MANY PEOPLE ASK:

"What does a medium think and do when he is confronted by a skeptic he realizes is out to expose him ?"

THIS STORY TELLS YOU

Rev. Ernst A. Schoenfeld, assistant pastor of the Church of the Spirit in Chicago, has answered that question for the *Psychic Observer* in a dramatic letter, which tells how he reacted to the visits of Norma Lee Browning of the Chicago Tribune.

He did not know at the time, of course, that he was on her list of "fakes and charlatans" whom she was supposed to expose for the Trib. But he soon sensed her true purpose, and the result was not an expose for her newspaper (at least. as far as he was concerned), but her remarkable "confession" in the last issue of the *Psychic Observer*; namely, that he had told her things that even her best friends did not know.

Mediumship Sacred

She went to him a confident skeptic but came away dazed and mystified. In spite of her denials of all that Rev Schoenfeld told her, she now admits that everything he said was true, and as her story showed, she was immeasurably impressed.

Here is what Rev. Schoenfeld has to say about his encounter with her:

"As a rule I do not read forstrangers unless I have contacted the person that has recommended them and they have a sincere problem. "My mediumship is very sacred to me, and I will not use it as a source of entertainment for phenomenon seekers: neither will I permit myself to act in the capacity of personal advisor to material fortune hunters. and I definitely have no intentions to compete against Dorothy Dix."

"I Heard the Voice"

"As I recall it, Miss Browning (I did not know her name at the time; in fact, it was never made known to me prior to your letter of May 30th) called me in the early afternoon for an immediate appointment.

"For reasons best known to my own Spirit Teachers I was strongly impressed to grant her request. As she stated herself, she did report within an hour from the time she called. Immediately after she entered my study and had herself comfortably seated in a large wicker chair, I sensed her intentions and wanted to inform her of her mission, but for some reason or other could not do it, which, as friends tell me, is not at all like me.

"It was, while pacing the floor as she puts it, I heard the spirit voice of my father calling me by my nickname, saying, 'No, don't do that; we will support you,' and almost at the same time my controling guide. Chief Many Feathers, appeared and with his usual stern look said:

" 'The lady stays; I want you to talk to her for us.'

"Well, she did stay, I would say, for about an hour and a half. It was an ordeal I could never forget. She denied everything I received, both clairvoyantly and clairaudiently.

"I remember several times I wanted to scream 'LIAR,' but she was a lady, and I did not intend to sacrifice my reputation as a Spiritualist Minister by acting ungentlemanly. I felt it was not only my own, but the reputation of all honest mediums and the high regard and respect which Modern Spiritualism has attained in its first century that were at stake, and I, then and there, resolved to defend it at any cost and with the only weapon I have, my God-given faculty, Mediumship.

"Under All Circumstances . ."

"I confess that several times during the reading I had to lean heavily on the Magic Staff of Andrew Jackson Davis, "Under all circumstances keep an even mind," and I am deeply grateful to the World of Spirit, who, in spite of all this material opposition, did not fail me.

"I do not give trance readings to strangers, and at no time do I hold seances in total darkness. Miss Browning's invitation from me to return the next day for a trance reading was the request of my control Many Feathers, who, just before the close of this strenuous session, in a rather harsh and almost angry voice, said. 'Invite the lady to come back tomorrow. I want to talk to her myself'

"Well, she did come back. What happened at the time is her own story. I served only as the mediator for the world of spirit, and have no recollection of what transpired.

"I Am Grateful"

"As I recall it, my reason for not accepting a fee from her for the first visit, she said she was sorry that she could not recognize or place anything I said. That being the case, I played my hand the same way and told her, 'As long as I have not been of any service to you I do not feel that I am entitled to a fee.'

"I am grateful to Miss Browning for her final frank and true account of what transpired while sitting with a Spiritualist Medium, and sincerely pray that by now she fully realizes that the National Spiritualist Association can proudly boast of hundreds of honest and sincere mediums whose fidelity and integrity is beyond reproach.

"Yes, confession is good for the soul. I am sure Miss Browning is aware of the fact that before one can have a counterfeit imposter or faker of the type she was looking for, one must first have a 'GENUINE.'

"May God bless her and may she attain the highest heights of Spiritual progression in her search for truth (that) is my prayer."

