



"Just forget it, my dear": quietly her aunt rose and left the room. * * *







Christian Festival?

Once again we shall hear the ever-recurring story of a newly born infant born in a stable and lying in a manger, whom wise men from the *East* came to worship, who were led by a star to Bethlehem: of the opposition of *King Herod* and the steady rise of the infant to power and influence.

Today we look upon *Christmas* as an exclusively Christian festival. Yet it antedates Christianity by many centuries. There is no

ground whatever for the assumption that Jesus of Nazareth was born on December 25th, since not even the year of his birth is definite and sure.

Authorities differ in their opinions between the years 17 B.C. and 4 B.C. It was not until the third century of our era that Christmas was celebrated as the birthday of Jesus, and there is no doubt that the date was chosen because it was the common custom of the pagan world to celebrate the rebirth of the Sun on that date.

Serious Opposition

Until that time Christians celebrated His crucifixion and resurrection but not His birth. Even when the celebration of the event was decided, there was a good deal of dubiety as to the fixing of the date. It was first celebrated on January 6th, now the feast of Epiphany.

December 25th was first celebrated in Rome as a Christian Festival in 354 A.D. at the earliest. Under Bishop Liberius, Rome took the date as a substitute for the an-cient festival of the winter solstice -the rebirth of the Sun on the shortest day of the year.

The innovation excited serious opposition as it was thought that the customary celebration by pagan peoples might overwhelm the attempt to substitute a Christian for the pagan festival. Helios-Sol-Mithra.


It was, however, pointed out that the date was calculated from the supposed date of the Annunciation. 24th March - the vernal equinox; giving a period of nine months.

"Gods of Vegetation"

An official command was, therefore, issued to all centers of the faith to observe the new festival but it was not until about 450 A.D. that the observance became general, and even then the Armenian Christians failed to conform.

There is, therefore, no reason to believe that Jesus was born at the winter solstice; the date was fixed

in an attempt to adopt and reform a pagan custom.

Mithra, one of the pagan Sun Gods, was mythically born on De-cember 25th, clearly in view of the winter solstice-the return of the sun and the rising of the constellation of Virgo (the Virgin) above the horizon.

Dionysius and Adonis (Gods of vegetation) were supposedly born at this time and the festival often celebrated the successful completion of the autumn sowings in the fields.

Ecclesiastical Claims

On this date, too, The Phoeni-cian God Melkarth wcke from his winter sleep in the sacred cave or grotto. The *Egyptians* had two festivals, one on December 25th to commemorate the birth of the infant Horus (the new-born sun) and January 6th, to rejoice over the lost Osiris found.

Leo, a Roman patriarch, in the fifth century complained of the adoption of this date by the Chris-tians, saying: "The day may come when the world will begin to deny that there was any other Savior of the world than the idol of heathen worship, the Sun."

Truly, modern critics might well ask, if all these ecclesiastical claims are so insecurely based what guarantee have we of the accuracy of the venerated ancient records? We are quite sure that truth was never hindered in its onward march by the telling of the truth. The suppression of facts is far more likely to undermine men's confidence than the revelation of facts.

But Christmas, whatever its ancient origin, has in these days a social meaning and aspect which presents something more kindly and humane than ecclesastical controversy and pedantic disputation.

Where Customs Originate

For the last eight hundred years at least it has been like the Aryan's bonfires "lighted upon every hill to celebrate the rebirth of the glorious sun" and a fire of kindliness and goodwill has been lighted in human hearts which expresses itself in the interchange of greetings, presents, visits, enter-tainments and kindliness to those in need.

It matters little where such customs originate: they are good and kindly, and that is enough! Hu-man minds and human hearts open. Thoughts of goodwill radi-ate to all-old feuds are forgotten and long-parted friends meet. Humanity becomes genial and friendly and draws nearer to the

the purple one, the one I have al-ways wanted to ride!"


And Bettina is placed astride the little purple horse, Pietro himself helping her up, his face grinning. "Yea? La signorina she walk, yea?"

"Immaculately Conceived?"

On the night when he commences his northward journey the virgin, the "Queen of Heaven," stands upon the eastern horizon at midnight, and is therefore, astro-logically speaking, his "rising midnight, and is therefore, associated logically speaking, his "rising sign." Thus he is "born of a virgin" without other intermediary, hence, "immaculately conceived

This explanation may satisfy the mind regarding the origin of the supposed superstition, but the aching void which is in the heart of every skeptic, whether he is aware of the fact or not, must remain until the spiritual illumina-

tion is attained which shall furnish an explanation acceptable to both heart and mind.

However, few understand how the material and spiritual forces alternately ebb and flow in the course of the year, and why Christmas is truly a "holy day."

Let us say that we subscribe to the astronomical interpretation as being as valid from its point of view, as the following is true when viewing the mystery-birth from another angle. The sun is born from year to year in the darkest night.

A Sublime Fact

The "world-saving" Christs are also born when the spiritual dark-ness of mankind is the greatest. There is a third aspect of supreme importance, namely, that it is no mere idle foolishness when Paul speaks of Christ being "formed in you."

It is a sublime fact that we are all Christs-in-the-making, and the sooner we realize that we must cultivate the Christ within before we can perceive the Christ without, the more we shall hasten the day of our spiritual illumination. In this connection we again quote our favorite aphorism from Angelus Silesius, whose sublime spiritual perception caused him to say:

"Though Christ a thousand times in Bethlehem be born, And not within thyself, thy soul will be forlorn; The Cress on Golgotha thou lookest to in Unless within thyself it be set up again."

