WHY ARE **WE HERE?**

To be efficient physically, always with a spiritual motive and objective.

WHY DO WE have to live on the physical plane, when the researches of Spiritualism show that there are many other 'planes' or 'worlds,' all reported to be incomparably more comfortable, and offering greatly superior op-

portunities for spiritual growth?

Obviously, physical life must have its own specific, definite purpose. How are we to find out what it is? Religious and other teachers enjoin us to be good; meaning

ers enjoin us to be good; meaning honest, truthful, moral, unselfish, and so forth. But all that would apply to life on any plane: so our question is not answered in a manner specific to physical life.

Paradoxically, the specific purpose of physical life can be found only by studying life on OTHER planes. Then, by comparing physical with non-physical life, subtracting what is common to both, we can perceive, and concentrate on, what is specific to physical life.

Creation Is Slow

Hence the necessity for studying psychic phenomena, for the same reason that, if we want to learn about steel, we must study iron and other metals, for only in that way can we ascertain the unique qualities of steel.

qualities of steel.

Let us consider just one characteristic of physical life. It has been well said that all we can do, probably on all planes, is to move matter. At once we are struck by the fact that it seems far easier to move matter on other planes than on the physical. On other planes, it seems, you have only to imagine, to think, and, hey presto, your creation is in front of you! If you make an error, a bit more thinking, and your mistake is corrected. Then consider how easy it is to move about in the other 'worlds'!

Very different is this moving-

Very different is this moving-matter business on our physical plane. 'Creation' is far slower: er-rors are not so easily corrected: it takes far more pains to plan.

Physical Life Demands

Physical Life Demands

Here is our clue. Physical life demands, in very high degree, such faculties as:—immense patience, perserverance, persistence, endurance: meticulous, exhaustive, detailed foresight and planning, both strategic and tactical; you cannot just 'think' your materials into existence, pluck them out of the atmosphere, so to speak. No, you have to find them, transport them, shape them, put them together in the right order, places and times. The gap between conception and execution is far longer and more tedious, demanding far more pains, in physical life, than on other planes.

We might say that physical life demands Edison's "infinite capacity for taking pains"; in other words, our special, specific job on this earth-plane is to make ourselves PHYSICALLY EFFICIENT

craftsmen, in the widest possible

sense.

But, in addition to being physical, man is also an emotional, mental and spiritual entity, so he has to learn to be efficient in working with those kinds of matter also. Nevertheless, the fact still remains that, while in the physical world, the 'lesson' he is here to learn is the efficient management of physical world. the efficient management of physical matter.

"Vale of Tears"

Heaven forbid, however, that he should make this an excuse for becoming a materialist! Far from it. Being essentially a spiritual being, he has to learn how to live with and handle physical matter in a spiritual manner, with a spiritual objective.

Readers are invited to cogitate on this seed-idea (if it seems sound) and develop it further in a thou-sand directions.

To me, it has proved wonderfully creative and directive as a guide in practically every detail of life in this "vale of tears"—though perhaps "vale of sweat" might be more appropriate!

To be efficient abscication

To be efficient physically, always with a spiritual motive and objective. That is the question. To divert a phrase of Emerson: to be as "of taking thought for oxen." Thus Ethics, Science, Religion, confirmed by Spiritualism, are ONE.

By What Authority?

EN ARE always confronted, generally unconsciously, by the problem of authority which can be classified into such types as:

- 1. God, religion, science, philosophy, law.
- 2. Church, state, army, university, police, political party.
- 3. Bible, text books, decrees, dogmas, theses, histories.
- 4. Plato, Thomas Aquinas, Newton, Blackstone, Einstein, Toynbee.

The first type concerns general ideas; the second organizations; the third recorded opinions; and the last persons. So far analysis reveals nothing startling; but, after pondering, a curious fact strikes the mind — namely, that the first three authorities emerge from the fourth.

