Do we live after physical death? Is there continuity, not only of life itself but of consciousness and moral responsibility? If such be the case, have we any means of demonstrating it?

To those who accept the teachings of Spiritualism, the answer is simple. In every country and at all stages of civilization, there have been individuals who differed from their neighbors, in that they could see and hear beyond the normal range. And there have been other "Queer speciment" who foretold future events with startl-

ing accuracy.
When Greece was in her glory, these abnormal persons were set apart for training, their latent powers were unfolded systematically, they were consecrated for service in the temples of the high gods. Moreover, the woman with such a gift was married to a man with similar powers, with the hope that greater "sensitives" would be born of such a union.

Foundations of Religions

It remained for the so-called Christian church to burn witches to death, and exert its influence to put modern mediums in jail. Here and there an eminent man of science has come to the rescue of an unfortunate minority, to whom neither freedom of speech nor freedom of religion is guaranteed by law.

In most of our large cities, the practice of mediumship becomes a crime only when the beneficiaries of its use are asked to pay a fee. This is unreasonable. However, is unreasonable. there is nothing reasonable about fanaticism.

Practically, the effort to stamp out mediumship is a concerted attempt to destroy the basic proof of immortality, which is the foundation of all religions. This is so preposterous that few thinking men and women realize what they are saying when they confess a faith that is based entirely on mediumship

Psychic Observer, of two articles dealing with apports, letters from all over the United States have come to me asking for more light. Over and over the question is stated, "Why is the world so slow to accept such dramatic evi-

Usually the writer has had personal revelations, which render acceptance easy. It is not hard to believe what we already know or at least what we earnestly wish to believe.

What Is Proof?

In the main, these friendly letters are accompanied by seance room tests or weird premonitions, such as might indicate that "coming events do cast their shadows before them."

In my psychic filing case I have material enough for another volume as a sequel to "Where Do We Go From Here?" Unfortunately. I am unable to use it. I am so constituted that I can write convincingly only of the things I have myself experienced.

To one of the most frequently repeated demands, made by believers and skeptics alike, I have long desired to make reply. "What constitutes proof of survival?"

As usual, I must begin by quoting Dr. Hervey Hyslop. Having fought a hard battle with modern psychologists, who account for all psychic phenomena as either tele-pathy or fraud, he set himself the of accumulating evidence that could not have originated in any human mind, either that of medium or that of the investigator.

Hamlin Garland

In doubtful cases he went far beyond the immediate circle. He said: "A discarnate spirit, speak ing through an authentic and absolutely honest medium, makes a e atement of facts that are not known to any living person. If some means is discovered whereby these facts can be established, the psychologists are left without a leg to stand on. Life after death is established."

During his forty years of investigation, Hamlin Garland made use of the Hyslop

"If the substance of what a spirit states, under test conditions, can be proved to exist in the mind of any living person-whether present or thousands of miles away-it cannot be accepted as final proof."

Such a condition would imply the existence of "Sclective telepathy," which the psychologists themselves do not recognize. The hard-boiled professor of Logic insists that one mind cannot communicate with another. excepting by means of the physical senses of hearing. sight or touch.

Sifting the Evidence

Two persons may happen to think of a thing at the same time, because of a mutual reminder, such as the strains of a song they had heard under peculiar circumstances; the deep roar of a steamboat whistle; a perfume some forgotten friend used to overdo, in the long-ago. One of the persons thus impressed might casually mention the name of the friend associated with the song, the whistle or the fragrance.

The other would almost inevitably exclaim: "Why, you read my mind! I was just thinking about So-and-So."

ing about So-and-So.

To the Spiritualist, who has been taught that minds which are in tune can communicate directly, whenever communication is neces sary, this cumbersome explanation seems foolish. The ether all around us is full of living beings. They talk to each other without the use of vocal organs, and under proper conditions they are able to carry messages from one friend to another on the earth plane.

In the presence of a medium this interchange of ideas and thoughts takes on an altogether different form. It has been my blessed privilege to induct several hundred seekers after truth or consolation into the mysteries of the seance room.

Love Does Not Die

The majority of these have sought my intervention because of the book, "Where Do We Go From Here," and within the past four years because of my articles in Psychic Observer. A letter or a telephone conversation usually is the first step.

Almost without exception the inquirer has lost a loved one. Death is so final, and yet the bereaved one knows that love does not die. It would be comforting to hear the voice again, to feel the touch of a warm hand, to have the assurance that those who die have forgotten. This yearning always arouses my sympathy.

I have spent many hours preparing sitters for their first experience. Hence I know what obstacles the novice is likely to

MORE SPIRIT PHOTOGRAPHY AT CAMP SILVER BELLE

Less than a year ago, Joseph W. Cushing of Lily Dale, N. Y. and Miami, Florida, passed away. He had always promised his wife, Rev. Sarah W. Cushing, that he would return and, in such a way, that there would be no doubt as to his own personal conscious survival.

