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EXICO ME MEDIUMS

Having completed the account of "My Trip To California," the article to follow covers my visit to Mexico, particularly Mexico City and the surrounding places of interest . . . including my experiences with two Mexican mediums and the general progress of Spiritualism in that section of the country.

Mexico can be proud of her past, but today, antiquity walks along the road of modernity, yet always will strange garbs and customs linger.

After a wonderful sojourn in California, we boarded a non-stop, or what is called a non-stop aircraft for Mexico City. The uniqueness of the scenery caused it to be an interesting flight.

After flying over miles of arid desert, we dropped down for a short time at Tuczon. Arizona. Quite a crowd of people, who appeared to be on holiday, awaited the arrival of the plane.

The next stop was El Paso, A commodious and completely modern lounge, res'aurant and ticket offices are housed in a new Building which was under construction. Even at this point the old world atmosphere could felt-the architecture murals were definitely Spanish.

First Stop-Monterey

All passengers entering Mexico have to go thru the customs at this point. From here, the snow capped mountains of Mexico beckon the traveler to this land of sunshine, gaiety, religion and antiquity.

After hours of flying over snowcapped mountains, and what, from a great height appeared to be limitless oceans of sand, we approached the beautiful and colorful city of Monterey. As the aircraft swooped down, some thirty people, including uniformed offi cers, Americans and a number of Mexican natives rushed out to watch the landing.

It was here we first learned to exchange American money into Mexican pesos when we paid for sandwiches and coffee. Here one begins to feel the lure of this fascinating, romantic country, so we were glad to hear the signal calling us aboard for Mexico City.

At "The Reforma"

Upon arrival at the airport of Mexico City, again we submitted to a sketchy going over by the customs. Having already secured reservations at the *Hotel Reforma*, on the Boulevard Reforma and with a personal letter of introduction to Senor Antonio Perez, we immediately drove to the Hotel. Mexico land of flowers—Senor Perez had our room extravagantly decorated with vases of Red Roses, Gardenias and Madonna He extended to us his good wishes

for a comfortable stay in his hotel.

Inasmuch as neither of us could speak *Spanish*, we immediately telephoned our friend, *Miguel Marquez*, who is Mexico's cham-

pion three - cushion billiard player. Mr. Pressing met him in New York City and Chicago some time ago.

Senor Marquez i m mediately came to our hotel and took us to a night-club where he selected for us a dinner of typical Mexican

food.

As our time was necessarily limited, we asked Miguel's advice as to the "musts" a traveler should see in Mexico City and surrounding territory. The following day he engaged Juan Perez, a highly educated Pueblo Indian to serve as guide and interpreter.

We obtained a car and wore driven over La Paseo du La Re-forma Boulevard, one of the most beautiful and one of the most famous city drives in the world. This great thoroughfare reminds me of the broad boulevards of Paris. It is adorned with monuments and flowers. In one circle, is the bronze equestrian statue of Charles IV ranked by Humboldt

as the second finest statue of its kind in the world. It was designed by the Spanish sculp-tor, Polsa and cast in Mexico in 1803. It weighs almost

30 tons. Then there is, at the end of this Boulevard, the Chapultapec Castle and gardens. This castle was begun in 1783 but was not finished un-til 1840.

Finally after our drive of about four miles, we reached our e stination, Xochimilco Gardens. It is a very interesting spot. Canoes can be had by the hour and the natives come up along side the


boats (see picture), and offer for sale, their various wares, such as pictures made of flowers and birds feathers. Wonderful corsages of orchids, camellias and gardenias are ob ainable for a mere pittance.

the canoes glide along the smooth still waters, natives come alongside in flat boats, playing haunting Spanish melodies on na ive instruments, guitars and the like. For a few cents they follow you down the canal and continue the serenade. After our ride on the canal, we stopped in the Maria Candelaria Restaurant where we had a delightful luncheon. the veranda we could see the natives. The Mexicans are a very happy people.

