REVIEW DR. T. J. HUD-SON'S EXPOSITION OF SPIRITUALISM.

To one who reflects, it is evident that the most important problems in life are yet unsclved; but their solution is most pressingly demanded.

We accept only what to us is a sense of reality, whether that sense has truth for its basis or not. No one has the least confidence in what to him seems unreal.

Truth is the only reality; and what is accepted and acted upon. is what we feel to be reality: The law expressing this truth may be stated as follows: Feeling gives rise to the sense of reality in what is felt.

The old proverb is "As a man thinketh in his heart, so is he." It is often quoted with the phrase; "in his heart" left out; thus "as a man thinketh, so is he."

This gives rise to the idea that the thinking makes a man what he is. The phrase, in his heart, expresses the true meaning of the proverb. In scripture the word heart, means feeling, and the proverb really is: As a man feels, so is he.

In Dr. Hudson's attempted explanation of Spiritualism, this law of feeling applies. He did not know that the sense of reality that one feels, is no proof of its being reality; and he failed to consider the fact that others arrive at oppos-Thus, ancient bards and modern truths . ite conclusions on the same subject, since opposite states of feeling give rise to an opposite sense of reality.

The purpose of this article, is to present a critical analysis of Dr. Hudson's theory of an exposition of Spiritualism based on the subjective mind. When a difficult problem arises, it is easy to coin words for its solution.

A school boy who makes his figures as he wishes in the solution of arithmetical problem, finds no difficulty in getting the answer he desires. So Dr. Hudson uses the term subjective mind, to fit his theory, and employs it as a factor in his effort to explain spirit manifestatians. Everything must conform to his conceptions; that is, to his state of feeling on this subject.

His theory is that man has two minds. It is evident that he, observing the rapid advance of Spiritualism and the growing disbelief in the dogmas of the church, saw that something must be done to destroy this enemy.

The doctrine of evolution being accepted as a scientific fact, he abandoned the Mosaic conception of creation and under took to prove conformity of evolution with the biblical accounts, so as to give a scientific prestige to that account

and save christianity from the tender mercies of Spiritualism.

In his last mark, The Evolution of the Soul, he has this to say: "Science has at last succeeded in unraveling the whole mystery, removing every phenomenon from the domain of superstition and demonstrating that all manifestations of whatever name or nature, proceeded from the subjective mind of living persons.

I cannot enter into details, but must content myself with saying in the most emphatic manner, that all that is mysterious, all that is uncanny and diabolical, all that is inane and idiotic, all that is false and infamous, all that transcends reason and common sense in psychic phenomena, is due alone to ignorance of the fundamental lessons that govern the relationship between the body and the soul."

It is the opinion of some Spiritualists that Dr. Hudsons's works will aid the cause of Spiritualism by arousing a spirit of investigation: and that no truth suffers when it is free to combat error.

That opinion would be correct if the people were disposed to investigate; but the fact is, most people are satisfied with their opinions; or if anything in regard to them is desired, it is to corroborate them.

Public sentiment among all classes favors the institution of the church; at least in exerting a moral influence in the community, if nothing else.

This is the case in regard to Dr. Hudson's theory. If it is false, truth is free to combat it, but among those who think so they are waiting for somebody else to do the combating; and so the error prevails.

The people know little about Spiritualism, and care less, about it. In Dr. Hudson's opinion, Spirtualism was all that he expressed in the last part of the above quotation, beginning with the words, 'I can not enter into details,' and in his apinion it must be throttled; so he goes about it by assuming a subjective mind that he thinks explains

It is impossible to convince a mind without it being conscious; and yet Dr. Hudson's subjective mind is unconscious, and if con-

scious, it can in no wise differ from the conscious mind, if by implication, there be an objective mind, if there is a subjective mind.

A phenomenon is the manifestation of a force acting through, as on matter. Human conduct has its rise in a psychic force, and differs in one respect from all other forces, in the fact that it has a purpose to accomplish. In the action of the physical forces, there is nothing between the force and its phenomenon.

Physical force is not conscious; but in psychic force, having a purpose, it must be conscious in order to devise the means for accomplish. ing that purpose.

This conscious state we call mind which is the expression of the Ego, that is, the manifestation of the psychic force. There is no force in mind, but it is inseperable from that force. Consciousness enables us to realize sensations, and that realization is the purpose we are to accomplish in life, whether we fail

The body is the organism of the psychic force, and its action is cogsized in consciousness. The force is ignored, and the entire attention is given to the phenomena to which it has given rise namely, human conduct. Every voluntary act in life is an effort to realize pleasant sensations and to avoid unpleasant ones. These are realized or avoided through the instrumentality of means made conscious to the mind.

SAYS DEAD MAY RETURN.

The Rev. Dr. R. Heber Newton addressed a large gathering at Cooper Union, on Monday evening, April 24, his subject being "Immortality."

In support of his views he referred to ancient history, of the Hindoos, the Buddhists and others. "It would be absolute mockery, unfeeling cruelty, said he, to bring people into the world just for the sake of taking them away again.

