San Francisco's Noted Direct-voice Medium Holds Special Seance for the Editors of Psychic Observer.

Florence S. Becker, one of Spiritualism's greatest mediums, was endowed from her earliest days, with not only the ability to commune with spirits but also the gift of prophecy.

Her parents were strict orthodox Christians. The astounding yarns, told by young Florence, were considered by some to be absolute falsehoods, and she was oftimes punished for repeating messages and relating communion she had with spirit people. As just punishment, she would sometimes be sent to a dark attic where she was obliged to spend hours in isolation from her playmates.

This procedure failed to correct the "scandalous" tale-telling. Materialized spirits would actually sit beside her on an old trunk in the darkness of the attic,—psychic scientists know that ectoplasmic formations can build up in semi-dark-- these spirits would teach and tell her many truths. Also, messages about future events, concerning the family and neighbors, would be included in the attic communications.

Her Early Life

Naturally, the young child would be filled with enthusiasm about her spirit friends. At the time she did not understand, nor did she realize these people were actually spirits. Again and again she would repeat the unbelievable yarns told her in the attic. In almost every instance, she would be justly punished by whippings, extra household duties or an extra nousehold duties or any hardship the good parents could conjure up to meet the strict re-quirements for upbringing a Christian daughter.

Florence's early home life was one of great problems and difficul-While still quite young, she married. From this union, she had two fine sons, who are now grown men in the service of the United States.

This Indian then told her a trip to San Francisco was absolutely necessary and so saying, packed her bags for the trip and helped the young children prepare for the journey.

Accompanied by this very same red-man, Florence and the two children traveled to the City of the Golden Gate. They went to an apothecary shop and, to the clerk, the Indian gave explicit instructions for an unusual mixture of herbs, et cetera, for a poultice,

This poultice was applied to the goitre which in a few days completely disappeared.

Shortly before taking his de-parture, this good old Indian cut one of his long black braids, gave it to the girl Florence, and said:

During our stay in Los Angeles. reporter from the Los Angeles Herald Examiner interviewed both of us at the Biltmore Hotel. According to the article that appeared the follow ing day, we were referred to as "au-thorities" on psychic science. "They declared that the current cycle of fantasy-type movies, particularly those with psychic themes, indicate a growing trend in troubled times to search for satisfying answers concern-ing the mysteries of life.

"The time has arrived when serious investigators and writers on these matters no longer can be regarded as just nuts, Mr. Pressing stated. There are too many intelligent and important people ho are interested.
"Mr. and Mrs. Pressing asserted that

the evidence of personal survival after death is now so voluminous and complete that any person can satisfy him-self merely by reading the literature available in a public library."

The preface of the rally pro-rum is headed Historic Spiritualist Meetings. It reads: "Round about the mid'twenties Sir Arthur Conan Dovle conducted the first Spiritualist Service ever to be held in Albert Hall.

"Today over twenty years later, the Albert Hall is again the scene of a great Spiritualist gathering. It is the All Spiritualists' Rally organized by Psychic News. In those intervening years, Spiritualism has not re mained at a standstill: on the contrary its message has been proclaimed from platforms all over the country.

"For many years dating from 1927, the Marylebone Spiritualist Association held annual services of reunion and remembrance at the Albert Hall. It is interesting to note that when the hall was first booked for a Spiritualist Service, the organizers wondered if they could 611 it Practically every London Spiritualist Church curtailed its services for that evening, and asked the congregation to go to the Albert Hall. Soon customary for the Albert Hall to be filled once or twice

a year, whilst other Spiritualist meetings had their normal attendances. "In 1938, Spiritual-

ism reached a peak hitherto unscaled. In less than six weeks, five propaganda meetings, arranged by the Sunday Pictorial, in conjunction with the House of Red Cloud,

Ronald STRONG were held. These enabled 25,000 peo-

ple to hear the case for Spiritualism.
"Before the war there were at least three large propaganda meetings every Sunday, at the Queen's Hall, Grotrian Hall and Acolian Hall, but with the outbreak of hostilities these had to close down. Ronald Strong, in keeping open the Wigmore Hall, became practically only champion in the Metropolis.

"The war over, Spiritualist meetings on a large scale are held frequently.

The London District Council of the S.N.U. hold Spring and Autumn Rallies, while the M.S.A. conduct a service at the Victoria Hall, Blooms-bury,, every Sunday. The Kingsway Hall, Holborn, has been the scene of several large propaganda meetings of late. The Link and Universal Brotherhood Federation have organized several meetings in that hall, and at the Scala Theatre."

