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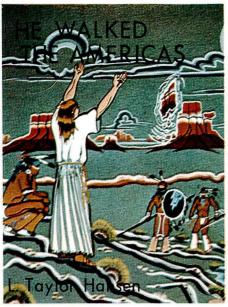

EDITORIAL

SEVERAL issues ago we asked the readers to make some suggestions as to how to improve SEARCH magazine. We got many letters. Some of them were satisfied with the magazine as it was, some admitted they felt it wasn't as good as in years past, some believed a drastic change was necessary, and others decried the changes that had already been made. The editors have studied the results of all this comment carefully, and we've come up with some conclusions.

What is it that SEARCH really is? Its physical format is a "pulp" magazine, and its area is that of "entertainment". People read it because it is a cheap paper means of pastime, which can be read in a few hours, or for a few minutes at a time, provide some measure of pleasure, excitement, and curiousity, and perhaps stimulate some more or less unusual thought. It is essentially "escapism". Thus, it is not to be taken seriously. Here

we come up with what we'll call Fault # 1: The editors have been inclined to view it as important, and a means to carry some sort of message, and to make people think.

Actually, Fault #1 should have been called Error # 1, because it was due to faulty thinking on the part of the editor himself. So, the remedy to this is to provide more entertainment, excitement and escapism. Thus, we need short articles of dynamic interest, about unusual and interesting events and Not an argument people. as to whether "ghosts" (for example) exist, and what they are, but just a vivid and thrilling ghost story. A real hair-raiser.

Fault # 2: Wordiness on the part of both the writers and the editor. Get on with the story, is the suggestion. Cut out all the extraneous discourse on the part of the author. Be concise, brief, to the point, and don't bore the reader with one unnecessary word. Especially no interminable gassing

by the editor, on a subject so esoteric even he doesn't know exactly what he is talking about. The editor should present tidbits of interest, with short, intelligent comments on each item.

Fault # 3: Too much "preaching". It is not the place of the editor to mould either the thinking or the morals or the behavior of his readers. They'll decide for themselves what is right or wrong, correct or incorrect, moral or immoral. The editor should realize his readers are as intelligent, or more intelligent, than he is, and not presume to be superior enough even to moralize. Thus, the articles should not be of this type, and the editor should, bluntly speaking, mind his own business - which is to put out an interesting and entertaining magazine that does not challenge or insult the reader.

Fault # 4: Too much "personality" in the magazine. The letters column tends to become a "feuding ground" between several people who monopolize the space available to letters, which should be on other subjects. These subjects should, actually, be the same as the stories and articles - personal reports by readers on things unusual that have happened to them. Or short comments on the pro and con of pre-

viously published articles.

When you boil all this down, the majority of readers do not want to be made to think, don't want to be exposed to this or that ism, don't want to be forced to read through wordiness. This is a 'little' magazine (one reader even called it 'skimpy'), and long, complicated material belongs, properly, in a book, not in a magazine bought to 'pass a moment or two in relaxation and entertainment'.

The editors are going to try to evolve a magazine which corrects some of these faults. We'd like to know from the readers how successful we are. We are introducing many small changes, too. Things like small departments, dressed-up headings, illustrations, new features, etc.

Although there was some suggestion that certain subjects should be avoided (religion, politics, current events, etc.), we have never actually gone into any of these subjects except as they possessed some mystic or occult overtone.

Oh yes, Fault #5: Verbose pomposity on the part of the editor. Make it short, zippy, even limited to one or two pages, and quit bragging. So, it would seem right now is a good time to knock it off for this time. - Editor.

HOW I DISCOVERED AND PUBLISHED OAHSPE

ANY PEOPLE have been curious as to my interest in Oahspe, and the reason for publishing a photo-copy of the 1882 edition of the book, although the 1891 issue has been continuously published since that date and is still published today.

The reason, of course, is to demonstrate the differences between the two works, and these differences were significant enough, to this writer's way of thinking, to be of substantial importance in any future debate as to the validity of the book.