Several months ago, during a visit to Camp Silver Belle, Ephrata, Pa., the editors of *Psychic Observer* attended a semi-private spirit photography demonstration conducted by *J. Edward*. There were about twenty persons present.

Eight of this number sat in a circle with Edward, each holding by their finger tips, a grip on an undeveloped camera plate. The plate was initialed by L. S. Brown, Pittsburgh, Pa. The signature can be checked by placing the picture (above) before a mirror.

After the prayer and some singing, the lights were extinguished . . . leaving the seance room in total darkness but all the while each member of the group retained their grasp on the plate.

In less than three minutes, Edward asked for "lights" and, with a committee, retired to the developing room; all returning shortly with the negative which Edward held up to the light. It was not till the proofs were received that the picture was positively identified.

It is imperative to remember that Mrs. Cushing was *not* present at the time this picture was taken but all knew her well and were aware her husband had passed away but had no thought of it, at the time.

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NAPOLEON-Was He Psychic?

What Supernormal Powers Were Possessed By This Man Who Became an Emperor Only To Pass Away a Lonely Prisoner?

While Doing Good, He Was "An Instrument in the Hands of Higher Powers."

When you pick up a biography Napoleon Bonaparte, you'll probably be told that over forty thousand books have been written about him-and no one knows how many more remain to be written. They appear at the rate of at least

We know more about him than any other personage in history. We know the menus of his meals, even the angle of his grenadier's We know what he did, what he said, what he thought. He has been laid on the dissection table and analyzed to the last detail.

Yes, listen to what his most dis tinguished biographers say. Lord Roseberry calls him a "problem." To Emil Ludwig, he is an "enigma." Bloy says we are confronted by one of the most formidable mysteries in history. Masson, who wrote eighteen books about him, confesses that, after thirty years' study. "I have even tess comprehension of this extraordinary being.

Providence Uses Such Men

Looked at from the orthodox viewpoint, it seems that Napoleon is unexplainable. Let us take a look at him from the occult viewpoint.

In one of his books. Paul Brunton, in a passing reference to Napoleon, makes this suggestive comment: "Bonaparte was a psychological mystery . . . an unconscious Yogi, an instrument in the hands of higher powers.

Professor Holland Rose takes' the same line - "Providence uses such men while they serve mysterious designs for the uplifting of the race.

These remarks will probably urprise those readers who have hitherto regarded Napoleon as a sort of glorified gangster, and the forerunner of the repulsive Fuchrer.

The term 'Yogi' is not inapt, when applied to "Napoleon." Not that he sat all day in "Pranayama." with his legs crossed, or that his nights were spent in meditation upon the Absolute Far from it. But consider the following striking points of resemblance.

Amazing Energy

The Haiha Yogis are noted throughout the Orient for their remarkable feats of endurance. doubt if one of these feats could not have been duplicated by Napoleon.

His body was not strong; but it was, as one of his ministers remarked. "the slive of his mind." It had to obey his will, whatever the cost. He flogged it unmercifully.

As First Consul, he used to preside over meetings which sometimes lasted for fifteen hours at a stretch. He would be as fresh at the end of the sitting as at the beginning.

He dictated continuously twelve hours without the slightest inconvenience. His ministers and generals groaned and collapsed under the terrific strains he placed upon them. And, however hard they worked, he worked three times as hard The Russian. Doestoiev-sky, said: "He was made of bronze, not flesh."

This emazing energy lasted

The Yogis devote hard practice to the development of Attention and Concentration. Napoleon did not have to. He possessed those enviable gif's from childhood.

"Nothing can divert the Emperor's attention." says one of his contemporaries, "Anything outside the task he is bent upon simply ceases to exist."

The force and continuity of his mind is marvelous," says another.

Napoleon could grasp the essentials of a problem before his subordinates were aware that a problem existed. This is the secret of his great military victories—or rather part of the secret, as we shall see later on.

Personal Magnetism

The great leaders of history-Buddha. Cacsar. Christ-have one characteristic in common: the ability to mould men's minds to their will, to drag a bewildered humanity at their very heels.

Napoleon possessed this power in a degree exceeded by no man since the days of the Nazarene.

"My material power was great," Napoleon once said, "but my power over men's minds was greatcr still. It amounted to magic."

He was rot exaggerating. A strange, thrilling magnetism which was felt not only by his associates, but also by his enemies. cmanated from him.

Readers who know something of French history will realize that Napoleon's satellites were not men to dominate. Talleyrand master of intrigue, and the clever-

est foreign minister alive at that time, called him "a devil."

Murat, a swashbuckling gallant who is regarded as one of the great cavalry leaders of all time, became

quite sheepish in his presence.

The list could be extended indefinitely. Ney, Massena, Aug-ereau, Marmont. all confessed, directly or indirectly, that they either feared or loved Napoleon.

