Approximately 30 persons attended a remarkable demonstration of Bertie Lilly Candler's materialization mediumship in Hollywood last November 16.

If Jean Harlow had appeared that night at the corner of Hollywood and Vine, it couldn't have been more real.

If Rex Mays had driven down Sunset Boulevard in his racing car, one could not have been more impressed.

If a handsome, carefully-groomed actor named Jack Lloyd had actually come back from the dead to greet and kiss

his pretty widow, it could not have been more dramatic—for he actually did!

Those who were there saw it. Those who saw it knew they were witnessing facts, not fantasies.

Bertie Lilly Candler appeared to be as thrilled as anyone else when she learned that her Hollywood demonstration in the home of Actress Irene Lloyd had been so successful—Jean Harlow was plainly seen and recognized; Rex Mays told of his premonition of death; Miss Lloyd confirmed that she was greeted by her husband in a way that would have only had meaning for her, and more than a score of other materialized entities gave recognizable evidence of their presence.

Mays Was First

A contributing factor to the success of the demonstration, no doubt, was the presence of Maude Kline, the Long Beach, Calif., missionary-medium, who was one of the most interested spectators but whose own vibrational force, it was said, was available to supplement the ecoplasmic emanations.

The form identified as Rex Mays was one of the first to make its appearance outside the cabinet (which, incidentally,

had been prepared for the occasion by Miss Lloyd, along with the usual red light, no apparatus of any kind having been brought by either of the two visiting mediums).

Mays' voice was filled with concern, as he asked someone

to get word to his wife, Dorothy, that he was still alive, despite the accident at Del Mar, Calif., which took the physical life of the famous race driver

on November 6. Just prior to the fatal race, he recalled:

"A voice told me, 'This is the last roundup,' but I didn't want to be a quitter."

He said that as he prepared for the start of the race he looked around at his wife and tried to let her know this was goodbye. His car went out of control, ripped out 200 feet of fence and then flung him onto the middle of the track, where he was run over by another racer.

"I Can See Your Face"

A veritable procession of materialized figures followed that of Mays at the Hollywood demonstration. Those who were greeted gave their own evidence of authenticity by such exclamations as:

"I can see you so plainly . . ."

"Why, I can see your face as plain as anything! . . ."

"It's my mother! I can see her! Why mother, it's just like you!"

"Wasn't that gorgeous!"

The last was from Maude Kline as the figure of a bronze-skinned Hindu, with black beard and turban, faded away.

"Each child," he had said, "is a great link in the chain of life."

As was true of most of the other figures which were seen in their turn, his form appeared to go right down into the floor, like a huge tongue of flame that suddenly dies down and then disappears before one's eyes. This phenomenon seemed to impress those present, possibly as much as the manifestations themselves. Occasionally, too, forms materialized through this famous Miami medium build up in full view of the spectators, rather than in the ectoplasm-collection chamber called the cabinet.

Maude Knows

Another personality came directly to Miss Kline herself and kissed her with the remark:

"Your husband didn't see that, did he?"

Bob Belfrage, Miss Kline's husband, was in another part of the room. Which raises an interesting question for the unreconstructed pseudo-investigators

who still claim, in the face of mountains of evidence, that all mediums are frauds. If this tattered theory is correct, then:

When one medium demonstrates for another medium, who's kidding whom?

Obviously Maude Kline of California wasn't being kidded by Bertie Lilly Candler of Florida on this occasion. Miss Kline's expressions of awe and delight at the manifestations were too patently genuine.

At the same time, the genuineness of the materializations themselves was demonstrated

number of test manifestations, apart from the more subtle psychological proofs mentioned above. The high points were the materializations of Jean Harlow and Jack Lloyd, but the other tests included these:

Test 1: Silver Leaf, the little guide-announcer for the medium, asked a man if he had his mother's watch. He replied:

"Yes, I have it."

The mother then appeared, and during a rather lengthy conversation, asked:

"What did you do with the shoes?"

over and over. For example, a woman who had talked with one personality was starting to walk away from the cabinet when Miss Kline said:

"Why, here's your mother!"

Turning back, the woman looked a moment and then replied:

"Oh, no; it's my aunt!"

"Why, she looks just like you," the California medium rejoined.

A little later, as the form literally extinguished itself within inches of the niece, Miss Kline gasped:

"Isn't that wonderful!"

There were an impressive

HUSBAND: Well, he's a fine man, but he's going to have to walk in my shoes for awhile. I'm not going to meddle in your affairs, though. I'll just pull his shirt tails out, that's all.

(However, he concluded by again approving the plan for remarriage.)

Note: Conversations quoted are taken from on-the-spot notations made during the meeting.

Test 3: A grandmother appeared plainly and was quickly identified by the wife of a noted Los Angeles attorney and prosecutor. The grandmother spoke German, and the two sang a German song together.