God is an idea in a human mind. A state is a collection of human beings. Books are the writings of men. It follows that authority is but a personal opinion; further, such opinion has a dual aspect, the mind originating the idea and the mind accepting the idea.

Therefore, the final authority for the individual is the individual who rejects, accepts or modifies the idea. One is back at the starting point. This is of supreme importance in Spiritualism, because it is now seen that: A man cannot pass the responsibility for accepting or rejecting survival and the spirit world as true or not true on to some other auth ity. HE is responsible, not for others, but for HIMSELF

From this there is no escape.

Our Contribution

PIRITUALISM has made a big contribution to modern thought in many ways.

It has taken the prospect of life after death out of the field of speculation and placed it in the region of certainty for all, regardless of faith or belief. It has revealed the natural simplicity of death and given a rational foundation to the continuity of life based on the existence of the spiritual (or etheric) body. 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The New Year For Spiritualists?

ELIGIOUS journals, throughout the world, are confronted at the advent of a New Year, with the usual task of editorially bringing to the fore, ideas, facts and figures that might benefit those who adhere to the various teachings they propound. Many editors attempt to summarize and play up the progress made in the past and point to some sort of a Utopia toward which each should aspire.

In the main, the one subject foremost in the minds of all thinking Spiritualists: What about the future? In our case: What progress, if any, has Spiritualism made? If we go back some hundred years and try to determine whether or not the religion of Modern Spiritualism has noticeably advanced or numerically increased, we are always confronted with a diversity of opinions and answers because everyone, putting in their two-cents worth, uses a different measuring rod.

Some would say we have increased in numbers even to the tune of several million, but these informers would mean that, even though millions are directly interested in survival, all need not necessarily be Spiritualists.

There are others who would say that the number of actual affiliated Spiritualists has increased and point to this imagined fact as progress. There are still others who would say that the religion of Spiritualism is fast losing its real purpose, in that the actual teachings, once vividly declared by the founders, are today being garbled and misrepresented by its own leaders, in the sense that our real spiritual philosophy is being expounded from our rostrums by a very few.

These opinions are based upon the varied and generally limited experience of individuals who simply do not get around and whose opinions therefore, carry little or no

As far as Spiritualism in the New Year is concerned, it is reasonable to believe there will be no noticeable improvement in any of its departments, regardless of what you use as a measuring rod, simply because the very nature of our religion makes it so.

The trouble is this. The average luke-warm devotee of Spiritualism is prone to think of Spiritualism in the light of Orthodoxy, Christian Science and Catholicism, to mention a few, in the sense that, once having been in the ranks, they look to these religions as being basicly sound, especially financially. Besides the leaders of these religions have little or no rebellion within their ranks simply because they exact loyalty to their creed and because they have been schooled in dogma, which can seldom be misinterpreted by their followers.

In Spiritualism, it is different. We have a democratic religion. Every single Spiritualist minister in the land can bisect, add to, elaborate, embellish or revise any part of the religion, philosophy and science of Modern Spiritualism they choose and pawn off their presentation as the real thing. Who is to stop them?

Consequently, we have no set philosophy to offer to the public and as a result, there is confusion. Of course, we have our Declaration of Principles studiously taught and studied by the National Spiritualist Association and many other groups not necessarily so affiliated. So have the English Spiritualists but they differ . . . and most of the other organizations, fundamentally Spiritualist, have coined their own declarations to suit the thinking and understanding of their leaders.

Adding to all this confusion and diversity of thought Adding to all this contusion and diversity of thought, there are almost as many different names of Spiritualist churches as there are churches themselves and I trust that some day, not too far distant, something can be done to change all this. Not that the uniformity of names would change the presentation, but at least it would eliminate a lot of the confusion in the minds of those who pour through any directory of Spiritualist churches.

The last record compiled at this office aggregates 375,000 accredited Spiritualists, in the sense that they are church members and pay dues, but I would not presume this accounting to be correct.



