



We have had these coins examined by J. Gilbert Wright, Industrial Research chemist, Schenectady, N. Y. This is what Mr. Wright has to say about Juliette's: We have had a spectroscopic analysis made of your coin. This revealed that it was of copper with a small amount of iron, a trace of silver and lead (not more than .0003% in each case). There was no tin, zinc or nickel. #### An Explanation



### A True Story of a Child's Grief And Her Reappearance After Death

An English couple, a Mr. and Mrs. Davis, living abroad, had shown hospitality to a traveling compatriot, in return for which the latter, a Mr. Thompson, had given them a cordial invitation to pay a visit to himself and his wife at their country home in the Midlands. Mr. and Mrs. Davis accepted the friendly invitation, and the next time they were in England they duly paid the visit.

And also—to send a message to my beloved sister, Evelyn Burnsides. "Hello Evelyn," this is sister Etta. And to all of the good friends that are gathered here this afternoon from Camp Chesterfield. My love, at this hour, goes out to all of my glorious friends throughout the entire United States.

I come, this afternoon, my good friends, hoping to bring you a little understanding or, perhaps a little better understanding, of this glorious country that I have passed to. 

### IMPOSSIBLE TO SCIENCE VS SURVIVAL

It is impossible as well as unnecessary for the world at large to wait until the scientists investigate the evidence for survival fully, if they ever do. As SIR OLIVER LODGE said in the nineteenth century, there is no crucial experiment which will prove survival. It rests on a mass of evidence of all kinds all pointing to the same conclusion. This evidence any man of reasonable common sense and intelligence can weigh, if it is put before him. It is absurd to argue that he should suspend judgment until science has investigated and understood all the processes involved in physical phenomena and mediumistic communications.

If the world had adopted this principle in the past, progress in all directions would have been far slower than it has been. The pioneers of flying understood little of its theory, while the scientific world looked on them as harmless lunatics. It was only when they proved that flying was a practical proposition that science became interested, and eventually was able to explain how it was they flew, and even to suggest how it might be done better. The same is true of the design of ships and yachts and many other things.

The truth of survival is really a matter of legal proof, the test of which is its "sufficiency to satisfy the mind and conscience of an ordinary man and to convince him that he would venture to act on that conviction in matters of important personal interest." The opinion of the man of science on that part of the case which falls within his special sphere is a matter of first-class importance, provided he has really studied the subject. He is an expert witness, but expert witnesses are commonly produced on both sides in legal proceedings and often look foolish under cross-examination by the op-

Many judicial trials have been held in the past, and substantial justice done before medical jurisprudence reached its present standard. As knowledge advances, so science becomes ever more helpful to those who have come to any decision in any sphere of life. But is the present generation and others to come to be debarred a belief in-nay, the certainty of-a life to come with all its ethical and inexplain this or that fact rather than the most obvious?

To stigmatize those who follow the example of Sir Oliver Lodge, Alfred Russel Wallace and other eminent men as credulous is preposterous. There is ample evidence to justify their belief, and in my view it is a sacred duty to bring it to the notice of the multitudes who are ignorant of it.

What is wanted is more publicity, not less of it, and leaders with conviction, common sense, breadth of view and inspiration. So surely as more people are "converted" and the knowledge of the facts spreads, and I have no fear but that many of its leaders will confirm the opinions of the few outstanding men who have so far thoroughly investigated the evidence.

## As a Nucleus"...

By PALMER EMERSON

Page nine of the PSYCHIC OBSERVER for September 10, 1940, carried a striking account by Juliette Ewing Pressing of a materializing scance that she experienced. This account, which appeared under the title: "MIRACLES ARE TAKING PLACE TODAY!" is impres sive because of the atmosphere of deep and grateful reverence that characterizes it: as well as for the strong natural emotion which attended her privilege of looking, at very close range, straight into the

And yet that strong and easily understood emotion did not in the least dim the clarity and logical coherence of her circumstantial narrative. The portion of the account that tells of her mother's manifestation, speaks of the employment of a handkerchief as the basis, or nucleus, around which the skilful mother wove a beautiful, delicate veil of ectoplasm, several vards in extent, and placed it about her daughter as a symbol of protection. One paragraph closes with the words: "The spirit people tell us that they use material substance, such as the handkerchief, as a nucleus.'

