

"Salem Witches"

CCORDING to a newspaper article, recently submitted by Prof. Jean Chauvenet, 2520 West Seventh St., Los Angeles 57, California, London's old Witchcraft Act, inherited from the early British Legislators during the early days, has at last been repealed by a new law passed in Boston, Massachusetts.

This law, exonerating Salem Witches, must have stirred up a great deal of interest because the Associated Press deemed it important news when they released the article March 5th, from their Boston office.

The article reads: "The Massa-chusetts Legislature, some 262 years late, is moving to rest the wraiths of Salem Witches.

The Committee on Constitutional Law recently approved a bill clearing the names of those hanged as witches in 1692."

The new U. S. "In God We Trust" 8c Air Mail Stamp (above) recently proclaimed by President Eisenhower, was launched April 3rd, according to an Associated Press bulletin.

The idea for the stamp was first presented some seven years ago but they were "not able to work out the technical details until just a short time ago."

Several months before actual plans were issued to print the stamp, Rt. Rev. Robert Raleigh, Calabasas, California, also wrote the Postmaster General who replied that he favored it.

By way of description, the Washington, D. C. AP news release has this to say about the stamp: "Eight cents is now the standard letterrate to overseas destinations around the globe, and the new stamp will therefore have its greatest use on international mail. Postmaster General Summerfield estimates that 200 million of these stamps, which he calls "a postal ambassador," will go into foreign lands every year.

"Majestically simple in design, the stamp is centered by the Statue of Liberty, printed in red. Around the head and the upheld torch is a brilliant white halo, fading off into a rich blue, background that frames the whole. The words 'In God We Trust" appear above the statue. At the top is "U. S. Postage 8c" and across the bottom, in white-faced gothic, is the spaced-

The stamp claims a number of 'firsts." It is the first of a regular issue to incorporate a religious tone, the first to carry the national motto of Trust in God, the first low-price stamp of regular issue to rate more than one color, and the first to be introduced by a President.

The Post Office says it also is the first of a new series of ordinary stamps which will eventually replace the "Presidential Series" started in 1938 under the Administration of Franklin D. Roosevelt, an ardent stamp collector.

That issue ran into 32 denominations, honoring as many deceased Presidents of the United States.

Modern Interlude

One night Mrs. Howard had been reading a detective story before she dozed off. The work of journal copying was proceeding on sched-ule when something went wrong; the dream became modern, a murder was committed, and Mrs. Howard woke up screaming. There on the table was the latest sheet from the journal—broken off in the middle of a sentence.

Has there ever been a book from the bookcase on the table? Never. Has Mr. Howard ever sat up to watch these strange goings-on? No; he just laughs at Mrs. Howard.

Meanwhile, the plot thickens. Already Brandon Windsor has made her stage debut at Drury Lane Theater, under the sponsor-ship of David Garrick himself. Already she has married and buried the elderly Earl of St. Charles and had romantic entanglements with a Frenchman named Pierre, a man named Godfrey, the Duke of Grafton, and her great love, Lord Ran-dall Clayton Howard, whom she met in a torrid scene aboard ship.




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

OR THE PAST 40 years, Spiritualist ministers and mediums, those affiliated with accredited associations, have been subjected to arrest and in many cases. conviction, in the course of their ministrations and demonstrations while practicing their religion.

Whether these mediums are found guilty or not guilty is beside the point. The fact remains that the laws are so written that in many instances without knowing it, mediums have been accused of violation.

The fact that Spiritualism is a recognized religion; the fact that they are ordained ministers; the fact that to the best of their ability they are following to the letter, the work they are privileged to do in accordance with the by-laws of their own association,-in spite of all this, harassment persists.

In the recent case of Rev. Jessie Curl, found "guilty as charged", it appears there was a reasonable doubt as to name. her guilt but the court so decreed and the case is history, except that she can have the case appealed or take it to the United States Supreme Court.

All this, of course, takes money and a lot of money and even if the decision is reversed it is a question of whether this would settle anything except of course, relieve her individually from the charge.

Some are of the opinion that this would be an excellent case for appeal purposes and that the Spiritualists should get behind this case and fight "this conviction in the appellate courts."

Others are of the opinion that if successful, this would legally establish the right of Spiritualist healers to practice in the State of New York, but would it? Still others claim that nothing would be gained except the decision may be reversed. But would even this settle the issue for all times? Some think not.

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If These Be The Facts-Let's Face Them

OR THE PAST 40 years, Spiritualist ministers and mediums, those affiliated with accredited associations, have been subjected to arrest and in many cases, conviction, in the course of their ministrations and demonstrations while practicing their religion.

Whether these mediums are found guilty or not guilty is beside the point. The fact remains that the laws are so written that in many instances without knowing it, mediums have been accused of violation.

