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## FORD AT HIS BEST



Arthur Ford

*"We have not seen faith"*

A lecture and 56 evidential messages were given recently by Arthur Ford, world famous medium. The propaganda meeting was held under the auspices of the International Psychic Society at the Hotel Diplomat in New York City.

Ford began his lecture by declaring that every person in the world, from the most learned university professor to the wild savages in the jungle, lived under one or two hypotheses: either he is a Spiritualist,—in the sense that he believed human personality transcended the five senses, or he is a materialist. And no alternative was possible.

A telling point in the lecture was Ford's declaring that today's prophets were not priests but scientists. The leading scientists have warned us that

we must develop a morality consistent with the power unleashed by research. For two hundred years we have suffered from the materialist philosophy of the scientists, and now with the introduction of atomic warfare, the scientific world is reverberating with cries for peace, for morality; the profession which has led the world in developing war instruments is heading the new search for a warless relationship between nations.

Arthur Compton said . . .

Ford propounded that none of the leading scientists were any longer materialistic. All agreed that physical matter provided no explanation of life. In the atom alone, a new world of knowledge has been born, and the most exciting pursuits of the greatest thinkers lie in that field. Men were creating elements in nature and were inventing new ones, a process which centuries ago would have sent them to the stake for "wizardry."

Scientists turn to a spiritual explanation of life. The great English scientist Gerald Balfour had declared, "We know too much about matter to believe in it any longer."

The speaker told that when he took part in a symposium before the Emil Hirsch Foundation in Chicago, one of the four participants was Arthur Compton, Nobel prize winner in physics, and this pioneer in atomic development declared:

"In my laboratory, I am not concerned with proving survival, but every day I deal with forces which are intelligent and before which I sometimes feel I should kneel in reverence.

"If I light a candle here before you and immediately snuff it out, I have not destroyed the candlelight. You no longer see it with your physical eye, but countless thousands of light years from now that tiny candle flame will be winging its way through space.

"If I can not destroy a candle light which I myself have created, how absurd to think that personality should be destroyed because of physical death."

Then Einstein, the father of Modern Science, had declared: "If my theory of the universe be correct, then fourth dimensional faculties are necessary." By fourth dimensional faculties, Einstein meant powers of perception beyond time and space, or in the language of the Spir-

itualist — clairvoyance, clair-audience, and the rest of the psychic and spiritual gifts.

The scientists did not hesitate to put forward their thoughts; each new world of ideas took the human mind higher in its evolution and involved a new outlook on a higher scheme of the universe.

Mark Twain said . . .

Ford continued his lecture by citing different attitudes toward death. The nonchalant attitude of dealing with one world at a time, and even welcoming death as "an angel's kiss to cool a fevered brow," a sentiment well expressed by Walt Whitman's poem which sang of death as "Mother with the gently gliding feet."

And the agnostic attitude, in which a person knows of no life after death, but is willing to be shown. Mark Twain, for example, wrote, "I have never had any proof of immortality, but it violates the deepest instincts of my soul not to believe in it."

The atheist declared that this life is all, that nothing followed decomposition of the body;

"All is vain." But the atheist was now out of date, the scientists who formed the back bone to the materialist philosophy had deserted to join the spiritual outlook, for energy is superior to matter, and there is survival.

Death stalked the planet. The world we know was born in terror and lives under the ghastly mask of potential annihilation, through atomic warfare. No one could escape facing death; death permeates all human life. And it is the task of Spiritualism to liberate the people from fear by showing that man is an immortal entity who survives.

**Fear Changes Things**

Ford showed that fear is in every national budget; fear was echoed in the speeches of every national leader: fear had colored art, literature, and religion, and it would be inevitable that fear would produce great

changes in the morality of the human race.

A moral basis, Ford continued, was indispensable to any solution of the problems now confronting mankind.

**Ideas Have Power**

We have sent our young men to the wars, and they have not returned. We stand in the mouth of hell, and we cry, "Are they dead?" Was the young artist dead before his song had been sung? Was Shelley dead? Would Shakespeare speak no more? Was all this imprisoned splendor to remain forever unrevealed?

We spoke of the creative artists as having gone into the unseen, but the telling point was this, what we most loved was always unseen. It was not the body we loved, but what was expressed through the body.

The spirit, using a physical vehicle, expressed ideas, love, faith, hope, and kindness. With-

out love, or ideas, or faith, the human body is nothing; yet we do not see these powers. Rousseau had declared that, "Man without an idea is an empty, helpless, senseless thing," and Victor Hugo had written, "Nothing is so powerful as an idea whose time has come." Yet no man had ever seen an idea, but all the race had felt the effects of ideas in the noblest and the cruelest perpetrations of mankind.

**Significance of Faith**

We had not seen faith, but we had observed faith in action. No one could have seen the impelling faith that sent Livingston into the African jungle, but anyone then present could have seen the inspired missionary's physical being. No one had seen the faith that made Darwin persist in his observations in the English garden that proved the birth-place of a new and brilliant concept of evolution.

But all could have watched his body at work.

Mental hospitals are crowded with people who have lost faith in themselves and in the universe. Without faith civilization would crumble. No business would open in New York tomorrow if everyone lost faith. Yet we have never seen faith. Saint Paul had said faith was the "Substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen."

