HAMILTON—(Special)—

Meanwhile, in Dunkirk, N.Y., at least 20 residents reported sighting a similar object sweeping over their town and onward to Lake Erie.

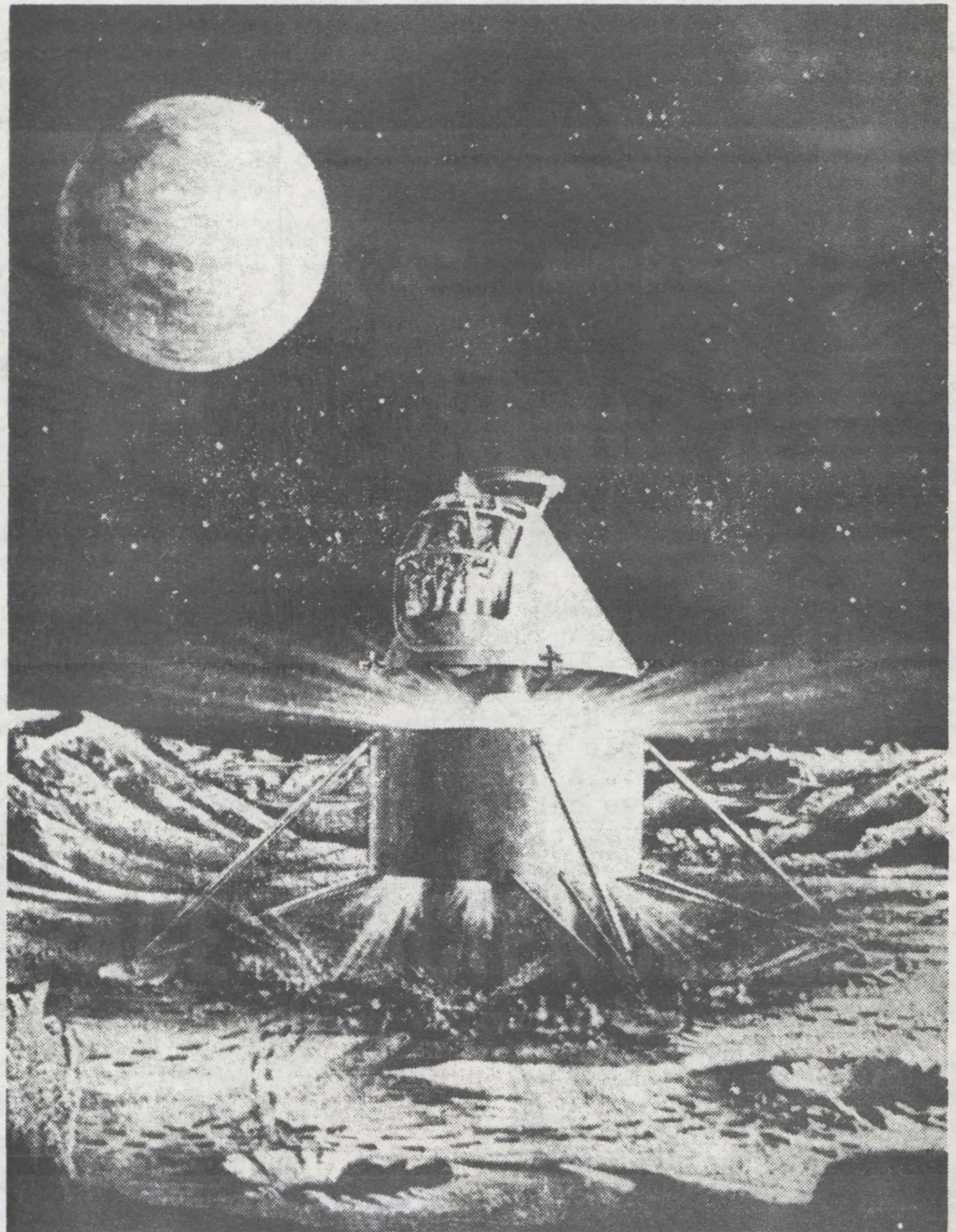
The U.S. Coast Guard was called in to investigate and patrolled the waters all night.