The fact that Spiritualism is a recognized religion; the fact that they are ordained ministers; the fact that to the best of their ability they are following to the letter, the work they are privileged to do in accordance with the by-laws of their own association,-in spite of all this, harassment persists.

In the recent case of Rev. Jessie Curl, found "guilty as charged", it appears there was a reasonable doubt as to her guilt but the court so decreed and the case is history, except that she can have the case appealed or take it to the United States Supreme Court.

All this, of course, takes money and a lot of money and even if the decision is reversed it is a question of whether this would settle anything except of course, relieve her individually from the charge.

Some are of the opinion that this would be an excellent case for appeal purposes and that the Spiritualists should get behind this case and fight "this conviction in the appellate courts."

Others are of the opinion that if successful, this would legally establish the right of Spiritualist healers to practice in the State of New York, but would it? Still others claim that nothing would be gained except the decision may be reversed. But would even this settle the issue for all times? Some think not.

According to Kenneth W. Greenawalt, Rev. Curl's attorney, "If her conviction goes unchallenged by the Spiritualist group, I predict that Spiritualist healers who attempt to practice hereafter in New York will be subjected in the future to very close surveillance and prosecution." It appears then that Spiritualists must fight to overcome the legal restrictions which conflict with one's constitutional right of religious freedom. 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ESTRELLA EXPLAINS LIFE IN WE BUY PSYCHIC THE SPIRIT WORLD

N the 30th of last September, my 36-year old daugha beautiful talented ter, young woman, was killed in Los Angeles traffic by a wild driver at a blind intersection. Estrella, for that is my daughter's name, had been married only a few months. She was employed as an artist in Vernon Kilns, when she

was swept out of this life in the middle of the night. At first, I was too stunned to realize she was gone, then the fact overwhelmed me and I prayed in a hotel room that she would be allowed to remain near, at least for a while if she was conscious, and perhaps I could in some way contact her, though I had never had any such experi-

ences before. I suddenly felt her presence near me, and seized one of my Aurameters. This device is a sensitive instrument for locating under-ground water, but which, I had found years ago, traces the human aura, or soul body, just as easily.

The writings and other phenomena of Stainton Moses did much to advance the Spiritual Movement among cultured people of England and Europe. Following his passing from the mortal scene, the Impera-tor Controls inspired the celebrated Boston medium, Mrs. Leonore E. Piper, also later a Mrs. Chenoweth.

It is reported from the Etheric that these august, evolved personages are now preparing other instruments of our plane and in coming years will give more wonderful spiritual teachings to our sorrowful planet.

The greater your inherent ca-pacities and potentials of service to humanity, the nobler the mem-bers of your Band will be. How can spirit people like Lincoln, Em-erson and Queen Victoria come to erson and Queen Victoria come to a sensitive who aspires mainly to money and personal influence over others?

Healing Bands

Spiritual healing has an unlimited future. So great is the need for healing of bodies, minds and emotions that thousands of Heal-ing Forces of Spirit are seeking expression through properly sen-sitized and qualified mortals.

For many years Harry Edwards of England conducted successfully his ministry of spirit healing before learning just who some of his invisible collaborators were. He found to his surprise and pleasure that two of them were Pasteur and Lord Lister, both eminent Europeans in the healing arts. Rev. Jessie Curl, another effective healer, has as principal Guide a Polynesian entity named "Hoola" aided by a Dr. Harrison and sev-eral others eral others.



Unconscious Co-operation

All truly creative people-whatever their belief and opinions-receive help from the Invisible. An interesting account of such influ-ence is given by Cyril Scott, noted English Theosophical writer, in his volume entitled "Music: Its Se-cret Influence Throughout the Ages."

Scott points out that all of the great composers were inspired Cosmically—most of them without conscious recognition of this fact. He cites the case of Liszt who, while writing feverishly and under tremendous creative tension, exclaimed to a friend nearby, "This is wonderful! But the music is not mine—not mine!"

Many metaphysical practitioners and other spiritual healers who get results with their patients claim that their sole contact is with God or Divine Mind. Let is is probable that when they pray for Divine Guidance and the flow of Healing Power, they unconsciously attune with Healing Forces or spirit doc-tors who also help to give strength and harmony to the receptive

Silently the Invisible World does its work, all too often without credit or understanding on the part of obtuse or prejudiced mortals.

Clairvoyant Observations

Many of us who appear often before public audiences of vary-ing sizes will be told by clairvoy-ants who are present that during part or all of the meeting certain "personalities" were evident, and were aiding in the work. When this happens dozens of times, and the descriptions of the Invisibles are corroborative, it becomes an are corroborative, it becomes an item of considerable reflective interest to the speaker, artist or performer. Or to somewhat re-verse the situation, when a plat-form clairvoyant or intuitionist gazes into the auras of his class, and begin to "read" members of an audience, he will see in the auras field one or more members auric field one or more members of the Band of that person!

