Patience Worth's Medium

We have just received an article: "The Truth About Patience Worth," specially written for *Psychic Observer* by Emily Grant Hutchings. Watch for it!

During the past 100 years, daily newspapers and magazines have treated the subject of psychic science and Spiritualism with various approaches—some serious and some, not so serious. The vein of thinking seems to follow trends dating first with Horace Greeley's serious articles in the early 1847 editions of the *New York Tribune*.

And now today, we find that in a mild sort of way, this trend

again borders on a serious approach to our subject, especially when handled by some learned columnists who submit syndicated articles to daily newspapers.

To be specific, it only remains to point out recent evidence substantiating this statement: several lengthy syndicated articles on the subject of mediums, mediumship and Spiritualism by Billy Rose, Dorothy Kilgallen, Louis Ludlow, Danton Walker and others.

In the days of Greeley (1811-

1872) a serious trend was started by this newspaper editor whilst today, a similar trend is being followed not by editors but by columnists for there is a difference.

When dealing with controversial subjects, editors usually sense the "balance of power" and follow the trend of the majority of their readers. They are influenced by public opinion and strive always, when handling highly specialized subjects, to only insult about 5 per cent of their readers — if, indeed, they need to be insulted at all.

Columnists, when they reach the topnotch brackets, are usually not concerned with what their own newspaper editor thinks and are able to say (barring libel) what they think. Their material is seldom edited, rather it is either turned down completely or the columnist is asked for a rewrite.

Truth For Truth's Sake

Greeley was a combination of editor and columnist in that he was one of those rare specimens of humanity, who feared no one for in June 1850, he was the first newspaper man to call upon the Fox Sisters in New York City and then to have

the courage to state publicly that he was puzzled over the rapping phenomena.

When Greeley expressed his conviction and said: "Certain developments strongly indicate that rappings do proceed from

dom get far politically, nor do they ever seem to attain popularity with the general public. Spiritualism was just as unpopular eighty years ago as it is today and this is the main reason why people in high places, even though convinced, avoid public statements on the subject. Greeley was one of the first and possibly the only newspaper editor and owner of any note who took a stand pro Spiritualism.

"We Are Not Responsible"

It is true that many newspapers throughout the world publish feature stories on Spiritualism from time to time, but as a rule, these stories carry a by-line and are prefaced by the editor's statement, "we are not responsible, etc., etc." With rare exceptions, these articles either scoff or ridicule the subject.

Even so, a few serious articles were published during the days of Doyle and Lodge and today some science editors release *pro* articles but they are usually confined to the dignified subject of mental telepathy and rarely comment favorably upon the *technique* of spirit communication.

So much for the editors and newspaper owners and what

departed spirits," this statement may have injured his presidential aspirations when he opposed Grant in 1872 for he (Greeley) was defeated and passed away November 29th of the same year.

History shows that champions of unpopular truths sel-

they allow, but the trend today is not evidenced in that field. Rather, it blazes forth from the pens of numerous columnists. By analyzing their articles and statements, we find that the text, when reference is made to psychic phenomena, is based on facts received as the result of their contacts with hundreds of people—people who have no axe to grind, but people who have had psychic experiences.

Over 50 Years Ago

To prove my point, I have only to refer to columnist Louis Ludlow's article. "Medium Interview Was 'One For The Books'" which was widely syndicated under the heading, "Sparks From the Washington

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Anvil." Mr. Ludlow begins his article: "One of the strangest experiences I ever had was when, as a young reporter about half a century ago, I secured an interview with May Wright Sewall and heard her tell about conversations she said she had through *spiritualistic media* with her deceased husband, Theodore L. Sewall."

Do not miss the point. Ludlow said "fifty years ago." Is it not reasonable to believe that even though it all began for him long ago, many experiences of this nature must have crossed his path? Could he not have been overwhelmed, during those years by such convincing data as to finally bring him to the point of saying something about it? . . . But why at this late date? Only Mr. Ludlow can answer that.

Tarkington's Preface

By way of friendly comment, instead of using the words, Spiritualist medium. Ludlow used his own special phraseology, "spiritualistic media." He goes on to say in his article that Mrs. Sewall published all these communications but he does not mention "Neither Dead Nor Sleeping" (out-of-print*) the book from which he quotes.

Nor does Ludlow say that the introduction was written in 1920 by Booth Tarkington who, after agreeing to write it, apologizes by saying he is neutral on the subject. If a man is neutral, why should he write an introduction to such a *pro* book?

It's the same old story, intellectual pen wielders like to play both ends against the middle. Their dear public comes first—their convictions are suppressed and seldom expressed unless the pulse of public opinion on a subject is at least normal.