"Pyramid of The Moon"

Our next stop was the pyramids. The larger of the two pyramids is called the "Pyramid of the Sun' whilst the smaller one is "The Pyramid of the Moon'. The history associated with these great pyramids of Mexico is entirely too lengthy to relate here, but I think it would be well worth anyones

while to obtain some of the books on early Mexican history and gain a superficial knowledge, at any of these great historic pyra mids that are in our own hemis-

Also, this day, we visited what is considered the most sacred shrine in *Mexico*, erected to our *Lady of Guadalupe*. On the spot -legend says-she converted the Indians tilma (zarate wi'h a hole in the middle for their head) into a beautiful cloth bearing her image, which is still preserved in a frame of pure gold and enclosed by solid silver.

Shrine of Guadalupe

In this magnificent cathedral, thousands of fai'hful followers of the great lady were to be seen in prayer. One of the reasons for the large crowd was due to the fact that it was during Holy Week that we made our visit to this Shrine.

One of the most colorful and interesting spots, that I saw, was the market place, which ran about a full city block just outside this Shrine of Guadalupe. Little stands with tent-like covers, were filled with all kinds of wares—silver novelties, bits of jewelry, pictures made of feathers and attractive little bits of art, rosaries, dolls, baskets, chairs and every other thing that you could possibly con-ceive of, made by the *Mexicans* are offered for sale.

I Meet A Medium

On metal slabs placed over burning coals to form a hot plate, vendors were frying little Mexican cakes-tortillas-which are being purchased and eaten by the natives as they walked about the market place.

Stall after stall was filled with beautiful flowers. I was particularly impressed with the thousands of Calla Lilies sands of Calla Lilies — perhaps this interest was caused by my having seen, some hours earlier, natives picking armfuls of these exquisite flowers and placing them in all their delicate beauty in little burro-drawn carts to take to the market place, where thousands would be purchased and offered in loving tribute at the shrines.

Arrangements were made for our guide to join us again in the evening when we were to keep an appontment with a Mexican Medium, Spiritualist Lenora Maria Stella Sedyde, Tlaxcale 62 Mexico D.F.

Two Spiritualist Societies

A black wrought iron gate barred the entrance to the courtyard of this home. Before we could enter, her young sons came and unfastened the chains, securing those heavy iron gates. re then led to the living room, where we were graciously received by Signora Sedyde and her entire family.

Our interpreter made it possible for us to converse them and we learned that Signora Sedyde is an automatic writer. She told us there were two Spiritualist Societies for meetings and demonstrations in Mexico City.

ion, very fortunately, I received one of my flashes of clairvoyance. For the moment, I do not recall the names, but I do know that in order to pronounce them, I was obliged to spell them out to Juan, who in turn relayed the message and descriptions to Senora Sedyde. The entire family clapped
their hands in glee and said the message was pleasing. They thanked me over and over again. As a mat'er of fact, they, each in turn came over to me, patted me on the shoulder and smiled hap-

A Rare Apport

A trip to the village of Taxco, pronounced Tas-co is a "must" for anyone visiting Mexico. About a hundred miles from Mexico City, over rolling hills and hairpin turns, one drives to what is called the Tropical Paradise of Cuernavaca.

Here Aztec kings maintained their summer homes. The Spanish Viceroys spent half their time in the town and now official Mexico and others maintain homes where they spend their week-ends.

The outstanding beauty spots are the Borda Gardens, the palace of Cortez with murals by Diego Riviera, the San Anton Falls and the Pyramid of Toepanzolco. The Cathedral dates from 1529.

Though this is another story, several years ago, during a direct



roice seance with Clifford Bias, Chesterfield, Indiana, I received from the spirit, an apport (See pic tures, left). It was a cross, beneath the figure of the Christ, there was a skull and cross-bones. I was born on a farm in the northwestern part of Iowa in the great corn belt of the United States. Was always of an analytical trend of mind and very much interested in the age-old question of Job, "If a man die shall he live again?" It is the inborn nature of an animal to cling to life, therefore I was naturally interested in a life to come, if there was such a thing.

Went to many different kinds of churches and listened to numbers of lectures but could find nothing in their philosophies that would throw any light on the subject. The

In the spring of 1925, a neighbor asked me to attend a meeting with him which I did, not knowing that it was to be a Spritualist meeting, one that was to change the whole course of my life. never investigated this line of thought as you will find that the majority of Spiritualists · hide their light under a bushel," and are apparently loth to talk about the great TRUTHS of SPIRIT-UALISM, apparently afraid they will be thought of as being queer.

