AFTER DEATH—WHAT?

CHAPTER FOUR.

We concluded our last chapter by pointing out the tremendous importance of 'dust' to all planet life. This must be realized by the student who would attempt to answer our question "After death-what?" We can now see that if man is to go on unchanged by death in his form and senses then there must be not only an atmosphere adapted to human lungs in spirit life, but unless there be dust in that atmosphere there can be no beauty for him in his surroundings.

We now go a step further and

see that if in that life after death. there be the rills and rivulets, the lakes, the rivers and the oceans depicted by returning spirits or their mediums, all such waters will evaporate into their atmosphere, where, unless protected by dust they cannot return in dew and rain, but will fall in deadly cloud bursts that would mean a second death for man and nature. But since spirit return is a proved fact we know that conditions must permit the new man to live and enjoy life.

It follows that man's new organs will be in harmony with his surroundings, his lungs will have to adapt themselves to the new atmosphere amid conditions so different to ours that mortal man cannot discover the existence of either the spirit lungs or the spirit atmosphere. Some 90 per cent. of our mortal bodies are mere water, which comes to us harmlessly, with a speck of dust for each drop that falls. So my spirit brother must also, if he have the form I know, have dust in his air, and mingle his dust and water just as we do. And if his soul crave beauty he can only be satisfied because their is dust in the air around him, which catches and refracts the ray of light, and thus creates color for him by its effect upon his eye.

The reader should stop right here to ask himself whether he is ready to accept the idea that the new born spirit is living in a world of dust and water, and therefore closely resembling curs. Of course if he is so living he may have a form very much like ours. But if his 'after death' thus includes dust and water he will have both dirt and mud, for mud is dust and water. His own body, his homes, cities and surroundings will need clean ing just like ours, and about all the real change would be that he had become invisible to mortals. We have once before pointed out that this would demand soap, washing days and door mats After Death, unless man and his surroundings should change beyond our present experience. But if, as is claimed, they are so changed, then his form will change too, and I shall have to make my neightors acquaintance all over again.

So far we have made a mere surface examination of the consequences of death. We are obliged to recognise that death involves mighty changes, that must effect every form physically. We are compelled to admit that, but there will be as great changes mentally, for our mentality is shaped by our surroundings quite as much as our body. Man has been taught religiously and socially, that it is his duty and privilege to increase and multiply, and we are quite sure that whether that be a duty or not, the nation that does not increase its population soon dies out, or is enslaved by some more powerful neighbor. We find every form of life shaped so as to propogate its species as its chief end. And the form of man is no exception. It is carefully shaped to hold not only the various organs by which it grows and lives, but also the organs by which it is to increase and multiply. Without these sexual organs the shape of man's body would be different, and woman's still more so. But though that is interesting and important, and compels a shape which we recognize as manhood. still it is, so far, only the physical side of our immortal possibilities.

Now let the reader stop and think that fatherhood, motherhood, sisterhood, brotherhood, and various relationships down to that of mother in law, are all the results of sex. If it were not for his mortal manhood—just as it is—the noblest attributes of man would disappear. Fancy a whole city or nation without a mother or father in it, and with a population that never knew either! All we count as holiest and most divine in man would be absent for he would know nothing of love. And any home without love becomes a hell. In that city there would be none of the romance of youth, no maiden and lover wandering hand in hand, and presently founding another family. Without motherhood and fatherhood selfishness would reign supreme.

When the fanatic tries to imagine a contended society, free from all woes and sorrows, he always talks of the brotherhood of man. And we are perpetually told that all

hope for humanity depends upon acknowledging the brotherhood of man. But there can be no brotherhood without mothers, and no mothers unless their bodies contain organs to hold unborn brothers for many weary months, and such bodies will be, and must be shaped so as to hold such organs in the best possible position.

TO THE OFFICERS AND MEM. BERS OF THE CALIFORNIA STATE SPIRITUALISTS ASSOCIATION.

