No Real Peace Before 1965

Brace yourself! This is going to be a little rough!

If you think the world was pretty well stirred up in 1950 and 1951, hold on tight and hope for the best in 1952 and 1953. These have long been denominated the "crisis years" by teachers and prognosticators speaking through the trance instrumentality of Rev. Richard Zenor of Los Angeles.

This year they repeat: "If we can survive 1952 and 1953, we can avoid a great world war. After that, the situation with Russia will change."

But that would not mean the end of troubles, for these are the troubled times of the "Last Days" before a new universal cycle begins, say those who speak of the future through Rev. Zenor. There will be more and many "little wars," many clashes and internal upheavals among the nations and, above all, an increase in the number and seriousness of so-called "natural disasters."

Universal Change

As one of the teachers put it: "Nature goes on a rampage."

The year 1965, it has been repeatedly said through Richard Zenor, marks the end of a 7000 year cycle, which greatly affects, not only the earth, but all planets in this and six other associated solar systems.

On this planet, the effect will be, it is said, "like the breaking of a boil which has finally come to a head," and the results will be drastic changes and upheavals, both in the affairs of men and the physical body of the earth itself.

The year, 1953, marks the real beginning of the "complete universal change," according to spirit collaborator Agasha, principal Zenor teacher, and from 1953 to 1957 (inclusive), will be one of the greatest periods of change.

To Encourage Mediums

Psychic research in Japan is considered to begin with Dr. Tomokichi Fukurai, Professor of Experimental Psychology in Tokyo Governmental University (Now a member of our Society), 40 years ago. He studied Abnormal Psychology especially Clairvoyance and "Thought Photography" throught mediumship of Yoshitomo Nagao & others.

About ten years after those experiments, Wasaburo Asano, our predecessor, founded "Japanese Psychic Science Association" in the year 1923. The Journal "Psychic Science" as an organ of that Association was published, but it was obliged to cease after the great earthquake in Tokyo, Sept. 1, 1923.

Asano's Experiments

Mr. Asano, who was in Osaka after the earthquake, came back to Tokyo in the year of 1924 and began to publish the journal "Psychic Research and Human Life." He also established "Tokyo Psychic Science Society" as the executive propaganda Psychic Researcher and as head director of the Society until his death, he did his best to cultivate mediums.

In 1928, Mr. Asano attended to the Third Spiritualist Congress

held in London with Dr. Fukuari. This trip abroad brought a great excitation for Psychic Research in Japan.

In England, Mr. Asano visited William Hope, a world-wide fame psychic photographer at Crewe and got his photograph with an extra -figure which was identified as Mr. Asano's "dead" mother.

In America, Mr. Asano was heartily entertained by Dr. L. R. G. and Margery Crandon in Boston and it was arranged to try the thumb-print experiment through Margery as a medium.

To the readers of the "Psychic Science & Human Life" Mr. Asano's description relating to the progress of psychic research, caused the second great-sensation to psychic researchers of Japan.

As one of the first, Mr. Saburo Kamei appeared as a physical medium in Japan. His psychic phenomena consisted of levitation of a table, directvoice, apport phenomena, materialization, etc. His directvoice was recorded in two pieces on phonographic discs.

A powerful medium cultivated by Mr. Asano was Eien Kitamura, who was an intelligent youth and a graduate of Agriculture and Forestry College. His Clairvoyant experiment told him without fail. He liked to use a wooden box locked, in which 3 cubes were arranged in a row at random, so that a number of 3 figures could be obtained—figures of numbers from one to six being engraved on each cube.

Dematerialization

The very interesting psychic experiment done by Kitamura was the one during which a Copper Coin (as well as a silver coin) was pierced by a paper thread in a few seconds at the daylight of 5 P.M., April 25, 1925 under the witness of Mr. Asano, Mr. Akinobu Manabe, and Mr. Miyazawa. (the writer, a friend of Mr. Asano).

While we were greatly expecting his future psychic development, he passed to the other world, July, 1941 under the fortieth of age to our great regret.

Next, I must mention Mr. Kouzan Tsuda, physical medium in Osaka. At first, he was

The "process of elimination, clarification and adjustment" which so confuses the world during the next few years reaches its climax in 1965, according to Agasha.

Only the world, as we

And, as he has said for so many years, 1965 represents the beginning of the "Golden Age" when peace, understanding and plenty will prevail and science, occult science and religion, will join to produce a truly "universal understanding of the Godconsciousness which motivates us all.'