THE BOOK of Judges comes next after Joshua, and covers the period of time from Joshua to Samuel, the period when the people had no king, but "every man did that which was right in his own eyes." This book is one of the most useful of the historic books of the Bible. It corrects many of the unhistorical stories of the Book of Joshua.

From reading the book of Joshua, one would conclude that the ten tribes of Israel which crossed the Jordan, acted in perfect unity in subjugating and exterminating the "seven nations" inhabiting that country. The reading of Judges gives the reader to understand that the conquest was very gradual; in fact, so gradual that it did not occur at all, for the nations were there to harass Israel clear down to the time of David.

From Judges we learn that

From Judges we learn that Israel was not a unit, but instead they were constantly engaged in internal wars. Moses, or rather "Yah-weh," had said: "I will utterly put out the remembrance of Amalek from under heaven," Exodus 17:13, but until King Saul's day, Amalek comes as regularly as the seasons of the year to blot and be blotted out, until Samuel offers its King Agag as a sacrifice to Yah-weh. 1st Sam. 15:32.

But, as the Pentateuch was not written by Moses, and the book of Joshua was not written by Joshua, so the book of Judges was not written until after the Babylonish Captivity, which takes us to 600 B. C. The materials for compiling the book may have existed from the days of Samuel, but Judges, 18:30 could not have been written until after the captivity. It reads as follows:

"And the children of Dan set up the graven image; and Jonathan, the son of Manassah, he and his sons were priests to the tribe of Dan until the day of the captivity of the land."

In the period between 1090 and 1000 B.C., while Egypt was feeble, one or more Habiri tribes under the leadership of Saul and David gained control and domination over Palestine and formed the monarchy of Israel. Then, under David's son Solomon, a cruel, vainglorious despot, the monarchy became weakened and, in consequence of his tyranny and oppression, it divided on his death into two in dependent kingdoms. Then, as we have said, about 600 B. C., the Babylonians found the small Israelitish kingdom a troublesome neighbor who was aiding their enemies

of the Nile. The Babylonians twice invaded Jerusalem and severely punished the people. The second time they totally destroyed the city and took a large number of the prominent inhabitants captive to Babylon. This captivity, or Exile, lasted until 538 B. C., when the Persians under Cyrus conquered Babylon. At that time the captive Israelistes were returned to Jerusalem as Persian subjects.

In Judges 1:19, is a text that can only be understood when interpreted in the light of the Spiritual philosophy. It reads like this:
"And the Lord was with Judah, and he drave out the inhabitants of the mountain; but he could not drive out the inhabitants of the valley, for they had chariots of iron." A man who is called an infidel quotes this text and asserts that iron chariots were too much for Jehovah! The Christian folds his arms and shuts his eyes and in his soul wishes that the text was not in the Bible. To me the explanation is clear. Yah-weh, the god here introduced, is the god of the hills. (See 1st Kings 20:23 to 38.) The verse at one place reads: "And the servants of the king of Syria said unto him, Their gods are gods of the hills; therefore they were stronger than we; but let us fight against them in the plain, and surely we shall be stronger than they."

These gods or spirits, like game-cocks, fight better at home than away from home. Spirits always give better manifestations in their own seance room, where they are accustomed to manifesting, than they do elsewhere. If furniture and familiar articles are magnetized, may we not believe that whole localities can also be magnetized giving added strength to the spirit power manifesting?

Now these Hebrews fought as mediums, and could conquer when in Yah-weh's territory; but Chemosh was also a god. Judges: 11; 24, 25. When Yah-weh and his army of spirits and mediums got down into the valleys, into Chemosh's territory, Chemosh and his soldiers being at home, conquered. In Judges 2:1, and "angel of the Lord" came up from Gilgal with a very important revelation, informing Israel that they had broken the conditions, and consequently other influences had gotten among them; influences which would harass them for a long time. The history of the battle between Yah-weh and other influences, called other gods takes up much of the remainder of the chapter.

