She remembered how often her father had told her: "*Bettina*, some day you will ride in Pietro's merry-go-round!"

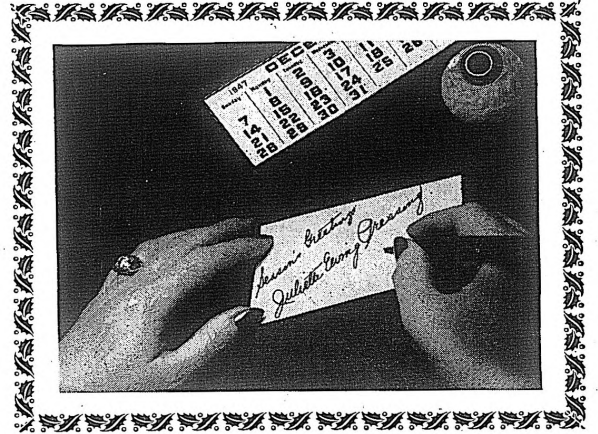

He averred that parties were for kids and he was big—about twelve he guessed. He had never known a home and had been pushed about all his life. When I suggested a nice red apple for the tree he said: "Naw, I've been licked too many times fer stealin' them."

Spirits Learn Politeness

We compromised on candy and I told him how glad we were to have him. We thought he had gone when he spoke again: "This man says to say thanks."

"We had a lovely tree with twenty-eight miniature gifts for the twenty-eight lovely little spirit ones that had invited themselves to our party. Mrs. Lynch and I were instructed to sit under the tree Christmas night so the children could really enjoy their gifts.

One by one they came through, first through Mrs. Lynch and then through me and each were delighted with their gifts. Many unknown to us spoke and all expressed delight at being there. The fact that there were no gifts for those extra guests did not cause them any envy or sadness, showing they had progressed beyond our earth selfishness.

In the short space of time since Harry (the newsboy) had introduced himself he had changed noticeably. He wasn't so abrupt in speaking and even said "thank you" without being prompted. He even admitted that he liked it over there as folks were good to him.

That party left us all with a happy glow in our hearts and the feeling that we had truly spoken with angels. Material minded people may point out that we might better have spent our efforts on "the living" but I am sure we gave them at least a portion of the joy we had from the giving.

ORIGIN and MEANING of CHRISTMAS

Kindliness and goodwill expresses itself by the interchange of greetings, visits, presents and entertainments to those in need.

We have not yet established "PEACE ON EARTH, GOODWILL AMONGST MEN" but Christmas is probably our nearest approach to that great ideal.

Two Great Festivals mark the Christian Calendar: *Easter* and *Christmas!* Both owe their origin to Astronomy.

The fact that *Easter's* determined by the full moon nearest the vernal equinox makes its origin certain, and in the same sense the date fixed for the Christmas Celebrations, December 25th, when the Sun—the giver of life and light—attains its lowest altitude and is reborn at the winter solstice to commence its steady rise, and its mission of bringing renewed life to the northern hemisphere, places it in the same category.

We stand on the threshold of the greatest of these festivals and in thousands of churches special services will be held to celebrate the birth of the One who is held "to bring life and immortality to light."

Christian Festival?

Once again we shall hear the ever-recurring story of a newly born infant born in a stable and lying in a manger, whom wise men from the East came to worship, who were led by a star to Bethlehem: of the opposition of *King Herod* and the steady rise of the infant to power and influence.

Today we look upon *Christmas* as an exclusively Christian festival. Yet it antedates Christianity by many centuries. There is no

ground whatever for the assumption that *Jesus of Nazareth* was born on December 25th, since not even the year of his birth is definite and sure.

Authorities differ in their opinions between the years 17 B.C. and 4 B.C. It was not until the third century of our era that *Christmas* was celebrated as the birthday of *Jesus*, and there is no doubt that the date was chosen because it was the common custom of the pagan world to celebrate the rebirth of the Sun on that date.