Test 4: A figure in typical nun's habit appeared and gave her blessing to one of those present.

Test 5: On the Sunday prior to this meeting, a woman had talked to her Arabian teacher through another medium. He stated he would soon appear to her and described himself as having a black beard, a high headdress, a staff in his hand, a certain type of band around his waist and other details of features and clothing which the student was to look for.

At the time, the student knew nothing of the Bertie Lilly Candler meeting in Hollywood but was invited by Miss Lloyd two days later. She, therefore, was watching carefully for all

of the points mentioned in the previous communication.

When the Arabian appeared, she checked each of the items he had mentioned when he had told her on the previous Sunday, "That is how you will see me." Nothing, she said, was missing. The description tallied completely in every detail.

Test 6: A man appeared to his niece, saying: "The largest part of me is my bay front!" It was, and she easily recognized his paunchy figure.

Test 7: A materialized form, speaking to a relative, said:

"Do you remember that little dish you broke in the sink?" (The answer was, "Yes.") "You thought you broke it, but I broke it." (This was said jokingly.) "But I didn't break the handle off the cup, though."

Test 8: Silver Leaf announced "Dr. D. D. Palmer," who, with dark beard, was recognized by Dr. John W. Gregory of Santa Monica, as well as by Miss Kline. She had known his brother and co-founder of the Palmer School of Chiropractic in Davenport, Iowa.

Note: This was the third form to materialize with a dark beard, but each beard was distinctive and characteristic, and of course the features were entirely different.

Test 9: A well-known radio producer, who is also director of a dramatic school, identified his daughter, whose death by shooting had been a sensation a number of months previously. Despite her highly emotional state, in a few words understandable to him, she confirmed his theory of the tragedy.

The "Know-How"

While most of the figures that appeared were substantial, the features of some were more distinct than others. Something of the problem of materialization was indicated when Silver Leaf remarked at one point:

"He (a spirit) didn't know how to build up. He comes in (into the cabinet, where the

ectoplasm is collected), and then he falls apart."

Other spirits had to be directed how to "step into" the accumulated ectoplasm in order to be seen. Of the features of some others, an art student who attended the demonstration explained:

"It was as though some of them had studied art and tried to make self-portraits of themselves from memory without having looked in a mirror for a long time. The result is what they think they should look like or what they think they looked like when they passed over.

"Therefore, the likeness cannot always have photographic

sharpness and detail. The features may be hazy and blurred, but there were distinct differences and many which were very plain."

There was no doubt in the case of the two climaxing tests. Identification was possible not only by a clear view of the features of Jean Harlow and Jack Lloyd, but also by their voices, gestures and mannerisms.

Miss Harlow's unexpected appearance was heralded by the announcement from Silver Leaf: "There's a dancing girl here."

The actress was immediately recognized by Miss Lloyd and others present as the figure glided out into the room. Miss Lloyd had met Miss Harlow at various film studios during her

lifetime, and both Miss Lloyd and others present said that her appearance, her dancing movements and her distinctive arm gestures were very typical.

Most dramatic of all the manifestations, however, was that of Jack Lloyd. First a man's voice was heard inside the cabinet, singing "My Wild Irish Rose."

"That sounds just like Jack," Miss Lloyd remarked. "He used to sing that."

Then the figure appeared. So touching and authentic was the following scene that many present found tears in their eyes. It is difficult to say which of the two principals was more excited while they exchanged their first endearing greetings.

Those Who Know Her

As she looked closer, Miss Lloyd, her voice atremble, exclaimed:

"Jackie, it really is you! My gosh, it really is you! I see you! I see you! I see your hair!"

Afterward she explained that his hair was carefully combed, as it usually was during his earthly life.

"I still love you, honey," said the manifesting entity. "You're going to dance again."

This was a reference to Miss Lloyd's wheel chair life as a poliomyelitis victim. (Her sweetness, cheerfulness and forbearance in the face of this disaster to herself and her career have endeared her to friends among the film stars and all others who know her. That is why she is sometimes called Hollywood's "bright angel.")

Final Proof

Before the form disappeared in front of her, the two sang together "My Wild Irish Rose," just as they had done in the past, and a moment later Miss Lloyd felt a light kiss on her forehead—a kiss, she said, that was final proof to her that her husband was there and remembered.

She explained that, during their marriage, he often left home early in the morning before she was awake. (Film studio calls are notoriously early.) Sometimes, though drowsy, she would feel his lips

On the morning of his death, May 19, 1933, he had left for Columbia Studios without her knowing whether he had kissed her as usual or not. Later he collapsed on the studio lot and died there.

For years, she said, she had wondered whether there had been that final kiss. Therefore, when the spirit figure of Jack Lloyd kissed her forehead in the same light, tender way her had done so many times before, she knew, she said, that he was aware of this sentimental question in the back of her mind.