An Explanation

Agasha has said repeatedly that the crisis years of 1952 and 1953, carrying over into 1954, represent the time when men must decide whether they will make the necessary adjustments to avoid a general atomic conflict, but he repeated again this year that the "White Forces," the teachers, angelic helpers and messengers in spirit, are working to overcome human confusions.

Whether they succeed depends a great deal upon the recognition which men give to these spiritual forces-by clearing their thoughts of the hatreds and tensions which nourish the evil forces now smothering them.

That means the great cyclic readjustment, which is making itself felt, will not be a fatalistic process. It also explains why predictions can never be 100 per cent accurate, for if they were, the doctrine of fatalism would be proved.

Prophecies, we are told through Richard Zenor, are possible because certain individuals, either in spirit or in the physical body, can "see ahead" dimly on the basis of past events, reading future results from past causes.

Since the chain of cause and effect can be altered to a degree by the "free will" of men, predicted results, therefore, are not completely inevitable. In practice, men tend to drift with the tide of destiny, held fast by the chains of their fate, and that is why there have been astounding cases of predictions which have been fulfilled in minute detail.

But now is the testing period, says Agasha, when men will have the chance to determine whether they will surrender to the hateful forces of confusion or choose the beckoning golden road of harmony and understanding. There will be great leaders who will point the way, and eventually, he says, men will find the way out of the present darkness.

How painful will be the process depends upon man himself -upon men as individuals and as groups in the world consciousness that is currently polluted by their errors.

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SPIRITUALISM is a religion based on fact, not theory. Its basic teachings have been endorsed by all the leading Spiritualist organizations in America and England. These teachings and affirmations, known as "Declaration of Principles", are clearly and concisely stated in their manuals.

Individuals, "inside" and "outside" Spiritual organizations, are entitled to their opinions and theories, but they should not pawn them off as the teachings of Spiritualism by calling them, "Spiritualist theories"

Only recently, I read an article in a "metaphysical magazine" wherein a theory was presented as a "Spiritualist theory". The theory goes something like this: "The material seed, which germinated the mortal body of Jesus Christ, was an apportation from the body of Joseph by the Holy Spirit . . . but the soul of Jesus, came from the right hand of God."

The theory continues: "Eve was an apported creation from the body of Adam while he slept.

The theorist tries to interpret Joseph's dream of the Angel and says that during that slumber "the Lord took from the body of Joseph, the seed of life, blessed and sanctified by the Holy Spirit, and caused it to conceive in Mary the Virgin, that the Light of God should be glorified on Earth in the body of Jesus, the Spiritual Son of the Heavenly Father.'

I have been a Spiritualist all my life; my mother (89) is a Spiritualist pioneer. In all of that time, never have I heard of such a theory. As scripture was quoted, and I do not claim to be a Bible student, I referred this article to Rev. Converse Nickerson, Somerville, Massachusetts (near Boston) who is one of Spiritualism's foremost teachers of the Bible.

In his reply, Rev. Nickerson said: "Our philosophy never has included any admission of the Virgin Mary theory, and if anyone tries to inculcate it into Spiritualism via the apport route he is off the beam. I guess the Scripture is correct, but the statements of interpretation are wild. Witness:

Joseph, the husband of Mary, of whom was born Jesus.' (comma, or no comma) Jesus still is the child of Mary, in the verse; also he is the child of Joseph, as we believe. Quibbling over such foolishness gets us nowhere in Bible interpretation. It is silly to try to explain this by an apportation theory.'

"Such statements," says Nickerson, "should never be made by any person, Spiritualist or otherwise. There is no reason to believe that anyone has had a revelation about the matter. All we have are the verses, and to try to 'apport' other meanings into them, is muddling the already muddled New Testament."

Moses Hull says: 'The evidence of the Messiahship of Jesus was all based on Joseph's dreams; there is no record anywhere else in the world upon which to base a pretense of evidence, except that the Angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph, in a dream, saying: 'Joseph thou son of David, fear not to take unto thee Mary for a wife, for that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Ghost."

"So then", according to Nickerson, "the evidence is all from Joseph's dream! How many years after all this, was such a statement written? Matthew, (the gospel of the Hebrews, as it was first called) bears not one word of Matthew's writing! Matthew knew Jesus, but there is no evidence that he wrote this book. Not until the year 175 AD, was this manuscript ascribed to anything concerned with

psychically cultivated by Mr. Asano, And after his death, Tsuda was seriously trained by Mr. Manabe, psychic researcher in Osaka.