Serious Opposition

Until that time *Christians* celebrated His crucifixion and resurrection but not His birth. Even when the celebration of the event was decided, there was a good deal of dubiety as to the fixing of the date. It was first celebrated on January 6th, now the feast of Epiphany.

December 25th was first celebrated in Rome as a Christian Festival in 354 A.D. at the earliest. Under *Bishop Liberius*, Rome took the date as a substitute for the ancient festival of the winter solstice—the rebirth of the Sun on the shortest day of the year.

The innovation excited serious opposition as it was thought that the customary celebration by pagan peoples might overwhelm the attempt to substitute a Christian for the pagan festival. *Helios-Sol-Mithra*.

It was, however, pointed out that the date was calculated from the supposed date of the *Annunciation*. 24th March—the vernal equinox; giving a period of nine months.

"Gods of Vegetation"

An official command was, therefore, issued to all centers of the faith to observe the new festival but it was not until about 450 A.D. that the observance became general, and even then the *Armenian Christians* failed to conform.

There is, therefore, no reason to believe that *Jesus* was born at the winter solstice; the date was fixed

COSMIC SIGNIFICANCE OF Christmas

Self-Improvement is not the FIRST consideration. Let him who would be the greatest . . . be a Servant to All.

Once more, in the course of a year, we are upon the eve of Christmas. The view which each of us takes of this festival is dissimilar to that of every one else. To the devout religionist it is a season hallowed, sacred, and fraught with mystery, none the less sublime because uncomprehended. To the atheist, it is silly superstition. To the purely intellectual it is a puzzle, for it is beyond reason.

In the churches, the story is recited of how upon this, the holiest night of the year, our Lord and Savior, immaculately conceived, was born of a virgin.

No further explanation is made; the matter is left to acceptance or rejection by the hearer according to his temperament. If mind and reason dominate him to the exclusion of faith, if he can believe nothing which cannot be demonstrated to the senses at any moment, he is forced to reject the tale as absurd and out of consonance with various immutable laws of nature.

"Light of the World"

Various interpretations have been given to satisfy the mind, these principally of an astronomical nature. They have set forth how, on the night between the 24th and 25th of December, the sun commences its journey from the south to the north. He is the "Light of the World."

Cold and famine would inevitably exterminate the human race if the sun remained always in the south. Therefore it is a cause for great rejoicing when he com-

mences his northward journey. He is then hailed as "savior," for he comes "to save the world," to give it "the bread of life," as he ripens grain and grape.

Thus "he gives his life" upon the cross (ing) of the equator (at the spring equinox), and then commences his ascent into the (northern) heaven.

"Immaculately Conceived?"

On the night when he commences his northward journey the zodiacal sign Virgo, the celestial virgin, the "Queen of Heaven," stands upon the eastern horizon at midnight, and is therefore, astrologically speaking, his "rising sign." Thus he is "born of a virgin" without other intermediary, hence, "immaculately conceived."

This explanation may satisfy the mind regarding the origin of the supposed superstition, but the aching void which is in the heart of every skeptic, whether he is aware of the fact or not, must remain until the spiritual illumina-

tion is attained which shall furnish an explanation acceptable to both heart and mind.

However, few understand how the material and spiritual forces alternately ebb and flow in the course of the year, and why Christmas is truly a "holy day."

Let us say that we subscribe to the astronomical interpretation as being as valid from its point of view, as the following is true when viewing the mystery-birth from another angle. The sun is born from year to year in the darkest night.

A Sublime Fact

The "world-saving" Christs are also born when the spiritual darkness of mankind is the greatest. There is a third aspect of supreme importance, namely, that it is no mere idle foolishness when Paul speaks of Christ being "formed in you."

It is a sublime fact that we are all Christs-in-the-making, and the sooner we realize that we must cultivate the Christ within before we can perceive the Christ without, the more we shall hasten the day of our spiritual illumination. In this connection we again quote our favorite aphorism from *Angelus Silesius*, whose sublime spiritual perception caused him to say:

"Though Christ a thousand times in Bethlehem be born,
And not within thyself, thy soul will be forlorn;
The Cross on Golgotha thou lookest to in vain,
Unless within thyself it be set up again."

