# FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT HARRY HOUDINI BILLY SUNDAY AIMEE SEMPLE MCPHERSON

Each year, for over ten years, Psychic Observer has published the account of Etta Bledsoe Day. Ever since her passing, Mrs. Bledsoe has spoken independently over a microphone in Chesterfield's auditorium through the voice mediumship of the Rev. James Laughton.

Most of our readers are familiar with the conditions under which these public demonstrations of direct-voice mediumship are held, but for the benefit of those unfamiliar with the procedure, a detailed explanation will be made.

The auditorium at Chester-field Spiritualist Camp, Chester-field, Indiana, seats over 2,000 people. The first Sunday in August, the time when these public demonstrations are held, always attracts capacity audiences. The demonstration is opened by explanatory remarks given by Juliette Ewing Pressing who, down through the years, has been chairman.

After a brief explanation as to just what the audience is about to witness, committees are chosen to examine the cabinet, the rostrum and everything around about. The members of the committee are told to check everything carefully, assure themselves as to test conditions, and then, in turn,

assure the audience that the medium has neither accomplices nor paraphernalia, except the microphone in the cabinet.

James Laughton is then introduced to the audience, proper music ensues, the medium enters the cabinet and the There are those who might think that the voice emanates and is projected much as they hear communications through trance mediums. self to be entranced and conduct the demonstration thru what is called *trance speaking*.

Those familiar with seance room phenomena know that the conditions must be as they are and those familiar with the marvelous mediumship of Rev. Laughton have heard. on many occasions, the inimitable voice of Etta Bledsoe who incidentally, has manifested through a number of mediums but through none as realistic and evidential as is evidenced through this particular medium.

### Why Laughton?

Some pertinent information regarding Rev. Laughton will explain just why Mrs. Bledsoc happens to manifest through him so characteristically.

### The Answer

"Why is it you seem to be taking such a great interest in me?" These words received this reply: "Someday, you will be a great medium and after I am gone, I will come back through you and tell the world that life is continuous and that spirit communication is a fact. Furthermore, all who knew me will recognize my voice and know that I have kept my word."

The first question was asked by James Laughton when he was a student at Brady Lake sixteen years ago. The answer to this question was received from none other than Etta S. Bledsoe, who has, for the past ten years, communicated on her day at Chesterfield through the trance instumentality and voice mediumship of Rev. James Laughton.

This year, Rev. Laughton completed his fifteenth consecutive sea-

son as a featured medium at Chesterfield Spiritualist Camp, Chesterfield, Indiana.

When interviewed recently, Rev. Laughton said he was 16 years old, when he gave his first message. To-day he is 37 and one of America's outstanding direct-voice mediums. He possesses startling clairvoyance and numerous phases of physical mediumship.

In the book, "Evidences of Immortality," the author, A. W. Wade, describes in detail results obtained at a seance with Rev. Laughton.

For years. Rev. Laughton has served one of the largest churches in the city of Detroit. Today, although he does not conduct a church of his own, he is featured one Sunday a month at the Allen Memorial Spiritualist Church in Detroit, of which Rev. Edith Green is pastor.

For several years, during the winter months, he has held services at Fort Lauderdale, Florida, and expects to return to that city and conduct regular Sunday services in conjunction and with the cooperation of the Rev. Edward Mackey of New York City.

### Story Comtinues

No one, who has had the opportunity to hear these Etta Bledsoe Day demonstrations, can doubt their authenticity. I was not privileged to be at Chesterfield during the demonstration but at the close of camp, I did hear the wire-recording and had I not had this privilege, I would not feel qualified to write this article.

I have always said that it is the human side of spirit communication that is most convincing. True, the voices are not, in all instances, exactly as we woulld like them nor can we say that they remind us of the voice we heard on earth, but there are other things that add to conviction — phraseology, enunciation and, above all, those human traits which undeniably creep in and prove.

For instance, when the voice of Billy Sunday literally pierced the atmosphere, his old "fire and brimstone" manner was unmistakable. Whilst I do not remember his voice, I shall never forget his mannerisms and phraseology when I attend-

ed one of his revival meetings in Oakland, near Pittsburgh, over 30 years ago.

And the same was true when Aimee Semple MacPherson gave a short "Hallelujah" address, taking up where Sunday left off.

This story is being reported exactly as given and, thanks to the wire-recorder, this article continues with a verbatim account of both Roosevelt's and Houdini's address.


### Bledsoe Speaks

I have been busy, very busy in these past days and months helping all who needed my strength, knowing that the words of those that I would bring would inspire you to go on in your world. I am proud of those that have this day walked with me and you too shall be proud for their feet have left prints in the sands of time that the world will not soon forget.

"But now I am free from the chains that bound me and after many changes of understanding and realizing much in that understanding, I asked Mrs. Bledsoe, who was then gathering souls for her presentation, to please let me address you and relieve my soul of the dreadful pressure that my former consciousness placed upon me. "I did communicate with my wife, who now stands here beside me and I here and now repudiate all supposed stories to the effect that I did not return. I am proud now to admit to the world at large that I am now working for the cause of communication and shall do all in my power to further this beautiful truth of life everlasting.

"This is Harry Houdini returning to my work in the spirit. May the Teachers bless you and give you courage as it is given to me to carry on."

