During my own life, I have contacted many of these spirit-beings, by name—spirits that were once my intimates, now on a plane above the physical. Unbelieving friends call it hallucination. Or else they were ghosts that I saw and heard. Oh my!

They Were There!

Who does not know that the word ghost is the Greek form for the Latin word, spiritus? . . . which gives us the English, Spirit, and also spiritual. Spiritualism, spiritism, etc. Certainly then they were ghosts—and they had spirit reality. *They were there.*

After the birth of Jesus, Joseph had two appearances of Heaven's Messengers. They ap-

peared to him in a dream. He heard what they said and acted on what he heard. When folk of today tell of such psychic (spirit) experiences, the orthodox ridicule them — and they "will not be persuaded, though one rose from the dead."

many are telling of seeing and hearing such astral beings — both by direct-voice and through other phases of mediumship. But they get no hearing from the orthodox.

If someone would explain just why the whole subject of a spirit world and its inhabitants is denied — except as magical-mirages, dwelling in abstract fancy, or in the misty

But now! Christians must regard this as something unexplainable — that John's experience was different from that of modern seers, mediums, spirit-guided beings, and clairvoyant persons.

Of What Are They Afraid?

They explain away the only explanation that is reasonable, sane or authentic—and it requires infinitely more credibility to accept the *explaining-away* than it does to accept the plain fact—the fact of Spirit-Communication.

Jesus appeared a number of times, out of the spirit-world, into the courts of men—after his crucifixion. And other spirits appeared out of the unknown, according to the crucifixion story. Just how much longer it will take so-called Christians, whose religion, if not a Spiritualist philosophy, is nothing but bubble-gum, to accept the facts as recorded in psychic research and other circles, is not predictable.

But if the churches are forever to block off the first Christmas Story — when men and Angels—Heaven and Earth co-mingled — as something in-

Cat’s - Paw?

Many times, we receive articles from people who stress the point that if printed, they do not wish their name mentioned. In many cases, these articles are well written, but the fact remains that their real reason is not because truth has not been expressed, but because they knew they were handling something that might explode in their face. Apparently, they do not care whether it explodes in the editor’s face. There are two cases in point and I will deal with them separately.

Case No. 1

If you are a namby-pamby Spiritualist, don’t read this; if you think God is only love, you had better pass up this article.

For the others, God is also hate in the sense that hate is expressed through human beings who are a part of God.

The article before me begins by saying that the word *spiritual* is associated with all that is lofty and good. Uninformed persons fall into the error of believing that everything emanating from the world of spirit should be good.

Unfortunately this is not so, for are we not repeatedly told the other world is more complex and devious in all of its aspects than this one? Since our personalities do not greatly change immediately after the transition, we are reminded that the after-life world is full of people we would not be in-

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clined to invite into our own homes had we known them in this world.

We are told there are more undeveloped souls in the spirit world than there are on earth and what we sometimes forget is that there are also deranged personalities who have not been, even though dead, released from the confusions and distortions experienced on the earth plane.

This, of course, blasts the orthodox theory that directly after death, everything is lovely. It probably will be lovely for some but just because some learned gentleman says he will forgive you sixty seconds before-hand doesn't settle the matter.

If Not—What Was It?

Many persons realize it is not uncommon for psychic occurrences to be of such a nature as to appear on the surface discrediting to the spiritual aspects of communion. This, according to our correspondent, is due entirely to a misunderstanding of the facts.

The point is well taken for a case is cited where a Long Beach, California, man recently took his wife's life and told authorities that spirit voices ordered him to do it. This same man alleges that one time he heard the voice of his dead daughter who directed him to commit certain destructive acts.

The wrinkled-browed psychologists regarded this man as mentally ill but this does not necessarily mean that the Long Beach man did not hear the voices, nor does it mean that spirit voices were not directing him. Nor, does it rule out the fact that all people who pass on become spirits and as such, regardless of their status, can and do communicate under similar conditions.

Like Attracts Like

When everything is in the state of perfection on the earth plane, human beings included, then and only then, will there be perfection in the spirit world.

To get on with the Long Beach case—This man's ability to hear voices was not necessarily evidence of a derange-

ment. In spite of the verdict handed down by the learned psychologists, many things can enter into the picture.

There are some who claim that, on this side of life, we attract to us guardian angels or lesser entities, who dovetail into our personalities, overshadow our very being and assist us toward all good.

sons who can say they have never been side-tracked? Reasons and excuses are not enough. The facts must be faced. There is no set rule; there is no set measured rod for the actions and reactions of the human mind which influences a human being. Many go off the beam, no matter how spiritual they are.

However, we know that rational, level-headed, idealistic individuals need have no fear in the sense that undeveloped spirits can invade and remain in their personal atmosphere so long as their motives and desires, their deeds and attitudes, and their harmonious adjustment to environment and to their fellow men, are not confused or distorted.

Spiritual Awareness

And with these last words, our correspondent has hit the nail on the head for article closes with:

"That which is good will attract good, and conversely, that which is evil will inevitably attract evil. The same law governs both, just as the laws of physics can be used for good or evil in our world. But the way in which we apply the law depends entirely upon ourselves."

