Not so — Mr. Macdonald! shameful prayer over the spectacle, and this included CLARENCE H. HAAS, President of the Federation of Spiritual Churches and Associations, who led this prayer in behalf of these poor misguided individuals who appear so brilliantly in this film.

In the meantime, the NSAC have taken the hot potatoes off their laps, and are trying to sit on them. But HOW LONG can one sit on a hot potato?

I have received many letters from good thinking and well-meaning people who suggest strong measures to rid Chesterfield of the frauds who have "taken money under false pretenses." This is indeed against the law in any endeavor, but to take money from those who are deceived

endeavor, but to take money from those who are deceived into thinking that they are communicating with their loved ones is dastardly in the greatest extreme.

It is also MIGHTY STRANGE that Emil C. Reichel has never gotten in touch with this editor regarding having a look at this Chesterfield expose' film. Emil Reichel, as everyone knows, is supposedly the one in the NSAC most qualified to know true physical phenomena. Why has not this man requested this film for full evaluation?

These heads of the NSAC involve THEMSELVES in this Chesterfield scandal by their very silence and refusal to meet the issue openly, hoping that they can sweep the whole thing under someone else's carpet!

Since Writing The Above

Robert Macdonald, President of the National Spiritualist Association of Churches, finally came out with a few words regarding the expose' of fraudulent mediumship recently uncovered at the Chesterfield "Spiritualist" Camp, Chesterfield, Indiana.

Macdonald presents his view in the NATIONAL SPIRI-TUALIST, the official church publication of the NSAC dated October 1960.

Macdonald closes a long, dreary, platitude-filled article

with these words on the Expose'

"Much as I want to, I cannot complete this message without some passing reference to the "exposes" so prominently before us this past summer. The alleged exposures have no part in the organization of Spiritualism. They have to do with persons who (allegedly) sought to deceive the public. The fact that the alleged deceptions were allegedly fostered by Spiritualists has no bearing on the N.S.A.C. People who are now rushing into print with a great air hurt innocence, were to say the least, abysmally obtuse, not to say stupid, that they were so patently (allegedly) deceived by tricks that would be obvious to any person of sense. If the alleged exposures are fact (we have no reason not to accept the word of the good people who say they are) then we are forced to recognize the happenings as a form of psychic entertainment having no meaning to the science, philosophy religion of Spiritualism. It would seem that the good people who were so (allegedly) because he saw the film!

deceived require very definite training in the modus operandi of scientific test conditions. There is undoubtedly a hunger in some people for mysticism, legerdemain and rather bad theatre and no doubt that hunger is satisfied by indulgence in childish mysteries. But to seek to pillory a respected religious movement because of their (alleged) innocence and ignorance approaches the quavering depths of bathos. Any person who accepts a Certificate without adequate preparation for the reception of such Certificate and for such a person to allege that the Certificate was thrust upon them because they were told that they had a spiritual "gift," smacks of a coyness that belongs in a novel for young ladies of a long time ago. The whole bit reduces an honorable calling to ridicule. It brings an bit reduces an honorable calling to ridicule. It brings an irresistible reminder of the time when some (apparently) Spiritualist group ordained a late lamented comedian's

The place where the alleged happening occurred is in no wise connected with any State Spiritualist Associa-tion affiliated with the N.S.A.C. It is a corporation completely separate and apart from the N.S.A.C. or any of its Zealand who claimed to be a affiliates. The intimation that it is connected with us in radiesthesist, and suggested he any way, is untrue. Some of our members do have homes there, it is a beautiful place. The matter of the alleged expose concerns individuals, not the organization which I now address. Your president is in full and complete sympathy with all and every effort to rid the Movement of Spiritualism of pretense, sham and trickery. It is always a laudable work, but since I have never been in the place (during its working season) where the alleged incidents took place, all I know about it "is what I read in the paper to borrow a phrase from Will Rogers."

Note particularly the sentence used by Macdonald as a springboard to start covering up for the NSAC: "THE ALLEGED EXPOSURES HAVE NO PART IN THE ORGANIZATION OF SPIRITUALISM. THEY HAVE TO DO WIH PERSONS WHO (ALLEGEDLY) SOUGHT TO DECEIVE THE PUBLIC."