When James Crenshaw visited the offices of *Psychic Observer*, he brought with him a transcription of an address delivered by Billy Sunday thru the trance instrumentality of Richard Zenor of Los Angeles, California. ings, characteristic of Billy Sunday, persisted but these were followed by apologetic statements regarding survival. It was just too bad for Billy when he found he was not dead but he is making the best of it.

During the past several years Aimee MacPherson has materialized in a number of seances losing none of her characteristics nor her orthodox way of expression.

For years, during the last war, it was common knowledge among Spiritualists that Franklin Delano Roosevelt attended direct-voice seances but the mediums serving him felt it best not to release the story and for obvious reasons, their trust in us was never violated.

In the case of Harry Houdini, his apologies and messages through dozens of mediums is proof enough for the Spiritualists. The text of his message at Chesterfield is added evidence that he must have suffered tremendously since his passing as a result of his condemnation of Spiritualists and Spiritualist mediums.

And then, too, Houdini even offers an apology on behalf of his wife who was literally browbeaten after her husband's passing and coerced into carrying on the "Houdini fiasco" for over ten years.

For it is common knowledge that on every Halloween night during those ten years, she assembled about her a group of newspaper men and proceeded with her mock seances. Because it was Halloween, newspaper men responded, sat in a lighted room before Houdini's picture and called for the great Houdini to speak. Nothing happened, so the news reports went out on the United Press and the Associated Press to the effect that spirit communication was not true. They neglected to say that no medium was present.

These are the things that make it difficult for Spiritualists to forget but to me the point evidenced in their return and their statements is that they all follow a certain pattern, the great yen for publicity and it is this very yen that, no doubt, caused them to again use the microphone—but this time, to ask for forgiveness.

Whether they are forgiven or not is not within the province

. . . . about some unique incidents, some rare psychic demonstrations and some intriguing experiences I believe will be of interest to Spiritualists and students everywhere but first I want to make it clear that the text of this article must not be viewed as a defense but rather as an explanation-for there are many who seem to be going off the deep end with their remarks regarding some of the advertisements now appearing in Psychic Observer. As usual, however, most of the criticism comes from those least informed.

The incidents, demonstrations and experiences to be cited will be threaded around what some refer to as the "paraphernalia of the seance room" -a subject which has, lo these many years, needed some explanation. It so happens that the Psychic Observer Bookshop sells all kinds of seance-room equipment: (i. e.) trumpets, slates, crystals, ouija boards, incense, planchettes and luminous paint. We make a nominal percentage of profit on these items and, in these days when printing costs are so very high, the sundries we sell help bear the overhead expense of operating a business and publishing a Spiritualist journal such as Psychic Observer.

Incidentally, this paper is non-organizational; that is, our columns are open to all Spiritualists, their activities and church work regardless of affiliation. Before Psychic Observer was founded, the spirit collaborators, who designed and worked out details of the plan of its publication, were emphatic in their determination to have it completely free to serve all, regardless of whether there might be slight differences of opinion amongst its supporters.

All Spiritualists believe in spirit communication. Mediumship is the door that connects the two worlds. Hence, Psychic Observer is considered the medium's paper. Unless the psychic centers (psyche which is soul) in some form are used, transcendental, invisible spirit contact cannot be made. God is spirit and through the spirit in man, he receives teachings and good news about his immortality, the truth that sets man free.

There are many phases of mediumship and for the physical phases which are the foundation upon which the entire structure of Modern Spiritualism rests, certain equipment is necessary to complete the normal contact. Ignorantly, even amongst the Spiritualists, we hear detrimental remarks made concerning this equipment and some designate these sundries as gadgets and paraphernalia.

It would be equally as foolish for one to say that a telephone instrument is unnecessary as it is to denounce the use of a seance trumpet which simply magnifies the sound of the spirit voice.

The trumpet is an aluminum megaphone shaped instrument which was first introduced in 1852 by Jonathan Koons, an Ohio farmer. Evidently, his spirit guides directed him to use such a device to support the psychic energy and magnify the sound of spirit voices. Since that time, thousands upon thousands of trumpets have been used for this purpose. The late Etta Wriedt, Detroit, Michigan, immortalized trumpet phenomena when she, with her astute and wonderful control. Doctor John Sharp, convinced prominent men and women on both continents.

I sat with dear Etta on several occasions. She told me of her many experiences in Europe when she sat at the late William T. Stead Julia's Burean. Her work was so successful and so many definite, incontrovertible proofs of immortality came through her mediumship that she was awarded the Queen Victoria

One illustrious personality, Sir William Barrett, who attended many of her seances said: "My friend; Professor Sidgwick, came through. Mrs. Wriedt doubtless had heard his name, but he died before she visited England and I doubt if she, or any others who knew him by name, were aware that he stammered badly. So I asked the voice: 'Are you all right now?' not referring to his stammering. Immediately, the voice replied: 'You mean the impediment in my speech, but I do not stutter now.

"I attended Mrs. Wriedt's seances in a somewhat skeptical spirit," Barrett continues, "but came to the conclusion that she is a genuine and remarkable medium and has given abundant proof to others besides myself. I am satisfied the voices and the content of the messages given are wholly beyond the range of trickery or collusion."

