OUR NEXT DOOR NEIGHBORS.

WE roughly divide our mediums into three classes. We count their several phases as material, mental and spiritual. Perhaps philosophical would be the better definition of those who become the mouth piece for spirit teachers. By all alike the "divide" must be reached, for the mortal can go no further. At best it is a region dark, drear and foggy. The ordinary public seance tells that tale, and the history of Wilson and Dallas proves that even if there be attempted privacy the foe can enter as easily as the friend. The intercourse may at first seem both amusing and attractive, but it is dangerous to both mortal and spirit.

It is not the intention in this article to attempt to follow the career of an advancing spirit. In the absence of reliable facts or proofs we leave that to theosophical adepts. But we have here statements of reputable witnesses still living, and experiences in harmony with those of numbers of investigators, from which we may learn lessons much needed in these days, when public phenomena have become objects of general suspicion.

It's a common experience for some cautious and critical investigator to watch and wait for months before he avows himself convinced that spirit return is a demonstrated fact. He has learned his lesson, and declares that he knows it to be a truth, for he has had the evidence. Soon after he reads an article headed "exposure," and learns that his respected medium has been captured with wigs, cheese-clotn garments, etc., as evidence of fraud carefully prepared. He still believes that what he experienced was without fraud, but all the same he becomes silent or talks learnedly of the unknown powers of the "sub-conscious self," and perhaps joins the S. P.R.

The present writer has, so far, failed to capture a single sub-conscious self and bring him into court. Sub-conscious self may or may not have the powers ascribed to him, and may or may not be so suggestible that he cannot help being a first-class liar; but there need be no doubt of the presence of our "next door neighbor." Every public seance with a genuine sensitive as high priest or priestess, has the ear marks of this truth. Let us see what is reasonably proved by such genuine experiences.

1.—All classes of spirits alike must come to the edge of the divide where "next door neighbors" dwell, if they want to communicate with mortals.

2.—Even the most advanced spirit must be limited and befogged by such a nearness to earth life. He may not be injured or enslaved by any foe, but he becomes bespattered with mud and mentally befogged.

3.—A pure and unselfish motive is no protection to the mortal from spirit foes, any more than it protects him from lightening and flood. The authors of the work we have quoted were true and loyal to their spirit friends, who were also true to them. Yet conditions favored the foe, and independent mediumship lost the battle.

4.—It is true the advanced spirit may be more powerful than any foe, but he stays in such an atmosphere no longer than is necessary for his labor of love for some mortal. Yet he can be thereafter simu-

lated so skillfully that the mortal rarely finds out the deception.

5.—Every class of spirit, whether advanced or not, is dependent on a sensitive mortal for any intercourse with earth life; and a mortal, unless he be a sensitive, can greet no spirit, whether friend or foe.

There are powers of clairvoyance, etc., possessed by many sensitives which, it is now claimed, belong to a man's sub-conscious self. Whether or not that be so, it is absurd to suppose the mortal could have any power superior to that of an advanced spirit. Across the divide that mortal sensitive will face the same law of limitation, and the tremendous influence of suggestion. That his vision is suggested is proved by the fact that very rarely do two clairvoyants have the same vision. Mortala have been in the habit of taking such visions in a mass, and sorting them into a semblance of harmony upon which a religion of belief has been erected. Clairvoyants who find dead bodies, locate mines, and tell tales of spirit life, are emphatically "next door neighbors."

Nature's progress is a system of steps. You cannot climb up to number six, and then jump to nine. Each step is a foothold of experience that cannot be missed. The returning spirit may come swiftly as he please, but he can miss no step. The mortal has his rigid limit, after which, and until the next step has been climbed, he will know, see and hear that which is above him only by suggestion. The clairvoyant who outreaches the divide becomes subject to the law of spirit life, and, like our spirit visitors, will be limited and twisted in the tale he tells the rest of us by the power of suggestion from one side or the other.

When we apply such logical deductions to our personal and seance experiences with mediums, we begin to see why exposures are becoming the rule rather than the exception in physical phenomena.

Let us remember that every mortal crosses the divide to become a spirit, and that many linger as near to earth as possibe. Of course all classes alike while thus near may exchange greeting with mortals somewhat easily. But those who aspire and progress, and are not

held back by the immediate effect of their earth lives, soon reach other vibrations, and gradually become further away and less accessible. So while we may meet the good and pure, we are sure to rub shoulders with those who are real settlers, and therefore "next door neighbors." They are largely those who, if we had known them in earth life in their true selfhood, we should certainly have avoided, unless ourselves already "neighbors." They are where they are from lack of progress, and may have been there years, or perhaps centuries.

