Certain types of minds run rampant when first viewing materialization because the demonstration is so dumbfounding, startling and unbelievable that certain types of mind simply cannot accept what they actual-

At each of the seances conducted by Gloria, lasting anywhere from thirty minutes to several hours, much time was spent having the sitters thoroughly examine the room and the medium. Then introductory explanations were made by Juliette Ewing Pressing who was cabinet attendant at each seance. Mrs. Pressing pointed out that it was the medium's desire to have the cabinet curtains

closed and pinned shut, not with common pins, but with safety pins. This was done by one of the sitters at each meeting and at the medium's request so that she could not be accused. while the seance was in progress, of coming out of cabinet.

I attended many of these seances and in some instances, two or more materialized spirits appeared at the same time. The masculine voices and singing could leave no doubt in the minds of the sit-

It has always been my desire, or rather a whim, to be privileged to lie down on the floor in front of the cabinet during a seance and see whether or not a materialized spirit could walk over me. At first, I was told by Glora's guide, Dr. Gray, that he was not sure whether or not a contact of this kind would be injurious to the medium or not but sometime later, as an experiment, Jackie, the cabinet guide, would try the experiment.

After first ascertaining whether the vibratory elements contacted would be such that no harm could come to the medium, I did have this experience. Jackie, the cabinet guide, walked right over me. It felt much like a doll walking as the

ized spirit walked the length of my body. My head was in my outstretched arms as I lay prone. I could not see above?

And what does this prove. It proves that the results of ageold experiments are correct. Materialized spirits have been weighed and made very little impression on the scales. The weight varying anywhere from three to forty pounds, when the spirit, standing on the scales, appeared to be fully materialized.

Many times when I have been priviledged to stand back of a materialized spirit, little was discernible except the head. As we continue our research, we find we know nothing and when we admit such a plight, then

. about the Diaz Temple

My next engagement was at Charleroi, Pennsylvania which is in the Monongahela Valley. about twenty miles from Pittsburgh. Here I was to serve the Diaz Spiritualist Temple.

I went from Jamestown to Pittsburgh by plane where I was met by the Rev. and Mrs. Diaz and Captain Highsmith. It was rather thrilling to drive through the hills and see the great maze of burning lava exuding from the steel mills.

En route to Charleroi, we stopped for dinner at a most interesting place, Veerhagen's Market. Everything under the sun was for sale in this tremendous building and open market. A small portion was set aside as a restaurant. I have never seen anything just like it and was told it was quite a landmark around the Pittsburgh area.

It seems that each place I go, I am convinced more and more that Spiritualists are the most natural and the most hospitable people on the face of the earth. When we arrived in the spacious home of the Diaz family, I was accepted as though I had known them always.

The Rev. Diaz has lived and worked in Charleroi as a Spiritualist minister for about 30 years. He is well-known and obviously revered and loved by the town's people. He is affectionately called "Pop" by everybody. As we walked along the street, a voice would call out: "Hi, Pop"; a few steps further and again: "Hello Pop" or "Good Evening Pop."

The Diaz have quite a family of their own and in addition have adopted several children. When Captain Highsmith's wife passed away, the Diaz's raised his two daughters and made a home for the family. For the first several hours, I was meeting first one and then anothr and soon it became difficult for me to remember names and relationships.

That night we visited the Diaz church so that I could listen to some of the recordings and hear various types of discourses and phenomena that had come through Rev. Diaz's mediumship.

Although time did not permit me to have a private sitting with Rev. Diaz, I did judge from these recordings that his is a most outstanding and unique trance mediumship. One discourse that impressed me was given by famous "Mother Shipton," whose prophecies are internationally known. voice and personality were absolutely foreign to the man, C. P. Diaz.

On another record, I heard Mrs. Highsmith give a lecture through Mr. Diaz that was perfect in diction and enunciation. The voice was utterly feminine. It is very rare that one finds an instrument (medium) so completely free from voice colorization.

Upon our return to the Diaz home, in true Spiritualist hospitality, the entire family gathered round the table to have a midnight snack.

The following day was a bright and beautiful Sunday. A large auditorium was engaged for the afternoon and evening meetings as the Rev. Diaz's regular church has a small seating capacity. A local florist had arranged a beautiful background of ferns and great baskets of fall flowers. Quite a large crowd attended both services.

The Rev. Diaz followed my lecture with outstanding demonstrations of clairvoyance that absolutely and incontroveritibly proved the dead live and can come back to establish their identity.

There is very little fanfare with the Diaz mediumship. In a simple, direct, straightforward manner, he calls out a first name, designates the person in the audience to whom he desires to convey a message, and then follows with full names of both spirit and receiver. To all of which are added amazing bits of evidence that leave the audience completely spellbound.

A great many strangers attended these services and many expressed, to me, their appreciation and high regard for the Rev. Diaz's work.

One remarkable incident that occurred was this: During the time we were eating our dinner at the Veerhagen Restaurant, suddenly "Pop" said: "Tomorrow there is going to be a message that will be outstanding. I see the initials J. H. I hear John Henry Geer or Greer. There will be a letter he wrote concerning his findings and messages in Spiritualism. This letter was written in 1850, a hundred years ago. Somebody will have this letter in their possession.