Faith, hope, and love, these are unseen yet vital to living. When Jesus was asked, "What is God?" He replied, "God is love." He knew his hearers, among them poor and unlearned people, each of them had experienced love in some form, though it was unseen, and Jesus' explanation of the unseen God as love was not a trite statement, but the explanation of a genius who knew what he was doing.

All the great men of history

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had been sustained by the unseen world. In the book of Hebrews it is said that Moses endured "as though he saw the invisible." He was no mystical recluse but a very practical man, the first labor leader, the first leader of mass migration. He led his people away from the tyrant Pharaoh, and he did this through tapping the invisible world of power and employing it to do good among the human race.

**Kipling's "L'Envoi"**

Ford declared that we who knew of the invisible as a reality had no right ever to be discouraged. We had the spirit of truth that Christ spoke of, and we had to expand our views and work toward infinite ends. He followed with Kipling's "L'Envoi":

"When earth's last picture is painted

The message service which followed the lecture was delivered in the expected Fordian manner, accuracy in each case and a swift pace to bring 56

messages, almost all these being subdivided. Ford's flawless platform technique brought rounds of applause from the audience as he snappily paced through the message work. At one point Ford had given a woman several messages, each verified, when she asked for her father's name.

"Do you study astrology?" asked Ford.

"No."

"Then where do I get 'zodiac'?"

**"Man Can Only Contact Man Through Man"**

Edison was working at the time of his death on an instrument which he hoped would pick up and translate into sound-messages from the spirits. Since his death, the great inventor has returned many times through mediums to tell us that he knows now that such an instrument could not be made.

From time to time, we hear that other men, men possessing far less ability than Edison, are trying to do the same thing. An understanding of spiritual laws should be sufficient to convince these persons that they are on a fruitless quest.

The Creative Intelligence at work in the universe has already fashioned an instrument of amazing complexity which does the job quite well. *That is man.* There has never been a revelation from Infinite Intelligence, Divine Mind or GOD; call it what you will: that has not come through a human being who has developed and dedicated his latent faculties to this end. Man cannot create consciousness, he uses it, translates it into action.

Let us understand our terms. The very word psychic comes from *psyche* which means life, soul, mind or *self*. Primarily it is the individualized spirit in man, his part in the Cosmic Whole. It means breath or spirit and is an entity.

"God breathed into man the breath of life and he became a living soul." In its secondary sense, the *psyche* or *self* is referred to as mind and relates to mental processes. Physical man is a biological product, a material instrument. Professor James says that psychology, which literally means "the nature of the *psyche*" is a metaphysical and not a biological subject. Metaphysics means above, or beyond the physical.

These men who would build a mechanical device to capture intelligence must do the job by an application of their own *psyche* or mind. Therefore, intelligence is master of the machine. The machine could *never* master intelligence.

"Zodiac is my father's name."

Ford delivered one message in Yiddish and its recipient translated the message into "Sweet Hannah" for the speaker, and verified the message.

**Tanner Verifies**

Professor Hyslop, famous American psychic researcher, came through the medium to reach the woman who had taught his children music. She verified the teaching and the message.

A former editor of *The Scientific American* reached Dr. Tan-

ner through Ford. Dr. Tanner verified the message and acknowledged having sat with Ford when the famous medium delivered the Houdini code message that proved Houdini's survival.

**What We Must Do**

A dramatic point in the night was the speaker's message from a suicide who had seen his family cremated in a German concentration camp. Another Nazi victim was contacted through the speaker. Their messages

After the 56 messages had been delivered and verified, Ford introduced two of his students, Ann Decker, wife of America's foremost test medium, Frank Decker, and Lee Jarnagin, university graduate from Dallas, Texas. Mr. Jarnagin had been preparing to enter the Union Theological Seminary at Columbia University when he began a correspondence on Spiritualism with Arthur Ford. The correspondence culminated in their meeting in Miami, Florida, where young Jarnagin was convinced and began his phenomenal development under Ford.

Prominent leaders in the Spiritualist movement were introduced: Adrian Peabody, Ethel L. Corbin, Kitty McKay Leith, Dr. Russell MacRoberts, the Rev. Raymond E. Burns.

Among the dogs Ford listed was a pet collie which had died the day before, a fact which Ford could not have known and Mrs. Terhune verified this.

## A Spirit Explains Difficulties

What Do They Remember?

What Is Important to Them?

On a number of occasions in seance rooms during the past 14 years, I have heard certain "down-to-earth" philosophy which, at first, startled me to say nothing of the effect it had upon others at the time.

This philosophy, boiled down and bluntly expressed, conveyed this thought: "The purpose of life is to suffer." Without some explanation, this philosophy was difficult to comprehend. However, the spirit guides would sometimes elaborate by saying: "The important thing is not the suffering, but how earth people cope with situations and overcome them."

By suffering, we naturally

think of several things, carrying mental burdens, overcoming physical defects, or facing up the "trials and tribulations" of life.

And then by way of explanation, the guides would say: "How can you become strong if you do not carry burdens?" or "Show me a person that has not suffered and I will show you a person that has not lived."

In order for this philosophy to make sense, we have only to face up on our problems of life and when we do, we can usually point to the so-called disastrous times . . . times of apparent suffering. As we look back, we find these were not so bad but proved to be the very things that gave us the strength to carry on.