Always Be Grateful

I shall always remember, how, several years before Mr. Tarkington passed away, a request was made for him to issue a public statement. Although he always answered letters, he was careful not to say anything *pro*. After all, one

must not run the risk of injuring their reputation.

There is no need to bring Ludlow to task for misquoting from Sewall's book, the name of which he does not mention, because the important thing is that this eminent columnist felt the subject worthy of consideration at all.

He could have mentioned that Mrs. Sewall sat with numerous of prominent mediums and witnessed numerous phases of psychic phenomena, but he said enough and Spiritualists should be grateful for the way he handled the subject.

For the record, May Wright Sewall, dean of a girls' Seminary in Indianapolis, passed

He wrote the preface

away July 22, 1920, several months after her book was published by Bobbs-Merrill Company. She was 76 years old.

For the original clipping of the Ludlow article, we are indebted to Oscar B. Smith, editor of the *Farmers Guild News*, Frankfort, Indiana. Smith states that Ludlow was a former representative and member of the 71st to the 80th Congresses inclusive and a Congressman from the Eleventh district of Indiana.

Of Ludlow's background, Smith also says: "Mr. Ludlow was at one time a member of the Washington Press Gallery for Indianapolis newspapers (1901-1913) and is a former president of the National Press Club. He retired from Congress in 1948 as one of Indiana's most highly respected Congressmen. Mr. Ludlow is regarded as a very responsible writer

which makes his article all the more impressive."

Inasmuch as this article deals with columnists and the trend they have recently shown toward psychic phenomena even though not thoroughly convinced, a logical reason should be given for this interest. I believe that, in their association with all sorts of people, columnists must be continually confronted with discussions of Spiritualism — and that these discussions are started not by the columnists themselves but by these more or less prominent people.

The Houdini Affair

Even today, those well informed, claim Walter Winchell retains his interest and spirit of inquiry toward the subject of spirit communication. Who can forget his direct association with the Houdini affair in 1929 when he interviewed the late Mrs. Houdini after she received the code message from her deceased husband through the mediumship of Arthur Ford? His column, during that fracas, included a letter he received from Mrs. Houdini wherein she (Mrs. Houdini) stated she was satisfied she had actually received said code.

Some columnists are reluctant, while in the flesh, to come right out and say what they think. O. O. McIntyre is in that category for during the past ten years and even longer, numerous direct-voice communications to the editors of this journal have been received from him, not through one medium but through dozens.

McIntyre's Message

McIntyre has voiced the fact that he was always interested in the subject while on earth. His communications, at seances, over a period of years, bear out this point and in other ways, his utterances have proven most evidential.

A feature article published by *Psychic Observer* several years ago, was based on a communication from "O. O." received through the mediumship of Frank Decker . . . and Dan-

ton Walker, New York columnist was present. Did he write about it? NO!

While in New York several years ago, I had an opportunity to glance through a file containing McIntyre's "Day By Day" column and after a search of several hours, I came across only two instances where he even mentioned the subject of Spiritualism.

Gloria Excited

In her column, "Voices of Broadway," Dorothy Kilgallen says: "Intimates say Gloria Vanderbilt Stokowski is currently excited about Spiritualism."

This quotation is taken from the New York Journal American dated January 26, 1950, and was, no doubt, made as the result of an interview Miss Kilgallen had with Gloria. However, we know that all gossip written by these columnists cannot be obtained by actual contact, but we also know that columnists are meticulous about checking and rechecking facts. Gossip is sometimes founded on fact.

If Gloria is excited about Spiritualism (and Miss Kilgallen spells Spiritualism with a small "s") what on earth could she (Gloria) be excited about! One cannot become very excited after reading books on the subject. Possibly, she attended a seance and since she was excited, probably she received some evidence.

"Great Literary Riddle"

Louis Sobol's column in a New York newspaper several years ago cited Stokowski's interest in Spiritualism and the fact that he attended seances given by the late Edward Lester Thorne. This could account for Gloria's interest in Spiritualism.

The Kilgallen clipping was submitted by Georges W. Pressier, 223 Grand Street, New Milford, New Jersey, who says that Gloria Vanderbilt Stokowski is the daughter of the late Reginald Vanderbilt, one of the earlier Vanderbilts and that hus-

band Stokowski is a famous concert music master.

"Patience Worth Case, Great Literary Riddle" . . . this column heading was used by Billy Rose in his syndicated article published the latter part of January when he discussed the mediumship of Mrs. John H. Curran who passed away December 5, 1937.

Spiritualists know her as Pearl Curran, the medium who received her first message in 1913 from a spirit named Patience Worth and like most mediums, her fame began two weeks after her passing when the Los Angeles Times Sunday

magazine published four full pages with pictures discussing her rare mediumship and at the time included excerpts from her books: "Sorry Tale," "Hope Trueblood" and "Light from Beyond." Where else could Billy Rose have obtained this data?

