# Henry Slade FAMOUS MEDIUM OF YESTERYEAR

Among the phenomena of Spiritualism, slate-writing mediumship presents features of great interest. This form of phenomenon, was the commonest manifestation in the mediumship of *Henry Slade*, though partial materialization, telekenisis, and the passing of matter through matter, were fairly frequent at his seances.

A great deal of controversy centered around his work, and it seems clear that the power fluctuated very much, and as with some mediums, he may have tried to simulate phenomena when the power was weak and circumstances offered opportunity of so doing.

The question of forced medium-ship is not the easy one some people suppose, and where genuine phenomena are frequent with any medium, accusations should be taken with reserve, and an endeavor should be made to study all the conditions. It is possible that if this be done, it will sometimes be found that the origin lies in the atmosphere provided by the sitters, who thus become the originators of actions of which the medium is the passive, and generally discredited instrument.

#### Conclusive Evidence

After a successful career of some years in America, Slade was recommended by Mme. Blavatsky and Colonel Olcott to give some demonstrations at the University of St. Petersburg.

Both testified to "messages in-

Both testified to "messages inside double slates, sometimes tied and sealed together, while they lay upon the table in full view of all, or were laid upon the heads of members of the committee, or held in committeemen's hands without the medium touching them." That is conclusive evidence of the genuineness of Slade's mediumship.

mediumship. Slade arrived in England on his way to Russia in July, 1876. He gave many sittings both to Spiritualists and others. Even Frank Podmore admitted that he was profoundly impressed. Slade gave sittings to Lord Rayleigh, and he also convinced Alfred Russel Wallace of the genuineness of the phenomena.

#### Omniscient Magistrate

Nevertheless, Slade was sentenced to three months hard labor, but the sentence was quashed on appeal. The temper, and one may say, the gross ignorance of the times upon these matters are reflected in the attitude of the magistrate, who only allowed four witnesses for the defense, and who stated he must base his decision on inferences from the known laws nature (Omniscient magistrate!), also on the ground of the depositions of Professor Lankester and Dr. Donkin; and this in face of the testimony of eminent men like Alfred Russel Wallace, Serjeant Cox, and George Wild. The egotism of materialistic science is clear in the magistrate's argument.

Slade went to the continent, and while there wrote to Professor Lankester offering to come to England and give him every opportunity to test his powers, but the professor never replied.

#### Passed Away In Michigan


The sittings at St. Petersburg were not very successful owing to the disturbed state of Russia at the time. In December, 1877, Slade went to Leipzig, and a series of experiments was carried out by Professor Zollner. These are reported in his book Transcendental Physics. Professors Fechner, Scheibner and Weber took part in the seances. Under test-conditions, writing was received on closed slates, knots were tied in string which had no ends, and the passage of matter through matter occurred.

Slate visited Australia, where he gave many seances. After this his powers waned. He passed away in Michigan, 1905.

## Visitor From World Beyond Talks To Two Theatine Priests and Two Laics

Catholic Newspaper Publishes Astounding Evidence of Survival Psychic Manifestations and Spirit Voices Experienced

Visitations from the other world that affected two United States citizens who are Spanish-born priests and two of the laity, a man and his wife, have occurred in one of the most extraordinary cases America has ever seen. I received the story from one of the priests.

I have known him for years, and I can see nothing that would permit me to doubt the data. The story involves the Very Rev. in Antonito, Colo., was superior there, and who for some months now has been in Mexico City to establish a new parochial foundation; and Ventura Prieto and Dona Elena Villafana, wife of Prieto.

The apparitions are of Estanislao Prieto, father of Ventura Prieto. The man died March 6, 1946, Ash Wednesday. He has been appearing this year, first as a soul from purgatory, then as one from heaven. The Prietos have both seen him. The priests have not seen him, but have had long conversations with him. Because Father Ordinas has permitted me to write this article, since the visitations were obviously intended to promote the greater honor and glory of God in a public way, and to give an impetus here, as it has been given in Europe by the Fattima visions, to devotion to the Blessed Virgin—this time to the Sacred Heart of Mary. The existence of purgatory has been particularly stressed.

