antiquity.

And this Spiritualistic discovery. this mighty modern movement now in a measure known throughout all enlightened lands. did not spring into birth full-grown like Minerva from Jupiter's brain. It was feeble at first.

It is young yet, but though young as compared with other religions, it is pregnant with divine truth and afire with infinite possi-

Seven years before the Hydesville manifestations, similar phenomena appeared among the Shakers. They continued for three years. These were so overwhelming at times in the line of mysterious noises, trances, visions and prophecies, and so exciting to those outside the Believers' fold, that they were obliged to close their meeting houses from the public.

They were thought to be going mad, and there was raised the old cry of witch-craft. The spirits prophesied at this time, through

the Shaker mediums, that these manifestations would soon go out into the world, and would spread to every hamlet and city, island and continent of the globe. This prophecy has been literally fulfilled.

Christianity started from a dream (Matt. 1:20)—Spiritualism from a mystic rap. Angels and spirits were the potent forces behind both the dream and the rap.

The mightiest results often flow from seemingly the minutest causes.

How small an upset lamp: yet. Chicago was lain in ashes: how small to the physical eye Newton's apple, yet there lay the hidden law that held suns and stars in their circling orbits.

How small Stevenson's puff of steam, yet now railways and ocean steamers girdle the globe: how insignificant to proud. imperial Rome was Mary's babe in that Bethlehem manger, yet there lay concealed divine causes that in less than three hundred years shook the Roman empire to its very center. and planted the cross as a crown of promise in every civilized land.

Easter Morning

So, that little half-muffled sound. that gentle telegraphic Hydesville tapping in 1848, like a messengerbird with good tidings of light and love from the heretofore dark lands of tombs, came with messages of holy memories from the loved, and startled the world!

It was the Easter morning of this century, the golden dawn of a new dispensation. the dispensation of spirit demonstrations and angelic ministries. of freedom from churchal confessions, from medieval superstitions and from human slaveries. It prophecied of woman's equality with man and withal, it inspired or instituted the great social, political and national reforms that have in the past de-

WARPEACE?

Nations must not expect peace until they can apply the basic truth of Brotherhood of Man.

Human evolution is very slow. According to philosophical authorities the human race as a whole is several millions of years behind its scheduled spiritual progress. This state of affairs is the result of man not being able yet to perceive and to understand the Light of Truth and apply it in his daily

In the long history of the world. when a Truth is presented to the masses, which Truth decries the old and asks for a new conception of life, a broader mind outlook and the expansion of soul consciousness, man refuses to go forward. He sticks tenaciously to the old ways of life and revolts attacking the light bearers of the new. This condition is the cause of many wars, suffering, bigotry and strife among the members of the great human family

One of the basic Truths which man is still unable to understand is that of the Brotherhood of mankind.

The First Plan for Peace

The Spiritual Guides of the destinies of mankind in the 6th century B.C., tried a great step towards the realization of this great Truth by the masses. Several men of the highest spiritual advancement, philosophers. world reformers and teachers were sent in all parts of the world to teach this great Truth and show the example by their life.

Thus, in China we had Confucius and Lao Tse. In Persia, Zoroaster and in India Gautama Buddha taught the same Truth. In Egypt we see the high priests of the temples of Thebes. Sais and Heliopolis, and in Greece, Pytha-

Of all these contemporary spiritual leaders and world reformers. Pythagoras proved to be the most esourceful, the most determined. practical and brilliant leaders and the greatest scientist at the same time. He set out to apply this great Truth of the Brotherhood of man among the Greek race by es-

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tablishing his famous philosophical School and Pythagorean Society at Crotona, in Magna Graecia.

This community was the first of its kind to be founded, in which all members were living as brothers, studying, working and living together, sharing all worldly things, in this first communal system of life and of government in the world.

The Plan Failed

The Pythagorean University and Brotherhood a Crotona during its thirty years of existence produced a galaxy of thinkers and philosophers of first magnitude upon whose knowledge, wisdom and spiritual progress all modern civilization is based.

For all those thirty years, the Pythagorean system of government and of life were responsible for peace, progress, happiness and spiritual enfoldment enjoyed by the Greek Nation as a whole. This progress was interrupted by the revolt of the masses drunk by greed, violence and ignorance breaking all refrains of discipline.

