

Shades of Harry Houdini

After Spiritualist mediums had been heckled by Harry Houdini over a period of 20 years; and after his wife, Beatrice, carried on for another 10 years, the public will now be "treated" to another re-hash of the whole sordid affair by a proposed motion picture release: "The Story of Harry Houdini".

According to the N.Y. Herald Tribune's "Movie News" column, the picture will stress, "exposes of phony spiritualists". The newspapers publicizing the picture, display their usual ignorance: (1) when they call all those who believe in Spiritualism, "phony" and (2) when they show they don't know the difference between a Spiritualist and a Spiritualist Medium.

At the recent Federation of Spiritualist Churches Convention, a letter of protest was sent to George Pal, Paramount Producer

In answer to a letter from Howard Brenton Macdonald, New York City, who asked that we also protest, the following letter was sent to the same George Pal:

My Letter to "PAL"

"Any Story of Harry Houdini' would not be complete without ALL the facts.

"Of course, I realize that in order to escape libel, the public may be informed there is no intent to condemn the religion of Spiritualism nor any of their mediums. I also know that in the film's attempt to present the 'truth,' the public may be led to believe that all mediums are fakes and frauds, and that the Great Houdini exposed all with whom he came in con-

"The premier showing of Beatrice Houdini's dastardly film, "Religious Racketeers", in Buffalo, N.Y., fall 1940, was run out of town by the Chiefof-Police when informed by me that Mrs. Houdini had lied and that she actually signed the statement. (See pages 37 and 48, attached booklet.)

"Unless you can state in your Spiritualist medium proven to be a fraud, this charge having been taken to court and the medium convicted, your proposed film will not have a leg to stand on when viewed by people who know the facts.

"You wouldn't dare incorporate ideas openly flaying Catholicism, or Christian Science, even if you had the facts pointing to fraud. Without facts, you would put the Spiritualists and the Spiritualist mediums in a bad light. I hope I am wrong." (Signed by R. G. Pressing)

Protest We Must

It seems a pity that Houdini, who, in his chosen field probably was one of the greatest, would stoop so low during his lifetime, to grasp free publicity by condemning all Spiritualist mediums.

HER INTENSE INTEREST IN Spiritualism and the Occult

After the accidental death of Film Star Maria Montez in Paris last September, the newspaper biographies emphasized her "fiery" temperament, her exotic screen roles and her Hollywoodian glam-

What they did not emphasize-because, of course, it was not so well known and not so appealing to the glamor trade—was her profound interest in all metaphysical subjects. Her keen, incisive intellect enabled her to grasp and appreciate profound philosophies with a facility beyond that of many students with years of training.

Her belief in the value of astrology as an aid in her everyday life was better known, for she set up horoscopes and was credited with some phenomenal analyses of her own and others' problems, based upon her interpretation of astrological charts.

Maria Predicts

I did not know her well, but I do know of my own knowledge that she once predicted to the hour when a moving picture studio would offer a compromise in a legal controversy with herand that was at a time when no settlement at all seemed possible. Her attorney called her a "witch" because she so accurately called her shots.

She vigorously urged a producer to start her "Atlanpicture at a time when she felt the zodiac configurations would be favorable. Later in court she told of how he rejected her advice.

"Too bad for him!" she commented tartly on the witness stand. And it was too bad, because the picture was not successful. She ended up winning a judgment for the "38,000," she said. "was still due under her \$100,000 contract for the film."

Montez Praises Book

While she used astrology as a tool to guide her life, she read extensively in other fields and was particularly well acquainted with the East Indian and other Far Eastern metaphysical philosophies. In this connection, she was fam-

iliar with the psychic aspects of these teachings and could relate numerous personal experiences to confirm her belief in an afterlife-in an afterlife where one's experiences and mental growth continue in a real world appropriate to the development of the individual.

Only a few hours before she left for Paris last fall, Miss Montez telephoned me and, though supposedly she was busy with her preparations for the trip, we spent a full half hour discussing my book, Telephone Between Worlds.

I say "we," but she did most of the talking. She had just received a copy of the first edition and was parti-

cularly generous in her praise -extravagant, in fact.

Her Real Interest

But the point was that she was able to evaluate my "reporter's report" of Rev. Richard Zenor's mediumship and the remarkable explanations of life and the universe which come through him on the basis of a wide knowledge of many kinds of teachings and with an amazing grasp of the deeper aspects of philosophy which a mere "glamor girl" would hardly be expected to understand.

Everyone said she was a remarkable girl, this Santo Domingo-born, conventtrained beauty with the reputation for tempestuous scenes and glamorous portrayals. Yet few probably knew of her remarkable intelligence and studious interest in all manner of things cultural and philosophical.

Couldn't Put It Down

She devoured ideas especially ideas about the nature of life and the "why" of its myriad manifesations, like a hungry child. (she told me during the last 'phone conversation, incidentally, that, she had been up most of the night, reading Telephone Between Worlds, because couldn't put it down.") But she judged the relative merit and substance of ideas with the mature wisdom of the ages.

On the screen, she was an actress-of renown. Off the screen, she often called herself a "showoff," but within herself she was as real and profound as a wise philosopher.

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

The medium is Mr. Neil Mc-Dougall, who is a member of the Goodwill Spiritualist Church of Bremerton, Washington, He is a past president of the church, hav-ing held that office for three years. He has also served the State Spir-itualist Camp at Edgewood, Wash-ington.

(**) She is not affiliated with any church, but helps as she can. During Mr. McDougall's term of office, she was the church musician. She says: "We have never been given the name from the speaker who gave this particular lecture. M')st of those who come have left their names behind them a long time before. The message was delivered in a small room in the basement of my home, having been built for spiritual development when the basement was put in. We meet in this room once a week. The room is used for no other purpose and as yet our teachers have allowed no one but ourselves to enter for the past three years. My assistance means that I give power and strength to the medium—battery I suppose would be the name for it. I also take care of the recording machine upon which the message is taken down, later to be transcribed. My work is the transcribing and typing.

We have since received a message concerning the recently signed Peace Treaty at San Francisco. It was given to us the night before the day the Treaty was signed.