In the year 1938, Mr. Tsuda was developed to a powerful physical medium who produced psychic phenomena of directvoice, uplift of a table (about 7 kg.), direct writing, partial materialization and direct playing of the harmonica in a dark room illuminated intermittedly by a dim red light.

The photograph taken by spirits' group of Mr. Tsuda was shown by Mrs. Kasukawa in our journal, June 10, 1950. (Note: The date of experiment was stated as 1922 but it was the year 1938.)

Mr. Reizan Motoyoshi, at Numazu, had his under-clothing removed by his spirit collaborator in an instant, while his hands were bound with a cord.

Again Mr. Yosinobu Hagihara at Osaka became gradually known as a physical medium.

In December, 1940, the first exhibition of psychic photographs was held at the "Peer's Hall," Tokyo, under the auspices of Mr. Manabe.

The Japanese Authorities, who were excited by the exhibition, considered that psychic photographs and other physical psychic phenomena were fraud and superstitions and must be pressed down, so that psychic phenomena might not be diffused in the higher classes of Japan.

Thus Mr. Tsuda, Hagihara and Kitamura were arrested at Osaka while Kamei escaped to Manchuria. Psychic researcher Manabe & others were also arrested for a time.

And so, Psychic Research in Japan, once favorably proceeding, experienced a serious disturbance at its very beginning. Moreover, after the world-war broke out, in the year 1941, all Psychic Research in Japan was suspended.

At last, the journal "Psychic Research & Human Life" ceased to appear,-all due to the serious paper control during the war.

After the war, the chance was luck in re-establishment of a Psychic Research Society. In 1947, the Tokyo Psychic Science Society and such others were revived to be called "Japan Psychic Science Association, Incorporated" and, since then the monthly journal "Psychic Science" has been kept on publication. And August, 1949, that Association was settled as a Foundational Jurical Person.

There are at present some local societies for Psychic Research scattered in the north and the west of Japan. But our Society is considered to be the leading group of Psychic Researchers in Japan.

While there are many mental mediums known as clairvoyants, healers and automaticwriting mediums, physical instruments are very few in our country. Even now, we can only mention guardedly the names of Tsuda, Kamei and Hagihara. Moreover, we regret that the psychic powers of these mediums seems to have declined as compared with our pre-war mediums.

Recently an efficient infraray filter was devised by Prof. Itaya, a director of our Society. We tried to take photographs of Mr. Tsuda's psychic phenomena when he came up to Tokyo, May, this year. A few of these photographs were found to be worthy, but we are of the opinion that they are not yet positive enough to give evidence to prove the trueness of Tsuda's mediumship.

In the light of a proposed forth-coming motion picture on the life of the late Harry Houdini, I thought it might be interesting, in my recent interview with Arthur Ford, world-renowned medium and lecturer, to find out if Beatrice Houdini herself had ever repudiated her signed statement to the effect that she had received the bona fide code agreed upon between herself and her distinguished if misguided husband, before his death-through Mr. Ford.

I had nearly two hours with Arthur Ford, whom I have come to regard as the world's foremost clairvoyant medium. I found him quite friendly and approachable and highly cooperative in our long questionand-answer session together. Readers of Psychic Observer, I feel sure, will be interested to get a close-up profile of this distinguished, internationallyknown clairvoyant, and to ponder some of the views which he sets forth on the Biggest News in the World today-the Spiritualist Movement.

Beatrice Deny?

Mr. Ford said that it was back in 1928 that his famous sittings for the Houdini Message were held. "Beatrice did not repudiate the message," he asserted. "She had tried many times to get a message alone-but was never successful. She stated at least four times in the public press that she had gotten the code through me-but no personal message. She had tried to get the message personally, but failed."

Just how the public could refuse to accept the fact that the Houdini Code was actually gotten psychically more than twenty years ago (1919), when it is known that Mrs. Houdini herself left a signed statement to that effect, is not clear. Her own signature was "witnessed" by a representative of the United Press and a representative of the Scientific American and by a personal friend of Mrs. Houdini, "Minnie Chester."

When asked if he or anyone else had ever received the large "reward" which had been offered by Beatrice Houdini to any medium who might contact the spirit that was Houdini and extract the agreed-upon code, Arthur Ford said, "No. The offer was withdrawn a year before the code came through," Here is one fact which no motion-picture mogul nor any other tycoon, raccoon or plain goon will ever be able to trample down.

Fear Unknewn

Having been myself advised, editorially, in a squid-shooting periodical, and by other prejudiced folk, that Spiritualism is a "dangerous" movement, I asked Ford for an expression on discoveries and inventions of this. Specially Written After An Interview in New York City

I presume it is "blister" to be wise.