His effect on women was equally striking. At a reception in Dresden in 1812, when he marched between the lines of bowing ladies, it was noticed that, as he passed, each one became agitated and blushed furiously.

When his soldiers knew he was present on the battlefield, their fanaticism rose to fever pitch and they became "like men possessed."

Intuitive Foreknowledge

Napoleon once said. "There are twin souls inside me." One of these souls was that of the soldier, the administrator, the emperor, and is perfectly comprehensible. The other is a strange sort of soul that not even the psycho-analyst can venture to explain.

On the one side, we have the man of action, hard, practical, even ruthless if necessary. On the other, we find "an everlasting sleep - walker." a superstitious dreamer, a man who confessed that he didn't know what he was doing

or where he was going.

"What point was I driving at? I did not know. I never was my own master.'

A strange confession from man of Napoleon's caliber. He compared himself to a fragment of rock hurled into space, obeving the will of someone else or something else. Sometmes he called this force "Destiny," other times he called it "my star."

"What is nritten in the heavens is written." he remarked to Jose-phine. "We cannot escape our phine. jate.

All his life he was dominated by he thought of this special star. "One must always be guided by one's star." he said And another time, "He wanted to harm me. but my star would not let him."

Invincible Confidence

This belief gave Napoleon an invincible confidence in himself which communicated to others and especially to his soldiers.

He was intensely superstitious, though some of his admirers deny this. He hated open doors and broken mirrors. Three candles alight at the same time made him

Napoleon never let omens of illfortune influence his decisions in any way. What did influence him -far more than he ever cared to

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were those mysterious premonitions which visited him from time to time.

When he was a schoolboy he began an essay entitled "St. Helena." He wrote only three words. "a small island," and then his hand stopped as though paralyzed. could not be induced to finish the

He never explained that abrupt ending. His schoolfellow, Bou-riene, who later became his sec-His schoolfellow. Bouretary supplies us with the probable explanation.

"Bonaparte." he said, "seemed to have a magnetic prevision of his coming future." It was not simply ordinary foresight, but a "clair-voyant intuition."

A Sixth Sense

Nancleon himself confirms this: "I always had an inner sense of what an aited me."
This "inner sense" served him

during his most critical battles. Eye-witnesses have described how he would command silence from those about him, and then sit at ing into space. like a man in a trance. Suddenly, he would spring up and issue orders. A few hours later, in almost every case, the enemy were either routed or annihilated.

These trance-like states were not infrequent in Napoleon's career. He could apparently enter them when he liked. Before his most famous victory. Austerlitz. his sleep resembled that of a dead

Sometimes this withdrawal of consciousness was sudden and involuntary. This took place at the reception on the occasion of his marriage to Marie Louise of Austria.

He was walking forward to receive the congratulations of his courtiers when he came to a sudden stop, with his eyes fixed on the door. He remained still as a statue for fully ten minutes, completely oblivious of his surround-

A Supersensitive Mind

At last one of the bewildered company ventured to address him. Napoleon jerked, glanced round in a dazed manner, and then with-

This and similar incidents in his life remind us of the Samadhi. or mystical trance, into which Oriental ascetics sometimes slip without any preliminary warning.

At such times Napoleon's mind seemed to become supersensitive. One of his intimates, Segur, records what appears to be an instance of telepathy.

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WHEN CHILDREN ARE MEDIUMS

For over a quarter of a century, records show that children, who are psychic, have learned, through bitter experience to deny their gifts. Only those with strongest natural power can survive.

When children are psychic, their elders are often too dense to recognize the truth.

Many natural mediums tell that as children they suffered not misunderstanding but often actual corporal punishment for lying. Whippings from elders too dense to recognize the truth when it came from the lips of their own Such experiences burn an indelible impression on the sensitive young mind.

No doubt many a child medium has learned through bitter experience to deny his gifts until they faded from his consciousness. Only ones with the strongest natural power could survive, and some of them grew to fear and despise this thing which made them different.

Recently I met such a woman. a child, wonderful physical phenomena occurred wherever she was: so her folks browbeat her, had her prayed over by the minister, tried to drive out the evil spirits with holy relics and finally banished her from home when she was twelve.

A Child Senses

Her "bad luck" followed her for years. She has never been to a Spiritualist church. She promised to go with me. but never has. It plain that she feels she has finally got pretty well away from it and it is so associated with trouble in her mind that she can not bring herself to do anything that might encourage its return. A wonderful gift stiffled by persecution.

spiritualists agree that Most nearly all children, in their greater purity and simplicity, enjoy a spirit communion that is largely lost as they grow older. When their fancies are discouraged as tall stories, and when they are trained in Sunday school, public school and home to discredit the psychic it is little wonder that one but the strongest natural mediums keep their gift past early childhood.