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

Germany's Outstanding Psychics and Mediums

A recent issue of Psychic Observer described the progress Spiritualism was making in Japan. Many wondered why we would go out of our way to explain conditions in this country but our readers are well aware of the fact that we do not make the news, we merely print it and so as a follow-up of this series, it will be of great interest to many to have an opportunity to read how Spiritualism is faring in Germany.

In order to present factual data, it was necessary to seek out a prominent representative of Spiritualism in that country. The information furnished in this article was received from Edmund Ad Hesse, who founded the first spiritual society in Germany after the war. The headquarters are: Hannover-Kirchrode, Rutenbergstr 23, Land Nledersachsen Britische-Zone Deutschland.

The organization has private groups in many towns.

Writings Intercede

Mr. Hesse receives very little publicity, but all organization of the movement goes through his hands. Together with Anni Johanna Fischer he is active day and night preparing the suppositions for the spreading of Spiritualism in Germany. He has united German Spiritualists into a society for scientific research, founded homecircles, discovered good mediums, published "roundhands" (periodical writings named "Interne Mitteilungen") which were the first Spiritualist prints.

The Germans are indebted to Mr. Hesse for his initiative in

founding the first Spiritualist library, free to all who desire reading material of this kind and also for his work which resulted in connecting the German Spiritualists with other countries after the war.

All of his writings openly intercede for Spiritualism, in spite of all the difficulties presented by his opponents, and these writings are used by the German Broadcasting system. He sends out thousands of letters to those seeking comfort, advice and help.

Modest Beginning

The following brief biographies of mediums were submitted by Mr. Hesse: Anni Johanna Fischer was one of the founders of the first Spiritualistic league which was permitted to organize by the Military Government of Germany after being prohibited during the reign of Nazism. She is now head of the administrative department

and one of the chairmen of this league.

The "Gesellschaft fuer wissentschaftlichen Spiritismus" (League for Scientific Spiritualism) is a member of the I. S. F., London.

The development of the league has made a steady progress from its modest beginning in spite of all difficulties and obstacles. This is mainly due to Frau Fischer's superior executive abilities, her untiring enthusiasm and to her unselfishness. She is a professional newspaper executive and every minute she is able to spare — usually the late night hours - are dedicated to the fight for Spiritualistic truth. She is always of useful assistance to all people that come to her for advice and besides handles the vast correspondence of the league.

War Experiences

This noble pioneer for Spiritualism has made a name for herself among friends as well as foes in public discussions where she is known for her seasoned quickness of repartee and for her convincing arguments. Her address is Hannover-Kirchrode, Grober Hillen (8). Deutschland.

Joachim Winckelmann comes from a family of publishers and booksellers in the Rhineland. Since his earliest boyhood, he has shown a deep interest for occultism. His first great experience occurred during World War I. He studied natural sciences in Berlin and Rostock, majoring in chemistry and

physics and getting credit for such subjects as mathematics, biology and astronomy.

Winckelmann has Herr known all great German mediums and many from other countries since the beginning of the century. He made scientific tests with various psychics in order to examine the nature of the ectoplasm, getting interesting and positive results. Two books with occult short novels by Winckelmann are going to be published later this year. Due to his high sensitivity, he has many clairvoyant and other transcendental experiences.

Rare Mediumship

He describes his own experiences, his practical knowledge and his perceptions in this book "Der Weg Nach drueben" (The Road to the Realm of Spirits) which was banned by the Nazis but has been republished in a new edition. Joachim Winckelmann is a conspicuous contributor to the Gesellschaft fuer wissentschaftlichen Spiritmus,

Auguste Oberdieck is one of the best known language and deep-trance mediums being extremely sensitive and having the experiences of several decades. The messages that she has transmitted from other planes are on an extraordinarily high level. Furthermore, she is able to retrieve stones, precious and semi-precious ones. like the well known retrieving medium, the late Heinrich Melzer. So far Auguste Oberdieck has retrieved approximately 300 stones.

Spiritual Healing

During the reign of the Nazis, she was continually persecuted by the government. She was grilled by the Gestapo several times, however, she survived all this terror thanks to the allembracing protection given to her by higher spirits. She is now among the chosen mediums that have given themselves to serve the cause.

