

He joined the Society for Psychical Research, contributed valuable papers to its journal and proceedings, and was its President during the years 1901, 190, and 1903.

He has investigated with many famous mediums and scores of lesser repute, with the result that he is able to say:

"I tell you with all the strength and conviction I can utter that we do persist, that people over there still take an interest in what is going on here, that they still help us, and know far more about things than we do, and are able

Records show that America has a war every generation. The Revolutionary War in 1775-81; thirtyone years later, the War of 1812-14; thirty-two years later, the Mexican War 1846-48; thirteen years later, the Civil War 1861-65; thirty-three years later, the Spanish War 1898; and nineteen years later, the World War. 1917-18.