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Maybe most would have lost it anyway. Maybe that is to be expected since the chief interest of most healthy youth is in the physical and the material. But we can not ignore the fact that it does exist for awhile

No doubt many a child's imaginative play is nothing more. Mine was not—as far as I remember, and I know if I had seen spirit after I was four years old

I would remember it. I depended a lot on my imagination, but I never pretended it was any-thing else so I got in no trouble over it.

But when a little child cries and insists he did see Indians or was playing with a little girl.
I firmly believe that he is likely



to be telling the truth. Although I have never seen spirit forms myself I know it is possible, and the parent who feels he must prevent his child being a liar by making an issue of such things is doing the child one of the greatest injustices one human can inflict on another if the child did see spirit.

If it did not see spirit, the best course is still to ignore the whole thing so the child loses the desire to fabricate when it receives so little attention.

So the only way is to treat the child's stories with casualness so he is neither overly encouraged nor discouraged. The sensitive child may be loath to talk about its spirit friends. I have seen that happen to my own four-year-old, but not before I gained some valuable information.

Later I often heard her and Selma speak of Mary Alice, and have heard her call and ask Selma if Mary Alice was at our house that day. That is the only child who has shared Mary Alice with Selma. It seems that she goes away when the others come. I became accustomed to the play, and still did not attribute it to spirit.

The day when I first felt it was something more than imaginwas something more than imagin-ation I heard Selma enter her room and say in surprise. "Well. hello, little gir!! What's your name? I said, what's your name? ... Well, if you won't tell me your name how can we play? I guess I'll call you Donna." (the name of a friend).

The child did not stay long, but somehow the conversation made me believe Selma did see the spirit form of a little girl. I remembered how she had come to me a few days before and asked how it was that Mary Alice never goes to the toilet, and how real was her concern. So when she came out of her room I asked my first ques-

tion.
"Where does Mary Alice live?" l asked casually.

Imagine my feeling when Selma turned to me very seriously and said slowly and clearly without a trace of babyishness. Do you know, mama,—she lives where I lived before I came to live with you."

I was so taken back I could only say rather weakly. "Why do you say that, honey?" to which she replied with the same earnestness. That's what she say.

ICELAND NEEDS MEDIUMS My Two-Hour Talk With The Primate

English Medium Welcomed by the Bishop of Iceland

The State Church of Iceland is an impressive example of Christian broad-mindedness. I have returned from a two hours interesting talk with Bishop Sigurds-son, the Primate, and the subject was Spiritualism and Psychical Research. He believes that propagating these two aspects of psychic science is a serious and spiritual task which cannot fail to benefit

He regretted that he had no personal supernormal faculties and powers, as they must, he feels, be of tremendous help to all who deire to spread spiritual knowledge. He has had some experience with mediumship through others, and has evidently been impressed by

them as he actually encourages people to investigate.

Never once did he attempt, throughout the interview, to interpose theological opinions, but was anxious to learn to what extent mediumship could strengthen one's conviction of man's spiritual nature: and desired to know what spirit-communicators said about the Beyond and mankind's relationship to God.

Lutherans Interest

This attitude naturally increases public opinion in the Mission I am carrying on under the sponsorship of Spiritualists and psychical researchers, for both have united in forwarding the work.

My interpreter for the public lectures was Rev. Jakob Jonsson. one of the best known ministers in Iceland. He is thoroughly acquainted with our movement with strong attachment to the science of it. a line which I have been requested to pay close attention.

I attended divine service in the Cathedral and listened to the Rev. Auduns preach over the air from the pulpit on psychic phenomena in the Bible. A large congregation listened with rapt attention.

Two other Lutheran clergymen. ho unfailingly forward our cause when opportunity arises, are the Reverend Ion Thorarensen, and the Reverend Friderisksson. I lectured in the latter minister's church some vears ago in Wynyard, Canada, and shall be meeting him in Rekjavik shortly.

Never in a Hurry

I have already conducted a series of meetings and seances pre-paratory to bigger efforts which lie just ahead. Icelanders are never in an unnecessary hurry, and the greatest care is being taken to prepare the public for what is to come. Later on, I shall have a chance to travel to other cities and see much of this remarkable and thrilling country.

none of whom are professional. That is perhaps the outstanding weakness, as most of them are too busy to devote themselves sufficiently to the subject to become fully developed.

Icelanders seem to be more spiritually inclined than most European races, partly because of their isolation, and the fact that there has been much less to distract them from religion than in larger and busier cities, such as London-Paris and New York City.

There is a lot of learning here, and many people have studied the extensive folk-lore that has been built up on the island during the last eleven hundred years. I shall have occasion to mention some of these strange and illuminating tra-

ditions later on.

There is only one physical medium on the island as far as I can gather-Laura Agustsdottir. I have yet to sit with her and shall then report what happens.

Iceland's Great Medium

Spiritualists are very influential in various departments of life, particularly political, and it is interesting to know that even the Foreign Minister of Iceland is sympathetic and did all he could to facilitate my visit.