From that time on until now. dissatisfaction, greed, bigotry, fanaticism, poverty in the middle of plenty, unhappiness and war, are the lot of humanity. Thus the great plan and attempt of the Divine Providence through Its messengers failed.

The Final Plan for Peace

About seventy-five years ago. another attempt has started and was put into operation, but this time the plan was more drastic and decisive. The grade has to be made by humanity at any price. This time besides the spreading of knowledge to the four corners of the world, countless inventions were sent to man. The most important of all for this purpose being those of airplane and radio.

In this way the elimination of all existing distances was effected. Thus the world has become a very small place for all nations, races and peoples to live in.

Under the present conditions the Divine plan is clear. The world's situation today likens a group of persons of several types beliefs and temperaments living in one and the same house. FEW KNOW ABOUT MIND AND SPIRIT OF MAN

THIS week we Spiritualists celebrate the ninety-seventh anniversary of the Hydesville rappings. which called the attention of the world to the fact that personal communication between the spirit world and this. was not only a possibility, but could be placed upon a substantial and orderly scientific basis.

It is a common fallacy to suppose that this incident was the beginning of Modern Spiritualism. For several years prior to the event a band of spirits, which included "Galen." Emmanuel Swedenborg and other historic personages, had taken charge of the mediumship of Andrew Jackson Davis. and were pouring the spiritual philosophy through his lips.

Davis was an uneducated country boy of 18, but the wealth of cultured languages, knowledge of history, of scientific law, and philosophic principles contained in his trance utterances, made his published works one of the wonders of the literary world.

He has well been called the John the Baptist of Modern Spiritual-

The "Good Work" Begins

It would appear that in the counsels of the unseen world, a real and concerted attempt was made to convey the teaching of Spiritualism to the world on philosophic and spiritual lines through Davis without the use of phenom-

They attempted to appeal to the mind and spirit of man rather than to his curiosity and wonderment. But it was a materialistic age. The treasures of the mind and spirit did not appeal to any but the cultured few.

And so. in March. 1818, came the outbreak of physical phenomena. That the work of Davis and

FLO COTTRELL, the rapping medium, does not live in the Fox Cottage during the winter months. She resides at Holland, N. Y. (30 miles south of Buffalo). She was unable to be present at this celebration.

Modern Spiritualism had a humble beginning. Through the mediumship of the Fox Sisters, the tin box on the table (see above) was found in the cellar. It was buried with the peddler who was murdered for the few notions and trinkets it contained. By deciphering a tedious code used when spirit raps were heard, the box, which is the original, was found.

According to history, the people at that time were satisfied that this startling demonstration proved conclusively that personal consciousness not only survives but also can, under certain conditions, administer proof positive that intelligent spirit communication is possible.

Consider Spirit's Viewpoint

When I look at the results and note the large number of people to whom Spiritualism is merely a mass of sensational phenomena. and note the selfish and materialistic uses made of these phenomena by individuals who have not sufficient spiritual life to see in them anything more than wonderment and entertainment, I am inclined to share the regrets of those great originals at the necessity of presenting the facts of the larger best aspect.

We too often fail to consider the matter of intercommunion from the standpoint of the spirit people. We consider our own point of view-our own satisfaction, but do we give sufficient attention to the other side of the problem?

Our mentors and inspirers are living in a world which is being peopled by those who enter it from here. The quality of the life over there is largely determined by the continuous flow of emigrants who pass through the gate from this world.

What Do Spirits Do?

They all have to be met: the unruly have to be controlled: the ignorant educated: the crude polished; the selfish purified; the sick in mind nursed back to health: the immature nurtured and trained; the creedbound released from their bonds, and the wilful taught the value of co-operation!

And we sometimes have the effrontery to ask: "What do they do in the spirit world?"

Looking at the matter from our own limited standpoint, we emphasize the fact that our loved sorrow, to comfort our hearts and influence our lives.

Of course they do! But that's a small and personal aspect. There must be over there administrators and directors who have to take the larger view of the wellbeing of the many communities: and the continual influx of newcomers must be very disturbing to the harmony of these bodies.

Have you ever thought that the gates of communion were opened not by a few small people of limited outlook, but rather by a council of great minds, striving to find some method of improving the type of people continuously passing into their world and disturbing its harmonious and smooth working?

Add to Their Joy

To illumine men's minds concerning spiritual verities, to improve character by the inculcation of a sense of responsibility. to help to curb selfishness and the brute instincts of men by teaching the necessity of personal discipline and self-control would result in an improved class of immigrants. Hence the original appeal to the mind and spirit of man.