The Lloyds (that was their stage and screen name, although, strangely, her professional name before marriage had been "Vernon," and his legal name was "Vernon") were an affectionate and devoted couple, and those who witnessed the materialization were deeply impressed.

"I was amazed," Miss Lloyd said later. "There was no doubt at all that it was my husband. I could even see the color of his eyes, which were blue. Every hair was exactly in place, just like he used to comb it."

Prize Solo

As the materialization meeting came to a close, someone produced a trumpet, and with Maude Kline present, it soon was levitated high in the air.

This was an impromptu epilogue to the main drama, but soon Jack Lloyd's voice was heard, and he fulfilled a previously-made promise to play a cornet through the trumpet. True, the solo would not have taken a prize at Carnegie Hall, but the sound was definitely the clear notes of a cornet, and again the number was "My Wild Irish Rose."

As the evening's "unrehearsed program" ended, those present conceded that Hollywood had brought forth a most unusual production but one unlikely to be reproduced by its movie makers.

very far, you will find fortifications, you will find barracks — you will find the troops of American soldiers trekking there for fortifications, for they too, see the handwriting on the wall.

Again I will reach out into that Canadian country and say there shall be a new form of mineral, radium, in the form of uranium—yea, and the secrets of the universe are being tapped and a new element coming into evidence that will

bring forth more tragedy to an already suffering world.

Now I come home. I touch your Eastern seaboard. You are going to have a rather late winter both on the Atlantic and on the Pacific. Your rains and your snows will come late in the year of 1950 and with all of the snows and the rains, prolific in the middle west, you find the same drought throughout the summer that has been for years.

You will also find with these

late snows giving way, the over-flowing of that Mississippi shall take two little villages and its inhabitants and not until enough destruction has come, will men busy themselves in a mechanical and scientific way to place an embankment, sheltering them from the over-flow.

You will find in the Floridas a great real estate boom in the year of 1950. You will find your Carolinas suffering from a sort of a virus plague that comes in from the sea and the Cubas.

THE "HOW" OF TELEKINESIS

What Men Do Not Like, They Try Hard Not To Believe

By
R. G. PRESSING

For a number of years, it has been my desire to assemble a fairly comprehensive story, with pictures, that might, in a general way, explain the technique and the "how" of that phase of mediumship labeled telekinesis but known to the ordinary layman as levitation.

Definitions of a word, especially in the field of psychic science, vary according to the experience and viewpoint of the personality submitting said definition. In the *Encyclopedia of Psychic Science*, the author, Nandor Fodor defines *Levitation* (page 194) "raising of physical objects, tables, pianos, etc., or of human beings in the air, contrary to the laws of gravitation and without any visible agency. More often the term is used in a restricted sense and refers to the levitation of the human body. As such, the phenomena was used from the ancient days" . . . and then Fodor goes on and in a treatise of over 5000 words, he cites a complete history of known cases. But Fodor used the word *telekinesis* only once.

Look At The Record!

In Lena Barnes Jefts booklet, *Psychic Facts*, she describes telekinesis as "movement at a distance from the motive cause or agency without material connection.

"Telekinesis," says Mrs. Jefts, "is used to cover levitation through mediumship, of all articles or objects—ectoplasm being the basis of the manifestations."

Fodor's 5000-word treatise on levitation includes: The fifteen before the altar levitations experienced by St. Joseph of Copertino in the presence of Pope Urban VIII; the Nancy Wesley levitations at the Epworth Vicarage; levitations of D. D. Home; the St. Teresa of Avila

levitations: the Mrs. Guppy-Volekman incident; levitations of Zaccarini; Eglinton levitations at Calcutta; Lombroso's explanation of the Palladino levitations; W. J. Crawford's famous cantilever levitation experiments; levitation of the French dancer, Maria Taglioni and the Nijinski levitations in Russia.

Little Known

All of which explicitly points out that these phenomena are not new. Down through the ages, miracles happened . . . they were called miracles then and even today, some people refer to them as such, whereas in reality, manifestations of levitation and telekinesis take place as the result of natural law and psychic contact.

Since man in earlier days knew little about these laws, all occurrences of this nature,

when they did happen, were referred to as supernatural, weird or eerie. In other words, what men do not like they try hard not to believe.

Mediums Cooperate

And so, there is a job to do. Millions upon millions of persons know nothing about spirit operators or even believe that there is spirit agency. . . and that is the real reason why manifestations of physical phenomena should be publicized more today than ever before.

The American Foundation for Psychic Research, Inc. has been functioning at Jamestown, N. Y., a little over six months and during that time, efforts have been made to present and study all phases of mediumship—especially physical mediumship.

Many mediums have cooperated with the Foundation even in that short space of time — Dr. J. J. Carroll of Buffalo, N. Y., just completed

a three-day series of seances. His phenomenal demonstrations are well-known and have been witnessed by thousands during the past thirty years — mainly because he has traveled extensively and held seances throughout the States and Canada. His has been an attempt to bring the truth of survival to the greatest number of people in the shortest length of time.

