There was great expectation among the many people gathered at Lily Dale, N. Y., last July to see Holland's outstanding sen sitive and trance medium, Jozef Rulof, produce some psychic paintings. Only a short while before the demonstration, a number of persons inspected, and admired. four specimens of Jozef's astral art in the home of Mr. and Mrs. R. G. Pressing editors of Psychic Observer.

There, some of them may have shaken their heads in disbelief when told that even the largest painting, the most elaborate one, had been produced in only a few short hours . . . but now they were to witness for themselves the spiritual and artistic powers of this man.

There was absolute silence when Jozef Rulof was entranced by the as ral painter Yongshi by name, a master artist who lived on earth many years ago.

While nobody was able to fathom what would finally come fom the mass of paint and color under Jozef Rulof's hands, the celestial artist worked on under great concentration and with quiet energy; and when he turned around to show his work to the crowd, not more than ten minutes had elapsed.

This unbelievable feat, together with the surpassing beauty of the painting itself,—spectral white flowers laid down before the Cross of Christ, on a fire-red background—released a tremendous applause from the spectators. And already a new canvas had been started in the meantime by Jozef Rulof's spirit collab-orator . . . resulting in another picture within just thirteen minutes.

And then there was a third one which, too, required not more than thir-teen minutes. It was a fabulous dem-onstration and proof of sublime art executed through superb mediumship.

Who, then, is this man Jozef Rulof? What is the nature of his gifts and why did he come to America?

Jozef Rulof was born in the winter of 1898 at s'Heerenberg, a village in Holland. His father provided for his large family by the work of his hands. Already before his birth, spirit enti-ties seemed to influence the child, awakening his soul so that he would be ready, not only for his later task in life as the bearer of their transcendental knowledge, but also to explain their cosmic laws on earth.

They proved to be spirit teachers. who then shortly after his birth, brought on the phenomenal events which could only be called supernormal manifestations—even by the most critical observ-ers. The child could, at times, leave his body and by certain psychic powers, sojourn in the astral life.

The child seemed to possess the power to predict events which, later on, came true to the letter. Through Jozef Rulof, the child, people seemed to be healed Dutch magazine 'Evolutie'

when his hands were placed upon them. Now and then, the laws of gravity seemed to be defied. It was when Jozef's body rose, or was elevated by 'astral hands" yards above the ground. He spoke with animals and flowers who seemed to communicate in turn with . . revealing their own origin and

In school, to be true, the child did not absorb much knowledge. His own astral collaborators apparently wished astrai collaborators apparently wished to keep him free from all earthly teaching and from certain biased presentations of "truth" which are apt to be detrimental to those whose desire it is to learn about the divine order of things. Later on, spirit advisers directed Jozef to go to the city and it was here that his rich spiritual gifts manifested themselves more fully.

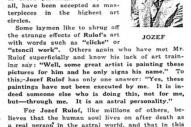
When the Masters, were able to manipulate Jozef's organisms to a certain degree of perfection, they were able to overshadow his personality. At this point, five distinct phases of psychic power were in evidence, (i.e.) Clairvoyance, by sight; Clairaudience, by vision; Impressional drawing; Psychic (trance) painting and Spiritual Healing.

During the course of Jozef's spiritual unfoldment, there seemed to be instilled in him a knowledge of the Other World as pertaining to God's creation. He was impressed to bring, to mankind and to world, the revelations as promised them to him and so, between 1934 and 1945, nineteen manuscripts - in each sufficient data for a complete book,—came into existence. Of these, the six last manuscripts were written

It is striking and surprising to see how Jozef Rulof composes his paintings and lays on the colors with a certainty and accuracy so that never once a line or a color scheme has to be corrected or changed. On one single morning I have seen three satral masters work through Jozef Rulof, each

one employing a different, a peculiar technique of his own, a circumstance which is so much more surprising since they all come through the same medium, Jozef Rulof's hand.