September 2 1904 The constitution and bye-laws of your Association specifies as one of the duties of the President, that he "shall submit in writing and read a report of the business, progress and standing of this Association at each Annual Convention upon the first day of said Convention." In compliance with this requirement, I submit and read as follows:

The year just closing in my estimation has been one of more progress than would be indicated by the fact that but two societies has been added to our list of membership during the year preceeding and particularly the close of that year special efforts were made to increase the number of Auxiliary Societies affiliated with the Associ

Every community in which Spirit ualism had taken root was so thoroughly and successfully canvassed that there was little remaining to be brought under the banner of organized Spiritualism during the present year, except by a very determined and united effort on the part of the Spiritualists working together as a unit to open up new fields of labor.

In the many towns and villages which so far han not shown the veen of Spiritualism strong enough to attract our ntion. It is my ry community of opini ouls actually re-One Thous. quires and is cap ble of supporting at least a small society, provided the proper step, are taken to establish one, an i foster it after it is

established until it becomes self supporting, this can only be accomplished by missionary effort.

I am heartily in sympathy with any movement looking to establishing a regular circuit over which well equipped workers would travel regularly ministering to our own people in and out of our regular societies and in every way possible building up societies already established and creating interest which would doubtless result in new societies being established.

There was an effort made early in the year and shortly after our last convention to keep our organizers Mr. and Mrs. Allen Franklin Brown in the field in such work as I have just outlined but the difficulty of procuring proper cooperation from those whom we desire to reach and benefit made it impossible to continue the work on account of not having sufficient funds to carry on the work until it could have been made self supporting or failing in this to have become strong enough so that it would be possible to carry the load.

The secretary's and treasurer's report shows that our total receipts for the year is only \$763 and it will no doubt be obvious to every one who is capable of working the simplest problems in arithmetic that of this amount a comparatively small sum was available for missionary work. If we ever expect to become a factor in matters pertaining to religion and the advancement of mankind along ethical and educational lines, some concerted action must be taken along the line of missionary work.

In this connection it would appear in keeping, to also call your attention to another branch of the work which I am sorry to say is being sadly neglected and as long as it is neglected, we limit the possibilities of Spiritualism at least for the present and immediate future.

I refer to Lyceum work, show me or name a strong Social or Religious organization of this or any other age and I will show you that the training of the young has been largely responsible for their strength.

I believe that the failure of Spiritualists as a class, to train their children along the lines of the generally accepted teachings of Modern Spiritualism is largely, if not wholly responsible for the present non-progressive "go as you please" condition in which our glorious cause is found today. I do not mean to to convey the idea that there are no exceptions to this condition, but rather that the condition above described is the rule rather than the exception.

It is with great pleasure that I inform you that there has recently been issued by the National Spiritualists Association a book of Ordination Usages, and other Rites, to

be used in the Religious Services of Spiritualism which will assist in placing Spiritualism among other religions with equal rights and privileges to its ordained workers as well as to the Associate Ministry of Spiritualism composed of mediums in good standing of some Spiritualist Church or Society and who are known to possess psychical powers of a genuine character.

The committee appointed almost two years ago to prepare these Usages and Rites reported at the National Convention in Washington last October and the delegates appointed by you at your last convention Mrs. Anna L. Gillespie, Mr. J. J. Morse, Miss Florence Morse, Mrs. M. M. Smith as well as myself had the privilege of assisting in the deliberations of our National body in regard to the report of the committee on these Usages and Rites.

It has been reported to me that there is likely to be an attempt made in the not far distant future to have our State Legislature enact laws which will curtail our workers in the exercise of their spiritual gifts, chiefly in healing the sick and I feel it a duty to charge you one and all to be ever on the watch to guard your rights as citizens of the State of California, and to fight for those rights. This can only be done through combined effort on the part of all Spiritualists.