"What message has Spiritualism for this upset age?" I asked, "Death is a real and personal problem to mankind," was the reply. "Thousands are being killed in battle. People want something by way of belief that has significant meaning in the face of all this. Spiritualism takes the whole problem of death out of blind faith and puts it on a scientific basis -a demonstrable fact."

"What has Spiritualism for religion on the whole-that the orthodox churches are missing?" Answer: "There would be no Christian church but for the 'resurrection'-and/or materialization of Jesus. For the disciples, the cross finished everything-until he appeared again -and they saw him. It was only after his appearance that they realized what he was trying to teach. There was no hope until after he 'returned'-came back to them, and talked to them. The - really significant things he said were said after the resurrection. That restored Hope and Faith, and started the Christian Religion.'

Geneva Conference

We were talking about religion and education and what seems to be a lack of religious influence in the colleges and universities. At this juncture I got some real news-that is to say, it was news to me. I learned something about Robert Dale Owen, whom Mr. Ford placed right up there with Horace Mann and Thomas Jefferson, in the matter of free education in the colonies. Scotsman Owen, "hounded out of his own country," as a free thinker (He would not "believe" what he could not "prove") came to America, went to New Harmony, Indiana-where he found Spiritualism - and started the first tax-supported school.

He later went to Congress and it was here, said Arthur Ford, that he first presented the idea of a national institution—which would conserve and make available to future generations the

Out of this concept, I was in-Smithsonian Institute, known to just about everybody who has visited the Nation's Capital. I was also informed that Horace Mann, the distinguished New

England educator, visited Robert Owen at New Harmony and "got the idea of Spiritualism."

As to my query on Spiritualism and Education, Mr. Ford grew quite eloquent. He spoke spiritedly of the far-reaching influence of F.W.H. Myers, the great English exponent of Spiritualism—as the Father of the Sub-conscious, antedating and influencing the great Freud (who himself was "one of the first in psychical research). quoted the dictum of a certain Educational Conference in session in Geneva, to the effect that Freud had made "the greatest contribution to human thought" - since the time of Jesus. It was also mentioned that another eminent educator, Professor William James, who was possibly the greatest exponent of psychology that America has had, had been largely influenced by both Myers and Professor Hyslop, teacher of logic at Columbia University -two Spiritualist stalwarts.

Professor James was thus

quoted ("Varieties of Religious Experience"): "All religious experiences are psychical." America's greatest educators, be it said, have been men of the Spirit—men deeply imbued with a profound sense of religion and Man's relation to the Absolute -small-minded spell-binders of today to the contrary.

Destiny

I asked, "Has Spiritualism a message for politics?" Ford: "Yes. Spiritualism, like all minority groups, is a radical movement. Like all true worldmovements, Spiritualism recognizes the supreme worth of personality. 'It wages war on anything that prohibits freedom of thought. It emphasizes everything that has to do with 'reform'. It is for all that stands for the individual and for human personality. Spiritualism would do away with War -which is a 'political' thing. It would destroy a false Nationalism-a narrow 'Patriotism'."

My next thought was, "Has Spiritualism anything to offer in the realm of Science, as such?" Listen: "Spiritualism is a science." Mr. Ford then quoted a striking epigram, by St. Clair-Stobart, 'Psychism is the science of the Seance-Spiritualism is the science of the Soul." "Spiritualism is dealing with facts," asserted my friend. "Fact, in any given circumstance, is an important factor in any science-in all sciences."

"Can Spiritualism influence Philosophy?" I wanted to know. Attend: "Spiritualism like all philosophies is an individual problem. Understood and practiced by the individual it would revolutionize man's thinking about God - and His dealing with the race. It would revolutionize one's ideas about Man and Destiny and Personality. It gives man a new and nobler concept of the universe. No philosophy benefits mankind until it becomes pregnant in the

Personal

Another query: "Would a Spiritualist philosophy be an aid to Religious Unity?" Reply: "Spiritualism is not a religion -not a sect or a cult. Spiritualism is the basis of all religions. All religions have grown out of or been born in psychical phenomena. Spiritualism has a quality that cannot perish. If what we declare to be true is not true, then Jesus, Mohammed, Buddha, Moses-all have been charlatans and tricksters. All of their religions were based on spirit. If Spiritualism is not true, then Christianity itself is a hoax."