The condition in which Jozef Rulof is doing his painting—and his writing as well—is called by the psychologists a trance, and this trance, this state of independence from physical consciousness has been proved and demonstrated oftentimes to the public, when he performed his artistic work in front of me and many other onlookers.

Then we all saw how his brush worked Then we all saw how his brush worked with purposeful swiftness, creating a maze of lines and outlines so that we were at a loss to say what would come of it, until—in the end—the result developed as a surprise, almost: A picture of surpassing beauty.

I and other witnessex have seen Jozef Rulof paint seascapes"upside down," and also other pictures in a dark room, in a darkness which was for our physical eyes complete, where, however, for Jozef Rulof the canvas was illuminated by a heaven-ply light which made is possible for him to complete his work notwithstanding.

And here is the explanation for the mechanics" of this process. The me-

dium, that is the man who is to serve as the instrument, in this case Jozef Rulof, has been notified by his Astral master that a picture is to be painted by him. Subse-quently he places all the necessary ma-terials and implements in readiness and

waits.

As a rule he does not know what the subject of the painting is to be. This I have observed many times with Mr. Rulof and also, that a painting was produced by the astral master through him entirely different from what he had anticipated. The purpose of this is to effectuate a complete neutralization of the medium's own thinking and feeling so that the astral master can work freely and without inhibitions. Here, the medium's spirit or soul is actually leaving his body, to journey abroad, to soar in the external world, remaining connected with this physical body only by a spiritual tie or ray.

This last remaining connection prevents This last remaining connection prevents his body from coming to actual, irrevocable death; in this way the medium's carthly body stays alive, subject to the orders of the master. This is the most simple and understandable way I can advise to describe this process. As a matter of fact, these are the workings of the Cosmic Laws which are really much more

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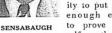

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THE HUMAN AURA

Our true character is "photographed" on the aura. Those who can visualize correctly know that some persons are intrinsically different from what they appear to be.

Some natures are so harmonious as to be veritable centers of love, health and happiness.

By S. G. J. OUSELEY

Of all branches of Occult Science one of the most interesting is the study of the Aura. Speaking concisely, the aura is a subtle, magnetic emanation generated by the etheric and other forces of the being or object with which it is connected.

Everything in nature generates its own aura, atmosphere, or magnetism. The fact is equally true of the lowest crystal and of the living organism, of the lowest and of the highest conscious entity.

To illustrate this point let us consider the common magnet. Around its poles there exists a sphere of influence known as the magnetic field, through which pass lines of force between one pole and the other.

Modus Operandi

The existence of this field is known by the influence of the magnet upon light iron filings; when these are placed at random on a sheet of paper they will respond to the magnet which is held beneath them with contact and will follow the motions of the magnet.

If these small filings are polarized by the magnet there is a remarkable affinity in their motion—they become temporarily imbued with magnetic power.

Supposing that these filings possessed intelligence and could be interrogated, they would probably say that they moved because they desired to do so—they readily followed an irresistible impulse. They would not be conscious of the real source of power.

The more sensitive the filings the greater would be the distance at which their response would take place---consequently the more sensitive would respond readily to impacts which would make no

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effect upon the grosser filings.

Movement of an electrical circuit across these lines of magnetic force converts the motion into power, and this power may be transformed into light, heat, or other forms of energy. This phenomenon is known as induction.

Scientific Proof

In the human organism there are forces analogous to, if not identical with, the forces of electricity and magnetism. Each human being possesses a magnetic field, which is the aura—it radiates from each individual as solar rays emanate from the sun.

The human aura partakes of the essential qualities of the etheric, the astral, the mental, and the spiritual forces of the individual. In a vital sense, every human being creates his own magnetic atmosphere, which unfailingly reveals the temperament, disposition, character, and the condition of health.

Is there any practical and scientific proof of the existence of the human aura? The answer is, its existence is evidenced in various ways

ways.

For example, when charged with high potential electricity, the aura itself becomes electrified, and if a neon or argo-filled lamp then be brought within the "sphere of influence," it lights up. The illumination occurs within a definite boundary which is variable around the body — there is a definite line of demarcation.