And so it is with mediums. Mediums are just people. They,

too, have their problems and all down through the pages of the history of Spiritualism, we find that the mediums had their problems but their difficulties seemed to have been even greater because, added to the normal work-a-day life of an individual, to them had been added a number of additional milestones to overcome.

Mediums have always been on the receiving end of scorn,

misunderstanding, condemnation, and hundreds of other epitaphs with which the rank-and-file do not have to contend.

And so, show me a medium that has not been condemned, ridiculed and maligned and I will show you a medium that has not reached what can be called, for the want of a better term, the top.

It isn't with the thought of setting up any one medium as being the only target but, in many ways, the Rev. Bertha

Marx, has had her share. When returning from a trip west some years ago, I stopped over at Springfield, Ohio, to attend an Ohio State Spiritualist convention which was being held in that city.

I had heard of the Rev. Marx and was anxious to meet her. At the time, she was pastor of a Spiritualist church under whose auspices the convention was being held. I was impressed with the type of work she was doing; her lecture was credible and her 'trance and mental mediumship above the average. At the time, her class members informed me that her direct-voice phenomena could be placed in the same category.

### She Was Sponsored

I spoke to Bertha and encouraged her to travel; told her to get about the country more, at least as much as she could; told her to visit camps, see other workers and afford herself and her spirit guides a greater opportunity. And this, she did!

Records show she attended conventions; received bookings at several camps, especially Lily Dale where all phases of her mediumship were passed by the Board of Directors; and met hundreds of people she would otherwise have never known.

It was during these days that she met the late Rev. N. S. Thelme who was, at that time, president of the W. T. Stead Memorial Center of New York City. As time went on, she was appointed medium for that Center in New York City and after the president passed away she continued. (See Page 5)

## The Mediumship of BERTHA R. MARX

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Today, she still conducts her spiritual work at 41 West 88th Street, in the Central Park, West district of Manhattan.

Two weeks during the month of August, she filled an engagement at Freeville Spiritualist Assembly, Freeville, New York, where her work received favorable comment. Needless to say, through all these years, she has been confronted with almost unsurmountable difficulties, but through it all, she carries on.

Last September, she visited the American Foundation for Psychic Research, Inc., at Jamestown, and did not hesitate to grant us another privilege to witness one of her direct-voice seances and it was during this seance, that the idea for this story originated.

#### German Spoken

It so happened that at the time a total stranger to us, paid a visit, inquiring about the Foundation, books, etc. He was a German and spoke very little English and when he learned that a seance was to be held that evening, he asked if he might attend.

During this seance, the bulk of evidence seemed to center around our German friend who, even though this was his first experience, talked directly to his loved ones. Most of the conversation, especially the singing, was in German and, toward the end of the seance, a learned discourse was given from none other, than Martin Luther.

Much of the philosophy I have tried to impart at the outset was touched upon and discussed by the medium's principal spirit collaborator, Dr. William Norris.

#### Thorne Explains

Another high-light of the seance was a direct-voice communication from the late Edward Lester Thorne who tried to explain the whys and wherefores of memory—memory as experienced by a deceased person.

Speaking for himself, Ed outlined difficulties which had to be surmounted. He actually experimented and tried to "think back" and gather fragments, here and there, of what

had happened. He even tried to explain a situation when asked pertinent questions regarding his last days on earth.

Too many people think it is all so easy. They really think all spirits have at their beck and call, answers to all sorts of questions, personal or otherwise. My experience with Ed answered much for me. I received the answers to many things that heretofore had puzzled me.

#### Obstacles Confront Spirits

We know something of the trials and tribulations of people and of mediums, but I won-

communicate, some have not experienced what actually takes place when the "spirit communication system" is cut off through some fault of theirs, either intentional or unintentional. I remember a time when just this happened. Bertha was the medium.

Several Canadian Spiritualists, by their determined questioning, seemed to have shut off the power. This happened when Mona, Rev. Marx's little child guide, was speaking. The results presented a difficult situation, to say the least.

#### Mona's Plight

der if we have ever thought of the difficulties and heartaches experienced by the spirit people . . . those who ever try to communicate.

Some spirits have not even learned the technique, some do not care, some have not the opportunity and if afforded can only make a feeble effort toward bringing through what we choose to call evidence.

On the other hand, many of the so-called seasoned sitters, do not understand the obstacles spirits have to overcome to com-

gone wrong and that certain contacts had been broken. She said the sitters should be dismissed at once. This was done, the medium remaining with Mrs. Pressing and myself. During the process, as little light as possible was allowed to seep into the room.

All the while, Mona was perfectly able to hold the medium in trance. She could speak as coherently as ever, but claimed that she was unable to release the medium. In the end, everything turned out all right, but

over 40 minutes elapsed before Mona could return her medium to consciousness.

#### Not So Easy

So I say, not only the mediums, but the spirit collaborators have their troubles. I hope it will some day be possible to prevent situations like this but these occasions occur and should be discussed rationally. Furthermore, I feel it is my job to impart, in as clear language as possible, a few of my experiences because by so doing, others may come to realize that it is not all as easy as it appears. This thing called mediumship and its expression is not all milk and honey as some would like to believe.

And so the Rev. Marx carries on and may she reach that goal to which every medium aspires, selfless service to their spirit guides and humanity.

