

IDIOTIC LEGISLATION.

The Youngstown (O.) Vindicator says: "The people were never in a more demoralized condition. The times were never so out of joint. Human life was never estimated so cheaply. Virtue was never held less sacred. The rights of mine and thine were never held so loosely What is seen is the effect. What is the cause?"

The cause my dear Buckeye editor, is found in a superabundance of idiotic legislation; in laws that interfere with men's natural right to earn a living and make themselves comfortable and happy.

In every state of this Union, not excepting either Ohio or California, there are laws that make it very difficult for all men to earn a livelihood by strictly honest and honorable methods. Monopoly is on top and labor carries the burden. The stupid masses who do the voting or at least a majority of them, permit themselves to be led to the polls much as dumb animals are led to the slaughter pens, and under one pretense and another are induced to vote to keep themselves in bondage to the landlord and to every form of monopoly that is based on the one parent of all monopolies. Thus we have industrial slavery, and large assignments of poverty, misery, crime, and all evils mentioned in the paragraph quoted from the Vindicator. Under a system of industrial freedom human nature would still be very imperfect, and there would doubtless be many ills and sufferings in the land. But until we have free conditions we cannot reason. able hope for any radical and permanent improvement over the social pandemonium which now prevails. The inevitable tendency of the time is toward still further retrogression. The cause, the fundamental cause, of the prevailing moral degeneraacy is no mystery to those who investigate the subject carefully and with unprejuced minds.

Human rights are often ignored by those in authority, and monopoly has industry by the throat. Ignorance and cowardice are responsible for these conditions. The people can throw off the shackles if they will use proper means.

A regular quarterly meeting of the Board was held on June 4th, 1904 at headquarters and the following business was transacted.

On application and endorsement of the Oakland Spiritual Society, a certificate of Ordination was issued to Mrs. May Fanning of Berkeley, Cal., also on application, Mr. John R. Burton, endorsed by the Oakland Psychical Society, a certificate of protection was granted him as a Healer.

The matter of holding a camp meeting in the vicinity of San Francisco and Oakland was considered at this meeting.

It will be remembered that at the last convention, the feasability of holding a Camp meeting the latter part of August, and the first week in September 1904 was left in the hands of the Board of Officers. friends, one of whom was a doctor. The other was taken sick and the people said died; but his friend sald he was not dead. He prepared his hands so as to be sure and after careful examination said he could feel warmth, and his loved friend was alive.

After waiting the usual time the funeral day was appointed. The neighbors gathered for the burial. The Doctor plead for delay, assuring them that life was not extinct. They answered his plea by giving time, a shorter time, and at last, gave him only five minutes, but during that time his young friend gasped.

When he awoke he told them the beautiful story of the spirit land; of its glories, its joys and its sweetness; and said he plead with them that he might abide with them, but that they told him he must go back to the earth.

He told his earthly friends of the friends who had passed from earth, whom he met there; and said that a well known esquire living some distance away came to the spirit land while he was there.