FURTHER THOUGHTS ON GARGOYLES AND SIMILAR MEDIEVAL CREATURES

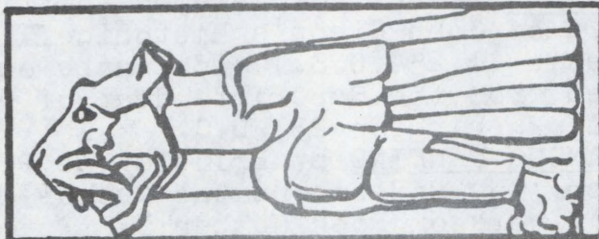

Those of you who remember my article in another publication on the subject of Gargoyles, will probably now say, well Gargoyles are only one sort of creature, who may, or may not

have been from another planet, true, I agree, in all the reports of strange looking creatures who people report having seen, in present times and in the past, there has been, it seems to this writer, not too much similarity in any of the reports, hardly any two reports seem to be alike. That is to say as far as the appearance of strange creatures are concerned, one person reports the creature he saw, or in several instances, came to grips with, was something of jellylike character, though small, another reports something very substantial looking of rather giant size. Greatly different sorts of creatures may have been seen at various times. There are those who have even suggested that the Yeti of Tibet and Nepal, is a creature from another planet, however in the light of recent reports about the Yeti, it would appear that there is actually no such creature at all, for as you know, a recent search in Nepal for it turned up nothing at all except a faded scalp of hair from a monastery. It was claimed to be from a Yeti, but later disproved to have been. Apparently the Nepilians saw some large creature far back in the higher elevations of their mountains, that they took to be a Yeti. But on closer sight was undoubtedly nothing but a large bear, it was only too easy to make a romantic legend out of a purported Yeti sighting and apparently many have, but scientists have now been unable to come up with any definite proof there is a Yeti. There has not been to my knowledge even so much as a photograph taken of a Yeti, so, I should have to see at least a photograph, before I even begin to believe in actuality. This writer is however inclined to believe there is such a thing as the Loch Ness Monster. Here we have definite photographs to show of it. However, this is a sea creature, and I am only in this article, concerned with living land creatures of manlike or humanoid appearance, creatures who may possibly be, or have been, from other planets. I am mainly concerned with the more mysterious creatures of medieval times, because it was only during that time of history, that Gargoyles and Gargoyle-like creatures were seen, and seen apparently many times, close up, not in the sky or a long distance off, they were, many times seen so close by

that they could be, and were described in most detailed ways.

In the new issue of Fate, there is an article about the Wudewasa or Wood Men of Northern Europe, with illustrations of ancient sketches showing what they looked like. In these illustrations one is struck with the similarity in the faces to the faces of Gargoyles seen on European and English cathedrals, there is the same wizened, rather pointed appearance of the face, that the Wudewasa was reported to have had, but unfortunately the Gargoyles on cathedrals just show the face of the creature, do not show what its body was like, whether it also was heavily furred over the body as the Wudewasa was reported to have been. Perhaps it may have also been furred, and that therefore the Wudewasa was one and the same as the Gargoyle, but one is rather inclined to disbelieve that, it could perhaps be possible, but probably not.

The latter part of the Fate article (Nov. 1962) goes on to conjecture that as far as the Wudewasa was concerned, it probably was not any creature from another planet, but was a prehistoric man, more specifically the Neanderthal Man. Though thought to be extinct, he was nevertheless continuing to live to medieval times in the more remote mountains of Northern Europe. This writer is inclined to believe, as he said in the earlier article, that the Gargoyle was something altogether different from the Wudewasa, and that perhaps he was really a creature from another planet, incidents of actual viciousness and damage done by Gargoyle-like creatures in English churches, hundreds of years ago, actual damage to structures, being shown, would seem to indicate there were living Gargoyles, and that they were not just figments of architectural imagination. It has not of course been proved, or at least not as yet, that the Gargoyle was a creature from a distant planet, but I think it highly likely that he was, you the reader, draw your own conclusions. He was not though, I think a creature at all of jellylike consistency. You can judge the general situation in a large way, by mainly consi-

dering the likeliness of the report or reports, you heard, for instance in medieval times there were many who did not believe there was any such thing as a Unicorn, though almost every coat of arms of the time, had one, and illustrations of them abounded everywhere, particularly in Europe there really was apparently such a thing as a Unicorn, though of course he did not have a magic horn. The Unicorn was apparently an animal called the Oryx, now extinct, and having been extinct for several hundred years, so with the gargoyle, though there not having been something living called a gargoyle, yet perhaps something very similar with a similar name. There is much likelihood I think on that, we do not have proof of course, but we do know there was such a creature as the Oryx, that much we can say.