MEDIUMS' PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATION.

The above association held its regular monthly business meeting on Saturday evening the 10th inst., at Mrs. C. J. Meyer's Hall, 335 McAllister Street. After transaction of business and the order for the good of the society-which means the welfare of the mediums, the growth and prosperity of Spiritualism everywhere—a lively discussion was had relative to the unjust legis ation and unwarranted attempt on the part of the supervisors of the city and county of San Francisco to enforce the collection of a license tax upon the endorsed workers and ordained ministers of the Spiritualistic religion, holding Justificates issued by the California State Spiritualists' Association, incorporated under the laws of California. It was clearly shown by the speakers that the ordinance, so far as it includes our ministers and demonstrators of our philosophy, phenomena and religion is purely class legislation, which is contrary to the fundamental basis of a free republic, and equally dangerous to the injured and suffering party and as well, whomsoever may for a time profit by such unlawful measures. A resolution was adopted to print circulars setting forth our grievances in the premises, and demand our rights to a fair and equal priviledge with other religious bodies, who derive their power to exercise their divine gifts for the betterment of humanity, and to worship God according to the dictates of their own conscience, from the same source, viz.: the secretary of state, under the great seal of our commonwealth. The committee having the above matter in charge have prepared a petition to the Board of Supervisiors, requesting the repeal of the ordinance. If the petition comes your way, please sign it.

COMMENTS.

"OF making books there is no end," and the making of magazines is included in the modern version. The New Thought publications are far greater numerically at the present time than the Spiritualistic, while several Spiritualistic journals have a New Thought department.

This certainly seems logical, for as J. P. Cooke says in his article under the guise of New Thought the life of Spiritualism is having a revival from one end of the country to another.

And why should it not be so? As soon as man is demonstrated to be a living soul, why should he not begin unfolding his soul attributes while a dweller in the house of clay?

Returned spirits state that a man's station in the after life is determined by his unfoldment in the earth life. Not so much his intellectual as his spiritual development establishes his status. The worth of Spiritualism then is "to turn people to the inward light," which, shining in every man, will, if he gives it way, be the light to his path and the guide to his feet.

To be in the abnormal vibrations of mediumship, to quote Dawbarn's thought though not his words, is not an unfoldment of the powers of the individual soul. Such an unfoldment is normal, and results in no disaster.

A controlled medium is but the hypnotic subject of an unseen power. The impression left by the hypnotizer may result beneficially or injuriously according to the wisdom he possesses. Whether one will be such a subject or not is for himself to decide, but he certainly should know the dangers as well as the benefits of such a surrender of his will.

There is no good thing that may not be so abused as to become a bane instead of a blessing. And in nothing is this more clearly done than in mediumship. But there are phases and other phases—some more and some less abnormal. Those phases which leave a man normal must, in reason, be of the most advantageous to all concerned. Nothing which injures another can be a lasting good.

Good may be said to be relative, and the advancement of the race may demand the sacrifice of the individual. But the matter of sacrifice is coming to be looked upon as a remnant of barbarism, which modern invention can and will overcome through the power of the inner light.

The forces of nature and not his fellow man should serve man. These forces are controlled by laws called occult to-day. To morrow these laws will be as plain as the law of attraction or gravitation. The wizard of the coming time will be he who can harness nature's forces.

These forces are harnessed by the spirits who retun and reveal themselves by the marvels of physical manifestations. Man, being himself a spirit, may learn and exercise this same power. In the effort to compass this achievement some seem to have turned from Spiritualism to new gods. Seen aright such effort is not apostacy, but rather a greater consecration to the true idea of Spiritualism.

VITUPERATION, DEFAMATION AND ABUSE.

THE words of the heading to this article have always been the weapons used by the average clergyman when attacking any ism not in harmony with his ipse dixit. The people of Las Angeles are being stirred from center to circumference by one Dr. Frank De Witt Talmage, who is delivering a series of twenty lectures in that very religious city. The Times and Txaminer of Los Augeles have each published a synopsis of his iuhuman and unchristian attack and tirade, on November 27th, against mediums and Spiritualism. 