At the summer solstice in June, the earth is furthest from the sun, but the solar ray strikes the earth at nearly right angles to its axis in the Northern Hemisphere, hence the high degree of physical activity resulting. Then the spiritual radiations from the sun are oblique to this part of the earth, and are as weak as the physical rays when they are oblique.

Highest Tidal Flow

At the winter solstice, on the other hand, the earth is nearest the sun. The spiritual rays then fall at right angles to the earth's surface in the Northern Hemisphere, promoting spirituality, while physical activities are held in abeyance on account of the oblique angle at which the solar rays strike the surface of the earth.

On this principle, the physical activities are at their lowest ebb and the spiritual forces reach their highest tidal flow on the night between the 24th and 25th of December, which is therefore the most "holy night" of the year.

Midsummer, on the other hand, is the sporting time of the earth-goblins and similar entities concerned in the material development of our planet, as shown by Shakespeare in his "Midsummer Night's Dream."

If we swim with the tide at the time when it is strongest, we shall cover a greater distance with less effort than at any other time. It is of great importance to the esoteric student to know and understand the particularly favorable conditions which prevail at Yuletide.

Coin of Service

Let us follow Paul's exhortation in the 12th chapter of *Hebrews* and throw aside every hampering weight as do men who are running a race. Let us strike while the iron is hot; let us specially bend all our energies at this time to spiritual endeavor, and we shall reap a harvest such as we cannot obtain at any other time of the year.

Let us remember also that self-improvement is not our first consideration. We are disciples of Christ. If we aspire to distinction, let us remember that that He said: "Let him who would be the great-

Rarely do men believe in *God*; they merely talk about *God*. How then can you believe in this great *Wayshower* of Life? Men say they believe and have faith. What faith? Why, they do not believe even in their souls—to them the soul is a wispy sort of thing. A majority of the sons and daughters of the generation do not believe that we live after death.

What are you afraid of? If you really believed and doubted not death to you would be like an angel of mercy to release you from this world's travails and misunderstanding.

Jesus of Nazareth taught eternal life that ought to begin here and today and he proved it and he submitted the evidence by the heavenly host, but do you believe what you say you believe?

How to Live!

The Nazarene came to show us how to get the most there is to get out of life with all its joys and romance and adventure, but out of his glorious livingness—a glory that is to be eternal—men have made doctrines only of *how to think about eternal life!*

Mankind is not atrocious; we are ludicrous. If moralists and religionists had courage, understanding and stamina there would not be all these doctrines but a better world.

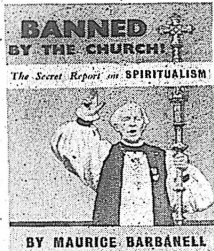

"The editor declared he considered it his duty 'to publish this report in defiance of the bishops who banned it, not so much to satisfy the natural curiosity of Spiritualists but to give the Anglican Parsons and laymen the lead that was denied them by their own leaders.'"

Kline and Jordan

According to Rev. Katie Whittemore, Rev. Maude Kline, noted blindfold billet reader and N.S.A. missionary and Rev. Fred Jordan, President of the International General Assembly of Spiritualists, were guest workers at her Church of Psychic Light, 617 Venice Blvd., Los Angeles, California.

Rev. Whittemore states that Rev. Jordan's efforts on her behalf have been greatly appreciated by all California mediums... molested by police interference. If justice is not done in her case, as well as others, Rev. Whittemore states the whole affair will be placed before the United States Supreme Court.

A collection called the "War Fund," inaugurated and contributed to by Rev. Kline, Rev. Jordan and others through donations of their services, has reached sufficient proportions to "fight the battle" to a finish. Over 50 mediums have been arrested in Los Angeles during the past few months.