When I visited London in 1946. I called to see my friend. Miss Mercy Phillimore, at the London Spiritualist Alliance, Ouecnsbury Place. I was filled with great pride when I saw a beautiful life-sized oil portrait of this great medium, Etta Wreidt, prominently displayed in one of the large meeting chambers.

Only recently, during my trip to Chesterfield, I had a long visit with my dear friend, Dr. J. E. Hett, who lives in





as a sort of focal point for concentration. Crystal gazing is one of the most ancient mediums of divination. I recall my first visit to a medium who styled herself Madame Audrey. She gazed into a crystal ball and told me many incidents of the past that were known only to myself. She saw happenings that were to take place in the future and most of her predictions came true. In addition she was able to contact spirit pople for she cited trivialities of family and home life. relayed to her from my deceased parents and other loved ones. This same good woman

one called Madame, I have always tried to follow that old saying: "Let him who is without sin cast the first stone."

Incense is another item that has been greatly ridiculed. The burning of incense has been practiced by occultists from time immemorial. Strange, but to ridicule incense burned in Catholic braziers is never thought of, nor is it considered odd that it is used.

Doubtless, the burning of incense clears the atmosphere and establishes conditions that make concentration and meditation easier. All canonized saints have at one time lived in

Whether the readers of this journal, or any one else, believes this account makes no difference. Thousands attended the meeting and were satisfied. To those who will not believe it possible for spirits to communicate, let them wait until they are dead.

These treasures were given us by an old-time Spiritualist, Evielena P. Bach, who knew we would not keep them "hidden beneath a bushel" but display them in a prominent place where all the world might see this real testimony.

Perhaps, the slate most widely publicized was received in 1887 through Fred P. Evans, an American medium whose home was in San Francisco. The spirit produced five differently colored writings and portraits on the slate of Alfred Russel Wallace, a famous naturalist, who visited Evans in

America. Wallace publicly proclaimed his experiences and as a result became one of Spiritualism's greatest propagandists.

Probably the ouija board has been the butt of more criticism than any other one instrument for spirit communication. In the out-of-print book, "The Worlds and I" by one of the world's best beloved authors, Ella Wheeler Wilcox, the story tells how she sat with a friend and held a ouija board endeavoring to make contact with her beloved husband, Robert, after he went to a higher

She was successful and afterwards told everyone, who would listen, that she had communicated with the so-called dead. When telling about spir-

it communication via the ouija board, a friend said to her: "I cannot imagine my husband needing a third person between him and me, or a material object like an old ouija board or a table to bring messages. When he was on earth he did not do these things. Why should he in the spirit world? He always came directly to me here.'

"I think not always," Mrs. Wilcox replied. "When he was only a block away from you and needed to send a message, he called up an operator to connect the telephone wires. He could not do this himself. He also used the telegraph operator and the wireless operator at other times to reach you. They may not have been people of education or culture: but they KNEW HOW TO CONNECT THE WIRES AND RENDER IT POSSIBLE FOR YOU AND YOUR HUSBAND TO COMMUNICATE."

And pressing her point, Mrs. Wilcox continued: "There is nothing more unreasonable or absurd in the use of a ouija board, a table, a planchette or a trained clairvoyant to afford our disembodied friends the power to transmit their messages than in the use of wires and operators on earth. Death. does not make souls omnipotent. Immortal life is a matter of slow growth toward greater power and knowledge. Free from the physical body, souls are for many years in the astral body; and that body has its limitations.

Upon etheric and vibratory conditions, the possibility of transmitting messages from the astral to the physical world, depends. An individual may be of an inferior type of mind and without knowledge on these subjects, or he who produced the phenomenon which brings messages from the worlds beyond may be of the highest order of development. There is no set rule. It is simply a matter of the right vibratory combination."

woman of letters and education, the humble ouija board was used. When I entered her apartment in Chevne Gardens, London, England, 1946, directly after the Second World War, I was graciously received by the lovely lady whose father, a professor in Dublin University, naturally gave his daughter every advantage of higher education.

Mrs. Dowden invited me to sit with her before a small drum-type stove. At this time. England was lacking in fuel so many outmoded ways to heat were being used. We chatted briefly and then, to my surprise, she produced a small ouija board, placed it on her lap, and told me to put my hands upon it. Immediately the pointer started to race over the surface and to my delight, my beloved daddy, Lapsley Cornelius Ewing, spelled out his name. He gave his place of birth and death and other evidences of life and personal conscious survival.

Another famous medium who used the ouija board was Gladys Osborne Leonard. In her early development, she allowed her guides to come to her by this method. She was the channel through whom Sir Oliver Lodge received the clinching evidence that caused him to publicly acknowledge that communication with the spirit world is a fact. However, for nearly half a century, this great mind had studied and endeavored to get facts about the future life.

Before a large audience, he stated: "Communication is possible, but one must obey the laws, first finding out the conditions. I do not say it is easy, but it is possible; and I have conversed with my friends over yonder, just as I can converse with anyone in this audience now."

The ouija board was also used by Pearl Curran, the St. Louis medium, for the worldfamous PATIENCE WORTH scripts that stirred two continents.