What about Oahspe's validity? Is it a "true" book? Or is it just a work of fiction?

Even as a lad of sixteen, when I wrote and sold my first science fiction story, I knew that some of the things in that story were not fiction. They were, in fact, a disguised presentation of a rather mystic experience, woven into science fiction form. Much science fiction I believe was "prophetic", even to the extent that it might have been "inspired". It is true that science fiction writers showed

the way to outer space, as we are adventuring into it today. Even the technical facts of space rocketry are so exact that scientists admit the fiction writers were actually masters of theoretical science, and not fictional pundits at all. This would seem to indicate something more than just imagination.

However, as a writer, so many of these "mystic" imaginings came true that I began to ask what it was all about. And when I asked, it seemed that Fate answered, and almost miraculously, many things came to me which, taken as a whole, set up a fantastic pattern of a new "reality" that I now firmly believe in. One of the major items which came to me in this mysterious manner was the book, Oahspe, sent to me by a reader who said, "I felt impelled to send this book to you. I don't know who you are, nor why you should have this book, but apparently it is important. Please read it."

The book proved itself. To me, it could not be a fake. It had to be authentic - because it proved the key to all the vast amount of ma-

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terial I had collected in my lifetime, and especially of that amazing adventure, the Shaver Mystery. Oahspe proved Shaver, and Shaver proved Oahspe. Somewhere between both, the actual truth lies. I don't believe the literal "truth" can ever be known - we can only approximate truth in the framework of our capability of understanding. I think that Oahspe can be understood, and that it points the way to a vaster, more complex reality still to be discovered. Perhaps the best way to conclude this story of my own discovery of Oahspe is to tell you of the book itself, and how it was written. If you have not read it, I recommend that you do so. It might remake your entire life.

John Ballou Newbrough was born on June 5, 1828, on a Springfield, Ohio farm. A college man, he specialized in medicine, particularly dentistry, which later became his profession. He was a big man, powerful and vigorous and adventurous. After college he went to the goldfields of California, and also to Australia. After becoming a dentist in New York City, he married, and became the father of a son and a daughter. A second marriage gave him another daughter. Part of his normal home life was an interest in spiritualism, and together with a dear friend, Edwin Augustus Davis, he interviewed many mediums, even entertained them in his home. in an effort to learn all he could of the occult. Davis was a photographer, and cooperated with Newbrough in taking pictures of spiritual phenomena, and many unusual pictures were secured. However, both men were dissatisfied with the

calibre of spirit communications being received, and Newbrough particularly felt that there must be something more interesting and practical. The advent of the Fox sisters upon the New York scene brought matters to a head in Newbrough's mind, and he earnestly desired to know how the angels lived, the plan of the universe, and the true facts of spiritual existence. He believed that if he purified himself, he might establish higher contacts.

One morning in 1870, Newbrough went to the home of his friend Davis, who lived on Sixth Avenue, near the old Hay Market, and said: "I've come for your advice; I had quite an experience about 4 a.m. this morning. I was sleeping nicely when I felt a hand on my shoulder. A voice said: "Wake up, doctor. Everything is all right. I only want to ask you a question, and we will go."

"I sat up and answered: 'Yes, if I can.' The voice said: 'Would you like to perform a mission for Jehovih?'

"I rubbed my eyes and saw that the room was lit up with pillars of a soft light so pleasing to the eyes that it was indescribable. I saw great numbers of beautiful spirits or angels. They did not have wings. I spoke: 'What is the mission, so that I may know whether to say yes or no?' The answer came back: 'Jehovih would like you to live



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spiritually for ten years, and at the end of that time we will come back and tell you what it is that we desire, for your body and mind are not sufficiently perceptible now. You must be pure.'

"What do you mean by living spiritually?

"We want you never to kill anything, or eat anything that breathes; meat, fish, birds, reptiles, etcetra. Live on nuts, fruit, vegetables. You don't need so much food, as you are too heavy now; you need to lose weight. One other thing is very important: you must help people; give

your services to people who need dental help, without pay, if they cannot pay. Do charity work; by individual charity you change the person's thoughts. They will think of you as a good man, and will send out good thoughts to you. You will need all the good will you can get.'