Dr. Kilner's Experiments

It may be a matter of inches in one part and possibly a number of feet in another, while there may be rays which can be traced by the lamp projected in a straight line for a matter of five or six feet. In this way it is possible to make a definite mapping out of the aura of an individual. Further evidence of this "sphere of influence" has been provided by the researches of Dr. Kilner.

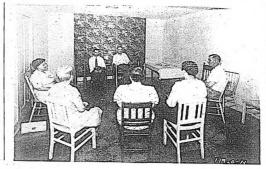
This auric emanation has been known to Occult scientists for a long time under a variety of names. It is the "magnetism" of Mesmer, the "electric fluid' of Jussieu, the "odylic flames" of Reichenbach, the "exteriorized sensibility" of de Rochas, the "vital rays" of Dr. Baraduc.

The researches of these scientific men prove conclusively that all bodies, whether animate or inanimate, emit a subtle radiation. Special sensitiveness is, of course, requisite to detect subtle forces in naure, and the aura, although undetected by the majority of people in ordinary states of consciousness, is detectable and clearly recognizable by individuals in suitable conditions of sensitive-

Clairvoyant sight has from the most ancient times testified to this subtle extension of the soul. The "halo" round the head of a saint is no poetical fiction, no more than the invisible aura or sphere of life radiating from a precious stone.

Sometimes this aura, not restricted to the head, is depicted as surrounding the whole body with a misty glow or luminous cloud. When Moses came down from the Mount with the stone tablets we are told that the skin of his face "shone" so that the people were unable to look upon him. Here is ancient testimony to the aura lit

up by the infinite power of spirit.

Extension of Personality

As each sun has its system of planets revolving round it, so each body is surrounded by smaller centers of energy evolving from the common center and, of course, partaking of the qualities of that center. Copper, carbon, and arsenic, for instance, send out curas of red; lead and sulphur emit blue auric colors; gold, silver, and antimony, green; and iron emits all the colors of the spectrum.

Plants and animals emit similar colors according to their innate characteristics; the human aura also expresses itself by colortones.

The student of occultism who has not gained the power of clairvoyance may still sense the presence of the aura by feeling conscious of the strange power which some people with strong forceful characters carry around with them. They may not be spiritual or even intellectual people, but the very force of their personality seems to radiate from them

The aura is just such a kind of

The "Human Double"

We feel the instinctive attraction or repulsion as the case may be, and we can give no reasons; nevertheless the attraction and repulsion speak of an intrinsic harmony or disharmony between the auras

The explanation of the aura is to be found in the nature of man. The three basic principles, the etheric, the astral, and the mental, which constitute a human being, go to form the aura.

To these principles may be added the spiritual, but this belongs to a different order of consciousness although it also manifests through the aura.

Interpenetrating the physical body (and in reality a part of it) is the etheric counterpart, or "double," the 'cctoplasm," which plays so large a role in the seance room, it is the vehicle of the life-forces which flow into man from the outer world—from the atmosphere, the sun, the planets, cosmic rays.

The Astral Body

It vitalizes and sustains the physical body; death, as it is called, is the cessation of the functioning of the etheric body on the earth plane. Interpenetrating the etheric double is the astral body, the vehicle of the emotions, desires, and passions—it is chiefly the brilliant, ever-changing radiations of the astral body that clairvoyants perceive in describing the aura.

The astral body is in its turn interpenetrated by a more refined and subtle structure, termed the mind, or mental body, the vehicle of thought, usually visible to seers as a golden nimbus encircling the head.

These three bodies, layers, or zones overlap each other; the etheric body extends only a little beyond the periphery of the physical and constitutes the inner aura; the astral body, with its eggshaped configuration, forms the second aura, and the mental body, with its subtler and less defined structure, forms the outer aura.

Aura Variations

In addition to these three general auras there are still more subtle emanations depending on

In previous issues of *Psychic Observer*. I have described my trips to California,—*Los Angeles*, Oceansides, San Diego, San Francisco. Mexico City and Texas. phone strike was to go in effect, we talked to our friend Albert E. Vaughn Strode. Enid, Oklahoma. Arrangements were made to meet him the following day at the Oklahoma Biltmore Hotel in Oklahoma City.

