Is It "Empty" Space? By WEST DOUBT

Science, unknowingly, in its theories and investigations of bas-ic matter, has revealed the asser-tions of Spiritualism to be cor-rect, in that science acknowledges that all matter including the hum-an body is almost entirely so-call-ed "empty" space. Long before ed "empty" space. Long before the discoveries of modern science that rare combination of seer and scientist, Swedenborg, stated that there is no such thing as a vacuum empty -called space is entirely filled with substance.

Science with its "material" Science with its "material" probes cannot penetrate this realm of "higher vibration." Science ac-knowledges that all the matter-that science accepts as existing is formed similar to the solar system with great spaces between ac-tual solids.

Like a spoked wheel, we see re-volving, matter as we know it is only an appearance of solidity be-cause of its high rate of particle speed or vibration. Gases are sol-ids because they have the same ids because they have the same identical structure as solids, but only a higher speed of particle vi-bration. It is the correspondence between our physical body's speed of particle vibration and the phy-sical objects outside ourselves that cause some objects to appear to have colidity and other bot to have solidity and others not.

We cannot pass through a wall of ice, but when it is heated and attains a higher speed of particle vibration we can pass through it which dwells within our physical body and gives it form and life. If the spiritual body were remov-ed the physical body would imme-diately collapse, and this is what occurs at so-called death.

"Death" Releases

This so-called empty space, re-vealed by the demonstrable theories of science, makes up the far greater part of our universe, and within it exists the peopled world known to Spiritualists. The scientist Einstein dealt only with the material phase of the uni-verse in his theories, and did not deal with substantial realities such as thought, feeling, sight, sound, etc., which are spiritual in essence.

These things partake of matter only to the extent they are bound to it by the human soul. "Death" releases them from this bondage and they continue to exist in the "empty" space. Science has neith-er analyzed these basic substances or defined their solds yot they or defined their abode, yet they are more real than matter, be-cause without them, matter could not even exist in the conception of man.

of man. The psychic phenomena of Spiritualism deals almost entirely with this realm of "empty space." The power that makes and sus-tains matter also dwells in this realm. If the truth were known, as revealed through mediumship, that the human body is of a spiri-tual essence in its entirety rather than material as science tends to assume, death would lose its "sting." "sting."

this way (infaily getting around to the matter!): I don't have the time to hold the paper, so when I'm in the dark room processing normal negatives and prints, I stick a piece of 4x5 paper (of this Resisto Rapid No. 4 which has giv-en best results) down my T-shirt and another upward from below to be over the solar plexus, and a third down in my shorts under the elastic, and forget them while going about my work. Whether the emulsion is against the body or not is immaterial if you are not perspiring, and that will quickly show up on a print. You can put three or four pieces together even. I cometimes stick one down my-collar in back over my spine.

EXPOSURE TIME

My print box has a single 60 watt ordinary house bulb under ground or opal glass. I give an

ground or opal glass. I give an exposure of everything from the fastest flash, to three and four seconds. I shift to a 40 and 25 and a $7\frac{1}{2}$ watt bulb. Or I pre-fer to hold the paper out the dark room door, daytimes. When I think of it, I remove them and expose them and toss them in the tray of plain wash water. I may start developing them af-ter a fast dip in the water, or after forgetting them for ten minutes. It was not until I'd made three hundred of the first tries, that a person (one of four

made three hundred of the first tries, that a person (one of four I know who have ever made these) told me about this pre-soak. It holds the whites better but is not actually necessary.

but is not actually necessary. One evening I made sixteen scotos this way and a glance at them when putting them on the ferrotype plates to gloss and dry made me feel disappointed for 1 always want good faces or well delineated block letters of initials of friends on the other side. Next evening when I sat down at the desk and pulled the desk lamp up close to stare at these, while slowly turning them around, I was aware of a good "5" on one. It turned out that all 16 prints had numerals on, most of them well defined. This resulted from my asking the friends upstairs "When am I going to finish suc-cessfully the chemical formula in the lab." It was then April, and I had hoped someone would write MAY or JUNE on. Instead most were "5" with some "6" and even a few "8."