I Made My Own Ouest

I went to the meeting with this friend of mine and was singled out for a message, which was of so evidential a nature that it knocked the wind out of my sails. The bearer of the message could not by any twist of the imagination, have had any personal knowledge about me. It had to come edge about me. It had to come from the other side as it was something that only God and myself knew and was something that I had

not thought of for years thus eliminating and possibility of mind reading. This set me to thinking along a different line than I had been used to.

Having received this evidence I went to many different meetings and almost always got unmistak-able evidence. Of course there were some mediums that were not sensitive as others and their work was not so outstanding as some of the better developed ones, but this did not dampen my quest for the truth. I was satisfied that I was on the right course at last.

An Outstanding Medium

Continued to go to meetings until I happened to visit The Golden Gate Spiritual Church, the pastor and guiding hand at this church was and is Rev. Florence S. Becker. There I received more evidential communications and her work was so outstanding that I did not look further, I had found what I was looking for.

My wife made arrangements to join her developing class and attended a couple of terms, and was so well satisfied that I made application and was admitted as soon as there was a vacancy.

Rev. Becker, I soon learned, was one of the outstanding mediums in the United States. In these classes there is a certain amount of oral and written work, after which the balance of the time is taken up with phenomena. This gives the controls, guides and teachers an opportunity to organize their bands to carry on the development.

Rare Phenomena

In the first class, my father and my mother came in with such evidence as no one but they, myself and God knew. I attended several classes and soon found that T would have to throw overboard my former conclusions and start at

Was told that I had mediumistic powers and was determined to go through with it. We were at class when there were four spirit paintings done.

I was one who helped prepare canvasses for the phenomena.

We took four canvasses that were stretched on frames such as artists use in their work. They were wrapped separately in black cloth after which they were wrapped in ordinary paper and sealed. They were then placed on a library table from which the drawer had been removed.

After the lights had been put out, the painting control, who was

of French extraction, asked that the French national anthem, "The Marseilles," be sung. The actual painting of the four pictures was accomplished in three or four minutes at the most. Three of them were of controls or guides of some of the class members and one was a portrait of one of the members the class, a Mr. Slade, this por trait was perfect in every detail.

When we broke the seals and opened the canvasses the paint was still wet. This demonstration alone was worth crossing a continent to witness.

Getting rid of old theories and taking on new ones is no easy job

as I soon found. It wracked me to the very foundation of my being. You think of how in a large measure we have been taught to accept thoughts and theories that serve only to hamper our path on the road to progress.
Unconsciously



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we retain such thoughts and even resent the efforts of those who try to show us that they are unreal and to our detriment. It takes time to loosen the barnacles of hampering thought when accumulated over a period of years.

During the winter of 1929, I was stricken with pneumonia. That was before the advent of the sulfa drug and the doctors could not check the fever and I lay days on the brink. The doctors could do nothing. Mrs. Becker who is also endowed with healing powers came over and went to work.

Etta and Evolyne

In about half an hour I was sweating freely. I got up the next day and went down to the doctor's office, he looked a' me as if he were seeing a ghost and said, "What are you doing here? You are supposed to be dead."

On Dec. 20th, 1936, Rev. Etta S. On Dec. 20th, 1900, Act. E. Bledsoe and her kindly and lovable sister Evolyne Burnside able sister Evolyne Burnside opened a church in Oakland. They also opened a developing class and both myself and wife enrolled with them until the passing of We, however, continued with Evolvne and this was interrupted only when she would go east each summer. We always went back as soon as she returned.

With the amount of trouble and disappointments that have come in the last decade, the guides, teachers and controls have been exceptionally loyal. I have found that if you are earnest and sincere. they will never leave you as long as there is a chance that they will eventually be able to serve humanity through the medium selected. If we on this plane of life were one half as loyal, this world would be a better place in which to live.