What's Wrong With It?

Some think the name "Spiritualism" should be changed into something new and happier. A recent letter states . . . "it seems that Spiritual Science" might be appropriate. "Psychic Science," I do not like, as it does not appertain to the highest. To quote from "Counsel from the Heavenly Spheres," by H. B., "many people seem to confound the psychical with the spiritual. Psychical development, is by no means synony-mous with spiritual unfoldment, but then both are combined in a perfect balance, and sympathetically evolved and trained, then the individual becomes a great force for good, both in this world and the next."

Now all these suggestions are meant well but in the first place, there are many organizations — all out-and-out Spiritualist organizations-that already use the two above suggested names, but the general opinion-and I have heard some opinions expressed in public, also to private groups and from Spiritualist platforms-is to LEAVE IT ALONE.

It is true, the name Spiritualism has been dragged through the mire by public prejudice but in spite of the stigma which has apparently become attached to it - as some believe - it will vet emerge from the fires of ignorant super-stition and opposition to its rightful

place as a Philosophy of Life.
Frankly, I cannot understand
the term "Spiritualism" so o so often arouses such strong animosity and con-demnation. Every religion must have some "Spiritualism" in it. Possibly this animosity is because it is often inden-

What They Thought In 1852

The stamp certification was dated Feb. 22, 1852

Malden Bridge, Feb. 22-52

Dear Brother:

"I have obtained a large pamphlet ublished at Auburn I don't now published recollect the title, which gives a par-ticular account of the origin and progress of the (so called) Spiritual rap-I have also two pamphlets and a volume entitled the Great Harmonia, published by Andrew Jackson Davis re cently, on the subject of philosophy of Spiritual Communications He mentions the pamphlet published at Auburn and agrees with the ideas therein

"His ideas and opinions conflict so what with some passages in the Bible but I think not materially to detract from the merits of the scriptures. The Bible may, and no doubt does, contain some error and, as this is an age of

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improvement, I think we should not object to a better light but go for a progression in knowledge in this as we are led to believe we shall in another sphere of existence

"As I have had some experience in Magnetism, I profess to have some knowledge of its principles and its effects and I know there is something in it which is wonderful and somewhat inaccountable and especially to a misinformed person, but since reading the above mentioned works it appears more plain and rational.

Secure this internal conviction first, then add the illustration.

'In a few brief years more Clairvoyant, healing Impressional, and writing mediums only will be known— men will have reaped a harvest of evidence. The testimonials of hundreds of thousands could then be secured. Per-sons, considered skeptics, will read with earnestness. The churches will grad-ually become powerless. Skeptical minds will get their questions answered outside of churches.

"Then the Churches will come to you.

Be careful, my friends, lest you forget and go to the Churches. Do not be absorbed by them. There is danger in ming too popular!

"Beware, when the churches begin to consider it profitable to invite you to take a seat in their beautiful compartment. Accept this and you are on the road to annihilation. 

iar with its appearances. The fact of its being burnt out and driven from the home it loved, was her first concern. This involuntary exclamation had a surprising and utterly unexpected effect. Looting. shooting and murder was the order of the day, but to tackle a spirit and offend a visitant from the unseen world was something different. The whole crowd just turned tail and fled.

The family felt forever grateful to the kindly spirit which had so wormed its personality round the girl's heart that it came first to her mind in the hour of peril.

Not all spirits are unpleasant, though human beings generally have an inborn dread of living in a haunted house. A friendly and quite unalarming spectre is no less a person than the foster mother of Edward VI. Mistress Sibel Penn, who has appeared in recent years —always gowned in her long grey dress.

In my Autobiography "THAT REMINDS ME," I described how she was mistaken for the housekeeper by a guest in an Apartment at Hampton Court Palace, but since writing that incident I have heard she appeared to a child in a house at Hampton-on-Thames, called "Penn's Place." This residence was given her in order that she might end her days in leisure and peace. Friends of mine who own it now say their little girl at the age of three described the lady in grey who came and stood by her bed at night.

Devitalizing Color

I also learned just recently that Mistress Penn was seen in the same grey gown in Hampton Church by our late Verger. He was familiar with her features as her life sized recumbent figure, in marble. lies just inside the South door, under a stone canopy, supported by Corinthian pillars. She died of smallpox in 1562. I have not heard before of an authentic spirit making several appearances always dressed in the same color and I think few living people realize how color affects their temperament and has a psychic bearing on health and well being.