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# The Spiritualist Notebook

## LOOKING FORWARD

Too often, in considering the possibilities of the future, attention is paid only to material advancement. Scientific successes of the past are reviewed and present efforts are stressed in order to set up an optimistic picture of man's control of his environment and of the forces of Nature which used to be mysteries to him.

While the establishment of assurance of a better world on the basis of past inventions and discoveries, as well as present endeavors, in the laboratory is justified, we frequently do not go far enough. Content to examine physical evidence only, we miss the whole area of philosophical accomplishment and thereby limit our faith.

### That Driving Force

What real difference does the atom bomb make if man fails in comprehending immortality? Who cares about it if confidence in the continuance of life after death is lost? First things must come first, and certainly the work of philosophers and thinkers in the realms of metaphysics deserve study of the most serious kind.

The results of Spiritualists' efforts to penetrate the astral plane are as phenomenal and faith-inspiring as are the successes of the physical scientists in bringing men understanding of the earth on which they live. In fact, their attempts—like those of all great thinkers and scholars—to dispel ignorance can be regarded as the driving force behind any incentive to progress.

### The Next 50 Years

That undiscovered country from whose bourne no traveler returns should not make cowards of us all. Rather it should serve as an inspiration to higher achievements on this earth, so that when the time comes, we are ready to cast off earthly considerations with no regrets. Only the neurotic looks upon spiritual communications with fear. The thinker welcomes psychic experiences, which herald an era of greater understanding of spiritual truths and psychic phenomena.

Those who have given serious thought to the subject of Spiritual-

ism are looking forward eagerly to the next fifty years. They foresee developments in the psychic field much as the physicists of a few years ago contemplated the splitting of the atom. To the laymen at that time this idea was fantastic. *Impossible!* they scoffed. *A product of the imagination!*

It is true that imagination played a part in the early work of this marvelous achievement, which has come in the present generation. Imagination—or the ability of the mind to pioneer in regions of thought hitherto unexplored—is a part of all genius. It is through this capacity to see into the darkness and to lead others to perceive the first glimpses of light in the caverns that the great thinkers of all ages have kept alive the material and spiritual aspirations of the human race. *Truth lies hid in obscurity.*

### Moontide Brightness

Knowledge, like everything else, is governed by cyclic law. That is why those who have studied the question of modes of communication between the Spirit World and this plane of life are confident that the second half of the Twentieth Century will bring forth tremendously important revelations. These will have even greater significance to every person than the splitting of the atom or the anticipated cure for cancer and heart trouble.

Although the whole world will go through some darkness, the moontide brightness will prevail eventually. In 1975 there will be a great surge toward metaphysical beliefs. Spiritualism will make phenomenal strides. Orthodoxy will fade rapidly. The new cycle will bring greater understanding, renewed faith, happier perception, greater deeds of altruism, magnificent medical discoveries, new ways and means of alleviating suffering and greater forms of mediumship.

Thought, will, feeling and justice are the attributes in which all Spiritualists glory. Therefore, the fol-

lowers of this Truth are deeply concerned with the potentialities and trends of humanity, for as one philosopher said, you can say of yourself, "I love him who willeth the creation of something beyond himself."

### Value of Dreams

Narada, Hindu philosopher, wrote: *One must study to know, know to understand, understand to judge.* Therefore, it is up to each one of us living now to spend some time on this wonderful subject of medium-

ship and the satisfying spiritual experiences that are in store as a result of its comprehension.

Oftentimes spiritual value can be found from dreams if real study is put upon their interpretation. Extensive reading on the subject of Spiritualism as well as solitary meditation are other ways in which the average person can add to the sum of knowledge of this important metaphysical science. Each individual's contribution counts.

Probably no period in history is more depressing to study than the Middle Ages. Progress in all the arts and sciences seemed to be al-

most at a standstill. Here you will find little originality of thought or inspired vision. Scholars, for the most part, were concerned merely with the task of copying the ancient texts. Interpretations followed the established pattern, or they were discarded as heresies.

### Voltaire Defended

The Renaissance with its renewed interest in the ancient Roman and Greek cultures followed the dreary centuries of the Middle Ages. Interest in finding answers to questions of human beings' place in the Universe was rejuvenated. Man began again his search for spiritual fulfillment. In the early half of the Seventeenth Century there came the philosopher Descartes, who stressed the importance of re-examination of accepted truths and the individual's responsibility in interpretation.

He was followed by Voltaire, who defended victims of religious intolerance. Many influential thinkers contributed to the process of freeing men intellectually and restoring their faith in progress. A new cycle was started, and we call it the Modern Age of rebuilding and fulfillment. This is an epoch of inspiration and productiveness.

Even today, however, there is a crying need for guidance in the hearts of many. Prophets still speak, trying to lead men into the paths of spiritual confidence. On a recent visit to the United States, Prime Minister Nehru of India warned that it is time to worry over fear, not the atom bomb. *The psychology of blind fear should be our greatest anxiety.*

He said, *The more terrible the dangers of war, the more the people should see the folly of it and avoid it. Russia's discovery of the atom bomb has forced people to think more vividly and to realize the possibilities in store. In that sense it may help toward prevention of war.*

Humanity has the benefit of accumulated wisdom and countless potentialities for improvement and growth. There are records covering thousands of years, knowledge passed on by one race to another and handed down through generations to the present time. Upon these we have

reason to base a philosophy of faith.