This disturbed the Israelites very much; they wept bitterly when the spirit-angel brought the message. They hurriedly changed back from "foreign-god worship" and built altars to Yah-weh. They named the place where the angel appeared to them, Bochim, which interpreted means "the weepers." Naturally for Yah-weh's chosen people to leave off worshipping him and following after such gods as Baal, Chemosh, and Ashtaroth, was a grievous insult!

In Judges 3:10, Othniel, son of Kenaz, and Caleb's younger brother, was ordained a medium and led the people for a time. It is said that "The Spirit of the Lord came upon him and he judged Israel."

In chapter 4:4-6 is the history of Deborah, a prophetess or medium, to whom the people used to go for judgments or sittings. She

Israel's Army

In chapter 5:19,20 is the history of another battle, where spiritlights served to assist Israel and hinder Sisera. Verse 20 reads: "They fought from heaven; the stars in their courses fought against Sisera." In this chapter also an angel comes from heaven and curses Meroz bitterly because it did not come to the battle; and blessed Jael, the wife of Heber, for betraying Sisera by an act of treachery, and finally driving a nail into his head. Compare verse 23 with 4:21.

In chapter 6:8, Yah-weh sent a prophet—medium—to Israel with an important message. In verses 11 and 12 an angel appeared to Gideon, and he was called by an audible voice to lead Israel's army, as Joan of Arc was afterward called to lead the French army. Gideon was only a common man, of a common family, and he did not believe that an angel would come to one of so low a degree. It required several tests to make this medium believe his own eyes and ears. This celestial visitant is called an angel seven times; the Lord, or Yah-weh, seven times; and God twice. Gideon could not believe his own mediumship. In verse 17, he says: "If now I have found grace in thy sight, then show me a sign that thou talkest with me."

me a sign that thou talkest with me."

Finally, when he was convinced that he had seen and talked with an angel, he said: "Alas, O Yahweh God, for because I have seen an angel face to face." Verse 22. Many people believe that to see a spirit, is a forewarning of their own deaths. Gideon was disturbed when he saw the angel because he feared it foretold disaster. To witness the things Gideon did, were startling enough. The fleece on the threshing-floor acted strangely indeed.

The Midianites

Gideon prepares a lunch of cakes, flesh and broth for the angel to eat. Verses 19-21. Finally the spirit of the Lord, that is, the spirit of Yahweh, came upon Gideon. Let two things be not forgotten: First, whenever you find the word LORD, in this part of the Bible, in small capital letters, the original word is Yah-weh. Second, Yah-weh was the spirit of a dead Egyptian. In verses 36, 38, and 40, this spirit is called God. He became Gideon's control:

Here, by the way, are manifestations more ridiculous than any rappings or table-tippings ever met with in Modern Spiritualism. Gideon asks the angel for a test and receives two of them, one by the dew coming on the fleece and not on the grass around it; the other by the dew coming on the grass around the fleece, and not on the fleece. Each of these manifestations occurred in the night.

In chapter 7, this same thing is continued. In verse 2 the Lord comes to Gideon and tells him his army is too large. This is something new; generals seldom get too large an army. Now, if this army was to do its work as a band of mediums is was too large the moment it got one soldier into it who was not sufficiently developed for the work. The army which, at the beginning, was not half as large as that of the Midianites, after being cut down, was still too large; so Gideon's control led him to take his army down to the water; and Gideon, by command of his influence, watched them drink. Only those who could be controlled to lap water like a dog were selected. Only three hundred of them could be so controlled!

Gideon, by his "Lord," or his influence, was led down, in the dark,

The Men of Shechem

Sometimes, when Yah-weh fell out with the people, he sent evil spirits to lead them astray. In chapter 9: 23 Yah-weh sent an evil spirit between Abimelech and the men of Shechem, and treachery was the result.

Such is often the case today.

Even in Spiritualism, influences, often lead mediums to oppose each other. Some think Jesuitical spirits are by this means endeavoring to render Spiritualism obnoxious to the world. On this side of spirituland, we know that many ministers and priests warn their followers away from mediums and Spiritualism. Personally, I suffered for more than a score of years, under the pens and tongues of those who, under spirit direction, sought to destroy my usefulness. Thanks to the higher and more intelligent powers, it is all over now.

