

World Centennial

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The Veil Is Wearing Thin

"Indeed, the evidence is that the whole personality survives."

THERE IS MUCH FOR THE PHILOSOPHER TO LEARN

A philosopher is one who takes all knowledge under his supervi-sion, if not as an individual, then as a group, and no fact can be outside his scope. He must make sure that it is a fact, and then be thankful that he has found some-thing which has hitherto eluded his system, and which may possi-bly contain the key to the whole.

Let us see what sort of testi-

mony has so far been obtained.

The testimony so far obtained, or purporting to be obtained, from departed human beings is to the effect that memory continues after bodily death; for reminiscences are employed as one means

of proving identity.

This, if accepted, shows that memory does not effectively reside in the brain, although habitual usage of certain nerve tracts no doubt makes recovery of memory more easy than when the material instrument has been lost.

Intellect Continues

Habits may be weakened by that loss, but memory need not be impaired. We find that incidents that have made an impression on the mind of deceased personalities are remembered, and can be recalled under proper stimulus.
Intellect continues also. Liter-

ary quotations are often ingeniously applied, so as to convey information in a curious, characteristic and evidential manner.

Aptitudes for learning and for artistic production seem also to continue. Innate, and probably also acquired, faculties and tastes belong to the individual and are retained.

Indeed, the evidence is that the wheir personality survives, with a character and powers similar to those displayed by the bodily organism.

What Is Higher Knowledge

Above all, family affection continues strong; the desire to help friends and relatives is perhaps the most prominent feature, and indeed often constitutes the motive power that stimulates the effort to communicate.

A wider knowledge, especially a keener appreciation of the future, is sometimes shown, though the knowledge in general remains subject to human limitations, and only in a few (sometimes unex-

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pected) directions does it exceed

our own in quality.

Those on the other side of the veil say that they progress in higher knowledge, but apparently that higher knowledge, acquired out of contact with earth, seems but little accessible to them when they make the effort to return into material conditions in order to have communion with us.

They seem then partially dazzled

by temporary reincarnation - if their momentary return to a material body may be so called. The brain is an inhibiting or screening organ, and our own habitual use it may be rather dazzling too. Few can use that instrument effectively.

Clairvoyance

Even so, they see farther than we can, they possess what we call clairvoyance; they are not so subject to the limitations of space and time as we are. And so it is that when they again try to use a brain they feel a strain, and make lapses from which at their normal state

they may be free. They sometimes make an effort to tell us about their surroundings, but we have no means of verifying the information given; its general tenor is that their power of interpreting the universe has re-remained unaltered or but little changed, and that accordingly their environment appeals to them under much the same guise, and with the same general kind of appearance as they had been familiar with here.

Communicators Happy

So far, then, as their own pres ent conditions are concerned, they testify that there are many grades of existence: they are not all in one place or in one state. The viciare not with them! nor presumably are the saints constantly accessible. There is, so to speak, plenty of room, and each appears to enter the state or condition for which he is fitted.

Diversity of tastes, diversity of interests, of powers, and of intelligence, still exist, just as they do down here. And there is a sorting-out process, probably more complete than it is here, whereby we associate mainly with those of our own kind.

Those who frequently communicate with us are evidently happy, amid gracious surroundings, surrounded by beauty like that of terrestrial landscapes and under conditions which do not feel strange or unnatural. So uniform is this testimony that I have imagined that perhaps they see the etheric aspect of the very things of which we see the material aspect.

Five Minutes After Death

Whatever the explanation, they certainly tell us that they are in a state where they can feel at home, can keep in touch for a time with those they love on earth, can be of service in many ways; and though they see opportunities of progress ahead, they are well satisfied to bide their time and do their duty in that state of life to which they have been called.

They are not suddenly transmuted into beings of another or-der. They remain themselves, and changes, like all changes in the universe, are gradual. Five minuniverse, are gradual. Five min-utes after death, as the Bishop of London has said, they are much the same as they were five minutes before, except that they are rid of the burden of the flesh.