T. Fukurai was president of the Japanese Society for Psychical Research, and around 1900 started experiments with mediums in making thought pictures. His book called CLAIRVOYANCE AND THOUGHTOGRAPHY was published in London in 1931 by Rider & Co., Paternoster House. It is filled with 119 prints of negatives on which were impressed whatever Japanese letter-character (and how complicated just one is) Fukurai requested be put on say the 4th and 7th only of a sealed and bound group of a dozen Kodak No. 50 plates (in those days they didn't have film as we know it), which were not handled by the medium or anyone.

ESP

Most "recognized scientists" working in the field of ESP would working in the field of ESP would lose their jobs if they let it be known they believed in communf-cation with spirit entities, and so would call this a supernormal evi-dence of telepathic energy-waves impinging on the plates. Since anyone who has investigated psy-bia memory hore the superchic phenomena knows full-well that slate writing (a sliver of chalk is placed between two slates bound and sealed) is valid, it seems most likely to me that spirits manipulated light-energy spirits manipulated light-energy on the designated plates to form the characters. Fukurai avoids a discussion of the implications of his results. I hope to use Fukurai's methods this winter with an in-ternationally known medium in L.A. Unless one is a well-develop-ed psychic, he probably would be wasting his time trying.

EXPERIMENTS

I mention the above merely to show the range of experiments that have been done in getting pictures or prints through the co-operation of discarnate entities (which you and I will be some-day). You are probably aware that spirits, working with those sitting in mediumistic circles, make pictures in the dark on pap-er (plain) and silk. Another well-documented type of spirit picture is that made particularly in the heyday of spiritualism by medium photographers like Wylie, who had to give up his profession and offices in Frisco, L. A. and San Diego because of irate sitters not wanting the spirit heads all around their own that Wylie got on his negatives and usually couldn't prevent. I have photo-graphed such an old family por-trait of my employer, made when he was a boy of 14 in Denver with his father, mother and a relative. This gave me a negative to print from and anyone really interested may write for a free print. I mention the above merely to

THE WAY YOU CAN MAKE SPIRIT PICTURES (Maybe).

SPIRIT PICTURES (Maybe). If you are quite positive that just spirits about us, let alone commnication with them through automatic writing and/or the use of a Ouija Board, is so much tommyrot for the credulous, (I have been doing both for five years) you will not want to waste your time on the following de-tails. If you are undecided and open minded, or a convinced be-liever as I am, you will enjoy try-ing the following experiments even if you don't have a dark room (you can buy everything you need for \$2, using the kitchen at night and your kitchen pans and dishes; if enough of you want to know, your editor will no doubt print such details). Let me write the procedure for the experience.

NAVY SURPLUS

Again, all papers work to some extent, but I prefer hard enlarging paper and use Resisto Rapid No. 4 (with which I print most all enlargements for norm-al pictures. This is Navy Sur-P.us in a sealed can, being 9%" wide and 200 ft. long, for

\$5). Take any size piece of pap-er, hold it in the dark room a minute or five minutes as you wish for experimentation, then expose it on your print box for varying lengths of time, wet i varying lengths of time, wet it for a few seconds to minutes in plain water, drain quickly and place in ordinary developer, watch the darkening till it would all turn too dark to see any-thing and QUICKLY squish through wash water into acid fixer.

Iter. If you know your stuff and someone suddenly dashed up in a taxi and said: "Quick, what will happen if you expose a piece of photo paper uniformly and devel-oped it?" you'd come right back with: "Uniform exposure will give you a uniform print of grey to black according to time exposed and length of time in the develop-er." YOU would say that but Fu er." YOU would say that but I'd take an hour explaining that I get numerals, letters, faces and legs and animals and what Trevor James would call Etherians or Atmosphereans. The fact is. I CAN'T get such a uniform print, nor can ANYONE in my presence.

SUPERNORMAL

SCOTOGRAPHS

Let's go back now to the process of making scotographs (from Sko-tos, the Greek word for darkness), the name applied to spirit paper prints. Obviously if a photograph-er got hold of a print of my boss when he was 14, with a lot of heads around him and his family, he'd say: "Sure, I can do that too by taking a lot of heads and mak-ing a new negative around one of the live person.