The two great personalities in Spiritualism and psychical research have been the Rev. Haraldur Neilsson and Einar H. Kvaran. Haraldur Neilsson. who was Professor of Theology at Rekjavik University, and the spiritual father of most of the elder clergy, including the Primate, was well-known to myself and other British Spiritualists. His investigations into the phenomena of mediumship brought him to England frequently, and it was he who instilled into the clerical mind here the present sympathy to us.

Einar Kvaran was perhaps the best known Icelandic poet, novel-

ist and journalist of his day.

Both these gentlemen have passed away, but their influence is still very strong. The greatest medium the country has had was Indridi Indridason who died a young man. His mediumship puts him in the same class as Daniel Dunglass Home, and he was just as versatile. There seems to have been no form of mediumship that he did not excel in. Like Home he died of tuberculosis.

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MEDIUMSHIP What It Is

How One's Development Can Be Improved

By Alfred Vout Peters

A great deal has been written about mediumship by people who have only been able to study it from outside, but with few exceptions hardly anyone within the ranks of mediums has attempted to explain this most difficult, intricate and really fascinating sub-

What is mediumship? and under what heading can we class this elusive faculty? have been the questions which have puzzled students of psychic phenomena. After a close analysis of my own medial powers, and those of my brother and sister mediums, I am convinced that it is an extension of the so-called artistic faculty, the faculty by which the musician is able to interpret the mystery of sound, the artist to express in color the beauty of nature and the hu-man face and form, and the actor to illustrate the varying aspects of human life as depicted in the drama.

Not a Contradiction

The medium, however, strikes a higher octave, and reaches out to a sphere beyond that of the earth and the emotions that we are familiar with. By reason of his supersensitiveness he is able to interpret things which belong to the realm of what we know as existence spiritual; and what is more important he is helped by, and works in co-operation with, the inhabitants of that realm.

Mediumship is a faculty that is at once normal and abnormal. This seems a contradiction, but the contradiction, but the ored by our point of view, and mediumship must be regarded as normal, if we consider the artist as normal, and only as abnormal if we consider the artist as an eccentric.

The faculty of mediumship is a talent in seven out of every ten persons. It is active in most children until it is smothered by contact with the outer world. We are all familiar with the feminine method of asserting knowledge on some subject without being able to explain how this knowledge has been acquired. This gift of intuitive knowledge is only a small and not very well understood part of mediumship.

What Induces Control

Now mediumship stands apart from all the other faculties that we are familiar with, inasmuch as it depends not upon the medium alone but upon outside powers claiming to be spirits of men and women who have left the flesh, and who claim to originate the phenomena familiar to us.

And now it may be of interest if I give some of my experiences on the inner side. I was always a curious child, and used to be visited by remarkable dreams, but I was twenty-six before I took part in a seance. This was held at the house of my sisterin-law, and obtained raps and knocks and answers to questions, I felt a sensation of drowsiness creeping over me.

Then I seemed to be looking from the ceiling down on the other sitters, and presently a voice not mine was proceeding from my mouth, calling my sister-in-law by a pet name, that I found afterContemporary English Clairvoyant and Trance Medium

wards my brother had used in earth-life, but of which I had never heard. Then the voice of my mother spoke, after which I regained the power of normal control. All the time I was not entirely unconscious, but knew that it was not myself that was speak-

During the second seance I was conscious that I saw the spirits of the so-called dead, and thereafter I commenced to sit at home, and obtained automatic writing and drawing.

The questions are often asked-What is the meaning of control? and how is it induced or brought about? We are told that it is a self-induced hypnotic state, and that the alleged control is simply the personality of the medium, or at the lowest that we are simply acting and deceiving the sitters.

Trance Technique

Now to understand the process of control by discarnate beings we must understand the mesmeric or magnetic control that is produced by a hypnotist in the flesh. we understand this it is plain. Mediums are simply magnetized by spirit beings, and as I have seen the process many times I will try to describe it.

The spirit operator commences to make passes down the medium's face and then from the crown of the head down the spine. At first the passes are made slowly, afterwards very quickly, till full con-trol is obtained over the medium,

when a hand is gently laid on his head. The sensations during this process are very pleasant, and a feeling of languor is induced which is very soothing. The eyes close, the hands and feet become insensible, and sounds and voices gradually recede as the control becomes stronger until the medium is in the magnetic state.

Improve Your Mediumship

The spirit then approaches and stands in the medium's aura, and from that position is able to manipulate his, brain and afterwards his whole body. This control varies in different conditions. Sometimes it is so deep that the normal consciousness is quite blotted out, and sometimes it is as if a voice is speaking in some far away place which has nothing to do with the medium.