For the past 50 years, the maligning of Spiritualists has been so systematic, so relentless and so well timed, that the planning back of it all is obvious and chance or happenstance can be ruled out. If a militant approach is not taken now, by all Spiritualists, it is a question whether this trend can ever be curtailed. It is worth a try. We have done and are doing our part. Now we ask for the help of all who take pride in calling themselves Spiritualists.

We are approaching a favored time of the year for those who would heckle Spiritualists . . . Halloween. It was on this night, each year, for ten long years after Harry died, that Beatrice Houdini pretentiously set herself up in a pent-house seance room in either Hollywood or New York Cityalternating each year.

Before holding her mock seance, claiming she wanted to see if Harry would speak to her (no medium ever was present) Beatrice would call in all available newspapermen-saying she was going to make another attempt to contact the spirit of her husband. The newspaper men always ate up the story,-Halloween night you know, -the night when ghosts and goblins are supposed to appear.

Of course, nothing ever happened, Beatrice got her story 'that her husband again failed to return' and thus this dastardly yearly hoax would again blaze in headlines: "Houdini Fails Again" and millions, who never read 'pro' literature, were misled.

Checking Up On

Mother Shipton

I have always been interested in the unusual prophecy of Mother Shipton and I was doubly interested reading the column about her in Psychic Observer, September 25th, 1951. Here is why:

Twenty-five years ago, my aged mother died. In her belongings, we found an ancient hand-written copy of the "prophecy", written not in my mother's handwriting, but by an aunt. That would set the date back a lot of years. This version ended as your article ends, giving the last date 1881.

Recently, instead of the traditional 1881 date, our poets and scribes have altered the last lines, changed the rhyme to fit a later date, their reason being that the world "didn't end in 1881 as the prophecy said, but kept right on going". So, the final date, 1881, having been "disproved", a new date had to be injected. And too, the whole prophecy was, of course, thrown into the discard as being just another of those idiotic things of which there are scores, and none of which ever 'came true". But, let's see.

Spiritual Changes

Great changes in this world are often dated from the birth of a Moses, a Jesus, the date being the beginning of the New Age. Several races and countries date themselves and their country from such births, because the birth of that man started a new era, indeed a New World, so to speak. "The world" has, since time was, been dated for and by the people living in it.

When it was said the world was coming to an end, it meant the "way of life" would come to an end, a cycle, an era, or what-net. Man was to start on a new course of development. It has been foretold several times that great changes would come about. Let's examine this 1881 matter.

It must be admitted that our entire world has but recently taken on a new face, new ways of thinking, new ambitions, new thoughts, new spiritual insight. Great political changes and alterations have been brought about within the life-time of many of us. This is not entirely due to the material forces, such as the age of machinery, and the multitude of mechanical alterations. They are but a reflection in the mirror of our minds. The big changes have taken place in the spiritual

It is common talk that the changes that have taken place in the past three quarters of a century have been more than in all the rest of recorded history. That statement is not only easy to say, but is easy to prove. It is but a matter of fact and record. Then, if that is so, that the changes of the past 75 years have been greater than all the rest of recorded history, doesn't that lead us to believe that the old ways of life came to an end back there? I think it does.

The "FDR" Era

Now, if we were to send a questionaire all over the world, to every race, creed and color, and ask them, individually, to name the one and only man they all knew, the one man they looked up to as working in their humble interests, for a better way of life for them, whom do you say they would name? Well, my guess is that there was only one man whose name and work

was known, and it was known to every individual in the world, in all the nooks and corners, into the farthest parts of the planet.

That was of course "FDR". And he was incarnated in the very early part of 1882. (Dates are not recorded in ancient history from the time of an event, except the event of birth. The Christian era, for instance, doesn't date from the year 33

when Jesus was crucified, but rather from his birth. An era stopped; another began when Jesus was born. And the date and time and place of birth to the seers of that day, for was all apparently well known they came to pay their respects. Herod also knew. A tremendous epoch had come to a close.

A List of "Firsts"

Beginning in the early eighties, came a new era in spiritual thinking. Those of us who can remember back to those days recall vividly the seances in New England, especially in Boston. Indeed, some of the greatest mediums date from those times. In other spiritual fields, not too far removed, were the great religious revivals; great choirs; great preachers and singing. Even Fiske University in Tennessee broke loose with harmony, sending (for the first time in history) their great Fisk Jubilee Singers all over the country and to Europe. This happened in the early eighties also.

The rise of Mary Baker Eddy dates from the early eighties. And not exactly in the same category, but who knows? came mesmerism, catalepsy, and many specialists in those arts travelled the country. I personally recall the great Reynolds, Flint, etc. No one up to that time had been hypnotized in public.

If we make a list of the "firsts" which occurred in the early eighties, we are amazed. Indeed, spiritual forces, spirit-

ual thinking, and related thinking, blossomed out during that period.

This is but one man's opinion but, being here in America, I am allowed to say it. My considered opinion, based upon a myriad of facts, many more than mentioned above, is that an era stopped in 1881 and a new one was born early in 1882. From that date, stems the great interest shown by the whole world in the spiritual forces rather than the material; in the greatness of an individual rather than the collected herding of human beings.

This brings me to the point of saying that I think Psychie Observer erred slightly when the date 1881 in Mother Shipton's prophecy was passed over as an error. I think the old gal had that correct also. So now, come on you readers. You have your say. I've had mine.

It is interesting to me to realize now that it took a "tongue-in-cheek" article published in "Colliers" about three years ago to put me on the road to Spiritualism.

As I read the article, written with a sort of amused tolerance, though apparently in a friendly vein, I was half indignant, yet thoroughly glad, for it did mention Ralph Pressing, and the Psychic Observer, which was all news to me, and the next morning saw a letter in the mail with a request for a sample copy of the Observer, followed by an order for two yearly subscriptions, one for myself and one for a sister in Wisconsin, I wonder how many new subscribers the article secured for them?

How It Started

As I read the first issue from "cover to cover," I did not fail to discover that in my own community were several churches, and yet I had been teaching school here in Seal Beach, California, for twentyfive years and had never learned of any. In that time, however, I had read every book on the subject I could find in the Long Beach Public Library and it does carry a pretty good Psychic Section.