His article began with these words: "Next time you meet a fellow who doesn't believe in anything he can't measure with a slide rule, ask him to give you a logical explanation of the documented case history of Patience Worth."

How It All Started

Could this mean that Billy Rose is challenging all of our critics, including the psychic researchers? Quite possible because he continues: "On a July evening in 1913, two St. Louis housewives, a Mrs. John Curran and a Mrs. Hutchings, were amusing themselves with an ouija board—a parlor pas-

time as popular then as Canasta is now. Suddenly Mrs. Curran felt a strong pressure on her hands and the pointer began to spell out a message: 'Many moons ago I lived. Again I come. Patience Worth my name'."

Rose Quotes Prince

Of course, with very few exceptions, all married women are housewives, but, at the time, Emily (Grant) Hutchings was a reporter on St. Louis Globe Democrat. Incidentally, Mrs. Hutchings, (2336 Tower Grove Avenue, St. Louis, Missouri) has written many articles for this journal. She is author of the book "Where Do We Go From Here?"

The Rose column concluded with this statement: "Either our concept of what we call the subconscious must be radically altered so as to include potencies of which we hitherto have had no knowledge or else some cause operating through, but not originating in the subconscious of Mrs. Curran must be acknowledged."

This statement is credited to the late Dr. Walter Franklin Prince, officer of the Boston Society for Psychic Research and can be found in his book, "The Case of Patience Worth," (out-of-print*) published by the society in 1929.

Not Mentioned

Articles on Spiritualism by Columnists are important. It's always the story behind the story for sometimes, as a result, seances are arranged. As proof—a story appeared several years ago in *Psychic Observer* with an account of a seance arranged for Danton Walker in the Hotel Taft, New York City. The medium was Frank Decker. Again I say that, to this day, Danton made no mention of this seance in his column. Rest assured that if he could have found anything wrong, he would have blasted the sordid news to all of his readers.

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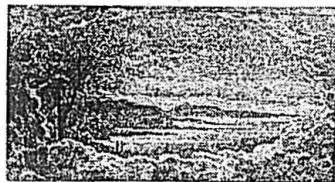


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AKIN

prominent men and women in many fields become initiated into seance room phenomena, they "freeze up" just as Danton did. This is caused by a certain something within each one . . . more like an urge to know about psychic things and the "freeze-up" occurs usually when they are confronted with positive evidence.

It is difficult for a mind of that type, a columnist's mind,

to immediately reorient its thinking. Rather they ponder over it. They seem to weigh the subject. They become confused and are confronted, through doubt and fear, with a myriad of questions.—Could it be true? Could I be wrong? Was I fooled? What will my colleagues say?

In other words, Spiritualism seems to be too much for the average "work-a-day souls" to comprehend. Intriguing, yes, but when the jolt of evidence hits them between the eyes, they sometimes run like a stoned dog or stand agast.

I shall never forget a statement made several years ago by one of Life magazine's feature story writers after having witnessed five seances in two days: "Pressing," he said, "I want to see no more. I am punch-drunk" . . . and that is usually what happens.

And so when certain types of minds are bowled over by irrefutable evidence, they either freeze-up or ask for some one to throw them a towel. It will ever be thus but when they ask for it, the job of all Spiritualists and Spiritualist mediums is to bend over backwards in an effort to present our case and then if they don't accept the fact that there is life after death, let them wait till they're dead.

For Twenty Years

Our Spirit friends, having discarded the physical body with all its human errors and limitations, are again in command of their spiritual perfection. And so, we usually can rely on the veracity of their statements and follow advice they may offer.

Therefore, contact with our Spirit friends and loved ones at the grand materializing seances given by Reverend James J. Dickson, is the beginning of real knowledge for us.

For about twenty years I have had the priceless guidance and knowledge of the truth about life both here and beyond the

grave from the Spirit World. This guidance and knowledge has been gained through the public materializing seances of Reverend Dickson at his Church, 2139 Grove St., San Francisco, and at private seances in his home at 2940 Nineteenth Avenue. These beautiful seances, where one can plainly see and speak with loved ones, are indeed rare privileges.

In Full Form

Rev. Dickson's cabinet guide, Minnie Brown, always superintends the seances and opens the meetings materialized in the form of a child. The Spirit loved ones materialize in full form, sometimes three or four at a time. They give their names and many speak as they did when on earth. They are usually willing to give full and complete answers regarding

the Spirit World and its activities, and tell us of life on other planets, earth's prehistoric and future civilizations, etc.