"Because of its great age, this letter will be held between pieces of glass to preserve it. I never heard of anything like this and I don't know that I have ever had such a preliminary message before. We will wait and see."

So as to be sure to remember the incident if it came to pass, I withdrew from my purse an All-American Airway schedule and jotted down the data.

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HEALING CENTER

During the afternoon service the following day the Rev. Diaz gave forth just such, a message. A lady arose and produced this old letter which was between pieces of glass. She was not acquainted with Mr. Diaz and never at any time, had he been

told about this possession of hers. She told me that she was a school teacher and promised to write a little story about this

I can truthfully say that I cannot recall having heard any more convincing messages than those that were gvien through Mr. Diaz on those two occasions.

Another gift possessed by this remarkable man is that he is an accomplished pianist. Sometimes he is completely entranced and improvises music truly "out of this world." I personally heard several numbers and on the records there were also several renditions of such phenomena.

In one case, by the touch, I was satisfied that several people used the hands of the medium. To me, it was all quite thrilling.

Another thing that was amazing was that the Rev. Diaz pieces crochets beautifully, more so than any woman whose work I have seen. It all started several years ago when his health failed causing him to have sleepless nights. He was impressed, then told to buy needles, cord, yarn, etc. In the night, when he was unable to rest, he would get up and crochet for hours without even looking at the stitches. As a result, he has fully a half dozen exquisite afghans and several elaborate bedspreads.

The 'phone was constantly ringing for Rev. Diaz. There were numerous long distance calls — all requesting healing and help in their hour of need. Many people told me of the amazing healings made possible through his mediumship. Each morning at four o'clock, his healing guide, Big Eagle, awakens him. Diaz responds, arises and, through silent healing, ministers unto those who have called to him for help.

I doubt if all these achieve-

ments are known to very many people. I was so astounded myself that I felt this column would have been incomplete had I not related it.

Captain Highsmith promised to take down several of the recorded lectures for possible publication in *Psychic Observer*. When we print these sermons direct from the spirit world, I believe our many readers will appreciate them.

On To Columbus

My next trip was to Columbus, Ohio, to serve the Ohio Avenue Spiritualist Church of which the Rev. Ralph Whitney is pastor. Last spring I was scheduled to go to this church

but, because of an emergency operation, I was obliged to cancel.

Incidentally, this was the first time in my public service for the cause of Spiritualism that I have ever been forced to call off an engagement.

I had made my plans, all air as well as hotel reservations for Saturday, November 5th. On the previous night, I was in my kitchen with the water running (a time when I so very often receive clear and distinct messages for myself) when the thought came to me: "You had better leave tomorrow instead of Saturday."

When I went upstairs, immediately upon entering the room where my husband was, he

said: "I was just thinking, you want to be sure to be in Columbus Sunday and there could be a change in weather so I believe you had better leave tomorrow instead of Saturday."

That was enough for me. I knew that the guidance was correct so I obtained reservations for Friday and left the Jamestown airport at 3:59 p. m. The weather was reasonably good but by the time we made a stop at Oil City, Pennsylvania, we were advised that there was a storm and such congestion at the Pittsburgh airport that our plane must wait over here (Oil City) until we were advised by radio that we could land in Pittsburgh.

After more than an hour's wait ,we once again took to the air and finally landed in a regular lake of water, which I had to wade through without overshoes.

Then in the crowded and congested air terminal at Pittsburgh, I had to wait another hour or more and did not arrive in Columbus until almost midnight. I was beginning to think that my spirit guides wanted me to go through quite a nerve-wracking experience but when I arrived at the Deshler-Wallick Hotel and took the letter of confirmation from my bag to show to the desk clerk, I was surprised to see something that I had not noticed before—my reservation was made for Friday instead of the Saturday I had originally designated.

When awakening about 11:30 a. m. the next day, the skies were very dark and a light snow was falling. I later learned that no planes were leaving either Jamestown or Buffalo and that, to reach Columbus by train, I would have had a long lay-over.

And so, my guidance was correct. The spirit knows and shows when we keep en rapport through prayer and meditation.

I telephoned the Whitneys' residence and they urged me to come to be their house guest. Late in the atfernoon, they came downtown to the hotel and we dined at a well-known restau-

rant, the Mills. After a delicious chicken dinner, we went to visit the lovely church where I was to serve the next day.

The church was rather large, I should say it would seat 300. There are stained glass windows and the high cathedraltype ceiling makes it appear immense. Recently, the church has been completely redecorated, the walls having been painted a light cream. dark red carpet and oak pews face a mammoth pipe organ.

I don't know whether it was the beautiful vibration of the church, the tone of the instrument, or the ability of the organist, but it doesn't seem to me that I have ever heard sweeter music, especially the A. F. P. R. and he promised to come to Jamestown in the near future.

After chatting into the wee small hours of this dark and stormy day, we awakened Sunday to find sun shining brightly and felt that the angels of heaven were working for us. A telephone call informed us that if we would drive a few miles out into the country, a Mr. and Mrs. Hall would donate all of the chrysanthemums we wanted.