It is difficult to realize what it

all means, but they certainly say that they have music, that they can paint, that they can carry on their studies.

Literature is somehow not closed to them; they do not seem to be deprived of any of the intellectual pleasures which they enjoyed here. It seems that we are never too old to learn, and to enlarge our powers of appreciation; for that knowledge, those powers and aptitudes, are a permanent benefit.

The Departed Rejoice

The next world-a personal and subjective phrase - seems to be very much what we make it. seem to be building our future surroundings in terms of character. Those who attend only to themselves will have only them-selves to attend to. Those who have cultivated wide sympathies

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In brief, most of the departed rejoice at the conditions they find waiting for them, and are happy and content. They do indeed oc casionally testify that there are far higher beings in existence, and that they find they themselves are in the course of progressing towards higher states.

They also claim that from time to time they can inspire those left behind and help them to achieve results, to gain ideas, to make discoveries, and that to this power we owe much of value that comes through what we call genius.

Bonds of Love

All this and much more testimony about conditions on the other side will be available as soon as the facts of survival of individual character and personality are effectively admitted as true. As a matter of fact, many bereaved people already take comfort in the reception of clear and characteristic

messages from their loved ones. The veil is wearing thin, and we are beginning to realize that the separation into two states and conditions of being is an artificial separation, due mainly to the limitation of our animal senses, and that a unity, a continuity, dominates the whole.

We are welded together in the bonds of love, as the heavenly bodies are welded together by the united bonds of gravitation, and as separate atoms are grouped into solids and held together by the ether of space. There need be no isolation, no bewilderment; the universe is more perfect than has yet been conceived, even by our poets; and the enlargement of conception gained by emancipation from the material body leads to yet keener appreciation of the grandeur and beauty of existence. Truly there is much for the phi-

losopher to learn.

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The URGA Manuscript

A document which may change the entire course of modern psy-chic research is shortly to be taken to England to be deposited with the British Psychic Research So-This is the Urga Manuscript, a document of revolutionary significance which was brought from the Orient by the late Major Gregory Pearson, for many years an ardent student of psychic phe-nomena. In it, the world is given its first authoritative report on the Tibetan knowledge of Astral

students who have Eminent studied it, believe that it will open up an entirely new field of investigation, owing to its startling revelations on the question of sur-vival after death and the influence of the surviving entity upon the lives of material beings.

Apart from its impact psychic research, the Urga Manuscript details the work of a group previously unknown in the Tibetan religious system. The members of group are described as initiates of the inner temples. It is made up of specially qualified Lamas who have been freed of ordinary priestly duties in order that they may pursue a study of psychic manifestations. What they have com-piled, and what is now available to the world at large, is the most com-plete picture of the occult universe ever attempted.

The Astral World

The document has had a romantic history. It was prepared by a *Lama* who had actually served in the inner temple himself. This man, Do-Ring, was a member of the staff of the Panchen Lama during the flight from Tibet in nineteen twenty-four. Apparently he remained in the city of Urga, where the manuscript was prepared, which fact would account for the name given it, and there contacted a noted Chinese trader Wing-on, who brought the material to the attention of Major Pearson.

Later Major Pearson was of service to the Panchen, and it is believed that the document finally reached him at the Panchen's request.

The breadth of the psychic picture presented in this document reveals how thorough was the un-derstanding of the inner temple

initiates. They speak of this astral reality as casually as we would mention the house next door. They show how the astral and material planes occupy the same space areas, revealing that the astral beings are freed of material limitations as to both time and space.

The whole concept, presented by Do-Ring, is radically different from any notions we may have held, and his vivid description of the astral world is alone worthy of the closest attention. He speaks of the surviving entity as being an infinite core, which possesses remarkable powers, yet, surprisingly, has a nature akin to that of an electron, with functions that are literally incomprehensible to the human

Important Revelations

He presents an entirely new concept of communication tween the astral plane and the material level of existence and establishes that every human being possesses the faculties necessary to maintain such communication.

The knowledge of the astral world at the disposal of the inner courts is so complete that they are able to state, with the utmost confidence, that any matter in existence in that world is of an elementary That is to say that any matter to be found there is composed entirely of a single element.

