



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a study of the situation; but the opposition of a minority group, who still believe that it is necessary to limit religious practices. Some of the opposition have no conception of the other laws on the Statute Books having to do with fraud, false pretenses and confidence games, which in our state are suffi-cient to prosecute fakers in any field of action. The law we asked to have repealed was the one mak-ing it a crime to accept money for our work. This law does not make it a crime to "perform," but does make it a crime to accept money for the "performace." Without a doubt the laws which discriminate against our religion could be taken to the Colorado Supreme Court and proved uncon-stitutional. It shouldn't be neces-sary to have to pay for such a fight, but it is. Then, too, there are those in our ranks who narrow Spiritualism down to technicalities too, as bad as the discrimination that occurred in the "Witchcraft Era" of old. One senator, who was in favor of repeal, remarked: "We used to burn the witches at the stake; if witches there are, or were, or ever have been!) Now we merely throw them in jail and make them suffer other indignities." We finally got the Bill through the House and to the Governor's desk—and in spite of great num-bers of letters from all over the state in its favor, it was vetoed. (Our Governor has definite relig-ious convictions too.) In his ex-planation of his veto he said he was not willing to make allowances just to churches, as he felt educa-tional research along these lines should not be restricted by law, either. We are no worse off than we

tional research along these line should not be restricted by law

when the should not be restricted by law, either. We are no worse off than we were, and we learned enough to know what to do next time—in fact, we already have our new bill written, and have a man in each house we can depend on to carry it to victory for us. The publicity we created brought both friends and enemies into the open, and the best educated are our friends in almost every in-stance.

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
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

Dr. Murphy says: Actually, most of us in the field are confirmed skeptics, and I'll tell you why. Having seen ESP in action and in the laboratory we know what it can do. We think the "evidence" presented by me-diums is evidence of extrasensory perception — of communication not with the dead, but with the living. Various ESP functions such as

Not with the dead, but with the living. Various ESP functions such as telepathy seem to be heightened by the onset of death. Under the stress of this most final of human crises, may not the mind cry out telepathically to establish a link with those it loves? Could not mediums who are able to give accurate and specific information actually be getting that informa-tion, not from the dead and de-parted, but directly, by unconsci-ously reading the minds of those living and present? Some of us think so, even though we try, as scientists, to keep an open mind about what is, to say the least, a controversial subject.



PYTHAGORAS was born on Samos, one of the Grecian islands, approximately 582 B.C. His parents are said to have B.C. B.C. His parents are said to have been very much in love with each other and **Pythagoras** later claimed that only such an union could place parenthood on the highest plane. We know this to be true, for a child born of love has the advantage, physically and men-tally, over one born in hatred or one who comes, undesired, into life. one life.

one who comes, undesired, into life. **Pythagoras** was a handsome man and, like most good-looking people, was well aware of the fact. His splendid mind taught him, how-ever, that a handsome man cannot always talk as well as he looks, so it is not good for him to talk too much. It is said that **Pythagoras** was a very silent man. His father was a very silent and away from home much of the time, leaving him to the almost constant com-panionship of his mother. He had an ideal childhood and during his youth, his insatiable de-sire for knowledge, and his mother's ambition for his future, caused him to build a mental foun-dation which was of inestimable value to his later psychic unfold-ment.

Objective Clairvoyance Parthenes, the mother of Pytha-goras, was a beautiful woman. She was a believer in the occult reli-gions and, even before his birth, she is said to have dedicated her son's life to the spiritis or gods. 

EVIDENCE that man-as well as **E**VIDENCE that man—as well as every living creature — is essentially an electrical apparatus, is piling up in such quantity that I think the case may be considered proved. Crile, head of the Cleveland Clinic, 1923. head of the Cleveland Clinic, 1923. After 20 years research, Crile found that every living cell, ani-mal or vegetable, has positive electricity on its nucleus, and neg-ative on the enveloping proto-plasm. The distinction between live and dead matter is the ability of the nucleus to generate surplus electricity, which it discharges in-to the protoplasm in microwaves, thus creating a continuous voltaic to the protoplasm in microwaves, thus creating a continuous voltaic cell-discharge of electricity in the body. Professor Edmund Jacobsen, M.D., Chicago University, considers that thought itself is, or has, elec-tric current. In the early 1940s, the U.S. Coast and Geodetic Survey published data on a celestial rain of negative electrons (not cosmic rays), hitting the earth at a rate of 1½ million per square centi-metre per second—of which more anon.

The tips of dendrites, like that of a lightning rod, produce concentration of electrical charge, needing only the launching push of a thought, to cause it to discharge into space

needing only the launching push of a thought, to cause it to discharge into space. In the Crehore Sea we have a plausible explanation of the Astro-logical importance of the moment of birth. While still a foetus, an entity is shielded from the Cre-hore Sea waves. The moment it is born, these influences, acting on virgin soil, may well produce deep, often indelible impressions, thus "rubber-stamping" the in-dividual for life. The reason, Crehore suggests, why we are not more telepathic than we could be, is tenseness and strain of modern life, which puts us out of touch with the Crehore Waves.

It is also at least plausible that instincts of a species are due to each individu-al being in constant telepathic com-munication with others of its species — living or dead. Crehore succinctly epitomizes the main elements of his thesis thus: he founds it solely on the findings of orthodox science: the body lives by generating a surplus of positive electricity: the brain has billions of filaments which are ideal radio antennae that send out and take in current: the atmo-sphere is a sea of negative elec-tricity (electrons): positive and negative electricity attract one an-other.

negative electricity attract one an-other. Hence he is correct in stating that he brings no new data. But he brings what is worth more. He is one of those rare individuals who can take known data, think about them, and out of them build a grand synthesis. And that is just what we need today. We have too much fragmentation in virtually every sicence. Our great need is synthesis.' So hats off to our Mr. Crehore! Though small, "Mental, Tele-pathy" contains much other ma-terial of value,! including tech-niques for practicing telepathy. Very strongly I advise the scienti-fically-oriented to procure and study this volume — diligently. I am disposed to think it will prove a landmark in human thought, and in our knowledge of our own selves.

The book of the Lereda Circle sittings contains the testimony of Abbe Abrugnana, corroborated by Alfred Russell Wallace, and Vic-torien Sardou, member of the French Academy. 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
