

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

# A Father's Last Letter to scout who wouldn't go back

happening a few weeks before Christmas when three Boy Scouts lost their lives while making a mountain hike.

After the heartbreaking occurrence was over, one of the grieving fathers wrote a public letter to his 'dead' son, explaining why he let the youth go with two other Boy Scouts on a tragic mountain hike. The following is reproduced from the Denver Post, Denver, Colo.

"'Some people have criticized me for letting him go on this mountain hike,' said David Greenburg. 'Some even said I had no feeling for my boy.'

"David Greenberg's 13-year-old son. David, a tenderfoot Scout, died with Mike Early, 16, and Michael La Noue, 13, on 9,400 foot Mt Baldy in a fierce snow-storm. They were last seen Nov. 15 — after three other compan-fons turned back in the blizzard. "Their bodies were found last Thursday, huddled around the re-mains of a campfire. after a search

mains of a campire, after a search that included 700 men, blood-hounds and dozens of alreraft. "The Arizona Daily Star of Tue-son printed this letter from Greenberg:

### 'Dear Son':

"Some people down here say that you were foolish to reach for the top of the mountain; that this was a task for a grown ma. "I do not believe this. All kids at some time or other in their lives want to think that they are grown men ahead of their time

Readers who have really understood the Etheric or Emergent interpretation of the UFO phenomena will note on reflection that the terms used by the UFO captain do not negate the etheric explanation - the differences are mainly those of terminology.

### ETHERIC FLUID

### (UFO Captain Speaking):

Around every inhabited globe in space there is an etheric fluid which envelops it and creates suit-able conditions for life. It is a temporary habitat, not only for men but also for spirits. No one can escape from it unless he knows how to produce another for his use.

# Q. Are spirits also cau within this etheric envelope?

within this etheric envelope? A. Yes. A spirit inhabiting a planet has a fluid body surround-ing it. A spirit who is still bound by matter to any extent cannot live without it. If it attempts to escape from its particular world, its spirit body leaves it and is re-assimilated into the etheric enve-lope of the planet. Thus, even spirits are prisoners for as long as they are unable to reject evil. and remain ignorant.

Many people call this fluid "ether," but the label is of lit-tle importance. That is a ques-

tion of words, which does not affect the problem. What is im-portant is to know what it is made of.

made of. We could well call it "electric fluid," which would be nearer the truth. In electricity there is a negative charge and a positive charge. In physics we have pro-tons and anti-protons, mesons and anti-mesons, electrons and anti-electrons, matter and anti-matter. On earth we only find matter, yet it is possible to create anti-mat-ter.

A body made of anti-matter would be expelled from matter. The force of repulsion would be unbelievable. There are inter-planetary vessels which are com-posed entirely of anti-matter, but the force-field created by this means has a terrifying effect on the physical properties of the people travelling in them. For this reason our space ships are made of matter. people travelling this reason our made of matter.

Further, we make our own eth-eric fluid inside the saucer, and by changing its polarity so as to

oppose that of the earth we are repelled from the planet at a speed corresponding to the differ-ence in polarity between the saucer and the earth.



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# HOW SOME SAUCERS FLY

(Continued from Page 3) gy required to bring about this

A. Everything is relative. On A. Everything is relative. On our saucer, the voltage and cur-rent are very high indeed. On a small craft used for research, very little current would be needed. Q. Where do you get this en-ergy from to achieve these re-sults?

There are various means of A. There are various means of making it. It can be obtained by turning hydrogen into helium at lower temperature and bombard-ing deuterium with heavier mes-ons, releasing a fabulous amount of energy; or by using ultra rays in an acid solution saturated with helium nuclei. The latter process is the most usual.

Q. How does the transforma-tion of ultra rays into usable en-ergy take place?

A. If you allow radioactivity to pass through a magnetic field you pass through a magnetic field you will get alpha, beta and gamma rays. The first are helium nuclei, the second are electrons and the third are gamma rays which are similar to ultra rays in their elec-tro-magnetic content. These three components of radioactivity are related. The ultra rays, or gamma rays, on passing close to helium nuclei, bring about a deformation of space and give birth to elec-trons until their wave energy is expended. Thus when gamma rays pass through an acid solution sat-urated with helium nuclei, the newly - created electrons gyrate urated with helium nuclei, the newly - created electrons gyrate around the nuclei, but the acid prevents them from joining up with the nuclei and they are col-lected on plates at the bottom of the apparatus. This provides an in-exhaustible supply of energy which requires nothing more than a lit-tle acid solution and some helium nuclei. nuclei.