When I came to that word "nucleus," I wondered how many other readers received from it the same "association of ideas" that came to me. Instantly I was transported back across nineteen centuries of time and many thousand miles of distance, to a sunny day in Palestine, when a great crowd of "the common people" followed a wonderful Teacher and sublime Medium, to hang upon his words.

The association of ideas may best be made clear, perhaps, by copying the brief story as it is told in two distinct versions of the same passages in the New Testament—and I hope the publishers may make it convenient to place these two versions side by side in parallel columns, so that readers may the more easily compare them. ## MECHANICAL ASSISTANCE FROM HERE and THERE TO CLAIR VOYANCE?

Can the Aura Be Scientifically Observed?

By HORACE LEAF

From the earliest times mechanical objects have been used as aids to the production of supernormal phenomena. Psychometry is the ideal example, the results often being dependent upon the use of an article.

Many different objects have been used to induce clairvoyance.

In the East, water, ink, and precious stones are often employed. In England, Dr. Thomas Kilner used a chemical substance known as dicyanin in solution, spread over glass and placed before the eyes; but his experiments were purely physical and had no relationship to spiritual clairvoyance.

By means of dicyanin he was rabled to see what he called the 'human atmosphere,'' physical particles thrown off from the physical organism; but it is admitted that this is sometimes visible to the unaided sight. I was permitted to experiment with Kil- is perfectly scientific. The prinner's own screen, but obtained better results without them, as did also some of my friends.

#### A Scientific Way

A more successful way to observe this aura is by passing electricity from a high frequency battery through the body and registering it through a tube containing a special gas.


In Copenhagen, a few years ago. I was consulted by a young Danish chemist who had been experimenting with a quartz which, he claimed, produced clairvoyance. His claim was that the quartz enabled one to see ultra-violet rays. I was unable, through lack of time, to confirm his finding, and he refused to lend his apparatus. He had, however, won recognition among his fellow countrymen.

In the United States of America, I became, along with a fully qualifled optician, interested in the use of special lenses for inducing clairvoyance, and it became apparent that certain colors were necessary. These colors appear to rest the eye while retarding the normal flow of optical energy.

#### **Experiment With Decker**

According to theory, the energy being kinetic will, when inhibited escape along fibrils of the optic nerve not normally in operation, enabling the eyes to register vibrations of light otherwise invisible. The lenses were invented by a well-known scientist.

### Psychic Phenomena In Brazil

**LEVITATION** In Full Light

Revista Internacional do Espiritismo, records a remarkable seance in Baura, Brazil, recently, in which the mediumship of Carolina Alves was examined. The phenomena included levitation and the production of perfumes. At this particular seance Dr. Rolim Rosa (Chief of Police) Ernesto Monte (Mayor of the City), and Dr. Silvio Miraglia (Medical Officer of Health) were invited to attend

and take full control of the proceedings. The seance was held in a public hall in full light, and in the presence of over four hundred people. The City Officers took particular care to see that no opportunity for any kind of deception was afforded, and all were perfectly convinced of the genuineness of the phenomena.

#### A Remarkable Seance

One of the outstanding happenings was the complete levitation of a large table without any physical contact. The table was three metres long, and weighed approximately one hundred kilos (over two hundred weights). That table was carried across the room without contact.

At one corner of the room was a large pitcher of water and to the astonishment of all present this was levitated, carried across the room and the water transformed into perfume, which was freely sprinkled all over the audience.

The Medical Officer of Health was completely baffled in the changes in the weight of the medium, who normally weighs about 112 pounds. He was asked to lift her, which he did easily, then he was requested to lift her again. and her weight was so increased that she could not be moved. A third attempt was made to lift her by four people acting simultaneously, but they were unable to raise her from the floor.

The seance is the more remarkable because the audience were both incredulous and rowdy. There was continual noise at the doors, where over five hundred people outside the hall were clamoring for admission.

The event has created consternation in the City of Baura, and awakened a large number of people to the claims of Spiritualism. "Two Worlds"