And so, in a short time, I found myself attending divine services conducted by Rev. Lola Reddig; and not too long after that, a member of her Monday night development class. In the light of my new teaching, I can make my own interpretations, and this I do with increasing pleasure.

Spirit world seems to have selected me for several healing experiences. I have always believed in Divine Healing, studied Christian Science for three years; still read Unity literature with much appreciation, and acknowledge here the help received from both when I have asked for help and have cooperated. But it remained for a Spiritualist seance to give me an instantaneous healing without even requesting or expecting it.

· An Open Mind

I had been suffering with an ingrown toe nail for years, and finally came the day when there was nothing more to be done but remove one-third of the nail, clear to the root. And that very night my class met.

If you can imagine the surging, throbbing pain of that surgery, after the anesthetic wore off, you will be surprised that I went. Well, so was I. I had not dreamed of it but at the very last moment, one foot encased in a bedroom slipper, I limped into the class room, ferto be careful.

As the lights went out and the red light came on I said to my neighbor, to whom a boisterous Indian frequently came during class, "Just keep that big Indian off my toes, please."

Miraculous Healing

The usual manifestations took place. One member of the class had a trumpet with a luminous band and it was always possible to tell just where that trumpet was. After it had whirled around the ceiling with such incredible speed the eye could scarcely follow it, it suddenly made a dive toward my feet.

I was holding my throbbing foot straight out from my chair and perhaps twelve or fourteen inches above the floor, and I quaked inwardly as the trumpet came so near. Frequently we are tapped by the trumpets -not always too gently-on shoulders, knees or face.

I was apprehensive, but nothing occurred except that the large end of the trumpet was observed by all the class to go round and round my extended

foot, yet never once touching the aching member.

Someone said "Alice is getting a healing treatment." But I was so new to it all-that was about my fifth or sixth attendance-that I did not take it seriously. Indians came in numbers and force that night and shook the room with the beat of their drums and rhythmical

Then came the period of the blue light, and during that time one of the class members announced that she saw a kneeling figure working around my foot. I neither saw nor felt a thing, but a little later as we sat in complete darkness, I suddenly realized there was no more pain; no throbbing; no ache in that foot. It never gave me another minute of trouble, and even at school (where my small first grade children frequently crowded around me to the utter ruin of my shoes).

I was protected for no one ever stepped on that foot. The

incident was closed in that class room. When I returned to the chiropodist for redressing and treatment, he said, "I never have seen anything heal as this has done." And I did not dare tell him a thing.

More recently, I have been the victim of sudden and violent attacks of dizziness that rendered me completely helpless at times, and other times threatened me with a recurrence so that I was afraid to leave home. It soon became apparent that as sure as Monday night came and I was to attend class, one of these attacks would put in its unwelcome appearance.

Some times I missed the class; but more frequently started out wondering if I would get there safely. One night as we sat in the red light, our hands joined in the circle, one of the attacks suddenly descended upon me and I sat in the darkness praying that I would not fall out of my chair. When we were given the opportunity to tell what we had experienced, I told them what I had gone through.

Rev. Reddig immediately sensed my condition and spoke the word of release with authority and assurance. I left the class room feeling well and furthermore, in the six months since then, I have had no return of this unpleasant condition, for which I am grateful beyond words.

Of course, my parents and teachers talk to me through the trumpet as they do to all the others in the class, and they are always welcome guests. But it

"Earth in Capable (God's) Hands"

. . . this was the outstanding message, received from the spirit people, by THOMAS F. OPIE, D.D., when he attended a series of convention seances during the recent SPIRITUALIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH conference held at Chesterfield Spiritualist Camp, Chesterfield, Indiana.

Opie Reports S.E.C. 1951 Conference

Thomas F. Opie, D.D.

"Your earth was created by God. It is in capable hands. Man really has nothing to worry about. And yet men actually garb themselves in the robe of worry-and find themselves floundering on the Mountain of Confusion.'

That statement, from one of the Masters who manifested at Chesterfield, Indiana, during the eleventh annual conference of the Spiritualist Episcopal Church held at Camp Chesterfield from August 31 to September 3rd, might be said to be the key to the door of current troubles in the world at large. The whole conference, by an objective as well as a personal look, blue-printed a way out of world chaos. It gave ample evidence of the oneness of divinity and humanity-of contact as between human folk and the Celestials.

Riffle-The Pioneer

The conference opened with a banquet never-to-be-forgotten-if for no other reason, because of the terrific heat-even the mercury climbed to an alltime high. It was said to have hit the red to one degree below an even hundred. This scribe, coming from the cool hills of the Berkshires in Massachusetts, does not recall ever having to compete, as a speaker, with Old Man Hotter!

Even the old-timers agreed that it was just about the hottest display of atmospheric sulphur they had seen in the history of Chesterfield. So far as the attire of the men was concerned, that was only semiformal, as every last male threw his coat to the winds, and most of them, including the banquet speaker, turned up sleeves and prayed for rain.

Lloyd Chase, cheer-leader, did all in his power, and that was considerable, to make us forget Mercury and court Harmony. The toastmaster, Rev. Austin Wallace, managed to better the heat-element with his wit and his swift darts at various celebrities present, and Rev. Mable Riffle, the crusading pioneer of Chesterfieldian Spiritualism, in her official greetings and graceful welcome to the guests, achieved the almost impossible by detouring thought away from Heatdom.

What "Psyche" Means

Rev. Thomas F. Opie having traveled about a thousand miles to be on hand as the guestspeaker, insisted that he "just had to talk," though like the "poor fish," to which he referred in passing as being unable to "close his eyes" or to "sit down," was "all wet" with perspiration, but managed to keep the banqueteers from falling into desuetude. His subject was, "Psyche-Whence and Whither Psychology?"

He asserted that until modern times, the word "psyche", which derived from the Mythological Miss Psyche, never meant anything but "Soul." She was so pellucid, so pure and so beautiful that she personified the soul. But when modern medicine came on, and could not locate the "soul," they wiped it out of the lexicon and substituted the word "mind" in its place.

He felt that Spiritualists in general are about the only true "psychologists" left in the world-for they truly deal with the "psyche" and have not

prostituted her to a lesser place in the world of thought.