#### No Official Statement.

As yet I have only begun the study of the case, but I have spent an hour conversing with Father Ordinas on his personal experience and frankly, I have been deeply shaken by what he told me. I am in position to pass ecclesiastical judgment on this matter, but I do


#### God and The Universe

Lois came from the kitchen and placed before her sister a moulded glass salad plate, fourteen inches glass salad plate, forthern ments in diameter, a mosaic of lettuce, cress, tomatoes, peppers, anchovies, hard boiled eggs and gay little pimento olives. #### Never Occurred To Me

Now at some time after my return to South Africa from active service in 1919, I enquired about "Klein Ahbraham" from his cousin, with whom he had lived for a short time. At any time since, I could have taken my oath in any court that the cousin told me Abraham's death in the terrible "Influenza" epidemic that ravaged South Africa in 1918.

Since it now seemed that this Abraham had remembered me with affection after all these years, and wished to make contact, I asked through the medium that he be found and produced.

And he was found and produced. It never occurred to me to doubt or question his identity. The little he was able to say was qui'e in keeping; he replied in Afrikaans (South African Dutch) to a question of mine in Afrikaans, which the medium herself does not speak. Also he referred to a roan horse which he had "seen me" riding; this I identified as my beloved roan Paul which I had ridden on the Salonika front in 1918.

#### It must Add Up

Only one thing he said which a little puzzled me, as seeming not quite in character: "I was very fond of you, but I did not think it was my duty to tell you so."

That seemed an odd point of view in the affection of a child of twelve, especially the peculiar expression "my duty". But odd expression "my duty". Before a couple can be married before a priest, they must go to a justice of the peace, who charges outrageously for the service, about all a man can make in 10 days.

Estanislao appeared first to the woman. There was a series of visions, all of course this year, and both the woman and her man saw the visitor.

They Talked With Spirits

Briefly, this is what was demanded. Estanislao said it was necessary for the couple to get married according to the rites of the Catholic Church if he was to be released from purgatory. The son argued that he did not have money enough for the judge. The vision told him to go to another town and see a judge, and to sell what he had to sell in order to get money, but assured him that all would go well.

The couple were to return to Father Antonio (Anthony) for the real marriage. The two went as ordered. On the train they saw the deceased father sitting in a car seat, with a ticket stub stuck in his hat, seemingly put there by the conductor. The spirit talked with them. At the designated town, the spirit telephoned to a judge

to whom he sent the couple. When they arrived at the justice's office, that man performed the civil cere-mony, and then, astonishingly, re-fused payment. The couple were really married before Father

Afterwards the spirit said that he would converse with the priest. He did come - only as a voice. There was a long conversation, in which the spirit said he would answer any questions. In a later vision, the spirit asserted he had spent the night with the priest, after the latter had retired, and as proof he said that Father Antonio had been unable to find his socks the next morning, but they had been rolled up in the sheet. They had been, the priest admitted.

#### What the Spirit Said

The Theatine Fathers, only a matter of months ago, had been given charge of a district with about 25,000 souls between Mexico City and the famous Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe. They intended to build three churches, one in Linda Vista, where the peo ple are better off, and two in extremely poor sections. They thought more funds would be available if the better-off people were cared for first. The church now is a tiny place, in a poor section, but the devotion to Holy Communion and to the Rosary is growing.

The apparition declared that the

churches for the very poor must be built first. The soul was then in heaven, as Estanislao had been released from purgatory when the couple were rightly married (it would seem he had not been with-out some personal guilt in this case.) The church in the section now served by the little chapel (it seats only about 50) must be dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Mary, said the voice.

#### Spirit Speaks to Ordinas

Father Ordinas of Denver was scheduled to visit Mexico City on official business. He flew there from Denver. He was told that the spirit said it would speak to him. Sure enough, the visitation came. Father Ordinas told me that he sat in a room, at evening but when it was still light, and Father An-tonio and the Prieto couple were in the room with him. He set a chair facing his own. He wanted the apparition to take its place there. It did.

For 45 minutes the priest conversed with the visitor. The talk was in Spanish. The woman at all times could see the spirit. men could plainly hear the voice, but could see nothing. It seems to me more wonderful to have things this way than if all could both see and hear. Father Ordinas asked that he be given sight of the visitor for only a minute or so. The reply was: "It is not the will of God."

