E. S. P. DEMONSTRATION

At a previous Sunday evening service, Rev. Bias publicly demonstrated the "Psychometry Test" . . . similar to the one enacted by the students at Duke University, Durham, N. C., under the supervision of Joseph Banks Rhine, Professor of Psychology.

A packet of 25 "PSYCARDS," five cards each of five different symbols was given to a stranger in the audience to shuffle . . . then handed to Rev. Bias, who had been previously securely blindfolded. Each card was identified . . . WITHOUT A MISS.

If any Duke student is able to get a score of even 8 correct out of 25, each is said to be endowed with some "rare extraneous thought projection ability" labeled with the high sounding name "EXTRA SENSORY PERCEPTION."

MAUDE KLINE and T. JOHN KELLY have also "gone through" the entire 25 cards without a miss . . and now, we have another medium, with a perfect record, REV. BIAS. Value of Music

A musical box is of considerable issistance, and should be kept playing most of the time, being hut off only during prayer and inging, and also during a silence which will shortly be referred to

As the power of the circle in reases, it may be possible to shut on the musical box for the purpose of hearing spirits whose voices may be faint.

Sitters can freely but quietly converse whilst the musical box is playing. A perfectly natural and happy frame of mind is not only helpful but necessary. The slightest approach to frivolity or dis-It is best to sit with knees uncrossed, feet apart, and with each hand resting on each knee.

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

Doctor Mattiesen did not incorporate this phase of the subject in his first volume, however, and neither does Mr. Muldoon now in his first, which is completely occupied with other significant evidences . . . intended to attract the interest of average people, without including any "preachments."

But although the purpose is to entertain, yet one could hardly expect the effect of the book to be restricted to just that . . . in minds that really think.

'No Sick Animal"

Those who do not think . . might perhaps receive these reports as the boy reacted to his first There hain't no sich animal!" . . unless the narratives were accompanied by some kind of explanation . . . showing why and how they are credible, as well as evidence that the events related really did occur.

This last point is pretty well taken care of . . . especially in the first chapter, which deals with psychic experiences of President Abraham Lincoln . . . during the Civil War and just before his assassination.

These include such events as were written into responsible documents at the time, and, as I understand, are still accessible. A glance at the chapter headings shows how interesting are the

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