So now, you know. If you still think that you can travel through life with your head buried in spiritual sand, so be it, but it is not as easy as that. Spiritual awareness is the only key to spirituality.

Case No. 2

This subject I am about to broach will be discussed long after we have all passed to spirit. There is much to be said on both sides, but first I must present the subject by quoting a statement I have heard repeatedly both publicly and privately, during the past ten years (i.e.) "*There is no future for Spiritualism as an organized movement but the ideas, upon which Spiritualism are founded, will permeate all religions and may gradually be absorbed by them.*"

This bald statement may not be as bad as it sounds because where is there a Spiritualist who has not said that his job is to spread the truths of Spiritualism. Few will say that his job is solely to perpetuate an organization.

More Legislation

One side will argue that should Spiritualists become organized, meaning one organization only, there would undoubtedly arise the need for additional legislation. This is all well

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Those in this school resolutely believe the axiom: *Like attracts like*. These people also believe that if we are high-minded in our thoughts, we will attract like personalities to our psychic atmosphere and say, that if we are not, we may attract a lower type of entity who may inspire evil acts.

That is quite true, but it does not cover every case because where is there an individual who can say his life is indeed perfection? Where are the per-

Wherever you hear anyone announce publicly or privately how spiritual they are, remember that spirituality is radiated . . . broadcasting the fact doesn't make it so, any more than does acting the part in order to impress some one.

Then our correspondent goes on to say that the type of guidance we receive depends entirely on our conduct and our thinking. And this is true, but who is to say that these things are always expressed for good?

and good, but how can you legislate the spirit world?

It is logical to point to the large orthodox organizations, some directed by vested interests, some directed by those who tell their readers what to read and some who have creeds and dogmas long outmoded. But Spiritualism hardly comes in that category.

What Freedom Means

Some argue there will never be one organization because there could only be one job as president. Others say that all the Spiritualist organizations, and they mean those who charter churches, are doing a good job. Still others say that many of these organizations and there are over twenty-seven of them, should be eliminated because of this, that, and the other.

Freedom of religion means freedom of organization, freedom of ideals, freedom of expression, freedom of types of worship, freedom of choice for rostrum arrangement, etc. Still others say that if there was only one organization the ministers and even the spirit collaborators might be told what to say, when to say it, through whom it should be said, whether they should discuss reincarnation or not, when messages should be given, when they should not be given, to whom they should be given, and what the spirits should say when they do bring a message.

Where's the Money?

These people also think that legislation under one organization would decide what types of mediums were respectable, who is the good medium, who is the bad medium, who is illiterate, who is educated, etc., and that they would be so busy deciding all of these questions that the fundamentals of Spiritualism would be forgotten.

There are others who say there are only two things that Spiritualists all over the world agree upon: (1) the dead live and (2) they can return and prove their identity through mediumship.

Another argument, that can be taken for what it is worth,

cites a plan which would admittedly cost one-quarter of a million dollars. That plan would be, if the money were available, to call a gigantic mass meeting at some central point in the United States (because this person only talked of the United States) preferably Chicago.

This *etheric* mass of money would be used to pay all traveling expenses of directors of all organizations and leaders of all churches. In short, everyone interested in one organization

could attend the mass meeting—all expenses paid. At the meeting, it was proposed to elect a Board of Governors, a Board of Directors and set aside state organizations with their directors—much on the plan of orthodox organizations.

BUT, here again are three catches: (1) where is the money? (2) who would handle the money? and (3) who would be president? I can see entire organizations flouncing out of the meeting en masse, if their

presidential choice was not acceptable.

So much for the viewpoints of people expressed throughout the country, but these people must be reminded of the fact that in spite of all the squabbles and differences of opinion, Spiritualism is growing. The numbers of chartered churches increase. While the records may not be complete, they show between 6700 and 6800 Spiritualist churches in the United States as compared to 5200 eighteen months ago. Another interesting point is that there are over 3,000 registered mediums in the United States as compared to 2600 listed at this office as of 1946.

Traditionists Worried

Another significant fact showing the possible decline of orthodoxy is the increase of column inches they are devoting to paid advertising. And why should they increase their advertising, were it not for the fact that they were attempting to bring some of the faithful back into the fold? People simply stop going to church, unless it is a few hard-shelled religionists, when their direct questions are not answered and the services do not make sense.

Today, the public wants something more and Spiritualism is coming into the news more and more. That is why the traditionists are worried. This, in itself, is a step forward because a thing only becomes news when people are interested.

Who's To Cooperate

Despite everything, the progress of Spiritualism is tremendous and its future assured. This future is based on the fact that all human personalities not only survive death, but because all those we call "dead" do live and all can prove, under proper conditions, their identity through mediumship . . . and these truths have permeated and will continue to permeate the thinking of all church-minded people.

It must be understood that the whole case for this one-organization idea rests on one word—cooperation. Invariably this word is misunderstood. The

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rank and file think it means everyone should cooperate with them, always forgetting it is a two-way door.

Even so, armchair strategists of psychic science outside the movement and leaders of most Spiritualist organizations are doing a good job considering the limited finances under which they must struggle.