The other so-called "psychologists," he insisted, are practicing "mentology," not the psyche-ology which has stood for "soul" for several thousand annums.

Colossal Event

"The mind is no more the Soul than the electric bulb is the powerhouse," he said-"no more is the mind the soul than the hum of a bee is the bee itself-only one emanation, one channel of vibration, coming from the Source, the Soul, the Ego, the true Self."

As one who has followed phenomena for many years and who has endeavored to keep up with psychic demonstrations and with the Spiritual Church in all of her phases of mediumship, I feel certain that this country has never witnessed a more lifting, a more thrilling, a more convincing and indeed, a more dramatic series of objective phenomena at one time than was furnished on Saturday evening, for four hours, in practically every known phase of mental and physical mediumship.

To undertake to relay the impressions of that colossal event to those not present to witness it for themselves, would be like trying to bring Heaven down to this dull sphere.

I Met 50 Mediums

It simply staggered imagination to see and to hear such master-mediums as Edward Mackey, lecturer, clairvoyant and direct voice (who proved a genius at "mastering the ceremonies" on that memorable occasion and also at demonstrating his own phenomenal mediumistic powers); James Laughton, clairvoyant and direct-voice; Clifford Bias, precipition, clairvoyant and directvoice: Maud Fox, apport, clairvoyant, direct-voice and precipitation; Fred Felix, Charles Swann, Robert Chaney, red light trumpet levitation; John Bunker, apport-medium par excellence and Dorothy Hiett materialization medium. Every one in his own phase of mediation was superb.

It amazed me to see such phenomena and such adeptitude at serving as contacts between two worlds-at mediating the Celestials so that they might make themselves-known and convey their messages so convincingly to loved ones on this plane-and yet to associate with the mediums in their homes on the lawns or at meals and find them so utterly normal in all human relations. There was nothing fanatical about a single medium whom I met, and I met fifty or more.

"Spirit of the Lord"

They were all just plain folk -regular people-and they all met me on a common basis, discussing with me any subject that might come up. In the days of the ancients all of these folk would have been classed as "inspired" messengers-as "prophets", "seers" and as God's Agents on earth.

Truly "the spirit of the Lord" is upon them. Their ministry is timely, impressive, far-reaching-and they prove continuity and demonstrate beyond cavil, "communication" as between us of the here and them of the

To watch and to listen to Cliff Bias, James Laughton, Bob Chaney, Ed Mackey, Fred Felix —or Nellie Curry, Maud Fox or John Bunker, as I did, in their superb clairvoyance demonstrations, as they gave hundreds of evidential messages from

hosts of "Humans-in-Spirit" to scores of men and women, including myself-and yet to withhold credence in the authenticity and the soundness of their work would be like listening to the radio or visualizing the television and denying what our own ears or eyes were disclosing to us.

I cannot make it too strong that here was reality, here was divinity, here was absolute and certain contact with beings no longer seen around here, but who have only gone into another plane of life-unseen to us, but as real as rain and still loving us and guiding us and no doubt helping us in many unsuspected ways as we go about this earth and its material affairs.

Based upon "on-the-spot" exena, gained when reporting the S.E.C. conference, his recent lecture on Spiritualism before the Episcopal clergy of the Berkshire Clericus (Massachusetts) aroused more interest than any subject presented there during the past ten years.

As a result, his 50-minute paper was discussed for over two hours . . winding up with the clergy relating their own psychic experiences. The discussions were friendly. Nobody was accused of ecclesiastical

When Rev. Opie had the last word, he said:

'Spiritualists are the true "psychologists", since they are admittedly dealing with the "soul"-which is not the "mind", inspite of modern psychology (which is nothing but "mentology", since it admittedly deals with the mind) and the psychiatrists, who, so long as they interpret "psyche" as meaning the mind, are perpetrating a hoax and are "dealing with symptoms"-seldom getting at the real cause and center of emotional and so-called "mental" ills-which is the "personality", the "self"-the Soul."

So much interest was shown in the subject that the chairman suggested that Rev. Opie undertake to procure a bonafide medium for demonstrations of phenomena at a later meeting of the clericus. Spiritualism is, indeed, overflowing its

first time was Charles Swann's "precipitation." I believe it is rather new to Spiritalism, though it has been traced back by some to "Veronica's Veil," of early Christian tradition-upon which the face of the Master was believed to have been psychically imprinted.

I had in my hand and saw close-up dozens of these "paintings" received by numerous people through the subtle mediumship of Mr. Swann, He told me that it was through his own grandfather in the world of spirit that he got his first "picture" through sensitized

That was four years back, at Chesterfield, and he has developed this phase of phenomena until now he gets pictures done on rayon crepe cloth-a very delicate fabric, which absorbs and retains the colors used by the Spirit Artist or any other communicator-which colors are furnished in ordinary ink-bottles, by the medium working, as he sets out these containers and the squares of white cloth, on a table before the folk privileged to witness this, and to obtain paintings, which no human hands, no seen brush or other accessories feature in the process of devis-

Mass Demonstration

It is Spirit Painting-not "spirit photography," with which it is sometimes confused, No camera or kodak is usedand the work is done in toto by the manifesting Spirit. I saw several such exhibits with as many as ten or a dozen faces, many of which were identified by the recipient-including a loved and lost doggie, in the lower left corner.

Robert Chaney of Chesterfield also demonstrates in the field of painting-precipitation, together with his remarkable "red-light" trumpet manifes-

In the mass-demonstrations, staged in the 2000-seat auditorium which I observed objectively from a front seat-center, such celebrities as Mary Baker Eddy, Madam Schumann-Heinck, Princess Irene, Amie Semple McPherson-and a soldier who had recently been a casualty in the Korean struggle .. . all materialized through the mediumship of Dorothy

The Princess made a dazzling appearance, said a few significant words of cheer and good greeting and was gone. Mary Baker Eddy, a tall white-haired figure, manifested out front center of the large stage, as did Schumann-Heinck, not ten feet from where I sat.