Planchettes, devices which

operate somewhat like ouija boards, were invented in 1853 by a French Spiritualist and I am told that this device came into use as a result of the power evident and necessary to tip a table. Many students have found these devices helpful to establish communication.

Luminous paint is used to cover a band outside a trumpet so that in complete darkness all movements are visible to all sitters. Application of paint inside the trumpet prevents students from having their attention distracted before levitation. The investigator who has expressed a desire to see the trumpet in action has been the first to condemn the

advertisement of the sale of luminous paint.

Others have considered such ads undignified and say they have no place in Spiritualism, but where is the student and medium to buy these devices if there is not a shop of "their"

I recall when I first became acquainted with psychic law, the average student or interested person would have no way to acquire them and so realizing that equipment for seance work is necessary for the psychic student and medium, Psychic Observer Bookshop has, at all times, endeavored to provide the Spiritualists of America with these devices.

### What a "Woman"

The September issue of "The Woman" carries another blast against the Spiritualists. Alson J. Smith, author of the article, "Spiritualism, Religion or Racket?" in his feeble effort to de-

scribe a Spiritualist meeting he attended in the Statler Hotel. Buffalo, N. Y., displays his ignorance by trying to describe something he knows nothing about.

It is amazing how editors of fairly well-known magazines will accept stories of this nature from the least informed. When reading the small type which describes who Mr. Smith is. it is easy to see that the author had an axe to grind because he claims to be the pastor of the Roxbury-Hunting Ridge Church in Stamford, Connecticut. This same Mr. Smith, who has written the book, "A Faith To Live By," seems to be breaking down what he is trying to build up-meaning that there are many followers of the religion of Spiritualism whose knowledge of survival, not faith in survival, is a great sustenance of their very being.

In Mr. Smith's silly article, he states that the American Society for Psychical Research has exposed hundreds of fraudulent mediums but he doesn't give the name of any. The one redeeming part of his article is the fact that although he has never attended the Chesterfield Spiritualist Camp, he feels it is at least "on its upper levels."

To show that the author does not know what he is talking about when discussing Spiritualism, he says that the National Spiritualist Association maintains a seminary in Wisconsin, the Morris Pratt Institute, where ministers are trained. The truth is that this institute has not been operating for the last five years although the intent is to reorganize during 1951.

It is just such articles that mislead the people and when they contain so many glaring errors, it is a pity anyone would take the article or the magazine seriously, but they do and there's the rub!

D. Rishi, a pioneer of this science and the other one is our own circle.

"There are many others who have home circles but they do not desire to come forward in public and hence are

Dr. Nasikvala however, has taken up the task of introducing Spiritualism in India and so far he has been successful. In Bombay all the mediums are working with the planchette and ouija board and some automatic writing is evident. In the case of the Doctor, he is entranced and his guide gives instructive messages regularly each week.

"Every Saturday, we invite those who desire to receive healing ministrations from Dr. Nasikvala. He is assisted by Mrs. R. S. Daver. Dr. Nasikvala has been successful in many cases after others have failed but still, he does not want to come out in public until he receives instructions from his spirit guide,"

When asked how he became interested in Spiritualism, Dr. Nasikvala answered: "When I was nine, I was fond of anything supernatural and as a child, was particularly intrigued with the work of magicians. At an early age. I was inclined toward occult science and practiced hypnotism and palmistry.

"It was not until Dr. Oscar Brunler, a brain specialist who was visiting India, told me that I could read palms by clairvoyance that I realized my potentialities as a medium.

"I attended my first seance in 1938 after the passing of a close relative and our first seance, even though we used a planchette or ouija board, made me know that some unseen force caused things to happen that could not be accounted for by hypnotism or conjury. Since that time, I have been thoroughly convinced and I am now a staunch supporter of Spiritualism even against the will of my wife and mother who became frightened one day when certain manifestations took place right in our own home."

do not know. Probably spirits know no more on the subject, -have no way of knowingthan we know.

"There appears to be two great bodies of thought in this world and in spirit realms; one, mostly Oriental, on both sides of death, affirming, the other, mostly Western, saying it is unproved.

"My own observations incline me to think that Oriental spirits, unaccompanied by Western spirits, that is by people of the white race while on earth, do not do efficient thinkby leaders of religious ceremonies to cover their own ignorance, and to a fear that Spiritualism may reveal events in the individual life of which the man refusing to investigate is ashamed.

The mental indolence will be cured in this life or later by pain resulting from ignorance. That God did not intend us to know such things is denied by the fact that Christ and his friends showed such things to thousands of people and taught the gifts of God in the psychic realm to disciples so that they could heal, speak with tongues and "receive in that same hour" what they should say while in danger.

"The world has yet to learn the truth that things held sacredly private by an individual will, if revelation would make for evil, never be told by spirits to any one but the individual himself."

### Sarasota Scance

Dorothy Graff-Flexer who conducts the Shrine of the Master, a Spiritualist church in Sarasota, Florida. Vick; Wllen Da Milot, May Bullen; Adeline Maltby; Arthur Bullen and I. M. Da Milot.

or several of these realms; each may honestly give what honest spirits report and yet the reports from different mediums and from mediums having different controls at different moments, may conflict.