Immortality is necessary to satisfy the demands of life, just as you believe that the sun will rise; it will vindicate itself absolutely. If it is a fact of the universe, it must be capable of verification. There never has been a day when immortality has been incapable of verification.

"I am sure that man, as studied now, has proved that he has powers of clairvoyancy; that he can exert his will through walls, and compel attention.

"In the four leading Universities of the United States there are eminent men who believe this. One is in Pennsylvania and one in Columbia. The latter from an unbeliever became an absolute believer in the psychic force.

"You begin to think of the cabinet, the seance and the medium. I admit ninty-nine out of a hundred of these are humbugs. But I speak of what men wno have studied have come to believe from their own experience. I do see ground for believing it possible. Those who are ready to receive it may have a verification.

"I don't believe that Christ appeared to his disciples in body or in spiritual form. I believe in the possibility of man coming back to earth again. Faith may be a living power."—Banner of Light.

DEATH OF HENRY M. STANLEY.

With the death of Henry M. Stanley the world loses one of its greatest characters, and one whose labors have done much to change the attitude of the entire world on a number of questions.

He was prominent in several ways but his first feat which called the attention of the world to him was his search for Livingstone when he was lost in the wilds of Africa at a time when that was in reality a "dark continent."

That he was successful and drew from the natives much of their history and secrets of life, caused him te be again selected to traverse that country where he discovered many of the grandest of the natural phenomena of that country and gave the world a knowledge of it.

The lakes of Africa, the great falls, rivaling our own Niagara, all were made known to the world by

this daring explorer. Though he was kindness personfied whenever it was possible, yet he did not hestate to punish with great severity where it was necessary. This mode of treatment has been of benefit to his successors in the exploration.

He did away with as much as possible, and punished slavers, and gave the people an education which qualified them to care for themselves far better than ever before.

One of the writer's favorite books when a boy was 'Stanley in Africa,' and many is the night he has fallen asleep in his bed with the cherished book in his hand. The struggles, privations and final triumph had a fascination that never tired, and it was read and reread.

Some one had to do this. Stanley was selected and made his mark. All honor to his memory.

Could any person read J. Stitt Wilson's discourse in the Philo-SOPHICAL JOURNAL, of April 16, and believe that mediumship is a crime?

It is an excellent reply to the "Great Psychological Crime," note the change that has come into Christian families since mediums have dared to use their God-givengifts.

Mothers no longer mourn and go insane for fear the innocent babe is writhing in hell.

I once knew such a mother. A wife, I also knew whose husband had died, when friends tried to console her in her sorrow by reminding her that her husband was such a good man, replied mournfully, but positively: "You need not try to comfort me with any such talk, I know that he had no interest in Jesus, and is not saved. I shall never see him again, the blood of Jesus Christ cleanseth from all sin. My husband had no part or lot in this great plan of salvation," those were her very words.

No bereaved wife is heard to mourn in this disconsolate way at the present time.

Compare the hopeless wail of the former with Prof. Wilsons hopeful, comforting knowledge of a happy future and let the comparison tell what Spiritualism has accomplished.

There is still so much to be done here and now! People have been working for God; now let them follow Mr. Wilson's example and work for humanity; and know that this is the only way they can work for God or Jesus Christ.

Let all who want to work for God or good join in doing away with every objection to a real commonwealth.

There is nothing now before the public better than active Spiritualism, which includes Liberalism, Socialism, and everything that enfranchises people, the rich, and the poor.

CLERGYMEN AS LABOR AR-BITRATORS.

A striking example of what may be expected when a Labor dispute is referred to clergymen for arbitration recently showed itself in Chicago.

The organization of local engineers in the Stock Yards district asked their employers for a reduction of hours from twelve to eight, and an increase of wages from thirty to thirty-seven and a half cents an hour. Both parties agreed to submit the question to a Board of Arbitrators: and strange to say, the board was made up of three clergyman—one Catholic priest, and two Baptist preachers, each one being a pastor of a church.

The learned Board held several sessions and finally made a report. They decided that, though such engineers should be, and those they happened to be dealing with were, "intelligent, sober, loyal, licensed engineers, capable of running any engine, and having in their charge costly machinery, thirty cents an hour was a good wage for them."

As to a reduction in hours, the Gospel-loving arbitrators dodged the question, though they did go so far as to mildly suggest that employers should consider the matter of sometime (in this world or another one) reducing the working hours.

Accompanying their report came their bill for services. It called for the modest sum of "Three Thousand Dollars"—one thousand for each of the ministerial philanthropists. That meant twenty-one dollars an hour for them, though thirty cents was enough for the engineers.

The three thousand was paid them: one-half by each party. The incident furnishes another chance for fools and knaves to shout gleefully over our glorious 'era of phenominal prosperity,' as a Nation.

Question—Were those well fed clergyman really arbitrators, or just plain traitors?—in Sacramento Ree.