It is not "faddy," as many

Kilner's Experiments

We should fly from colors that depress or repel us as from a disease. People known as "sensiease. People known as tives" are specially influenced by color, which depresses or exhilarates as the case may be. Psychics say the love of yellow indicates a controlled and practical mind. I glow in the company of yellow, yet I know a woman who is leaving her furnished flat simply because it has yellow walls.

The science of color is worthy of deep study. If you look into the matter you will find each of the seven colors of the spectrum— violet, indigo, blue, green, yellow, orange and red, has something to say to your spiritual side, which can disturb or stimulate the lifeforce.

Clairvoyants who see curas tell us that flame color quivers round highly developed individuals. Dr. Walter Kilner, a notable man, proved scientifically that when humans were looked at through a Kilnerscope, they fell into different color groups, so it is feasible that if you detach yourself from your right group, you suffer accordingly.

"Observations"

For instance, if you find you definitely prefer wearing a cer-tain shade, it shows the inner man is craving for that color, which calms and satisfies the consciousness, so why not try a color-cure as a change from chemist's drugs? Have you ever noted how color comes into general conversation?

In my latest book "OBSERVA-TIONS," I mentioned how admirably light colors suit Queen Mary. Last summer she was seen gowned and hatted entirely in pink of a delicate shade. I added: "If she selected that color it can be taken for granted it was the "pink of perfection," since she always dresses in excellent taste.

Many think their lives are governed by the stars, but I firmly believe our destiny is mingled with the color influences surround-We look up at the midnight blue of a sky, spangled with

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the diamonds of Heaven and their silver sheen thrills us . Those "candles of the night" appear so beautiful, that we almost hear them singing as they shine, they wear the sweetest shade of all.

The quality of silver is often used in conversation—"a silver tongue" for lovely speech, for wealth—"born with a silver spoon in the mouth" and we all look for the cloud with the "silver lining."

I often think how the amazing colors and celestial music of the spheres will rejoice our sight and hearing when we pass on!

ways manifests definitely as a spirit, is foremost in the life of Mrs. Becker. From the spirit side of life, he now helps her over many rough places and unfailingly re-

sponds to her every call.

Now, some will ask these ques-In the beginning was this Indian a spirit who had the power to materialize himself? Was this Indian able to build a human body whenever such was needed? these manifestations occur for the evolution and help of humanity?

If these questions are not answered in the affirmative then how could this Indian hold a body together for such a length of time?

These manifestations will probably never be fully understood by those in the mortal body. But then, can we explain exactly how the wind blows? Can we explain exactly just how we eat and assimilate our food? "Can we explain how life can remain in a seed that has been entombed for centuries?

Precipitated Painting

Records show that seeds, buried with Egyptian mummies for centuries, have been brought out of tombs-planted and developed into great fields of grain.

Oh, Great Mystery of Life—we mortals ask for light and wisdom we are but children in the eyes of God

The story about the Indian and many more were told me in Cali-fornia by Florence Becker during my recent visit to her residence in San Francisco.

Throughout her career as a medium, Mrs. Becker has conducted developing classes for spiritual unfoldment. I was told that during class. Mrs. Becker's teacher, Dr. Briggs, announced he would like to try to produce some unusual phenomena. He requested that canvas be purchased such as used by artists for oil paintings—and that they prepare a frame and tack the canvas to it.

They followed these instructions and the canvas, tacked to a frame as directed, was brought to the class room. After a thorough ex-amination, the students securely pinned it in black sateen. There were no paints of any description in the room.

Rare Phenomena

The lights were extinguished, the medium was entranced, and the class work continued as usual. At the conclusion, when the spirit teacher was about to dismiss the students, he told them to be very careful of the paint as it would have to dry. Dr. Briggs also in-

structed them to keep it, as much as possible, in a dim light at least several days.

After the shaded lights were turned on, you can imagine the amazement and delight of the students as well as the medium, when they found a beautiful picture had been precipitated on the canvas whilst beneath these black cloths

I met several people who were present when some of these remarkable paintings were produced. In the home of many students in San Francisco these precipitated paintings are their most treasured possessions. This phase of *Mrs. Becker's* mediumship is truly remarkable but, owing to her extreme modesty, comparatively few people, on "the outside," have ever seen or heard about it.