Minutes later, we hopped into the car and to their country place and in no time at all Ralph Whitney was absolutely bowed down under the great load of beautiful "mums" which we took directly to the church and decorated the altar. attend these meetings. Many outstanding messages were given to these strangers.

At the afternoon service, Ralph gave straight clairvoyance without billets. In the evening, he told the people to write their questions. These written questions were not taken up until he started the message service.

In times past, I have seen Whitney use the blindfold, but he said that recently, he had been subjected to such criticism that he decided to read the billets without the blindfold and without touching them.

After reaching those in the audience, he gave full names and details, and then asked: "Would you like to have your billet?"

When the people responded: "Yes," he put his hand into the basket, which was placed at the side of the altar quite a distance from where he stood, and at random pulled out each paper. Without looking inside, or even looking at it for that matter, he handed the proper billet to an usher who promptly took it to the right person. In every instance, he was 100 per cent correct.

It is only on very rare occasions that Spiritualist mediums give messages to those seated on the rostrum. However, with apologies, Mr. Whitney turned to me and said: "Do you know Marcella, an attractive darkhaired woman?"

"Yes," I joyfully replied because I am always thrilled to receive a message.

He continued: "This is a bit odd, but it seems that there is someone who is unable to make personal contact so Marcella is relaying the following message: 'Tell dear Juliette that I am so glad that Theodore sent the bracelet.' Does this make sense? This is a most unusual contact I am making but I hope you understand. Marcella nods her approval."

This was a particularly monvincing message because since the passing of my beloved friend, Winifred Graham (Mrs.

mother and daughter duet that was apart of the program.

To describe the Whitney residence on Bryden Road, I will start with the basement floor level, reached through an outside street entrance, which leads to the Rev. Whitney's class room and healing sanctuary. These rooms are very attractively decorated-walls covered with knotty pine all quite modern with one side of each room painted in a color to harmonize with the floor and draperies.

Though I did not have an opportunity to sit with him for trumpet work, I was told by many of his followers that the direct-voice mediumship of the Rev. Whitney is outstanding. I have invited him to serve the

The Ladies' Auxiliary, of which Mrs. Whitney is president, served a very excellent dinner to about 100 people. It is amazing how these ladies of the church can, apparently with such ease, handle dinners for such large crowds of people.

When I report the work of mediums, I often use the expression, "second to none" and I really mean it. After my lecture, both afternoon and evening, Rev. Whitney gave as conclusive evidence of the living spirit returning to establish identity as I have ever witnessed.

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MESSAGE

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THE PSYCHIC STORY

The Bible is a psychic book. Its pages throng with spirits and angels. It incessantly carries a message of spirit communication between our world and that future condition of existence, of which it is the object of instruction.

"Angels, principalities, and powers," as the apostle Paul states it, are the chief themes of the Hebrew and Christian Bibles. The supernatural events which are chronicled within their pages stir us to wonder and speculation regarding our future state; about the nature of God and the soul; happiness and destiny; and all that pertains to the great realities of life.

Inasmuch as we take the Bible as a book of authority we are bound to seek the true interpretation of its statements. Our reasoning faculties, coupled with present day experiences, scientific and otherwise, must determine for us the truth of what it relates.

A decalogue of universal spiriual laws cannot be chained and compassed within the confines of a single book or a single race of people. The true exposition of such laws requires the whole range of the ages of the human race.

This book of Jewish and Christian law is such a decalogue. We cannot find its complete interpretation solely through a single creed, or a combination of creeds. We must seek a universal understanding of spiritual truth.

Many passages of Scripture fail to harmonize with some of the tenets of the Christian religion. A very puzzling, though very dramatic account is found in these verses from the 27th chapter of Matthew's gospel:

52 And the graves were opened; and many bodies of the saints which slept arose,

and to prominently include full text of verses which definitely state the truths of spirit communication. Such verses found in the Christian's textbook should silence all doubt and confirm our contention that the Bible teaches Spiritualism.

May we make these truths our stay and consolation, and, in the thoughtful words of the poet Wordsworth, consider them to be "the fountain-light of all our day," and "a master light of all our seeing." May we say in our hearts, as he said:

"Hence, in a season of calm weather,
Though inland far we be,

Our souls have sight of that immortal sea Which brought us hither—

Can in a moment travel thither,
And see the children sport upon the
shore.

And hear the mighty waters rolling evermore."

We are tempted to philosophize upon the question of how these dead and buried corpses got back again into their graves: if animated into life and action, did they again pass through the agonies of physical death as they laid their bones down in calm recumbence?

In all theology there is no

consistent explanation of this weird happening. No other account in Scripture tells, or even hints, of buried human bodies rising from their graves and returning to those dark abodes.