It was truly amazing to see the startling whiteness of the stone buildings in the midst of the oil fields,—there is no smoke or grime to mar their original beauty.

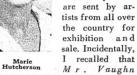

As our mission on this trip was to meet various Spiritualist leaders, we took a cab to see Rev. Nell. Burgess, who at that time was not in public work, due to illness of her son.

We also called at the home of Rev. Mae Daerr McQuestion, 329 N. W. 13th Street, where we had pleasant chat, discussing mutual friends,—amongst them, the late Nettie Nichols Johnson, Etta Bledsoe and other well-known leaders in the Spiritualist movement who visited her Spiritualist Temple.

This temple, built by Rev. Mc-Question and her late husband, was dedicated especially for Spiritualist services. It is here that she carries on her spiritual work and continues to welcome visiting workers. Incidentally, Rev. Bula Haney, El Paso medium, had just concluded a series of meetings at the Spiritual Science Church of America, of which Rev. McQuestion is pastor.

The Wiley Post Memorial

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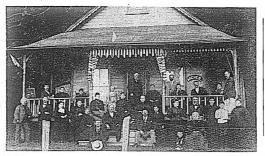
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Psychic and Spiritual Development

IT IS all too common among Spiritualists and Occultists to speak of 'psychic development' and "spiritual development" indiscriminately, as if they were one and the same thing; whereas, in fact, they are entirely different in

meaning.

Psychic development stands for, and refers to, a development of the psychic faculties - clairvoyance, clairaudience, clairsentience, Strange as it may appear to many, that development can be by persons on a so-called spiritual plane of being, who sit regularly for such development, and whose spirit controls are under the law of attraction or affinity.

Law of Attraction

It must be evident that, in cases such as the foregoing, develop-ment, while "psychic," may be anything but spiritual in nature.

Therefore, it is emphatically stated that no man or woman should seek psychic development unless he or she is living a clean life, striving to do right, and wishes to obtain such development for honest and worthy purposes.

To attempt intercourse with the spirit world while one is living on a not too high spiritual plane-or for trival or unworthy motives, such as cupidity, idle amusement or curiosity—is apt to attract undesirable entities.

How many mediums possessed of genuine psychic powers, with great possibilities for good, have been ruined for these reasons is a matter of common knowledge among all who have acquaintance with psychics.

Mediums, Protect Yourself!

Spiritual development, on the contrary, is beneficent in every way. By spiritual development is meant such a regular or steady increase in spirituality as results from the continual effort to lead a better and a higher life.

Psychic development can best be had when it is accompanied by spiritual development.

Spiritual development protects, as with a shield, the medium, or sensitive, and attracts the better spirit guides. The latter alone have the knowledge, power and will to develop the medium safely

and properly, and afford protection against the undeveloped spirits who throng the earth plane.

A consideration of the foregoing should make it evident to everyone that spiritual development should accompany psychic development, and that psychic development should rarely be at-tempted without it. 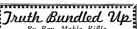

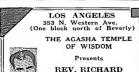

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British Monarchs Who Were Healers

Edward The Confessor, Queen Anne, Henry VII, Queen Elizabeth, Charles II, William III . . . they all endorsed and some carried out the ceremony of healing

As yet "faith healing" cannot be included in the material science of physics.

I have heard many explanations, many theories, of the once accepted healing powers of the monarchs of Britain, but I have heard only one that seemed to give a true valuation of the mysterious power which began with Edward the Confessor, who resigned from 1042 to 1066 A.D. That valuation is the simple one that healings did take place.

One cannot push aside the evidence of all the historians. It is inconceivable that the Royal Touch did not accomplish what was claimed for it, and that the cures thus effected were the result of mass hallucination, or individual misconception.