A powerful organization is necessary and it remains with you fellow Spiritualists to interest yourselves individually and collectively to the end that such an organization be started and once started supported not only by your purses but also by your brains and energies, both mental and spiritual. In such an effort we could no doubt secure the assistance of all ibroadminded liberty loving people.

I recommend that a special committee be appointed to consider this question and that the committee report to this convention before adjournment.

I notice that some of our sister State Associations are distributing suitable literature in the form of tracts, spiritual newspapers, etc., through the medium of Auxiliary Societies and well know workers. I recommend that the incoming board of officers be asked to consider this phase of missionary work and if in their opinion it is worthy of being tried, that they be authorized to procure suitable literature; or if deemed best use the Spiritual papers for distribution, special postal rates can be received and the work carried on at small cost.

In closing this report, I have one appeal to make to each and every Spiritualist who may hear or read this report, and that is, that at all times and in all places remember it is for the good of the cause you ought to be working; loosing sight of the individual in the effort to do

the "greatest good to the greatest number." So long as discord, jealously and inharmony prevail in our ranks no advancement can be made; we will not even hold our own, but will retrograde; with these obstacles eliminated nothing can stop our progress upward; we need fear no evil from without, if the evil that lies within is cast out and trampled underfoot.

Let us feel our beloved Spiritualism and have for our object the enlightenment of our fellowman in the knowledge of the immortality of the soul and of the fact that we furnish proof of such immortality. If we find that we cannot reach certain individuals or classes ourselves try and find someone in our ranks who can reach them and interest them in our glorious truths.

The true value of anything worth having is best found by counting what it has cost in effort or sacrifice to obtain it, having once obtained it, the effort or sacrifice which we are willing to make to keep it.

Most of us know and possess the truth in some degree as taught by Modern Spiritualism. Is it not therefore correct to reason that the man or woman who is willing or has sacrificed most or who is working or has worked the hardest possesses the truth in the greatest degree.

I will close this report with the question: How much are you willing to work or sacrifice for the dissemination of the grand and glorious truths of Modern Spiritualism?

THE DEMONISM OF THE AGES AND SPIRIT OBSESSION.

This is a profitable book to read, there is more instruction in the introduction than in many a popular booklet. Truly the proper study of mankind is man, and here is a book giving some of the results of this proper study.

A relation of facts gathered from reliable sources, as well as facts which have come under the writers observation. No embelishment for effect, without ambiguity or mysticism nothing to tax the credulity or common sense of any one who believes there is no death.

It would have been advantageous to the cause of Spiritualism had these things been put more prominently before the people. Had mediums or subjects of obsession, and those engaged in developing mediums, been permitted to study such a book as this exposition of causes, they would have been warned and prepared to escape obsession.

Such expressions as "I have had enough of Spiritualism, it breaks up families, leads to insanity and the like" would have been less frequent. Believing that every thing is that comes from disembodied spirits is an open door for

imposition. Evasion of truth cripples integrity, and covering iniquity will prevent the ultimate triumph of any cause.

If these things were generally understood by those who ought to know, doctors, preachers, teachers, parents, legislators, etc. What a renovat on the human world might secure, what wonderful reforms might be looked for, capital punishment would be abolished, suicides and murders lessoned, and insane asylums with fewer tenants, no use for tobacco, intoxicants or vacinations.

Nobody can read the thrilling letters from those who have had personal experience in obsession and believe the narrative is fiction, however unpleasant it may be to accept the facts that all ought to know.

You will learn by reading this book that like does not always attract like. A pious praying Scotch Presbyterian, a Bible student who wanted to obey God's word was overpowered by evil influences. He says of himself that "evil spirits forced him to do things against his own common sense and judgement". He went to a doctor and also to his minister, neither of whom could do anything for him, finally hearing of a man who had power he said: "I immediately wrote that gentleman and begged him for God's sake to ask his spirit friends to come and save my life.

He sent me a letter at once, and as I was reading it I felt conscious of the presence of powerful spirits moving about me and some sort of healing powers darted through me and I began to feel like a new man." He repeatedly read the letter until his enemies were thoroughy vanquished. This as late as 1903.