Wherever you go, some of your spiritual influences accompany you, and they will be seen or "felt" by those who are sensitized in their cosmic and astral percep-tions. When you visit a sensitive for a psychic or intuitional reading, inquire as to the names or types of influences that are with you. Eat live, vital foods. Eat less, since you have probably been over-eating; and BREATHE MORE. Learn some good breathing exer-cises, and do them every day. Properly done, they are wonderful for physical health and vitality, for mental clarity (including memory) and for spiritual upliftment.

Let go of all habits that nail you firmly to materiality and its limitations of consciousness. Give up artificial stimulants of all kinds; sometimes this must be a gradual process but the sooner the better it will be for your spiritual freedom and true unfoldment. Give up drugging the body with toxic medicines and other unnat-ural substances. LIVE WITH THE LAWS OF NATURE AND YOUR GOD.

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





CHAPTER IV PART I

NLIKE the early Spiritualism in America, which was in its nature mainly literary and philosophical, the early Spirtualism of England had its rise chiefly from the phenomenal and more sensational side of the subject

The first interest in Spiritualism in England appears to have begun in the early fifties, with the visits to England of several well-known American mediums, notably Mrs. W. R. Hayden, Boston, Massachu-setts; Mrs. Etta Roberts, Onset, Massachusetts; and Daniel Dun-glas Home, Troy, N. Y.

The form of mediumship of Mrs. Hayden and Mrs. Roberts was of a physical nature, including raps and table-tapping which spelt out mes-sages. Mrs. Hayden was investi-gated by Professor De Morgan, who was greatly impressed by her powers and wrote an account of her mediumship in a preface to the book published by Mrs. De Morgan, entitled, "From Matter To Spirit.'

Home's mediumship was of a much more important and varied nature. It included physical mediumship, trance, materialization and the famous phenomenon of levitation or lifting of objects without any visible means, in which the body of Home himself was included.

Home's Mediumship

Home arrived in England about 1855 and at once aroused great interest. His sitters numbered many of the royalty of England, and he later visited the continent of Europe, where he gave sittings to other famous personages, in-cluding the Emperor and Empress of France; the King of Prussia and the Czar of Russia.

All these sitters appear to have been greatly impressed with his mediumship and many of them were completely convinced that through the entranced medium, they were conversing with the spirits of their deceased relatives and friends.

The phase of mediumship of Home's which first attracted unusual attention in England was that of levitation. At a seance with Sir William Crookes in 1870 it is stated that among other phe-nomena that took place, Home was lifted bodily in the air, after the manner of the levitation of the Saints.

In another famous seance at No. Buckingham Gate, London, in the presence of Lords Lindsay, Adare and Captain Wynne, Home is said to have floated out of one window and in another, although the windows were eighty-five feet from the ground.

The account of these occurrences is contained in the booklet by Sir William Crookes, entitled "Re-William Crookes, entitled "Re-searches in the Phenomena of Modern Spiritualism," and in the Proceedings of the Society for Psychical Research, Vol. VI, pp. 90-127.

These sensational phenomena of Home's have perhaps acted un-favorably upon an estimate of his mediumship in general and have tended to obscure the more im-portant intellectual side of his mediumship; for Home was both an able thinker and writer. As already noted, Home produced two very important books on Spiritual-ism, entitled: "Lights and Shadows of Spiritualism" and "Incidents In My Life" My Life."

The first book, a large one of nearly 500 pages, printed in 1877, contains one of the best historical accounts and estimates of the movement that had been produced up to that time. The book points out the many good and truthful things in Spiritualism and mercilessly attacks the shortcomings of some cannot read the book and feel that Home was capable of any petty deception in the production of his own mediumistic phenomena.

Alfred Russel Wallace

In the "Lights and Shadows of Spiritualism," Home says: "I never was a professional medium. Against men and women who are I have nothing to say, provided they be but honest. For myself, however, I have all through life felt an invincible repugnance to making merchandise of the gift bestowed on me. Large sums of money have been offered me for but a single seance, and they have been invar-iably refused."

Home figured prominently in the many experiments and researches of Sir William Crookes in the phenomena of Spiritualism and Sir William always referred to him in the highest terms of respect. We shall have the occasion to consider some of these experiments

 share when dealing with the investigations of Sir William Crookes.
 Regarding the literature on
 Spiritualism in England at this early period, it may be said to have started with the book by Mrs. De Morgan. It is a record of ten years' investigation in the phenomena of Spiritualism and contains a lengthy preface by Profes. tains a lengthy preface by Professor De Morgan, relating his ex-periences with the American me-dium, Mrs. Hayden.