The spirit said that he would answer all questions, but the four living human beings somehow felt a disinclination to ask much. Fa-ther Ordinas did, however, get some specific information.

#### An Explanation of Purgatory

He had been worried about the novitiate that had to close. Would another location be better? The reply was that the novitiate could be put anywhere and would get candidates. The spirit declared that God was pleased with the work being done by the two priests. Again directions were given about the churches to be built.

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and the priests were told not to fear going ahead.

Most interesting data were given about purgatory. Father Ordinas told the spirit he had heard that there is a daily respite in purgatory at 12 o'clock. Is it at or midday? The spirit midnight answered that it occurs at midday -because that is the time when the Angelus is recited.

For 15 minutes, souls high in purgatory are completely relieved of suffering; but the respite somewhat affects all souls, though it is more difficult for those deep in

purgatory.

Father Ordinas asked about a young priest who had died, whom he and Father Sagrera knew well. That priest, the spirit replied, was in purgatory and suffering terribly.

#### Priest in Heaven

He asked about Father Peter Rinas, a saintly Theatine of Colorado, who died in Europe early in 1947. Father Peter, the spirit assured them, was in heaven.

They asked for some description of hell. The spirit said he had never been there!

At the end of the interview, there was a bright light that flashed outside a window at the

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back of Father Ordinas (no auto shields around to catch reflections). The spirit asked whether all had seen it. All had. He had been sent for to return to heaven, he declared. At the end, all four were elated and happy. The spirit had told them they would be. Nothing occurred in the conversation except what would confirm the truth of the Holy Catholic Church.

Father Ordinas said that he had learned from the curia of the Mexico City archdiocese that Father Antonia had done wonderful work. But, said the Provincial, the priest has suffered greatly because of

conditions he has met.

I know Father Ordinas well.

Most of his people are the very poor. The Denver Theatines live in two little houses joined together. Last year I carried official com-munications between Father Ordinas and the Superior General in Rome, at San Andrea della Valle church. The residence was a large bare monastery. The priests were dressed in the poorest cassocks I have ever seen—the fate of many priests in Italy after the war.

#### Priests Zealous, Normal, Learned

I have often been to Confession to Father Ordinas. I have often talked to him. He is a most normal, most zealous priest. I know Father Antonio. He is learned, he is zealous, he has an ahundance of sound common sense. He built the beautiful Church of the Sacred Heart in Durango, Colo. These men are not neurotics. They personally were astounded by what happened.

The strange visitations have occurred in the 400th anniversary year of the death of St. Cajetan, founder of the Theatines. It will be celebrated in Denver Aug. 7 with Solemn Pontifical Mass. Pope Pius XII himself is the protector of this order, instead of its having a Cardinal Protector. It is known that he will issue an official statement in connection with the anni-

"Otsego (Michigan) - Dillis L. Harvey, Route 1, Plainwell, Michigan, after two years work has invented and received patent rights on a new, im-proved type poultry plucking machine. The machine was preceded by several other models.

Spectators who saw the machine operate at a recent demonstration are prepared to back up his claims. Har-

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vey's machine plucked two chickens in nine seconds and he indicates that it will de-feather a turkey at the same

half feet square, made of welded angle iron and is operated by a half-horse power electric motor. The bird is held in place by inserting the feet into two strong hooks at the top of the machine. A hand lever at the right adjusts the large discs on either side of the rotating shaft, to which is attached a series rubber brushes.
"There is a removable door at the

back of the machine which allows it to be cleaned by simply running a stream of water through it. The maplucks the birds clean of pinfeathers, and that it can be used for ducks as well as for turkeys and chickens."

my horrified amazement at this discovery of what seemed, whatever its origin, to be a barefaced piece of humbug. For it must be grasped that it was not the mere invention of this particular communicator in itself that so discomposed me; it was that I at once asked myself: "If such a thing has happened in this case, then how many more of the fifty or so contacts I have made were similar humbugs and fictions?"

#### Pseudo Abrahams

Of course, the Spiritualist would be almost certain to say that, in such cases, it is a real spirit communicating, but one who, for malevolent purposes of his own, is impersonating. But even supposing ithis to be the case, what reliance can one place on a medium and her guide(s) who cannot detect and protect who cannot detect and protect one from such deceptions? And what reliance can one place on one's contacts being genuine?