"A friend of mine is sure there is no God who has benevolence toward mankind, because spirits purporting to be Confucius and Thomas Paine told him so. As neither of those spirits have, presumably, any more information on that subject than is known to people on earth life their opinions, if they are really the persons they claim to be, settles nothing. In the same way the question of reincarnation may be no nearer a solution because one set of spirits affirm and others

ing. Philosophy, in the Oriental mind, crowds the scientific spirit into comparative inactivity.

"I have known instances where a group sitting successfully under control of American Indians and white people in the spirit world, have secuted only promises, vague generalizations and meditative remarks not meaning much, after Oriental spirits gained unlimited control.

"The resisting power of the people who do not accept the truth that spirits communicate is largely due to a refusal to stop, look or listen. This is due to mental indolence, to a superstitions fear that "God did not intend us to meddle in such things" a view fostered

ialization seances for the public.

Of the hundreds of accounts submitted to Psychic Observer describing materialization seances, most are drab, listless and monotonous in that the descriptions do not carry what we could call the "human touch."

It is the naturalness and the human side that to many is most convincing. Alice Straton's article is most intriguing in this sense because she says: "When one of the sitters was greeted by her materialized husband, she told him to walk about the room so everyone could get a good look.

"To this, the spirit husband replied: 'You have not changed a bit. You still keep ordering me around.

"The spirit husband continued to chide his wife and said: 'Why should I go around and gawk at the other people. I do not even know them.

"And then to get in the last word, the spirit's wife replied: 'I know you don't know them but I want them to see you.'

The spirit husband stood his ground and said: 'But I did not come to see them. I came to see you."

Those familiar with seance room phenomena, especially materialization, have experienced just such human traitstraits that are expressed and creep into many seances which prove the fact that individual idiosyncracies exemplified are the greatest proof of personal conscious survival.

According to the report, over 40 persons materialized, each being introduced by the medium's cabinet control, Red Wing, who was careful to test the lights before the seance began. At the close of the seance, according to Mrs. Straton's report, the trumpet was suspended in midair, its gyrations plainly visible in the red light, held the audience spellbound.



### The Lunacy Lie

For years the opponents of Spiritualism have tried to associate "lunacy" with its tenets but no facts have ever been presented to substantiate their

A booklet, "Does Spiritualism Cause Lunacy," published some time ago by H. J. Osborn, presents history few are familiar with, hence excerpts from his treatise may clear up some points, for he says:

"Right thinking is of the first importance on all subjects; on none is it of more importance than the subject of Lunacy, yet few has there been, or is, more loose and muddled and speaking since the days of the ancients, and of Plato's famous double paradox: Madness



is of greater utility than sanity, and a distempered mind, so far from being an unmitigated evil, is, in fact a notable blessing.

"There is no historic record of any care, by the ancients, of the insane, before the establishment, in 491, of the first hospital for the purpose in Jerusalem. From then onward till the first quarter of the 19th century, lunatic asylums were in fact prisons.

"In Feudal times the super-lord confiscated the property of "bornfools" and others mentally deranged, and in the reign of Edward I, the king, by his agents, had the custody of all lands owned by lunatics. Thus, in fact, the care of the insane became a State Trust.

"There is a Lancashire saying, There's nought so queet as folk, and it is told of some ancient Quaker that he said to his wife, The World's queer; everybody's queer, except me and thee; and thee's a little queer. Which sayings are but terse paraphrases of the more classic one which affirms that All men think all men mortal but themselves, and that in turn, may be why many people say there are more lunatics outside than inside the asy-

"It has long been said that Spiritualism leads to lunacy; the wonder is that it is not yet held that all Spiritualists are insane. The one saying would be as tenable as the

"Now, if Spiritualism be a cause of insanity, its incidence must be sought in one line, or at most in two lines, of the table - sudden mental stress and prolonged mental stress, since in none of the other thirteen lines can any trace be found of the most remote suggestion of Spiritualism as a possible factor. Moreover, prolonged mental stress, read in the light of the phrase used by the authorities, privation, neglect and bad environment, may be wholly dismissed for the present purpose. Thus, only one factor remains -- that of "sudden mental stress." Under that heading in the official records are included all cases of religious mania, and in these again the caseswhere there are any of Spiritual-

### The Church and Lunacy

"Why should Spiritualism be singled out for attack? Why not orthodox revealed religion? Religious mania is not the monopoly of one cult. What would be said if some Spiritualist should proclaim that the Church of England is a prime producer of insanity? The imagination refuses to picture the uproar that would ensue. Yet, if one should arise and make such a charge, he would have that which the opponent of Spiritualism entirely lacks - official data .... which he might cite and hold it proof with far greater point than their diatribes

### Some Medical Critics -

"One of the medical Superintendents, replying to enquiry, said, Religious mania is a popular expression for cases of insanity manifesting certain symptoms, and cannot be regarded as a cause. He added, no patient has been admitted to this institution whose insanity has been certified as caused by Spiritualism.

On the first statement, it may be remarked that popular expressions often embody fallacies, and those used in this connection are no exception. Loose thinkers and writers might profit by the definition given.



who was written to because there appeared in London papers a statement of his attributing a large increase in lunacy to Spiritualism, in his reply evaded the point of numbers, but expressed the opinion that a considerable number of those who engage in Spiritualism are already suffering from hallucinations of the senses, and it is on that account that they become interested in Spiritualism.