Mrs. De Morgan's book was fol-Mrs. De Morgan's book was ioi-lowed by a work by Alfred Russel Wallace, the co-founder with Dar-win and Spencer of the doctrine of evolution, entitled, "Miracles and Modern Spiritualism." Mr. Wal-lace's attention had been drawn to the subject of Spiritualism, and after investigating its phenomena after investigating its phenomena and giving considerable study to the subject, he announced his un-qualified belief.

Andrew Jackson Davis

Mr. Wallace remained a Spirit-ualist for the rest of his life. In his later years, in 1910, he pub-lished his last important book, "The World of Life," which deals primarily with the problems of evolution, but in the latter part it contains a re-statement of the author's belief in the philosophy

of Spiritualism. sessed no faculties which were not inherently possessed by the higher representatives of the animal kingdom.

Wallace, held, on the contrary, that while the instincts and lower mental faculties of man were derived from the animals, yet the higher faculty of self-consciousness, the rational and thinking principle of man, that which constitutes his inmost spirit or personality, did not come up through the animal kingdom, but was derived from an entirely different source.

The Spiritualists explain this by saying that the spirit or soul of man, his divine and immortal prin-ciple, is derived direct from the Deific Ocean of Spirit, from which it is segregated and then incar-nated or centered in the brain of

the infant human foetus. Man therefore, is more than an animal, because he is a spirit existing in an animal brain and form. A. J. Davis, it will be remembered, taught the same theory, and yet neither Davis nor Wallace held that there was any impassible difference or gap in the ultimate na-tures of spirit and the animal mind.

Katie King

They were of the same ultimate nature, but existed in different degrees or states. Spirit the interior and superior principle and corre-lated with the animal mind; but spirit, as such, had not existed in any form in nature below man.

It was about this time, 1870, that Sir William Crookes com-menced his well-known investigations in Spiritualism. He was, at this time, perhaps the most famous physicist and chemist in England, and his interest in, and subsequent espousal of, the new doctrine of Spiritualism naturally caused a great sensation in academic and literary circles.

Sir William first started his investigations of Spiritualism with D. D. Home. He had him at his laboratory and home where he in-vestigated his phenomena under the strictest test conditions.

Crookes spent a large amount of time in the study of the phe-nomena, "under every test that he could devise" and took lengthy and accurate notes of them; and as a result he was absolutely convinced of their genuineness and of the existence of a new and hitherto unknown force, which he denomi-

nated "psychic force." Sir William wrote up his conclusions regarding the investigations in several articles and read them before the members of the Royal

ualism on a firm scientific basis. Cook together. I was to The book describes all kinds of tests and experiments with the new psychic force, and the results were so thorough and convincing that are are are a cabinet. that no one could reasonably doubt them.

The part of Sir William's inves-The part of Sir william's inves-tigations, however, which had the greatest interest for the public was that part which dealt with the phenomena of materialization. The medium through whom the materializations were produced was young woman, Florence Cook. Sir William, having heard of her remarkable powers in this direction, engaged her to stay at his home and to give seances there.

He devised a particular labora-tory in his home and in it built a cabinet for the tests and arranged every necessary test condition to assure the genuineness of the phenomena. In attendance the phenomena. In attendance were frequently other scientific men who desired to witness the phenomena.

The results produced were re-markable. While Miss Cook was in a trance condition, the spirit of a young woman materialized who called herself Katie King. During the various seances, Katie would appear, both in and out of the cabinet and would walk about the room, conversing with those present as if she were an actual, living

person. On different occasions, Sir William was able to see both the bodies of Miss Cook and the materialized Katie at the same time, thus proving that the materialized form was not that of Miss Cook.

Florence Cook In the course of forty seances, with scientific and reliable wit-nesses, Sir William had the opportunity to study the materializations at close range and to gather the necessary facts and details regarding them. The results of his investigations he wrote, in three letters to a journal of that period, "The Spiritualist," by which they were published.