Years ago I was so distressed by a persistent cough affecting my small son, which had resisted treatment, that a seance was arranged with Rev. Dickson to see what should be done about it. My son's Spirit Guide materialized and told me in detail what had caused the cough and how to treat it. Within a short time after following her instructions he was well, the cough entirely gone. And by adhering to her advice he never had a recurrence of the complaint!

We Are Not Puppets

Another time our family became involved legally. Naturally, the loved ones were asked for counsel and they outlined the action for us to take. We followed their suggested course which was quite unorthodox and so surprised our opponents, that we were enabled to arrive at a simple solution of the matter, satisfactory to all.

It should be emphasized, however, that we earth mortals are not puppets manipulated by our Spirit World loved ones. Their loving help is always available, but we are here on earth for our own experience which must be the result of our own choices and decisions, as far as possible.

Rev. Dickson does not confine himself to the public seances at the Church or to the private meetings at his home. He is constantly called upon to give materializing seances to gatherings at various people's

homes. One of my greatest joys is to have a materializing seance in my home, where those gone before reunite with members of our family in old familiar surroundings!

Happiness—Our Heritage

At one of our home seances, about twenty loved ones materialized with eager enthusiasm, and spoke with the family. We were all affected and stimulated by the vibrations of pure joy that radiated that evening, the manifestations were so grand and overwhelming. There was no gloom, nothing somber, all of our Spirit friends were young, gay and happy. In fact they were so plain they showed themselves to be younger than many of us, although some had been very old when they passed into the Spirit World. All of our Spirit loved ones spoke of their great desire to help us to have the happiest earth life possible for "It is sunshine, not clouds, that make for a better life."

Another remarkable experience is to be invited, with four or five other people from the audience, into the Cabinet by the Cabinet Guide, to sit with Rev. Dickson at a public materializing seance. In the stillness of the cabinet you can see the materialization in operation as a Spirit unfolds its luminous form.

In the beginning just a small

spot on the floor. From this spot comes first the head, then the shoulders and arms, continuing to build in this manner until the Spirit stands in full form before your very eyes. The form steps through the curtain, gives its full name, is recognized, holds a conversation with its earth friend, then vanishes in the air.

I Wanted To Know

We watch Spirit after Spirit materialize until the Cabinet curtain is opened wide so that the audience may see Rev. Dickson, those sitting in the Cabinet with him and materialized Spirits, simultaneously. Surely such manifestations prove Eternal Life.

Today when so many dwell in fear of atom bombs that may come, I can feel the strong vibrations of comfort which freed me from terror during World War II. Here in the West we heard by radio, and read in our newspapers, about the attempt of an enemy submarine on our coast near Santa Barbara, and of some kind of bombs which fell in Oregon.

Fearing San Francisco might be shelled or bombed I wanted to move, with my family, away from this area. I arranged for a private materializing seance with Rev. Dickson, however, and the Guides calmed my fears by giving me assurance that if danger was imminent they would give warning in time for us to get away. I went home knowing they would keep their word, and continued to rest securely on their promise until the end of the War.

Deals With Human Problems

This love and care of the Spirit World exists for everyone—there are no favored few. Not a day passes without some tangible evidence of the help and presence of my Spirit friends but were it not for the wonderful materializing seances of Rev. Dickson, where I can see and speak with them, much of the significance would be lost.

The contributions of the Spirit World, however, are not confined solely to the solving of

human problems. Our Spirit friends are actively working in the realms of art, music, theater, science, invention, etc., giving impressions and advice to all who are aiding in the construction of a better world.

But, their work in behalf of art, for instance, is more able to be appreciated when concrete evidence is tangible such as the beautiful independent colored slate drawings done without human hands in broad daylight, by Juanita, Spirit Artist Guide of Rev. Some time ago I was invited by a member of Rev. Dickson's Church, The Spiritualist Church of Revelation, Inc., to spend an evening at her home. I accepted the invitation and on that evening was one of a large group composed of doctors, attorneys, educators, other professional and business people.

When all of the guests had assembled, our hostess said she had asked Rev. Dickson if he would sit in her home at a social evening for a Spirit Dance and he had agreed, and that was what she had planned for the evening. Those of us familiar with a Spirit Dance were delighted.

While Rev. Dickson talked for a few moments about materialization and the Spirit

Dance manifestations, two of the men guests stretched a curtain across one corner of the very large living room to make a Cabinet. When the Cabinet was ready and the lights softened, Rev. Dickson took his place behind the curtain and immediately the Spirit, Minnie Brown, parted the curtains and stood materialized before us.

A Spirit Described

She appeared as a seven-year-old child showing her curly hair as she walked about the room greeting the guests who were sitting in a semi-circle three rows deep from the corner Cabinet. Because of the nature of the manifestation, quite a large space was required between the assembly and the curtain.