If I had never heard of the philosophy of Spiritualism, which teaches that the soul of man is immortal and cannot see

death, I would believe in "the sleep of the dead." Under such a misconstruction of the truth, if suddenly there should appear to my vision the spirit presence of my grandmother, I would naturally conclude that she came forth from her grave. Whoever wrote of the startling events which attended the crucifixion of Jesus, has set down his ideas of the happenings in precisely the same manner,—

53 And came out of the graves after his resurrection, and went into the holy city, and appeared unto many.

I do not doubt that the *spirits* of the saints appeared unto many. I do, however, question the statement that the mortal bodies of the saints arose. It would be most difficult to imagine dead bodies reanimated and walking about. We must find a more consistent answer.

These saints "appeared" in the streets of the holy city. If their spirits appeared, then there was no need for their bodies to return to the graves which had held them. So, again, the chronicler has misstated the facts. He should have written:

"The spirits of the saints whose bodies slept in the graves appeared in the streets of Jerusalem!"

They were seen of many.

If they "appeared," they also disappeared when they were no longer seen by the fleshly inhabitants of Jerusalem. The word "appearance" is very significant. It is used several times to describe the spirit visitors of the New Testament. "Made visible" could be an apt way of describing a ghost. A celestial being that lives in accordance with a higher vibrational law certainly would have to register his presence through some law of vision that is connected with the coresponding laws of this world.

Luke records a very charac-

teristic event relating to the "appearance" of Jesus as a spirit:

"And their eyes were opened and they knew him; and he vanished out of their sight." - Luke 24:31

Now let us proceed in our interview with the ghosts of the Book of the Acts of the Apostles:

The psychic power that pervades the Acts of the Apostles is the fulfillment of the promise made to them by Jesus:-these close friends of the Master who were to carry on his teachings. Upon these psychic events is laid the foundation of the Christian church.

Luke has recorded in his gospel this great instigation of the leadership of the spirit world which so confirmed the words of Jesus Christ:

mortality. A new vision of heaven had been granted them. They now knew that Jesus as a spirit personality was with them: that he had become immortal in the same sense that they also would become immortal. His words and his presence were now living truth, and they preached henceforth words of living fire born of the conviction of absolute knowledge.

Luke begins his narrative by declaring:

- 1 The former treatise have I made, O Theophilus, of all that Jesus began both to do and teach,
- 2 Until that day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom he had chosen:
- 3 To whom also he showed himself alive after his passion (suffering-

spirit power is present, physical manifestation takes place. Here was "the time and the place." By special apointment the followers of Jesus were there to receive a sign from the spirit

The description of the haunted house reads:

- 1 And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place.
- 2 And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting.
- 3 And there appeared upon them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them.
- 4 And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. -Acts 2

Here was the manifestation of the mighty spirit power, called the Holy Ghost, - the pneumata haggion, from the spirit world! It appeared as a brilliant and firey light over the heads of each of them. Under its influence they were moved to speak in tongues: we could say they were entranced by spirits who spoke through them.

The Rev. Moses Hull says that they thought the disciples were drunk, and some mockingly said, "These men are full of new wine." Peter then stood up and preached to them:

- 15 . . . these are not drunken, as ye suppose, seing that it is but the third hour of the day.
- 16 But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel:
- 17 And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. -Acts 2

Peter argues that Jesus has caused this manifestation. Probably with him was that great company of angels that he spoke of in the Garden of Gethsemane, when the soldiers came to take him. The angels were with him then, and he left the earth to be with them in spirit.



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SUPERB MEDIUMSHIP

Arthur Ford Raymond Burns H. G. Burroughs

It is not uncommon for mediums to give information that staggers doubters and disbelievers. Even my doubts had to first be shattered, and this through Arthur Ford's medium-

The first evidence I had of his psychic ability was when as comrades of the Spanish-American War, Charles A. Bayne and I both of Washington, D. C., went to Camp Silver Belle, Ephrata, Pennsylvnia, and attended an auditorium seance.

Since Ford was a total stranger to us, we did not expect to receive a message but when the meeting ended and we strolled out onto the lawn, we were surprised when the medium came out and approached us.

Ford said he was not aware he had ever seen either of us; but that, as we entered the auditorium, he saw a lady and a gentleman walking with us.

Turning to Mr. Bayne, he said: "Her name was Elizabeth." To me, he said: "His name was Lawrence." That experience introduced my friend to Spiritualism. He had lost a daughter named Elizabeth a few months previously and I, incidentally, had lost a son named Lawrence, in 1903.

We were both speechless for a moment, as neither had ever heard of such things coming from a total stranger. Finally, Mr. Bayne asked: "Where did you get that information? It is correct but you are a total stranger to us."

Ford answered: "It did not come from any human living source."

Before this, my wife had been quite bitter against Spiritualism and didn't want me to have anything to do with it.

However, just to prove she was broad minded, she visited Camp Silver Belle with me some time later but was not interested in any of the programs. I did not insist nor did I care to disturb her line of thought.

On another occasion, last summer, Marion J. Desmond drove Mrs. White and me to

Silver Belle and as we rolled along, we talked about Mr. Ford and his sensational work in getting the code words from Houdini to his wife.

Quite naturally, Mrs. White was curious to see and hear this nationally-known medium, but first we attended a lecture and

heard some very fine clairvoyance by Rev. Raymond E. Burns, Stamford, Connecticut. And then, that evening, we heard more doubt-shattering mediumship by Rev. H. Gordon Burroughs, Washington, D. C. Mrs. White seemed interested, but, even so, she did not say too much.