"I answered: 'This will be quite a change of living for me. I will let you know.'

""We already know your answer; it will be yes! the voice said, and then the lights dimmed and went out, and the atmosphere changed back to its normal darkness. I got up and wrote down everything that had happened, then I drank a glass of milk and came over to talk to you."

Davis and Newbrough discussed the matter for hours, and during the conversation Newbrough revealed that he thought he had recognized three of the spirits, although he had not had a good look at them. He asked Davis if he thought the adventure was real, or only a dream.

"John," said Davis, "I don't believe it was a dream. I'd say, go ahead. I myself don't like meat or fish, and I would have no objection to going on the same diet so that you will have assistance in keeping to it, as it will certainly be hard on you to be so different in public eating habits. Perhaps the ten year wait will be worth it, when you find out what it is that you are to do."

At 4 a.m. one morning late in

1880, John Ballou Newbrough was awakened from his slumber to find the same mysterious and beautiful lights filling his room. He sat up and demanded: "Am I worthy? The same voice spoke: "You have done well. You have passed our test. We know that you feel more healthy. Now we want you to buy a typewriter and place it on this table. We will thereafter awaken you one hour before dawn each morning, and you will sit in this chair before the typewriter and put your hands on the keys. You will buy plenty of paper and keep it always ready to use."

"I don't know how to use a typewriter."

"We will control your hands and arms, and perform the task for you, so don't worry. You must not look at what is written intil tis finished."

There was further discussion and instruction, then the pillars of light dimmed and went out.

On the norming of canuary 1, 188. having rollowed all instructions, the first writing session began at the moss Newbrough later told tho his friend. Davis: "To my amazement as sat nahechair, my hands went in indistanted to pound at the keys it seemed to me that I was half asteen out, saw everything was toing, saw no spirits, but snew they were using my body and thought clocked at my hands and fingers; they were going

like mad. Then it occurred to me that it was fantastic.

"The papers seemed to pile up fast on the right side of the typewriter. As the days went by, I was doing more and more. At first I was thinking what am I writing about? My mind seemed blank, but I had never felt better in my life. I always locked my door after me, and it was locked when I came back. I noticed, though that there was a blank paper over the pile I had finished, and a paperweight on top. It was oblong in shape. As I left my room the next morning, I took particular notice how the paperweight lay on the stack of finished work. When I returned that evening, I wanted to see if it had been moved. but it had not. But to my surprise, my bed had been made. Everything had been dusted and cleaned. I said to myself: 'The spirits are certainly working hard around here!' I heard a loud laugh, and the voice said: 'We are! We don't want you to worry about a thing. We are taking care of you, and no harm can come to you, Remember this!""

Every morning, before sunrise, until December 15, 1881, John Ballou Newbrough wrote at his Sholes typewriter, at a speed physically almost impossible considering the crudity of this first typewriter, and finally the manuscript was complete.

In 1882 the book was published. Newbrough kept the very first copy off the press, and presented the second copy to his friend Edwin Augustus Davis in appreciation for his assistance over the years.

The foregoing information (which it is significant to note is essentially the same as the account given by Newbrough himself in a letter written on January 21, 1883 to the editor of The Banner of Light in Boston, Massachusetts) comes from the diary of the grandson of Edwin Augustus Davis.

Although copies of the first edition of OAHSPE are reputed to exist in the possession of various individuals, only one copy has been located in fifteen years of diligent by the publisher of searching photo-copied edition, and it is from this single copy that the photographic offset plates have been made. Inasmuch as there are considerable differences in the 1891 edition (and those subsequent) and the 1882 edition, it seems desirable to preserve the first edition in greater quantities for the purposes of those more erudite and concerned students of OAHSPE who, made aware that a "revision" was made, may wonder at the extent of the revision and reasons for it.

