College Endowed

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Por THE last 40 years, English-speaking Spiritualists have striven to promote, build and conduct institues or colleges for those desiring to study our philosophy and all phases of mediumship. Some were called schools, some psychic research societies, some institutes,—but whatever the name and, no matter the amount of effort, to date this type of supervised learning has met with little success.

Years ago in England, there was founded the British College of Psychic Science. The word "college" was a misnomer because no students were enrolled, rather experiments were conducted by various psychic researchers, one being Dr. Nandor Fodor, author of "Encyclopedia of Psychic Science," a massive volume recognized as one of the createst elastics for students.

massive volume recognized as one of the greatest classics for students of Spiritualism.

This college was founded by Sir Oliver Lodge, championed by Shaw Desmond, and fathered by J. Arthur Findlay but activities are now defunct. Dr. Fodor moved to America and now lives in New York City where he is devoting his time and effort to psychiatry.

In America, the Morris Pratt Institute, formerly located in Whitewater, Wisconsin, is now housed in the headquarters of the National Spiritualist Association, 11811 Watertown Plank Road, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Years ago, this institute enjoyed fair attendance under the leadership of the late Thomas Grimshaw and others qualified for this type of work.

Other so-called institutes, colleges and foundations have cropped up and then died down over a period of years, but to date there is no Spiritualist "College" which has enrolled more than a handful of active students.

In Britain, J. Arthur Findlay, possibly the best known writer in the field of Spiritualism, publicly stated recently that his estate at Stansted Hall, Essex, some 40 miles from London, will be turned over to the Spiritualist National Union. His mansion will accommodate 40 students and possibly be organized and conducted in such a way that it will be the largest "Spiritualist College" in the world. The reason: there will be an endowment by Findlay of sufficient amount to carry on indefinitely.

I visited The Findlay's and Stansted Hall shortly after World War II after it was used as a Red Cross Hospitial. Many English students of psychic science and Spiritualism plan to take advantage of this institute of learning and even now on special days, The Findlay's welcome visitors. All American Spiritualists visiting London can, by appointment, visit this country estate, according to Findlay.

Any person whose future may have been told as aforesaid, shall be a competent witness against all persons charged with any violation of this chapter. Nothing contained in Sections 2671268 and 269 of this Act shall be deemed to apply to services of a duly ordained Minister of Spiritualist Church, incorporated under the laws of the State of Michigan."

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Importance of the Lyceum

OST RELIGIOUS DENOMINATIONS, as well as the Spiritualists, share a common problem. Children will attend Sunday schools, and in our case, the Lyceum, only until they become teenagers and then quite suddenly their interest wanes and attendance ceases.

We, too, claim that our Lyceums cater to people of all ages. What then, is the teenager's point of view? New and wider interests suggest a break with an apparently childish habit. Fresh experiences, especially in-our high schools provide a different set of friends, and these may not be Spirit-

Consequently, unless well grounded in our philosophy, these teenagers are not able to cope with the ridicule sometimes forthcoming if they voice their affiliation with our Spiritualist Lyceums.

When we look at the record, we find the name "Lyceum" was thought to be a fit one for such a school by none other than the great American Seer, Andrew Jackson Davis. The Webster dictionary definition of Lyceum may surprise you for it says it is "a place of exercise with covered walks in the suburbs of Athens where Aristotle taught philosophy."

There is a difference of course, between Davis' Lyceum and the Greeks' Lyceum. Davis had the power, during trance, to travel into the spirit spheres where he saw spirit children being taught by means of object lessons. The children were arranged in groups according to their Spiritual enlightenment and age. They performed marches to illustrate lessons.

Likewise, did the ancient Greeks. They performed physical exercises in their gymnasiums and, while resting, were taught philosophy.

We have then, in the Lyceum, a system of mental and physical education based on the principle of training practiced in the spirit world introduced chiefly for the children of Spiritualists but not necessarily confined to them. The aim of the entire system is to make better citizens.

The real aim of the Lyceum, however, is not to force opinions upon the young but rather to allow them freedom of expressions of their own thoughts and any inspiration they may show. The leaders are there to guide and correct but not to crush nor cram. This differs greatly from the creed-and-dogma object lessons taught the young in any Orthodox Sunday school.