The mysterious power of healing afflicted people that was invested in the Royal rulers of this country continued right down to the time of Oueen Anne, when on February 28th, 1712, there appeared in the Gazette the following notice:

It being Her Majesty's royal intention to touch for the Evil on Wednesday, the 19th of March next, and so to continue weekly during Lent, it is Her Majesty's Command that tickets be ered the day before at the office in Whitehall.

The "King's Evil"

Nobody can say exactly why the power of healing by touch ceased to be a perogative of kings and queens, but it probably was the growth of skepticism that made its appearance and smothered the faith that was in the common people as well as the upper classes.

Certainly the Stuart rulers firmly believed in their ability to cure people by their touch of the sufferers, and it is on record that James I cured a diseased throat of the son of the Turkish Ambassaby stroking the afflicted part.

Mostly, however, the cures of the English sovereigns were confined to one disease-scrofula, or struma. It was known as the "King's Evil" because a king's touch could cure it. But Edward the Confessor, who originated this method of curing people, was said to have "bequeathed" the ability to all of his successors, although his cures did not confine their operations to one disease. There seems to have been no limit to his healing ability.

Cripple Is Restored

In an old chronicle it is stated that the King once carried on his back to St. Peter's Church, Westminster, a diseased cripple; and there the cripple was completely restored.

You will find a reference to Edward's humility and labors in Shakespeare's *Macbeth*, where in Act IV, scene iii, in reply to Macduff's question about the disease so cured, Malcolm replies:

'Tis called the Evil:

A most miraculous work in this good King,

A special form of religious service was, throughout the ages, con-nected with the Royal Touch. This ceremony differed slightly under the Kings, but one form, published by order of Henry VII in the year 1486, can be taken as a rough outline of all.

The King Confesses

·The service opened with the King, kneeling, and saying: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

The Chaplain, addressing the King, replied:

The Lord be in your heart and in your lips, to confess all your In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

The King then made the follow-

ing confession:
I confess to God, to the Blessed Virgin Mary, to all the saints, and to you, that I have sinned in thought, word and deed, through my fault. I pray Holy Mary, and all the saints of God, and you, to pray for me.

The Chaplain offered up prayer, asking God to grant absolution and remission of sins: and following this a portion of the Bible was read, generally one of the Gospels emphasizing the power given to the Apostles as promised in St. Mark, chapter XVI.

And He said unto them, Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.

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He that believeth and is baptized shall be saved; but he that believeth not shall be condemned.

And these signs shall follow them that believe: In my name shall they cast out devils; they shall speak with new tongues;

They shall take up serpents; and if they drink any deadly thing, it shall not hurt them; they shall lay hands on the sick and they shall recover.

How They Prayed

The Chaplain then took his place beside the King, repeating the words. The Clerk of the Closet knelt in front of the King, with the sick person on his right hand. The sick person also knelt.

The King stretched out his hand and touched the sore place.

As each sick person was touched, the Chirurgeon, who was also present, led the sufferer away, and the next followed to be touched in a like manner.

When all the sick had been touched the ceremony ended with a special prayer offered by the Chaplain in which grace was asked so that "on those bodies soever we have imposed hands in Thy name, through this Thy virtue working in them and through our ministry, may be restored to their health, and being confirmed therein, may perpetually with us give thanks unto Thee, the Chief Physician and Healer of all diseases."

A Divine Gift

It will be observed that the whole ceremony was purely religious, and that the King's Touch was not accepted as the personal attribute of the monarch, but-as the quotations above show belief in a cure rested in the idea that through the King, he being the highest in the land, the healing power would operate. In short, the Touch was a Divine gift vouchsafed to the King by virtue of his high station.

The words of the service are plain enough, and there can be no excuse for the suggestion that it was superstition to hope for a cure from a man whose name happened to be Edward, or Henry, Charles or William; or a King merely because he was King. The King was but the instrument, the medium, of the cures.

A skeptic might, of course, unreasonably suggest that millions of Roman Catholics today are victims of superstition in believing that the Pope can give them special blessings; or that the Church of England clergy who believe in spiritual healing are guilty of upholding superstition by their ministrations to sick people: but the belief, the hope, in succour, lies not in the officiating men but in the fact that they are agents of something above them.