At convention time, many of the directors are fortunate if they have their actual expenses paid. Between conventions, some travel to their own churches and receive remuneration, but in the main, no present-day organization in this

country is sufficiently financed to send their missionaries regularly in the field—with promises to pay part of their expenses. This is no fault of the leaders but simply because sufficient financial support is lacking.

There are expressions of cooperation in the organized movement as evidenced by a recent editorial in the *National Spiritualist* wherein the Rev. Verna K. Kuhlrig states; "Instead of isolating ourselves in-

to one little group, let us open our doors wide, very wide, to all those who seek help and desire to unite for greater strength and a better world in which to live." A broad statement this and the Rev. Kuhlrig cannot be classed as a visionary.

However the catch is who is going to unite with whom and what organization is going to cooperate with whom.

David Bedbrook, secretary of the International Spiritualist Federation, London, has released his "Universal Appeal." Bedbrook, evidently speaking for the English Spiritualists, would unite all for a common cause.

True Spiritualism?

In this country, the Federation of Spiritual Churches and Organizations, Inc., valiantly try to do their part by having all groups reason together for a common purpose. It is a marvelous idea, but to date, very much misunderstood. Most of the criticism about the Federation comes from those who know the least about the conditions that have to be faced in this country and the real purpose of the Federation.

Those outside the movement claim things are not just right, saying: "certain messes have to be cleaned up, ministers aren't sufficiently educated and that most of the churches do not present true Spiritualism." The answer to those outside the movement is: if they want organizations to survive, let them join and help make Spiritualism true and respectable.

When Smoked Out

Those inside the movement gripe for the same reason. Most of the grippers condemn everyone and everybody and have the gall to point out that they are the only ones who know how to conduct a Spiritualist or spiritual service.

We also find there is, indeed, a slight split in the Spiritualist movement today. Those who believe, foster and are convinced of physical mediumship and those who are not.

There are those who feel mental mediumship is the only salvation insofar as proof of survival is concerned. When these people are *smoked* out, for

a logical reason you will generally find they have never, or at least have not in a long time, attended a voice seance — let alone demonstrations for materialization. Yet these same persons glibly read the Declaration of Principles, wherein physical mediumship is mentioned, and let it go at that.

In addition, there are hundreds of great Spiritualist leaders who, to hear them tell it, have only to "reach out and touch the hem of His garment" and many of these teacher-mediums have yet to give a convincing message — only platitudes about spiritual growth or someone with a "fatherly vibration" seems to come through.

This situation is not new. It has been going on for years and will continue to go on but out of it all, will come a great enlightenment to mankind, not because of differences of approach, but in spite of them.

Each Spiritualist, each medium, each person convinced of survival—all have the right

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HOW SPIRITS
FIND OUT

If there is one thing that the study of mediumship perpetually proves it is: Always expect the unexpected.

Students and researchers have continually found this out over the years as they have patiently waited for the message or the bit of phenomena which would either satisfy a particular yearning or fill a gap in their accumulated knowledge of the subject.

There seems to be no such thing as an analytical approach to the study of mediumship in the same sense as a test tube analysis of a chemical compound. Rather, there must be, it appears, an observational type of analysis, unforced and to a large extent uncontrolled, other than by the exigencies and the requirements of each situation.

We Cannot Command

The phenomena cannot be broken up and subjected to mathematical particular in the way that some laboratory technicians would like, because —

(1) The same thing rarely, perhaps never, happens in exactly the same manner twice and therefore cannot be reproduced at will by other experimenters bent upon seeking the same results under what they deem to be the same conditions, and —

(2) No one seems able to command the world of spirit.

The wills and actions of free men anywhere cannot be commanded easily. The spirits we contact are just people, with

a somewhat different degree (not kind) of form than ourselves in our material world.

Therefore, they too have their peculiar traits and personality inclinations and especially their own ideas about when and how their phenomena and communications should be presented.

Furthermore, they have their limitations, even as all of us have many different kinds of limitations, and can no more perform miracles than anyone else.

They often must determine what is appropriate and even possible in a given situation, and that can no more be effectively controlled by us here than the conversation at a ladies' tea party or the covering of a news event by a reporter. (As a reporter of many years experience, I can vouch for this.)

Hence, experience in matters pertaining to the world of psychics has shown that we may expect most when we expect the unexpected.

Patience, too, is an important watchword for an intelligent appreciation of the tremendous problems and limitations of communication, plus an understanding of how to take advantage of a given situation. Thus we will be able to contribute such stimulus to the phenomena or communication as will enhance it, rather than inhibit it. Like a naturalist stalking a rare animal, patience then is frequently rewarded, even though with what is unexpected.

Hostile Atmosphere

Every sitter, it is said, is almost as much a part of the manifestations of mediumship as the medium. So, while no rule book of procedure is available or could probably ever be written, a relaxed alertness, rather than either a blank acceptance or a too prying insistence on a particular manifestation, often encourages remarkable results. Of course, it goes without saying that a hostile atmosphere generally produces only negative results.

By cooperating, mentally, conversationally and otherwise with the special type of forces being studied, one can achieve much success in such studies. Watch, wait — see what will happen, and then adapt one's thoughts and desires to the immediate situa-

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tion. That has been the most successful approach to the manifold problems and vagaries of communication.