The next forenoon when Ford was the scheduled lecturer and message - bearer, Mrs. White purposely chose seats in the second row from the front. Before very long, the medium said: "I hear the name 'Lawrence,' and he says that when he was but a child he fell into a little stream of water and drowned. Does anyone recognize him?"

Mrs. White nudged me and so I asked: "Is his name Lawrence White?"

Mr. Ford turned toward me: "Are you a veteran of the Spanish-American War?"

When I acknowledged as much, he questioned: "Did you leave a hand in the Philippine Islands?"

I shouted: "I did," to which the medium replied: "Lawrence says you are his father all right but you are not using your right name."

At this point, I explained that my father left this world when I was just a child and that my mother later remarried and that that was why I have been using my stepfather's

"Yes," Mr. Ford said, "your correct name is Malcolm Fa-

I replied: "That is right" and then the medium continued: "Lawrence adds that when you were only a few years old, you

were captured, or kidnapped, by the Comanche Indians and your stepfather rescued you by shooting the horse on which you were being carried away. Is that right?"

All this was absolutely true and most amazing to me because Ford had not the least knowledge of my childhood experiences. How could he, then, without spirit help, relate these details so perfectly and without a moment's hesitation.

Mrs. White marvels yet! She is not satisfied that any spirit of a deceased person gave it to him, perish the thought, but yet she cannot account for it in any other way.

There is an old saying: "A person convinced against his will is of the same opinion still." Even so, I am in no position to wonder much when other people cannot believe in Spiritualism for I remember that it took me about twentyeight years to accept it.

And this brings me to my early days of investigation, when I always insisted upon having some satisfying proof directly from a friend with whom I had made an agreement before she went to that other world.

You see, in the year 1929, I had made an agreement with Madge Forte Crofut, a woman I had known for fifteen years, that the first of us to go would try to come back to the other through the slate writing mediumship of Pierre L. O. A. Keeler. We agreed that the one who passed away first would answer the question: "How would you like to take a buggy ride this sunny afternoon?"

We chose Keeler because we believed his phase of mediumship—messages written on the inner surfaces of slates fastened together previously, or messages on paper or cards between such slates while they were being held by two people in full daylight-to be absolutely fraud proof.

We had witnessed so many demonstrations of his medium-

ship that we knew he never needed to resort to fraud, but yet, I could not make myself believe it had been done by any deceased person.

Now Madge had been confined to her home for a number of years with an ailment which, she had been told, would take her away within a year or so. The prophecy was correct for she passed away March, 1930.

It was not until 1933 that I made an appointment with Keeler by telephone. I did not mention what I wanted but I received plenty.

One of the several messages I received was signed "Moffett." Now Rear Admiral W. A. Moffett was one of the 73 persons drowned when the United States Navy dirigible balloon "Akron" sank off Barnegat, New Jersey, April 4, 1933—just two days previously.

That message read: "Sir: I am getting along all right. I wish you had known me. I am quite alive! One moment I was in mortal peril, the next peace."

I left that message at the former home of Admiral Moffet in Washington, but as usual nothing happened, however the message I received from Madge

and his spirit guide, "George Christy"

was most gratifying. It read, in part, as follows: "I am glad you remember me, even if I am out of your mortal sight. Don't say a word about buggies. I wish I could materialize an old mare and a buggy; then we; just you and I, could go out this sunny afternoon."

As a result of this evidence, my doubts vanished as swiftly as darkness in a dim room when an electric light is turned on. I have talked with spirits and they with me, and I have not the least doubt that I, too, will live on when my summons comes.

With Swaffer's Help

Merle Oberon, the film star, who recently conducted an investigation into Spiriualism following the death of her fiance in a plane accident is now convinced of survival.

Hannen Swaffer, one of Spiritualism's greatest propagandists, made this disclosure when part of his postscript to the series of articles on Spiritualism appeared in London's "The People."

Wishing to help Merle Oberon, who was at that time deeply distressed, Swaffer arranged a sitting for her with Lilian Bailey, the well-known English medium.

To ensure that the film star's identity was kept secret, Swaffer asked Mrs. Bailey to meet him at a house in Mayfair. The fact that the house belonged to Douglas Fairbanks was withheld from the medium.

"I myself opened the door to



Mrs. Bailey," Swaffer wrote, "in case the butler might mention a name and took her into a drawing-room where Merle Oberon— who was unknown to her—was waiting.

"Within a few minutes, despite the attempts of her spirit guide, who did not want his medium upset by a strange control, to stop him, the dead fiance entranced the medium. . . ."

The spirit assured Miss Oberon that he was well and happy and not suffering in any way. A further sitting with Mrs. Bailey was held afterwards.



Three weeks later Merle Oberon had tea with Swaffer and told him that she had pursued her inquiry on her own.

"She was perfectly satisfied that her beloved sweetheart had survived the grave. A few weeks before she had been a broken woman. She came to tea smiling and confident," Swaffer added.