The original manuscript, it is said, was destroyed in a flood in El Paso, Texas, after it had been carefully checked against the 1891 edition by Andrew M. Howland, who aided Newbrough in the work of revising the 1882 edition. Des-

troyed also were the paintings from the 1891 edition reproduced in the photo-copied edition.

Howland, in a letter written in 1893, mentions that the Book of Praise was nearly double in present size, and that quite likelythis is also true of the Book of Ben. The Book of Discipline, which appears in the 1891 edition, does not appear in the 1882 edition, and unfortunately there is now no evidence that it appeared in the original manuscript. Other fragments of original proof sheets, including an introduction to the Book of Saphah and an explanation of the Tree of Language, appeared only in very recent editions. Apparently it is true that the original OAHSPE manuscript has never actually been published in its entirety, and because the manuscript is destroyed, some considerable portions are now lost.

Little can be done today to remedy any lack, but certainly none of the published editions should be allowed to become unavailable, as is the original manuscript. Therefore, your writer produced the photographed edition of the 1882 printing, which was the very first, together with all its typographical errors, its language key charts, its Commentary, and as an added feature reproductions of the paintings (also destroyed in the same flood that removed the original manuscript from the ken of

man) of the key prophets in OAHSPE.

The book can be secured from Palmer Publications, Inc., Amherst, Wisconsin, for \$10.00 plus 40¢ postage.

The publication of the photo copy of the 1882 edition is not to say that subsequent editions are invalid, for in fact the doctrinal content is unchanged, and the bulk of the publication is materially the same, except for the omissions, additions and revision changes as will be noted. This photo copy of the 1882 edition is offered solely in the interests of completion, and to answer those who ask questions concerning the first edition and the exact nature of the changes that were actually made, and what their effect on the validity of OAHSPE has been. The paintings are also included from the 1891 edition, because that is also very rare.

In our humble opinion, the first edition should not be lost, as was the original manuscript. In the light of present day science, the Book of Cosmology alone is evidence of a fore-knowledge that superior stands as a sturdy sentinel over the doctrinal portions. And in the light of present day anthropology and archaeology, its historical portions stand as remarkable evidence of that superior foresame knowledge. OAHSPE is truly a gateway to understanding.

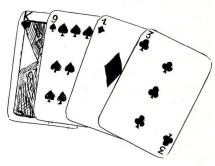
Let's Run The Cards

WOULD LIKE to share with you a method of card reading

which I learnedlong ago.
During world war I, a neighbor
who's son was in France, taught my
mother, and I learned too. We were
interested because my two
brothers were also "over there",
and though I was only ten, I worried
most of the time. Several evenings
a week we got together, either at
her house or ours, to check on our
loved ones; and throughout the
whole time we had a general idea
how they were faring.

One night we were awakened by the voice of the older one, Arthur, calling, "Mama!", we got up immediately and "ran" the cards. It was apparent he was in great danger and wounded, but would live. Many months later when he was home, we asked him about it. He said that on that night he had received a head injury while repairing a telephone line under heavy fire. He also remembered calling Mama.

In the years since, I have

learned a very little of the ancient science of astrology, and can see a marked connection between that study and "our" way of running the cards. For instance, all fours refer to the house, home or base of operations of a person of corresponding complexion. The nine of hearts represents the deepest wish of the querant. He may "cut" the cards for a specific wish, but the nine of hearts will show where his real wishes lie.

Sixes indicate working conditions, or health changes. Threes show short trips, spades and clubs indicate night trips, or in darkness; diamonds and hearts, daytime. Dueces usually mean news, the specific nature being shown by the surrounding cards. Nines mean longer trips.

Tens show where a person should be most successful in life. If the ten of diamonds faces the querant's face card, he could be very successful in a career of finance. The ten of spades, law study or enforcement. The seven of clubs indicates the coming together of friends and acquaintances for the common good, such as lodges, churches, study groups.

In my early twenties I moved to New York city. Mother wrote me about certain people who would try to influence me. She was always right.