Willy Kaiser who is shunning all publicity and whose name is not mentioned in the press but is repeated respectfully by a great many people is a psychical and spiritual healer living on 27 Kurze Keismar Strasse, a narrow little street in Gottingen. The orthodox medical faculty has ignored him but those people that he has cured are full of praise.

Sight Restored

Herr Kaiser does not practice his healing professionally but during his spare time as he is not able to obtain a license. Sick people with all kinds of ailments who have been given up as hopeless and incurable cases by professional physicians come to him in the evening throughout the week and on Sundays. There is proven evidence that Kaiser has restored the sight of blind men and that he has cured others that were suffering from paralysis. He possesses very intensively radiating °and penetrating healing powers. He is also one of the best contemporary mediums in present Germany and an irreplacable contributor to the Gesellschaft Juer wissentschaftlichen Spiritismus.

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paigners for Spiritualism in Germany. He was born in Prague but has lived in Wurttemberg since his early childhood. Schwarz studied mechanical engineering and economics and has been seriously interested in Spiritualism and occultism for 25 years. He is also an authority on anthroposophy.

Spiritualism Defended

Besides being a Spiritualist, like Sir Conan Doyle, is the author of detective stories under the pen name of Ralph Black. Herr Schwarz likes to defend Spiritualism against the charges made by the German press and to answer them with barbed replies. He is thoroughly familiar with his branch of knowledge and an excellent writer. His articles are regularly printed in the periodical "Okkulte Welt" (Occult World) and his book "Die Geisterwelt ist nicht verschlossen" (The Realm of Spirits Has No Closed Doors) the first postwar publication of its kind in Germany, was published recently. A spiritualistic novel "Sommerland" (Summerland) is being completed. Dr. Rudolf Schwarz lives in the little village of Erkenbrechtsweiler in Wurttemberg.

JACOBY, Alice Middlemas (85), of Leominster, Massachusetts and Glendale, California, passed away July 1st. Services were held in the city of Dunkirk, New York. The Rev. Hazel Iris Day officiated. Cremation in Buffalo followed. For the Past 35 years, Mrs. Jacoby, as Alice Middlemas, has served the cause of Spiritualism. She attended the International Congresses, London, 1928, the Hague, Holland, 1931; married Samuel Jacoby (1938) and after an extended tour through Europe, resided in Boston, Massachusetts. What's In A Name?

It is high time Spiritualists ceased to like having their heads patted by those who write jubilantly of some psychic experience, as if it was a golden revelation, which of course it is to them, and ending the recital with: "I AM NOT A SPIRITUALIST."

Several years ago, I was rereading my copy of "To Have and To Hold," the romantic swashbuckling tale which has its setting in Jamestown, Virginia, the first successful British colony to be established in America in 1607. My book is copyrighted in 1899 and 1900 by Mary Johnston and in 1900 by Houghton, Mifflin & Co. It is of the three hundred and twenty-seven thousandth edition. Mary Johnson, born in 1870 died in 1936.

Patience Worth

The tale is illuminative in pioneer detail and historically inspiring. In an unexpected way, as the story of the heroine unfolds, the brideship coming in with its treasure of wives for the young settlers, and there is one high-born lady, persecuted in England, admitting to a man who she is to marry for security: "To what name upon the ship's list do you answer?"

"Patience Worth," she replied.

That is on page 24. Again, page 35: "I had a waiting woman named Patience Worth." Again, Page 160: "You married not the Lady Jocelyn Leigh, but a waiting woman named Patience Worth."

Patience Worth of the Curran-Hutchings production identifies herself with the Stuarts. The reigning king of the time of Jamestown in James City, county, Virginia, was James I of England and the VI of Scotland. The Charles I and II Stuarts came a little later. Thus far, historical narrative and fictional assumption agree.

Now that is the preface to an outstanding fact in the strange manifestation of Patience Worth, the charming woman, spirit, fused with the mentalities and latent gifts of two charming human beings. The fact, as far as public avowal is concerned, is that of all the multitude of reviewers, critics, believers, scoffers, not one has discovered the original name of Patience Worth in the novel of fifty years ago.

The woman through whose unfolded powers the personality manifested probably had read

the popular book. The title might have intrigued and clung to subconscious memory and quite honestly have come to renewed life in the ouija board. Or the spirit being human though beyond mortality, may have liked the name and so assumed it for convenience.