Materialization

In materialization for public work there must be a dim red or blue light in the room in order that the people can see the forms as they are built up and come out of the cabinet. They can be self illuminated, but it takes too much of the medium's strength and vitality to do so. The materialized forms, as a rule, talk independently but can also use the trumpet if they like and some mediums keep a trumpet near the cabinet.

There are several different types of materialization that I have witnessed, some the head and shoulders only, sometimes a single hand, as well as a form of etherialization. In this phase they are fully formed but are like vapor, you can put your hand right through them Noted Writer and Author

the same as if they were a cloud of steam.

In trumpet work, the vocal cords are usually materialized inside the trumpet, and upon these the voice vibrations are manipulated. This is the type of the work that my wife is developing. The naturalness of the voice depending upon how well and true the cords are materialized.

For independent voice, the voice box as it is called, is materialized independent of anything else and on this the vibrations are manipulated, and of course upon how perfect these cords are built up pends the tone and timbre of the voice.

We have a son who passed away at the age of 14 months and who is now grown to manhood in the spirit world, also a daughter who was denied earth life, she would now be about 25 years old. She is now grown to womanhood in spirit So far we do not have a light in the room, but part of the forms come out self-illuminated, which

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is a cold silvery light much the same as moonlight.

We have witnessed our son and daughter waltz all 'round a large room illuminated so clear that we could see every detail of their being. It is unusual for the medium to see these forms but as my wife and I do not go in trance, I am grateful to the nth degree to be allowed to witness the forms and hear them talk.

Etta S. Bledsoe is a universal spirit as she says she can do a greater work that way than she could if she attached herself to an individual to work through. Of course, she will always be close to her sister Evolyne and help her and her pupils until such time as they are able to steer their own course. I do not feel that she will ever entirely leave those with whom she was so intimately associated with here on earth. If she did, she would not be Etta Bledsoe to lose all contact with her would be a calamity indeed.

Knowledge Is Priceless

She has brought into the class room hundreds of outstanding mediums and personalities of yester year to witness the phenomena. Her husband, Scott Bledsoe, comes in and voices quite often. We have made a promise to our spirit helpers to dedicate our remaining years to the dissemination of this great truth, and to do the greatest good will mean a great deal of traveling, lecturing and demonstrating at all the great camps all over the country.

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Some few years ago, I asked a number of different Mediums of both sexes what sensations, if any, they experienced or recognized when undergoing Psychic Control and if they could describe same? In almost every case, the reply was similar viz:—that they felt in a vague kind of wav--activity (and here they indicated the place on the body) which was in the approximate region of the great Ganglia, the Solar Plexus.

As far as I can discover, very little mention is made of this Ganglia in Psychic literature except when the writers have been either medical practitioners or Scientists, and one such was *Dr. Lindsay Johnson* of South Africa, author of "The Great Problem."

Equilibrium Necessary


Dr. Johnson recently "passed on." He was quite convinced that the Solar Plexus was the point of attachment of the "Psychic Cord," the connecting link between the Somatic and the Psychical areas, and in this conclusion I am completely in agreement with him.

The equilibrium or balance preserved between the two fields is such delicate sensibility that the slightest disturbance in one is immediately reflected in the other. and so by the study of the two CONJOINTLY rather than as separate entities which is the usual method, we are more likely to arrive at a focul point of common acceptance: at least, we shall not have left anything of importance unconsidered.

Diseased states in the physical will most assuredly bring about important reactions in the Auric

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field which strives to adjust itself to the changed conditions but not always with complete success.

Kilner's Experiments

Much that is interesting has written about the human AURA A, and many are familiar "The Human Asmosphere," that well-known work of Dr. James Kilner, unfortunately out of print at the present time. If I may say so, Kilner's conclusions whilst delightful to trace, appeared to have a certain amount of materialistic conception about them which must

tended to persuade some of those who have studied his researches, to arrive at the conclusion that the AURA was merely a physical ra-diation without any special significance beyond that point.

Had this form of argument been generally accept ed. then much that has followed

Louis S. Vernon-Worsley would have been construed as being almost worth-less and only a waste of time. less and only a waste of time. Fortunately this has not been the

Whilst it cannot be demanded or expected that every Student of Psychic Science must be a *Doctor* or a Meta-Physician, the close association and collaboration of the two bodies does, in my view, call for ... clearer understanding (in a general way) of our physical make-up and how the human "instrument" functions.