No Complaints

Carroll visited the large cities, the out-of-the-way places, the humble churches and the fussy research organizations and in all that time, not a single written charge of wrongdoing has been submitted to this office.

Yes, Carroll is a veteran medium. He has contributed much to the cause of Spiritualism, particularly in his own field — levitation and partial materialization in the red-light.

Any experienced psychic researcher will tell you, and the classics on the subject point out, that every medium who has gained prominence, because of the ability of their guides to demonstrate phenomena, has stressed and specialized in certain phases.

This does not mean that many of our foremost mediums of yesteryear and today are not versatile in the sense that they

possess many phases, nor does it minimize their ability to do justice to various psychic gifts, but as a rule, every medium seems to be able to demonstrate one phase to a greater degree than any other.

Guides Specialize

And this is particularly noted by the results obtained in seances with Carroll. Since the days, and even during the days, of Dell Herrick, William Hart, and P.L.O.A. Keeler, records show that Carroll's red-light demonstrations of telekinesis are outstanding — for surpassing any of his other phases.

Furthermore, technique in producing phenomena naturally improves and reaches a degree of perfection when the guides of a medium specialize on one phase and this decision is made after the guides have analyzed the potentialities and chemicalizations of their instrument. In Carroll's case, Pat, his spirit collaborator, seems to have perfected his technique to such a degree that he is now able to overcome almost every conceivable obstacle.

Boiled down, all of this means that the guides prefer to demonstrate that phase which they have found their medium best fitted for.

Flash Light

Over ten years ago, Carroll held a series of seances for the editors of *Psychic Observer*. A photographer, not a Spiritualist, took flashlight pictures of the phenomena. These pictures definitely showed supernatural manifestations but in this experiment the photograph by flash-light did not show when developed, ectoplasmic formation.

This, of course, was due to the fact that visible signs of ectoplasm rarely appear on the negative when bright flashes are allowed to diffuse the manifestations.

A thorough review of the textbooks, in and out-of-print, disclose few pictures showing the "how" of levitation as well as do the pictures taken (see pages 12 and 13) during the

Carroll seances held at the American Foundation November 12th, 13th and 14th.

At this point, it is imperative that the reader understand something about the conditions under which these pictures were taken. Since flash-light rays diffuse ectoplasm, the best pictures could only be taken in total darkness with modern infra-red photography simply because ectoplasmic formations must be allowed sufficient time to build.

Now, you may ask, what about all the pictures on record that show ectoplasmic formation? There are many, but when these pictures were taken with flash-light, in most instances, the results were apt to be injurious to the medium. If not injurious, the medium was left with a sickening feeling or suffered temporary internal disorders — nothing serious, in most instances, but annoying nevertheless.

Infra-Red Photograph

After years of experimentation, Harry Gardner, the Elmira, N. Y., psychic researcher, has become quite adept in the use of the infra-red camera and it is to him that we extend our gratitude for the fine work he was able to turn out during the Carroll demonstrations.

When the members of the Foundation were informed of the scheduled Carroll seances at Jamestown, dozens responded from all parts of the country, members and guest non-members alike. The circles included eminent doctors, lawyers, executives, educators, college students and hosts of others, most of whom witnessed a psychic demonstration for the first time. All were strangers to the medium.

Good Place To Start

In my opinion, it is this type of seance that neophytes can best receive their first inkling of the fact that there is a power in operation. Through infra-red, the mechanics or ectoplasmic dynamo generating this tangible power can be photographed.

What is this power? It is the force exerted by the spirit

chemists through these ectoplasmic formations that cause objects to move. These formations occur and when in motion, in the red light they are not always discernable to the naked eye, and can best be photographed by infra-red.

Gravitation A Law

By these experiments, it can be shown that the laws of gravitation are NOT violated, but rather they are taken into consideration, else this ectoplasmic formation would not have to be brought to bear in order to cause the manifestation.

This viewpoint differs from Fodor's explanation. He says these things happen "contrary to the laws of gravitation". Gravitation is either a law or it isn't. Since it is a law, we must reckon with it. Fodor should make up his mind.

All this "rigamarole" of terminology and technical wording would be weak and subject to rebuttal were it not backed by plenty of pictures to vivify and prove a particular case in point.

My job at any seance, other than to witness the phenomena, is and always will be concerned about the sitters. What are they thinking? What do they do? What is expressed in their countenances?