After Minnie returned to the Cabinet the first Spirit dancer appeared. It was a slender young woman dressed in a gown of pale pink. The bodice was form-fitting with narrow shoulder straps, while the skirt was quite full, made in three tiers or flounces, each one banded in a design of brilliants which flashed as she whirled and swayed to soft background music.

Indians Materialize

The exquisite grace with which she executed the pattern of the dance surpassed that of a finished ballet dancer. On completion of her number she bowed very low and then disappeared into the Cabinet.

Minnie then announced that the next dance would be an Indian War Dance. Scarcely had she finished speaking when a magnificent, tall Indian Chief with large dark eyes and clear-cut harmonious features stepped through the curtain. Keeping time to soft Indian music, he stamped slowly away from the curtain, followed by a second Chief, who in turn was followed by a third!

The Chiefs serpentine across the floor bending forward from the waist and then straightening heads thrown up and back repeating these motions over and over. The lead-

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er wore an elongated feather headdress from which hung feather ornaments of different lengths the longest of which brushed the fringed epaulets on the shoulders of his buckskin jacket. Fringe and beadwork also ornamented the edges of his sleeves and trousers.

How Indians Materialize

On his left arm he carried a war shield painted with the figures of a turtle bird pony and snake and his right hand held a spear trimmed with fringe along its entire length. The second Chief wore a wide feather headdress attached to a headband covered with white feathery down. Long down-covered panels flapped against his face as he danced. He wore buckskin trousers and a sleeveless jacket. Thick fringe about eight inches long covered his upper arms.

He, too, carried a shield and spear. The third Indian wore a plain band around his head which held six feathers. He wore only trousers so that as he danced his perfectly proportioned body could be seen as it gleamed in the subdued light. When the Chiefs finished their dance back into the Cabinet they filed Indian fashion.

Dematerialization Seen

When the last Indian had vanished, Minnie Brown parted the curtains and said the dance to follow was called "The Passing of a Soul". Then through the curtain came an Indian Squaw dressed in pure white fringed buckskin. Slowly, in her small white moccasins she moved from one side of the dancing area to the other holding her arms and swaying from side to side, apparently, in anguish.

Finally, she faced the audience and slowly, slowly sank to

the floor on her knees. Then clasping her beautiful hands together, she rocked from side to side and back and forth. From the kneeling position she leaned closer and closer to the floor until she vanished from

our sight

A prehistoric Grecian number followed, enacted by two departed loved ones of members of Rev. Dickson's Church sitting in the audience. Simultaneously they stepped from the

Cabinet dressed in identical purple robes trimmed in gold. Their demonstration consisted of assuming classical poses or attitudes, rather than actual dancing. In poses they appeared as lifesize paintings against the dark backdrop of the curtain, while in others where the light gave more roundness to their forms, they appeared as though sculptured in marble.

Seance Lasted Two Hours

One of the last dances was executed by an ancient Egyptian Princess wearing a sheath-like costume with floating panels which stood out horizontally as she spiralled swiftly before us. Her close-fitting headdress of feathers was trimmed on each side with birds' wings. Just before the exotic Princess concluded her dance, the Spirit form of a large man stepped from the Cabinet, and when the dance ended, he held the curtain open so that she might enter. He followed.

For about two hours we watched this marvelous spectacle until Minnie Brown concluded the Spirit Dance with one of her own. She finally closed the seance with a beautiful Spirit song in the sweet voice of a child.

No Human Achievement

It was colorful! It was gorgeous! There was never a sound of dancing feet, the rustle of garments or the tinkling of bracelets. The stillness was profound. Only the soft music to which they danced broke the silence. Long after the seance closed we sat, enchanted, our souls thrilled with ecstatic rapture. It was agreed that although earthly performances might reach the heights, no human achievement could surpass the Spirit Dance we had just witnessed.

as far as England is concerned, has failed. The Conservatives will be returned to power.

The necessity for proper evaluation in currency occurs in mid-summer. It will help to stabilize floundering England. This nation, in time, will become an armed fortress. The monarchy is reaching its end. Nature is preparing a different pattern. Changes will come. Changes will be received unwillingly, but the cavalcade of generations will benefit.

Think well those words, and analyze them carefully. It is not an ambiguous expression. Remember if you can develop the consciousness of serenity, no power on earth can destroy our outlook, or cause you individually to swerve

At the time of this experience I was floundering around in regard to religion, unable to believe what I had been taught and unable to throw God out of my life. For ten days I had been ill. Now I knew that wasn't possible. My soul was gradually withdrawing from my body. Then, I thought happily the soul must be that part of one which thinks, for my mind had never been clearer.