The direct appeal was ignored and phenomena were resorted to as a half-way house to draw attention to the fact of a spirit world in the hope that the recognition of that fact would induce men to consider the necessity of fitting themselves to enjoy its simplicity.

Not by prayers and fastings and religious observances, but by types of effort which will unfold their innate powers, expand their minds and enlarge their field of service.

Spiritualism only accomplishes its true purpose when it improves character, increases usefulness: expands our knowledge and makes us better citizens here, as a prelude to the citizenship of the here-

Let us view our ninety-seventh anniversary from this aspect: then shall we add to the joy of our invisible companions.

MY EARLY PSYCHIC EXPERIENCES

SCIENTISTS CALL IT "Multiple-Personality" "Split-Personality" "Alter-Ego"

"He's a very strange child," my mother often confided to her friends. "He has an imaginary playmate that he calls by the ridiculous name of Pepper.

Mother's discussion of me and my "imaginary" playmate Pepper disturbed me not at all. Pepper to me was a very real little boy who came every day and many nights to visit and play with me.

From whence he came and whither he went I questioned not. possibly because it did not occur to me to question. Pepper has grown up with me. I've seen and talked to him all my life. He is my spirit collaborator.

Many modern psychologists will tell me that Pepper is my own "alterego." that he has no existence other than being one-half of my own "split-personality" or one phase of my own "multiple-personality."

Born in Huntington

To me, these statements are much more far fetched than Pepper's own simple statement that he is a spirit being: that he "died" in 1911 at the age of one year, that he was allowed to visit me: that he has grown to manhood in the spirit world just as I grew to manhood in the physical world.

Perhaps there are such things as split personalities and multiple personalities but who can say, in the face of the massive pile of evidence, both ancient and modern. that there is no such thing as intercourse with spiritual beings?

In 1916, when I was six years old, a remarkable phenomenon of strange lights in the sky startled and puzzled my home town of Huntington. West Virignia.

I was with my family out in the yard watching these lights when a force which I did not understand struck me to the ground.

A voice, which I shall never forget, spoke in my ear, "Be not afraid. little boy, you're not hurt. I am your teacher."

Table Tilting

Not until years later did I learn his name. It is Dr. Albert Las-

celles. He is my spiritual teacher. The first manifestation of my physical mediumship occurred when I was eight years of age. My sister Georgia was entertaining some friends one evening when the subject of 'table-tilting" was introduced.

Thereupon the young people determined immediately to try an experiment. A small round table was placed in the center of the room and all present except me placed their hands upon it. Nothing happened.

When the (as now I know usual) comment was, "I didn't believe it could, anyhow." I went to the table and touched it lightly. Instantly the table began vio-

lently rocking back and forth, then literally shot across the room as if a very powerful man had flung it. My mother later rescued me from under the sofa.

Needless to say, after that the young people of the neighborhood kept me busy "making the table walk," to answer their questions by tilting once for "no." twice for "yes." three times for uncertain

and four times a call for the alphabet.

The questions most usually asked were, "Who will I marry?": Does my sweetheart love me? and "Will I ever be rich?"

These adolescent questions were sometimes answered and sometimes disregarded. I'm sure the guides often had their tongues in their cheeks.

When I Was 11

This phase of mediumship lasted only a short time and was stopped by Dr. Lascelles who explained that it was harmful for a youngster to exercise physical mediumship for any extended period of time.

From nine to fourteen my mediumship was dormant except for the regular visits of Pepper and the occasional presence of Dr. Las-

When in my fourteenth year, my spirit teacher led me to the occult and Spiritualistic section of the public library I was in ecstacy. From then on I read everything I could get my hands on. from Hudson's "Law of Psychic Phenomena" to Blavatsky's "Secret Doc-

I read "Golden Bough" and knew that, with all his erudition.

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Frazer had missed the point as far as ancient magic was concerned I read Sales' translation of the Koran and prayed to Allah on a parlor throw rug.

I read "The Lives of the Saints" and burned candles before a home made crucifix. I read a poor treatise on Yogi and sat crosslegged breathing through first one nostril then the other.

What I Learned

My reading was unorthodox and voluminous. A lot of it was undoubtedly beyond my depth, but with Dr. Lascelles' wise and patient guidance. I learned.