In chapter 10:10 to 13, the Hebrews had deserted Yah-weh, their spirit guide; but when they got into trouble they called to him to come to them once more. But he, in his wrath, as recorded in verses 13 and 14, said unto them: "Ye have forsaken me and served other gods; wherefore I will deliver you no more. Go and cry unto the gods which ye have chosen; and let them deliver you in the time of your tribulation."

In verses 15, 16, the children of Israel made their acknowledgments to Yah-weh, and put away their strange gods, and again accepted his guidance.

In chapter 11, Jephthah, the son of a "naughty woman," and one who afterward sacrificed his daughter to Yah-weh (see verse 39), was called to fight for and judge Israel. This Jephthah aeknowledged the God of the Ammonites to be as much God as his own Yah-weh. In verse 24, he said to the general of the armies: "Wilt thou not possess that which Chemosh thy god giveth thee to possess?" So whomsoever the Lord our God shall drive from before us, them will we possess."

Here the gods of Chemosh and Yah-weh are placed on equal terms.

Yule Log Tradition Fast Becoming Lost To Modern Living

THE YULE LOG is a tradition of Christmas, but due to central heating it is becoming a lost tradition in this country. Few city dwellers have open grates or desire a log fire. And those living in the country find coal or gas more efficient and less trouble.

However, for those who have a place to burn the yule log and want one, tradition says it should be oak, ash, olive, apple or pine. Further, the fire on which it is placed should be kindled from a brand saved from last year's log. And that it should not be allowed to go out during the night.

For those determined to have the yule log, the voice of experience says get hold of all the wood you can. Some kinds burn better than others, but reject none these days.

Ashr is highly praised by some

you can. Some kinds burn better than others, but reject none these days.

Ash is highly praised by some and can be used without being seasoned. It burns quickly, but throws off great heat. Poplar, on the other hand, should be seasoned or it will spark badly.

Elm is condemned as undesirable, but can be used. It is slow to get burning, but lasts a long time and brightens up when it gets going. A few logs of birch, pine or fir will help it along.

Beech and oak are among the best logs. Beech is especially good, having a pleasant aroma and a steady glow. Oak has the outstanding merit of burning slowly. If none of these are available wood from all kinds of fruit trees are prime favorites for the yule log because of their pleasant smell when burning.

SPIRITUALISTS who would prove their faith by the Bible will find that it furnishes the strongest evidence. From Genesis to Revelation the nearness of the spirit world and the inter-communion of spirits and mortals runs like a golden strand through all its pages. Not only spirit communion, but every phase of the manifestations distinctively known as Modern Spiritualism is represented on many occasions, often hundreds of years apart.

This similarity of expression

This similarity of expression shows that the same psychic laws held then as now, and there has been no change. Spiritualism furnishes the key whereby the mysteries of the Bible and its miracles are explained with a clearness commentators have not been able to attain for want of the knowledge it furnishes.

Though angels are understood to be special creations, and spirits to have ascended through mortal bodies, the words are used by the writers of the Bible as interchangeable, as shown by the following passages:—

"That is some answer to the problem of pain, but it is an oversimplification because it does not deal with innocent suffering. In the animal world we still do horrible things in the way of torture and ill-treatment. It would be very hard from the animal's point of view to say that that was the working out of cause and effect.

"These are problems which have puzzled men from the beginning of time. I think you will find that the clergy are no better qualified to answer them than anyone else."

Speaking of world affairs, Dowding said he thought honest self-examination would reveal the fact that many people desired peace only because they feared the alternative. "Nothing that is based exclusively on fear can be good," he said. There was some sound sense for scientists. In the matter of inquiring into psychics, Lord Dowding declared it was very much a question of "becoming as little children."