A Leading Question

A typical example of the unexpected in communication was encountered by this writer late in July at the home of Minnie Cooke O'Hara, the well known trumpet medium. Mrs. Crenshaw and I were the guests of the editors of the *Psychic Observer*, Mr. and Mrs. Pressing and had been greeted by a voice identifying itself as "Grandfather Crenshaw."

After a few preliminary remarks, Mrs. Crenshaw asked: "Have you visited our home (in Los Angeles)?"

The voice said he had. "Do you know what it is we have that belonged to Jimmy's grandmother?"

That was a leading question if ever there was one, for my aunt two years ago had given us the old spinning wheel which had once been used by my grandmother. No one in the immediate group knew this.

Pinkflower Chimes In

But the voice said it was a shawl that had belonged to her. We said "no," and the voice said, "Well, you were supposed to have it," and then on a slight note of confusion, he said he would "go take a look."

Possibly no more than two seconds elapsed before another voice, that of Pink Flower, Indian girl guide who often comes to Mr. and Mrs. Pressing, spoke thus through the trumpet to Mrs. Pressing: "How would you like a spinning wheel?"

Mrs. Pressing: "A what?"

Pink Flower: "A spinning wheel."

Mrs. Pressing: "Why, yes. I would like one."

Pink Flower: "Well, I know where you can get a spinning wheel."

Mrs. Pressing: "Where, dear?"

Pink Flower: "At his house!"

There was no confusion in her voice — only a tone of

feverish caprice. She was having fun and showed it.

I spoke for the first time since she had started talking.

"At whose house?" I asked, just to be sure. Then she replied:

"At your house—at Jimmy's house," she said.

Neither Mrs. Crenshaw nor I had given any hint of the nature of the object during this conversation. Now, however, we both started laughing

and confessed that it was, indeed, a spinning wheel we meant.

Someone asked how she knew about this spinning wheel, and she replied she had gone and looked during the previous conversation.

The grandfather's voice later returned and said that the shawl he had in mind had been made from material originally spun on the wheel and that we should find out what had become of the shawl.

Three other unexpected occurrences marked the session. First, there was a time when two voices carried on a brief conversation between themselves through the trumpet, and second, toward the end of the meeting, another new trumpet which Mr. Press-

ing had brought simply to be "magnetized" for a friend was levitated and used by one of the voices.

This was unusual, since it is difficult, apparently, for the spirit entities to use an instrument that has not been thoroughly seasoned and conditioned.

Must It Be "Alleged"

The new trumpet which had never before been used, floated and moved and was clearly visible in all planes and angles from floor to ceiling which it tapped several times.

What is more this last occurred after Mrs. O'Hara had emerged from her usual trance state, and she too was able to watch the floating trumpet as it went around the room—only protesting, incidentally, when it came too close to her. (She said she had never overcome a nervous feeling about the closeness of such phenomena, at least when she was conscious of it.)

The third unexpected incident occurred when the trumpet brushed me on the shoulder, and the voice advised me that this was no "alleged" blow—friendly, though it was.

Asked to explain, the voice reminded Mr. Pressing and myself of a forgotten conversation earlier in the evening (in the medium's home, but outside of her hearing), in which we had discussed the frequent use of the word "alleged" in reports of psychic phenomena.

Expect the Unexpected

Other voices who spoke during the meeting included Mrs. O'Hara's own Indian girl control Bright Star and her two other principal controls, Dr. Charles Adams, a member of the pioneer Adams family and an ancestor of the medium, and a guide known as Dan.

While none of this would be classified as conclusive "proof" by a scientific researcher, nevertheless it has certain corroborative, as well as a delightful entertainment value for the person willing and ready to expect the unexpected.

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Nothing Really Dies

We must understand that the ASTRAL PLANE is like a mirror of the physical plane. In it are seen all of the ramifications and all of the vibrations as well as the actual objects or physical formations which we see about us on the physical plane. Every molecule, every atom, every subdivision of the atom is represented in the ASTRAL PLANE.

The ASTRAL PLANE is a field of action which interpenetrates the physical. Hence, when the body of man becomes inactive and is so called in a state of death, we must look to the ASTRAL for the continuations of the life of the individual. Here the reflection remains, because it is of the spirit rather than of physical matter, and spirit is eternal as it is. It is *not here today and gone tomorrow*, but was in the beginning, is now and forever shall be.

You may say that matter is eternal, too, for physical scientists have proved that nothing really dies or disappears but merely changes form. But the spirit does not change. In other words, the spiritual identity is eternal. Man is alive with all of his faculties intact even after the body has been buried in the grave or changed to ashes in the crematory.

Adjustment Comes First

To recognize the state which man takes after he seemingly dies one must think of him as being drawn inward into another plane much as we are drawn into our subconscious thoughts in dreams even while on the earth plane. He is able to function just as he did there—is able to hear, to see, to taste and to feel.

Astral Shells and Spirits

THE DISTINCTION WITH DESCRIPTION

He is capable of sensing all the conditions existing around him to that degree of clarity with which he used his faculties on the earth plane.