Another case is of a lady possessed of a most lovely unselfish nature, with admirable poise of character, was not sufficient—she was obsessed by a Catholic priest, and had to be removed to another location.

Death makes no immediate change in the disposition or soul tendency, hence the undesirable influences and obsessions. These may be of ignorance, mischief or malice. All controlled mediums are under certain conditions open to that danger.

Swedenborg says that souls are often in the spirit world a long time before they learn that they have left their bodies, which are just as tangible as ever. The noted Theosophist, L. W. Leadbeater in his book "Invisible Helpers," says that little is given by the dead, it is far more common for them to be themselves in need of assistance than to be able to accord it to others.

Those are most truly progressing when assisting the progress of others, and denizens of the spirit world are as eager to progress as are the inhabitants of earth when they learn that they can. It is a delusion that one enters at death,

the place where he will eternally remain, but it is easier to overcome untoward habits here than there.

Nor is one's future wholly dependent upon believing or knowing. Persons who believe that death is oblivion, that now is the time to help themselves and their followmen, with no hope of reward except the satisfaction of doing good; making those around them happier and the present life cleaner and more enjoyable; verily they have there reward.

Three or four years ago I handed to a Methodist minsiter the first volume of Buchanan's Primitive Christianity. he returned without reading it, saying "I am not in sympathy with any phase of Spiritualism." I asked what were the manifestation of the Wesley families? Nervous imaginings, hullucinations, was the answer.

THE CRUCIFIXION OF CLARA U. MYERS.

A most remarakable demonstration of spirit power was witnessed a few evenings ago at the home of Mrs. Clara U. Myers. On Sunday evening she remarked to her husband how remarkably strong she felt as she with a number of persons belonging to her class had been away for a little outing together.

She retired about 9:30 p. m. and at 2:30 in the morning she was taken with a violent pain in her body, and for nineteen hours suffered the most excruciating pain that I ever witnessed. Once in a while, her little guide Rosie would control her and ease her suffering. We were powerless to help her in any way as her guides would not allow anything to be given her, stating that they were removing the old and injecting new chemicals into her body. Every part of her body underwent a change, so that the guides could have more power for the development of those in her classes. I wish to say right here that I have seen a great many mediums but have never seen one so self sacrificing for others as this dear soul is.

We were told by the guides to gather round her bed at 9 o'clock and the following gentlemen did so, Mr. Myers, Mr. O'Brien, Mr. and Mrs. Morris, the Messrs. Leisk and myself. The guides explained to us the nature of the treatment. then told us to feel the flesh of the body, it was just as though she had been dipped in water. The guides then left her and when she came to, she did not have a particle of pain and on the following day, was

up and about the house.

While this was going on and guides were working with her, an evil spirit got into the next room and turned on the gas, lit it, and burnt a towel that was hanging on the wall, her spirit mother came and put out the fire (so we were told afterwards by Mrs. Myers guides.) The door of the room was closed, several of us smelt the smoke which had penetrated to the upper floors and a search was instituted, the cause being found as already stated, all the persons whose names I have previously given will testify to the truth of what I have written.

I have been investigating this truth for ten years or more but have never witnessed any grander demonstration than this during all that time. King, her guide is one of the grandest spirits it has ever been my privilege to come in touch with, working faithfully to help humanity. Her many friends in Boston, New York, and Chicago will be glad to know that Mrs. Myers is at present very well and faithfully working for the cause of truth. Our opponents are reaping a revenue from license tax imposed upon our Spiritual workers; a strong effort is also made to prevent our Spiritual and Magnetic Healers

from exercising their God given powers to heal the sick, as did the "Nazarine" and his followers.

If every Spiritualist in California would be faithful to the cause of humanity and true to the divine principles of our philosophy and religion by contributing money for needful purposes:—Give a strong moral support to all legitimate efforts made to secure equal rights and lawful recognition and by exercising the right of ballot, by voting for and elect trustworthy men into office, they would hasten the day when we would not only be granted, but would be in a position to demand our rightful privileges and natural freedom.