It must surely appear like a platitude to say that the intimate nature and the deep reactions upon us of our Psychical field make it imperative that we shall have a good grasp of inter-actional processes. Unless that is the case we shall in all probability fail to discover or understand the causation of certain types of happenings, of which no explanation can suffice which only takes cognisance of physical factors alone.

The Solar Plexus

Such pre-occupations with unilateral investigations is almost cer-tain to lead us to distorted concepts of the REAL purpose under-lying all forms of Psychical activ-

I will try to be more explicit. The Solar Plexus is a Ganglia or a knot or bunch of Nerves situated behind the pit of the Stomach in what is described as the Epigastric Angle. It is an integral part of the Vagus or Pneumogastric Nerve Trunk, probably the greatest of its kind after the Spinal Cord it-It is closely associated with other important ganglia and these "controls" exercise considerable influence in psychical manifesta-tions whether they be spontaneous or induced.

Many people are familiar with e phrase "Solar Plexus punch" in regard to Boxing, but only those who have either actually felt it or witnessed its application can fully realize its crippling nature for a time. It appears to have a paralyzing effect and the recipient invariably falls to the ground as if

he had been hit with a sledge ham-

Recovery from its effects takes varying periods but it not usually followed by any untoward conse-The explanation of this phenomenon is somewhat involved, and perhaps resort to analogy will help to clarify same.

Cross-Currents

Without doubt, the human organism is an extremely sensitive and delicately balanced "instrument" of an electrical character in many respects closely resembling Wireless Receiving Set, Television Apparatus, Sound Recording Mechanism and a Photo-Telegraphic System, capable of carrying "currents" or varying frequencies at one and the same time without interference with one another, very much in the same manner as an electric Cable does.

Let us regard the Nerves as the "wires" of our electrical circuit, or they could be belikened to the "lines" of a system of communi-"lines" of a system of communi-cations such as a Railway. Any event which disturbs the normal working of such systems usually results in paralysis and disorganization. In our human work" we also have work" we also have stationed along the routes "controls" which operate like the signal boxes on the railway, capable of either passing or opposing the passage of "trains" of energy.

Balance of Power

In either case, sudden influxes "overloads" may easily throw out of gear the governing machan-ism and bring about either disorganization or a complete cessation of normal activity.

The mechanical "controls" or "signal boxes" however, differ very considerably from the hu-man "system" inasmuch as whilst breakdown on the former can often be immediately or maybe soon rectified, in the latter case many obscure factors must necessarily have to be reckoned with, which will at times appear to defy all efforts at removal. Apart from this ego, the two systems of control bear a similarity which is remarkable, the Ganglia being regarded as corresponding to "distributive Stations", any suspension of their influence having the most far-reaching consequences upon both physical and psychical fields.

Continuing with the "electrical" human apparatus, just a word about a little device contained in almost every Wireless Set known as a Grid Leak, usually consisting of a tiny tube containing a number of carbon granules which all act independently of one another provided the amount of current passed does not exceed its capacity.

Should a sudden heavy "load" be imposed upon it the granules "pack" or "seize" together, and by

so doing greatly increase the resistance offered to the passage of the energy in question, bringing transmission to a standstill until the excess is removed. In other words, a "choking" effect is in operation, and the line has to cleared before a resumption of activity becomes possible.

In some such way, the Solar Plexus (gateway to the Psychical area) keeps guard over the human system of communications, offering opposition to the passage of excess "loads of energy" to matter from what source they arise. We see evidence of this in the cases of shock which are so often met with in daily life which may be the outcome of direct or indirect violence.

Hypnotic Influence

The process is automatic and effectively shuts off for varying periods of time the intimate connection between the Somatic and Psychical zones, inducing a state unconsciousness which partial or complete. When such condition obtains, we have a demonstration of the cohesive nature of the Nerve Molecules, such affinity acting with the certainty of a switch.

Naturally, both applied violence and other forms of energy differ considerably in degree, and around this point will revolve the resultant amount of disability which accrues in any specific chain of circumstances.