Most important of all his revelations is that concerning the rite of purification, a psychic rite in which the astral beings direct a flow of purifying power into the mind of the initiate, clearing away all barriers to a perfect communion. This rite . Do-Ring suggests, prepares the human to communicate with the astral without the use of mediumistic talents.

All Data Intact

This point alone is to be the subject of extensive research work, for if the faculty of psychic com-munion can be readily developed, the modern human enters a new age in which the union between the physical and astral worlds will be universally established.

The Urga-Manuscript contains a great deal of matter which is not of a specific astral nature, treating the entire range of the occult force as one unit. This is particularly important, for it is indicated that in the inner temple, psychic com-munication must be whole in sense, and not directed at merely one phase of the study.

The occult universe is charted with an exactness never before attained in any teachings. Each plane is shown in exact relation to its fellow planes, and a new sense of

The trustees of the late Major Gregory Pearson have determined that the basic manuscript shall be taken to Great Britain, and that the publication of any of the material contained in the manuscript shall be rigidly controlled, in order that it may be available to stu-dents generally. The British Psy-chic Research Society was chosen as the recipient of the document. because of the fact that largely Major Pearson was a resident of that country.

Complete data is to be maintained here, however, for the benefit of American and Canadian societies, and will be made available during nineteen forty-eight. It is possible that an occult organization, with headquarters on the West will engage in an exhaustive research on the material, and its findings will be made available to other organizations having similar interests.

For the believer—and it requires an indurated skepticism to deny the evidence presented by this book—the life of Edgar Cayee will be the story of one of the great psychics of all time. 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
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
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our stricken civilization lies in a reconciliation between the Eastern and Western elements in

human knowledge. The author's main thesis is that there are two entirely distinct sets of values in all human affairs: the physical and the imponderable. He attributes our present muddled and dangerous condition of the world of men to the fact that we have been increasingly insistent on the physical and sensory values.

Mr. Hyde considers that Osiris, or the male Lawrence Hyde principle, represents science, action and the material values of Western civilization, while Isis, or the female principle, represents the imponderable emotional, introspective and spiritual values of the East. He believes that the chaotic conditions of the present day are due to the fact that men have been almost exclusively in charge of education, religion and science for the past several hun-

dred years. What is needed to get us back to a condition of sanity, he affirms, is a much larger mixture of the female principle of emotion and understanding in our religion, education and science. The coming age is one in which the claims of the female principles of Sophia or Wisdom could at least receive the recognition which has been denied to them in our over-masculinized culture, the author contends.

This means that as the century advances mechanism will progress

sively be subordinated to personality, reason to intuition, external science to knowledge of a more internal and esoteric order.

science to knowledge of a more internal and esoletic order. The concluding chapter affirms that "The heart of all our realiza-tion and endeavors as far as the spiritual path is concerned will be mystical realization—the key to all external adaptations. Nor can there be any question of the coming religion being anything but uni-versal in its range and content.

"Nothing less than a really comprchensive philosophy can satisfy us in this sphere, a philosophy which has not been developed merely defensively in order to serve the narrow purposes of this or that re ligious organization, but which is based upon a scientific, inspirational and really tolerant attitude to religious experience.

"For it is evidently the mark of our present epoch that no partial or one-sided attitude, scheme or more of activity can any longer be of real assistance to us; on all levels, that of religion included, we must admit our unqualified interdependence, open our souls to the Whole, and the courageously follow up all the possibilities which present themselves to us as a result."

If we cannot put the teachings of occultism, in its various interpretations, on a practical basis and in our present every day lives realize the truth of them-then primarily they have little value to us, and remain but mere words. Self realization has been the

watchword of every progressive person; upon its results are based the present triumphs called civilization. If there is a God or a Supreme Self we must have some measure of definite comprehen-sion, or God or our Supreme Self have little or no existence in our gross thoughts. Conscious realiza-tion is the only thing that seems to satisfy the majority—a thing which no amount of theorizing can

Spiritual Realization

Too long has humanity been engrossed in a "sense" world to appreciate the abstract realms. No preciate the abstract realms, 1vo amount of theorizing seems to bring ultimate satisfaction concerning them. Every man has sought satisfaction only to be lost in the maze of delusion.