Monarchs differed somewhat in

the application of their touch. Some contacted the sore very slightly with the tips of their fingers. Others made the sign of the Cross on the diseased skin; was the method of Queen Elizabeth, although there is reason for suspecting that she did not have great faith in the service. Charles I and Charles II stroked the swelling or sore with their hands.

8,000 Cases

In the year 1682 it was calculated that Charles II, who touched more people than any other King, carried out the ceremony on more than 8,000 of his subjects. more than 8,000 of his subjects. He is credited with curing other diseases besides scrofula. There are records of blind people who were brought to Whitehall and were cured. Others who were bedridden and crippled were able to walk immediately after the cere-

Of all the kings who practiced the touch the first to openly cast doubts on its efficacy was William III. He officiated at the function only once, and even told the patients that "he hoped God would give them more sense." However, Queen Anne revived the ceremony. and it was on March 30th, 1714, that Samuel Johnson, then a boy, was brought by his mother from Lichfield in order that he might be touched by the Queen. Boswell, who relates the circumstances, describes the Royal Touch as a su-perstitious "notion."

What was the secret of the cures that followed the Royal Touch? I have heard it described as "just faith healing." Well, suppose it was faith healing? That does not lessen the remarkable nature of the It shows what faith can do. And I have not yet heard that faith can be included in the material science of physics.

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All Spiritualists will welcome this new edition of Dr. Carl Wickland's, most famous work Thirty Years Among the Dead. Of inestimable value to psychic healers and those interested in different forms of obsession, this book has become almost a classic of Spirit-ualist literature. It is a handsome volume which should find a place in the libraries of all Spiritualist

Occultists, and Theosophists in particular, will not accept the chapter devoted to Theosophy, where a seance is described at which Madame Blavatsky is supposed to have communicated through the mediumship of Mrs. Wickland and refuted the doctrine of reincarnation. But this forms only a small part of this thought-provoking book, and those who are not concerned with either Theosophy or Reincarnation should certainly

Predicted at Tulsa

"Tulsan predicted new bomb months before atomic blast" . . . these were the headlines preceding an article that appeared in a Tulsa newspaper recently. The article reads:

"Was the development of the atomic bomb seen by a Tulsa medium eight months before it blasted Japan into total defeat?

The prediction of "a new bomb" ame last January from Rev. Adella Reynolds (See Page 9, Column 1) in her annual forecast for the year—with the gray-haired, motherly woman speaking in trance before her congregation at the Second Spiritualist Church here.

With the books closed on 1945, Rev. Reynolds' predictions—as published in The World at that time—were dusted off to check her score.

Rev. Reynolds, incidentally, remem-bers none of the predictions she made in her trance-except the vision of the bomb was vivid as was the terror she felt when she visualized it.

"These thoughts are not my own," she said, "I have not studied about them or read about them. I am in an entrancement when they come to me and I do not remember anything I say unless the pressure is so great that it shocks me back to consciousness. This is the only reason I remember the revelation of the bomb.

"The haunting fear of the blazing inferno of exploding fire which came to my sub-conscious mind from the world beyond was so terrorizing that the trance was broken."

Some of her predictions published in The World, January 15, 1945, were:

"Liberation of many war prisoners in March; destruction of many battleships, the appearance of a new bomb, the

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coming of a new prophet and the signing of a contract between Britain and the United States; a great struggle before the end of February; many railroad disasters; the death of our great general.

"Marching back and forth in New York and Washington; great disappoint-ments for small nations; great medical advances; and many happy faces are expected in the country which will bloom and blossom after a while.

"Change in the dollar with more substance as a result: movement of many young boys to foreign countries; stub-bornness between Britain and the United States until spring, at which time a contract is to be made.

Rev. Reynolds has been able to receive messages she believes come from the other world since she was a child but it took many hard shoves to convince her that she was meant to be as she explains it, a "psychic-anamedium" —that is a medium who receives her messages through the body's nervous system.