So much then for the ordinary operations of an external objective character, by which we mean, ocular demonstration of certain phenomena, but what of those that are called into play when purely psychical forces — which are not ordinarily demonstrable — are at work resulting in the person affected suffering from a temporary 'suppression" of their own powers of volition, sometimes leading to the commission of acts which may or may not be desirable.

It is beside our point here to go into the mechanism of Hypnotism, although the "Biologized" subject is in exactly the same position as a Medium in the deep trance state, once control has been developed fully.

Under favorable conditions, the incoming psychic "vibrations" are enabled to attune themselves to the prevailing frequency of the Aura of the person it is desired to "imand once this is successfully achieved a state analagous to anaesthesia of a variable character exists in the special sense areas governing sight and hearing, hence the suspension of the Medium's own normal operatons during the period of "trance control"; simultaneously, access is gained to the speech centers for the purpose of giving oral expression to that which it is desired to communito that cate.

Auto-Suggestion

As the process of "impression" advances and deepens the "invadforce is accentuated until the instrument is in a state of noticeable passivity, the special sense now being in complete subjection to the external power. In this somnolent condition, the possibility of the Medium introducing into the proceedings, any personel thoughts or ideas is very remote indeed, so much so that it can almost be ruled out altogether.

Much has been said and written about the ever-present possibility of Auto-Suggestion during periods of LIGHT trance control, this may be due to a conflict which is taking place between the two fields of "vibration" viz:—that of the Medium and the other of the entity desiring to manifest.

It has to be always remembered in this connection that a great deal of the success or otherwise of this kind of control will depend very largely upon the extent of the rapport achieved between the two contributions, and quite obviously, unless there is a good amount of harmony prevailing the results are bound to be disappointing.

Distorted Messages

I think this is one of the explanations of so many unsatisfactory sittings, particularly so when these take place in a room or apartment where there are a number of other pople. Cross-vibrations are bound to be in operation under such circumstances.

It is only reasonable to assume that so many opposing "influences" must of necessity introduce difficulties in the way of "distor-tion," and the only satisfactory way of dealing with such conditions when present, to use a Wireless phrase once more, "tune them

Sometimes this is not easy to accomplish and the interference may ruin the whole proceedings, due to the greater power of the manifesting entity over that pos-

Borda gave to the city the beautiful Cathedral as an expression of his gratitude to God for his great material suc-

Even today, Taxco is considered the silver mecca of Mexico. Doz-ens of little shops flank either side of the cobble-stone streets. In these quaint shops, there are millions of bits of jewelry, for the most part made of silver. Gay colored baskets, woven by the natives, and all kinds of objects cleverly designed from tin can also be seen. could spend a week looking about in these fascinating little stores but our schedule was too limited for us to spend very much time at

"Tony's" Studio

We did visit a very quaint and interesting silversmith, Spratlings, who deal chiefly in large pieces of silverware. The designs are particularly beautiful. Designs which reflect evidence of civilizations and generations about which little is known.

essed by the earthly "instrument." When this is the case, it is far wiser to abandon the attempts to subjugate the "unruly spirit" rather than indulge in freakish demonstrations that only leave everybody present with a sense of frustration if not antipathy.

I will now proceed to outline the process of Control in more detail, in the hope that it may prove of use to Mediums in helping them to assess fairly clearly what is happening from its inception to the conclusion. The "impression" of the manifesting entity passes along the Ray Attachment (Psychic Cord) to the Solar Plexus, and this great Ganglia in conjunction the other two main Centers of activity, the Cardiac Plexus (Heart) and the Hypogastric Plexus (Abdominal), transfer the incoming "waves of Influence to that other great Trunk line, the Pneumogastric Nerve. Having done this, any resistance which may be present rapidly diminishes until the whole of the physical organism is open to "suggestion."

The reactions are immediate and the subsequent developments can be of a variety of identities. First and foremost the respirations undergo a marked acceleration with a consequent increase in the amount of air taken in. This results in a higher oxgenization of the blood and the heart in order to accommodate itself to the extra demands being made upon it may double or even treble its beat-rate.