### Solar Energy

There are, however, other means. On an interplanetary journey something might go wrong with the apparatus we use for transforming hydrogen into heli-ter collection. um and the gamma ray collecting apparatus. If this should happen we would turn to solar energy. We we would turn to solar energy. We would pass it through a tube of coal-gas. This gas, with a suitable eatalyst, unites with water, turn-ing it into formaldehyde. This pro-duct is then oxidised, giving us coal-gas and water again. In this second process solar energy is turned into usable electric current, which is cruits artificiant to most turned into usable electric current, which is quite sufficient to meet our immediate requirements, as on interplanetary voyages there is no lack of propulsive energy for the craft. The laws of inertia pro-vide us with the necessary accel-eration to reach the planet that is

eration to reach the planet that is our objective. Q. So that explains the whole operation of the saucer? A. Yes, that is how it moves. We have, however, several naviga-tional instruments, as you were able to see. Supposing you had to explain to somebody how a jet explain to somebody how a jet plane moves, you would natural-ly say that a backward thrust is exerted which impells the craft in a forward direction. That would be true, but inside the plane there are many navigational instruments



This kills the spirit of research in a world where so much has yet to be discovered.

(Notes on Previous Discussion): Saucers do not cancel out gravity, as it was at first thought, but they derive their power from the atmospheric pressure itself. This is why many people have been told that their source of energy was Nature herself. If saucers cancelled out gravity, they would only be able to move in one di-rection, and would still need a propellant to supply the power. Even supposing they did overcome gravity this way, they would still possess a certain weight in rela-tion to the air, and the ensuing friction with the atmosphere would limit their speed consider-ably. ably. It should therefore be perfect-by feasible to construct a saucer on Earth. Its covering could be made of any material, as there would be no friction with the stamosphere. 

# Courageous Psychic Journalism

(Psychic Observer Staff Writer) Seldom does an author-lecturer have an opportunity to

occupy the editor's swivel chair, so when our new P.O. editor-publisher invited me to write a lead editorial for a forthcoming issue, I accepted with alacrity. In fact, Tom O'Neil's warm and friendly letter arrived just this morning, and within two hours I am pounding the typewriter keys in my vicarious editorializing!

Tom, I am going to address these thoughts to you as well as to our P.O. family of readers. I am going to make pos-itive statements and recommendations, realizing that many of them may not find agreement with you, and others may be impractical. I am not in your responsible position and am unaware of some of the undoubted legal, financial and promotional hazards that you face. Be that is at may, I shall now write as I please and let the clips fall where they may.

### Hard Core Of Support

The enterprising psychic journalistic must know first who his friends and enemies are. It is important to serve your friends and to win more of them from the sometimes apathetic mass of readers. It is also important to recognize the foes of psychic journalism, to protect your publication from their assaults and to expose their villainy and stupidity when possible. A courageous stand against the enemies of Light will always win readers. You will have brick-bats but the bouquets will be sweeter with enduring pleasure.

First you must rely upon the hard core of Spiritual-Ist churches, organizations and groups. There are in America and Canada some tens of thousands of loyal Spiritualist people who are, or ought to be, your best friends. You must go out of your way to please, help and instruct them, insofar as is ethically possible. They need a fearless journalistic assault upon the fortresses of ignorance, superstition and religious prejudice; and you certainly need their moral and financial backing.

### American Spiritualism

The Psychic Movement in America has vast potentials but in many ways it is sadly disorganized. As Agnes Reuther said in one of her recent penetrating editorials, the movement needs cleanliness and unity. You will have to rise above all bickering between groups and maintain an impartial policy between the various organizations. Help them all when it is right to do so, but try not to serve the selfish ends of any of them

Always remember the motto of your masthead: TRUTH IS OUR AUTHORITY. Spread the truth of spiritual and psychic science with fearless clarion call. Also do not fear to expose untruth wherever it be found!

Most psychic editors in the western hemisphere are afraid to expose the fakery and dishonesty in our movement. They prefer the easier course of turning their head the other way even if sometimes the nose must be held to avoid the offending smell.