This editor anticipated that Macdonald would try get out from under by stating that the INDIANA ASSOCIATION OF SPIRITUALISTS was in no way connected

with the NSAC, so I sent the following telegram to every officer of the NSAC on the day they arrived for their convention at the Tuller Hotel, Detroit, Michigan::

THE PROOF ON FILM WAS SEEN LAST SUMMER BY TWO MEMBERS OF YOUR BOARD. RALPH PRESSING ASKED ME BY TELEPHONE TO SEND THIS FILM TO YOUR SECRETARY. I AGREED PROVIDING FORMAL REQUEST WAS MADE DIRECT TO ME. TO DATE — NO REQUEST. ALL NINE BOARD MEMBERS SHOULD SEE THIS FILM, NOT JUST TWO OF THEM. THE WHOLE BOARD IN ALL FAIRNESS SHOULD HAVE THE SAME OPPORTUNITY TO SEE THE FRAUDULENT ACTIVITIES OF TWO OF YOUR OUTSTANDING MEMBERS. THE FACT THAT CHESTERFIELD HAS NOT YOUR CHARTER IS BESIDE THE POINT. SURELY YOU DO NOT WANT TO DEFEND FRAUD BY REFUSING TO BE ENLIGHTENED OR BY SAYING YOU ARE NOT TO BE ENLIGHTENED OR BY SAYING YOU ARE NOT INVOLVED. YOU AS A BOARD MEMBER ARE INVOLVED AND SHOULD ACT AND ACT NOW. THE FRAUDS SHOULD RESIGN AND SEND THEIR CERTIFICATES TO THE SECRETARY. WHILE HANGING ONTO THE COAT-TAILS OF RESPECTABILITY OF THE NATIONAL SPIRITUALIST ASSOCIATION THEY ARE SUBJECTING YOU TO SEVERE PENALTIES OF PUBLIC DOUBT. #### Radiesthesist Pin-Pointed Plane Wreck On Map

It was a flying sensation in Australia when the airplane Southern Cloud disappeared without

This occurred early in the 1930s. At the time Keith Smith was a young flying enthusiast, and as a member of an aero club he took a

memoer of an aero club he took a great interest in the fruitless search for the plane.

Nearly 20 years later, because of his many talents, he became well known as one of Australia's top radio personalities.

Then last year he received a

Then last year he received a letter from a radio listener in New Zealand who claimed to be a could locate some of the persons named in a "Missing People" pro-gramme that Smith conducted.

All he required to do so, he thought, was a map of the possible location, a picture of the missing person and something belonging to that person.

He mentioned many successes he had had of locating people at a distance.

Keith Smith decided he would make a test. He had some news-paper cuttings dealing with the loss of the Southern Cloud. He cut from one of them a pic-

He cut from one of them a pic-ture of one of the missing persons, a Miss Glasgow, and sent it to the radiesthesist saying that the woman was lost in an airpland crash. Could he say where the wreckage could be found? Smith sent with the cuttings the map of Victoria on which he had plotted the original course of the

plotted the original course of the aircraft.

aircraft.

Inside a week he had a reply from the radiesthesist who told him that the cutting he had sent had a picture of a woman on either side.

He had managed to separate the living one from the picture of the crash victim and gave as his opinion that the aircraft in which she had travelled did not fall to earth within the confines of the map of Victoria. Victoria.

He believed he had located it in the Canberra area and he sent a map on which he had marked the spot where the aircraft should be

This map was much smaller than the one Smith had sent him and therefore was subject to greater error. The radiesthesist asked for an air map of the Canberra dis-trict so that he might pinpoint the wreck exactly

Keith Smith tried to obtain such a map. He found he could not do so immediately because the Air Board had drawn it from circulation. While he was still attempting to get hold of a map the wreckage of the aircraft was found.

When he was able to check the discovered location of the wreck with that given to him by the radiesthesist he found that his correspondent had been 17 miles out

of his estimate.

When he questioned a map expert he learned that the margin of likely error in marking a location on a map of the scale used by the radiesthesist was exactly 17 miles.

When he was later shown cut-tings of the finding of the plane the radiesthesist told Keith Smith that he had never before heard of the aircraft or its loss.

The ECTOPLASM comes FROM the medium in trance, and goes BACK to her (or him) when materialization ends. The ectoplasm COVERS the astral or spiritual BODY of the one being materialized. It usually does rot happen in a FLASH but gradually. I have seen pictures where the ectoplasm covers only PART of the body in the PROCESS of materialization or de-materialization. In almost every case, fraud can be suspected when the medium is not in TRANCE, or where the "spirit" HANDLES the ectoplasm as if playing with it. PHOTOS are NOT ESSENTIAL to detect THIS kind of FRAUD.

It may interest you to know that a certain David P. Hatch passed away in California about 1913. He was a Judge, and member of Hermetic Societies and wrote Hermetic books under pseudonym of "Paul Karishka." AFTER he passed away, he dictated three books, "Letters" - "War Letters" and "Last Letters of the Living Lead Man" thru Elsa Barker. These books became "best sellers' during World War No. I. They are extremely important and interesting. In one book he describes a meeting with a very great angel he called the "Beautiful Be ing." The Angel and Judge Hatch visited war hospitals and scenes. But in a magnetized bar the larger portion of the molecules have their magnetic axes, or poles, POINT-ING IN THE SAME DIRECTION. Mr. Bougon's model suffered transportation injury during its journey to me. I had to repair it with little to go on, either in materials or knowledge. However, when the soft steel shaft "A" is inserted and held against the wood spacer by the thumb and index finger-then released at the lower end of the incline—the shaft will rush "up the hill." It strikes the top wood spacer with a sharp click, bounces back, and is caught and held firm by one of the frontend magnets. If this model were open at the high end, the shaft would shoot out this opening and jump a good distance—thus to wrench itself free of any farther magnetic influence of the device!