One of the seances with Miss Cook at which Katle King ap-peared is described by Sir William as follows: "On March 12th, dur-ing a seance here, after Katle had been walking amongst us and talking for some time, she retreated behind the curtain which separated my laboratory where the company was sitting, from my li-brary, which did temporary duty

me, clothed in her robes and turban hea immediately walked in brary up to Miss Cook, A ping aside to allow me to found Miss Cook had slipi tially off the sofa, and he nead was hanging in a very awkward position.

position. "I lifted her on to the sofa, and, in so doing, had satisfactory evi-dence, in spite of the darkness, that Miss Cook was not attired in the "Katie" costume, but had on her ordinary black velvet dress, and was in a deep trance. "I pass on pow to a seance held

"I pass on now to a seance held last night at Hackney. Katie never appeared to better perfection, and for nearly two hours she walked about the room, conversing familiarly with those present. Katie now said she thought she would be able to show herself and Miss Cook together. I was to turn the gas out, and then come with my I was to turn the phosphorus lamp into the room

Height Varies

"I went cautiously into the room, it being dark, and felt about for Miss Cook. I found her crouching on the floor. Kneeling down, I let air into the lamp, and by its light I saw the young lady (Miss Coch) Cook) dressed in black velvet, as she had been in the early part of the evening, and to appearances perfectly senseless; she did not move when I took her hand and held high the light quite close to her face, but continued quietly breathing.

"Raising the lamp, I looked around and saw Katie standing close behind Miss Cook. She was robed in flowing white draperies as we had seen her previously during the seance. Holding one of Miss Cook's hands in mine and still kneeling, I passed the lamp up and down so as to illuminate Katie's whole figure and satisfy myself thoroughly that I was really looking at the veritable Katie and not at a phantasm of a disordered brain.

"She did not speak, but moved her head and smiled in recogni-tion. Three separate times did I carefully examine Miss Cook tion. Three separate times did I carefully examine Miss Cook crouching before me, to be sure that the hand I held was that of a living woman, and three separate times did I turn the lamp to Katie and examine her with steadfast scrutiny, until I had no doubt of her objective reality."

Sir William concludes his letter by mentioning some of the points of difference between the personages of Miss Cook and the materialized Katie King: "Katie's height varies; in my house I have seen her six inches smaller than Miss Cook. Last night, with bare feet and not tip-toeing, she was four and a half inches taller than Miss Cook.

"Katie's neck was bare last night; the skin was perfectly smooth both to touch and sight, whilst on Miss Cook's neck is a large blister which, under similar circumstances, is distinctly visible and rough to the touch.


"Katie's ears are unpierced, whilst Miss Cook habitually wears ear-rings. Katie's complexion is very fair, whilst that of Miss Cook is very dark. Katie's fingers are much longer than those of Miss

ed instances of levitation by other mediums since that time, there is little reason to doubt that the phenomena of levitation did actually take place as reported. Comment-ing on the occurrences, Sir William Crookes writes: "On three occaslons I have seen him raised completely from the floor of the room. On each occasion, I had full opporfunity of watching the occurrence

"There are at least a hundred recorded instances of Mr. Home's rising from the ground, in the pres-ence of as many separate persons, and I have heard from the lips of the three witnesses to the most striking occurrence of this kind... the Earl of Dunraven, Lord Lind-say and Captain C. Sir William had forty-four different photographs made of the materialized Katie King as she ap-peared at the seances. The photographs revealed her just as Sir William had described her and, in one of them, she is seen stand-ing by the side of Sir William and

leaning on his arm. Sir A. Conan Doyle says he has some of these photographs in his possession and that "there is no possession and that "there is no more wonderful impression upon any plate than that which shows Crookes at the height of his man-hood, with this angel—for such in truth she was—leaning upon his arm." arm.

This account, by Sir William Crookes, seems so complete and so sufficient in all respects that there is little room left to comment on it. The facts in the case have never been controverted and Sir Wil-liam's seances with Miss Cook re-(Con't. Page 8, Col. 3-4)

Spiritualism "The HIGHER SPIRITUALIS In England

CHAPTER IV PART I

NLIKE the early Spiritualism in America, which was in its nature mainly literary and philosophical, the early Spirtualism of England had its rise chiefly from the phenomenal and more sensational side of the subject.

The first interest in Spiritualism in England appears to have begun in the early fifties, with the visits to England of several well-known American mediums, notably Mrs. W. R. Hayden, Boston, Massachu-setts; Mrs. Etta Roberts, Onset, Massachusetts; and Daniel Dun-glas Home, Troy, N. Y.

The form of mediumship of Mrs. Hayden and Mrs. Roberts was of a physical nature, including raps and table-tapping which spelt out messages. Mrs. Hayden was investi-gated by Professor De Morgan, who was greatly impressed by her powers and wrote an account of her mediumship in a preface to the book published by Mrs. De Morgan, entitled, "From Matter To Spirit.'

Home's mediumship was of a much more important and varied nature. It included physical mediumship, trance, materialization and the famous phenomenon of levitation or lifting of objects without any visible means, in which the body of Home himself was included.

Home's Mediumship

Home arrived in England about 1855 and at once aroused great interest. His sitters numbered many of the royalty of England, and he later visited the continent of Europe, where he gave sittings to other famous personages, in-cluding the Emperor and Empress of France; the King of Prussia and the Czar of Russia.