"That, it goes without saying, is a gratuitous slander on the great mass of inquirers into Spiritualism, and could only have been conceived by one who had no definite or practical experience. But the same gentleman was fair enough to add, It would be unfair to regard these cases as having become insane on account of their enquiries. Quite so, and opponents cannot have it both ways. First, the charge is not true; next, if it were, it would be an unfair one to urge against Spiritualism.

"Yet another correspondent wrote, I have formed the opinion that Spiritualism appeals to persons who are mentally unstable, unduly emotional, and credulous; in such people there is only needed some exciting factor to render them insane, and this factor is available in potent form in attendance in Spiritualistic seances.

"Suppose this to be true, are normal sane people to be debarred the search for truth on that account? Spiritualists do not seek such weak people, nor offer them inducements, and therefore ought not to be blamed."

### Corelli on Lunacy

Those familiar with the writings of Marie Corelli are apt to think that she was somewhat of a Spiritualist in her day - especially if they have read "Life Everlasting" or "The Romance of Two Worlds" but get ready for a shock such really was not the case if reference is made to two articles she wrote for the "Daily Telegraph" several years before she passed away.

In these articles, which I have on file, she indulges in many quite Correlian diatribes against Spiritualism. Even the editor attacks her by saying: ... in her latest book, she falls foul much more severely of the clergy of her Anglican Church;

because, forsooth, they do not put down all such things, as, in her florid imagination, she supposes Spiritualists to be engaged in. It is not necessary to follow Miss Corelli through her diatribes against the Bishops and the Church, but she owns she has learned nothing in relation to Spiritualism since she wrote her first book; and she still asserts that Spiritualism 'must inevitably deepen into incurable insanity!' Imagine a great writer so ignorant of publicly recorded facts and figures which prove so conclusively that this result does not follow.

Hardly a day passes when either Mrs. Pressing or myself do not have just such opportunities and the case in point is our recent sitting with the minister of Anderson's Spiritualist Temple of Truth, the Rev. Virginia Leach Falls.

During July, the Rev. Falls journeyed from her home, 1422 Walnut Street, Anderson, Indiana, to Camp Silver Belle and after a chat with her, we asked for a sitting and were graciously allowed to use the beautifully equipped seance room used by Ethel Post-Parrish.

There is no particular accounting for the apparent shyness evident when the younger mediums sit with us but this tension usually vanishes and in the main, our seances with the younger mediums have been remarkable and with Rev. Falls, there was no exception.

mediumship, could be described as semitrance, or a sort of a combination of clairvoyance, clairaudience and clairsentience, brought to us many evidential messages. Rev. Falls, whose principal spirit collaborator is "Evening Star," a member of the Sioux trible and another Indian collaborator from the Osceola tribe, a maiden squaw by the name of "One Eye" were both seen clairvoyantly by Mrs. Pressing and later this fact was substantiated by the medium.

A host of well-known personalities closely associated to us manifested and gave pertinent evidence other than just their names. The medium's healing guide, a spirit by the name of "Dhar-Khan" transmitted valuable information for our own well-being, whilst Dr. Bartlett, who assists the medium with her class and lecture work, presented some philosophical teachings to which he added a bit of prophecy.

Rev. Falls opened services in her church in Anderson early in October and will continue through the fall and winter months. They are chartered by the Independent Spiritualist Association.

### Professors vs. Magicians

### Monotonous Regularity

According to a clipping taken from the August 25th St. Louis Globe Demograt, there is a girl in St. Louis who is reported to be marked with Christ's wounds. It is a case of a young Lemay girl who reportedly may suffer from stigmata thought to be reproduc-

tions of those suffered by Jesus.

The case was turned over to the Catholic chancery, the alleged authority on the subject. The girl, Joan Rosso, 16, lives at 356 Hoffmeister Ave., St. Louis, and she is entering her junior year at the Notre Dame High School.

The reporter claims to have seen the wounds on the girl's hands but has been advised by the priest not to discuss the case. The reporter goes on to

"The pastor of St. Andrews, Rev. James M. Huber, and his assistants, referred inquiries to the Chancery office, where a spokesman said he had no comment.

"Miss Rosso reportedly faints during each mass, at the Elevation of the Blessed Sacrament. Such was the case when this reporter watched her on two separate occasions.

"She appeared to be in a coma, which lasted for about 20 minutes after the end of the

"While in the coma, the girl can be heard speaking softly in Latin. Her command of the language would do credit to a seminarian who had studied Latin intensively, a priest who overheard her said.

"At times her face contorted, as though she were in pain,

"A shy, somewhat plump girl of medium height and wearing light-colored shell-rim glasses, Miss Rosso politely but firmly refused to discuss her-

### Crowds Gather

"My daddy has told me not to talk about it," she said at the home of an aunt. Her father also declined to discuss the matter, but admitted his daughter had been suffering from the wounds for several weeks.

"Friends and neighbors described the girl as quiet and reserved, and apparently of only average devoutness until recently. Since the wounds have appeared, the girl goes into seclusion after mass, and reportedly spends much time reading religious literature.