Psychic predictions have been checked and verified for centuries. Therefore, it is not difficult for a qualified medium to forecast the future. We are justified in leaving the current years to their own interpretation and looking ahead to the future and the spiritual satisfactions which are in store.

Nature Cannot Compel

Naturally most of us are vitally interested in the remainder of the Twentieth Century, which is just beginning its second half. Civilization is to pass through critical events, foreshadowed on the astral plane. Old systems will disappear, and in their place a new order of things will be established.

*What part am I going to play in the panorama of events that will occur? you may ask yourself. To what extent will I be able to contribute to the welfare of the human race? Or am I to remain quiescent, merely a spectator in this glorious drama of spiritual evolution?*

Nature cannot compel you to train yourself for a special job, it is true. But if you are prepared at the psychological time and available at the right place, your opportunity for service to mankind will come. To be altruistic demands cultivated knowledge and constructive perception. The full realization of your own divinity will help to make you ready to act when opportunity comes.

No "Ifs" or "Buts"

Your duties as a Spiritualist benefactor must be according to Twentieth Century specifications. On whatever plane you function, whether it be in a small or big capacity, your acts have their consequences and power. Infinitesimal as you may feel, you are in reality part of the whole human structure, and this knowledge must be woven into your every act and thought.

There are no *ifs* or *but*s in the pattern of Spiritualists' faith in life after death. Immortality cannot be questioned. Both the BHAGAVAD GITA (Hindu Book of Wisdom) and the BIBLE back up this absolute assurance that death is but a transition, a going on to new planes of experience and greater spiritual comprehension.

On this earth you will not understand the flame which is always dancing, which is always alive, everlastingly burning, unless you have within you this realization, that you are part of the flame, part of that eternal world in which there is Liberation and Happiness. Nor will you be able to comprehend the power and

glory of Jesus' words: *In my Father's House are MANY MANSIONS.*

As the second half of the Century begins, it is perhaps fitting to follow the New Year's custom of making resolutions, but let us not be content with petty intentions and ambitions. civilization. It is, therefore, to Spiritualists especially that this message is conveyed, for they have learned the true meaning of Self-realization and hence communion with other centers of consciousness.

### Real Altruism

The power of understanding—and hence communion—goes even beyond other so-called centers of consciousness as we know them in the case of mediums who have progressed to complete comprehension of the One Life. Death appears no more of a barrier than varying economic and social positions or disagreements regarding rites of worship.

Spiritualists are better equipped than any other group of people to realize the unfortunate tendency of creeds to separate mankind. Recognition of the Divine Power is the important consideration, not the way one chooses to express that recognition or gratitude for its universality and everlastingness. The prayer felt in the heart is as important as the hymn of praise sung in the church.

Actually the Truth and Life lie within the individual, but only if he regards his individuality as not himself but as a mere convenience which he has created for use on this earth and by means of which he seeks to attain the life beyond individuality as we know it here. Only through awakened spiritual will is he able to grasp the concept of the evolution of the Soul and reject consideration of his existence *per se*.

The realization of one's own seemingly separate life as an aspect of the One Life means the birth of real altruism. As intelligence develops, the person who has gone this far is able to see the One Life reflected in others too. Then is the spirit of brotherly love truly awakened and humanitarianism manifest in its purest form.

When the advanced thinker has to meet the death of a beloved friend, he does not try to bind the deceased down to the earth by ties of sympathy for his grief. He does not lift his voice in sorrow to create a state of longing and anxiety which will disturb the one who has gone on. Realizing the Divine Self in both, he does not seek to impose his seeming separateness, which is bound up in the earth body, upon his friend who has left the earth plane and is ready for free spiritual experiences.

This is altruism of the highest order and makes possible a condition of mutual helpfulness, for the

spirit which has been freed by death and assisted in liberation by earth friends is in the best position in turn to help them. Time and space as such no longer exist and communion is possible. These are the Truths which Spiritualists know and which during the next half of the present century more and more earth inhabitants are going to come to understand.

The knowledge or comprehension of each individual is like a little stream emptying into a river, which in turn rushes on to the great sea. Each thought and act of pure altruism adds to the waters until at last the ocean of Happiness sweeps over all, engulfing the whole world in its warm and invigorating current.

If a person is reluctant to employ such a word as millennium (as used in The Book of Revelations) when he contemplates the era of spiritual enlightenment and progress which the next fifty years will bring, there is no necessity to do so. Remember that the Spiritualist's faith in this period of greater understanding and achievement is based upon the ability of individuals to see the Divine Self in all.

It is not a vague or impractical dream, but is established firmly upon perception, which has its roots in the present civilization on this earth. It has as its foundation the accumulated knowledge of the past and, like the work of the physical scientists, is grounded upon facts and proven theories.

### Spiritual Awareness

Fortunate, indeed, is he who perceives the Truth now and can begin at the start to plan his life in accordance with the Spiritualists' welcome of the second half of the Twentieth Century! If you can comprehend the One Self in you and in all other human beings, you will not need to wait for evolution to urge you on. Having grasped the concept of true altruism, you will be eager to help the weak, to conform the sorrowing and to do whatever you can to improve the lot of humanity on the earth plane, so that all may know the abundant life.