I learned I was a spirit existant in eternity, manifesting in a physical world in a physical body which was not me but mine.

I learned that God was not an old man in some far-off heaven but Universal Spirit that was all containing yet uncontained.

I learned how man in the spirit world and man in the earth world communicate with one another.

I learned that my psychical experiences were duplicated and far surpassed in times past and pres-

I learned to feel a kinship to all those who had seen visions of the after-death home. I LEARNED 1 WAS A MEDIUM.

cades brightened the moral horizon of this century.

As in the historic past women were last at the cross and first at the tomb; so in this century, women—the Fox Sisters—were the first to discover the new alphabet; that, cabling the ocean of doubt and bridging the river of death, enabled mortals and immortals to stand consciously face to face, reclasping hands and reaffirming their undying loves. The stone was now forever rolled away from the doom of the sepulcher.

Upon the ushering in of this dispensation there were no Sinai thunders, no terrific earthquakes. no darkening of the sun, or other strange mythic miracles. Neither did any graves give up their dead, for there were no dead in them.

The tombs there, and the tombs of the agone ages were all empty. The pronounced dead had risen. Their white feet were pressing the evergreen shores of life, and their inspired tongues were musical with the resurrection songs of immortality.

Not Supernatural

Nature's chain has no missing links. Law is as continuous as immutable. Cause and effect, father and son, the old and the new. ever in continuity clasp hands. The good of the old-time remains, the truth never dies. There are no dead today.

Spiritualism, as tangibly as absolutely, demonstrates it. Oh! death, where is thy sting? Oh! grave, where is thy victory?

Ring the bells of gladness, sound the loud timbrel, shout the chorus in one ascending, resounding anthem of joy: for death is conquered, priestcraft is uncovered, theology is proven worm-eaten, creeds are doomed, sin is checked, the devil is defeated, and the old-time hell is transfigured into Gehenna - gardens and vineyards where purpling grapes now grow in richest luxuriance.

A few years ago, I was in old Bethlehem near Jerusalem. Now I am in the new Bethlehem, Hydesville, near Rochester—the imperishable Bethlehem of this crowning century of science and progress. This is consecrated ground, consecrated and sacred to science, to brotherhood, to the immortality of divine truth, and to the matchless glories of present spirit ministries.

A Demonstrated Fact

This is truly an age of science, of profound research. And while investigation is indispensable to arrive at truth—while psychical research is an earnest move in the right direction, and while mere spiritism, accepting the fact of an intercommunion of this and of the world beyond, is a grand step upward from materialism. Spiritualism is a fact, an absolutely dem-

onstrated fact.

And more, it is a fact plus immortal truth, aflame with the suffix al, which suffix implies quality. a spiritual force, allied to and connected with conscience, reason, intuition, religion, prayer, inspiration, angel ministries, and a deeprooted spirituality, the fruits of which are love, joy, peace, kindness and good will to man.

Self-Evident Truths

All thinkers admit there are self-evident truth-axioms. That I exist is to me an axiom. The existence of space is another; the existence of God is still another. And the logic of true Spiritualism is this: God is spirit, self-conscious, pure, infinite, unchangeable; and man in his innermost being made in the image of God, is necessarily a conscious spiritual being.

Spiritual beings in all worlds, visible and invisible, just as naturally respond to and converse with each other through the electro-forces of nature and the vibratory laws of sympathy as music responds to music, or as love responds to love in noble human souls. There is one God, one eternity, one law, one humanity and one destiny for all aspirational human intelligences.

Abounds in Phenomena

Spiritualism is rooted in God. for God is spirit. It is grounded in Nature, for Nature is the garment of God. It is established in law. for law is the will of God manifest as energy and force. It is the science of all sciences, the philosophy of all philosophies, and the true wisdom-religion of all historic ages.

Spiritualism abounds in phenomena. The genuine are the cellar-wall foundations, the scaffolding by which the masses ascend. They have their uses. Materialists especially require them and more: they require a clap of thunder to arouse and inspire them to think above the ruts and miry fogs of a dreary material existence.

But Spiritualism does not rest alone upon, or center in, phenomena. It centers in essential Spirit, and is based upon the consciousness of the races, upon the emotions of a quickened nature, and upon the moral constitution of man, which constitution requires for sustenance, aspiration, vision, faith, trance, clairvoyance and heavenly impressions from the angel spheres of love and wisdom.