All these sitters appear to have been greatly impressed with his mediumship and many of them were completely convinced that through the entranced medium, they were conversing with the spirits of their deceased relatives and friends.

The phase of mediumship of Home's which first attracted unusual attention in England was that of levitation. At a seance with Sir William Crookes in 1870 it is stated that among other phenomena that took place, Home was lifted bodily in the air, after the manner of the levitation of the Saints.

In another famous seance at No. Buckingham Gate, London, in presence of Lords Lindsay, Adare and Captain Wynne, Home s said to have floated out of one window and in another, although the windows were eighty-five feet from the ground.

Sir William Crookes

Many writers, regarding these phenomena of levitation, have enexplain to hallucination or hypnotization on the part of the beholders; but in view of the many other record-ed instances of levitation by other mediums since that time, there is little reason to doubt that the phenomena of levitation did actually take place as reported. Comment-ing on the occurrences, Sir William Crookes writes: "On three occa-sions I have seen him raised completely from the floor of the room. On each occasion, I had full opportunity of watching the occurrence as it was taking place. "There are at least a hundred recorded instances of Mr. Home's rising from the ground, in the presence of as many separate persons, and I have heard from the lips of the three witnesses to the most striking occurrence of this kind-the Earl of Dunraven, Lord Lind-say and Captain C. Wynne-their own minute accounts of what took place. "To reject the recorded evidence on this subject is to reject all human testimony whatever, for no fact in sacred or profane history is

supported by a stronger array of facts.

These sensational phenomena of Home's have perhaps acted un-favorably upon an estimate of his mediumship in general and have tended to obscure the more im-portant intellectual side of his mediumship; for Home was both an able thinker and writer. As already noted, Home produced two very important books on Spiritual-ism, entitled: "Lights and Shadows of Spiritualism" and "Incidents In My Life."

The first book, a large one of nearly 500 pages, printed in 1877, contains one of the best historical accounts and estimates of the movement that had been produced up to that time. The book points out the many good and truthful things in Spiritualism and mercilessly atof its misguided adherents. One cannot read the book and feel that Home was capable of any petty deception in the production of his own mediumistic phenomena.

Alfred Russel Wallace

In the "Lights and Shadows of Spiritualism," Home says: "I never was a professional medium. Against men and women who are I have nothing to say, provided they be but honest. For myself, however, I have all through life felt an invincible repugnance to making merchandise of the gift bestowed on me. Large sums of money have been offered me for but a single seance, and they have been invar-iably refused."

Home figured prominently in the many experiments and researches of Sir William Crookes in the phenomena of Spiritualism and Sir William always referred to him in the highest terms of respect. We shall have the occasion to consider some of these experiments later when dealing with the in-vestigations of Sir William Crookes.

vestigations of Sir William Crookes. Regarding the literature on Spiritualism in England at this early period, it may be said to have started with the book by Mrs. De Morgan. It is a record of ten years' investigation in the phe-nomena of Spiritualism and contains a lengthy preface by Professor De Morgan, relating his ex-periences with the American medium, Mrs. Hayden.

Mrs. De Morgan's book was fol-lowed by a work by Alfred Russel Wallace, the co-founder with Dar-win and Spencer of the doctrine of win and Spencer of the doctrine of evolution, entitled, "Miracles and Modern Spiritualism." Mr. Wal-lace's attention had been drawn to the subject of Spiritualism, and after investigating its phenomena and giving considerable study to the subject, he announced his un-constiled bolief qualified belief.

Andrew Jackson Davis

Mr. Wallace remained a Spirit-ualist for the rest of his life. In ualist for the rest of his life. In his later years, in 1910, he pub-lished his last important book, "The World of Life," which deals primarily with the problems of evolution, but in the latter part it contains a re-statement of the author's belief in the philosophy of Snithualism of Spiritualism.

Due to the results of his affiliations with Spiritualism, Mr. Wal-lace taught a different theory of evolution, with regard to man's mental faculties, from that taught

inherently possessed by the higher representatives of the animal kingdom.

*

Wallace, held, on the contrary, that while the instincts and lower mental faculties of man were de-rived from the animals, yet the higher faculty of self-consciousness, the rational and thinking principle of man, that which constitutes his inmost spirit or personality, did not come up through the animal kingdom, but was derived from an entirely different source. The Spiritualists explain this by

saying that the spirit or soul of man, his divine and immortal principle, is derived direct from the Deific Ocean of Spirit, from which it is segregated and then incarnated or centered in the brain of

the infant human foetus. Man therefore, is more than an animal, because he is a spirit existing in an animal brain and form. A. J. Davis, it will be remembered, taught the same theory, and yet neither Davis nor Wallace held that there was any impassible dif-ference or gap in the ultimate natures of spirit and the animal mind.