Back home, I began reading for friends, always without recompense. Mother thought it wrong to accept pay for helping others. I have studied the cards through the years, and there is always good advice there if I heed it, which I do not always do.

The querant must have a clear idea of what is wanted, otherwise there will be confusion in the cards, and little meaning. Here is the way we did it and I still use it. The querant shuffles the entire deck, without "riffling". As he shuffles he should keep his mind focused on the question or problem at hand, or in mind. When they are well shuffled, cut into three piles, cutting away from you. Turn the piles over; those cards showing will indicate the most important aspect of the day. Take up the pile nearest you and spread them on the table, being sure to keep them on the same order in which they came out. That is don't turn them over, around or upside down. Consider each card individually and in context. Then spread the second pile, and the third likewise. When all are spread in three rows, you are ready to read. Here are the meanings of the individual cards.

DIAMONDS: ace - a letter or other message concerning money or anger; duece - malicious, gossipy or "mad" news; three - a short daytime trip concerned with money, trouble or anger; four - the home base of operations or place of business of a person of "diamond" complexion; that is, a person with very blond or red hair, blue, gray or green eyes and very fair skin; five - always refers to time. Days, months, years. Invery precise readings it can be hours; six - this card warns of work or health conditions which will bear watching. Whether it is illness or work, the surrounding cards will tell the story; seven - an alliance in which the primary consideration is money or other material gain, this card facing a personal card shows a person who will do almost anything for money; eight lucrative career or hobby. If this person has psychic ability he is likely to put it to work making money; nine - journeys, trips, writing, or a religious career, in which there is the prospect of material gain; ten - this is the card of finance. Facing a personal card, it shows he or she could be very successful in a career of finance.

Surrounding cards will indicate the direction the activity should take; king - a man over thirty-five of diamond coloring; queen - a woman of any age with diamond coloring; jack - a young man of diamond coloring. Also used for the younger of two men shown in sequence.

HEARTS: ace - good news, success; also a child if running near a face card, or with the ace; duece good news - if two dueces run together, it means the message is doubly true. However, if the duece of hearts is with the "death" cards, it foretells the death of a person of heart complexion. The "heart" person is one with sandy, light brown or gray hair, and blue, brown or gray eyes, fair or ruddy complexion; three - short, friendly daytime trips or visits. The cards closest about it will indicate the nature of the trip; four - the home, residence, or base of operations of a heart person, five - always tells the time involved: six - sickness of a heart person, or one in which he is concerned. If money cards surround it, the illness will cost the heart person money; seven - this card refers to marriages, alliances and partnerships in general; eight - this is the card of success in love, marriage, and/or career affairs. Also ability and success in psychic, hidden or mystic studies or experiment; nine - this is the BEST card in the whole deck! If it runs facing you you will assuredly

"get your wish". Also trips or journeys associated with love, marriage, religion and the higher things of life; ten - good luck in job, career, personal affairs and your approach to the world in general; king - a fair-skinned man, past thirty-five who has sandy, light brown or gray hair, with blue, brown or gray eyes; queen - a woman with the coloring of the king; jack - a young or younger man of like coloring.

CLUBS: ace - good news, friendly message, a letter; duece news about money for a person of "club" coloring; three - a friendly journey, or visit, good talk with friends: four - the house or home of a "club" person; five - as the other fives, this is a time factor: but a friendly one. With this card, there is always time to do what must be done; six - this is an indication of illness for a club person who may be a friend. Also shows any kindness or service a club person may do for someone who is ill or in difficulty with no expectation of wish for pay or reward; seven - this is the card of affiliation: in which friends come together for the common good; as in lodges, groups or churches; eight - the possibility of gain through an inheritance; nine - travel, religion and higher learning through the reading of travel and historical books; ten - this card shows opportunities in a career or calling

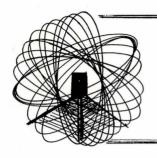
in those lines of thought connected with higher learning, religion, travel and communications; king - this man is past middle age, fair of skin with dark blue, brown or hazel eyes, dark blond or brown hair; queen - a woman of the club coloring. Also indicates a woman who is of gentle disposition, and good intentions; jack - a young manunder thirty-five; or the younger of two men, of club complexion.