I have seen my own controls materialize and one of them has spoken to me in a seance. how much of the information that we receive is derived from the outside spirit intelligence, and how much from the medium must be left to the judgment of the sitter, as sometimes the information coming through the medium's brain had become disturbed by his own ideas.

How can one's mediumship be improved? is a question often asked. In reply I would emphasize three essentials-first, a nonflesh diet, eliminating tobacco and alcohol; second, exercise in the fresh air daily; and third, ample rest for body and mind.

So you wouldn't get anything but mind-reading, after all. Why don't you go with your own mind open? Professor W. was a brilliant man. He should have ingenuity enough to give you proof that would convince you."

purposely avoided telling Myrtle anything about the sitter excepting that I was sure of her sincerity. In the beginning she was nervous and a little frightened, so I kept hold of her hand, and from time to time whispered explanations in her ear.

A Medium Explains

First her mother spoke to her. She faltered a response. Then her mother-in-law, with the announce-ment, "I've brought my boy. boy. You're not afraid of him.

The next instant a strong mascuvoice exclaimed: "Dearest, we're not going to waste time on pass-words. I've thought up a more convincing test. Hold out your left hand, palm up.

"Then all of us heard her cry: "Oh, oh, oh! That's wonderful. Do it again. Now I can never doubt."

After the seance Myrtle said to her, "I am not usually clairvoyant during a sitting, because Parker, my spirit collaborator, concentrates all my forces for the physical phenomena. But he permitted me to see what your husband was doing. With his index finger he wrote something in the palm of your hand. Then he closed your fingers over what he had written, and played with your ring, twisting it back and forth."

Whether the sentence written by a spirit finger was the one agreed upon or merely. "I love you," is of no consequence. It was absolutely convincing, and that is all that matters.

Physical Phenomena

Among the scores of experiences which it has been my privilege to share, I must mention one that made a profound impression. The man in question was a Swede whose brother had died in Stockholm. It was interesting to hear Swedish spoken and sung. And since Myrtle Brown knows no Swedish, this should have been convincing.
Still there was a lingering

doubt in the mind of the man who

had been reared in the orthodox Lutheran faith, and had been taught that it is a sin to "traffic with witches and disturb the dead."

On the occasion of his second sitting, the question of impersonation was answered definitely, for one practical man who knew evidence when he felt it. The brother's voice spoke to him, without the trumpet, accusing him of harboring doubt, and repeating parts of the conversation that had followed the first seance. Then he commanded, "Put your hand incommanded, Fitt your hand in-side the trumpet—and get a good grip on what you feel. But don't try to pull it out and take it home with you."

Twenty Years' Experience

There was an exclamation of astonishment, followed by some goodnatured teasing on the part of a man who had been "dead" twenty years. The sitter's wife de-manded to know what had taken

"It wouldn't mean a thing to anyone but me," he explained. anyone but me," he explained.
"My brother had a deformed thumb, with a double nail. He cluays had to have his gloves made to order, to accommodate that big thumb. When I put my hand into the mouth of the trum pet -there was Olaf's hand, just as solid as mine, and he dug me with that double nail. He used to tell me when we were boys that I was hard to convince. Well. I'm con-vinced!"

After twenty years of psychic investigation, I could multiply instances of proof that there is no death. Unfortunately for the doubter, he has to have the truth brought home to him in his own personal way. Again to quote Dr. Hyslop, it is the trivial incident that carries conviction. And for satisfactory evidence the requisite is an open mind.

It is very hard to believe in communication with the world beyond the grave unless one has had experience such as I have had. For years I, too, believed that if there really were a life after death, at least no one could return from it. The more I delved into science the less I believed there was a life at all and it was not until the death of my son that I knew that "life beyond the grave" was really true.

And the strange thing about it was that I did not apparently need to sit for development under the tutelage of anyone to get in touch with my loved ones.

It all seemed to come about this way-my son who was very dear and close to me, closer than most sons are to their mothers. died very suddenly in January 1941. After his death many of his friends told me that in 1939 a "fortune teller" had told him he was going to die in 1941.

1 Was Desperate

On New Year's eve of 1941 he and his friends spoke of the prediction and by the 16th of January he was gone. He had only been sick five days with a form of pneumonia for which no serum had yet been discovered. And although he was a strong healthy boy nothing could be done for him.

The shock of his death was very near unbearable especially since I had lost my husband only year before by accidental death. I felt in my sorrow if only there were some way I could talk with them, that is if they were really alive.

Always the doubt of another existence hovered near although the prediction of my son's death made me stop and think and I was not as skeptical as I had been in my vounger days.

desperation I went to a medium, not recommended by anyone but just chosen at random from the list of churches in a newspaper. She turned out to be a little old grandmother type and as I remember, her grandchildren, who were with her at the time. continued to annoy us all during the reading.

. . . Then I Tried

Among the things she told me was that I was going to have a long letter from my son. "Did I ever sit with paper and pencil and try to have him write to me?", she asked. "Well. I should," she advised "because he is going to write you a long letter."