People sit in beautiful churches seeking this satisfaction and the solution to their problems, and by beautiful combinations of words cleverly expounded by religious teachers, experience a sensation defined as "spiritual ecstacy." But "emotional ecstacy" never

leads to spiritual realization-nor to freedom. Even the Scriptures inconsequential when they fail to inspire spiritual wisdom. Some spend a whole life time diligently studying the Scriptures — foundering in biblical lore—they starve for spiritual realization.

How To Acquire

Others spend life-times searching every nook and corner of science and philosophy, only in the end to wonder "what it is all about." Without form or continuity, extended research is valueless.

'As a donkey carries loads of sandalwood on his back,' says an Indian proverb, "only feeling the weight of the burden without getting the benefit of the sweet per-fume, so it is with those who study innumerable Scriptures knowledge of the essence — the truth—of them."

Experience is the real method

Read

of acquiring knowledge — and strength; a strength of self-realization by which we can declare truth with conviction. There is a great deal of difference between a man of book-learning and one who has experienced and knows through self-realization.

Though the works of the great teachers and philosophers might be quoted completely from memory, till the bearer appeared profoundly learned—he would merely be repeating, "parroting," the words of another. He who has experienced, knows.

Knowledge Limitless

Therein lies the difference. Deny it though the world may, once we have experienced a thing, we know it to be true. Thus the Seer knows that immortality is a reality because he has experienced communication and has seen those who have passed through "death." In his knowledge he is bold because he knows:

Philosophers and religious teachers have, for thousands of years, preached the immortality of of the soul, yet humanity is still afraid of dying; and death throws a mantle of grief over most hearts. Did humanity understand its true nature this universal fear would be dispelled.

Because we have no conception what self-realization limit our knowledge, and thus we limit our capacity to receive in-spiration from the higher planes. Talk though we may, however, glibly, most of us are in complete ignorance of the nature of our real self-however we way talk about the immortal nature of the soul.

It is the soul-realization that us the capacity to comprehend its immortal nature. When we realize our true self, and perceive its nature as we perceive those who are about us in an objective world, then fear of death will cease to exist and disease will

As the parrot repeats the things which it is taught so long as it remains undisturbed, but reverts back to its natural screech when molested by an enemy, so humanity, parrot-like, repeats and chants the things which are taught it as infallible truths, only—in the time of sorrow or distress—to re-vert back to its natural cry of wonderment and doubt.

Like parrots, that repeat words without comprehension of their meaning, so those ambitious for knowledge cram their heads full of "words" without understanding them. Because so few have any understanding of their real nature, we find the masses weak and mis-erable when trouble or death ap-

But when man realizes that his supreme Self is in reality one and the same with God; and that he cannot be separated from God because the two are inseparable then shall he begin to unfold the mighty powers lying dormant with-in, awaiting manifestation.

How Self Is Quickened

It was the Nazarene's comprehension of his at-one-ment with the "Father" that gave him the power to perform seemingly mir-aculous feats — yet he promised we should do greater things. Why have we failed to do so? Simply because we have failed to realize the vast significance of his most important message — at-one-ment with the Father.

Realization of our Supreme Self is unattainable unless we feel in-tense love for this Self, which is God. Love is the uniting force of the universe. As families are bound through love, so beautifully is symbolized the love that unites mankind to its God-or its Supreme Self.

A Maze of Theories

When touched by this Supreme

Love the heart is purified; the emotional body is released from unholy attachments; and all selfish desires vanish. Without understanding of the fundamentals of Being, man's search for knowledge and power will avail him nothing but disillusion.

The mere religionist gropes in maze of theories only to be lost in vague and blasted hopes. The scientist gropes in the material realms of physics and chemistry, only to find himself stranded on borderland of the spiritual world.