Few Are Gullible

Never think that these groups, especially the new-comers, swallow the whole manifestation "hook, line and sinker." Few there are who openly express an opinion, but when they do, that is the time psychic research becomes interesting. In one instance during the Carroll seances, an eminent psychiatrist seemed to think . . . but before I get into this discussion, the general set-up of the seance must be explained

The pictures (pages 12 and 13) show that a black curtain was stretched about five feet high across the corner of the room. Back of this curtain was placed a collapsible card table on which were several trumpets, a mechanical music-box, a tambourine, a school class bell, a large guitar, a blank pad of paper, pencils, and a glass of

water. The sitters were requested to examine most of these articles as well as the cabinet before the seance started.

Aviatrix Befuddled

It so happened that all during the seance, numerous unannounced trips were made to the cabinet by an inquisitive aviatrix who could not seem to come to the point of believing such phenomena were possible. This aviatrix was so flabbergasted that she was continually bobbing up and down. On two occasions, without asking permission, she even scooted back of the curtain to make sure no one was there.

After the sitters were satisfied with the arrangement, a battery of two persons were selected. These persons were chosen by Carroll to sit along side of him during the demonstration. (see pictures).

After all three were seated on plain chairs in front of the black curtain, another black curtain was pinned in front of these two sitters and the medium with only their heads visible. Contact by clasping shoulders or holding of hands was made by all three.

Now to get back to the eminent psychiatrist who was not satisfied with the "hand-holding." He thought the medium was not sufficiently under control and here, by control, I mean he evidently felt that both Carroll's hands should either be tied or held by the sitter next to him.

Perfect Justification

There can be no question but that the psychiatrist's suggestion was well-taken and I, myself, could see no reason why his request was not granted, but must counter by saying that whether his wish was granted or whether it was not, the pictures clearly show that even if the medium's both hands were not controlled to his entire satisfaction, (as a matter of fact, one hand was being held and the other was grasping the shoulder of the sitter next to him) it would have been humanly impossible for even a contortionist or a man with four

hands and arms twice the length to have caused the phenomena witnessed — besides real ectoplasm is not handmade. That's the value of pictures.

What's all this got to do with your soul? What's all this got to do with spirituality? These expressions are common. They are hurled at people who derive a great deal of consolation from witnessing seance-room phenomena. The answer to these two questions is nothing, if, when witnessed, some spark within each individual is not awakened. The manifestations themselves may seem childish but results are what count. If a soul is touched, if an otherwise rank skeptic is moved out of a state of lethargy . . . then some good purpose is served.

Why The "Hush-Hush"?

Some of these spiritual fanatics even admit that phenomena has its place in Spiritualism but continually harp that the soul is the thing—that Spirituality and its development is the goal. Of course it is. Nobody denies this fact but must they continually try to "hush-hush" the phenomena by constantly spreading seeds of doubt . . . and there's the rub!

For years, it has been the same old story—the super-sensitive spiritual souls gnash their teeth even at the very mention of physical manifestations. Their cry is that it isn't spiritual or that it is too gruesome to look at.

These dear people want everyone to develop the soul within, or strive to reach the spiritual heights of cosmic consciousness, or suggest that you project your astral bodies hither and yon. All of this is well and good and no one would lay a straw in their way if that is what they want to do above all else, but why should they look down their "holier than thou" noses and sneer at others who desire to conduct such experiments

For the past fifty years, hundreds of psychic societies and organizations outside the organized movement of Spiritualism have been functioning in an effort to teach soul growth

and assist the student to develop their own psychic power. The woods are full of them. Hundreds of Spiritualists have banded together in classes and home circles—their goal being spiritual unfoldment.

Philosophical Groups

In the first group, we have students interested in Rosicrucianism, Divine Science, Unity, Theosophy, B'hai, Hindu Philosophy, Psychology, etc. They are all helping to spread the very same truths that are, in essence, part and parcel of the truths taught by Spiritualist teachers and mediums which comprise the second group.

The only difference is this. The first group feel, and rightly so, that each individual should unfold their own psychic powers and that it is unwise to contact professional mediums or those who have already developed positive mediumship. The only catch is . . . What do the leaders of the first group do when one of their students becomes a potential medium? The line of demarcation between soul growth and spiritual consciousness on one hand, and potential mediumship on the other, is very slim. Yet, leaders of the first group are apt to "high-hat" the lowly medium.

Beyond Dignity?

There are also those who feel it isn't dignified to hold physical phenomena seances. They point to the paraphernalia, jibe at the use of tambourine, bells, etc., and conclude with the argument that we should have outgrown these "playthings" long ago—and to a degree, they are right but since we are told that we must become *as little children*, why not interpret the saying literally and approach the subject as little children?

But then, what's particularly dignified about the procedure followed by some of those staid gentlemen who classify themselves as psychic researchers? They, too, work with gadgets, machines, bottles and even marbles when they set about investigating telepathy and

other phases of mental mediumship, but nobody ridicules them because they are scientists.

They Know . . .

We must never forget that the reason for experiments in any field of physical phenomena should be to show that there is such a thing as A SPIRIT, SPIRIT POWER, and INDIVIDUALIZED PERSONAL CONSCIOUS SURVIVAL. That's the job at hand and the results should justify the means, else why call it *psychic* research?