Free at last, I found there was an odd sort of sight, at no one point but awareness of the all-around. The atmosphere was a hazy shimmery pink and I floated in it with ease. It was most pleasant. And yet I hadn't departed to any definite place for I still heard the organ music coming from the radio and was aware of my son playing in a corner of the room. It was as if the roof were lifted and I could look down into the house. Time had ceased to exist.

I thought, I'm awfully young to die and it isn't fair to my family to leave them now. But I didn't want to go back to that sick body. I had achieved such perfect rest how could they ask me to return? I turned my attention back to the newness (Continued Page 24, Col. 1)

SPAIN

Spain will come into the arena of activity in the next three years. You will find a definite recognition and financial support directed toward that country from the United States of America. A definite, or shall we say a blanket recognition of its present state of government is assured. There is the danger of earth shocks wiping out large areas. Those are circumstances that are unavoidable and cannot be controlled. As in the past years again we sound the warning—America guard carefully your waterways. The Panama zone may reveal a network of spy espionage that will startle the American people when they read the facts of intrigue.

Again we say guard well the Dardanelles and the Suez for attempts will be made to blast those Waterways.

Shipping—those areas will come under acute conditions during summer months. American shipping will be fired on as in the past. These remain incidents. Everything possible that can be done to antagonize a nation will be done at the latter part of 1950. - However, as we have already expressed it, it would appear that under those particular vibrations it is the leadership of individuals who will be able to eradicate the tensify.

UNITED STATES

Returning back to your own Nation, there is a movement on the way to enforce Prohibition. It will become a volatile issue. Your coming election in 1952 will find this a controversial issue. You are the pivot point. All other things evolve about you. Circumstances that will catapult you into whereby it becomes necessary to revamp your currency structure after 1952 are not the direct results of anything in America, but of worldwide collapse.

Nations are now being kept going by the help of cash, the borrowing capacity reaches an apex—then the collapse. It is not a pretty picture but it has happened again and again throughout civilization, and beyond your times it will happen again.

Therefore, as I take leave of you build spiritually your hopes on a strong foundation. In the words of the Master "I build my bridge upon this rock," I say unto you, "I build my faith upon this rock, and all the world shall not assail against me."

Arthur Ford's New York appearance, lecture and clairvoyance, was reported in *Psychic Observer*, Nov. 25th, by Lee Jarnigan. Apparent discrepancies in her report were pointed out by Ruth MacRobert of Larchmont, N. Y., in *Psychic Observer*, January 10th issue.

Mrs. MacRobert took exception to the way her suggestions were handled in this column, and now one of our readers, Marjorie (Mrs. Frank) Ralston, R.F.D. No 1, Little Falls, New Jersey, has taken exception to the fact that Mrs. MacRobert presumed to find fault with the editor in the first place.

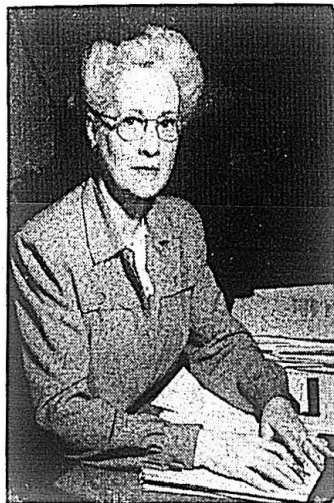
Mrs. Ralston's letter reads: "In reference to Ruth MacRobert's concern over the distress of persons reading Mr. Jarnigan's reporting of the Ford lecture.

"Mrs. MacRobert states: 'Because of Mrs. Terhune's prominence I feel you should be reminded of the facts, which, if not meticulously followed may give the Spiritualist press a poor reputation. . . With all due respect to Mrs. Terhune and with full recognition of her justly established prominence, the implication that had Mary Jones or John Smith been involved, the resultant distress would not be so acute. The point in question, one of inaccurate reporting—regrettable though that was—being thereby modified, might we not further modify it by considering the overall value of Mr. Jarnigan's article. In so doing, why not consider the best rather than, as Mrs. MacRobert did, 'skipping over the most to consider the worst.'"

"Mr. Jarnigan is a young newcomer. I have watched him work on several occasions and listened to him discuss many subjects. Those of us who have been privileged to incorporate into our thinking the blessed 'facts brought forward by the Spiritualists and developed to

their full by the metapsychists' (Prof. Richet, 'Light', Oct. 8, 1927) recognize and honor true mediumship wherever found, whether manifested through a trained intellect of an illiterate. However, we also recognize how sorely, from a Public Relations stand-point, we need persons of young Jarnigan's type as platform workers. May we not, then, give tolerant understanding and support to his overall reporting of a splendid lecture and not focus attention upon one inaccuracy.