"Crowds at St. Andrew's at daily mass have grown\_steadily each day since the phenomenon was first noticed. Yesterday more than 400 persons were in church. Persons sitting behind her said that blood trickled from the wounds in her hands.

"The wounds on the palms are slightly oval in shape and slightly larger than a dime. The wounds on the backs of her hands are smaller. The reported wounds in her feet and side were not visible because of her clothing and shoes.

### Physicians Convinced

"The first case of a stigmata reported was that of St. Francis of Assisi, who was said, by contemporary historians, to have suffered much pain from the wounds which appeared late in his life. He died in 1226.

"About 300 cases of stigmata among Roman Catholics have been recorded and in the nineteenth century, physicians made a thorough study of 19 of these cases and were convinced of their objective reality and honesty of the stigmatized.

"The most widely known living stigmatist is 52-year-old Therese Neumann of Konnersreuth, Germany. Each year thousands of persons go to see blood apparently oozing from her eyes and palms as it has every Good Friday since 1926.

"The Roman Catholic Church has never taken a position on stigmata. Non-Catholic scientists have studied but not fully explained the stigmata. They are inclined to feel that the stigmata is associated with cataleptic or nervous hysteria.

"Miss Rosso was acompanied by an aunt when she was seen in church by Globe-Democrat reporters. The girl was kneeling when she began to reel and her aunt, Mrs. Joseph Rosso, caught her and stretched her out in the pew.

"After the mass a score of persons gathered around the girl's recumbent body while others kneeling in the church recited the rosary aloud until she sat up."



(Editor's note: This is the final article in a series of three written for the *Psychic Observer* on the changing attitude of medical men, especially psychiatrists, toward psychic phenomena.)

The answer to the jackpot question, "If psychical phenomena are real, why don't scientists accept them?" is:

They do!

Not all of them, of course, but those who do are recruiting greater and greater numbers of investigators, as well as actual "believers."

Psychiatrists, the medical men who treat the ill of mentality and the brain, are finding themselves on a frontier of new thinking along lines which would have been considered the sheerest heresy in science a number of years ago.

Large numbers of them have decided that an interest in such things as telepathy, clairvoyance and spirit manfestations can be considered decent and no longer unmentionable above a whisper.

It has been a difficult transition, in which the relatively few sensitive individuals able to see beyond so-called normal boundaries have been ridiculed, persecuted and maligned. Gradually, however, men of repute have recognized that some possess faculties, such as clairvoyance, which pierce the fog of our narrow world.

Dr. Victor Parkin, the noted California psychiatrist, offers this analogy: Suppose a flying fish were to report back to the other fish in the depths what the world above the water was like. Would he not be ridiculed for his bizarre descriptions of momentary glimpses of a strange, unbelievable world where there was no water?

The psychic sensitive is like the flying fish, privileged for a moment to rise above the sea of the earth level and to bring back descriptions of a freer, larger world beyond, but subject to misunderstanding and unbelief on the part of those unable to imagine the existence of other realms.

Now, after so many fragmentary reports, agreeing in so many details, a little light is beginning to filter through.

Dr. Russell G. MacRobert, the New York neuropsychiatrist, who conducted a survey

among his colleagues to determine whether any large number of them were interested in such things (they were; see Psychic Observer Sept. 10, 1950, now has told how research is proceding in a direction once considered verboten.

For the May, 1950, issue of the magazine *Tomorrow*, Dr. MacRobert contributed an article called "Science Studies Intuition." (The magazine just happens to be edited by Eileen J. Garrett, one of the world's great mediums, whose own clairvoyant "intuition" is outstanding).

First of all Dr. MacRobert

cites a typical example of what parapsychologists would call "precognition" under anesthesia:

"The following experience occurred to a woman in April 1949 while she was being given gas anesthesia in the office of a prominent New York dentist. The patient had a dream under the anesthetic and when she awakened she was very upset. In her dream she saw her friend Mrs. Manuel Quezon, widow of the first president of the Philippines, ambushed and murdered on a lonely mountain road near Manila, half way around the world. Allowing for the difference in time between New York and Manila, the dream occurred ten hours before the crime was committed - a very ample margin of knowing before-hand. ('precognition) as well as seeing something true at a distance without the eyes (clairvoyance).

"'Weird,' concluded the dentist's report to me, 'especially coming from a very intelligent, two-feet-on-the-ground type of person.'

"The woman had been instrumental in founding a hospital in the Philippines and was familiar with the country. When the newspapers reported the scene as she had dreamed it, she returned to the dentist's office to learn if, while anesthetized, she had called out any names, hoping she might help identify the unknown assail-The woman then was ants. greatly disturbed, regretting that she had not relied on the dream as a warning, and immediately after its occurrence radioed to her friend in Manila. She might have been able to prevent the murder. 'If only I had known,' she said."

After relating this incident, Dr. MacRobert disposes of the orthodox "production" theory of psychology, which holds that it is the brain which "produces" or secretes thought by a complex chemical and "quasi-electrical" process. This supposedly stems from an accumulation of sense impressions from the outer world.

If this were true, consciousness would reside in the brain, but brain surgeons, Dr. Mac-Robert points out have proved that there is "no area of the brain cortex indispensable to the existence of consciousness." Great sections of the brain can be removed by surgery without the patient losing consciousness or memory.