On the other hand, I never heard of an individual, a person seriously interested in physical phenomena who did not want to unfold his spiritual potentialities. These persons are, in the main, avid students and prolific readers on the subject and, in most cases, have their spiritual feet on the ground. In part, the affidavit reads: "The doors were nailed shut and covered with black cambrie which had been securely tacked; all windows were covered and nailed shut and secured with four bolts; the doors were covered with weather stripping; there were no trap doors under the rug and no means of ingress or egress in or out of the seance room except through one door at the far end which constituted the only entrance to the seance room.

"Affiants further state that their examination of the seance

room and cabinet revealed no apparatus present therein which could in any way be used for deceptive or fraudulent work on the part of the medium."

PICTURE-STORY OF THE TECHNIQUE OF PSYCHIC PHENOMENA

Received thru the Mediumship of J. J. Carroll *The "How" of Telekinesis (LEVITATION)*



A Photographic partial materialization showing materialized fingers of Pat Carroll's cabinet guitar, grasping extended left palm of R. G. Present. Florence Varley's head can be seen, turned to the left to get a better view of the demonstration. Others in the picture: Christine J. Lemelin, Montreal, Canada (center) and Carroll, the medium, extreme right. Miss Varley, a brotherologist, is a keen observer. As a result of investigation into the field of psychic science, a written resolution was sent to Dr. Karl Beck, minister of the Jameson's Christian Church. When soliciting her church membership, Miss Varley said: "... and I have become convinced of the truth to be found in Spiritualism..." Miss Varley's complete statement published on page 15.



B This picture shows the music box being held above the curtain. The ectoplasmic structure supporting the box, extends from the medium's throat to the edge of the curtain directly under the box. The man in the picture with closed left hand under his chin is Victor Shane, a Jameson Spiritualist. The top of the medium's head is discernible directly back of Mr. Shane.



C This is one of the most dramatic pictures of the entire group. Note the veil of ectoplasm completely covering the medium's face. The trumpet is being held just above the curtain at a convincing angle. Sleights may even then try to explain away the levitation but the mass of ectoplasm clinches the demonstration. Two sitters, Rev. J. Townsend and Edna Pinney, served as the battery. Their heads are plainly visible.

Beginning page 8, this feature included an explanation of the technique of levitation and the history and importance of physical demonstrations in relation to philosophical teachings. On this page, the pictures and captions are self-explanatory. It only remains to point out the nature of phenomena witnessed... phenomena which happened but has not, as yet, been mentioned.

During Carroll's series of seances, Pat demonstrated automatic writing. The tablet and pencil, previously examined, rested on the card table back of the cabinet. Pat asked people from the audience to announce the names they desired him to write. Nothing was planned ahead of time. Many names were called out. Pat could be heard scribbling these names on the tablet and then tearing off each sheet.

When complete, these sheets would be lightly wadded into a ball and either tucked through the curtain or thrown clear of it usually in the direction of the sitters to whom the sheet belonged. The names called and written, although somewhat difficult to read, were invariably the names each sitter directed Pat to write.

The guitar played while in a swirling, rotating motion. It played above the curtain, back of the cabinet, and then high near the ceiling. On occasion, it also played out in the region of the sitters. The tune to be played was sometimes called from

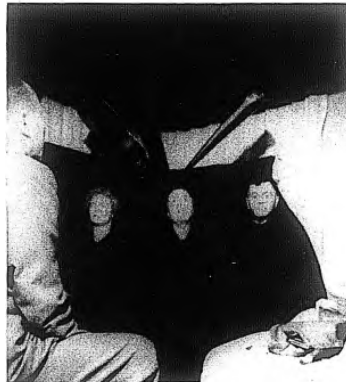
the audience and when rendered, no visible hands could be seen touching the strings.

Sitters could hear Pat wind up the music box; the bell and tambourine appeared many times above the cabinet—the latter was thumped in a typical manner.

Of these demonstrations, the card table manipulation was unique. It would have been impossible for any earth being to accomplish this feat without being detected as the source of power.

The space between the curtain and the wall was cramped because the curtain was stretched across the corner of the room, making the quarters triangular. All four legs of the bulky card table could be folded out the catches on each leg were extremely difficult to release, even for a lunatic. Over a period of years, fingers have been caught and pinched in this apparent simple folding operation.

At the close of each seance, Pat was able to push, throw or hand all of the paraphernalia out to sitters in the room and when he came to the card table, there a rumpus really began. You could hear all the twisting, turning, and fussing Pat went through in order to fold each leg, and then, this heavy card table, (twice the weight of an ordinary one) was projected over the curtain as sort of a finale.