Lollie's Symbology

Another impressive feature I noticed, in Mrs. Becker's home, was her valuable collection of elephants that have come to her from all parts of the world. This immense collection includes specimens made of jade, ivory, crystal, china and other materials. The elephants vary in size. Some are so tiny a magnifying glass must be used to see them. Amazing, but true. Others are quite large, probably two to three feet in

Famous men and women who have sat in seances with Mrs. Becker have contributed to the collection which now numbers into thousands.

Lollie, her beloved spirit childguide, is particularly fond of these clephants, and the entire collec-tion really belongs to her. In Lollie's symbology, the elephant means peace, exemplified when the elephant's trunk is upturned-and she will not have a single elephant whose trunk is not flung high.

The Children "Have A Time"

To reach Mrs. Becker's sanctuary, we went downstairs to the first floor level. Incidentally, practically all of the San Francisco homes are so built that the first floor level is the basement, so if one is entering from the street, the door would, therefore, open directly into a foyer.

Mrs. Becker has two seance rooms. One is very large and will seat about thirty or forty people, whilst the other room is quite small. Both are entered from the foyer. It was in the smaller room that we sat for our private seance.

From time to time, throughout the entire day, whenever condi-tions made it possible, Lollie would speak a few words to us in independent-voice. Evidently she

was eager and ready to chat, because, immediately after the lights were turned off, we heard independent voices in gleeful conversation. These proved to be my little spirit child-guide *Pink Flower* and Lollie.

Independent Voice

The characteristic greeting from Lollie is a jolly, cheerful "Hoo! Hoo!" for everybody. During the greater part of this scance, Mrs. Becker was not entranced hence she, too, could enjoy and participate in the conversations with the spirits.

These manifestations are natural and especially convincing for the uninitiated. There is not a shadow of a doubt that the voice is that of a spirit and not the me dium. In some instances, as additional evidence several voices were heard at the same time. At this point, I was intrigued by spirit who was able to produce a unique sound . . . sawing wood. This continued for several minutes, then a rasping noise—denoting that the sawer, had struck a knot in the wood.

My Mama, Annie E. Ewing was one of the first spirits to communicate and express her joy for the opportunity to speak. She was opportunity to speak. She was able to create beautiful spirit lights which radiated sufficiently us to distinguish outlines of the three of us-Mr. Fressing, Mrs. Becker and myself. We were actually able to discern each other in the pitch-dark room.

Startling Evidence

After others had expressed their greetings, a most dramatic entree was made which proved to be a most powerful spirit. The room
—walls—chairs — floor, vibrated though a slight earthquake might be taking place. Then, a strong resonant Indian voice spoke saying: "I am White Feather. I posed for my portrait with an artist in England. I am well satisfied with the results. I have come to bring power and peace. There is great work to be done." This was most evidential, see article page 12.

Several days before we left for California, we'received from S. A. MacDonald, London, England, a number of beautiful pastel paintings of various guides. Amongst these pictures was one of White Feather

During the winter months, from time to time, while in meditation,

I saw a certain Indian. This Indian wore a magnificent white headdress, and gave his name, White Feather. Naturally, I was pleased to have this corroborated and I was doubly blessed to have been given such evidence. To be sure this was the same White Feather. (See Picture, Page 12).

Not one word concerning these astels had been mentioned to Mrs. Becker and as a matter of fact, we had not discussed the pictures with anyone outside our office staff in Lily Dale, several thousand miles from California. For the skeptic, this data should have remarkable evidential value.

A gentleman (see Page 1) well known amongst Spiitualists the world over, spoke to us. He was Dr. J. M. Peebles. These things are done by the ower of God working through you; but you can not become the demonstrator of this power if you hold one unkind thought or if you are one of those human beings constantly criticizing and seeing the mediocre things in life. Linless you become so big that your vision does not see these things, unless you accept only the broad, beautiful things, unless you can accept the divine within every human being you meet and see him as a spark of the individual manifestation of God, you cannot do these things. Faith must be established, and that is one of the fundamental principles of Modern Spiritualism.

Why Can We Believe?

Now why do we have faith? Because we know that we are in direct touch with God. I do not believe in God: I know God. And you, too, may know God and be in direct touch with Him constantly, enjoying the beautiful things of life more fully and more spiritually, finding the worth-while things that make for real and lasting happiness, and freeing yourself from those things which are merely objective and which in every sense of the word keep you tied down. This can be your inheritance.

Why can we believe? Because we know that from time immemorial, God has never closed the gates to the children of the earth, and that He has always spoken to them. He has spoken to the hu-man family, through various sources, one of the chief of which is ministering angels who are sensitive to vibrations and can convey messages to the earth plane.