Katie King

They were of the same ultimate nature, but existed in different degrees or states. Spirit the interior and superior principle and corre-lated with the animal mind; but spirit, as such, had not existed in any form in nature below man.

It was about this time, 1870, that Sir William Crookes com-menced his well-known investigations in Spiritualism. He was, at this time, perhaps the most famous physicist and chemist in England. and his interest in, and subsequent espousal of, the new doctrine of Spiritualism naturally caused a great sensation in academic and

literary circles. Sir William first started his investigations of Spiritualism with D. D. Home. He had him at his laboratory and home where he in-vestigated his phenomena under the strictest test conditions.

Crookes spent a large amount of time in the study of the phe-nomena, "under every test that he could devise" and took lengthy and accurate notes of them; and as a result he was absolutely convinced of their genuineness and of the existence of a new and hitherto unknown force, which he denomi-nated "psychic force."

Sir William wrote up his conclusions regarding the investigations evolution, with regard to man's mental faculties, from that taught before the members of the Royal Academy of Science. He later published them in the small book entitled, "Researches in the Pherometal faculties, including his soul or spirit, were evolved directly from the animal kingdom. On this basis, man was simply a more highly evolved animal, and pos-

sessed no faculties which were not | course epoch-making for Modern Spiritualism, for they for the first time established the facts of Spiritualism on a firm scientific basis. The book describes all kinds of tests and experiments with the new psychic force, and the results were so thorough and convincing that no one could reasonably doubt them.

The part of Sir William's investigations, however, which had the greatest interest for the public was that part which dealt with the phenomena of materialization. The medium through whom the ma-terializations were produced was a young woman, Florence Cook. Sir William, having heard of her remarkable powers in this direc-tion, engaged her to stay at his home and to give seances there.

He devised a particular laboratory in his home and in it built a cabinet for the tests and arranged every necessary test condition to assure the genuineness of the phenomena. In attendance

The results of his investigations he wrote, in three letters to a journal of that period, "The Spiritualist," by which they were published.

One of the seances with Miss Cook at which Katle King ap-peared is described by Sir William as follows: "On March 12th, dur-ing a seance here, after Katle had been walking amongst us and talkbeen walking amongst us and talking for some time, she retreated behind the curtain which separated my laboratory where the company was sitting, from my li-

"I pass on now to a seance held last night at Hackney. Katie never appeared to better perfection, and for nearly two hours she walked about the room, conversing fa-miliarly with those present. Katie now said she thought she would be able to show herself and Miss Cook together. I was to turn the gas out, and then come with my phosphorus lamp into the room now used as a cabinet.

Height Varies

"I went cautiously into the room, it being dark, and felt about for Miss Cook. I found her crouching on the floor. Kneeling down, I let air into the lamp, and by its light I saw the young lady (Miss Cook) dressed in black velvet, as she had been in the early part of the evening, and to appearances perfectly senseless; she did not move when I took her hand and held high the light quite close to her face, but continued quietly breathing.

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

Rev. Morris' blind-fold billet reading is different from that of others I have witnessed. When the billets are placed upon the pulpit after their collection, he holds all of them up between his hand in unassorted arrangement.

In this position, without one falling out of place, he delivers the messages, occasionally placing them upon the pulpit, singling out the one just answered and handing it over for verification. He states not only what is on the billet but offers much that is unwritten. Names are freely stated. At one of the meetings, several

persons attempted to test the medium in devious ways. One wrote his message in Greek, and this was not only correctly interpreted, but the father's original Greek name was revealed.

To another, whose disbelief was pointed up by his question, it was brought out in the open but not to his discomfiture for the writer readily admitted that he sought to embarrass the medium. The pleasure and satisfaction gained from the services were openly evidenced by applause and praise.

What They Wore

The materialization seances I attended at the First Church of Spiritual Science were extremely interesting. The light in the room was sufficiently bright to distinguish each person easily. The spirits manifesting were readily discerned and their faces and distinguishing features were prominent.

Jewelled crowns, covering the entire head shone brilliantly. Red Indians came with bronzed faces, Red long black braids descending on either side of their heads. The characteristic gutturals of their language were clearly enunciated. These Indians were much taller than anyone in the room.

What They Said

I attended two seances at the First Church of Spiritual Science. The Reverends Chambers attended the cabinet, each sitting or standing at opposite ends of it. The cabinet in the seance room was a curtain strung across a vestibule leading to the church, and the entrance to the room for the public was the opposite vestibule with loose curtains drawn across.