Turning to the personal, I found that Arthur Ford has had some exciting experiences along the way. I had picked up somewhere a statement that at one time he had been an ordained minister in the Episcopal church, my own persuasion. He tells me that he never was a clergyman in that faith, nor did he ever join up with the Episcopalians. He said that his father was "nominally" an Episcopalian-but evidently, like the

late Henry Ford, on his own admission, he "never worked at it much." His mother was a Baptist, down in Florida-and he joined that church by baptism at the age of 12.

At the ripe old age of 16, Arthur was actually "officially excommunicated" from the Baptist branch of the tree-ofsects. Can you imagine such a travesty? I doubt that it has been duplicated in the life of any man living today. His crime? He believed in "open" communion - and the recognition of other Christians as "Christian." He was excommunicated from Baptistism because of his open and avowed opposition to the doctrine of "closed communion."

Early Life

Shades of Martin Luther and Harry Fosdick! Had this brilliant mind and top crusader remained in the good old Baptist fold of the South, he might have succeeded in making "Christians" out of them.

After being turned out of the green and watery pastures of the "Aquarites", our hero joined the Disciples or "Christians"still at the tender age of sixteen. 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

Will you join with me in understanding the laws of vibration? The information I wish to give is the result of years of experience, experiments, observation and study. May our spirits commune together as true lovers of God's creation!

Vibration is the law of nature,-the law of the Great Spirit (God). Every living thing vibrates, from the lowest form of plant life to the highest form of being,-MAN. We thereby create our own character, personality and success or failure, as well as our own state of health. "For whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap." (Gal. 6:7)

Over-indulgence in tobacco and alcohol temporarily stimulates the body but shortens its life. It is comparable to racing the motor of a car. Any harmful stimulant to the body is weakening to the spiritual vibration, as well as an offense to the dignity of the human spirit. When the physical body is not a fit vessel for the spiritual body, then the spiritual body is handicapped.

The Reason

Lowest of all vibrations are hate and jealousy combined. A person entertaining these feelings is apt to draw in earthbound forces which could take control of his mind to such an extent that he could be influenced to commit murder.

velopment of the spiritual vibrations, and depends on the amount of desire put forth in that direction.

Our minds are so little accustomed to deal with spiritual things because we live in and think about material things almost constantly. Most people do not think of God a minute or two a day, and some only a very short time once a week, and wonder why God is not more kind to them!

Jesus healed the sick by his knowledge of all types of vibration (God's Law), He never knew or planned what he was going to do or say, as every person had a different vibration and varying amounts of faith, according to their character and emotions.

Let us analyze the miracle of the healing of the woman who had been ill with an issue of blood for many years. While he was on his way to help the daughter of Jairus, who was dying, a woman who was in the crowd, surrounding Jesus was healed simply by touching the hem of his robe.

Meaning of Virtue

What was the explanation of this miracle? Jesus had charged his body with a powerful mental vibration. The sick woman had tremendous faith. "If I may but touch this garment, I shall be whole." (Matt. 9: 21) Faith raised her vibration to such a high degree that it reached or matched the vibration of the Great Master.

When she touched the hem of Christ's robe, she established a contact, and the healing current flowed to her and immediately stanched her issue of blood. Jesus knew instantly that someone had reached him, although the multitude pressed him on all sides, for he insisted, "Somebody hath touched me: for I perceive that virtue is gone out of me." (Luke 8:46) Virtue is just another word meaning goodness, or power.

Finally, the woman came forward fearfully to confess she had touched him.' Jesus gave everyone a great Key when he said unto her, "Daughter, be of good comfort; Thy faith hath made thee whole," (Matt. 9:22)

Faith, then, opens the door from which the spiritual gifts flow, Spiritual vibrations are high vibrations. Having great faith automatically raises the human vibration high enough to meet the spiritual vibration. Think of the protection, the healing, the psychic gifts and inspiration available to all if we stay on a high vibration faithfully!

Inherent Faith

Jesus could not perform any great works in his home town. He was received with jealousy and ridicule by the people who should have been the first to acknowledge his mastership. They had no faith, and they received very little in return.

Most people deny that they have faith in spiritual healing, and yet they become healed. These people, although they do not realize it, do have inherent faith, otherwise they could never be healed.

Jesus knew that he had to inspire faith in all those who came to him for help, so that he could get on the same vibration. He would give the

person something to do, such as picking up his bed, walking, etc., in order to raise his vibration high enough to enable him to be healed. When they were in accord with him and obeyed his commands, they were healed!