Old-timers in the Spiritualist movement today will tell you that if it had not been for their Lyceum training they have turned out to be atheists.

And so, it behooves all those who profess interest in their Spiritualist church to devote more time to the young people and make every effort to create added interest in their present Lyceum or start one at the earliest possible moment.

CHURCHMEN in England recently decided to seek the help of Christian mediums in examining claims of contact with the "spirit" world. For this purpose, the Churches Fellow-ship of Psychical Study was formed. There is, however, a much older research body — the Society for Psychical Research, founded in 1882 by F. W. Myers, Edmund Gurney, Professor Henry Sidgwick, Lord Rayleigh, and Sir William Barrett. Members of the society have brought a cool and scientific approach to the subject. It is with the work of researchers in the psychic field that this series deals.

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To these questions, religion would answer emphatically "No"; the rationalist would give an equally vehement "Yes."

There is nothing new about the controversy; for centuries it has been a major issue for the churchman and the philosopher. But it is only in our own time that science has entered the field.

Much valuable work on what is popularly known as "psychic phenomena" has been done by the British Society for Psychical Research.

This can be done in or out of trance, at various levels or degrees of inspirational influence. There is, for example, some Cosmic Influence in the production of this discourse, but it is by no means total. All writers and creative artists should pray and meditate for inspirational help from the Higher Octaves of existence. When such inspiration reaches great heights it becomes genius. Men like Thomas Edison and Henry Ford received many of their best deas directly from Cosmic Sources.

Inspirational Speech: Just as Spirit can influence the flow of thought through pen or type-writer, so can the ideas of speech come under inspiration, either in conversation or before an audience. Only the blind can fail to see that the early church functioned with all of these supernormal powers, which are almost entrely absent from the modern church with its creeds and orthodexies.

A physical medium is a sensitive whose body chemicalization and psychic energies permit of utilization by discarnate operators in the production of external phenomena. Since I am not a physical medium I do not pretend to give instruction in the development of these phases, but discuss herewith some of the types of unusual manifestations.

It is vitally important that a physical medium have a well doveloped and vigilant Band of Etheric cooperators. The manipulation of his or her life energies is a subtle, often dangerous process and can result in damage to the

nervous system and vital organs if improperly executed.

improperly executed.

Hereward Carrington writes that in his experiments and sittings with Madame Eusapia Palladino, the famed Neapolitan medium, she was placed upon a scale on one occasion and her weight varied 30 pounds in the course of two hours! It would appear that the supernormal extrusion of 30 pounds of substance from a woman's body is not something to be done lightly or inexpertly.

not something to be done lightly or inexpertly.

The following are brief descriptions of better known types of physical phenomena:

Telekinesis: The supernormal direction of psychic energy causing movements of objects without any physical contact. Sometimes these movements of objects without any physical contact. Sometimes these are small, light objects but on occasion the Forces have mbved heavy sofas filled with people, weighing up to one thousand pounds!

Somehow the energy is with-drawn, principally from the medium and partly from others present, and then is directed by invisible operators or Intelligences to produce the varied manifestations.

Levitation: This is the supernormal raising of objects, or the countering of normal gravitational influence. Jesus did this when he walked upon the water. The flying saucers do this when they rise rapidly into the atmospheric without any obvious or familiar means of propulsion. Jesus undoubtedly used His adeptic powers to control all the elements and natural forces surrormding Him.

Spirits can levitate objects by directing force so as to overcome gravity and thus render them weightless. Levitation: This is the super-

citing and thus physical mediumship the weightless.

Direct Voice: In this dramatic form of physical mediumship the Invisibles use the ectoplasmic substance to build up a temporary voice box, through which they are able to vibrate our atmosphere and thus make the sound of human voices. It is a dramatic experience to hear from the subtle ether's the voices of those who have passed from this plane!