Researchers By-pass

As a facet of this glittering diamond of revelation, the name does not matter. Save as an instance of how "researchers" can bypass what might be a leading contribution to their research. Which is, to illus-

trate our contention that while in communication the name is desirable like an oiled key in a rusty lock, it is the intelligence directing the key which matters. It is the substance of the things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen which really matters. Not the signature of the highest angel could enhance the wisdom and beauty of the writing of Patience Worth. The poetry is frequently so subtle, so delicate, one must read it often to feel the perfume blow over one's face and into one's heart.

Emily Grant Hutchings

According to the publication of the psychic revelation, there were at least two years of steady practice with the board before the coming of Patience Worth. Undoubtedly, both women contributed to the marvel, and though it crystalized in Pearl Curran, Mrs. Hutchings has not lost. Her own literary gifts would not be sacrificed to the gain wholly of another, neither in fame nor honor nor gold. That is not the way of heaven. At any rate, Pearl Curran now knows in the Other World the secret of And Emily Patience Worth. Grant Hutchings perhaps knows within her inmost heart the goldenness of a bloom more slowly opening and whose substance is of the finer fabric of her soul.

But ask Mr. Yost or Mr. Prince (if he be here) or the ghost of Dr. James H. Hyslop or the minds of any of the men of God who analyzed, dissected, loved or anathematized Patience Worth. After all, what's in a name?

because about one year after the appearance of Patience Worth and under similar inviting conditions, a like experience befell me. In the west room upstairs, looking out to where the white lilacs and snowballs and syringes and hawthorns come early in the spring, where the red berries attract the homing birds in the autumn days, on a fall day, suddenly, while sitting at the typewriter, there came words I did not know, a form of English not mine.

Shining Frontier


There was a woman out of the frame of the shadows leaning toward me, a man's hand with a peculiar ring reaching toward me, a mist as of many centuries rising between me and practicality. They are alone on the slant of the hill which leads from the valley of the shadow to the shining frontier of the Afterwhile

The next morning, suddenly, I wrote a poem altogether unlike any I had written. And then, progressively, as by a plan; came the introduction of two personalities. For 36 years, a man and a woman have writtcn_and spoken an archaic language, the extensive vocabulary authenticated by laborious research, the words frequently automatically written, else I would not know where to make research.

They purport to be of the seventeenth century, of England. The language of the woman has no trace of Latinity, rarely of Anglo-Saxon. The man's language is scholarly with indicated acquaintance with Latin, French, Italian, The words of both invariably trace to middle English, sometimes to Old French, back to the Middle English, a blend of Scotch and English.

We have experimented as to the spontaniety of the production, asking that something be said with words beginning with a certain letter and which we have never had. 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to the same idea or information, given in another form, as "faden" to "vaden." Once, I asked why that was. "Because it sifts to my tongue." Between the Anglos and the Normans, there was a change. The literary value to me has been incalculable, amplifying knowledge of my own English.

Natural Aptitude

The woman who is known as Prudence is predominant in the demonstration. The personality is fascinating, witty, caustic, strictly truthful and gay. Never in all these years of heavenly companionship has there been any preachment but that of love and truth and fair dealing. Clairvovantly, I have seen the exquisite beauty of her and her gowning, the inimitable grace. She seldom makes mistakes.

Trying to get to the heart of this manifestation, I have analyzed myself. I have a natural aptitude for language but my dominant and lifelong interest is music. And while there are poetical and musical references, Prudence shows a peculiar resentment of my interest in music. I am not a professional medium and have chosen my seances for intelligence and genuine psychic interest.

Dull Side of Life

A stranger calling and asking for a "reading" and I refusing for prudential reasons as I usually do, the voice of this dearly beloved will blithely begin talking to this person I have never seen. And, as happened not long ago, the woman answering: "Oh, that is what I want. Oh, praise God! Oh, I do thank you."

And for me on this dull side of life, only to say in my heart, a prayer of gratitude for this incomparable blessing.

And I think perhaps along with the wonder of many things which are happening physically, there may be a concerted effort to bring not only proof of survival but of the glorification of human abilities come to their ultimate in the heavenly kingdom.


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

Spiritualism Overflows Its Banks

If the so-called "Orthodox" were frank and fearless, it would not be long until just about all of us would be convinced on the continuity of life and the reality of spirit communication.