At the summer solstice in June, the earth is furthest from the sun. but the solar ray strikes the earth at nearly right angles to its axis in the Northern Hemisphere, hence the high degree of physical activity resulting. Then the spiritual radiations from the sun are oblique to this part of the earth, and are as weak as the physical rays when they are oblique.

Highest Tidal Flow

At the winter solstice, on the other hand, the earth is nearest the sun. The spiritual rays then fall at right angles to the earth's surface in the Northern Hemisphere, promoting spirituality, while physical activities are held phere. in abeyance on account of the oblique angle at which the solar rays strike the surface of the earth.

On this principle, the physical activities are at their lowest ebb and the spiritual forces reach their highest tidal flow on the night between the 24th and 25th of December, which is therefore the most "holv night" of the year.

Midsummer, on the other hand, is the sporting time of the earthgoblins and similar entities concerned in the material develop-Shakespeare in his "Midsummer Night's Dream."

If we swim with the tide at the time when it is strongest, we shall cover a greater distance with less effort than at any other time. It is of great importance to the esoteric student to know and understand the particularly favorable conditions which prevail at Yuletide.

Coin of Service

Let us follow Paul's exhortation in the 12th chapter of Hebrews and throw aside every hampering weight as do men who are running a race. Let us strike while the iron is hot; let us specially bend our energies at this time to all spiritual endeavor, and we shall reap a harvest such as we cannot obtain at any other time of the year.

Let us remember also that selfimpovement is not our first con-sideration. We are disciples of Christ. If we aspire to distinction, let us remember that that He said: "Let him who would be the great-





A lengthy news release from London Iast month, picked up by The New York Times, carried the headlines: "Spiritualists win support in Britain" ... "Report suppressed in 1936 shows special study group endorsed princi-

pressed report on Spiritualism and cites The Archbishop of Canterbury in the leading role.

The article covers the sup-

ples."

The article reads: "Spiritualism as a religious force received the approval of seven members of a ten man lay and clerical committee in a long suppressed Church of England report published today.

"The committee, composed of prominent religious, medical and educational authoritics, was appointed in 1936 by Dr. Cosmo Gordon Lang, then the Archbishop of Canterbury. Its majority report, signed by seven of the ten, was suppressed by the House of Bishops when it was submitted secretly in 1936. This report was published today in the current issue of Psychic News, the minority report, still remains secret.

"The majority report declared that 'it is clearly true that recognition of the nearness of our friends who have died and of their progress in spiritual life and of their continuing concern for us cannot do otherwise for those who have experienced it than add a new immediacy and richness to their belief in the communion of Saints.'

"According to that report 'miracles of healing are acclaimed as closely parallel to the healings performed through a medium.'

"It is strongly urged that if we do not accept the evidence for modern psychical happenings,' the report went on. we should not, apart from long tradition, accept gospel records either.'

"The report declared that 'a strictly scientific verdict on the matter of personal survival can only be one of not proven,' adding that the 'while question of extra sensory perception is still a matter of scientific subjudice.'

"On the matter of scientific justifica-tion, the report said that 'while we regard some part of these (Spiritualist) claims as a matter proper for the scientist, we regard some other parts as not properly capable of scientific verification or dispute, but at the same time as deserving consideration of Christians on grounds of another kind.

'The report advocated 'much more freedom in our recognition of the living unity of the whole church in this world and in that which lies beyond death.

"A. W. Austen said the editor of Psychic News had declared that the seven signatories of the majority report were the late Dr. Francis Underholl, Bishop of Bath and Wells; Dr. W. R. Mathews, dean of St. Pauls: Canon Harold Anson master of the temple; Canon L. Grensted, Noltoth professor of Christian religion at Oxford; Dr. William Brown, prominent Harley Street psychologist; P. E. Sandilands, prominent lawyer, and Lady Gwendolen Stephenson.





One day, in his foster mother's arms, Billy remarked about the lines in her face. Now she had grieved for years because she could not have children. She thought of those tears, but only said tenderly to him that she had been very foolish to cry so much in the past and that had caused the lines, but she is now happy.

Looking lovingly at her, Billy said, "That woman should have given me to you a long time be-fore she did."

She was startled momentarily, and told me about it, but I could not make her realize what it meant, though she admitted that Billy has imaginary playmates.

Selma's Clairvoyance

As children grow older the problem is: What Now? I have bungled sometimes with Selma, and yet she knows she can talk to me about her spirit friends, and does sometimes; and where I was so careful-so afraid of encourage ing her in being fanciful-I find it is so easy to tell when she is just letting her fancy run and when she really sees.

When Selma sees clairvoyantly, she hesitates to tell even me until I wonder for weeks at a time if the psychic power has left her altogether.

I am sure she does not see, quite, as often, now that she is older. Selma is now five and playing with other children all day long. But whenever she does give out there is no mistaking her sincerity.

For instance, the other day she was talking about her play when her eves widened in wonder as she looked over my head at something, but when I asked her she evaded it by murmuring "Nothing" and tried to go on talking.

What Are Ghosts?

But her eyes were again and again drawn up. I insisted on knowing what she was looking at and she said, "Mama, there's the most beautiful light over your head, and it's all sparkly."

I said, "Thank you, honey. That's nice to know." And we continued our talk. That is always my policy with her. We have only discussed the matter at length a very few times, and then I let her lead the pace.

About six months ago, I took her to a movie, and the second feature was a so-called ghost story one of those dealing with actual spirit return. I felt Selma's tenseness when the spirit on the screen manifested and disappeared before our eyes. I felt sure she was so intensely interested because of her own experiences, and I half expected her to mention Mary Alice, but she said nothing and neither did I. She turned it over in her mind until the next day before she asked: "What are ghosts?"