The materializing spirits offered personal messages where needed, greetings and tests and demonstrations interesting to all. Spirits of all sizes represented various ages from grand parents to the small child. These spirits had release from the curtain and many of them came forward to the edge of the circle across the room.

The forms were solidly built but nevertheless re-entered the cabinet speedier than any human could; or their forms decreased in size in front of the curtain slowly disappearing altogether. Most extraordinary was the amount of ectoplasm in evidence. The robes were very full and flowing; huge billows of ectoplasm were used for healing as it was placed over the heads of those needing special healing.

Sitting opposite the cabinet, I could see within it as the curtains parted to admit spirits going out, or returning; the inside of the cabinet was white with dazzling ectoplasm.

Teachers and guides came forth including Dr. Baker, teacher of Rev. Chambers, and Dr. Jameison, teacher of Rev. Morris. The teachers, some as Hindus with huge turbans, gave teaching applicable to all. Standing tall, often with upturned arms, they remained outside the cabinet until the conclusion of their universal message.

What They Sang

Jewels were a brilliant featuresome spirits wore glittering robes with sparkling headdress covering the entire head as if it were a close-fitting cap. A few wore huge pendants ablaze with light. At one time, the light blazed upward from the entwined hands of the spirit and reflected on the face of the manifesting spirit. From my seat, I commented on





SOME WORDS USED IN CONNECTION WITH SPIRITUALISM

PSYCHE-(sy-kee). The Spirit (Greek).*

PSYCHIC-(sy-kik). Things to do with the Spirit. A person who is sensitive to Spirit influence, is termed a Psychic, too.

PSYCHOLOGY-(sy-kol-o-gee): PSYCHOLOGICAL-(sy-ko-lodgeikle). The study of things to do with the Spirit: sometimes used as if referring to things to do with the mind, only.

PSYCHOMETRY-(sy-kom-et-ree). A Psychic, by placing an object such as a glove, ring or letter, against the forehead, or by holding such an object in the hand, is able (by Spirit aid) to get into spiritual contact with those (either living or "dead"), to whom such object has belonged, or by whom such object has been handled.

The P standing at the beginning of a word, when followed by the letter S, is not sounded.

PHYSICAL—(fiz-zikle). To do with matter, or material things; as opposed to psychical (sy-kikle) which deals with Spiritual things only. Ph is sounded as if written F.

CLAIRVOYANCE—(clare-voy-ance). Seeing with Spiritual sight, persons and things, either in the Spirit-world or on earth, which are invisible to those possessing only physical (normal) powers of seeing.

CLAIRVOYANT-(clare-voy-ant). One who sees in this way.

CLAIRVOYANTLY - (cldre-voy-ant-lee). Seeing by means of clairvoyance.

CLAIRAUDIENCE-(clare-or-dience). Hearing Spirit voices and sounds which are inaudible to those possessing only physical (normal) powers of hearing.

CLAIRAUDIENCE-(clare-aw-dience). Hearing Spirit voices and NORMAL-According to rule ...

ABNORMAL: SUPER:NORMAL-Not according to, but deviating from, rule. In connection with physical matters, a wiser definition would be, not according to, or deviation from, Nature's rules and laws, so far as we know them at present.

OBJECTIVE-That which is external to the mind, e.g., the bricks in the wall of a house (physical).

SUBJECTIVE-That which pertains to the mind, and the spiritual portion of the human being: e.g., a Spirit visible only to those who are clairvoyant.

MATERIAL-Things to do with matter, or connected with the earth.

MATERIALIST-One who believes in material (earthly) things only, refusing to believe in spiritual things.

MATERIALIZATION—The appearance of a Spirit clad, for a time, in a more or less solid material body: the taking on of human matter drawn from the bodies of those on earth for a time, by a Spirit, so that it may be touched, felt, seen with physical sight, photographed, weighed, etc., etc.

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DE-MATERIALIZING-The dissolving of a materialized Spirit form: the Spirit, on leaving the temporary material body, causes that body to collapse, and the matter of which it is composed, to return to the bodies of those persons on earth, from whom it was originally drawn.

ASTRALIZATION: ETHERIALIZATION: APPARITION—The appearance of the Spirit of one either living or "dead," clad only in the Spirit-body, which although clearly visible to those possessing only physical (normal) sight, cannot be touched or handled. Termed also "Ghost" and "Spook."

SEANCE—(say-ahnce): THE CIRCLE—The meeting together of persons desirous of getting into touch with those termed "dead."

DOUBLE - To "see the Double" is to see the Spirit of one still living on earth, clad with the spirit-body only, at a distance from the Spirit's physical (earth) body.

LEVITATION—The lifting or moving upwards of physical bodies or things, without visible means, or visible contact with anything.