Yes, I still think that perhaps gargoyles lived, and that they were half animallike, half humanlike, creatures from another planet. I think it unlikely however (though it is remotely possible, perhaps) that the Wudewasa was anything or any creature from another planet. I am inclined to go along with the assumptions of the Fate article, that the Wudewasa was in fact, the prehistoric Neanderthal Man, and consequently not of a planetary origin. As to the Yeti, there may be no such thing, but something very like it has been reported from British Columbia, a creature called the Sasquatch. And the existence of this, not as yet disproved, many have reported seeing it.

Bright Object Sighted Ringed by Red Lights

An unidentified flying object, described as "five times as large as the brightest star" surrounded by red lights, was reported seen in the Chatham and London areas early yesterday.

Hovered Over Erie

Chatham detachment of the provincial police reported that calls had been received from persons who saw the unusual sight south of the Morpeth area hovering over Lake Erie.

Provincial Constable George Fodor of Chatham, said the bright white object was lower than the normal star but "five times as bright."

The object was later reported

to have been seen in the London area and the London detachment, provincial police, said it was visible from their headquarters.

A spokesman at the London Airport control tower said several calls were received about the object but its identity had not been determined.

HELLO OUT THERE

Scientists are thinking of one day getting a coded message from other beings on other worlds somewhere in space.

They have simulated the kind of message they might expect. One such message consists of 1,271 ones and zeroes in what looks like random order. But it is a code that can be reproduced in picture form.

To start with, such a code may reduce itself to a coded square. Mathematically, the number of 1,271 can be produced by multiplying 31 times 41. So perhaps this square of 1,271 units is 31 units on two sides, 41 units on the other two sides.

Marking a dot for every "1" and leaving a blank for every "0", a picture in dot form begins to appear.

In a sample message, portrayed in a recent issue of international science and technology magazine, the picture tells a great deal indeed.

At the bottom are three beings, looking much like humans—in fact, like a man, a woman and a child. At the right of the picture is a portrayal of the solar system that the beings inhabit. The "man" is pointing to the fourth planet—presumably the home planet. Next to the third planet are what appear to be waves and a fish, indicating these folks get around by space vehicles in their own solar system, and know that a neighboring planet has water and life.

Above are representations of atoms of hydrogen, carbon and oxygen, indicating that this group of beings has a chemistry like our own.

Other sample messages have been devised too, using shorter codes that are reducible to picture-messages. Scientists use these examples only to show that a great deal of information can be transmitted to us in coded form by superior beings somewhere, if anywhere.

'Search For Life In Space'

WASHINGTON (AP) — One-hundred top-ranking American scientists urged the government Saturday to place more emphasis on searching for life beyond the earth.

They cited international prestige as one consideration and expressed concern that life-detection experiments might not be ready in time for inclusion in the first United States unmanned capsule landing on Mars. This is scheduled to take place sometime in 1966.

The scientists expressed some criticism of the U.S. man-in-space program. They said not enough emphasis is being put on developing techniques to sustain astronauts on prolonged flights such as those to the moon and the planets.

The recommendations were contained in a 16-chapter report to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration by the space science board of the National Academy of Sciences.

Ghost Chased Her Here

OAKVILLE—(Special)—Few immigrants to Canada can match an Oakville woman's reason for fleeing her homeland—she was chased out by a ghost.

Mrs. Frederick Rimmington, an elderly widow, says she was forced to leave England after being terrorized by a poltergeist—literally a noisy ghost—for more than a year.

She is convinced not only that a ghost haunted her house, but that the phantom was her husband who died in 1957, two years before a series of unexplicable incidents began to complicate her normally-simple life.

The reign of terror of the poltergeist of Finchley Road in Birmingham started in March, 1959, and continued until February, 1960.

Lights in the six-room house would turn on and off

in the middle of the night. On several occasions knocking and scratching at the doors of the home awoke Mrs. Rimmington in the middle of the night.

The widow wasn't the only one who heard the noise. At 4 o'clock one morning she was startled by the sound "a ton of coal being poured down the stairway" and by high-pitched singing or moaning. A next-door neighbor also heard the commotion and came over to find out what had happened.