Her first messages came to her while she was writing as a child. Then pen-cil in her hand would move and mes-sages from the *dead* would be written by her. The messages were for peo-ple she knew but they concerned matters of which she had no knowledge.

"When this happens," she said, "I ied to put the pencil down but I couldn't. Once when I refused to write, something hit my hand with such force that it broke the pencil and bruised my hand in several places."

"For a long time I thought that I was just imagining things and I re-fused to tell anyone for fear they would think the same thing."

the development of the higher spiritual nature. In some individuals of a devout, unselfish, mystical type the spiritual aura very pronounced and beautiful, whilst in others of an animal-like nature there is no vestige of it. Nothing *colors* the aura like habitual thought.

The aura varies in many ways. In the first place there will be the question of its area and extent this will depend on the development of the soul and mind. In primitive people these inner forces will naturally be crude and rudi-mentary, while in intelligent, highly developed individuals the opposite will be true.

The composition or texture of the aura will also vary according to the individual-the brutal and the refined, the sensitive and the insensitive, the choleric and the placid will manifest different auras in accordance with their disposition and character.

The aura is further rendered complex and diversified by the varied play of the emotions, passions, and feelings, which impart a definite fridescence or colortone to the auric radiations. aura is also an unfailing guide to the health condition.

Human Atmosphere

In sound health the vital rays or forces stream into the auric atmosphere, imparting to it a clear, radiant brilliance; in failing health the color tones are dull and dark, whilst disease is indicated by nebulous spots or patches over the part affected.

It is thus apparent that our true character is "photographed" on the aura; that which we intrinsically are as distinct from what we appear to be will stand revealed to the sensitive eye. In no other way, in fact, can be explained the attraction or repulsion we often experience on meeting people for the first time. It is the invisible play of the aura which persuades us before the spoken word or outward form.

The human atmosphere is the invisible influence at work in all kinds of contacts-business, social, emotional, and so on. It explains why some people are a source of inspiration and personal power, influencing all those who within the sphere of their influence the successful preacher, doctor, politician, and others who are spoken of as having magnetic personalites.

What the Bible Records

The lesser lights, the host of small, ordinary people are attracted and energized by their powerful auras, just as the small iron filings are irresistibly drawn into the magnet's field of influence; furthermore, the auras of these "little people" may become polarized by the influence of a powerful personality and they may even become "lit up" with the

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brightness imparted to them.

In the Bible records there are numerous cases of the transmission of spiritual powers and forces, and the transformation of lesser gifts and qualities into greater ones, which cause marked changes in the

Dr. Coates expresses the farreaching effects of the aura in the following passage taken from his book Human Magnetism:

Some natures are so harmonious to be veritable centers of health, love, and happiness to all within their sphere. Their presence cheers and upbuilds those in sympathy with them, while it has a counteracting influence upon others less well disposed.

The "How" of Inspiration

Angular, vicious, and unhappily developed natures shrink out of such presences and refrain from evil or are won over by it to a higher and sweeter life. Then there are those who are no' only giving off benign influence but are also absorbing into themselves the vibrations which proceed from higher and brighter souls dwelling in supernal planes.

It is thus inspiration comes. It is within the radius of this magnetism that the inner and outward, the unseen and the seen, commingle man reaches heavenwards while still retaining his touch of earth.

9 Know This Happened

WAS THERE So Were Five Hundred Others

R. G. PRESSING

Last September, in the Masonic Club Auditorium, Owosso, Michigan, over five hundred persons witnessed another public demonstration of physical mediumship . . . a demonstration which, according to eye-witnesses, may be unparalleled in the history of Spiritualism. The occasion was the seventh annual convention of *The Spiritualist Epis*copal Church, Eaton Rapids, Michigan.

This was the *third* consecutive year, the S. E. C. has sponsored such a tremendous undertaking: *First*, at Columbus, Ohio, in The First Spiritualist Church, 6th and State St.; *Second*, at The Olds Hotel Ballroom, Lansing, Michigan. The *fourth* demonstration of this kind is scheduled to be held during the S.E.C. convention next September in Chicago, Illinois.