SPADES: ace - this card can be good or very unfortunate, depending on placement. If it is reversed (upside down) it means bad news; if reversed with the dueces of spades it indicates a death. If reversed with the trey of spades it shows a death over which there will be doubt, such as accidental death. If it runs upright facing a person of spade coloring it means that person will receive good news; duece unfavorable influence, news and disappointments in some undertaking of minor importance; three nighttime trips. It adds a negative influence to any cards around it; four - the house of a spade person; five - again time, in this case a time of reckoning. Pay-uptime; six - this card indicates those illnesses, maladies, and afflictions which could become chronic, disabling or malignant. It will run near the person who carries the germ or evidence of fatality; seven - this card indicates unholy alliances, partnerships depending on

the misfortunes and illnesses of people in general for its success or prosperity. Places of confinement. such as jails, hospitals, asylums or orphanages: eight - the card of reckoning, lawsuits, truth-will-out situations, wills and goods the dead. Also psychic influences and abilities which are put to evil works; nine - the TROUBLE card of the deck! Trips or journeys which turn out badly, business failures, heartbreak and personal loss. The surrounding cards will indicate the source of the trouble: ten - this card shows trouble in career or job, dissention among co-workers, employees or employer. You can pinpoint the trouble by studying the adjacent cards; king - a man over thirty-five, with black or dark brown hair, dark or olive skin and black or brown eyes: queen - a woman, any age, of spade coloring; jack - a younger man of spade complexion.

So much for the individual card meanings. One must use great discretion in reading. I once wondered why their message was so often right. Now, I think I know.

Since each of us harbors a small segment of the universal soul, called the "oversoul" by Emerson, there is complete knowledge of all things in our unconcious, and as we shuffle the cards, with our thought concentrated on the problem or question, our subconscious arranges the sequence of the cards.

ARE SOME PEOPLE PSYCHIC?

ORTUNATELY FOR me, my ability to operate the Ouija board lasted for about only six months and then gradually faded away and has not returned, but I can still place my hand on the planchette and, by involuntary motion, spell out what I consciously dictate.

He was more that 90 years of age and proprietor of a quaint novelty store on Main Street - a store that often aroused my curiosity as I passed along the street. So, one day, seeing a Ouija board on display

in the window, I entered the store and after buying a few cheap jimcracks, asked; "What is that board with the printed alphabet? What is it for? What does it do?" Grinning broadly and hobbling over to the window where I was standing, he cracked: "That? Oh, that's an Ouija board, You place your hand on that heart-shaped thing and ask a funny question and it spells out a funny answer. That darn thing is more fun than a barrel of monkeys. Hawhaw-haw!" - jackass language. Feeling that I knew more about the matter than he did. I walked out. leaving the board behind while wondering about that "wisdom of old age" of which I had heard so much but had never met.

To him, like millions of others, all things have been cut and dried and polished to a shining surface, affording no reason for serious thought about the dark, deep mysteries of life that shout for attention from all around. At the very end of the line, his kind are content to settle for a funny (?) answer to a "funny" question: "What am I going to eat for dinner one year from today?" "You are going to eat a barrel of monkeys," an answer that, allegorically, could contain more truth than fun

And there are those who seek the truth for accomplishment of evil ends. I have in mind the actual case of the greedy housewife. Being an Ouija hound, she asked the board as to where she could get a lot of money and was told that a fortune in currency had been buried in her backvard. Upon telling the good news to her husband, he, like an obedient imbecile, dug up so much of the vard in futile search for the fortune. But Greedy Greta, still convinced that by use of the board she had access to a friendly ocular of wondrous knowledge, persisted in her quest and was reminded that her husband carried a large lifeinsurance policy which, when he died, would become her legal possession. Asked as to when her husband would die, the board told her to hasten his death with murder and assured her many times over, over and over, that, if she followed instructions, she could not possibly become suspected by the police. Carried away by deceptive visions

of wealth and grandeur, that foolish woman did follow instructions which were so clumsily conceived that the police were led directly to her door and placed her under arrest and then on trial for murder. It is from accounts of that trial published in the newspapers that I got the details.