In fact, for the moment it seemed to me as if I was seeing the whole edifice built up in the last ten years disintegrating before my eyes.

It is true that this phase of ex-treme discomposure did not last. When I began more calmly take stock, I realised that I had masses of evidence so irrefutable that not a hundred pseudo-Abrahams could explain it away or break it down. Nevertheless, I still felt very uncomfortable indeed; what had happened once might happen twice, might well have already happened twice, or three times, or four: my confi-dence in the genuineness of sev-eral entities whose fidentities it had not been feasible to test scientifically had received a rude shock.

#### What I Did Not Know

Fortunately for my peace of mind, I had a sitting already arranged for two days later. Thereat I at once raised the subject with my chief and most intimate communicator; his identity at least was beyond dispute or doubt. He said that he thought the medium's guide would be better able to explain it than could he himself. "Then", I said, somewhat grimly, I fear, "the sooner she does so the better".

The medium's guide then treated me to a longish discourse about living people leaving their bodies during sleep and functioning on the spiritual plane, and said that it is not by any means unknown-which I know to be true, for that matter-for them to control mediums under such circumstances "My medium here has herself done such a thing.'

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I treated this suggestion with cant respect. "Look here!" I scant respect. said: "If you're trying to tell me that a fifty-years-old farmer in the Cape Colony, whom I've not heard of for thirty-nine years, went to sleep at ten-thirty in the morning and came here and controlled this medium, I tell you candidly it's not good enough".

#### The Usual Difficulty

The Guide said "He may have been ill in bed and gone to sleep.
"What?" I said; "Twice! Twice ill! Twice did this in his sleep, with a year between?"

She admitted that this did not seem likely. "And besides," I said, "he both times came when I called him, and, what more, he would come again in ten minutes' time if I called him again.

"Well', she said, "why not call him again and see what happens?

"You bet I will!" I said; "Now I want M—" (a new contact) while the power's strong."

There was a change of control. "Is this M—?" I asked.
"No. Ahbraham."
"Oh! Indeed! Now who are

### **How To Induce CLAIRVOYANCE**

By J. J. MORSE

Clairvoyance is either independent or induced, but it may be subdivided into the Natural, the Hypnotic, and the Spiritual.

Let me first refer to the hypnotic method. A suitable subject being obtained (and let me here say that suitability is not a question of sex, as quite as many men as women are to be found in whom the faculty can be excited), the hypnotist proceeds, by one of the various methods at his disposal, to induce the hypnotic state, in this case the deep sleep.

If the subject is a clairvoyant, the lucid state will grow in clearness in time with repeated exercise, the customary minor experiments being relied upon for developing and training the sight. This lucidity is capable of being educated. At first it may be uncertain, while, in some cases, it is almost perfect at the first trial.

#### Would-be Clairvoyants

A peculiarity of the case is that clairvoyants differ as to their abilities, just as much as ordinary people do. Some are able to travel to distant places, others cannot "see" anything outside of the apartment in which they are. In some the "sight" only operates when an article to be described is placed in contact with various portions of their bodies, as, for instance, the top of the head, the nape of the neck, the pit of the stomach, even between the shoulders.


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some cases prescribe the necessary remedies. As a matter of fact the medical profession is constantly utilizing the last-named class to assist it in obscure cases. It has been found that in the course of time the services of the hypnotist can be dispensed with, as the subject appears to learn how to induce the sight by personal volition.

The last of the means of developing this "sight" I have denominated the Spiritual, and this brings us into the question of Spiritualism, and involves what is known as mediumship. In this case the would-be clairvoyant joins a spirit circle, and the development is carried out by the spirits. The spirit acts the part of the hypnotist, and the subject in this case is, or becomes, a medium.

#### Andrew Jackson Davis

The mediumistically developed clairvoyant usually sees spirits i.e., so-called dead people, and the testimony to this fact is practically universal today, while many, including my own daughter, in whom this spiritually induced clairvoyance is in active operation. But how much of this form of clairvoyance is due to the action of the spirits and the mind of the medium, is a question not easy to answer.

The one point common to each case is that clairvovance is a latent, but normal, form of clearseeing, mental perception, or soulsight, and I venture to assert it can be brought under the orderly control of the will, and exercised at discretion. In such cases it becomes what my old friend Andrew Jackson Davis describes as the "superior condition," which term he was the first to employ.