I have just talked with a hard-headed business man from the Old Country. He is not a religious person and seems to have no definite views as to an after-life — certainly no connection with the Spiritualist philosophy. He was for years' a banker and did business literally in four or five languages on the continent.

This gentleman took part in the first world war, in which the episode of the psychic to which I am leading took place. He was associated, as a Frenchman, with Herbert Hoover in his grand plan of feeding the starving after the armistice had been signed. He is now resident in this country—a sound, highly intelligent and straightshooting person of the old school.

He told me of being accused of complicity in some military adventure and of lying to a higher officer.

"You are a liar," he cried out to the officer when he accused him falsely. He was taken from the ranks and placed in military prison — something that hurt him deeply, as he was and is a man without guile, and as honest as rain.

"At the moment I was imprisoned," he told me, "my father, who was a hundred and fifty miles away, suddenly started up and said to my mother, 'Son is in trouble'!"

I wish some of these dear souls who have discovered there is a way of return had been alert to the great value — or the negligible value of a name in that strange door of some souls here which opens to the whispering of life and remembrance and everlasting love, and men and women and children not angels, but glorified humanity. to write their question and send it forward to the dais.

Positive Evidence

"Are you crippled?" she asked addressing her by her name, through the medium. She was surprised at this startling query, as she said she had "never been crippled" in her life.

"How about the second-toe on your left foot?" was asked, mediumistically. Then she recalled that at least forty years ago, when she was a little girl, she had severely injured this toe, while barefoot, and paddling around in a small swimming hole. She struck the member against a rock, doubling it under her foot and breaking the nail, causing pain at the time — but since then, absolutely forgotten.

"Now, remember," she was saying to me, "My mother, who died a short time after this small injury of mine, was the only person on earth who knew of the accident."

It was this to which she was now referring as a "crippled" condition! This small and personal incident was used no doubt in order that the mother might dig up something out of the actual past that would prove evidential.

Later on, according to this Florida woman's story, she again attended a seance-meeting with the same medium. This time she sent forward some question, the nature of which

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I do not recall-and it is not germane to the story.

"When the medium came to my question" she told me, "she cried out, 'I feel aflame! I feel cold! I'm burning hot, and then I'm freezing! Has some one in the audience had a fire in their ice-box?"

That was a poser! Fire in an ice-box! Did you ever hear of anything so unlikely?

Not a Heritage

The narrator explained to me that her Frigidaire had actually "been on fire" the day before-but this medium could have known nothing about that, first-hand. It was at a distant locale. It developed at the seance, that the lady's mother, was again attempting to convince her and to produce something evidential.

A short-circuit in the wiringhad occurred at her home and had caused quite a good deal of excitement, but little damage, as electricians were soon called and made the slight repairs necessary - after my friend had had presence of mind enough to cut off the current. I think she got something evidential. What do you think?

Convinced Episcopal Parson

A dear old lady, past eighty when I knew her, now adorning Paradise, used to talk to me (I'm not a Spiritualist in the sense of church-connection - but a convinced Episcopal parson - convinced absolutely now, of the actuality of communication and of the sound grounds of the Spiritualist cause) about spirit-experiences very much as I might talk of my fishing expeditions. She told me of contacting her son who was a casualty of the first World War. And, although herself not identified with the Spiritualist church, she talked of these matters without reserve and without apology or hesitancy. She simply cared not one hoot whether her hearers accepted her stories or not.

I wish that more folk who have these spirit-experiences talked freely about them

for many do have them time and time again. If the so-called "orthodox" were frank and fearless in such matters, it would not be long until just about all of us would be convinced of continuity after demise and of the reality of communication as between the here and the there.

Medium Didn't Know

Why this should be limited to one religious group calling themselves Spiritualists, puzzles me --- and I doubt not that it puzzles the Spiritualists also. It is known and admitted that these experiences and the whole principle of survival and of psychic phenomena and spirit-

communication - all this is an open book. And it is not something that the true Spiritualist wants to claim as his unique heritage.

"Then I asked him if he had seen his sister, who had died years back, in her teens," she went on.



Have Ships SOULS?

Hard-headed scientists will scoff at the idea. Yet, can we, despite all of our advanced scientific knowledge, put our fingers on that something which creeps into the building of a ship which makes it an unlucky ship?