Spiritualism in Germany

The religion of prirtualism and the Society for Scientific Spiritualism is receiving quite an impetus in Germany. This is proven by a letter recently received from Dr. Ing. Paul Brandt, Frankenthal (Pfalz), Wingertsstrave 14b Germany.

Dr. Brandt says: "Spiritualism which was subject to persecution in Germany is just being re-established. I am trying to serve this cause.

"Being the leader of a very successful circle and of the French Zone Branch of the Society, headquarters of which is in Hanover, I am a contributor of the "Okkulte Stimme" (Occult Voice), the only Spiritual-listic periodical which is published here. Incidentally, this is the only society of its kind in this country.

"Compared with the United States and England, Spiritualism is pretty well behind in Germany. We, as the leading Spiritualists, consequently need a lot of training from these countries. Friends in England have been sending papers and books on that subject, though

from the States, we practically have not received a thing so far. By accident, I got hold of copy No. 176 of the *Psychic Observer* the other day. In it, I noticed the "Dickson's Materializations by Mrs. Amy B. Marshall.

"Of course, it is still impossible to subscribe to the *Psychic Observer*. I would very much like to ask you to send me free copies of your paper to help me strengthen and develop Spiritualism right here in Garmany.

"Should you have a very few old copies or books you won't be able to sell, would you be good enough to send them to me, too? (Request granted.)

"I would appreciate your kindness very much. I realize that I am asking too great a favor and you can be sure that my friends and I would be very, very grateful if you could see your way to help us.

"Should you have interest for Spiritualistic or occult occurrences in Germany, I would be glad to give you short reports."

The late Edward Lester Thorne has manifested through numerous mediums throughout the world. He has made every effort to prove his identity through many mediums in various countries.

The latest evidence of this fact was disclosed in a letter just received from Florence Kingston, 14 West 48th Street, New York 19, New York.

and only then, is anyone able to take on new experiences. Scarcely are any two demonstrations just alike.

The photographs accompanying this article were taken by a Jamestown photographer, Louis H. Holmes. He is not a Spiritualist and his only interest in taking pictures was that they be made clear cut and reflect credit to his profession.

Holmes was made to understand that his job was to take the pictures and follow the instructions given by Gloria's guide. The lighting was also under the direction of the spirits and the pictures were snapped at periods ranging from five to forty second expo-

This is the first time Gloria had ever submitted to photographs of this nature. In fact, her mother, Lula, due to unfortunate experiences along this line years ago, was doubtful whether or not her daughter should agree to the experiment.

When Gloria first arrived at Jamestown, the matter of pictures was not discussed, but after she had been with us several weeks, she was given permission by her guides and so, another milestone of evidence has now been added to the mass of material now on file at this

There has never been a photograph of materialization published that has not been the subject of criticism, but this criticism usually comes from armchair psychic researchers or pseudo-Spiritualists who either never attended a seance or never looked at the mass of photographs published in such books as the Phenomena of Materialization by Schrenck-Notzing; or Geley's immense book, Clairvoyance and Materialization," or Crookes' Researches Into the Phenomena of Spiritualism.



In as much as this was the first time Gloria Taber had ever submitted to have these kind of pictures made, she was extremely nervous; so much so that many times, from the cabinet, her guide remarked, "My medium is standing rigid. I cannot make her sit down." This apprehension, for some unknown reason, seems to over-shadow most mediums when they allow themselves to be subjected to unusual circumstances; test conditions, recordings, or photographs. There is no accounting for this anymore than there would be for a person who takes a screen test for the first time.

It is also a fact, mentioned many times by various spirit guides, that when confronted with unusual circumstances, they, too, become apprehensive and overly meticulous because they recognize the importance of the job at hand. And why shouldn't they be; they are human

beings endeavoring to make it possible to present evidence that will shatter man's disbelief and make him know that the dead do live, can manifest, and return to prove their identity in various ways.

During the series of seances sponsored by the A.F.P.R., hundreds saw the materialized form (see photograph No. 1, page 1) of the dancing girl who, on many oc-casions, picked up the castanets, previously placed in the seance room, and with amazing grace danced from one to three minutes. Furthermore, during this dance there was no vibration. The willo-wisp movements were quick, precise, and at the same time an-

No one could put on a seance, if they had it in their mind to do so in an effort to prove the demonstration could be duplicated,—and present a human to duplicate this demonstration. Why? Because there is bound to be some vibration.

passed on years ago, — kneeling back of little Joyce who, incidentally, insists upon attending every seance and, in most instances, when the sandman does not interfere, she has her way.

The materialized forms, photographs 3, 4, and 5, are evidential in the sense that the original photographs show them to be of different height, facial expression, size of head, and general features. The right arm in photograph 5 is oversize, much too large for a form of that build and then, too, note the toes in this photograph. Some, who have seen the originals, even complain about this. If hands, faces, etc., can be materialized, why not toes?

Other critics may about the ectoplasm, the hems and general appearance but forget that the medium was examined and went into the room clothed only in a bathrobe. Mrs. Pressing saw to that. Surely no one could accuse Joyce of collusion. The photographer, definitely a non-Spiritualist, most certainly can be ruled out because all he was there for

was to take the pictures, and he did a splendid job.