How They Tune-In

There then follows a corresponding rise in the arterial and venous circulations which induces dilatation of those vessels to accommodate the increased volume and pressure. This is effected through the Vaso-Motor Centers in the Brain—the controlling agency behind all such processes—but the distension of the blood vessels alters the "equilibrium" of the in-strument followed by adjustments in the AURA or mental area.

The Eye and Ear mechanisms are also profoundly affected and become "tuned-in" to 'vibrations" that would otherwise not be "registered" by those centers. It is a higher rate than 50,000 per second, but I cannot say what is the extreme sensitivity of the Eye mechanism in a similar operation.

It is in such a way that they become affected by visual and aural "impressions" that would otherwise not be recognized, and it is

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in the exercise of the functions of Clairvoyance and Clairaudience that this faculty finds expression, with of course, the aid of the speech mechanism to complete the "cyle of events."

At this deep stage it is possible for the "instrument" to be operated in any manner that is desired and extraneous influence now being complete "possession." The Medium's own personal "vibrations" are temporarily suppressed just as again in wireless practice, one "wavelength" is superimposed upon another for some special purpose, as for instance, transmitting the time dots from Greenwich.

Mental Physiology

In this connection, it has always got to be borne in mind how close ly resembling an aerial the human Aura is, extremely sensitive to every "vibration" impinging upon it. It is due to this faculty that we so often experience those strange feelings and desires that baffle explanation, and perhaps an extract from famous book entitled "Mental Physiology" by Professor W. B. Carpenter, C.B. L.L.D. M.D. F.R.S., will help to es'ablish my point even more definitely.

Here is the extract:

"It has been already shown that sense perceptions of various kinds may be excited in the Mind, not merely by be excited in the Mind, not merely by "impressions" made upon the corresponding ORGANS OF SENSE but also by IDEAS by which the Mind becomes possessed THROUGH OTH-ER CHANNELS. It is only necessary to glance at some of the more familiar features of insanity to be assured that the strangest perversions of sense-per-ceptions exhibited by a "Biologised" subject, have their counterpart in those morbid states in which the controlling power of the Will is completely sus-pended, and the Mind is POSSESSED not transiently but ENDURINGLY in some cases, by some DOMINANT IDEA OR FORCE.

"Entirely possessed as he is by the one dominant idea FIXED IN HIS MIND BY ANOTHER, and unable to escape from it by any volitional act of his own, the subject then proceeds to ACT AS DIRECTED by the "controlling influence" whether that force be SEEN or UNSEEN."

That clear statement from so great an authority is surely worthy of our most careful attention, confirming as it does the Writer's belief that such processes are regularly operating around us, and often as we have attempted to show on previous occasions, FOR ULTERIOR MOTIVES OR IM-PROPER PURPOSES.

True Development

That is the field of the Etherite, the name I have given to all Discarnate EVIL influences or entities. The process of super-nor-"impression" is almost identical in either case whatever the motive for the actual "control" may be, and it is just as well that Mediums should always be on the qui vive against "irregular" action of a psychic nature.

Many statements have been made from time to time as regards the necessary qualifications for a good Medium and opinions naturally vary a great deal, but there are two attributes which appear absolutely essential to me, and they are first of all, a good physique and secondly, a Spiritual background. Without these no background. Without these no amount of enthusiasm for giving "demonstrations" on public platforms of alleged powers can possibly compensate for their and in the interests of the public and the Psychic Faculty itself, such activities ought to be restrained until such time as TRUE development has taken place. In order to dispel any idea that I may be prejudiced in this mat-ter, I proceed to quote from "Psy-chic Philosophy" by Stanley de Brath, who also has strong opinions about this matter. Here is what he says:

"Mediumship which comes naturally and is pursued in a wise temper can, (like all other natural powers) be productive only of good; but its forced activity and the constant opening of the organism perhaps out of mere frivolity, desire of gain, personal vanity or still baser motives, to unknown influences and to the various conditions which paid Mediumship may involve, paralyses the Will, ebervates the physical body, and (if not counteracted by purer agencies opening the eyes to the danger), may end by reducing the un-happy Somnambule to the invertebrate passivity of a Jellyfish; or by filling him with a self-conceit which blinds him to the obvious folly of the unpractical course he is pursuing, may leave him Morally if not Mentally unbal-

Law of Growth

"In endeavoring to popularise this great but comparatively unknown subject which has been of incalculable value to so many Minds, by showing them the Law of the growth of the Soul and the Spirit, I wish to call attention to the literal and exact truth of what I am about to state.