What Paul Said



graces: they open their seances with hymns and prayer, they are richly blessed with clairvoyant visions, and calm, up-lifting ministrations from the loved in heaven.

They walk in the spirit. They see in every pure, crystal stream a present Jordan, in every emerald clad mountain, a present Olivet, in every well-cultivated prairie a Canaan flowing with milk and honey, and they teach salvation by character, or by the life, as did Paul who said "Being reconciled we shall be saved by His life," (Rom. v:19).

The Spiritual Is the Real

It is not cold chilly matter, socalled, not sea-slime, nor protoplasm that constitutes the underlying infilling, basis of life, but spirit—that is to say, spiritual or divine substance. Spirituality is substantial reality. Much that seems real to the senses is only illusion.

Man is a spirit *now*—a spirit living in a material body, which body bears something of the same relation to the real, conscious, invisible man that the husk bears to the corn, or the bark to the growing tree.

Evidently man is a trinity in unity, constituted of a physical body, a spiritual body, and a conscious undying soul or spirit, which spirit is uncompounded, in-

destructible, divine substance - God in man.

Advanced spirits are denominated angels. Spirits are but men and women, divested of their mortal clothing. They are not authority. They are not perfect but have taken with them consciousness, memory, sympathy, character, and through the mystic laws of vibration and thought transference they delight to impress and inspire.

They walk by our sides often: and yet, unseen! Philosophically considered, there is but one world, and that one world embraces the yesterdays, the todays, and the innumerable tomorrows of eternity.

Spiritual marvels have appeared as rifts in the clouds, as lights upon the mountains, under all skies and in all past periods, assuming various forms of manifestations according to temperaments and racial developments. They were and are God's living witnesses of a future existence.

Cosmopolitan Spiritualism

To deny them is to plunge the world into the thickest mud of materialism. To counterfeit them, as certain professed mediums have done, exhibits the deepest, grossest and blackest deprayity.

Spiritualism is not local, but cosmopolitan, inspiring under some name alike Yogis, seers, prophets, oracles, and intermediaries in all lands. To this I bear the most positive testimony.

These manifestations were considered at different periods miracles, magic, apparitions, possessions, special providences, witcheraft, demons and angels. Their persistence, surviving the decay of thrones and empires, is according to Herbert Spencer, a palpable proof of their reality and of their moral value—only truth is immortal.

What Scientists Say

The learned Dr. Beard, physician, author, scientist and hypnotist of New York, strongly inclined toward materialism, declared that "Judge Edmonds" used to say that he sifted the evidence of spirit manifestations just as he sifted evidence in cases of law, and in accordance with the same principles, and from the standard of the law books and the universities his position was impregnable."

Camille Flammarion, the great French astronomer, said: "At least ten of the manifestations he witnessed through Eusapia Paladino" were incontestible. He further said:

Placing myself solely at the point of view of a physicist who observes. I say, no matter what explanatory hypothesis you might adopt, there exists an invisible force drawn from the medium's organism, which can leave her and act outside of her . . . Invisible, intelligent forces seem also to act in unison with hers, producing varied phenomena. Those pronounce themselves spirits, and what other explanation can be given?

Alfred R. Wallace, the eminent English naturalist and scientist, pointedly says: "My position, therefore, is that the phenomena of Spiritualism, in their entirety, do not require further confirmation. They are proved quite as well as any facts are proved in other sciences."

With the more intelligent scientists of this country, including *Edison*, the great inventor, the victory is won; and so Spiritualism proudly takes its place in the *Pantheon* of the sciences!...

No Miracles

It must be remembered, however, that these spiritual phenomena are not miracles in any such sense as the 17th century schoolmen defined them. They are not violations of the inexorable laws of nature, but the operations of higher natural laws than the masses comprehend. The supernatural, in fact, is the natural upon the spiritual plane of existence.

Spiritualism explains the philosophy and the various psychic methods of spirit intercourse. It has encouraged all the philosophic reforms of the age, and has given us a revised geography of the heavens and the hells—the higher and lower spheres of existence.

It has outlined the law of the progress of spirits, angels, archangels, seraphs and the still diviner intelligences that pass and repass to and fro from the planetary (Continued on Page 9, Col. 1)

In describing the cottage, Ripley called it "THE SPOOK HOUSE" but admitted the rappings were genuine, stating it was "a phenomenon that startled the world."