The inescapable conclusion, of course, is that matter is not essential to consciousness and that something beyond the mere filling of a material reservoir of sense perceptions accounts for consciousness and memory.

But stubborn adherence to the "production" theory has, in the past, interfered with a conscientous study of such things as hunches, prophetic dreams, premonitions, and intuitive flashes.

Now, however, psychiatrists who are endeavoring to find out more, says Dr. MacRobert, recognize that "memory is of the nature of spirit;" that memories, as Philosopher Henri Bergson said, are a part of the mind, and that the mind is distinct from the brain. (Dr. Gustaf Stromberg, the astronomer, has written extensively along the same line.)

"Intuition, in its various forms, is one of those real or apparent types of natural phenomena bearing upon the possibility of mental activity apart from the body," writes Dr. MacRobert.

This leads to the inevitable conclusion that the theory which lies at the basis of any understanding of psychic phenomen is true, namely: that every living thing is animated by a spirit or soul (or both, depending upon definition), which is capable of consciousness and conscious existence apart from the physical body.

Since the mind, therefore,

can function without the brain, it also may act upon or be acted upon by brains other than the one to which it is momentarily assigned by destiny.

Therein lies a clue to the mystery of intuition — which, of course, has yet to be solved by the interested scientists, but as Dr. MacRobert suggests, it is significant that they are at long last interested.

"The foundation for the materialistic view of mind has disappeared because no tissue seems to be necessary to preserve memory," his article states. "Thus, the chief stumbling block to the acceptance of intuition has been removed."



Victor Parkin, M.D., of Los Angeles, is one of the West's leading psychiatrists. In Southern California it is said that he has been an expert witness in court more times during his career than any other psychiatrist in that area.

He was formerly resident psychiatrist at the State Hospital in Patton, California, and was also at one time resident psychiatrist in the psychopathic department of the Los Angeles General Hospital.

In conclusion, Dr. MacRobert remarks that psychiatrists in the past "have been accused of bitterly resenting the existence and validity of psychical phenomena such as intuition and its relatives," but that "times have changed."

Dr. MacRobert had previously written in the Journal of Insurance Medicine (April, 1949) that parapsychology might open up a "vast neglected field of fruitful research" for psychiatrists and added:

"Should the next 25 years yield results in psychic research in any measure comparable to the results in physics in the last 25 years, a new era of enlightenment will result for man. But at present the surface of this area is merely scratched . . ."

His survey of 1943 showed that 68 per cent of the psychiatrists and neurosurgeons who responded to his inquiries believed they should "look into the truth and significance of these extrasensory and psychical happenings."

With this view, my friend Dr. Victor Parkin of Los Angeles concurs.

"I think," he told me, "that the increasing interest in things psychical and spiritual will become commonplace among scientific workers.

"Psychiatrists, I believe. should examine into every possible activity of the mind, and if they do not do so, it is by reason of a prejudice so stubborn as to set them apart from the scientific method and to expose them to valid accusations of bigotry.

"It is not scientific to prejudge any subject, nor does it do credit to the scientist to ignore a legitimate subject of inquiry or even damn it with faint praise.

"These realms of the mind are our great new frontier of investigation, and certainly the investigation, presentation and evaluation of those phenomena we class under the heading of 'psychics' must be fully and adequately considered if we are to cross the frontier and not remain stifled and imprisoned behind a barrier of orthodoxy."

The barrier must eventually give way, believes Dr. Parkin, so that the "increasing interest in things spiritual will become commonplace among scientific workers."

Why do not scientists accept the validity of psychical phenomena? Again, the answer: More and more of them are doing so.

But we are just beginning to hear about it.



seriousness explaining the various techniques employed in seances, supporting his knowledge with passages from the scriptures. The names of personal friends and well known mediums are mentioned, but even then he finds it difficult to be serious.

In the middle of his book, he describes an experience with a spiritual voice. He says: "Pat's rich brogue, genial wit and harmless horseplay keeps the seance in an uproar, so that he and his medium are always as welcome as two old cronics."

Incidentally, it was interesting to

learn that the city of Rochester had derived its name from the Great grandfather of the author-Colonel Nathaniel Rochester, who had served in the Revolutionary War.

Apart from all that, I had a swell time reading RHR's book. I liked its dispassionate tone, its home-spun writing in an intimacy like one relating incidents between chuckles. If there's any criticism, I'll have to lay it on the publisher's statement on the jacket. They claim having read the book with care, labeling it as a serious document "disturbing to the orthodox Christian," and as an "introduction to Spiritualism."

I hardly believe that even RHR will agree with such a statement to the extent that it was his pur-

pose to write anything serious enough to disturb anyone. Nor was it intended to introduce Spiritualism. For, had this been the case, RHR being an attorney and an astute student of the law, (he was formerly a clerk in the law office of Judge Lehman), would have certainly known how to present the evidence in a manner much more convincing.

No, this fine old man had found something beautiful in the passing of his son, something apart from the grief and sorrow that generally hangs with death, and his book was more in an effort to express the happiness he had discovered, so that others may be comforted as well.

Thanks again RHR for letting

me read your book. I enjoyed every word of it.