### THE GREAT PYRAMIDS

What We Can Learn From Jhom

Timeless and changeless, the great monument of the East has this message for modern man

OCCULT HISTORY AMAZES THE ARCHAEOLOGISTS

EDWARD G. COLLINGE

There is no mystery concerning the origin and purpose of the Pyramids, and the message of the Sphinx is revealed, if we the teaching of Occult history. This teaching is, incidentally, the one which provides the maximum answers to the many enigmas that puzzle the orthodox world and which leaves the minimum num-ber of illogical contraditions.

According to this history, there little doubt that the Emperor Cheops chose deliberately to mislead posterity by giving the impression, in inscriptions on certain stones of the Great Pyramid, that he built it, whereas, in fact, he was responsible only for renovation and repair.

#### Cosmic Hierarchy

In order to provide a brief surof the Occult history associated with the Pyramids, their origin and purpose, it is necessary also to review briefly history concerning Atlantis, the hidden purposes behind the manifestation of the human kingdom at the physical level, and the cosmic machinery concerned with "civilizations." The following is a short and incomplete survey of this history.

The members of the Cosmic Hierarchy concerned with the evo-lution of the Human and Deva Kingdoms, working in accordance with the plan for the solar system (in the multi-dimensional sense) or, in simple terms, in accordance with "the will of God"—arrange and supervise, within the limits of Man's restricted free-will, the individualized Egos cyclically manifesting in form at various levels, the lowest of which is the physical (as far as Man, is concerned).

#### Cycles of Civilization

Arising from this supervision and, in harmony with the pulse of the Universe, "civilization" proceeds in cycles comprising waves or "arcs" of evolution and proceeds involution, each succeeding "peak" civilization transcending the previous, insofar as major cycles are concerned. This process is further complicated by these major cycles having minor cycles su-perimposed upon them.

The last "major peak" was the Atlantean, approximately 90,000 years ago, since which the geography of the world has almost completely changed.

In both the major and minor "cycles" there is the ascending progress or evolution to a pinnacle, the particulars of which are determined by the particular "focus" and purpose intended by the Hierarchy, and a descending or involution, in which, in the main, the reverse of the process occurs The manifesting cycles of devel-oped and undeveloped man, each of his cyclic union with his Overself or Ego, are synchronized with these cycles.

#### 90,000 Years Ago

The glory of Atlantis at its zenith, some 90,000 years ago, is beyond our conception and far more glorious than the spiritual, intellectual, artistic, material and general attainments of the minor cycles such as the historic Egyp tian, Phoenician, Greek and Ro-man, all of which occurred in comparatively modern times during the involutionary part of the ma-jor Atlantean cycle.

There is existing today in Egypt -not far from the Pyramids temple called Denderah. On the ceiling of this building there is a zodiac which, it is agreed amongst astrologers and astronomers alike, can only apply to a period in the world's history 90,000 years ago.

Now, it is fundamentally obvious that the motive for preserving a record of that distant era must have been very strong. The Temple itself is barely 3,000 years old and, obviously, the stones of and, obviously, the stones of which it is built must have been erected by someone who desired to preserve the memory of that era in the form of a Cosmic Calendar: the present temple and zodiac are almost certainly copies of copies, preserved for as long as the elements would permit.

#### Occult Background of Atlantis

It surely stands today as corroborative evidence of the history concerning Atlantis! The zenith of development attained (planned by the Hierarchy) was uch that the manifesting leaders of that era made every effort to preserve for posterity a record, sign or symbol of that glorious period in human history.

The research and findings of Dr. Paul Brunton, in his "Search in Secret Egypt," provide much valuable support for the secret history concerning pre-historic (Atlantean) Egypt.

Let us travel backwards in that man-made three-dimensional convenience we call Time, to this period of Atlantean attainment,

The "motif" of the Occult Plan "cycle for this previous major differed in many ways from the Occult "motif" or principal purpose for the present major cycle which has, comparatively speaking, just commenced, the outstanding features of which have another 'motif.'