Direct Writing: Under proper conditions the discarnate operators

Direct Writing: Under proper conditions the discarnate operators can produce writing on paper or other surfaces. Some years ago slate-writing was very popular, and there were mediums who excelled in its productions from the Etheric. Psychic or Spirit Photography: Sensitive photographic plates are imprinted with "extras" which upon development of the picture show as likenesses of departed friends or loved ones. Sometimes this is done without benefit of camera; sensitive plates are "exposed" while being held in the presence of mediums who are able to supply energy for this type of phenomenon.

Teleportation is a very timely subject because it undoubtedly provides a clue to the origin and mancuvers of the flying saucers and other strange aeroforms in our skies. It is declared by some etheric Mentors that these discs are mentally created in planes of Etheria, then projected in flight with the speed of thought. At a critical point in our atmosphere they lower their vibrations, or convert their frequencies, and are seen by us as material objects in our skies.

When their scouting-mission is

When their scouting mission is over, or at will, they simply reconvert their vibrations and emerge upon a different dimensional level of existence. This sounds rather fantastic but it is the only inclusive explanation of all saucer phenomena that I have encountered during seven years of investigation of these strange craft.

Materialization: Of all psychic phenomena this is perhaps the most evidential of human survival of the change called death. From a materialization medium there is extruded sufficient ectoplasm (sometimes called psychoplasm, teleplasm or odic force) so that spirit entities can build up temporary bodies through which they can function again on this plane. The materialized bodies are usually short-lived, perhaps a few minutes at most, although the spirit Katie King materialized before Sir William Crookes and remained long enough to have lungh with Crookes and his party of scientific investigators! A rather curious mystery here is, what became of the lunch that she ate, after the spirit form was dissolved and the ectoplasm was returned to the bodily substance of the medium?



How to Sit

The average person is filled with ignorance and perhaps superstition about mediumistic phenomena, and is unable to secure good results from a sitting because he doesn't know what to say or do. The following are a few simple suggestions that will make your sittings with a trance medium more successful:

Assuming that you have made



an appointment in advance, you should meditate upon the sitting and think about the astral people that you would like to contact if they are available. In other words, make your mental appointments with astral friends before you enter the sitting, Mentally ask them to be present if possible and if conditions permit. As you are seated and the me-

As you are seated and the medium becomes entranced, keep calm and relaxed, with an essentially spiritual frame of mind. Be positive in your expectancy of good to come from the sitting.

You will first talk to one or more of the Guides or Controlling Intelligences of the medium. Be courteous, explicit and act with good manners as you would during any other formal interview. Have your questions well in mind, and preferably written on a piece of paper before you come to the sitting. In this way you will not forget anything that is highly important to you.

The Guides will inform you of the presence of astral people and will transmit messages and replies to you.

Sometimes you will have the privilege of talking directly with your astral friend, but ordinarily the conversation must be carried on through the intermediary of a Con't. Page 7, Col. 1.)

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
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CHAPTER XI

When the spirit arrives in the spirit would, it finds conditions not very much different from those it left on earth. It finds itself upon an earth, with trees, grasses and plants growing on it, and sees a landscape much the same as it was accustomed to see upon earth. It perceives houses and streets and people moving about, just as they did on earth.

Everything seems very natural to the spirit, for, by the law of affinity, it has gravitated to the point in the spirit world most in keeping with its own state and condition. So real and natural do things seem, that the newly arrived spirits do not realize that they are dead, unless they have been previously acquainted with the spiritualistic philosophy while on earth.

Many individuals, schooled in the orthodox religions and expect-

Spirits tell us that after a person has arrived in the spirit world and has received preliminary instruction regarding his new state, he is left to himself for a period in order that he may, have time to meditate and to realize his new condition. When this has been accomplished and he has been sufficiently instructed concerning his new state, he is then left to himself to follow out his own in clinations and attractions; for spirits have the same free will and power of choice in the spirit world that they had upon earth.

The spirit, thus left to himself, seeks out old associates and congenial pleasures, and thus naturally gravitates to his proper place in the spirit world. If his desires and pleasures are of a gross and material kind, he naturally finds his place in the lower spheres; while, if they are of a refined and exalted nature, he finds a suitable place in the higher spheres.

Such, in a general way, are the experiences of the spirit after-leaving the body, according to the accounts received through mediums from spirits in the spirit world.