A nationally-known Movie-tone Weekly sent their representatives to Lily Dale in 1938 and in the process of their investigation, they were able to pick up the actual rapping sounds. Through the mediumship of FLO COTTRELL, raps were heard on the microphone. All the rapping sounds are made by Miss Cottrell's principal spirit collaborator, who prefers to be known as "UNCLE IKE."

mortals, must be known by their fruits: if they improve your health. enlarge your moral nature, lift you up spiritually, and beautify every characteristic of your higher nature accept them as messagebearers from the diviner life --but even then, be yourself!

"Karma" - Unnecessary Word

Mortals are moral agents, the architects of their own heavens or hells. They reap what they have sown, "Karma" is an unnecessary (Sanskrit) word, implying cause and effect-nothing more. Every child born into this world is a possible archangel or a possible demon: his head touches the world of light, his feet the world of darkness. He is a rational, moral being, having the power of choice.

> The angels call, and souls are constantly coming up through tribulation deep. God's love is infinite and unchangeable. The door of mercy is not shut: there is ever the opportunity of progress from darkness to light. None can be eternally lost.

"Good Morning"

Spiritualism does not say "good night" in the solemn hour of death. but rather gives the glad assurance of a most welcome "good morning." just across the crystal river. It does not drape the mourner's home in gloom, but lifts the grim curtain, permitting us to hear the responsive words of undying affection from those we love.

It would see no mourning garments worn, it would see none draped in crape, but would see at funerals only opening buds and blossoms and hear only resurrection songs of music.

It would see cemeteries made as beautiful as gardens and the groves of spring time, with wild briars twining around tombstones. and everything else that can remind us of the evergreen shores of immortality.

Oh! let us rejoice then, and be glad in these Easter days of Spiritualism, for they give life a new meaning and add millions of charms to the homes of our loved in heaven. They put new courage, new strength, new intelligence, new religious aspirations, new and sweeter devotions into our daily

Spiritualism the complement of true Christianity, beautifies the bitterest cup, helps bear the heaviest burdens. lightens the darkest day. comforts the saddest heart, and gathering up the kindly efforts we make in behalf of our fellowmen. transfigures them with its brightness and ennobles them with its moral grandeur.

I Was Called "Blasphemer"

Those of this generation know little of the persecutions, trials, and martyrdoms of those old pioneers of the Rochester-rapping days. They were called fanatics, heretics. madmen. They were mocked, slandered and hunted as though they were wild beasts. Some of the more mediumistic. like the Nazarene, had not where to lay their heads.

Personally, some forty years ago I had stones hurled at schoolhouses and halls in which I was lecturing. I was hooted in the streets: and once was mobbed by an infuriated sectarian crowd after an evening's discourse.

At another time, in Illinois, a church-woman rising in the audience rushed toward me, flourishing an umbrella over my head. and shouting. "You are a blasphemer! you are a wicked blasphemer!" And then slamming the door after her, hurriedly departed.

Antithesis of Materialism

Coolly, I replied. "How the chaff flies when the gospel fan blows."

In those early times of this movement, press and pulpit pronounced the phenomena "toejoints." "imagination" "secreted machinery." "detached portions of electricity." "the devil," and a "nine-days" wonder." And yet. right in the face of these oppositions and journalistic toe-joint expositions. Spiritualism marched

Spiritualism, the antithesis of materialism, was the heaven-inspired and angel-commissioned instrument for turning back the inflowing tide of materialism, and of demonstrating the fact of a future progressive life.

Reduced to the last analysis.-Spiritualism rests not upon any Bible, not upon any creed, any external authority or any phenomena: but upon the moral and spiritual constitution of man, upon reason, conscience and the soul's divinest intuitions.

Test Mediums and Platform Speakers

The phenomenalist and the great broad-minded leaders, all have their work. There should be no rivalry, only as to who will enlighten the most minds and bring the most polished stones to the divine temple of truth.

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Number One Hundred Fifty-seven March 25, 1945

speakers are indispensable. There is no virtue in ignorance. "Feed my sheep" was an old command. No dry stale food will do. It is neither digestible nor nourishing. Thirsty flocks rush to the living waters.

If spiritualist committees will employ worthy and cultured speakers and secure excellent music their edifices will be thronged each Sunday. The day for wretched discordant singing and dull ungrammatical illogical lectures through the sickly organisms of half-developed mediums in dusty. ill-ventilated cob - web - decorated halls is passing away. Bid it good hye, with gladness.