This is his state at the time of progression to the ASTRAL PLANE. As time goes on and he becomes attuned to the state of his new existence, his faculties gradually unfold, and he begins to use them on that plane. It is as though an individual has changed his residence and was becoming used to the new locality. He has to familiarize himself with the new rooms and the new appliances in the new household in order to function properly.

Unless the soul is especially dextrous—that is, unless spiritual faculties have been awakened and developed on the earth plane—one cannot expect the disembodied being to accomplish much on the ASTRAL PLANE right away. Adjustment must come before spiritual progress can be resumed.

Man—A Living Witness

There are certain individuals in physical existence who can adapt themselves more easily to conditions on the ASTRAL PLANE. Flexibility of personality and variety of activities, in other words, make some people particularly dextrous. We recognize this ability on the earth plane and know that it will continue.

We must understand that there is constantly in action a vast ocean of magnetic currents which connect the physical and the astral. This is somewhat similar to the vast amount of electric currents which are continually entwining the atmosphere and in which the atmosphere is submerged completely. It is, of course, difficult to picture the unseen activity which is going on in the universe around us where we are on the earth plane.

One is not able to understand the presence of electricity unless it is focussed. One, likewise, is not able

to understand the presence of the ASTRAL PLANE unless attention is focussed upon it and realization comes through that focus. Man is the living witness and the living instrument of this particular focusing.

Great Astral Screen

Hence it is through man and through his physical organism and the attuning faculties, that man is able to come in contact with the

other side of life, that side which is more attenuated and refined. Everything which exists on the material plane exists in the astral with an added *plus*, because in the ASTRAL PLANE we have all of those things which have occurred, all of those things which are occurring, and all those things which are yet to occur.

All that which is and has been is laid down as a vast record. If one could understand or realize all of the events which have occurred in this world as represented in pictorial fashion on the great astral screen, one could get an idea of the vastness of that panorama. The clair-

voyant can do this at times, for he is able to use the power of his inner condition to withdraw from the physical and enter inwardly into the astral.

It must be borne in mind that all events which have occurred remain in the astral and are capable of being resounded and resounded again, and that these reverberations are eternal. The dramatic artist is able on the earth plane to conjure up any event and make it repeat itself. Or a writer can explain and picture a certain condition, affair or problem of life, so that it is produced again and is brought before witnesses as something which is authentic and pertaining to the past.

Clairvoyant Actualities

In the manner in which personal memories are recorded in any mind all memories are recorded in the astral. Now it is possible for the average clairvoyant to vibrate with certain portions of the astral and get information there if he is advanced enough to read the records.

If a murder has been committed in a room, the clairvoyant can, by entering the room a year later, ten years later, a hundred years later, by the power of vision, read the record of that event provided that his seership is accurate enough.

This does not mean that the individual who was murdered is in a state of communication with the clairvoyant. There is a decided distinction between that which is disembodied spirit and that which represents a record in the ASTRAL LIGHT. The ASTRAL SHELLS which are referred to in certain theosophic literature are no more than the records in the ASTRAL LIGHT, which from time to time dissever from that particular place so that they are brought to the sight of the clairvoyant as actualities.

Vivid Parallels

Let us suppose that you have a cloak hanging in a closet, and that by some miraculous beings that cloak is removed from the closet without hands touching it and suspended in the air as though it were

Death came suddenly and easily, releasing her to travel still more widely, and leaving me behind for a time wondering—where?

I closed our summer home, high in the Sangre de Cristo mountains of northern New Mexico, and came to Oklahoma City for the winter months. Here I found not only one, but two Spiritual Science Labora-

Crumbling Materialism

In three years what I have attained by experiment, observation and experience in these laboratories has been a springboard for unfolding an individual superphysical capacity, enabling the active exercise of spiritual power.

This is not unusual, of course, in these days of confused and crumbling materialism. Ordinary experience is being transcended more and more by persons whose unanimity has brought them in contact with startling spiritual phenomena. And anyone who feels disposed to prove that psychic phenomena rest upon natural law can do so.

Highly interesting among my experiences is having a part in what I choose to call an *apport mailing-system*, established by discarnates who state—the requisite for same has been rarely found.

I Saw This Happen

By way of explanation: letters which we write and seal are dematerialized and are returned at the subsequent session answered fully on the back of each sheet. Also on my personal writing-board, when with the group assembled, messages are written as I watch the materialized hand of the amanuensis at work.

The spiritual science laboratory, in which these remarkable results occur, is carefully cloaked from publicity and very few in this vicinity are aware of its existence although the group has been active for years.

All members are selected and sought out by this group for affiliation. Each one is a sensitive more or less developed.

They are convinced

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The most highly developed sensitive is one who is unalterably opposed to having her name publicized in connection with spirit phenomena.

Here briefly is her story: In 1922 she became a widow with two little children to support, and she was seriously ill, yet trying to work for remuneration. Her physician told her she had but three months at most to live, that she must rest or die even sooner. One of her business associates took her to her first spiritual seance.

She was greeted by her spirit-doctor and told to place a glass of water near-by while she brushed her hair each night, that they in spirit world would magnetize the water, doing this each day. She was saved to rear her children, has remained in good health and meanwhile has unfolded as a spirit-instrument of great power.