"The following is not related to the matter of reporting but may help reduce the significance of that one incorrectly reported item. I had persuaded a friend who had lost her husband almost two years previously to hear Ford lecture. Up to that time, the idea of the actual sur-

vival of personal identity and individual memory had been meaningless to her. She was still in a state of self-absorbed grief, under a Doctor's care, and a source of anxiety to her daughter. Last Christmas I received a card from the daughter (*Psychic Observer* file) who says: 'Thank you so much for making Mother look at things in a different light.'

"The fact that Ford stated a dog, which had died two days previously, was still alive and Mr. Jarnigan misunderstood or misrepresented that statement, to me somehow loses consequence as compared with leading a woman's mind out of two years of torment into its first step in spiritual stability.

"Accuracy is to be desired, of course. Appreciation of spiritual content is even finer; and we might even be grateful for a lecture to be reported and a paper in which it would be published."

Dunninger in Contempt

OCCULT DICTIONARY

By JOHN BOONE ROMISER

ADEPT. One who has attained to spiritual power and understands the secret doctrines that concern the origin and destiny of mankind.

ALCHEMY. The chemistry of nature. The primary assumption is that there exists a universal solvent by which all atomic elements can be transformed into their original substance. The main object of alchemists in the past was to discover a process by which gross metals could be transmuted into gold. In addition to being an expert chemist, the alchemist also was supposed to have psychic perception. This description applies rather accurately to the inventive genius of modern scientists who specialize in atomic power.

ANIMA MUNDI. "Soul of the world." All-connecting consciousness, or the divine essence which is everywhere, permeating and animating everything in nature. The occult lore is that all sentient life is fused, blended, and unified by Anima Mundi; and that in reality there is no such thing as separateness. Radio-activity is a symbol of this principle in action.

ASTRAL BODY: A replica of the physical body, but more subtle and tenuous. The astral body penetrates every nerve, fiber, and cell of the physical organism. It is constantly in a supersensitive state of oscillation and pulsation. The psychic faculty is within the astral body which is extremely impressionable to extra-sensory vibration.

ASTRAL LIGHT. The invisible region that surrounds the Earth. It cannot be perceived except by those who are psychically developed. Within its realm every condition, event, or circumstance of the past, present and future is recorded. It is called the "great terrestrial crucible" into which everything is resolved and perpetuated. The psychically gifted behold there, in panoramic detail, the histories of nations and individuals. They can reveal coming events by what they see mirrored on the astral screen.

ASTRAL PROJECTION. The astral body separated, partially or fully, from the physical body and visiting another locality, near or far. This occurs when you are asleep. As a general rule, you do not recall the experience on awakening. Some dreams, however, are the result of such travel episodes. An adept can command his astral body to go any place he desires, for the purpose of making observations, investigations, and acquiring essential information.

AURA. A psychic affluvia that emanates from human, and animal bodies as well as inanimate objects. It is composed of electro-vital and electro-mental magnetism, surrounding that of which it partakes like an envelope. It is visible only to the psychic. The aura is frequently multi-colored, or brilliant. Or it can be dull, according to the character or quality of the person or thing. To the seer the aura of a person is an index to the hidden propensities.

CLAIRAUDIENCE. The psychic ability to hear sounds or voices regardless of distance.

CLAIRSENTIENCE. Psychic sensitivity whether is is a "hunch" or "that peculiar feeling that something is going to happen." Almost everyone possesses intuitive clair-sentience to some degree.

CLAIRVOYANCE. The faculty of seeing with the inner or psychic eye through the densest material. Past, present, and future time is telescoped to the clairvoyant to whom each vision is revealed by astral light.

EGO. Your conscious feeling of "I am I." In academic psychology the ego is synonymous with the mind. Occult philosophies claim that there are two egos, one identified with mortal personality. The other is of divine, indestructible origin.

ESOTERIC. Secret knowledge not accessible to the uninitiated. When such information is published, it ceases to be esoteric and becomes exoteric. This means that the facts have become the property of the rest of humanity.

FOURTH DIMENSION. Everything you see has length, breadth, and thickness. But in the Astral Light an object is seen in its entirety, including the inside. The fourth dimension, therefore, is the sum of the other three.

HYPNOTISM. The process by which a person of strong will power submerges another of weaker resistance into a trance-like state. Then, by a series of suggestions, the hypnotist can direct the other to do almost anything. For a time hypnotism fell into disrepute because it was practiced by the unscrupulous.

MAGIC. The hidden mysteries of nature. Magic is of two classes: Black and White. White Magic is exercised for a beneficent, helpful purpose. Black Magic is the abuse of super-normal powers for selfishness and greed. It is dangerous, and might result in evil reactions. White Magic remains pure and undefiled.