The late Harry Price would say the ectoplasm was regurgitated or even secreted within the body of the medium. Asinine allegations, but gloated over by critics who never attended a seance of this kind.

The only one left to be accused is myself (R.G.P.) and right here let me say that if the time ever comes that I am ever a party to publishing anything I am not satisfied is authentic, then the PSYCHIC OBSERVER will cease to exist. I was there and should know what I am talking about. Whilst I am not infallible, I am satisfied the photographs appearing on this page are definite proof of materialization.

I receive many letters of praise and many letters of condemnation for my stand. The condemnation, though many times expressed in all sincerity, usually comes from those who have never read anything but anti-literature; articles published in some psychic research journals; or the ravings of conjurers, magicians, and pseudopsychic resarchers who scream fake and fraud. These hecklers claim they can duplicate, but seldom if ever present evidence to substantiate their claims, yet they claim to be scientific.

In all of these books, you will find photographs of ectoplasm and materialized forms. In each, the ectoplasm varies in structure. In some photographs the ectoplasm looks like netting; some like muslin; in others, some of the pictures show wrinkles and creases and what appears to be a hem; in still others, the photographs show holes, rips and what-not. The important thing is that anything is photographed at all and that the object photographed is separate and apart from the medium proven only when this same substance cannot be found in the room after the seance. In the seance with Gloria Taber, nothing of any nature was ever found in the room during her entire month's stay at the A.F. P.R.

It is hoped that, in the not too distant future, Gloria Taber and her mother, Lula, will again serve the American Foundation for Psychic Research and when they do, advance notice will be published in Psychic Observer.

Before the medium, Gloria Taber, entered the seance room, three women from the audience were asked to volunteer; their duty being to examine the medium and, if satisfied, sign a statement (see Statement No. 1. page 14). 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
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

STATEMENT No. 1 Those Who Examined the Medium Signed This Statement.

We, the undersigned, formed a committee to examine the medium, Gloria Taber. She removed all clothing. Then she dressed in a robe and slippers.

We were perfectly satisfied that nothing was concealed on her person or within the clothing. She carried nothing into the cabinet, not even a purse.

STATEMENT No. 2 Those Who Examined the Room Signed This Statement.

--+--

We, the undersigned, thoroughly examined the seance room located on the garden floor, 12 East Fourth Street, Jamestown, New York, and found the doors nailed shut and covered with black cambric, securely tacked. The doors were covered with weather stripping. The windows, nailed shut, were also covered with weather stripping and secured with bolts. There are no trap doors under the rug. No one can enter the room except through one door used for both an entrance and exit. This door is at the opposite end of the room from the medium's cabinet.

In the seance room, the heavy lined maroon brocaded drapes and the black cambric over the doors were examined. The plain chair used by the medium was also examined. The cables and wires leading to the air conditioner, lamps and electric record player were carefully checked.

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

Rev. Helene Gerling, Pastor of UPS Rochester Temple, Secretary-Treasurer; and Rev. J. Bertran Gerling, member of the Supreme Counsel of the Federation of Spiritual Churches and Associations, International Director.

The minutes of the meeting disclosed: 115 members in good standing, an increase of 44 over last year and chartered churches now 25, an increase of 11. J. W. Ring

Those who have been interested in Spiritualism for the past fifty years will remember an old-time medium, John Willis Ring, who still conducts seances occasionally at his home at 6371/2 W. Buckthorne Street, Inglewood, California. Like all other mediums, during his hey-day, he was both praised and condemned; and now at the age of 75, he calls himself a "has been" but says that it is better to be that than a "never was."

I asked Mr. Ring to give me a little history about his work in the field of Spiritualism. He says he was born in Scranton, Penna., 1876, and that, in 1884, his family moved to Kansas where he first became aware that he was clairvoyant. It was in his mother's prairie home that he saw his own grandfather, Nickerson; describing perfectly to his mother—a man he had never seen.

When little John was 13, his father had him sit in seances with E. H. Adams and John Disler where he witnessed physical manifestations for the first time.

At these seances, his family was advised to go to Paris, Texas, by an Indian spirit, "Sunrise," who guided them to the home of Stella Pollard who advised them to go to Galveston and open a church.

In 1897, Mr. Ring was ordained by Allen Franklin Brown, and after the 1900 disaster in that city, he became the pastor of the Spiritualist Temple of Galveston.

Some years later, a certificate of ordination was presented to

Mr. Ring by Harrison D. Barrett and Mary T. Longley, officers of the National Spiritualist Association at that time. Later he was appointed National Superintendent of Lyceums.

Ring's account of his life lists trips to Lily Dale, Chesterfield, and Lake Pleasant Camps where he met the late Guy Ballard long before his "I Am" movement was founded.

During his travels, Ring worked in Kansas, Oklahoma, and California; spending considerable time also in Buffalo, Cleveland, and Chicago where

he was invited to the rostrum by Cora L. V. Richmond. Mr. Ring visited Morris Pratt Institute in White Water, Wisconsin, when Moses and Mattie Hall were instructors.