During their visit to Los Angeles last year, the editors of *Psychic Observer* met Mr. and Mrs. C. S. Wainright, 122 North Arden Blvd. They are staunch Spiritualists but little known in "Spiritualist Circles." Strange to say, he is not very well acquainted with mediums on the West Coast but during the past fifty years, has assembled and read nearly every available book on the subject... now he wants to really know. Eleanor Views Death

A recent article "Views on Death," released from Hyde Park by Columnist Eleanor Roosevelt, reads: "Many things have been written that are designed to give us who are living a different attitude toward what we call death. One of the most famous books of this kind is, I suppose, Maeterlinck's 'The Blue Bird.' Since the last war there must be thousands of men and women, young and old, who have fought with themselves over this very question of the nature of death. "For oneself, it is a fairly simple

problem to resolve to make up your mind as to what you believe and go ahead on the assumption that it is true—or, if it isn't true, that it won't matter a great deal. It is quite a different thing, however, when death takes hundreds of thousands of the young people we had counted on to carry on in some way the work which we ourselves might be laying down.

"The problem was brought home to me recently when I had the opportunity to read a short play called 'Assembly Call,' by Jack Preston, a West Coast newspaperman. The play is dedicated to the author's son, Charles, a lieutenant pilot in the air force who was lost on Aug. 26, 1942, and bears the familiar quotation from Shelley:

"From contagion of the world's slow stain
He is secure and now can never mourn;
He lives! He wakes!—'tis death is dead, not he!
Weep not for Adonais, thou young dawn!"

"I think anyone whose boy went out never to return will find some comfort in the way this young pilot's father and mother met the loss of their only son. After his passing, they realized that their role must be to help him while they are here on earth by finding something worthy of their own mettle to accomplish. They took off their mornings and started to work with the youth of this generation. They understood young people and knew that they could give them something which had meaning, just as they had been able to build a real relationship with their son. They suffered at the start, but they pulled themselves together to go forward in their work.

"I don't know that the thinking of modern young people conforms to any one particular denomination of preaching, but there is a religious battlecry in this short play which ought to have a special appeal to the young. Many of the scenes and the lines will help us to live better lives."

Eleanor Recommends

The two books mentioned in Eleanor Roosevelt's column have been favorites, especially among Spiritualists. "The Blue Bird" by Maeterlinck is a classic. It is obtainable from Dale News, Inc. at two dollars per copy.

"Assembly Call" (\$1.00 per copy) enjoyed a tremendous sale during the past two years. It is a play... definitely about spirit return. In fact, the editors of *Psychic Observer* met the author of this play in New York City. At the time, sponsors for a play based on the complete text of the book, were being sought. However, the author, Jack Preston felt duty-bound to make certain stipulations to his prospective producers... one being that not a line of the text could be changed or altered. Owing to the fact that the data was received through mediumistic talents in his own family and that the whole play was relayed by their own "dead" son, it is easy to understand why he took such a stand.

SELMA — The Child Medium

Her Psychic Unfoldment

How a Mother Deals With and Encourages Her Daughter's Mediumistic Talents.

Since my article on child mediums last year, I have received many letters from persons interested in the subject; so I have decided to make another report.

Certainly no subject deserves more careful consideration, especially by those in contact with young children for it is now generally recognized by spiritualists that some degree of mediumship is common to all young children.

In my first article I tried to make clear that my daughter, Selma, is in no way so outstanding as to be noticeable to the public. Only undeniable proof to me made

it certain that she received guidance from the other side of life. She made me realize that her unseen playmates were spirit children—her own sister whom she never knew.

After I wrote that article, Selma saw my Uncle Herschell. She said, "His name was Uncle Hershey—something like that."

A week later she identified him. She saw his picture and whispered to me, "There's that Uncle Hershey I saw."

I am sure that many, many children have the same faculty. I can give you an instance where one of her playmates gave his mother proof that was ignored.

This little boy, whom I shall call Billy, is adopted, but does not know it yet. Neither do their neighbors know it, nor anyone, except me . . . that I know of.