Your awareness of spiritual help from those who have gone before will be sharpened. Then will you know that your dear ones in the World of Spirit, linked to you by love and sympathy, willingly sacrifice themselves to stand before you, shielding you (whenever possible) from harm. And knowing all this you may justly question yourself: To what greater happiness, to what greater destiny could I aspire?

## Joe and Poe

Leave it to Joe Dunninger when it comes to worming his way into the news spotlight. And this time, he conjured up the idea of chiseling in on the 100th anniversary of the birth of the great poet, Edgar Allen Poe.

Poor Joe! Things must be getting difficult for him. I remember the time several years ago when he told me he was through using mediums for publicity purposes.

According to a recent release, he has now duped another newspaper reporter into thinking he is serious about his psychic investigations and is again flouncing his threadbare \$10,000 challenge. As usual, it is coupled with an idiotic *psychic test*, which, in his heart, he knows is impossible.

His latest blast couples him with one, Wirt Whitcomb Barnitz, who claims to be a lifetime student of Edgar Allen Poe. It appears that Mr. Barnitz has been taken in by the wily Joe for he asked him to attend a seance with an *unnamed* medium.

Too bad Joe didn't page Frank Decker but he couldn't afford to do that because then he would have to soft pedal his \$10,000 challenge. He knows Decker would tell him to put up or else. The picture (this page) shows Joe to be a little uneasy. It seems the alleged magician can't figure out from which end of the trumpet the spirit voices originate. —>

Since Joe's sad experience with Decker many years ago, mediums always remain unnamed. Dunninger doesn't dare challenge Decker, anyway Joe is leery of libel, especially since "Crystal gazed" at him recently. All these shananigans are part of a conjurer's game, but I can't understand why Spiritualists

take these magicians seriously.

I recall an incident in Buffalo recently when I was approached by a man who showed me the "Poe clipping." This man said: "Dunninger must be a great medium." I responded, "His job is to fool people and if you want to be fooled there is nothing I can do about it."

I reminded the Buffalonian that Joe has publicly stated: "I am not a psychic, a medium or a mind-reader." However, so

long as newspapers print his balderdash, I suppose people will read it. Newspapers have nothing to fear if they insult one-half of one per cent of their readers. And Joe Dunninger profits with a lot of free publicity which creates a greater demand for his services, (even as this article may do). These demands lead to contracts for stage and radio time at large fees.

Joe will always be well paid as long as the newspapers and the ABC co-operate. Nothing seems to stop him for as long as it pays off, as it did for the Houdini's, he will try to ride on the crest of the unpopularity of the truths of spirit communication . . . for Spiritualism, even though true, is indeed an unpopular religion. Conjurers know this and play it for all it is worth.

## Where Credit Is Due

A New York newspaper, in blazing headlines, features an article written by Cholly Knickerbocker which bluntly states the fact that a spirit is credited with assisting the career of the now famous artist, Oscar De Majo. One night, according to the report, De Majo went to a Spiritualist seance and there he was told he would be a great painter, even though at the time he had never touched a brush in his life. *It came true!*

## Famous Scientist

One of the most remarkable cases of spirit materialization ever to be put on record was vouched for by Sir William Crookes, renowned British scientist, who passed over in 1919 at the age of eighty-seven. His entire life had been devoted actively to science.

It was Crookes who discovered a new element, the metal thallium, and who also discovered the cathode rays.

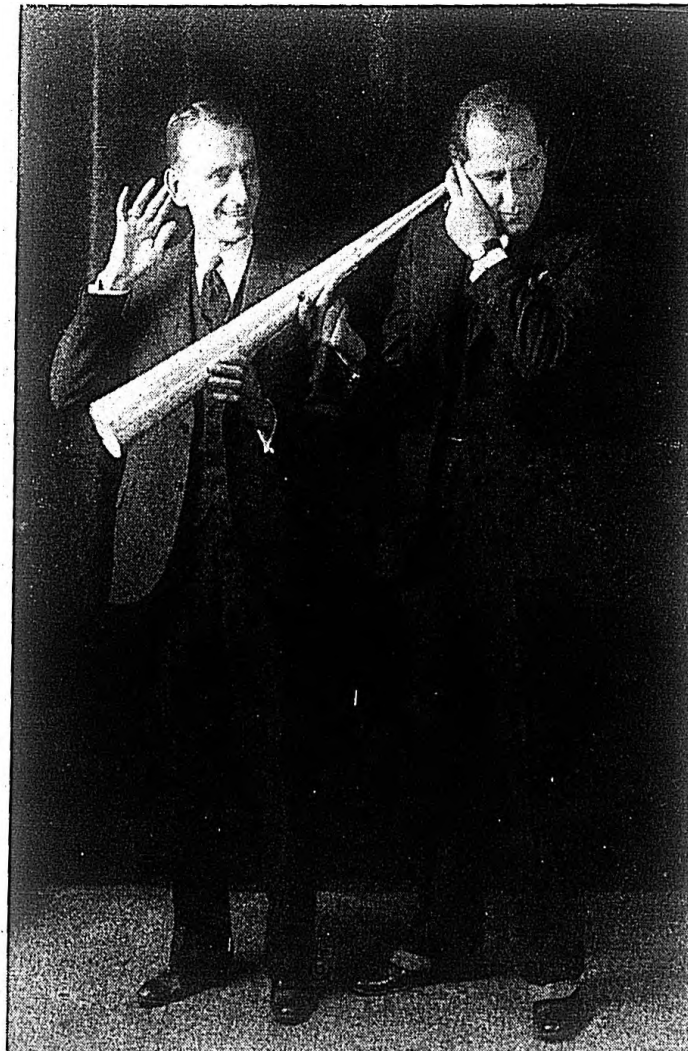
Crookes gave all his discoveries freely to the world, and his degrees, medals, presidencies of learned societies and the Order of Merit bestowed upon him by a king of England has made his name outstanding in the history of science. And so it was only natural that a mind so virile and original should also turn to the world-old mystery surrounding the question of death.