Concerning the conditions of life in the various spheres to which the spirits go after arriving in the spirit world, the spirits give us something like the following information.

The first sphere, or the one nearest the earth, is the lowest plane in point of development and is the place where the evil and sinful part of humanity go after death. It is gross in its nature compared with the higher spheres, because it is formed out of the lowest and most unrefined emanations of earth.

But this, of course, applies only to the very lowest sphere—the first sphere. The second sphere has more light than the first one and the third sphere is normally bright. Hewat McKenzie, in his book already quoted from, and compiled, from information received direct from a group of scientists in the spirit world, gives the following scale of light for the first three spirit spheres. Reckoning earth light on the basis of 100, he says, the first sphere has from 0 to 30 degrees of light in its lowest portion, 30 to 65 degrees in its middle portion and 50 to 70 degrees in its highest portion.

On the same basis, the second sphere has from 70 to 80 degrees of light in its lowest portion, 80 to 90 degrees in its middle portion and 90 to 99 degrees in its upper portion. The third sphere has from 100 to 110 degrees of light.

The people of this first sphere congregate together in cities, much as they did on earth and live in very much the same way as they did on earth. Their houses are described as poorly constructed and greatly neglected, because houses in the spirit world, as on earth, correspond to the mental status of the owner or builder, and an undeveloped and slovenly mind would have a home of that quality in the spirit world, just as it would on earth.

In the spirit world, so we are told, such things as houses, clothing and even the surrounding plants and other vegetation, are much more responsive to the mental influences of the inhabitants than in the earth world, and accordingly, these things in the spirit world take on the exact condition of the people that dwell among them.

The houses, cities, soil, plants and clothing of the people in the first sphere are all imperfect and unlovely, therefore, corresponding

to their own imperfect and unlovely natures.

The people of the next or second sphere are, of course, more advanced and developed in their natures than those of the first sphere, although they are still very imperfect and undeveloped. This sphere is brighter relatively than the first sphere, but it is still dull compared with the higher spheres.

The people of this sphere are just emerging from the ignorance and evil vices of the first sphere, and consequently they still retain a large portion of their previous characters.

In the second sphere, however, the ignorance and vices are tem-pered considerably by aspirations for the better and thus the inhabitants become prepared for ascent into higher spheres.

in for the better and thus the inhabitants become prepared for their ascent into higher spheres.

The spirits say there are no rediding in the first sphere, because children had not remained on earth long enough to acquire the vices and evil natures which belong to this sphere. Most children at death proceed directly to the third sphere, which is also the sphere to which all well-intentioned people go after death.

Those below the average grade of goodness go to the first or section of sphere; those above the average grade of goodness go to the fourth sphere. The average in the fourth sphere. The average in the fourth sphere. The average in the fourth sphere. This is the real Summerland for the larger part of humanity.

The third sphere is described at a very much like the earth, only in a very much more perfected condition. The beauties of earth are all retained in the third sphere and greatly augmented and accentuated. The imperfect conditions of earth, such as storms, the cold, extremes of climate and other imperfections, together with the hates and evil propensities of manual these are eliminated from the third sphere.

Only the more perfect conditions of earth are there represented, which is the natural result of the more developed and beauty-loving intellects, just as the reverse was the case in the creations of the lower spheres.

After the inhabitants of the third sphere have become sufficiently enlightened and developed, they progress to the fourth sphere. The fourth sphere is a more intellectual sphere and the dwellers there are described as interested chiefly in philosophical studies and in the arts and sciences. They have passed beyond the sphere of practical needs relating to the body, and their interests and enjoyments are now mainly intellectual.

It is to this sphere that the more advanced philosophers, scientists, and artists go. It is the home of the geniuses of earth.

Here men perfect their philosophic conceptions of the universe and embody their ideas in the most perfect artistic creations. The advanced thoughts which inspire men on earth originate in this sphere or in those above it, and are by the dwellers there passed on to the third sphere and to the inhabitants of earth.