One of the most outstanding miracles of Jesus was the raising of Lazarus from the dead. Jesus planned beforehand to make a demonstration of this type, because he did not go to the aid of Lazarus while he was ill, but waited until he had been dead four days. Jesus took this drastic action because of the many doubters who had to be convinced by a spectacular demonstration that he was the Son of God.

Not "Miracles"

When Jesus came to the grave of Lazarus, he "tuned in" to God's vibration. He knew he had contacted God, for he lifted up his eyes and said, "Father, I thank thee that thou hast heard me. And I knew that Thou hearest me always: but because of the people which stand by I said it, that they may believe that Thou hadst sent me." (John 11: 41, 42) Then he cried with a loud voice to Lazarus to come

forth. And Lazarus did, to the glory of God and the Son of God.

This "miracle" illustrates the use of all three types of vibration: (1) The power of the mental vibration, the thought which was directed to the body of Lazarus and heavenward to God; and (2) the power of the physical vibration, released by the loud voice; and (3) the power of the spiritual vibration, the "silent" and most powerful of all, when the spirit was returned to the body by God, through the spiritual power of Jesus.

Divine Potency

By his knowledge and control of vibration, Jesus could heal absently, project his physical body, read minds, walk on water, feed the multitudes, and perform many other great works. He could still the tempest, because he understood the vibration of the water and the wind. With his superb mental power, he sent out a more powerful counter-vibration and rebuked the wind and sea.

Other great masters had this knowledge and spiritual power. There is a divine potency in every human being. Jesus said so. It is necessary, of course, to have a spiritual teacher. A person must lead the good life and be worthy, in order to be a healer, or receive other spiritual gifts. We cannot all attain mastership, but all of us in the bosom of our Mother, the Earth, can be closer to God, the Father of us all.

We can pray to Him, "in secret", and He will hear us. God gave us the method of communication so that we, his children, would be able to "tune in" with Him at any time, through Vibration.

Each individual soul is the gardener in his own little "plot of ground", of his own life during the span and spread of his short sojourn upon the Material

You, and you alone, sow the seeds, and you alone reap the harvest of your sowing.

One of the reasons why so many lives are fraught with Negation and Destruction is that most individuals pay little or no heed to the planting of their Thought-Seeds. The average person simply creates his Thought-Seeds as a matter of careless Thinking and then scatters them about unwittingly, allowing them to fall as directed by the Winds of Fate.

Three Seeds to Plant

Thus, few of their really desirable Thought-Seeds ever find firm root in the rich Soil-ofthe-Soul deep within the Sub-Conscious. So, of course, their growth is weak, they are "overrun" by the tares and thorns of their own Garden.

The Thought-Seeds which you wish to bring forth into a fine, worthwhile Harvest should be planted D-e-e-p within the sub-conscious. This you can best do in the following manner:

My son is wayward, writes a mother. I have exhausted every effort to reform him. His wild ways make me very unhappy. What should I do?

I know of but one answer to a case like this, and that answer is: Loose him and let him go. That sounds very harsh but it is in reality the only spiritual, metaphysical,—or even practical method what can be used with the wayward when every effort to reform a person, as in this case, has been exhausted.

"I find in the practice of Truth and in one's way of living," observed W. Frederic Keeler, a metaphysician of great power of a generation ago, "that to let go of any unpleasant condition, including any person who is not bringing happiness into one's life, is the very best way. Let them go. But we have to do that thoroughly in Spirit, then always there comes out of the unknown, and out of the dark, some things or some person or persons definitely better.

"We never mentally die to one unpleasant condition without being reborn into another exceedingly pleasant one. The only thing that can prevent that rebirth and attraction of new good is to hold regret and resentment in one's heart, and of course that means we are not letting go."

Develop Character!

Over the years, I have also found this to be a great Truth not only in my own life but in the lives of perhaps hundreds of others. The wild are made more wayward by material help. One finds it very practical even to stand aloof from them and let them survive or perish for, in some instances, this awakens in them responsibility for their own acts and, sometimes, they develop character. But when

they know there is somebody on whom they can fall back they seldom are willing to do this. Actually, one who helps the incorrigibles participates in their waywardness.

Certainly, it is essential that we refuse to react mentally and emotionally to the evil deeds of others. We must, indeed, refuse to be drawn into even the sorrows of others when they are worthy. As a matter of fact, when one becomes immersed in the sorrows of another one cannot help to a very great extent. That individual in despair needs stamina and strength and not weakness. When we give way to tears, because of his troubles, we give of our weakness and not strength.

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
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

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