Ring also remembers a Mrs. Niver, having met her at the M.P.I. She now lives in Los Angeles. Mr. Ring claims to have benefitted by correspondences with Andrew Jackson Davis. He knew Rev. E. W. Sprague, George W. Kates, Maggie Gaul, Georgia Gladys Cooley, George Colby, and the late Lucius Colbun.

Some years later Mr. Ring concentrated his efforts in California where he appeared on the platform with the late John Slater and Nettie Howell. He recalls the time he was pastor of the Progressive Spiritualist Church of San Diego which was chartered by the California State Spiritualist Association. He has been presented on the rostrum by Rev. Margaret Foley, Rev. Florence Becker, Rev. Minnie M. Sayers, and many others.

One of the outstanding contributions to Spiritualism cred-

ited to the eloquence of Ring was the time (1908) when he debated our case with the great Christian Evangelist, J. W. Chism.

A 285-page book, "The Great Debate Between Ring and Chism," now out of print, published in Headrick, Oklahoma, tells how Ring overwhelmed his opponent when he affirmed the subject: "Resolved, that the fundamental principles of Modern Spiritualism are identical with the spiritual basis of the religion of Jesus Christ."

Many readers of Psychic Observer will remember John W. Ring and I trust he will receive many letters from those who remember his good work; and even though 75, I know that there are many years of usefulness ahead for him. Although he did not say so, I feel there is some work he can do in churches on the West Coast.

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. about the Diaz Temple

My next engagement was at Charleroi, Pennsylvania which is in the Monongahela Valley, about twenty miles from Pittsburgh. Here I was to serve the Diaz Spiritualist Temple.

I went from Jamestown to Pittsburgh by plane where I was met by the Rev. and Mrs. Diaz and Captain Highsmith. It was rather thrilling to drive through the hills and see the great maze of burning lava exuding from the steel mills.

En route to Charleroi, we stopped for dinner at a most interesting place, Veerhagen's Market. Everything under the sun was for sale in this tremendous building and open market. A small portion was set aside as a restaurant. I have never seen anything just like it and was told it was quite a landmark around the Pittsburgh

It seems that each place I go, I am convinced more and more that Spiritualists are the most natural and the most hospitable people on the face of the earth. When we arrived in the spacious home of the Diaz family, I was accepted as though I had known them always.

The Rev. Diaz has lived and worked in Charleroi as a Spiritualist minister for about 30 years. He is well-known and obviously revered and loved by the town's people. He is affectionately called "Pop" by everybody. As we walked along the street, a voice would call out:

"Hi, Pop"; a few steps further and again: "Hello Pop" or "Good Evening Pop."

The Diaz have quite a family of their own and in addition have adopted several children. When Captain Highsmith's wife passed away, the Diaz's raised his two daughters and made a home for the family. For the first several hours, I was meeting first one and then anothr and soon it became difficult for me to remember names and relationships.

That night we visited the Diaz church so that I could listen to some of the recordings and hear various types of discourses and phenomena that had come through Rev. Diaz's mediumship.

Although time did not permit me to have a private sitting with Rev. Diaz, I did judge from these recordings that his is a most outstanding and unique trance mediumship. One discourse that impressed me was given by famous "Mother Shipton," whose prophecies are internationally known. The voice and personality were absolutely foreign to the man, C. P. Diaz.

On another record, I heard Mrs. Highsmith give a lecture through Mr. Diaz that was perfect in diction and enunciation. The voice was utterly feminine. It is very rare that one finds an instrument (medium) so completely free from voice colorization.

Upon our return to the Diaz home, in true Spiritualist hospitality, the entire family gathered round the table to have a midnight snack.

The following day was a bright and beautiful Sunday. A large auditorium was engaged for the afternoon and evening meetings as the Rev. Diaz's regular church has a small seating capacity. A local florist had arranged a beautiful background of ferns and great baskets of fall flowers. Quite a large crowd attended both serv-

The Rev. Diaz followed my lecture with outstanding demonstrations of clairvovance that absolutely and incontroveritibly proved the dead live and can come back to establish their identity.

There is very little fanfare with the Diaz mediumship. In a simple, direct, straightforward manner, he calls out a first name, designates the person in the audience to whom he desires to convey a message, and then follows with full names of both spirit and receiver. To all of which are added amazing bits of evidence that leave the audience completely spell-

A great many strangers attended these services and many expressed, to me, their appreciation and high regard for the Rev. Diaz's work.

One remarkable incident that occurred was this: During the time we were eating our dinner at the Veerhagen Restaurant, suddenly "Pop" said: "Tomorrow there is going to be a message that will be outstanding. I see the initials J. H. I hear John Henry Geer or Greer. There will be a letter he wrote concerning his findings and messages in Spiritualism. This letter was written in 1850, a hundred years ago. Somebody will have this letter in their posses-

"Because of its great age, this letter will be held between pieces of glass to preserve it. I never heard of anything like this and I don't know that I have ever had such a preliminary message before. We will wait and see."

So as to be sure to remember the incident if it came to pass, I withdrew from my purse an All-American Airway schedule and jotted down the data.

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