The number, the name of spiritualists, is legion; and they should rise to the occasion securing neat appropriate buildings. They should decorate the desks with roses and lilies, and consecrate the holy structure, to seances, lyceums, lectures and mediumistic gifts-saying. like a seer of old. "this is sacred ground."

And further, it is not wise to have the inspired speaker and the test medium upon the platform at the same time. They have each a different work to do. They have different auras, different spirit-influences and different purposes in view. These necessarily divide the sympathies of the people. Milk is good, and vinegar is good, but it is neither good nor wise to mix them in the same bowl.

Needs of Spiritualism

There is much work to be done. God, angels and ministering spirits help those who help themselves. There are pressing needs demanding the prompt attention of Spiritualists. They need more intellectual and moral culture, more harmony of action, and better music in their societies. They need to give more encouragement and financial support to progressive lyceums and the young people's social institutions.

They need more commodious and comfortable edifices, consecrated to and used only for lyceums. lectures. conferences, and seances. They need to pay more attention to organizing public circles so as to have a calm aspirational and religious element the predominating factor.

Eyes Upon Us

They need to be imbued with more of the fiery missionary spirit that characterized the old pioneers. They need more settled speakers, conscientious, cultured and apt to teach: and they need to have kindled in their soul's depths a diviner and loftier spirit of enthusiasm.

Such regal-souled missionaries and martyrs to truth have in all ages shaken the world, and crowned new dispensations with imperishable glory. Spiritualists, the eyes of all Christendom are upon you; do your duty."

In that same hour, and possibly at that same moment. Lawrence met his death on a lonely country road. He was flung violently over the handlebars of his motorcycle. and landed 60 feet away.

In addition, they are strangled by the curtailment of manpower. plus a thousand and one other difficulties which prevent a smooth running of business. Taking all these things into consideration, we feel our service has been reasonably good.

Many Books Out-of-print

We have received many letters of complaint and a few inquiries as to "why" papers have not arrived promptly, hence this explanation. At the same time, we shall also try to clarify a few other matters that cause complaints to reach our desk.

All mail in this section has been slowed up. Letters from some points in the country are often received ten days to two weeks after date of mailing. Such delays we simply cannot help but we can assure our customers that all book and merchandise orders are filled and shipped from this office the

same day they are received. As a rule, if we do not have a book in stock, or if for any reason an order is delayed, a postal card with explanation and probable date of shipment is mailed to the customer the same day. This procedure puts our customers at

ease in regards to a possible delay. Our customers should realize that many books are going out of print. When our journal goes to press, the book page has been carefully checked and all books thereon are in stock. But by the time this issue reaches the subscriber, it is possible that certain titles have been sold and then when we reorder from the publisher, there are apt to be occasions when the book has since gone out of print.

Few Letters Go Astray

If your book orders do not reach you or if a card has not been sent to you within a reasonable length of time, write a letter of inquiry, but please wait a week, at least.

In some instances, our customers register impatience within a days after their order has been sent to us. We can check this by the date of postmark on the two communications.

Customers sometimes write very unkind letters. They tell us they know their letter must have been received because their name and address was on the outside of the envelope, and that it certainly would have been returned if we had not received it. Sometimes mail, even with return address, has been lost. However, during our Christmas rush, relatively few let-

ters went astray. The fact that the sender's name and address was on the envelope did not insure the letter reaching us.

Watch Your Number

While explanations are being given, we will endeavor to clarify our system for handling expirations on subscriptions. On the upper left hand corner of front page of each PSYCHIC OBSERVER, you will see a number. For instance. March tenth issue is number 156. If on the outside of your wrapper in which your paper is mailed, the last number is 156, such a number would indicate that your subscription expires with issue number 156. Spiritualism Makes No Claims That Cannot Be Substantiated.

ON THE thirty-first of this month, modern Spiritualism will be celebrating its ninety-seventh anniversary. On March 31st. 1848, little Katie Fox discovered that the power which was causing the disturbances in their home. "could see as well as hear." From that time to this, communion between the two states of being has been unbroken.

In the face of misunderstanding, misrepresentation, and the active hostility of both the organized churches and of materialism. Spiritualism has gone on its triumphant way. So virile and strong that not even the unwise enthusiasm, and sometimes ignorance of its friends, could stay its progress.