#### Etheric Force Used

The accent was on certain astral (emotional) development, refinement and control, in those distant days, and materialism, during that long period of glory, was non-existent; the physical life and material things were regarded as sub-servient to the higher (Egoic) pur-

Thus, the average Atlantean possessed etheric aid, in very many cases, astral "vision," had achieved conscious projection of the astral body and had learned to control and utilize natural forces and to co-operate with the Deva King-(nature spirits). achinery, "scientific" develop-

Machinery, "scientific" development, in its present form, and "modern means of propulsion and use of "power" were largely unnecessary; in other words they achieved many of the results obtained today in a much more efficient and spontaneously natural

They used an etheric force, knowledge of which has been temporarily lost or, rather, purposely hidden during this, the beginning of the evolutionary part of the next cycle, and the name of this force has come down to us in the language of Sanskrit as "Vril."

#### The Aztecs and Mayas

This force or power, fundamental in etheric matter, was used by the Atlanteans of that era to pro-pel their vehicles and levitate their aircraft. Physical travel was, however, not as important as it is today, as conscious projection is the astral body to any part of the world was possible to them and distant friends could be visited and consulted in this way.

Some 90,000 years ago the great continent of Atlantis was spread across the Atlantic and part of the Pacific; and much that is now land, in other parts, was then below water. The Mediterranean coast-line was quite different.

During this era, and after, many Atlanteans migrated East whilst others went West (in accordance with the Plan).

Today, the archaeologists and historians are amazed to find the Pyramids and hieroglyphics of Egypt repeated in South America. Occult history thus explains the fact. "Prediction"

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
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
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Renewing Old Acquaintances

One of the reasons, perhaps, that the close friendship developed between us and the Sharps was because they are well acquainted with Bob Gast, one of my close friends. In fact, we grew up to-gether from childhood in Louis-ville, Kentucky.

Bob Gast was one of the pioneer flyers who went out to open up the China Clipper lines, connecting America and the Orient, as did the Sharp's son Charlie (Chuck). Young Gast lost his life in one of these flights, and Chuck Sharp was one of those who went out to search for his missing plane. Many times I have received definite test messages from Bob Gast since he has been in the land of spirit.

Chuck Sharp was stationed in China for many years so I had never met him personally until this day at his parents' home, where he and his wife are enjoying a well earned rest after the hardships encountered during the long Chinese war.

#### Spirit Guidance

Captain Sharp is very self-effac-ing and did not discuss his brilliant heroics in China. It so happens I have read "China After 7 Years of War" (edited by Hollinger K. Tong, published by Mac-Millan and Company, copyright by Chinese News Service, Inc.) and found that:

At one time the Japanese were moving into Hankow, with Generalissimo and Madame Chiang Kai-Shek still in the city, the Wahan cities — Wuchang, Hankow, and Hanyang—were in flames. In the afternoon, Captain Sharp brought his plane to a landing through these walls of fire. The Generalis-simo and Madame Chiang boarded the plane at dusk, and Sharp took off. Halfway to Changsha, the plane's radio went dead.

Instead of risking a night landing on the postage-stamp field at Changsha without being able to inform the Chinese air defense that the plane was Chinese, Sharp de-cided to return to Hankow. The Hankow field was being mined for destruction. Only Captain Sharp's steady nerve and good luck saved the ship from striking any of the hundreds of mines on the field and the runway.

#### The "Flying Banshee"

He repaired the radio, took off the second time, and flew to safety at Changsha. As soon as the plane departed, the mines were exploded and the *Hankow* field was destroyed.

Captain Sharp, who was operations manager for CNAC, made the first flight over the *Himalayas*, but he is best known to airmen as the pilot of the "Flying Banshee." He was flying a plane to *India* during the evacuation of *Hong Kong*. While landing on the *Namyung* airfield, the plane was machinegunned by *Japanese* fighters. More than three thousand bullet holes were counted after the attack was

over.

There were no repair facilities at Namyung, but mechanics were sent from other places and patched the plane with metal and fabric. Four of the most important instruments on the bullet-ridden panel were repaired so that the ship might fly. The ship did fly.

Under Sharp's firm control it

flew the *Hump* to *India* for repairs. During the flight, many of the fabric patches blew off, and the wind hissed through the holes with a fiendish roar. By the time the plane reached the CNAC Indian base, it way a flying monster, shrieking like a banshee. It has been known ever since as the "Fly-

ng Banshee."