During discussions with numerous devotees of Spiritualism and learned investigators of psychic science, I find very few who have even heard of the Crookes' experiments. Not one in a hundred knew about his great classic: "*Investigations Into the Phenomena of Spiritualism*" (\*)

A pathetic situation, indeed, when even the so-called leaders of the movement express their ignorance of the published facts concerning that most controversial phase of mediumship, materialization. Most of the criticism seems to come from those who know the least about the subject . . . those who openly admit that they haven't attended a physical phenomena seance in 40 years.

Also it may be of interest to relate that Maude Kline and Frank Decker were the attendants at our wedding at Camp White Eagle, Westwood, New Jersey, October 4, 1937. The ceremony was performed by the Rev. Ida M. Demopoulos, president of the New Jersey State Spiritualist Association.

About India

This is an opportune moment for me to introduce a subject that I have by-passed

for some time. It concerns the Master teachers of India and Tibet.

I agree with Mrs. Hunt that our loved ones and highly evolved spirit teachers work and help us in our endeavors to learn more about the laws of spirit and how to live life, but my personal experience is that "when the pupil is ready, the master appears."

Out of the blue so to speak and without seeking on my part, through correspondence, I came into contact with a highly evolved soul and one who is private secretary to His Holiness, one of the Tibetan Masters.

At some future date, I shall probably tell you more about the direct teachings I have received from these highly evolved souls who are yet living on the earth plane. I shall try to explain, as best I can, the real value of being *en rapport* with them.

Another point, that has always interested me, is watching the fulfillment of prophecy. In the year of 1936, a clairvoyant, Elsie Woodworth Graves, gave me a reading in which she told me that, during the years 1946-47, it would be my destiny to have direct contact with highly evolved teachers in the Far East. She said they would assist me to carry on the work that was scheduled for me to do. I have the written record of this reading

which was given to me in the Leolyn Hotel, Lily Dale, N. Y.

My observation is that when we, as students, do the very best we can, in accordance to our own light at that time, invariably the long range prophecies come to pass. Such has been my experience.

Please note: "when we do the best we can according to our own light at that time" because with limited understanding and limited light, we make mistakes, but out of these mistakes comes greater help from the spirit people who inspire us to greater understanding.

Even though a prophecy is not fulfilled immediately, or when we assume it should be, I have observed that in due season, the very things some mediums relate do come to pass.

Giving spirit messages to people is a tremendous responsibility for a medium and one that sometimes frightens me, especially if it happens to involve prophecy. In my case, being unaware of what I am about to say, prophetic utterances sometimes pour out. I will relate a case that happened early in September, 1947.

My dear friends, the Rev. Sarah W. Cushing and her daughter, Winifred, called upon me at my home. Winifred told me about her summer's experiences with the Jennertown (Pennsylvania) Stock Company and said that her agent had contacted her about a probable engagement with Mae West.

Knowing that Mae is a personal friend of mine, she asked me several questions about her. Before thinking, I blurted out: "Win, you may join Mae West's company, but before many moons, you will be in a Broadway success that will have a long, long run." In addition, I told Win that this engagement will result from the excellent work she did in "All My Sons" at Jennertown.

A short time later, she joined the cast of Mae West's "Diamond Lil" but not for long. (Continued Page 14, Col. 1)

"Mrs. Parrish will have her usual classes for the study of philosophy and the personal development of each student's individual psychic abilities.

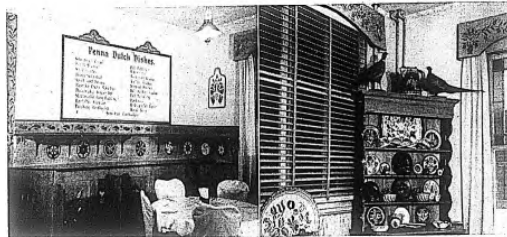

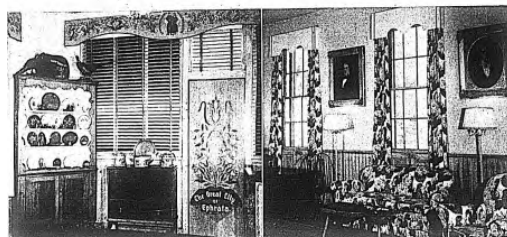

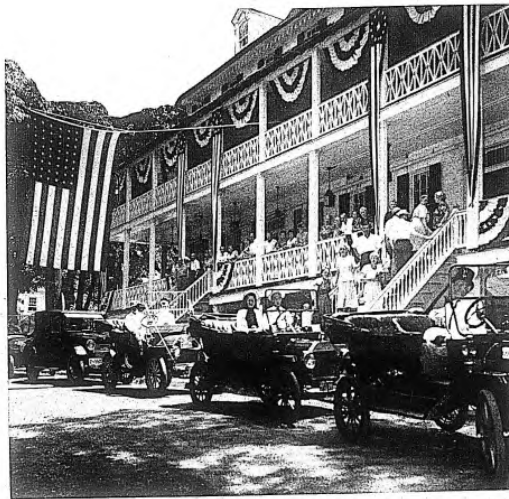

The first Spiritualist book I ever read was "Through the Mists" (\*\*) by R. J. Lees. Of course, you know and perhaps have read that beautiful book. It had the same sort of effect on me as father's script did on you.