When in the late days of April, 1949, the proud £2,000,-000 Royal Mail liner Magdalena broke in two and ceased her life just outside Rio de Janeiro harbor a cloud of sadness hung like a pall over the shipyard where she had been born, christened, and launched.

For the designer of the Magdalena, for every shipyard worker from the men who laid the keel to the man who drove home the last rivet, it meant something more than just the sadness that there is about the passing of a ship whether great or small. An indefinable something had been taken from them, something which every man in the yard from office boy to managing director had given from both the thoughts of his mind and from the labor of his body to the bringing into being of the ship. That something was their creative thought and work and their spirit which had passed into the ship.

What Captains Admit

Do ships, did the *Magdalena*, have a soul? Does that something which is given out by the creators of a ship become a mystical part of a ship and exist as long as a ship lives?

Every ship's captain will freely admit that each ship has an individual quality and temperament different from any other ship. In the same conditions at sea every ship will behave differently. It takes a voyage or two before a captain knows his ship, knows her tricks, her ways. I suggest that there is something more about a ship which every captain gets to know than her mere structure of iron, steel, and woodwork.

I have walked the decks and alleyways of an empty ship lying rusting as she lay moored swinging to the tide after her thirty-five years of good and faithful service had ended. Ghosts of the happy laughter of the glittering jewel-clad passengers of her many voyages of her past haunted the empty saloons and staterooms. But these evening - dressed passengers, and the gold-braided ships' officers were just memories which clung to the ship. They were not part of her -"SHE," the ship created out of human thoughts and hands, although she was now old and no longer flew the gay flags with which she had set out on her maiden voyage.

Japanese Homage

We may dislike the crafty Japanese and many of their ways, but the Japanese recognize that there is something more to a ship than its mere material structure. The Nipponese always say prayers over the loss of a ship. Even the hard-headed shipping magnates of Japan don their kimonos and bow their heads at the prayers said at a little altar for a ship bound for the breaker's yard after a long life of good service at sea. I have met sailors, passengers, even hard-bitten dock laborers, who have confided that they wished that "a few words be said" when a ship built in British yards has gone.

Some may say that the air of sadness which hung over the

yards where the *Magdalena* was built was merely emotional reaction. But those who make their living by the sea, whether in port or aboard ship, will deny that it is mere emotion. They will say that it is something deeper than that. What it is they will hesitate to say.

That First Voyage

That an indefinable something goes into a ship when she is being built must be freely admitted in the case of what are called "unlucky ships." Sailors, dockers, tugboat skippers know these ships which are dogged by ill-luck all their lives, sometimes from the moment that the blocks are knocked out beneath the keel to launch her. Maybe she'll stick on the ways. Maybe there will be an accident at the launching. Or the ill-luck which dogs her every knot which she travels on the seven seas does not begin until she sets out on her first voyage."

Why do we christen a ship? Why is the event of christening a ship accompanied by greater splendor even than the christening of a baby! Is it some deepseated occult knowledge which has come down to us through the ages that causes us to christen ships, a knowledge which our highly - civilized brains have lost track of?

Ships Possess It

When I say — "Have Ships Got Souls?" I do not mean the kind of soul which human beings have, or perhaps, dogs, cats, and other animals. I mean the "something" which is a component whole made up of that which passed into a ship from every one who contributed in thought and labor to the building of her.

Hard-headed scientists will scoff at the idea. Yet, can we, despite all our advanced scientific knowledge, put our fingers on that something which creeps into the building of a ship which makes it an unlucky ship? Perhaps only an African witch-doctor would be capable of smelling it out!

About the "Magdalena"

Our churchmen in their vestments bless the hounds in the sport of fox hunting. Priests and parsons bless fishing nets and fishing fleets before they commence their harvesting of the ocean and rivers. In Kent there is the annual ceremony of blessing of the silk farm. In a Cistercian monastery in Ireland a beautiful Latin prayer is said in the annual blessing of silkworms.

Why not a few words said over a ship like the Magdalena which has sailed down our rivers, and has passed over the horizon never to return. Let these few words be called prayers for the soul of the ship, or called what they will-a few words for the passing of that "something" which every manjack in the Call that gave out of himself into the ship, shipyard occult "something" the soul of the ship or whatever name you like. Without any doubt it is there!

