HUSBAND'S SPIRIT HAUNTED WIFE.

Mrs. Annie Olsen tells Coroner's Jury of awful visions which made her confess murdering him.

Mrs. Anne Olson, 9024 Emerald avenue, Chicago, is in the county jail. She was held to the grand jury February 17 by the coroner's jury after an inquest over the exhumed body of her husband.

Shrieking with fear of the ghost of her husband, Mrs. Olson rushed into the South Englewood police station two days ago, crying: "The spirit of my husband ever moves before the window of my home. I can stand it no longer. Any fate is better than a living torture such as this."

She then told the police she had murdered her husband upon the morning of Fəbruary 8, because he Investigation by the police proved every part of the woman's story true except the single fact of the murder. Olsen's body was exhumed and instead of the single bullet wound in the head first reported by the coroner's jury two were found, corroborating the wifs's selfaccusation. The inquest was reopened and Mrs. Olsen was held to the grand jury on her own confession.—Light of Truth.

Buss. president of the society, received the gift, thanking the ladies heartily Morton D. I never saw a body—just a hand and face the face of my husband with the two bullet wounds in the side of his head where I had shot him.

"One night I looked out of the window and saw my husband standing in the snow pointing a revolver at me. He was covered with blood all except his eyes. I fainted. When I came to my senses I went to the police and told them that I had killed him. They didn't believe at first, but its true—its true."

DEDICATION OF A NEW TEMPLE.



A PROPOSITION BY W. J. COLVILLE.