Just as the radio today picks up voices wherever they may be upon wave lengths of vibration,

just so the human mind may be attuned to catch the vibration of these angel voices. Both Paul and Christ were the recipients of the visitation of angels in a far-off day. The very birth of Christ was foretold, guarded over, and directed by ministering angels.

All Are Guided

It was through the care of ministering angels that the life of Jesus was protected. Joseph in dreams heard the voices, others heard the voices, Mary heard the voices, and they were directed what to do and when to bring the Christ-child back to his own coun-That is why in the early days we were told to pray to our guardian angels. That is why to-day some of us pray to the saints and those who have gone to the higher realms of spirituality. The church has already given us this knowledge, but it has not perfectthe knowledge which it God never said that we could not have this knowledge.

God is not going to do something for you unless you do some-thing for yourself. Because of your desire and because of your effort to accomplish the thing desired, the angels of light on the Other Side, knowing your desire, hearing your prayer, and seeing your effort, surround you with every possible care and help you to accomplish the things you de-sire. They make it possible for doors to open for you at the right time. But you must have faith, and you must continue to have faith, letting your faith become your consuming thought, energy, and life.

In your prayers you make mis-takes by saying, "I have prayed for this and nothing happens." God Don't pray for this or that. Your already knows your need. ministering angels know what you want and your angelic friends are already making preparations to have your prayers come true.

Instead, let your prayers be for the good of ALL and not for ME. In our praying and believing that we shall receive that for which we pray, we should pray for all man-kind everywhere, that they may receive solace and that their lives may be joyful.

At night time, in the silence when the day is ended and you have come to God, listen for the voices of angels talking to you. May you hear them as did Jesus of Nazareth and ever have the watchful care of a ministering one who helps you and guides you. Surrounded by loving angels, may you be directed to peace, to love, and to conscious association with God.

CASSADAGA

Cassadaga Camp, located at Cassadaga, Florida, amid the pines and lakes, proved of interest to hundreds of guests this past sea-son. (January, February, March,

The hotel, overlooking Spirit Lake, was capably managed by J. M. McGill and wife, Margaret.

Around this modern, comfort-

able hotel revolves a story of Spiritual upliftment; perhaps forming the basis of warmth and good fellowship which seemed to prevail throughout the camp.

On February 6th, the Cassadaga On February oth, the cassauaga Woman's Club celebrated their 23rd birthday with a George P. Colby Memorial program, in honor of the founder of Cassadaga Camp, who was born at Pike, Alleghany County, New York, in 1848.

How It Came About

As a child in Minnesota, Mr. Colby followed the path of the truth of Spiritualism. At the age of twelve, it was prophesied he would someday found a center of psychic faith in the south.

Early development soon led to outstanding mediumship, and to seances conducted by the youth throughout America, from the eastern shores, as far west as Oakland, Calif.

At the age of twenty-seven, Colby's remarkable demonstrations of mediumship were brought to an abrupt halt, as the ravages of tuberculosis took their toll of his

Retiring to Florida for his health, he arrived by boat at Blue Springs, then only a wood yard, and, with the Gidding family who had accompanied him, occupied a deserted house near what is now known as Orange City; Deland, Lake Helen, and the former city not having been in existence at that time.

Cassadaga Is Born

Wandering through the wilderness, he climbed a low hill, staring at the scene below, the shimmering lake surrounded by towering pine trees heavy with needles and moss. And Cassadaga Camp was

Discovering a deserted storage crib, he placed logs across one corner, moss formed his mattress and the sky was his covering. An open fire on the ground was his fireplace.

Other than a narrow gauge from St. Augustine to Tatoi, there

were no railroads south of Jack-sonville, Florida's gateway city, and George Colby's only means of obtaining food and mail were from Enterprise or Beresford, the distance being traveled by foot, a tir-

ing chore for an ill man.
Regaining his strength and recalling the medium's prophecy, Mr. Colby renewed his fight for Spiritual survival, and in 1893 held a three-day meeting in a tent borrowed from the East Coast Railway, acting as lecturer, singer and message bearer.

Featured Mediums

Capturing the interest of the Lily Dule, New York, Spiritualist Assembly, which was then the Cassadaga Lake Free Association, he was assisted by members of this great organization in creating the Southern Cassadaga Spiritualist Assembly. With his donation of thirty-four acres of his homestead land to be used as the site of the assembly, the camp was completed in 1895.