A Staggering Seance

The latter explained her appearance with the words, "You know we have no 'jealousies' here." The great singer was whimsical and said, "In view of the heat you have been having, I will not sing 'Keep the Home Fires Burning," but shall sing my favorite, 'Silent Night' "-which she did sing with a tremendous volume, heard throughout the hall. It was a staggeringly convincing demonstration of materializa-

While the Rev. Mr. Chaney was in trance, a Figure who has been announced as one of my own spirit-guides, "Master Hicks," delivered a vocal address to the large assemblage, in which he urged that we "seek not a God" who is "far away in space," but "seek the God within you."

He added, "The imagined 'God' far off in space is "too far away to help you", but "the God within your own being is always at hand-Divinity within every soul."

Several of the mediums, at one time or another during the conference proper, contacted two or three persons, deceased only the previous day, and one medium spoke for a soul actually in the act of leaving the body in death. These persons were identified by present loved

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
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

the magnetic person of the Rev. John Bunker, at which there were thirty of us completing a circle, the air was alive with laughter and psychism. Everyone in the room received an apport. A lovely lady near me, a Mother of a departed soldier, had a demonstration that was touching to the last degree.

Apport Demonstration

On a former occasion, she had received a "purple heart", which she had misplaced or lost. Her son presented to her a beautiful "red heart" saying that he "wanted to keep the purple heart" which he had apparently taken over privately, in some way not explicable to the human mind, and would "give Mother the red one."

I myself received an exquisite stone carved with the most delicate design imaginable the figure of an old Roman soldier with helmet. A jeweler later identified it as a "hemetite attagio." I call it "Perfection" in miniature.

One of the Masters gave us some thoughts by way of lecture that impressed me. "There is no irreverence in laughter," he said. We had been quipping with "Thistle", Mr. Bunker's Spirit Guide, and the whole seance circle was really in uproarous glee, laughing unrestrainedly at the whimsical remarks of Thistle (said to be an Old Soul who was on the earth more than two thousand years ago) - and at each other, "The world needs more joy-more fun-more laughing spirit."

Again, "The human mind is like a parachute. If it does not 'open', the man crashés." And this, "He who loves nothing goes crazy."

Independent Card-Writing

When we stepped upon the piazza of the cottage of Mary Langley Beattie, one of the elderly and pioneering spirit-mediums of Chesterfield and of New Carlisle, Ohio, she said, "Two of your sisters in spirit are with you. You may have more sisters in spirit, but two of them, a youth and an elder sister, walked by your side." I have two lovely departed sisters who had previously come through from the heavenly places.

In her demonstration of cardwriting, or precipitation, Mrs. Beattie had me hold the cards, together with several pencils which she supplied. When we examined the cards after a brief period one of mine contained this legend: "Tom, we from the angel side of life are proud of you. We, too, enjoy many indescribable blessings and do share many of our joys with you. Mother Ida." Another had this: "Greetings, Thomas. You have mastered many problems and will leave marks on the sands of Time. Bishop James Freeman."

Excusing the "personal", there was absolutely no possible way by which this exercise could have been trumped up or in any manner fakedanybody on this planet to the contrary. It was as genuine as a letter from home, believe me.

Symbol of Life

At a public demonstration in the auditorium, I received from my celestial mother a beautiful little cross, with this statement, through Mr. Bunker's agency while in a trance and working under the guidance of "Dr. Gonzales" his Spirit Guide, while I and another from the audience held his hands, extended as high as we could reach, as if in supplication: "I have cut out the 'Figure' from the cross because I know that you, with me, regard the cross as a symbol of Life and not of "Death."

U. S. A. Delegate To Sweden Rev. Melvin Smith

The International Spiritualist Federation World Congress was officially opened September 1st in Stockholm, Sweden. Speeches of welcome were given by representatives of the various Spiritualist Societies from the Scandinavian countries. Dr. Folke Bergman, President, of the Swedish Spiritualists Union; G. V. Ekstrom, President, Northern Spiritualists' Union; A. C. Mortensen, President of the Danish Church Union and H. Krohn, President of the Helsingfors Society.

A special choir, made up from members of the society, led by Dideon Eckstrom gave some special musical selections. Ernest Keeling, President of the I. S. F., Liverpool, England, responded to the various speeches of welcome. He said in part that it was a joy and privilege for the delegates to assemble from all parts of the world in the beautiful city of Stockholm.

Mr. Keeling commended Rolf Carleson and his committees for the splendid job they had done in preparation. He said it seemed that almost from the moment they had arrived at the railroad station they had been so well taken care of.

Congress Events

Mr. Keeling particularly pointed out that, regardless of what part of the world we came from or the language we spoke, we could still meet on the one common ground and knowledge as presented by Spiritualism.

He said that if our background be Christian, Jew or Mohammedan, if we are to meet together for a common good we must go beyond the limitations of any one creed and be broad enough in our perceptions to include the other man's viewpoint.

A dinner of welcome was held in the Hotel Malmen. There were some four hundred persons present. All delegates from out of the country, were guests of the Swedish Spiritualist Union. There were twenty countries represented.

Mr. Carleson called upon representatives from the various countries for a few remarks. I showed films taken during the last Congress in London.

The events of the Congress might well be divided into four categories, namely: business of the Federation; the presentation of papers; demonstrations of clairvoyance and specially arranged side trips in and around the city.

The business sessions started September 2nd. Only officially elected delegates could take part in the business sessions. Routine business affairs and some changes in the By-Laws were attended to in the earlier sessions.

Executive Committee

Elections were held on Friday. P. J. Hitchcock was elected president, to replace Ernest Keeling. Ralph Rossiter, was elected Treasurer in place of Mr. Hitchcock.

Both Mr. Hitchcock and Mr. Rossiter are from London. They are members of the Marylebone Spiritualist Association, I was elected a member of the Executive Council for six years.

Other members of the Executive Committee: David Bedbrook, London, Secretary; Rolfe Carleson, Sweden; Andre Dumas, Vice-President; Mme. St. Clair, Paris, France; Mdm. L'-Homme, Liege, Belgium; and Leonard Lloyd, Johannesburg, Africa.

Clairvoyance was demonstrated on various evenings by English speaking visitors, Rolfe Carleson acted as interpreter in each case. It is a law in Sweden that only members of the Society can attend a public meeting of Clairvoyance, There are some 800 members in the Society in Stockholm and so the evening attendance was good.