F And here we have a photograph showing the guitar and two trumpets held up and extending out into the room. Note the unconcerned look on Carroll's countenance. The lady in the center is stretching her head upwards to view the demonstration. The ordained minister, Rev. Townsend of Buffalo, N. Y. (extreme left) when questioned said she was partially entranced when this picture was taken. On several occasions, sitters were called from the audience to experiment. Attempts were made to pull a trumpet away from Pat by sheer force. No one was able to do it.



D Anyone, with eyes to see, should admit that this photograph showing the guitar in mid-air is most convincing. Again, the mass of ectoplasm extends from the medium's throat, back of Mrs. Pinney's head and then over the top of the curtain to the instrument. Actually, the drapes on either side of the guitar were of a dark maroon shade, but they photographed white... Why?



E The mound of ectoplasm seen in the center above the lower curtain did not take the shape of a materialized head. On occasion, psychoplasmic heads, without animation, have bulged in Carroll's seances. In the center foreground, right hand across his chest, is A. Marc Connolly, one of Jameson's young lawyers, whose interest in psychic phenomena began a short time ago.

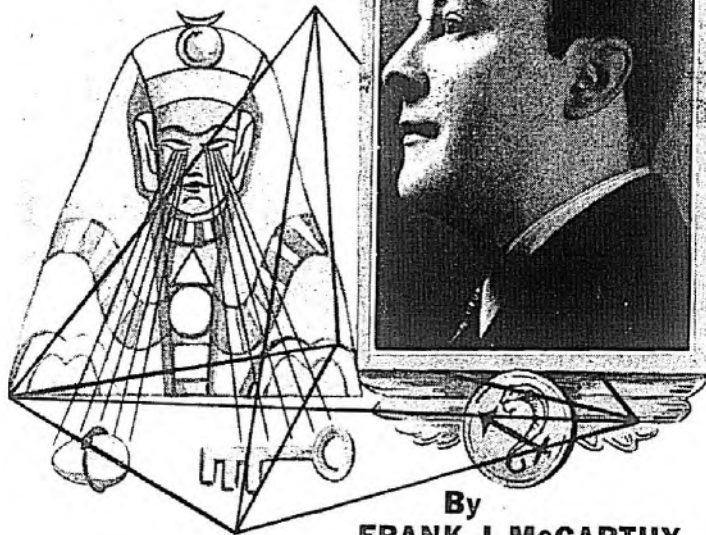

Spiritual Values

That "men cannot live by bread alone" few people deny, but many fail to realize the wonderful spiritual fare which is the daily lot of the men and women of our great nation. Democracy itself is one of the sources of our strength. Constituted as a political dream, it is much more than a form of government. It is a glowing, vital expression of faith in humanity.

Freedom of religion is one of the tenets of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. The Catholic cathedrals, the Jewish synagogues, and the Protestant churches, which are found in the towns and cities all over our land, give evidence of the successful operation of belief in man's right to worship as he pleases.

Double Meaning

Within one short city block you may find families attending a dozen different religious sanctuaries, including Buddhist temples or civic organizations like the Y.M.C.A. The place wherein one worships is not the important consideration. The spirit with which one enters any House of the Lord is the cohesive force, joining together the members of every religion, and illustrating in practical and dynamic form that "all men are created equal."

There are certain words in our vocabulary which have a double meaning. "Club" is one of them. A person says, "I am going to the

club," meaning a meeting place for a particular group. Or he may say, "Our club believes so and so." The difference is here apparent, for in the latter example, reference is made not to a building or room (which obviously cannot think) but to the members who meet there. The same dual meaning is attached to the word "church." From this fact confusion sometimes arises.

All Churches Alike

Those who speak of the state of the church as dependent upon material means for construction and maintenance are thinking of the first concept of the word. This includes consideration of lecturing facilities, recreation rooms, beauty of structure as a fitting monument in God's honor, salary of employees, etc. All of these things are important, but far less so than the expression of a congregation's faith and thanksgiving for the blessing of human life. It is in this latter significance that all churches are alike.

At one time in history the two meanings of "church" were more closely connected. When the members themselves built the structure, as they did in old colonial times, or when everyone subscribed with labor to the erection of the cathedrals in the Middle Ages, then one might use the word "church" without fear of misunderstanding.

Today the buildings themselves are constructed by experts, who may not be interested in anything about the project but their fees for work. The members of the congregation are simply onlookers as far as the actual operation of building or care of meeting places is concerned. It

is only in the use of "church" in the broader sense that our unity lies.

In spirit and purpose the members of all religious sects and creeds are joined together. In no place in the world is this fact more apparent than in the United States, which was constituted on the principle of faith in God and in human beings as His agents. The individual human spirit is the well-spring of strength, a conscious center of God's eternal power and holiness.

Moral Judgment

The intense desire for understanding of the universe, the longing for the abundant life, and faith in the Omnipotent Power to make possible the accomplishing of these dreams fills the hearts of men and constitutes religion, or the religious urge. It is this spirit which underlies the organization of any church or other institution designed for the common good.