Personally, I have seen nothing comparable to the sustained power for manifestation which her mediumship affords. Herein was the *apport mailing-system* established quite some years ago. We will dismiss as a personality this attuned spirit instrument, except to say that she is now but a house-wife, a happy one and a very youthful looking grandmother.

The group convenes each Friday night. Until I joined, records were not kept. Recently several wire-recordings were made of proceedings. Details:

Three hour sessions. Ruby light and full dark both pro-

vided. Independent-voice predominates, trumpet also used. As spirit children regularly appropriate a part of each period to manifest, a box of wind-up toys, a toy piano, a French harp, sticks of rouge, etc., given by us have accumulated.

The children romp with playthings at our feet and often above us in the room. The harp and toy piano are played well; wind-up toys are operated by the little ones to be released in a bedlam of noise. All of us feel their frequent tugs at our shoe laces, clothes and hair; some of us see them as both fully and partially materialized children.

Christmas "Thank You's"

They are infinitely affectionate and wise, speaking with independent voice, often several of them at one time among themselves; they have purpose in what they say, often rare wit. Each of us has attracted our own little family of wee-ones, known by name and by their distinct personalities. A little French girl, "SHERL," is the most outstanding in my "family"; she it is who brings me apports, (not mail), and leaves the impress of her lips with rouge on sheets on my writing-board.

They delight, it would seem, in chewing gum, candied beans etc. while in our midst; taking same from our hands for some favor to us. They say, "when we start back home it just evaporates." We can send rosebuds and other small flowers and

greeting cards on special occasions like Mother's Day and Christmas, and later, next session, comes back a thank-you letter from the spirit recipient.

Fraud Ruled Out

I write in detail about these spirit children because these little tots are trained on their side to handle what they call "STUFF," and again "Spirit-chemicals," essential for apportioning letters back and forth from the Spirit-world. Should there be as many as ten or twelve letters, they say they cannot take all of them this time, "cause we don't have enough Stuff."

Sometimes all letters returned are brought to me by means of a levitated trumpet; letters crowded in the large end I take out, and then comes voice instruction for their distribution.

Fraud in our sessions is simply not to be considered, for no purpose nor opportunity for fraud is afforded. Some of us who see, observe the spirit-folk at work; thereby "impersonation" is less likely as well. I'm grateful to say that not once in my life have I had to come in contact with a fraudulent physical medium, but most of us have had our innings with imposters discarnate, and have had occasion to follow the Biblical admonition of John—"try the spirits whether they are of God."

I receive independent writing as previously mentioned thus: My board is on a small table near me and certainly I know



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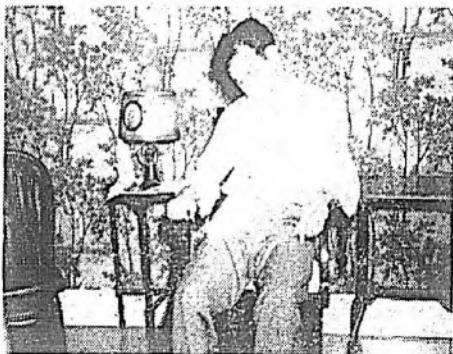

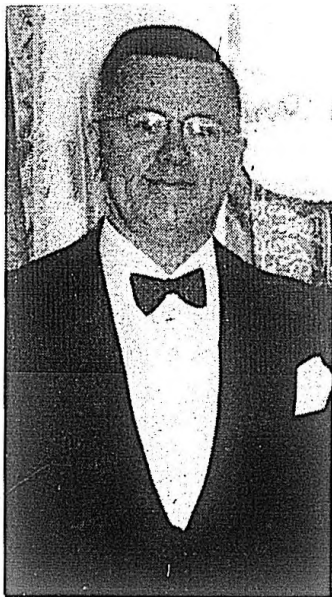

there is no fraud for I watch the materializing of the hand, and all hear the writing being done. You will note that I do not get independent writing wholly on my own as yet, but this and precipitated paintings are said to be forthcoming later.

We will have to use more space, the editor willing, in telling about the second spiritual science laboratory. This group of students is more out in the open. Two members are my revered friends, Florence Heistand and Bluford, her husband. With their own money

But above all else she has sterling characteristics, placing service, if necessary with her two hands and own money, above preaching and demonstration of spirit-return. She is strictly noncommercial, being blessed with pri-

vate means. She is a real student, a leader, a woman with great poise, attractive, charming. We all love Florence and "Blu."

Science Laboratory

I, who by church affiliation was formerly an Episcopalian, find myself interested and active in the Spiritual Life Science Church of which Florence Heistand is pastor. We have many a laugh, her deceased father was an erstwhile preacher and Florence, who knows so much better, has to watch out . . . for God has long whiskers.

I've been in class-work with Florence for three years and there have been outstanding experiences and phenomena you may be sure, some of which I've written for other magazines and journals.

The new church building has a specially built seance-room. It is designated as a Spiritual Science Lab., and used solely for that purpose. We are able to bring lectures into the auditorium from Spirit-collaborators by means of loud-speaker amplification. There are numerous details yet which I could include. But better—you might visit Oklahoma City some day and see rather than just be told of activities.