The fourth sphere is much more brilliant than the third sphere, which in turn is described as enjoying considerably more light than the earth. According to Mr. McKenzie's scale, the fourth sphere has a brilliancy of from 110 to 120 degrees, considering earth light as 100. This increased brilliancy is not regarded by the inhabitants there as in any way abnormal, because it is in complete accord with their customary manner of vision.

To the inhabitants of the third and lower spheres, however, the light of the fourth sphere would be unbearable. This is the rule regarding the degrees of light in the spheres. What is merely normal light in the higher spheres is the spheres below.

Some people always complain of unsatisfactory interviews with the Etheric but it is their own fault. Their consciousness is very negative and the Forces finally give up the contact as a more or less impossible task.

The best attitude is that of a courteous, sincere and wideawake seeker of truth. Keep your emotions under control and KEEP THINKING even if the turn of events is dramatic and unexpected. Give mental co-operation to your unseen Mentors and encourage them to tell you everything they can. Make your questions intelligent and to the point. With these conditions observed, if the mediumship is genuine and conditions in the astral are satisfactory, you are sure to obtain a very satisfying and enlightening sitting.

An interview or private sitting with an inspirational or intuitional sensitive follows most of the rules laid down for the trance interview, with the following differences. Of this I write from long experience, having given thousands of such interviews during the past fifteen years to people in all parts of America and Canada.

The Intuitional counselor does not enter trance but does become subjective and is studying the etheric conditions around you, including the auric field. Usually his or her basic impressions of you will first be given, including the aura analysis, sometimes a reading of karmic influences from previous incarnations, and other general intuitive impressions.

Then you are permitted to ask

Then you are permitted to ask questions or to raise any problem areas of your life. In my case this is informal and confidential, of course, and as the interview proceeds I give additional impressions. ceeds I give additional impressions concerning problems under discussion, and project their lines of tendency into the future. This is not fortune-telling in the common sense of the term; it is a projection of tendencies just as the stock market and grain markets are projected by experts who have certain facts and then extrapolate or direct their future lines of tendency.

When the most important problems have come under discussion and guidance I usually dwell then upon health and emotional problems. Impressions are given here as well, and then followed with metaphysical healing treatment as the case may require.

Prof. J. H. Hyslop, writing in 1902 in his noted work, "Enigmas of Psychical Research" stated that in his long researches he had found large margins of error and sometimes of deliberate fraud, even as high as ninety per cent, but the ten per cent of residual truthful information of evidential value was well worth all the struggle involved in obtaining it!

So one must be open-minded but careful. Do not make the mistake of swallowing whole everything that is said to you; but on the other hand, reject not without cause and good evidence to the contrary. Despite all the difficulties surrounding psychic and intuitional contacts, they are still wonderful sources of knowedge and guidance for a great many people.

Matter of Chance

Dr. Soal's experiments were among the most thorough and painstaking ever carried out. He tried to eliminate every conceit-able loophole for error—and his percipients were at first, phen-omenally unsuccessful.

After five years he had tested 160 different subjects and had recorded 128,350 guesses, none of which showed any more "hits" than could be accounted for by

which showed any more "hits" than could be accounted for by chance.

Dr. Soal began to believe there must be some serious flaw in Professor Rhine's methods. Then he set to work to resift his tabulations, and discovered an extraordinary factor — that in many cases the precipient had correctly guessed the card before or after the one the agent held in his hand. He at once began a new series of trials, and found that the "hits" on the card one ahead were so many that the odds were a billion billion billion to one against their being obtained by chance. The startled investigator was now faced with new evidence—this time for precognition, or seeing ahead.

Experiments like these, and others which are still going on, may seem unimpressive to the man-in-the-street, but they have brought forthright comments from at least two authoritative sources. One comes from Rhine himself, who says: "There is now evidence that

"There is now evidence that extra-physical or spiritual faculties exist in man."

And one of the world's most distinguished scholars, C. D. Broad, Professor of Moral Philosophy at Cambridge University, says:

"For my own part, I have no doubt that telepathy among normal human beings happens from time to time. In order to account for the information that is sometimes conveyed by good trance mediums and automatic writers, a very extensive and peculiar telepathy among the living is the very least that must be postulated."