Bertha Harris, London, gave a brilliant performance of independent work and at the close, she was given a long applause.

Musical Mediumship

Rev. Smith, America, demonstrated psychometry of billets. At the close of the demonstration, the chairman said, "In America they are known for doing things fast, certainly Mr. Smith has upheld the American style in an admirable way tonight."

Mrs. Margit Selin, formerly of Finland, and now from Stockholm, demonstrated her remarkable gift of musical mediumship. Born in 1897, she married a judge and is the mother of three children. She received only an insignificant elementary instruction in piano playing. But . . . in the presence of her husband and other favorably disposed musical persons she plays, in a slight trance, piano music which is surprising discussed. A written invitation and overwhelming both in the technical and in the musical respect

Mrs. Selin's selections often resemble the style and spirit of well known composers or they are merely romantically enjoyable. Her technical performance is remarkable for she never practices regularly nor has she the pianist's well trained fingers. Certainly it is convincing evidence of life after death.

Sharp's Auragraphs

Staveley Bulford, President of the Psychical Research Association, Brighton, England, gave a most wonderful evening of his 40 years research. His lecture was illustrated with lantern slides on his work in Paranormal Photography and some experiments with voice recordings. A series of slides showed the progress of his work and the work of the spirit to produce the photographs.

One most interesting finding was that six cameras were used and flashed simultaneously. The spirit extra never appeared but upon one of the finished photos. This proved to Mr. Bulford that the extra was created on the inside of the camera for if it were external each camera would have recorded the extra.

Mrs. Leonard Lloyd, South Africa, demonstrated independent clairvoyance. Her pleasant manner of delivery was graciously received by the audience.

Harold Sharp demonstrated his beautiful gift of mediumship in his many colored auragraphs. His work was much in demand. Mr. Sharp is an English medium.

David Bedbrook, also of England, demonstrated spirit healing. At the close of the Congress, several persons attested publicly to the help they had received.

Sightseeing Tour

In connection with healing a film was shown of Harry Edwards. He carries on his work in a beautiful and large old home which he purchased and turned into a center. Besides a stream of people coming there daily, many letters are answered. He goes into silence and his staff of stenographers do the

There was a sightseeing trip around the city, by motorcoach, and through the famous Town Hall. Indeed it is magnificent. There followed a luncheon at Bellmanstro Restaurant, one of the finest in Stockholm, located near Skansen, where there are many old homes, a very old church, a large outside musical arena.

There was a boat excursion through the waterways around Stockholm and out into the Baltic Sea. It was a most beautiful

Another motorcoach trip was made to Millesgarden, the home of the famous Swedish sculptor, Carl Milles, whose work is known throughout the world. He believes in the continuation of life and a number of his works depict this idea. He has donated his home to the Swedish State where people may always come and view his works and his home. There is a small entrance fee.

Unity and World Peace .

Still another trip was made to Sigtuna, one of the oldest towns of Sweden, more or less a cultural center. Old Sigtuna is buried many feet down for in those days the refuse was thrown into the streets. When it became too great, the people merely burned down the whole town and built again on the ashes. So the remains of many old towns are below the ground.

Here in this town is also the remains of several old churches built by the peoples before the time of Christianity. Here you may also see some of the old stones with the markings of the Vikings upon them.

The farewell tea was held in Hotel Malmen. In the beginning of Carleson's farewell remarks, his voice filled up because we were parting, and there was a hush over the whole group. Then the joys of the week were recalled and much enthusiasm filled the ranks Thus another Congress had gone by and the bonds of international fellowship had been knit a little stronger and one knew that such comings together would do more to bring world peace and unity than any other institution conceived by man.

More About **World Congress**

Stockholm, Sweden

Undoubtedly the most significant happening in the Spiritualist world this year was the "Spiritualist World Congress," held in Stockholm, Sweden, in September. Spiritualist mediums, devotees and experts in all branches were in attendance. "From all corners of the earth they came"-for the International Spiritualist Federation.

A delegation was present from the United States-and an American introduced one of the most impressive features of the early conference by way of a cinematograph film record of the sessions of the Congress held in London in 1948. This was the Rev. Melvin Smith, whose film brought back interesting memories and summarized the London Congressional meeting of World Spiritualism.

Outstanding Spiritualist leaders came from America, Britain, France, Germany, South Africa, Finland, Italy, and all over the globe. Some of the most prominent writers, lecturers, mediums and psychic authorities in the whole Spiritualist family were to be noticed in the various assemblies.

A final feature of the Congress was a series of short and pithy talks, made by folk from various countries, in answer to the query: "What is the central theme of Spiritualism and its message to Humanity?" Miss Maja Pedersen, of Copenhagen, was the first speaker to this question. Many felt that Spiritualism is much to the fore in public thought and has a vital message of assurance and peace for a troubled world.

Manchester, England

A bust of the famed spiritual healer, Harry Edwards, one of earth's outstanding demonstrators of Spiritualist cure, has been completed in Manchester, England, by Maurice Rottesman at his studio, 26 Elmfield St., Cheetham, Manchester.

It was to have been cast in bronze by interested persons, with a special plinth-to be unveiled in the Royal Festival Hall, London, on September 17th - and was shown at the time of the Festival Healing Demonstrations in England this

The sculptor is an artist of high standing and is Jewish.

A Religion Based on the Facts of

Spiritualism

Jesus may have felt his teachings would be more acceptable If he were baptized, for he went ". . . from Galilee to Jordan unto John, to be baptized of him, But John forbid him, . . . And Jesus answering (his objections) said unto him, Suffer it to be so NOW: for thus it becometh us to fulfill all righteousness. Then he suffered him." (Matt. 3:13-15)

To me, these words mean that he did not believe that BEING BAPTIZED, had any real importance; yet he yielded to public opinion for sake of the effect it would have on those he desired to help.

Jesus, thereby, set an example for all spiritual teachers; and he said to all the world: "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." (Matt. 4:19)

The example he set on that occasion may have caused some who were sticklers for following "the letter" which "killeth", instead of seeking the "spirit" which "giveth life" (2 Cor. 3:6)-to lose the greater good they could have gained.