The "HOW" of SPIRIT AND PSYCHIC PHOTOGRAPHY

In the field of psychic science, thousands of pictures have, for the past 46 years, been taken of phenomena. Of all these supernormal pictures, none have been duplicated by our opponents. Duplicated in the sense that similar pictures were produced by normal means or trick photography. None of these manufactured pictures presuming to be like the originals even came close to the real thing.

During the past year, *Psychic Observer* has published numerous spirit and psychic pictures but on each occasion, letters have been fired into the office stating it would be a simple matter to duplicate them. To date, no one has submitted a single picture nor have they made any attempt to back up these allegations

And now, another group of photographs were made possible recently through the mediumship of Ethel Post-Parish at Camp Silver Belle, Ephrata, Pennsylvania.

Case Proven!

It was over ten years ago that Silver Belle, the spirit collaborator of Mrs. Parrish, first allowed her picture to be taken. In this instance, the medium was not shown, only the spirit in a materialized form but in this issue will be found a series of pictures produced through the efforts of the medium's guides and collaborators, in an attempt to show the various stages prior to the actual manifestation of a materialized form. In the past, we have been challenged when presenting stories of this nature in that we did not describe the procedure in minute detail and so this story will be an attempt to bring out every point as clear as is humanly possible.

Our job is not specifically to try to prove the case for physical phenomena to anyone against their will but will be a honest presentation by one who was there—meaning my-

More about the materialization seance later but to conform to strict continuity and detail, the auditorium schedule began when Jack Edward, noted spirit photographer, was introduced to the audience.

At this point, an explanation must be made as to the difference between spirit photography and psychic photography. A spirit photographer is a medium, man or woman, (records disclose the late Mrs.

low it to be out of her possession until she entered the dark room at the close of the seance. In addition to Mrs. Pressing, others were selected from the audience as a committee to follow Edward into the developing room and view the actual procedure of passing the negative through the developing fluids. The entire committee consisted of R ev. Virginia Leach Falls, Rev Mary E. Doyle, Douglas Arnold, Jack Wade and William McCarter.

Air of Expectancy

Another Committee was appointed to examine the cabinet, the walls, the curtain and the entire rostrum upon which the demonstrations were viewed. I, myself, made a thorough examination before the demonstration began.

When the doors of the chapel (where all the public meetings are held at Silver Belle) were closed, the entire audience became tense. An air of expectancy prevailed. J. Edward had his camera set up on the rostrum to the left of the cabinet. He was introduced by Lena Barnes Jefts and then Julietie Ewing Pressing and William Kunze, Baltimore, Maryland, were called forward to watch the entire procedure. Ethel Post Parrish was seated to the right, outside the cabinet. After Mr. Edward was introduced, he preceded to take a picture of the audience allowing one full minute time exposure.

The fact that this demonstration was to be held appeared on page 15 of the current Camp Silver Belle program, wherein it states "Saturday, Inne 24th, 6:45 p.m. auditorium seance; demonstrations of physical mediumship followed by infra-red photography by Iack Edward. This is a pheromena seance that you will not want to miss."

Thousands of these programs were mailed and everyone was invited to be in attendance. Before the seance began, the doors were opened and no one was barred. This procedure breaks down the argument that Deane as the only woman spirit photographer) who possesses the phase of mediumship whereby spirit "extras" appear on negatives after they are developed. A spirit photographer, such as Edward, takes his p'cture of a group or individual in moderate or bright light, the phenomena taking place within the darkened camera.

On this specific evening, Mr. Edward took three pictures; two spirit pictures and one skotograph (Mrs. Deane's phase). The plate containing the negative which finally was developed as a skotograph, was first passed around the audience so as each member could sensitize or in some way cause their own spirit friends to somehow be attracted during the

ence, and the second to the left. All this under bright light immediately over the rostrum, the other lights in the chapel having been extinguished.

This concluded Edward's demonstration of spirit photography except that he snapped the infra-red pictures of the objective psychic phenomena (materialization) later produced through the mediumship of Ethel Post Parrish.

Breath-taking Moments

To take these pictures which could have been taken by any commercial photographer, Mr. Edward adjusted his camera in the center aisle, focusing the lense directly on the cabinet, some 15 or 20 feet away. Immediately back, elevated possibly six feet, a red light was also focused on the cabinet.