That was a case of demonic intent over the board following the victim's set pattern of desire leading on to destruction, for that housewife not only wanted unearned money but, deep within, she desired the death of her husband and followed out the dictate: "I'll believe only what I want to believe."

Of the millions of Ouija boards that, over the years, have been sold to the populace of the world, it is with only mild curiosity that the average operator asks: "I wonder what makes it work?" Then following a few hilarious sessions of "funny" questions and answers, the boards are relegated to forgetfulness and to that populace, taken as a whole, no great harm has been done and, except for particular cases, no benefits gained, but to a comparatively few susceptible and unsuspecting victims who "monkey around" and in frivolity arouse evil triflers of darkness, those "funny answers" can be deeply suggestive and gradually develop potent forces that lead to disaster. As an example of one possible case: That old bromide may be asked: "When am I going to die?" and the answer: "Know that you are already half-dead" could, in subtle ways, lead to sickness and final death. The Ouija board is not a child's toy and should not be trifled with. It can be dangerous!

Having lost my ability to operate the board, my subsequent experiments with it were, of necessity, confined to watching and experimenting with others who could operate. There was that occasion when I was standing about ten feet distant from two women who were harvesting a bountiful crop of "funny answers" and, unknown to them, I concentrated upon the thought that what they were receiving be interrupted by unintelligible jargon, and it was not long before I was amused at seeing their expressions of surprise when the planchette spelled out mostly consonants. Upon my walking away, the planchette resumed the line of hogwash they had previously been getting. To me, that experiment seemed to be evidence that thought transference from others nearby can be a source of disturbance to those operating the board

I have never read that Professor Rhine of Duke University ever experimented for thought transference by means of an Ouija board. If he has, his experiments must have been conducted in great secrecy, but it seems to me that had he done so, results could possibly have

been more definite than those derived from the method of calculating away probabilities by means of guess cards. Of course, Ouijan experiments would have smacked the mysticism. They would not have been "scientific" and Professor Rhine would have become the laughing stock of his colleagues.

My experiments with the board did not really begin in a dynamic manner until I surprised a friend of mine (Dick F-) by discovering that he was a whiz at the board. He was a whiz and at that time was. as he still is in my memory of him, the mystery man of my life - a wizard man. After having witnessed his planchette spell out a lengthy rhymed account of adventures experienced by a participant in the campaign of Maximilian in Mexico, we decided to experiment and during his visits at my home which averaged, perhaps, about once every three weeks over a period of two years, some of his Ouijan messages were too involved with intangibles for either of us to understand. However, they were put on record and preserved over the vears and, at last, their mists of sublety have taken on more or less definite shapes.

It was quite some time before we realized that two opposing forces were operative over the board, one being evil and the other benevolent - one an enemy and the other a friend, each composing in the same style of delivery and always in flawless English. Naturally, before we had recognized the personalities of Dick's Dr. Jeykll and Mr. Hyde, we two innocents, fearful of missing something of great importance, heeded every word and every form of instruction received and we found that we were never told to do anything that we could not, at least, well begin, BUT -

Came time nearing midnight in late November of a damp chill when a halo encircled the moon and we, not yet having distinguished between Dick's good Dr. Jeykll and his evil Mr. Hyde, were told by Mr. Hyde to walk to the distant cemetery and toss a quantity of that devilish chemical, calcium sulphide, onto the seventh gravestone we would see and then walk along the bank of the canal where we would find something of great value which, when found as per instructions given, proved to be a small, stinking can retrieved from a heap of human dung. Upon taking the can home, unopened, and asking the board to describe its contents, we were told it contained a brown grease whereupon, opening the can and finding that such was the case, we were told to keep it for a future use - a future use that, so far as we ever saw, never developed.