Nothing unusual was discovered and all returned to bed.

At 4 p.m. the same day the Rimmington chimney caught fire. Mrs. Rimmington is convinced her husband was trying earlier to warn her of the danger. Many of the incidents, she said, seemed to foreshadow or warn of sickness to herself or her family.

Unnerved by her experience, Mrs. Rimmington began to sell her furniture and she put her house up for sale.

YEARS AGO?

Visit From Another Planet

LOS ANGELES—Earth may have been visited by creatures of an advanced civilization, from outer space, astronomer Dr. Carl Sagan, 28, said today.

He told the American Rocket Society that earth may have been visited many times by various galactic civilizations and that they may have left things behind.

Some kind of base may be maintained on the dark side of the moon, he said.

NO FACTS

Dr. Sagan labeled his talk Intelligent Exterrestrial Life.

No facts have yet been found to indicate life exists on other planets, he said.

"My conclusions are purely provisional. I advance them to stimulate thought and study," he declared.

"Interest in possible civilizations on other worlds has fascinated man since the beginning of history but only in the past decade has it become even slightly tractable to serious scientific investigation."

One star in 10,000 might have planets that could support life.

In such cases there would be one million stars that might have advanced civilizations.

A FEW SURVIVE

"It seems reasonable that at least a few of these advanced technical civilizations would not have destroyed themselves, nor lost interest in interstellar communication or suffered insuperable biological or geological catastrophes," he continued.

The most probable distance to the nearest such community, Dr. Sagan said, would be several hundred light years. (A light year is the distance light travels in a year at the speed of 186,000 miles a second.)

He believes man will travel to such communities "within a century or two" with immense spacecraft involving nuclear staging and fusion reactors.

Little Men From Mars Not There

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — A leading expert on Mars said today that interplanetary studies indicate that Martians, as imagined in science fiction, do not exist on the red planet.

If there is any life there, Dr. Rodney W. Johnson said, "it is probably a low form of animal life or plant life that lives and then goes dormant in seasonal cycles."

"The atmosphere and climate of Mars is not compatible with life as we know it," said Johnson, head of General Electric's interplanetary systems development at Valley Forge, Pa.

"ALL INFORMATION we have now does not support the belief that higher types of life exist on Mars," he said.

Johnson spoke on "The Terrain and Soil of Mars" to the nation's foremost space scientists at the American Astronautical Society meeting here.

However, Johnson added it would be much easier for earth space explorers to exist there than on the moon.

What colonization by earth exploratory teams would be like on Mars was described by Chester R. Haig Jr., of the McDonnell Aircraft Corp., St. Louis.

"During the first year or so," Haig said, "life at the colony will not be unlike living in a Pullman car which wanders rather slowly over a vast flatland that alternates between long stretches of desert

COMIC STRIP'S SPACESHIP MAY NOT BE DREAM

Propulsion Methods Studied by U. S.

Washington, Jan. 5 — The magnet-powered spaceship flown at dizzying speeds by Diet Smith, the eccentric millionaire in THE CHICAGO TRIBUNE'S Dick Tracy comic strip, may not be a pipe dream, an air force official said today.

Scientists in air force and industrial laboratories are do-



ing research on dozens of methods of propelling vehicles thru space as fast as Diet Smith' machine. Some have high promise of being practical; others are pure theory.

What puzzles scientists who read the comic strips is how the Diet Smith contraption can take off from the earth like a scared deer. The electrical propulsion systems being studied would not be practical for earth launchings because of the ratio of weight to thrust.

Study Ion Engine

The exotic space engines on the drawing boards would be turned on in space, after being launched by chemical rockets, where the absence of atmospheric drag conceivably would make possible speeds of 100,000 miles an hour and more.

For example, the ion engine being developed for the air force by Electro-Optical Systems Inc., Pasadena, Cal., has a thrust of 2.1,000 of a pound, compared with the 360,000

pounds thrust of the Atlas rocket which sends American astronauts into orbit.

The Atlas, after struggling thru the earth's atmosphere to the edges of outer space, sends an astronaut on his way at a speed of 17,500 miles an hour. But, freed of atmospheric drag, the ion engine is believed capable of sending a payload streaking toward the stars at a speed of 100,000 miles an hour.