### **Exposing The Fakers**



And so the writing continued week after week, each day be-fore sunrise, until it was finished; then he was told to read and publish the book, Oahspe.



**Celestial Television Will Solve Problem** 

Psychic Science is the development of a faculty of "knowing" which is beyond the ordinary realization of the five physical senses and results in clairvoyance, clairaudience and psychometry; an inner seeing, hearing and feeling. This development can be brought about by bringing all the seven endocrine glands into a state of perfect health and then stimulating the pineal and pituitary glands which are located in the middle of the head. Meditation, progressive thinking on right principles and controlled breathing are the simplest and safest means of stimulation.

Trance mediumship is the surrender of these faculties to the use of a disembodied entity.

However, a few frauds may be the result of accidents or illness that have destroyed one or more of the endocrine glands and they are un-der the illusion that they can still "read" as they once did. Many of those so afflicted are wise enough to quit before they become in-volved in some court action. 



"When you face the dying, what is your word to them?"

The Pittsburghers are: Dr. William B. Kieswetter, chief of surgical staff at Children's Hospital; the Rev. Dr. Samuel M. Shoemaker, rector of Calvary Episcopal Church; and the Rev. Dr. Cary N. Weisiger III, of Mt. Lebanon United Presbyterian Church. They draw back the curtains of the sick room and reveal their convictions about Christian administration in the hours of impending death.

Dr. Weisiger says:

"As there are fads in fashions, the arts, automobiles, politics, sports and amusements, so there are fads in religion and medicine.

"The current fad about incurable disease is to conceal the truth.

"Most of the time ministers are bound by the conspiracy of silence, evasion or downright falsehood. The old idea of helping to prepare the patient for death and destiny is hardly even entertained.

"The current slogan: 'Drug them into eternity.' To this way of thinking Dr. Weisiger utters a loud:

"Bah!"

For him fear of death is completely pagan. A true Christian brushes aside fear and looks death squarely in the eye, he contends.

What are his words to the dying?

"I dwell on four themes," says he, "God may yet give healing. All suffering is controlled for God's glory and our good. The promises of Christ for life, death, and eternity hold true. Finally, Heaven is a place of rest and fellowship, where one awaits Resurrection."

This is the orthodox viewpoint. Ask the folk who have already made the Passing and you find they don't concur five cents' worth.

Healing isn't a matter of opportuning God's caprice. Suf-fering is by no means for God's glory and our good. The promises of Christ for life, death, and eternity are correct within limits. Heaven, however, is by no means a place of Heaven is the next state of Consciousness to earth, where the lessons learned in the mortal body are applied to purposes of of brevet unto oneself. practical soul-expansion.

Naught else!

Unquestionably the Orthodox Viewpoint is aimed at rationalizing the multitudinous error of the past with facts obtained from Psychical Research that are becoming unchallengeable all about us. How is Othodoxy ever to maintain its claims, however, when the testimony of ten million "dead" communicants declares the Church and theologians know almost nothing of the great fundamentals they are affecting to discuss.

Fryer said that not only were seals, often when pregnant, killed for their skins, but also for their oil, used to make margarine.



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# Space Experts Predict Moon, Mars Colonies In Generations

Rockets will be burning their way toward the outer planets, more than three billion miles from Earth.

Engines will fashion huge space transports, capable of carrying hurdreds, perhaps even thous-ands, of people on space expedi-tions that may last most of a lifetime.

These are among the predictions for the next 25 years — the com-ing generation — made yesterday by a panel of nine space experts in astronautics, the journal of the American Rocket Society.

The experts were agreed that the Earth would be ringed with satellites and space stations.

Some would watch the great cloud masses that blanket the Earth, aiding the prediction and control of local Earth weather.

Others would act as relay sta-tions for radio and television net-works of global scale. Huge rockets would roar between ontinents carrying cargo and pas-

Aboratories. Dr. Wernher von Braun of the Army Ballistic Missile Agency listed the generations of rocket development for the next 10 years.

The first generation, now in ex-istence, is based on short range ballistic missiles, and can put into orbit payloads up to 33 pounds.

The second and third generations will use 1,500 mile range and in-tercontinental range missiles as boosters and could or bit 3000 pound and 10,000 pound payloads

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
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

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
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