The headlines of this article tell brief-Iv what actually took place at the Owosso public seance demonstration; the picture of each medium participating in the demonstration is published above, tho' you may say "It cannot happen" or "It did not happen." My only answer is: "Were YOU there?" If not, I WAS and here's the story:

The auditorium itself was no different than thousands of others except there was no stage. A foot-high plat-form was built on the main auditorium form was built, on the main auditorium floor and upon this platform, a cabinet was built,—approximately 8 feet high and 6 feet square. This cabinet was used only for the final demonstration—materialization. Rev. Clifford L. Bias, chairman, introduced each of the seven mediums and explained briefly the type of psychic phenomena each one would attempt to demonstrate.

The medium, types of phenomena, conditions, results and comments are as follows:

1st.-Rev. Charles M. Ball, independent card writing; a new pack of 5x7 cards and crayons were examined by persons in the audience; full light; two persons chosen to sit in full view be-fore the audience; Rev. Ball stood between and directly behind these two persons; part of the packet of cards was placed on the shoulder of each sitter who assisted in holding them in place; Rev. Ball placed a hand on each packet and over each of his hands, a handkerchief was thrown. In less than two minutes, the singing having subsided, writing could be heard by the sit-ters—and even by some in the front row of the audience. Over twenty cards had colored writing or drawing or both; eight were definitely identified as far as text; three persons attested to handwriting.

2nd-Dr. Meurice Russell, District Clergman of The Spiritualist Episcopal Church, Kansas City, Missouri; Clairvoyance, Clairaudience and Psychome-

blind-fold was adjusted by stranger in audience; dozens of messages received from hundreds of written billets placed upon the table before him; accurate descriptions and quick responses.

3rd-Rev. Nellie Curry, mental mediumship; full light; Over 22 detailed messages; hundreds of descriptions and names—nearly all recognized; dates and places; no hesitation; no groping; intimate messages of guidance; astounding mass of evidence and proof of sur-

4th-Rev. Clifford L. Bias. direct-voice or trumpet-in-the-light; auditorium darkened-good red light; medium hold trumpet at arm's-length directly in front of audience; strangers called to the rostrum by Sylvia, Rev. Bias' spirit collaborator, whose voice could be dis-tinctly heard by most of audience; both masculine and feminine voices in sustained conversation heard by over eight persons called up front; last part of demonstration, medium's mouth covered with "gag"—ruling out ventriloquism as clear voices would not be possible under such conditions.

5th-Rev. Robert Chaney, Spirit Photography, good red light; 12 strangers chosen to form in row before audience; each initialed their own sheet of photographic paper which was held over their solar-plexus; medium passed before each—pressing his finger tips on the paper; immediately after all 12 papers were touched, they were developed by the medium in full view of the audi-ence. All 12 papers contained extras; four definitely recognized.

6th-Rev. John Bunker, apport, red light; medium stood with arms outstretched before audience; each of the medium's arms held in this position by two persons during entire demonstra-tion; medium entranced by *Dr. Gonzo-las*, his spirit collaborator who explained the nature of the phenon about to be witnessed; various objects dropped to the floor at intervals; medi-um described each apport as released;

it was explained by Dr. Gonzolas that, without the co-operation of the audience, such a demonstration would have been impossible.

7th-Rev. Lula Taber, materialization, good red light; otherwise entire auditorium blacked out: medium entered cabinet; three women examined medium and took her clothing with exception of black slip; Star Bright, Rev. Taber's spirit collatorator, announced that she would do her best: dozens of spirits manifested; two and three at a time; Ada Besinnet and Etta Bledsoe materialized; seance closed after a matterialized spirit sang "The Lord's Prayer."

Yes, it all happened at Owosso. I WAS THERE in the front row all the time and during the last demonstration, I sat right beside the cabinet, not less than two feet from any of the spirits who materialized.

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