"If you ever come over here and visit the north of England, do not forget that a certain vicar lives in the hamlet of Rivington near Bolton and that this vicar would be glad to meet you."

Again I say, reading good

books covering the experiences of others, serves as inspiration and guidance. This guidance, presented as lessons in book form, is vitally important for sincere students who are striving to gain a better understanding.

Robert James Lees, the author of two other excellent books: "The Life Elysian" (\$2.00) and "The Gate of Heaven" (\$2.50), was one of the best known clairvoyants in England. He was often received at Buckingham Palace by Queen Victoria and an account of his mediumship was published in the London Daily Express shortly after his passing. This account explained in detail how he rendered great service to the English police in the famous "Jack the Ripper" case.

The author, a minister of the Unitarian Church of Charleston, South Carolina, presents a book which all Spiritualists should read. It is a record of spirit phenomena observed under controlled conditions by the author. Dr. Westwood believes serious psychical research, done with a detached and critical attitude, should answer once and for all three questions: Do psychic phenomena occur? If so, under what conditions? How are they to be classified and what inferences can be drawn?

It seems that the trouble with all staid psychic research societies is that certain phobias present themselves at the outset. They spend their time and energy on the promise that they are going to discover something new. They continually look for something that has already been discovered. Much like an American who starts out to discover America. Since he is already there, why look for the place? Instead let him inquire about its customs and potentialities. The fact of the matter is that he is right in the middle of America but his actions make it appear that he is about to enter the wilds of Africa or some dark continent where he needs as defense something to bolster his fear. Instead of guns, harpoons and arrows, he uses rope, adhesive tape, boxes, etc., as a means, he thinks, to protect himself against some dangerous monstrosity that might leap at him in the dark.

Not so with Dr. Westwood. His book is based upon sittings with "Anna," an 11 year old girl; Ada Besinnet of Toledo, Ohio, and Etta Wriedt of Detroit and many others.

The latter two mediums passed away but in his book, the Doctor discusses the implications of their phenomena and asks for tolerance towards the widening of research in this field because he believes that by so doing, it will be a source of faith and hope upon which a better world can be built.

"*Adventures in the Supernormal*" by Eileen J. Garrett; Psychic Observer, Inc., \$3.50.

This 252-page book is a detailed life of the author—her trials, tribulations and heartaches. In Spiritualist circles, she is well-known. For years during her early days, when

hundreds had an opportunity to witness her demonstrations of trance mediumship, she earned for herself an enviable reputation.

No one, familiar with the technique of spirit contact, doubts the authenticity of the communications received from her spirit collaborator, *Uvani*, whose voice was heard repeatedly during her early career as a medium.

Nowhere in her writings and nowhere in her books, does she deny spirit guidance transmitted through her to others anxious to know that there was indeed, a life after death.

To Spiritualists, labels, high-sounding phrases, misleading terminology, and all the various expressions used to describe the phenomena emanating through her instrumentality . . . all these point to

one explanation, the fact that she is simply a good medium.

When scientists choose to explain away her mediumship (and I have only to refer to her book, "My Life In A Search For Mediumship") as a "split personality," "subliminal self," "mental telepathy," etc., it means nothing.

In their attempts to pooh, pooh her mediumistic gifts, they have merely made her case stronger in that they have admitted the existence of a certain psychic power and are now merely stuck with the source. It is appalling to find that the scientific attitude toward demonstrations of this nature will accept any hypotheses, but it must not be a spirit—an individualized spirit.

*Uvani* never, in any of his recorded statements, said that he was a

thought-form or a part of Miss Garrett's ego, but simply said he was a spirit without a body ever trying to bring consolation to the world.

Miss Garrett does not deny this, rather she feels that she, in her field and with a different approach, can do her job in her own way for this thing we call Spiritualism and the results will be the same, no matter what names are used to describe her gifts.

According to the jacket describing the merits of the book, Miss Garrett's life has been a subject of mystery. Mystery, to whom? Certainly not a mystery to the medium, whose spirit collaborators, in all love and affection, guided her during her early days of strife and made it possible for her to leave the continent and come to the United States. These same spirit influences guided her to sources who recognized her unusual gifts and thus she was helped to the enviable position she holds today.

She has done her job well. She has helped thousands and so may her work continue. Those desiring more information relative to the career of this noble woman have only to read "Adventures In The Supernormal."

In a well-written, six-page type-written article, he describes how, in 1946, he met Mildred Krull, a



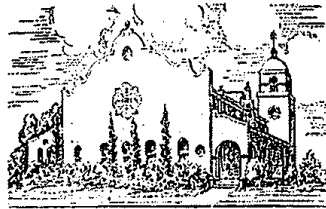