Our great public-school system attests our faith in human reason and intelligence. Boys and girls from every type of home are given the opportunity to learn, to grow, and to be inspired with ambition to become better citizens of their country and of the world. God's will, as exemplified by the superiority of right over wrong, is part of their training.

The part which individual observation and thought plays in moral judgment is not denied. Arbitrary creeds or absolute standards are not crammed down the throats of those who seek education in American institutions. The emphasis is upon the importance—nay, the necessity—of learning to think, to evaluate, and to choose wisely and ethically.

Future Depends On Faith

Social legislation, including such measures as social security and unemployment compensation, are further illustrations of the concept of the individual's importance in the United States. Our government was conceived and dedicated to the protection of the God-given rights of every person to "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

The future depends upon continuance of faith in man. You may call him God's handiwork or God's child, but you must not lose confidence in his divinity and mission to do God's will. You and I, our next door neighbors, and every man, woman and child in the world, regardless of sect or race, are representatives of a Higher Power, whose glory and might is infinite

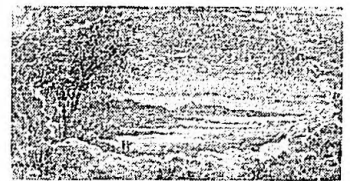

A unique program, covering every phase of church activity, has been set up by the Spiritualist Episcopal Church, and is now being used by many churches of that organization to help fulfill its slogan "Constant In Service."

Speaking of the program, Rev. John W. Bunker, presiding clergyman of the organization, said, "Feeling that all our talents, whatever they may be, are given us for a purpose that is, in the final analysis, a spiritual one, the SEC has originated this program so that each member and friend can have a work to do in helping bring the truths of Spirit to an increasing number of persons."

The SEC believes that every church member is a steward who has been given, or has come into, his particular talents and, just as in the Biblical parable of the talents, these abilities should not be buried or wasted. The church has divided these talents into ten classifications and assigned every member of each individual church to one of these classifications . . . or Stewardship committees, as the church calls them.

Each of these Stewardship committees plan a one-year program of activities which it will conduct . . . and results of the plan show already that churches are greatly benefited through use of the Aggressive Stewardship program. inside the church membership and in the entire community in which the individual church is located, thus fulfilling the purpose of the church and earning a rightful place among recognized religions. (2) To increase opportunities for individual service, to increase enthusiasm among members, and to increase membership and attendance at church services. (3) To bring a greater understanding of spiritual truths to the people, and inform them of the activities of the church.

For the attainment of this ideal, Attendance and Membership Stew-

ards devise plans for stimulating action in both those departments. Social Service Stewards call on the sick and aged, send flowers and cards and take church literature to those who cannot attend services. Public Affairs Stewards represent the church in community activities outside the church, such as Red Cross, March of Dimes and Community Chest.

Fellowship Stewards conduct the social affairs of the church, arranging various types of parties and entertainments.

Boys' and Girls' Work Stewards sponsor Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts and similar organizations, organize hobby shows, and conduct activities in connection with the young people of the community, whether members of the church or not.

SEC Education Stewards operate Sunday schools, distribute church tracts and other publications such as *Psychic Observer* and *Golden Rays* magazine, and devise means of

helping people learn the truths of Spiritualism.

Achievement Stewards publish church bulletins, send stories of church activities to local newspapers and radio stations, and report to both their own membership and to the national offices of the church at Eaton Rapids, Michigan, on the activities conducted by their individual church. Three other Stewardship committees are active in affairs particularly concerned with the Spiritualist Episcopal Church.

At the Tenth Annual Conference of the church, to be held in September of 1950, suitable awards will be given those churches who attain the highest achievement rating in this program.

This is probably the most comprehensive church activity program ever attempted in the annals of Spiritualism. SEC leaders and many others are watching the program with a great deal of interest to see what effect it may have both on those churches and persons already members of the organization and on persons in the various communities who are outside the religion of Spiritualism entirely.

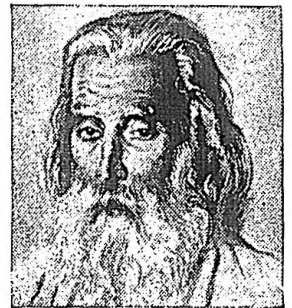

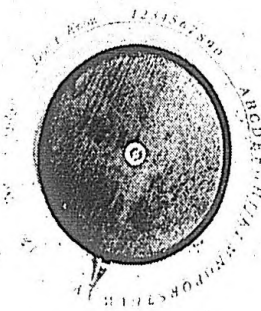

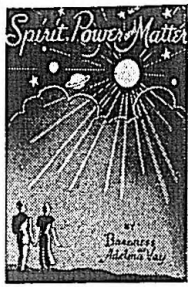