Wisdom of the Spirit

At the end of this article I endeavor to use one of my mother's first letters back for a double purpose. I pray I am successful. You will see the tenderness of her message. As for the quality of communications taken as a whole, so great is the wisdom, profound the love and accurate the prophecy that the content is all the human heart could desire.

We all know that fruitage is the outcome of planting and growth. We know, too, the need for a harvest of peace in this troubled world, both for the individual and the nations. Only within Spiritual Science are the elements and the fertile soil for abundant harvest. But that harvest must have diligent workers—you and me.

To me, the main truths of

Spiritualism are survival and communication and the teachings involved. In speaking or writing about these we should avoid over-statement, yet all we do or say or write should be done in a positive tone while not a superior tone, until it shines forth in purest radiation.

Certainly to us our communicators are proved great in wisdom, for wisdom is defined in part as discernment, and the ability to deal sagaciously with facts as they relate to life. But —we have yet to speak of love.

Broad Pathways

You adjust as best you can to your loss. You carry on. But always and always you rebel against that barrier of silence. You must break it

down—"How?" You rebel and you search. Your search leads out on a broad pathway, that narrows as you go along. You lose your way in blind-alleys, but emerge to find your way on ahead. ergy that comes of God to enable us to achieve what will make us happy. Prayer is a way to gain power to endure. It is a call to battle.

If you were a drowning sailor who perceived a rocky bit of land not far off, would you pray that the little bit of heaven come to you? Would you not rather pray that strength hold out until you reached that promontory? Then you would pray aright. Prayer's most faithless enemies are not those who scoff at it, but those who revel in it, believing that they need do nothing to bring about answer to prayer.

Simplicity of Prayer

Spurgeon opposed long prayers. Too often the so-called praying man or woman only mesmerize or hypnotize themselves, do themselves physical, mental and spiritual harm by their long, lugubrious prayers. As to those who believe they shall be heard because of much

speaking, Spurgeon said: "I could not pray long prayers even if my eternity depended upon it. Besides, if I go to the bank with a check, what do I wait around the premises for when I have got my money?"

Would that all understood the simplicity, the beauty, the sacredness, the power of prayer. Many who pray look upon prayer as holy, see its beauty, know that power is gained through prayer. But none seem to realize the simplicity of prayer.

Prayer under favorable psychological conditions works mira-

cles, proved countless times in all ages. No prayer is ever uttered in vain.

Men and women of today, as of old, plead, "Lord, teach us how to pray." So many are confused regarding prayer even as they are confused regarding life. If you want to learn to pray, start as a little child who asks in simple, child-like fashion, knowing that the earthly father-mother will not withhold good gifts from the little one.

Prayer for another is the sharing of God's love with another, according to Doctor W. Frederic Keeler, greatest metaphysician in all the generations that have come since we first learned to use prayer. A little child of thirteen or fourteen taught me this in the long ago when she shared her love with

her mother whom the family physician said could not live, in fact, declared positively, "Your mother will not live through the night."

Mary took good to her mother. She shared God's love with her mother by some mystic process.

"God told me what to do," the child said after her meditations in the backyard beneath a tree. "God told me to take His good and love to mother."

After her asking, after her praying, Mary went into the room where her mother lay dying and laid her little head upon the bed beside her mother. Again she asked for the healing. In about a half-hour the mother awakened out of coma, smiled, laid a pallid hand upon the child's head.

We Should Know

Many times each day after that the child went to God in prayer. Surely she shared God's loving good and power with her mother for at the end of three weeks the woman sat up. Five weeks later she was walking; she grew constantly stronger; she lived for thirty years.

The old grandmother oft told the whole countryside about that miracle. Neighbors flocked about her, to hear the story. "And all Mary did," concluded Grandma, "was to take God's love and healing to her mother."

Certainly we should know, if for self we pray, that prayer is the most magnificent and powerful activity of life. We who be-

hung upon an imaginary nail in the air.

Now, we know that such a thing is impossible on the earth plane because of natural laws. But because of the flexibility of astral matter and the energizing forces of nature on another plane, it is possible for such exhibitions to ensue on the ASTRAL PLANE.

We are constantly going through experiences. What we did in times gone by remains indelibly impressed upon the ASTRAL PLANE. That is the reason why individuals who have clairvoyant power are able to look at people and tell them what has occurred in times gone by. This, then, is what we are dealing with.

A Matter of Attunement

But when we talk of the subject of disembodied entities or spirits, we are dealing with astral inhibitors and not astral environment. It is very possible for one clairvoyant to become confused between the entities that are inhabiting the astral environment and the environment itself. It is important, therefore, that the individual attune himself to consciousness.

Unfortunately, we find that even those who were attached to the theosophical movement, and who laid down such statements as spirits being largely astral shells, had not accomplished the feat of being able to attune into consciousness. All life, whether or not it is the connecting life between the astral and the physical is of a conscious nature.

There are too many individuals who are willing to progress along occult lines without the necessary mental and intellectual development. On the other hand, there are those who propose to study occult matters purely along certain intellectual lines without closely informing themselves of the soul nature of all being.

How Clairvoyants Know

The true life of the psychic, whether he be a novice or an advanced student of the occult, must be dedicated to the attunement of himself to his Masters, whether those Masters are in the body or out of the body. Only then will he be able to determine if he is communicating with the astral plane environment or with the astral plane's inhabitant.