Several times, later on, as I was sitting quietly alone thinking of them as I did almost constantly. I would hold the pencil on some paper. Apathetically and always with misgivings I will confess, but lonely and heartbroken as I was I could not help but try.

One evening when I felt especially sad and lonely I decided to try again the advice of the medium with small hope of success, but at least I felt I should try even though it failed.

Only a few minutes passed when the pencil began to move over the paper! I could tell by the moveshould get a larger piece. This I did orally not realizing I could communicate that way.

I was told to get more paper and then I received the long letter which a very dear son who was frantically trying to reach his mother, would write.

Page after page he wrote me and no one can imagine the utter joy, and gladness, and yet the frantic fear, that when he stopped writing he might not come again. But amazingly the messages came just the same the next day and every day after and with them came a peace that "passeth all un-derstanding."

Affords Untold Comfort

I now know that heaven surely must seem like a nice place in which to live because my son has conveyed this idea to me, not only by writing but also by talking with me as though he were seated in the same room. All of these experiences I have had and many more. Especially do I remember his description of life "over there" which is included in my book "When he Heavens Speak" (Dale news. Inc., \$2.00).

I only wish I could tell each person and especially every mother and father, who have lost a dear son in the war, how to contact their loved ones, but cannot. Nothing more than I have told you here, but it is worth trying and trying again and again.

The comfort I have received from having my son and husband with me again, because we do talk as though they were beside me: Of having his advice in the solving of the complex problems of everyday living, is one of the great joys of life.

I never see him but we can talk more freely than we did when he was living and at anytime of the day or night. You mothers who have lost your sons in this war at least try the same as I did. Your boy would be so glad and what comfort it would bring

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

on me I saw that she realized for the first time that I could not see Mary Alice.

Then in a tone of patience approaching exasperation that a child can assume with elders sometimes she explained, "She looks like you. She's my sister. I've told you and told you that she's my sister."

Could It Be?

That was true, but I had never attached any significance to it. Selma had now passed her fourth birthday. Every only child longs for a brother or sister. I considered that Mary Alice brought a sisterly vibration and answered that need in my little girl and I was grateful.

I often thought of Selma's true sister who spent only sixteen days on earth in 1935. Her name was Lois Anne. The prayer nearest my heart had been that if Mary Alice were truly a spirit child, why could she not have been my little Lois Anne?

Now I was nearly paralyzed with suspense as for the first time I forgot all my former casualness and pumped Selma for information.

All I could get was. "She looks just like you only she's a little girl. I told you she's my sister. That's why she lives with us so much."

Could it be? After all, my other baby had been named Mary in the beginning, and after awhile I had decided on Alice as the best name to go with it. Not until shortly before her birth did I change to Lois Anne to please others.

Startled By a Child

At first I thought her name yould remain Mary Alice in my heart, but soon I thought of her only as Lois Anne, and so it has remained for eleven years.

If this Mary Alice is my child, then why has she retained that name when she was formally named christened and buried under the name Lois Anne? I must add that Selma had never been told, to my knowledge (and we are far from my family) of her baby sister in spirit.

I also noticed last winter that Selma shows other signs of clairvoyance. It is uncanny how she can 'read my mind,' finish sentences I start, tell who is telephoning and when there is mail for her. I tried not to attach too much importance to such. even when she startled me by announcing the contents of packages received through the mail before I knew myself. I kept telling myself that it might be a coincidence.

The Child Knew!

One day we heard a child screaming. I remarked that I wondered what was the matter with him. Selma, busy with blocks on the floor murmered, "His daddy got out of the car and is going back in the house to see what is the matter."

I walked to the window, and saw that she was right, but she could not possibly see from where she was sitting. Other such incidents have happened. Often she makes the statement in a spontaneous way, and then, evidently not knowing how she knew, she changes it to a question, asking me if it is not so.

I had tried to explain her knowing when she has mail by the fact that her mail is generally cards in smaller or odd shaped envelopes. However, the other day the postman handed me the mail walked into the house with it I looked at one envelope of regular size and appearance and Selma said. "That one's not for anyone, is it?" It was addressed to our street address only.

Children Sense Difference

I am not claiming that my child is a paragon. She is just like other children except a little more shy, sensitive and self conscious, and I am sorry to say she cries too easily. Selma, to everyone's consternation began to cry very bitterly and protest that he couldn't see her because Mary Alice had gone to school.

Always Be Sympathetic

I do not know if those things have had anything to do with it or not, but Selma has hardly mentioned Mary Alice for more than month. Maybe the mediumistic phase is passing, especially as she now has mortal playmates most of the time.

Had I not been a spiritualist, I doubt if I would have noticed her clairvoyance beyond passing surprise as she is not spectacular. However, with some mothers she might even have been spanked for untruth.