Before the bright lights over the rostrum were extinguished, Ethel Post Parrish entered the cabinet and took her place on a plain wooden chair, also examined. The breath-taking moment, having arrived, everyone's attention was directed to the phenomena that they hoped to view because permission had not, as yet, been actually granted Edward to take the pictures.

This permission had to be given by Silver Belle through her medium. A few moments elapsed before the entrancement and then it was that the entire audience heard Silver Belle say: "We are ready" and then of course, after the medium entered the cabinet the overhead lights were extinguished leaving only the rays from the red lamp which glowed back and above Edward's position.

Pictures Tell Story

In all, seven pictures were taken with infra-red bulbs and film and these pictures were snapped several minutes apart.

A slight confusion occurred when Edward had difficulty replacing the bulbs and film in almost complete darkness as the red light showing over his head did not help his vision, in fact it was very difficult for those back of the first two or three rows to see or distinguish much of the phenomena, however infra-red photography took care of that.

A glance at the photographs on page 12 and 13 show a black curtain stretched to the right of the cabinet. Edward explained that this was necessary in order to get a better photograph of a materialized spirit and in that, he was correct.

During all the seven pictures, Lena Barnes Jefts, who stands to the left of the opening, was directed by Silver Belle to part the curtain the moment she was ready and after each picture was taken, the curtain was dropped.

The pictures speak for themselves, but will be explained elsewhere in this issue. After the seance was over, the committee followed Edwards into the developing room and within a very short time, the report came that on the first three, there were many spirit "extras" and that the other seven maaway and during the actual photographing of the materialized spirit, I sat on the floor not less than two feet away and in front of the black curtain and vas able to vaguely see that there were, indeed, masses of ectoplasmic substance before my eyes, but I had no idea that the pictures, when developed, would be as vivid and astounding as they were.

And so another chapter in Modern-Day Psychic Research conducted by *ardent Spiritualists of Camp Silver Belle* is closed and there will be on file, evidence which will stand on record down through the years, long after the mediums or members of the audience will have passed away.

terialization photographs were positive—all different, showing various stages of materialization.

And so, as near as is humanly possible, I have tried to give a complete description of what actually transpired and there can be no question but that these pictures like all others, published by Psychic Observer will create a great deal of controversy. Most of the allegations will come from those who know the least about the subject, but remember there were 81 persons present, including numerous skeptics. Of these, none found fault with the test conditions or the results.

During the entire evening, I was seated in the very first row. At first, about twenty feet have there ever been photographs of this particular nature (i.e.) seven different stages of materialization photographed with the medium in plain view. Each experiment is a unit unto itself.

Over a year ago, through our sponsorship, levitation and partial materialization were photographed. Later, in a different way, ectoplasmic structures were photographed culminating into the materialized form; and then we featured a materialized form with the lower portion of the same spirit partially dematerialized.

We have also presented pictures showing a fully materialized spirit on the floor in full form with the entranced medium standing along side and now we have this unique and startling presentation—photographs of the seven stages of materialization.

Entire Season

For over 27 years, Ethel Post Parrish has demonstrated materialization from the New England States to Florida and in many parts of this country east of the Mississippi River. Her mediumship like many others has been condemned from time to time. No medium living or dead has been free from criticism but now the evidence presented in this issue will settle, once and for all, the fact that materialized forms in her seances are definite spirit people, manifesting entirely separate and apart from her and in this instance, over ten feet away.



If possible, send an earth picture of the spirit identified for comparison. When earth pictures of spirit extras are received they will be printed together with another reproduction of the picture on which the extra appears . . . this evidence by comparison should convince a skeptic.

Sufficient time will be allowed, but of necessity a deadline must be set so all the pictures can be assembled into one article at the same time. The deadline will be September 1st, 1950.

When those recognizing the spirit, only have one picture of the deceased, it is suggested that the earth picture be rephotographed before sending same to the *Psychic Observer*. This prevents loss in transit and will make it possible for all earth pictures to be filed at this office.

The phenomena of spirit photography reaches the peak of its importance when an earth picture can be printed alongside a spirit picture. The phenomenon itself is astounding but the clinching part is the reproduction of both earth and spirit picture so all can see that people called "dead" can project their likeness. These people have not lost their identity, they have not lost their individuality, nor have they all lost their power to return and project themselves. In this way personal survival after the change called death can be definitely proved to all those who have eres to see.



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