What M. B. E. Taught

believe that that same "spirit"-which leads a teacher to seek for the greatest good to the greatest number -- led Mary Baker Eddy, when she opposed Spiritualism as she then understood it. It can hardly be doubted that she gained many followers for Christian Science who would not have followed her if she had accepted Spiritualism as it was then generally understood.

What she did, whether knowingly, or even with a feeling of uncertainty, brought about the acceptance of her teachings, by many people in many parts of the world. They have been blessed thereby, and her teachings can go on blessing others for all eternity.

What she taught caused many of her followers to reject Spiritualism, and it will not be easy to clear away the effects of her teachings from the minus of her followers.

About the year 1918-after she had been in the Spirit World several years-I made an appointment with Pierre L. O. A. Keeler, an internationally known slate-writing medium, and I asked Mrs. Eddy if her views about Spiritualism had changed since she left this world. Here is a copy of the answer I received:

What M. B. E. Said

"Sir: Perhaps it is not known to you, as it is not generally that I came into my work through Spirit agencies, and at first I called myself a Spiritualist, Later on the elf of pride and hypocrisy psychologized me, and I thought it my place to build up a new faith on the facts of Spiritualism which had sustained me for years. So I dropped my Spiritualism into the cauldron of Christian Science. I made money by it, but this built up a fire of remorse within me which is burning out my very soul. I am now for pure, unadulterated Spiritualism first, last, and all the time. My writings are much of sham. Well might the letter "e" be added.

"Respectfully,

Mary Baker Eddy."

(Underscoring supplied)

Later I asked if she meant that the latter "e" should be added to the word "sham" so that the sentence would read: "My writings (about Spiritualism) are much of shame." Her signed answer, which I now

have before me, reads:

"Dear Sir: Yes, you may make my sentence read "Shame" for the stuff I put out was both. I defamed Spiritualism yet it was this which gave me my first insight to another life. . . .

Mary Baker Eddy."

The message, and the later answer, were both in ordinary black lead pencil writing, that was done on 5 by 7 inch blank ·cards, that were between two ordinary school slates while Mr. Keeler and I held them. Several-maybe a dozen of the blank cards—would be between the two slates. They would lie about as close together as the sheets of paper in a closed book. The writing would sometimes be done on the upper surfaces of eight or more of the cards, but there was never even a scratch on the back of the card immediately above, and touching it. You can readily see that it would not be possible for any human hand to write between such slates.

During the more than forty years that I knew Mr. Keeler, I had many sittings with him. Yet never, even once, did I sec, or learn of, any act of his that appeared suspicious. I became satisfied-beyond any doubtthat he did not need to resort

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to deception in the work he did. Mary Baker Eddy has had such a broad awakening-since she "crossed the bar"-that she wants her followers, particu-

larly, to have the benefit of

On the basis of what Mrs. Eddy has written and spoken to me, I PREDICT that: (1) When the right time comes, and (2) She finds a suitable channel for giving it to the world; (3) She will endeavor to give to the members of her church, and to all the world, the acceptable understanding about Spiritualism which she has gained during her years "Over

That seems to be the only way she can put out that "fire" that is "burning out her very soul."

Her teachings closed the door so that she cannot reach her own church for any help from her followers! But Spiritualists, whom she "defamed", will pray -"Father, forgive her, for she knew not what she did, -Suf-

A Psychic Observer Feature PIRITUALISM . . For The Young

LUKE, Chapter IV, tells how Jesus went from the synagogue to Simon Peter's house, and found his mother-in-law sick of a fever. He stood over her and rebuked the fever, and immediately it left her and she arose and ministered to them.

John, Chapter IV, relates how. a nobleman of Capernaum came to Jesus at Cana, and begged him to come and heal his son, dying of a fever. Jesus said "Go thy way, thy son liveth." The parent believed him, and returned and found his son healed of the fever. On asking the time of his son's recovery, he learned that it was at the time when Jesus said "Thy son liveth."

This is described by John as a miracle, but it was obviously a case of absent healing such as our present day Healers per-

In Chapter V we read of the pool named Bethesda, having five porches in which lay many invalids awaiting a stirring of the pool waters. When this occurred, the first man to enter the water was healed of his

One of the invalids had lain there 38 years, and was so crippled that one of the others always got more quickly to the waters. Jesus saw him and, learning of his inability, said "Rise, take up thy bed and walk," and immediately the man stood up and walked away.

Sight Restored

In Chapter IX we read how Jesus, having escaped from an attempt in the Temple to stone him, met a man blind from his birth. His disciples asked him who had sinned, the man or his parents, to cause his having been born blind; and Jesus is reported to have replied that nobody had sinned, but that the works of God should be manifested in him.

Then he spat on the ground and made clay, with which he anointed the blind man's eyes, and told him to wash them in the pool of Siloam. The blind man did, and his sight was restored.

NOTE: I think that, in view of our opinion of Jesus, we can accept his disciples' alleged

question and his answer as an interpolation by someone who thought that he was adding glory to Jesus.

I, personally, regard Jesus as a gifted Healer who, like our own Healers, knew of his powers, and was only too glad to use them for those who needed

In The Acts of the Apostles are recorded a number of psychic healings and two miracles, most of them accredited to Paul, who, as Saul of Tarsus (Chapter VIII), began his association with the Early Christians as an enemy and persecutor, "haling men and women, and sending them to prison." Haling here means hauling.

What Paul Did

Furnished (Chapter IX) with written authority by the High Priest, he set out for Damascus. and during the journey he was suddenly, blinded by a bright light from the sky, and a voice said "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou me?"

Jesus, from the Spirit Side, was speaking to him; and when he asked what was wanted of him, he was told to go into Damascus where he would get instructions. Those who were with him were amazed, as they heard a voice but saw nobody.

He was blind for three days, and then Ananias, in a vision, was told to go into Damascus, to the street called Straight, and restore Paul's sight. Ananias protested, because of Paul's activities, but the voice insisted; so, going into Damascus, he healed Paul and then baptised him.

In Damascus Paul "preached Christ" and confounded the Jews, who planned to kill him, but the disciples helped him to escape, by lowering him down the city wall in a basket.

Returning to Jerusalem, he was at first avoided by the disciples, until Barnabas - with whom he later joined in a preaching partnership - told them of his conversion.