It has gathered under its banner representatives of every grade of society. It is a living gospel backed by scientific evidence. and offering a philosophy of ever-widening degrees of progressive life.

A New Revelation

The movement of Spiritualism was initiated, not by the people of this world, but by those in spirit life. It is truly a spirit-inspired and spirit-guided movement. and we do best when we open our spiritual nature to the higher influences of the spirit world, and strive to interpret and express in our daily lives their gospel of

The stream of inspiration has continued to flow with steady power from the first opening of the door between the two states of life. Within its light, Spiriualism has gathered people of all shades of opinion. It is broadly tolerant. kindly, but withal just. Its unseen leaders see with clearer eyes than ours the great issues at stake. It is in very truth a New Revelation, the opening of gates closed by bigotry, ignorance, fear, and the selfish desire of those who seek to have power over the great mass of people.

Its aim is the liberation of souls from the thraldom of creed, to teach them that creeds are merely statements of opinion and have no binding force unless they express truth.

The Inspiring Message

It seeks to free men from the domination of organization, and the restricting influence of dogma. Its messages are morally inspiring, though they are theologically lax. It has never supported the idea of man as, a fallen being. "born in sin and shapen in iniquity," of a final heaven or hell.

Its message is broadly human and divinely inspiring. It has rolled the stone from the sepulchre of doubt and negation, and revealed that death is a thoroughfare, through which pass souls to and from the world of spirits.

But inspiring as is the message of Spiritualism, it could do nothing without those who were prepared to brave the contumely and ignorance of the world. We remember the pioneers who through the press of hostile opposition kep:

faith with the unseen and gave out the truth they had discovered, unflinchingly and unafraid of all that the opposition of either creedalism, or scientific scepticism could

make to the progress of our-truth.

The pioneers of our movement had the glorious consciousness of angelic companionship. The world might reject their message. call them fools or mad, but they knew that what they stood for was God's truth. The great truth for which they stood was, and is, demonstrated survival of man over death; a rational conception of spirit life and a pathway of progress upward and onward for ever.

Religious Leaders Believe

To the bereaved they came with the wheat of comfort, the veritable bread of heaven, and proved to them that their loved still lived. They made the resurrection of Jesus a living fact, lifting it from the realm of belief to that of scientific certitude.

If the Church had had vision. it would have seen here the very corner-stone needed to buttress its declining faith; but shackled by tradition, by ritual, ceremony, creed and dogma, by its belief that the Bible was a final revelation from God. it was blind, and is still, as witness the suppression of the report of the committee it appointed to inquire into Spiritual-

Do the leaders really believe that truth can be shelved in such a way? Is that a part of the Christian tradition with which the Religious Committees tell us Spiritualism is not in line?

Not only the Church but even Science was blind. Scientists were as dogmatic in saying what was or was not possible. Had they

Spiritualists Dogmatic

Spiritualism is humble: it makes no claims it cannot substantiate. Spiritualists are sometimes mistaken, they are human and seek in many ways for knowledge.

At times they are as dogmatic as the priests they denounce, but in the main the stream of teaching flows in well-defined channels, and we can wait patiently the outcome of the work the spirit people have begun.

Depends Upon Mediumship

We must remember those gifted people whose sensitiveness fits them to be the Mediums for those in the higher life. They are the Medium Prophets, the forth-speakers of the spirit world. Upon them depends the continuance of

our movement as a living force in the world.

We need more and better Mediums: men and women imbued with the lofty desire to serve their fellows and who are prepared, as were those in the past, to brave the scorn of the world for this precious truth. I believe the need will be met.

The door between the two states of existence is open, and will re. main open. Remember, no mediumship, no Spiritualism; no Spir. itualism, no evidence of man's survival of death.

Creative Spiritualism

In three years we shall celebrate the first centenary of the movement. Plans are being formed for it. I hope there will be a combination of forces, a coming together of many shades of opinion and of many organizations, united in one aim. the formulating of plans by which in the future his glorious truth can be presented to the world.

And now let us dwell upon the work that the pioneers have done and breathe a prayer of thankfulness to them for their valiant work. To the Mediums who gave themselves so nobly and unselfishly for the giving of this truth to the world, what can we say?

They are not beyond our gratitude, and they are as earnest for the dissemination of the truth as ever they were. They still live. That is the glorious fact for which they gave their lives. A living creative Spiritualism is the world's greatest need at this hour. May we be privileged to continue to give it to the world. "Light"
