To my mind the most essential step for the future will be the uniting of the spiritual forces.


As long as we are divided against ourselves, we cannot hope to unite the world and bring about the brotherhood of man.

DR. J. M. PEEBLES, INTER-VIEWED.

Q.—You are on your way to the Eastern States, I hear?

A-Yes, I am. Left San Diego, April 3rd, reaching Los Angeles the same evening, becoming the guest of Mr. and Mrs. Von Freitag, we were greeted at their residence by some old friends, among whom were Dr. Daniel W. Hull and Capt. Greene, who over 50 years ago was a member of the Oswego branch of the Cadets of Temperance. I was president of this order and was also pastor of an Universalist Church. Capt. Greene, a devoted Spiritualist was one of my cadets in charge, and upon leaving. I gave his father a Bible, which was presented to me in the Harmonial hall, at Los An. geles for comments and remembrances.

We had a most delightful time on Sunday at the Harmonial hall, when I say we, I refer especially to Dr. W. G. Thurber, who accompanies me on my travels as private secre tary and co assistant. Dr. Thurber is a young man, upright and conscientious, and has just commenced his work as a trance speaker and intermediary healer. He addressed the Los Angeles people Sunday upon the subject of a Young People's Association in connection with the Spiritual Society.

Q—What was the character of the proceedings on the Sunday services at Los Angeles?

It was Easter Sunday and the speakers platform was decorated with lillies and a profusion of flowers. The audience was a very intelligent one. As we stepped into the hall, Prof. Bowman was addressing the audience. The address was instructive as well as eloquent, notwithstanding the little jealousies, envies and a little back biting, Spiritualism, has a good standing in Los Angeles, and yet when compared with San Diego, and its fine temple, its flourishing Lyceum and Young People's Association and Spirit of Harmony,they are far behind San Diego.

Spiritualists, are not as well organized in America as they are in England, nor are we as enthusiastic in the up-building of this movement as are the Spiritualists of New Zealand and some other Islands of the ocean under the British flag.

In Wellington, New Zealand, Spiritualists own a magnificent temple and a member of Parliment is their President. They have a fine Lyceum and very choice music.

Q—What do you consider, Doctor, to have been the worst hindrences to the spread of Spiritualism?

A—The frauds and traveling tramps that advertise what they cannot perform and seem to seek only what they can make out of the name financially. This is deplorable. Spiritualism is a sacred word and persons who cheat in the name of Heaven and in the name of Immortality, would resort to any crime and will ultimately reap the sad refuse of misery.

There is another class extreme in radicalism and by this other class mean, those who seem to take pleasure in the annihilation of God, of Christ, of Mohammad, of Joan of Arc and other great world reformers.

This class quite generally oppose organizations, they are so individualized, that in standing erect they bend backward about 45 degress.

Q—Doctor, when you say God, do you mean a personal being?

A—I do not believe in a located human-shaped personality, located afar off, and moving the starry worlds, something as schoolboys

move their hoops. When I say God, I mean much the same as did Andrew Jackson Davis, when he said, the great Positive Mind-the same as did Alfred R. Wallace when he said, the Great Supreme Mind—the same as did Proclus when he said, Causation—the same as did Jesus when he said: "God is Spirit." When I say God, I mean Consciousness, Life, Purpose, Will, and the Infinite Love of the Universe, imminent in the sands of the sea and the stars that glitter in the Heavens. In one sense God may be personal, but that personality is not based upon shape or form, but upon "Purpose and Will."

True, we cannot comprehend God, only some conceptions of God, do not most of our differences result from the misunderstanding and meaning of words and terms?

Most emphatically. Take the matter of the Spirit world, the Spiritual world, the Summer land, Heaven and Paradise, are not synonomous. They are unlike. They also confound soul and spirit. They are entirely unlike in their original meaning. They also confound, Christ and Jesus. Jesus was a man, when a child eight days old, was like all Jewish children, circumcised.

He cursed a fig tree, according to the record, and positively refused to be called 'good,' saying: 'Why call ye, me good? But one is good, and that is God.' Christ means the annointed, the illumined. At baptism he became illumined, that is, Christed, called Jesus Christ.

Both Christ and Buddha signify illumined, enlightened and they were both great inspired soulsaviors.

Q—Have you any future plans mapped out, Doctor?

A—Yes, it is my purpose, as well as Dr. Thurber's, to spend the summer in Battle Creek, Mich., lecturing and healing; leaving early in the autumn for London on our way for Egypt and India.

One of the Ma Ha Rajas of India is interested in the philosophy of Spiritualism and has united with others in India to have me come there and lecture with others. Dr. Thurber will accompany me.

Q. Doctor, what do you think of this New Thought movement?

I believe in New Thought and New Ideas. None of them are new; but in conception they are new to us. But as Spiritualism is all-embracing, it overshadows and underlies all that is really new. So-called New Thoughts are but the discovery of all thoughts, so we bid the New Thoughtists Godspeed as our coworkers who come in at the eleventh hour. We hold the olive branch to all reforms.

Q—What do you consider the New Thought?

A—I have been considerably puzzled to know just what the New Thoughtists' New Thoughts are. Those published as New Thoughts are as old as Unitarianism, Spiritualism, Socialism and A. J. Davis' Divine Revelations.

Q—Do our New Thought friends demonstrate a future existence? Do they show the relations in character between this and the future state of existence?

A—I think they do neither.

Q—Is it not true, Doctor, that the Spiritualists have been theorizing quite long enough regarding matters and methods of reform? And do you not think that the time is now ripe for some united and practical action, even by uniting with others whose aims and objects are

for the betterment and the upliftment of the race physically, socially and industrially, as well as morally and spiritually?

A—Most emphatically I do; and hence, I work in all fields of reform, regardless of their origin or name. I have lectured for the Young Men's Christain Association in Battle Creek. I have lectured for the Young Women's League, for the Nature Club and with other branches of Reformers.

The time is ripe for the grand union of all these social, moral and religious movements. These all constitute the spiritual power in the line of human redemption such as the world has never yet witnessed.

I am an optimist, believing in evolution and upward tendency of all things, and in the early dawn of the so long prophesied, 'Good time coming.'