MAGNETISM. Elemental electricity which creates power of attraction and polarity. Almost every person and object has magnetic attraction.

MESMERISM. A coined word derived from Mesmer who

lived in the Eighteenth Century. He was a physician who applied psychic magnetism in the treatment of diseases.

MONAD. Nature's pattern for each species. It shows the difference in basic molds, which produce contrasting characteristics, such as appear for instance in corn and ivy, spiders and butterflies, dogs and elephants, baboons and humans.

OCCULTISM. The science of perfected living. It explains the brotherhood of sentient beings and the triumph of natural laws over human mismanagement.

PANTHEISM. Deity in nature. The Greeks worshipped the faultlessly contoured human body. In Roman days, the deity was represented in the grandeur of pastoral scenes. Modern pantheism is electricity, the universal agent that accelerates humanity's progress.

PHENOMENON. A cosmic, chemical, or psychic impulse which is experienced by those who are able to tune in on Nature's more sensitive forces.

PHILOSOPHER'S STONE. The power by which all life evolves, and through which all minds and all souls realize their mutual kinship. This term is often erroneously associated with spectacular alchemy. Actually it signifies the highest aspirations and the purest ideologies of altruism.

PROPHECY. The ability to foresee the future. Anyone who is able to prophesy accurately must be psychically equipped to read the records in the Astral Light. When there is faulty interpretation, it is not the Astral Light which is at fault but the adept who is temporarily out of tune with the vibratory beams.

PSYCHOMETRY. The ability to weigh or determine psychically the qualities of inanimate objects such as metals, textiles, antiques or potentially active chemicals. Psychometry may be defined as reading the "memory" or innate powers of material things.

PSYCHOPHOBIA. Fear of the unseen. Literally, a horror of destiny. Many materialists possess this phobia.

SOLOMON'S SEAL. The double triangle, the angles of which form the six-pointed Star. The apex of the emblem represents the human head or intelligence. The two-upper outstretched points of the symbol suggest human feeling or sympathy with everything that lives, moves and has its being. The two lower extremities signify human responsibility and substantiality. The angle below these, pointing earthward, represents procreative power. This cryptograph denotes the human being.

SOLOMON'S TEMPLE. The human body developed by divine principle.

SYMBOLS. Pictorial representation of thoughts and ideas. Some psychic impressions are received in the form of symbols, especially in the dream state. For example, fish or eggs signify money, and a horse denotes friendship.

TELEPATHY. Silent transmissions of thoughts from one mind to another. This may occur at close range or over a long distance, if two minds are in attunement or affinity.

VIBRATIONS. Magnetic waves that permeate the Astral Light, Psychic pulsations. Everyone is constantly affected by vibrations. They serve as direct agents of Nature's Laws.

The book, 7½x10 inches, is 2 inches thick. It has a stiff red binding and the print is just the proper size.

Among the activities of the convention was a large and successful public meeting at which messages were given by the Revs. Parker, Tindall, Argoe, Pinkney and Fourton. times and in the spring of 1943 was elected President of the Church. She received her first orders back in 1933 and was fully ordained in 1936. Following the death of the founder, Rev. Parker continued to hold services at 123 West 88th Street, and at Carnegie Hall.

Another branch of the Mother Church is in Washington, D. C., supervised by Rev. Alice Tindall, whose New York contacts with the Ecclesiastical Council and Mother

In this way, the literature can be given away to those who need it most. Furthermore, when the congregation finds that this literature is being distributed, they will be eager to contribute dollars instead of dimes and nickels every Sunday. Many orthodox churches have found this method works and for this reason, their literature is found on buses, in waiting rooms and on their own church literature stands—free for the asking.

The expression, "play ball," synonymous with the great national past time, has been used in every field — business, politics, etc., and it is true as associated with Spiritualist churches. The game can only be won by cooperation and team-work.

In all fields of sport, and it is fun to help a good cause, there are naturally those who stand out,

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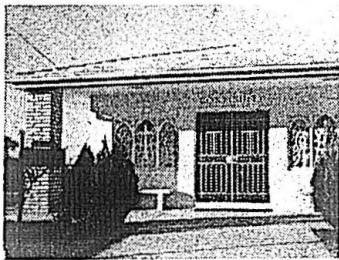

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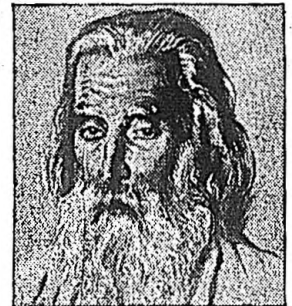
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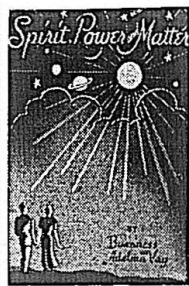