Following a full recovery, which he attributed to the drinking of the Cassadaga spring water, George P. Colby lived to the ripe old age of eighty-five, crossing to the Spirit side of life in July of 1933. His home was purchased by Mr. and Mrs. V. M. Alderman, and can still be seen, as well as where his storage crib was located. Like the waters of the spring which continue to flow, the spirit and

courage of this magnificent medium lives on in all who enter his haven of truth.

Outstanding demonstrations of psychic phenomena were displayed at this southern

camp during the months of January, February and March, by the noted mediums, T. John Kelly, Arthur Ford and M. McBride Panton.

A Rare Exhibit of Exquisite Psychic Pastel Drawings Sketched by S. A. Macdonald, Noted English Medium Will be on Display During the Summer at Lily Dale

The six pictures, printed above, are reproduced from photographs of the original pastel drawings, sent to the editors of Psychic Observer by S. A. Macdonald, psychic artist, 27a Addison Gardens, London, W. 14, England.

No. 1 - RED FEATHER, according to Macdonald's description attached to the original, was sketched after contact had been made with this Indian -immediately following his (the artist's) reading of an article in Psychic Observer. This contact was verified during a sitting in his own seance room. During the manifestation, Mr. Macdonald explains how he was shown an enormous red light-similar to a hand torch. Two and one-half days was the time required to paint this pastel.


No. 2-PINK FLOWER is a difficult time-study with an astral background. It was made possible only after Macdonald's clairvoyant vision. Time required,

No. 3—SISTER MARIE of the WHITE SISTERS required only twenty minutes. The artist calls this a "quick sketch."

No. 4-CHANG FOO LI is a quick sketch but required 11/2 hours time. This Chinese Philosopher was painted as a result of a clairvoyant vision which appeared after Mr. Macdonald read a letter received from Juliette Ewing Pressing. It was this Chinaman who manifested though the trance instrumentality of Rev. Richard Zenor, (See Psychic Observer, May 10th, 1947) pastor of the Agasha Temple of Wisdom, 353 North Western Ave., Los Angeles, California. Rev. Zenor could not possibly have known about the picture. The Chinaman gave his name and described his own picture in detail-one of the most evidential messages ever received by the editors.

No. 5-WHITE FEATHER, the Indian spirit who manifested through the direct-voice mediumship of Rev. Florence S. Becker. This pastel required three days. It is a time study . . . done as a result of a clairvoyant vision after contact was made with a letter received from Juliette Ewing Pressing (See article starting page 1)

No. 6-BLUE BELL, a quick sketch. Time 30 minutes. She was seen by the psychic artist during a seance, at which time she conveyed the message that she came with PINK FLOWER and loved to help her medium, Mrs. Pressing, with the colors . . . meaning that in her selection of color combinations around the home, she was always there and likes to "impress" her. Macdonald at Work in His London Studio



SPIRIT PICTURES PRODUCED BY PSYCHOMETRY

The six pictures appearing on this page were done by means of psychometry, an unusual gift possessed by MACDONALD, in addition to his artistic talents. Either by handling a letter, envelope or handkerchief, or all three, he is able to pick up certain psychic flashes . . . not unlike objective clairvoyance. This help, coupled with his intuitive gifts make it possible to sketch likenesses of spirit guides and teachers of those from whom he receives certain tangible objects.

According to communications received from Macdonald, "quick sketches" are usually made in profile. Front view sketches, taking considerable time, are called "time studies". All pictures are liable to smudge but, if framed immediately, will last up to 100 years.

Macdonald is a popular London psychic artist. He conducts tours through the British Isles and at these appearances, exhibits pastels, lectures and demonstrates his psychic gift.

Before the editors of PSYCHIC OBSERVER deemed it wise to accept advertising from Macdonald, they asked for a sample of his work and were told to follow instructions. JULIETTE EWING PRESSING then mailed a personal letterhandkerchief. The results are shown on this page.

Since publishing Macdonald's pastels in PSYCHIC OB-SERVER, the artist has received numerous replys from readers. No price was mentioned and, not knowing the actual worth of pastels, he was reimbursed with various small sums. This was no fault of the reader.

In London, Macdonald's fee for sketches varies. Twenty-five to fifty dollars for the "time studies" on French or Italian "Ingres" paper, size 24 in. x 19 in. Those prefering smaller sketches on paper 15 in. x 20 in., the fee is from ten to twenty dollars. The difference in price is accountable because the twentyfive dollar portrait in full color is without the astral background. It is far more difficult to do the sketches at a distance than it is when sitting for a group of five to eight people, says Macdonald.

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