How well I remember how my nephew at her age would insist that he had seen such and such until his parents felt it their duty to spank him to teach him the difference between his imagination and reality. If he had told those things in the spirit of play he would have had no trouble, but he was such an earnest little fellow, and would insist with such an open, honest face that he was telling the truth that it seemed terrible to his parents that he should be that kind of "liar." He is now grown, and has no memory of that time, but I am glad I have been able to appreciate that phase in Selma's life.

While writing this I mentioned to her, "Mary Alice hasn't been here for a long time, has she?"

"No." she replied. "She went away to school. But she'll come back—I hope." I hope so. too. . 0 0

The Doyle boys should not ride on the coat-tails of their father's evidence and conviction, they should set about collecting own data . . . instead of looking down their noses at communicareceived by others, from their famous father.

disastrous Russian campaign, Napoleon was lying on a sofa plunged in meditation. Suddenly he jumped to his feet and cried, "Who is calling me?"

No one within earshot had called. But was it the voice of the lonely Josephine, whom he had divorced and thrown aside? Or was it the "Vive l'Empereur" of one of his dying soldiers?

A distinguished military critic

has remarked that Napoleon seemed almost to read the minds of his opponents, so nearly did he anticipate their movements. One thing is certain. He knew he would lose the battle of Waterloo.

A foreboding which he could not shake off told him that the Napoleonic romance was coming to an end. "My star grew dim." he said, "I felt the reins slipping from my hands, and yet I could do nothing."

The Man of Destiny

At dawn, on the day of Waterloo. he approached a bivouac fire, on which a pot of potatoes were boiling. He asked for one, and began to eat it. His aide-de-camp heard him utter the following broken sentences: "After all, I can endure it . . . Men may live in any place and in any way . . . The day is not far off..."

His mind was lingering over

those words he had written when a schoolboy: "St. Helena-a small island. . .

"An instrument in the hands of higher powers." So far as the carly part of his career is concerned, we may, I think, give an unqualified assent to that statement. When Napoleon worked to cleanse a corrupt and degenerate Europe, those higher powers Europe, those higher powers worked with him and swept him from success to success.

But, in his later life as Emperor, when a selfish ambition had hardened his nature, and he made war for sheer love of conquest, those powers abandoned him. As he said himself, "The spell that had hung over my miraculous career was broken."




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Emma Hardinge Britten (1823 - 1899)

Emma Hardinge Britten was an inspirational speaker and medium. One of the best propagandists of Spiritualism, daughter of Captain Floyd, a seafaring man, she had shown gifts as musician, singer and elocutionist at an early age and was earning her living as a musical teacher at the age of eleven.

Under contract to a theatrical Company in 1856 she went to America, where, through the mediumship of Miss Ada Hoyt (Mrs. Coan)

she became converted to Spiritualism, developed psychic powers in her own person and sat publicly for the Society for the Dif-Jusion of Spiritual Knowledge of New York. She furnished one of the best attested

cases of the early history of Spirit return. The mail steamer Pacific sank in the high A member of the crew possessed her body in trance and disclosed the fact of the tragedy. She was threatened with prosecution by the owners of the boat when the story was made public, but it was found to

Her mediumistic gifts embraced automatic writing, psychometry, occasional healing, prophecy and inspirational speak-Her inspirational addresses disclosed great erudition. They were extempore and the subject was generally chosen in the auditorium by a committee from the audience. As a propagandist she was unequalled in zeal and enthusiasm. For years she traveled all over the United States, Canada, England, Australia and New Zealand.

She founded and edited for five years Two Worlds of Manchester. She was also among the founders of the Theosophical Society in New York in 1875,

She was the author of Modern American Spiritualism, London, She was the author of Modern American Spirituatism, London, 1870; Nineteenth Century Miracles, New York 1884; Faith, Fact and Fraud of Religious History Manchester 1900; Extemporaneous Addresses, London, 1866; The Wildfire Club, 1861, translator and editor of the anonymous MSS of Art Magic, Boston 1875, and Ghostland, or Researches into the Mysteries of Occultism, Boston, 1876; editor of the American periodical The Western Star, 1872, and the British The Unseen Universe, 1892-93. She also wrote a number of musical compositions and songs under the nom de plume of Ernest Reinhold.



The problem of Discarnate Influence in Mental Disturbance is not a local one: it is international. for no country has a monopoly of spirit interference, as witnessed by its acceptance as a reality by Germany, France, Italy and Greece. In Britain however, so deeply rooted is the fear of appearing ridiculous that they will not hear of it.

Man's Lack of Understanding

It is not necessary to drag-in the Book of Holy Writ to support the case, but there are numerous instances of Jesus and His Disciples "casting out Devils" as a matter of course in their daily healing work, and in the Middle Ages it was the practice to burn at the stake, anyone suspected of being "possessed of a demon," which seems to indicate they appreciated the possibility of such happenings.