Each has taken a different route one, through emotional observance, and the other by the exacting methods of mathematical calculation-only to find themselves arrived at the same place: the borderland, which together they must enter before terrene knowledge can be harmonized.

All efforts of man toward knowledge must eventually lead to but one place—the door of self-realization—where "God" awaits. Then realization that we are an eternal indestructible soul will give us strength to solve the problems of life—a strength which makes us fearless of the future and what it

When we know death is logically impossible, then we cease to fear it, and look upon it as a great adventure. In us abides the eternal-God lives and moves and manifests in us-we cannot die; for God could not destroy Him-self. He who has attained this understanding is richer far than he whose wealth is measured in

It is the truth supporting our knowledge that makes us richthe practical application of it that makes us valuable. Those of great philosophical learning confuse us by their technical discourses—in which they often fill a volume expounding a simple theory.

Too Many In Bondage

Today humanity's brain is confused by the elaborate systems of philosophy. It were better for it to revert to simple, childlike principles of learning. The Masters use few words. One's illumination speaks for itself. The possession of this great Truth makes all other truths appear insignificant.



Born on Christmas Day, 1882, Miss Anderson received her early education in Jersey City, N. J. After high school graduation, she matriculated at Cooper Union, in Manhattun, to train in the profession of a masseuse. Almost a half century of service to humanity in her particular profession is a record.

Everyone found her to be more than a mere nurse and aside from the im-mense flow of magnetism that emanated from her finger tips, her personality and antiable sense of humor seemed to attract all those with whom she came in contact. It was these latter two in contact. It was these latter two qualities which enabled her to give an extra tonic to her patients, says Mr.

Miss Anderson became affiliated with the Church of Spiritual Revelation thirty years ago, when the founder of the church was still making her home upon the earth. It was through this founder, the late Rev. Alma Stuart Iartounder, the late Rev. Alma Shaart Jarrett, that she acquired her vast knowledge of Spiritualism. In 1927, a few days before Another Alma passed to higher life. Miss Anderson promised her that she would be faithful to the institution as long as there was breath in This trust was never brok In all her years of close affiliation, she never missed a service with the exception of a well earned week's vacation she enjoyed cach year.

Mr. Russell informed me that people from all walks of life came to pay last respects to this dear soul whilst her body lay at rest in the church before the funeral

Among them were many notables in spiritualist circles, such as Everett F. Britz, secretary of the General Assembly ad Spiritudists; Rev. Sarah W. Cushing, Lily Dale, N. Y.; Rev. F. Palmer Gib-son, lecturer and psychic; and Rev. Converse Nickerson, another famous lecturer and psychic, who also came to nay last respects to his close frend. Mr. Brown enclosed a clipping from the Pittsburgh Post Gazette with the heading "Scientists Told To Watch Psychic Developments" and the sub-heading "Pitt Professor Seeks Pittsburgh Subjects for Tests in Thought Transference."

The article in its entirety follows: "Scientists should pay more the psychic abilities of those to sense the unspoken thoughts of others, is the opinion of a Pitt pro-fessor who spoke Monday at a luncheon meeting of the Hungry Club in Hotel

Henry.
"Dr. Robert A. McConnell, an assistant professor of physics at the University of Pittsburgh, stepped a bit outside of his specialty, which is electronics, to delve into the realm of the psychic, in which he has more than a passing interest.

Observation Placed First

"The lack of a theory to explain such things as thought transference and other psychic ability, Dr. McCon-nell told his audience, is wholly unim-

"The question of the existence of extrasensory perception can be decided only by experimental observation,' he said. 'The lack of a theory is unimport-The one important thing is the observed fact. As theorists themselves often say, a theory can be found, sooner or later, to fit the facts."

"As a result of applying the scientific method, Dr. McConnell said, experi-menters at Duke University have come with evidence which can not be explained away.

"In this experiment, one of the re-archers had a deck of cards, and turned them over at the rate of one per minute. In another building, keeping step by means of a synchronized watch, a second man wrote down his guesses as to the cards turned up.

Psychic Persons Wanted