Engine Is Small

The ion engine under development is a small affair, more useful for maintaining the attitude in flight of space capsules than for propelling large payloads thru space. Its advantage over present gas-operated control systems would be the tremendous thrust developed with minimum fuel loads.

Here is how the ion engine would work:

Its fuel would be cesium, a rare metal, in liquid form. Heated to the vaporization point by battery-supplied electric power, it would be forced thru a tungsten grid. In the process, electrons would be stripped from the cesium atoms, producing ions.

First Test Failure

[An ion is an electrified particle formed when a neutral atom loses or gains one or more electrons, the most elementary charges of negative electricity. Loss of electrons creates positive ions; gain of an electron creates a negative ion.]

The interaction of the cesium vapor and tungsten would create an electric field which would accelerate the ions, forcing them out the rear of the engine as a beam to provide thrust. The acceleration would be constant — thrust would be added constantly to the thrust originally provided.

The ion engine failed in its first flight test Dec. 18, 1962, but has operated successfully in laboratory tests. The air force said it located the source of the Dec. 18 malfunction but gave no details.

Soviet Scientists Figure Moon Heat

LONDON. — (Reuters) — Soviet scientists have estimated that the temperature of the moon, at a depth about 31 to 37 miles is about 2,120 degrees Fahrenheit, the Soviet News Agency Tass reported.

THE COSMIC EGG

Most scientists arrive at what they call their inventions or 'break-throughs' by applying different sets of data to each other. If they don't fit, then some further pieces of data are put together with some of the original pieces, and so on and on. Sometimes, they strike lucky, and a new development is given to the world.

However, this is not real creative thought or Creation, as it was originally intended, and as it is used throughout the greater part of the Cosmos.

I am moved to ask the question: Could it be that in the last 150 years

certain gentry off-planet have initiated an intensive programme of technological advancement for humanity on Earth?

MYSTERIOUS FLASH SEEN IN MARITIMES

A flash in the sky, described as "cone-like," "ball-shaped" and "multi-colored" was reported in wide sections of the Maritimes today. RCAF headquarters here said it had received no report of the object. Reports indicated it was seen most clearly at Springhill, a northern Nova Scotia coal mining town. A report from Prince Edward Island said the flash was bluish. In Moncton it was described as white. At Springhill, residents said it changed color. It was also seen in St. John. Trans-Canada Airlines here said none of its aircraft reported seeing the flash.

Norman MacDonald said 50 people were in the main street of Springhill "when this thing lit up the whole town. It was like daylight. It changed colors...every color of the rainbow. Then it exploded and the smoke stayed in the sky. It was all over in a few seconds." MacDonald, who said it happened at 12:25 am ADT said "I never saw anything like it. It was scary." Coalminer Robert Miles said: "It was pretty bright. It looked like a round ball. It seemed to explode." Nothing was seen to fall to the ground.

Junior Davis of Springhill said it was conelike at first "and it looked like a rocket. I watched it for a few seconds. It exploded and disappeared." May Turnbull said she was standing in the street in Springhill "and I saw a bright light. It was moving and then there was smoke." A spokesman at the control tower at Moncton Airport said the light was sighted at 12:20 a.m. Moncton is about 60 miles west of Springhill. The spokesman said it could have been a meteor or a satellite. It appeared to be about 100 miles above earth, with particles falling away. He said a similar sighting was reported about a month ago. STRANGE OBJECTS REPORTED AT CEDAREEDGE

Strange objects in the clear night sky over Western Colorado were seen Thurs. night by scores of residents of Cedar-edge and Delta. At least 2 objects, glowing red, blue, green and yellow, were observed here for a period of more than 2 hours.

Town Marshall, Ed Marsh, State patrolman Richard Kutor of Delta, and Councilman Phil Aust & George Bowness watched the mysterious objects for more than 2 hours, sometimes through binoculars. Marsh said atmospheric conditions might have produced an illusion, despite the clear moonless night.

"They were about the size of golfballs, but it was impossible to relate them to any known object to determine their altitude and speed," he said. Marsh said the objects changed color rapidly and appeared phosphorescent. One viewer described them as resembling an open umbrella.

The objects moved steadily eastward until they disappeared.

Earlier this week two Larimer county residents in Northern Colorado reported sighting an object in daylight. Fort Collins man described the object as grey in color and weighing 200 to 300 lbs. (Credit: Washington State NICAP subcommittee, via Dorothy Lefler.)