He then spoke boldly in the name of Jesus; raised Eutychus at Troas; was released by an earthquake from prison at Thyatira, and performed several healings. And thus was added to the infant Christian Church its first great missionary.


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

Lola Reddig—the Medium

is the unexpected, the unusual, that really gives me a thrill.

When I read that Rose Mackenburg article in the Post some few months ago, the unfair, exaggerated attacks on mediums, and the crude, ridiculous pictures that were supposed to clinch her assertions seemed to me an insult to all human intelligence, including my own. So I went to class rather upset.

The Spirit world evidently felt that I needed special help and assurance and I certainly received it. First a spirit appeared to Rev. Reddig giving the rather unusual name of "Alvina." No one in the class, except myself, could place a spirit by that name.

Five years ago, one by that, name who had been my girlhood chum, passed into spirit. As I acknowledged her, a second spirit joined her and gave the name of Henry. That was the name of her husband, a bed-ridden invalid whose death followed hers in a matter of weeks.

Unusual Phenomena

This took place hundreds of miles from California and no one in the class room could possibly have known these friends of mine. Alvina spoke. "Henry is well now," she said.

I had scarcely recovered from the surprise of this when a friend who had passed of a deformative malady came into the room, giving her name,

As I acknowledged her, Rev. Reddig saw her cross the room to me bent and crippled, and described her to me that way. Suddenly she stood up before me, very tall and straight.

The next week, I attended a materialization seance and she came out of the cabinet and walked to my chair. As she gave her name, standing so straight and beautiful, she said, "I want you to see me now."

Rev. Reddig's classes have two definite objectives. The spiritual development of her students and the production of light within the group, to be used by the many spirit entities. who are brought each week into the class room by a borderland worker named Bob. Bob was a flier killed in world war

He brings each week boys who have just died on the battle field, and who are still unable to realize that they have made the change. Each class closes with prayers for these boys and directions for finding and following the Christ Light into Progression.

Seance Room Examined

Rev. Reddig seems to have many phases of mediumship. Some that I personally have witnessed are psychometry, blindfold billet, trumpet, independent voice and materialization. It has been my privilege to witness her materialization seances seven times; twice in conjunction with Bertie Lilly Candler, and five times alone.

All were held in Long Beach in her regular seance room. Always under the same stringent conditions that would convince anyone that fraud was impossible-unless they belong to the Rose Mackenburg contingent.

The cabinet is movable - a slight wooden frame, smoothly covered with black cloth, with the usual curtains in front, and I have assured myself by personal investigation, as have dozens of others, that there are no pockets in the curtains, no trap doors under the rugs, no doors behind the cabinet.

The men sitters who are always invited to investigate it, frequently move it out from the wall, so they can do a thorough job. Women sitters accompany her to a dressing room, where she removes most of her clothing, retaining a minimum of undergarments, plus shoes and stockings.

Infra-red Bulbs Used

Then, attired in a dark blue jersey house coat, she returns to the seance room, gives a few simple instructions and the seance begins.

Her cabinet attendant is her husband, Rev. John Reddig. He attends the phonograph and assists who may need help ir locating the cabinet. Her cabinet guide is a Chinese girl named May Lee, and she is indeed

The pictures accompanying this article were taken in absolute darkness under her direction on June 16th, 1951.

I think all should know how these pictures were taken. Rev. John Reddig had a camera and four infra-red bulbs lined up on a table in the back of the room. After the sitters, sixteen in number, had taken their seats, he explained that they were going to try for pictures in the absolute dark, though it was really a noble experiment new to all concerned, including May Lee, who was in charge of the whole affair, and no results were guaranteed.

So the lights went out, we repeated the Lords Prayer in unison and sang two verses of "In the Garden", when May Lee called out "Now we are ready. We are about to take picture of ectoplasm coming out of medium."

May Lee Proves . . .

In about a minute she again called "Ready", and the second picture was snapped. This is the picture that shows Rev. Reddig and May Lee sitting just outside the cabinet. Then there was a much longer wait and in the darkness I sensed or felt that they were walking past me.

Again May Lee said they were ready and picture number three was taken. This picture shows them well away from the cabinet and about half way down the room.

Then the red light was put on and we were able to see. May Lee spoke from the cabinet, "I will bring my medium down into the room so you can all see us". And out of the cabinet they came-May Lee tall, slender, in trailing white. Rev. Reddig, shorter, heavier, wearing her dark robe. There was enough light that even the scalloped collar on her robe was plainly discernable.

May Lee took her completely around the circle. This is the third time I have seen her do this. Previously she has called attention to the white ectoplasmic band that connected

This time she did not, but as they entered the cabinet she said "I am not used to having my picture taken. Could you

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

Dancers and Indians, leave the cabinet and circle the room sometimes several times. Sometime the parents and relatives are able to walk some distance. My mother walked to my chair, perhaps ten feet from the cabinet. She was beautiful in white robes covered with jewels. She has kissed me and her cheek is soft and warm.

At one seance (not June 16th) May Lee suddenly came out of the cabinet, throwing one of the curtains up over the top where she held it. She called upon

Standing thus, curtains wide open, she called six or eight of the sitters to come up, enter the cabinet one at a time and see her medium sitting in trance in her chair. "Put your hand on her head" she said to us. I was E grateful for this opportunity of such wonderful proof, by touch as well as sight.

May Lee Directs

Rev. Reddig works with the Brotherhood of Light and always some teacher of that school comes into the seance room to deliver a well worded lecture or sermon. On one occasion three of these Brothers appeared together.

On June 16th there was but one, very tall and impressive, who gave us the usua! discourse. As he disappeared into the cabinet May Lee directed Mr. Redn dig to take the fourth picture. The room was darkened again and when May Lee said "We are ready" the picture was snapped.

Evidently this flash bulb was defective. We all sensed at the time that it had not worked properly, and so we were not G surprised that no picture of the Brother of Light had been secured.

These are but a few of the things that I have personally witnessed at Rev. Reddig's seances. They are never twice IN alike. At each one some new proof is given to marvel about. And some of the demonstrations have been so sacred and so beautiful I would not even try to put them into words.