"If every man in the street and "If every man in the street and scientist and clergyman had the kind of mind I think of he would be prepared at any rate to examine the evidence. But without you become as little children you won't even examine the evidence. You make up your mind without any evidence

make up your mind without any evidence.

"The thoughts I give tonight arise from reading, discussion and from notes I have kept of circle records over the last dozen years.

"I found I could not deal with any of the subjects I want to mention without first referring to God. I want first of all to define, without irreverence, I hope, what I mean by the use of that word.

"I think we have to visualize God as a kind of commander-inchief who has a number of subordinates at his service. One might, I think, picture one angel lord in

"Then there are our galaxy and our milky way, of which we are an infinitesimal speck, and other neb-ulae in fantastic numbers.

"However simply we put forward our devotions to God, we can think of them being picked up by one of these subordinates, who will ensure they reach the central headquar-ters.

"One way God has been regarded by religions much older than the Christian is as a trinity. My own impressions about that is that it is rather a man-made effort to define the illimitable. In 325 AD, under the Emperor Constantine, it was decided, largely as the result of the operations of gangs of toughs, that the trinity rather than the unity would be the religion adopted as the official faith of the Romans.

adopted as the official faith of the Romans.

"There is a point beyond which no reasoning can take us. God has decreed that spirit shall descend through varying grades of matter until it reaches the dense and solid. After that, it begins to rise again through the mineral, vegetable, animal, human and angelic, until it reaches again the source from which it began—the pure, undifferentiated spirit of God.

"The downward path is called involution and the return journey is called evolution. The teaching of this principle has come to us from supernormal sources.

"We, together with the plants and animals and minerals, are all on the returning, evolutionary path. But if we step across and concern ourselves with this other stream of matter which is in process of involution, we find that we get hurt. And as we don't like getting hurt, we call this downward stream evil. In fact, it is fulfilling God's law, although it is on another part of the cycle.

A questioner asked whether, if there were psychic overlords for the planets, could there be overlords for the nations? Lord Dowding replied that he fully believed each nation was represented by some beneficent angel.

The questioner then inquired why those angels did not "get together to sort out the mess in the world." Did it appear reasonable to assume that, possessed of powers of destruction which were now admitted to be cataclysmic, man was capable of controlling such abilities without a spiritual foundation?

Dowding pointed out that the deadliest weapon of the first world war—poison gas—had not been used to any great extent. It seemed reasonable to suppose that atomic weapons would not be employed for the same reasons.

His questioner retorted, "The only reason poison gas.wasn't used was because they didn't know which way the wind was going to blow."

There were protests from the audience when the lecturer stated that man was less barbarous now than he had been in the past. "What about the Nazis?" one woman called.

Holding to his point, Dowding said: "We have made great progress during the last 200 years. That is quite remarkable, for 200 years is a very short period in the total span of human life on earth."

THE WHOLE Christian tradi-THE WHOLE Christian tradition is filled with "spirits." Sometimes they are called Guardian angels, sometimes angels and actually sometimes they are called plain "men." We are told that "two men in white garments" stood at the tomb of the Master after the Resurrection. These unseen beings, for just about everybody, have no existence — simply because they cannot be seen, except clairvoyantly, or heard except clairaudiently.

These as you know are two French words that mean "clear seeing" and "clear hearing"—seen and heard on a level of vibration high above the normal sight and hearing of the average individual. And the tragedy of it is, that because the average human cannot see or hear them they assert emphatically that they do not exist — they are not there.

A portion of a candle, which burned mysteriously for almost a month:

Parchments on which disembodied hands have scrawled messages to the living:

The table from a nun's room on which a dead priest left the imprint of his hand and a cross.

The collection began in the 19th century, after a fire in a chapel, during which passers by saw the image of a man in terrible pain in the midst of the smoke. They concluded it was a spirit from Purgatory. After the fire was extinguished, the image remained, and was photographed by score of people. It is still there today on the wall, behind a painting.

Fr. Jouet and his successors collected affidavits and documents attesting to the truth and validity of each item. The Church expresses no opinion.