If you go to a moving picture show and see flashed upon the screen a reproduction of something which has occurred before, you will get a certain feeling of reality; but nobody is foolish enough to be so entranced or so completely won over to assume that it is the real thing.

Experience has taught him better. Just as we know when we go to a moving picture show that it is not real, so does the individual who is able to attune himself with the various grades of consciousness know when he is communicating with a spirit and when he is not.

The comparison of going to a moving picture show and exploring the astral environment is meaningful in more ways than one. The ASTRAL PLANE has somewhat of a shadowy character, but the awareness of it focussed in individual self-consciousness assumes a reality. One recognizes that it is a different degree of consciousness — or, let us say, a different kind of consciousness altogether—but it is by attunement or spontaneous knowing from within that the true clairvoyant knows the exact nature of any communication.

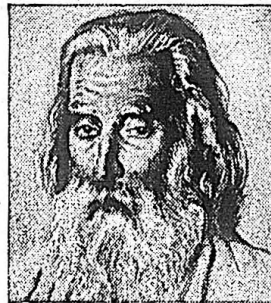
Life should be exalted beyond measure. Life, which is of God's love, should be glorified. Prayer must give us the daring and the purpose to *use* life.

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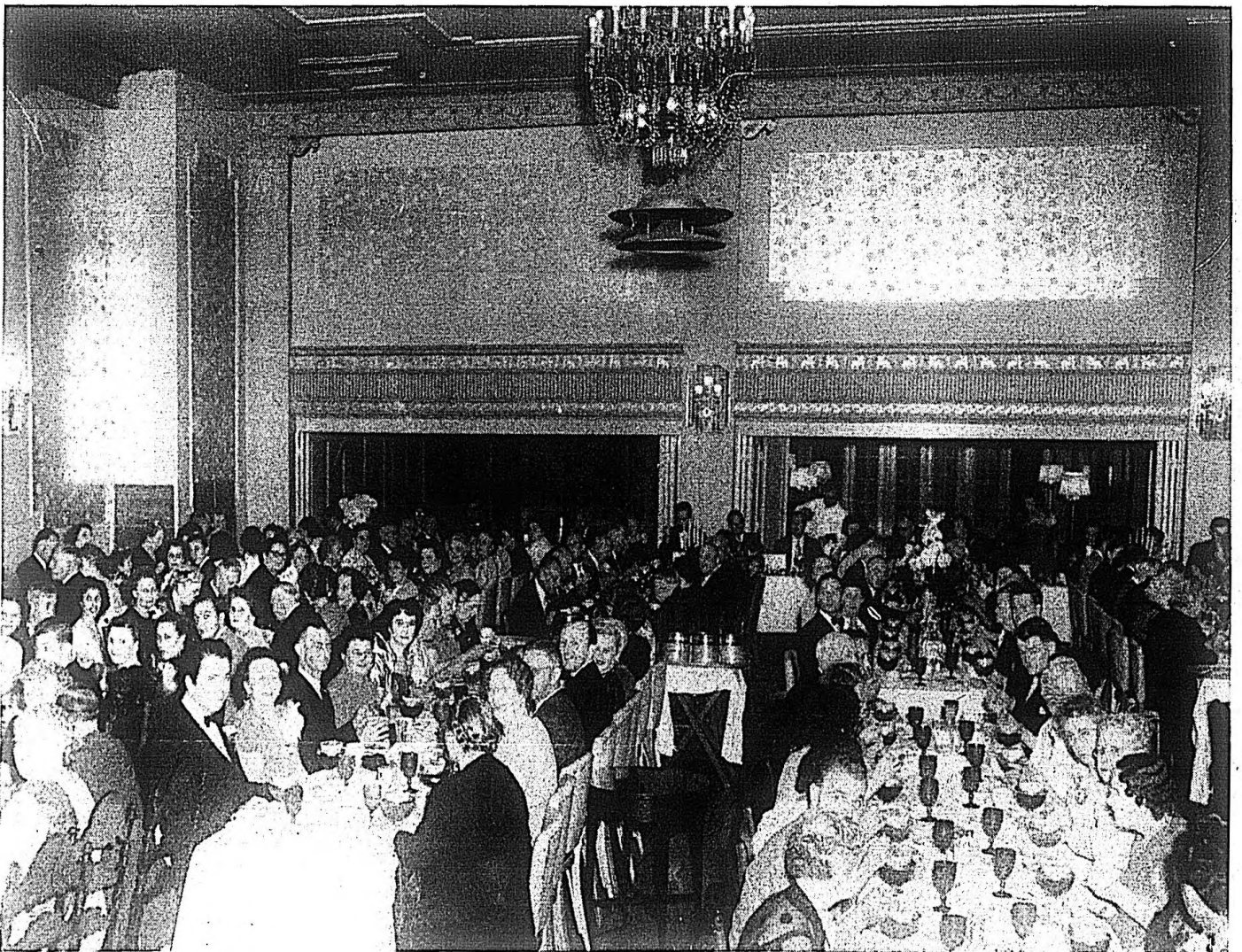
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National Spiritualist Association Banquet — San Antonio, Texas