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"It is as dangerous for the inprepared experimenter, lightly and in a rashly frivolous temper, to undertake per-sonal investigations in this matter, as for one knowing nothing of chemistry to en-ter a Laboratory and begin unguided experiments nitro-glycerine and the ful-

minates.

"He will be dealing with REAL (though Mental) Forces of great potency, and they may in sober truth, cause to be attached to himself such influences whose power he may feel in ways lit-tle suspected by him, and he may ultimately realize the meaning of the Medieaval student who, by repeating his Master's invocation, called-up the DEVIL, but who could not dismiss his inconvenient attendant when his services were no longer required.

A Broad Statement

"The facts of the case however, still remain unshaken, notwithstanding all the obloquy, derision and denunciations of almost a hundred years. They have prevailed in spite of the worst obstacle of all, the poor deluded people, deficient not only in reason and judgment but also devoid of common sense, who imagine themselves possessed of Occult Powers and the wild nonsense about Planes and Spiritual Electrons. Though ignorant of the simplest Chem-

istry and Physics, they pretent to a knowledge of the machinery of the Universe."

I would not deduct or add one word to that statement which appears to me to be sufficient and complete To some it may seem uncharitable, but anyone who knew Mr. De Brath personally, would not associate any such inention in his work.

"There is one class of human beings who love to live in self-deception and that in all seriousness, not for passing amusements only! Guess who I refer to now! It is the hard-hearted Scientists! Mouthing half truths re-finality, he builds a universe of mechanics without mind, soul or God! Do not Scientists come here?

"They do and then! Their universe tumbles down over their ears and they have to begin anew on some pet theory as foundation! Why do not scientists face facts? Their science is as much a superstition as the old superannuated superstitions of ages and will vanish like a dream when the Divine light of Truth plays against it."

Spiritual Laws which work irrespective of any person's belief. Spirits give gentle guidance and though we are all advanced in in-telligence and culture, what we lack most is the spiritual outlook.

Spirit Communication

Communication between the spirit world and our Earth, we are told is now organized, harnessed, controlled and regulated. What was occasional, not sustained and in bursts of inspiration has now come to stay. It is part of one vast plan, a plan that is far more co-ordinated than we can realize.

The organization that is behind communication is massive and worked out in masterly detail.

It is purely a natural psychic faculty. It is only an extension of the five senses. It touches the psychic factors which surrounds the physical laws. So all mediumship is a co-operation of the *spiritual* and the *psy-*chic and it is in the blending of

the power that you have spirit communication. It does not wholly depend on the psychic faculty of the instrument but in the co-operation of a spirit Guide or control with an instrument.

Though you may have psychic faculties they do not become spiritual faculties until they are used for a spiritual purpose in association with spiritual people in the other world. So it is clear that the physical and psychic faculties should be blended with the power of the spirit to get spiritual gifts.

What They Teach

Survival having been proved and tested, the presence of various graded sorts of Intelligences of different planes having been found true, what then has Spiritualism to teach?

The teachings of all Intelli-

gences to whatever race they may belong or what particular creed they may favor, show that I. man is a responsible Being; 2. that he makes his own conditions; 3. bestows his own rewards and punishments as a natural consequence of his acts; 4. that man can not escape his own good and bad thoughts and though he may slip back a thousand times, still he makes progress at every stage however small it be and then moves steadily forward to the Great Goal.

They tell us we are all children of God, no matter what our beliefs or faiths are or what form we worship, and no one is cut off or damned. We are punished By our sins and not for our sins by an extraneous entity.

The Law of Cause and Effect brings its inscrutable results beautifully expressed in the saying "as we sow so shall we reap."

to his people were withheld by the
inspiring Angelic Intelligences.

It is only when humanity is
highly evolved that all truths appropriate to be known are revealed. Hence revelation proceeds progressively in proportion to the evolution of the soul. Every