Stitt Wilson, presented the claim of Socialism upon the Spiritualists from the Spiritual and Ethical standpoint, on Saturday evening, Sept, 3rd, making some strong points, showing the duty of every one to join in the movement toward elimnating the great wrongs which exist.

A synopsis of the closing address of the Convention by Henry Frank of New York, founder and leader of the Independent Liberal Church and of the Liberal Culture C ub, of that city, distinguished author, orator and reformer, was the next speaker.

He said he did not label himself a Spiritualist because frequently labels limited and misrepresented a man. He strove to be a broad. guaged independent thinker, open to the reception of Truth from any source. The reason that he liked and encouraged the Spiritualists was because they had the temerity and courage to penetrate one of the most uninviting and recondite fields af human study, and in spite of opposition, ridicule and obloquy, for half a century have fought all foes and won for humanity some grains of truth.

With the philosophy of Spiritualism, so far as it emphasized the recondite possibilities of the human soul which lie outside the plane of physical sciences, he was in the heartiest sympathy. For he declared it is from the invisible and intangible realm of existence that all the sources of knowledge and discovery are open to mankind.

We learn nothing from the visible save as it leads us into the invisible. There is in reality no realm of unknowabilty for the researches of the human mind. The unknown today becomes the known tomorrow no man living can say with logical exactness that the outmost bounds of the invisible worlds shall not sometime be discovered to the observation and reason of man.

If there be an invisible sphere inhabited by spirits who once inhabited the flesh, there is but one way to learn it, and that is by observation and investigation.

The first ground work that is required in scientific study is the as sembly of facts. We have no generalisation without particulars. Whatever may be the conclusion to which advanced thinkers of the future may reach as to the real cause and source of alleged spiritistic phenomena; this much will humanty be indebted to the cohorts of Spiritualism; namely, that they first of all set the world a thinking about this most momentous and perplexing of all problems that can confront the race. But he thought it well to interject, from his point of view, one word of caution.

The facts may be one thing and the explanation and philosophy another. It may be one thing to prove alleged mental or spiritistic phenomena, but quite another to discern the real and incontrovertible origin of them. Science slowly creeps through the ages and it remains for those who have true scientific minos how be it there be but few in the world to hold their patience, and while they encourage and pursue the investigation of the revelations of wonder that come from this source, await with calmness and dispationately the conclusions to which the future may arrive under more favorable and decisive conditions.

However, in the last analysis what is nature but the manifestation of the invisible forces, which are transmuted into material substance when their vibrations sink to a plane amenable to the physical senses.

There is nothing visible which at the same time is not invisible, for the forces that constitute and produce it, are all the ultimate substance they contain. The last analysable phase of nature is motion; and motion expressed in intelligible relations, is the equivalent of spirft. Here science or the investigation of physical nature and philosophy, or the observation on the facts of experience, converge and harmonize.

Herbet Spencer falsely asserted

that the real basis of unity between religion and science was at the point of the Abstruse or Unknownable. That would make of religion a fatuity; and of science a dream. If religion and sciences shall anywhere converge and harmonize, it must be in cognition, in actual knowledge, in indisputable experience. Therefore if science leads us only to the Abstfuse and Unknowable, science is but a blind leader of the blind; and if religion does the same thing, it becomes but a poor imitator.

No! man was made for knowledge not for ingnorance. Agnosticism is the foolish apology of despair and never will lead humanity to the goal of genuine discovery. We can show that religion and science harmonize in the plain of the Invisible, but not that of the Unknowable.

The Unknowable is only the Unknown, but the Invisible is eternal, and ever reveals to humanity all the addition to his acquired information.

The penetration of the invisible, which is the Infinite, is the ceaseless duty of humanity, for from this source alone is mankind benefitted.