One day, in his foster mother's arms, Billy remarked about the lines in her face. Now she had grieved for years because she could not have children. She thought of those tears, but only said tenderly to him that she had been very foolish to cry so much in the past and that had caused the lines, but she is now happy.

Looking lovingly at her, Billy said, "That woman should have given me to you a long time before she did."

She was startled momentarily, and told me about it, but I could not make her realize what it meant, though she admitted that Billy has imaginary playmates.

Selma's Clairvoyance

As children grow older the problem is: *What Now?* I have bungled sometimes with Selma, and yet she knows she can talk to me about her spirit friends, and does sometimes; and where I was so careful—so afraid of encouraging her in being fanciful—I find it is so easy to tell when she is just letting her fancy run and when she really sees.

When Selma sees clairvoyantly, she hesitates to tell even me until I wonder for weeks at a time if the psychic power has left her altogether.

I am sure she does not see, quite, as often, now that she is older. Selma is now five and playing with other children all day long. But whenever she does give out there is no mistaking her sincerity.

For instance, the other day she was talking about her play when her eyes widened in wonder as she looked over my head at something, but when I asked her she evaded it by murmuring "Nothing" and tried to go on talking.

What Are Ghosts?

But her eyes were again and again drawn up. I insisted on knowing what she was looking at and she said, "Mama, there's the most beautiful light over your head, and it's all sparkly."

I said, "Thank you, honey. That's nice to know." And we continued our talk. That is always my policy with her. We have only discussed the matter at length a very few times, and then I let her lead the pace.

About six months ago, I took her to a movie, and the second feature was a so-called ghost story . . . one of those dealing with actual spirit return. I felt Selma's tenseness when the spirit on the screen manifested and disappeared before our eyes. I felt sure she was so intensely interested because of her own experiences, and I half expected her to mention *Mary Alice*, but she said nothing and neither did I. She turned it over in her mind until the next day before she asked: "What are ghosts?"

Selma Left Sunday School

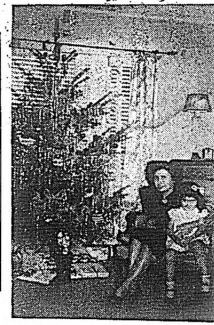
I explained about the spirit body, how it is sometimes seen by people. Since so few can see spirits, I told her that many think that they cannot be seen at all. Others joke about such things and call them ghosts.

She listened closely, then said, "Mary Alice is not a ghost. She is a really girl." Now I had not mentioned *Mary Alice* at all.

I explained my best, but Selma remained somewhat confused. She was attending a Lutheran Sunday School (her father's family is Lutheran) and for her age she thinks deeply. She often asks me about Bible stories and Angels, and of course I give them the spiritualist interpretation which seems to satisfy her better than what she learns at Sunday School.

One day we were reading Bible

stories and she kept asking about angels. I finally resorted to reference to *Mary Alice*. Selma was upset and cried out: "But *Mary Alice* isn't an angel. She doesn't have wings. And she doesn't live away up in heaven. She lives close to us. She lives in a house."

I mentally noted that Selma has a better conception than her Sunday School teachers. I tried to explain and reconcile her, but she is so sensitive on the subject she

got overwrought until she cried, protesting over and over that *Mary Alice* is a real girl. (Yet, you see, she wanted to believe in story book angels, too.)

Finally I saw I was getting nowhere fast, and I suddenly changed my tactics and said sharply: "Then why can't I see her?"

Selma stopped in the middle of a breath and she looked at me, speechless. Then I explained again that that is the difference between those on the spiritual and mortal planes—that we can not see spirit people except we have that gift.

Now, had Selma been inclined to falsehood, she would have followed up that advantage by "seeing" a lot of spirits, but it is only on rare occasions that she sees, since she is older. That does not concern me. What does matter is that she does have an understanding of the truth.

Note: Selma suddenly left the Sunday School of her own volition, and will not go back.