It is my opinion, a longer model containing more magnets, set as shown, would accelerate the shaft to a higher speed than the calculated 30 miles per hour gained in this model shown. By raising the front end of this model an additional 1/2 inch, I found these magnets would pull the shaft up the steeper "hill" against the force of gravitation, but not with the speed or resounding click evident when using the 1/2-inch incline shown in the drawing.

Russia Catching Up Matter, Mind, Space

In "Two Worlds," E. A. Tooke has an intriguing article, "Russia's Scientists are Catching up with Sir Oliver Lodge."

In 1929, in "Phantom Walls," Sir Oliver Lodge wrote: "Matter is turning out to be an insignificant portion of the whole physical universe, a rare and occasional perturbation of its vast extent. This act nullified her rights of Ordination under The National Spiritual Alliance under canon law. Her rights of Ordination were granted by The National Spiritualist Association Of Churches by sanction.

In 1954 the Ordination of Mrs. Emmons was revoked by The National Spiritualist Association of Churches for cause thus nullifying any rights under that body.

In 1959 — November — Miss Mildred Pelletier stated in a letter "No, we did not re-issue Ordination papers to her."

In 1960, dated July 18, a further letter from Miss Pelletier stated that no papers have been re-issued or no re-Ordination taken place.

The Ordination papers of The National Spiritual Alliance, granted to Mrs. Emmons are in my possession awaiting the return of the papers of The National Spiritualist Association of Churches and which are the property of this organization.

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

#### How Many Souls?

The "occult movement" of our modern day is at pains to reorient our conception of man in harmony with this basic knowledge, if true it is. If man is a congeries of inner units of different organic essences, his allegiance to truth demands that we should know it and deal with our problems accordingly. If man is a sevenfold creature and not just a unit body animated by a battery of spirit, it is of supreme importance to know as much as we can of it. For if there are these distinct inner ingredients in our make-up they must stand in certain definite terms and modes of interrelationship with each other, and a knowledge of this would be basic for any true soul science. In fact one might say that the most fundamental element in the quest of religion, philosophy and psychology has been to understand the relation of "soul" to body. But if now we have to consider that man may have three or four "souls" intermediate between physical flesh and divinest spirit in his interior 'anatomy," soul science becomes a thing of far greater complexity than we supposed. It can even turn out to be true to say that man is a composite of seven souls, and that each of these has its "body."

And, going even further than that, it is now thinkable that the difference between soul and body is only the same as the difference between invisible water vapor in the air (for the air always contains moisture-hydrogen), visible water vapor, as in cloud or steam, water in its common liquid state, and finally ice. Indeed, as pure analogue, these different forms of the one element, water, are most helpful suggestions as to the difference between spirit and matter, all the way down-or up. And, if we may swerve for a moment into the line of religious philosophy, this consideration points up most vividly the fallacy of so much "spiritual" religionism of the modern "cult" varieties in their eternal condemnation of matter, the sinful flesh, and their exalta-tion of "spirit." For all this disparagement of the one and glorification of the other is now seen to be hitting at one and the same thing, condemning it in its lower expression as matter and deifying it in its higher expression as spirit. Sometimes individuals fail to get enough of them in their foods (sometimes because they are naturally absent in the soil in which the food was grown, or have been leached out by erosion). In such cases serious illness can result, but just as often or oftener, the result may be lowered efficiency, nervousness, or lack of energy. "It is not commonly realized that vitamins control the body's appropriation of minerals, and in the absence of minerals they can have no function. Lacking vitamins, the system can make some use of the minerals, but lacking minerals, vitamins are useless.

"No man today can eat enough fruits and vegetables to supply his system with the mineral salts he requires for perfect health because his stomach isn't big enough to hold them" - meaning that crops grown in soils poor in minerals will not contain enough of these nutrients to ward off deficiency diseases.

It has become increasingly clear, then, that the plant, the animal and the human are all dependent upon the mineral content of the soils and their crops for the adequate intake of both the major and trace elements. When the soil is mineral-depleted, crops will be deficient in minerals, and animals and humans feeding on them will inevitably develop physical abnormalities, or deficiency conditions.

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Minerals constitute but 5 per cent of human and animal nutrition, yet they occupy a critical position in metabolism and hard tissue structure. Any form of interference with mineral chemistry will quickly provoke serious physiological disorder by virtue of participation in three major physiological functions which are structural (bones), catalytic, and enzy matic. The skin eventually will react unfavorably to mineral deficiencies. Those minerals proved vital are calcium, phosphorus, magnesium, sodium, potassium, manganese, iron, cop iodine, sulfur, zinc, fluorine, and Ohio. 433 W. molybdenum.
