On November 15th, 1903, the Truth Seekers' Spiritualist Society of Dallas, Texas, secured the services of Mrs. Alice Baker as their regular speaker. Mrs. Baker has continued continuously in such capacity, and still acceptably tills the position. Just previous to the annual meeting of the Texas State National Association of Apriritualists, held in San Antonio, Texas, September 29th to October 1st. 1904, Mrs. Baker made formal ap plication for ordinatior. As the usages less than one year previous. the application was not acted non at the annual meeting, but deterred until after the annual meetic of the N. S. A., to be held in Oct ber 1904, in St. Louis, Mo. He , it was found that the usages adopted by the N. S. William P. Phelon, M. D., Joander of the Hermetic Brotherhood of Atlantis, Luxor and Elephanta, died at the headquarters of that coe ety in this city, December 29th, 1904. Dr. Phelon was boin in Yorkshire, England, September 28th, 1884, and came to America in his infancy. He was a studious and thoughtful young man, and choosing the profession of medicine made of it a success. He served his country faithfully as surgeon for an Iilinois regiment during the civil war. After the war he devoted a large portion of his time to investigating occult philosophy, finally devoting his whole life to the work. In the early seventies he founded, or rather reorganized the Hermetic Brotherhood, to renew and carry on the work to which he felt he had devoted his former incarnations in the lost continent of Atlantis. He was the author of many books on hermetic philosophy, and was recognised throughout the world as one of the greatest souls of modern times, and a power in the spiritual uplifting of his race.