And arrived another day of a night when we were told to walk to a point far out on the state highway where, in the semi-darkness of the

road, I was missed by no more than a foot by being hit by a car speeding about 70 miles an hour. But it was not for credulous me to doubt the lose faith in a mighty mystic power that had condescended to choose Dick and myself for special attention. What could be better evidence as a base for faith than the fact that I had not been hit? Loss of faith could be justified only if I had been hit and killed. "What fools these mortals be!

Finding things of "great value" lying on the sidewalk should prove to be an interesting and pleasant hobby so, one night, we were told that a walk around the reservoir while watching a halo that encircled the moon, would reveal a lone object of great value lying on the sidewalk. Following instructions, we walked the lengthy route to the reservoir and climbing the hill, we did watch that halo that encircled the moon and we did find that one and only object lying on the onehalf mile of circular sidewalk. It was a pine cone which, upon taking home, we were told to keep for a future use - a future use we never discovered.

But our hiking sprees were not all nocturnal for, one time, we were told that during the light of day, we should walk Litchfield Street in search for a gazing crystal lying on the sidewalk. So, hoofing it along into what I thought was the locality of that street, our squinting at

street signs failed to reveal our objective and upon asking a policeman, walking his beat, as to where that elusive Litchfield Street could have been misplaced, we found that he, too, was of dense ignorance. Finally, deciding that perhaps our sponsor was having a little innocent fun at our expense for which, of course, we readily pardoned him, we started for home, deciding that if ever use for a gazing crystal arose, it might be that if we humbly begged pardon of the board for our unfaithful and unjustified abandonment of post while on duty and then, as a further gesture of appeasement, we bought one of those crystal balls, all might be forgiven. That was our hope for, strangely, disturbing logic seemed to faintly suggest that if, in an uninterrupted search for the gazing crystal we should not be lucky, strict and faithful adherescence to duty might entail many years of ceaseless walking back and forth over the sidewalks of Litchfield which, even we might, in time, learn to consider as being a wee too much of a joke. You see, with only a little joking aside, we really did take the board seriously.

It was one of those bitter cold nights of winter with a chill, penetrating wind from the North when we weakly protested against a proposed walk of nearly three miles to the main line of the railraod, carrying with us, a 4-digit number

to match with a like number of a train that, so said the board, would pass while we were there. At this first show of rebellion, the board told us to stay home if we wished but that if we did, we would miss a wonderful revelation. In view of that, I started out with Dick who had lettered a small improvised board "for further instructions" and we trudged our freezing way to the railroad where, after waiting a long time and watching several trains pass by, each of which, to our shivering disappointment, was not of the sought number, Dick asked his little board: "What should we do now?" and was told: "Leave the tracks here and go home. "Pleased that we were not required to ripup the tracks and tote them home with us but could leave them lying where they were, we gladly started for home and the warm comfort of our easy chairs.

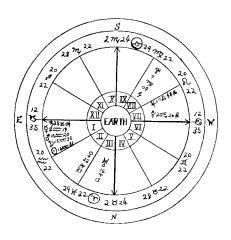

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THE CASE FOR ESPERANTO

HOW WONDERFUL IF EVERYONE ON EARTH COULD SPEAK THE SAME LANGUAGE!

In THE summer of 1887, some 77 years ago, a Russian occultist published a booklet entitled "Internacia Lingvo". Fearing at first that being associated with so utopian a scheme as an international language might damage his new practice, he used the pseudonym "Dr. Esperanto."

What was first a pseudonym soon became the name of the language itself. Now, the name Esperanto is almost another word for "international language".

Other international language projects, launched with much publicity, have come and gone like the rise and fall of a Fourth-of-July rocket, but what Dr. L. L. Zamenhof presented to the world almost four generations ago has actually evolved into a living language, spoken throughout the world.

The basic structure of the language and its fundamental vo-

cabulary were formulated by Dr. Zamenhof himself but, unlike other proposed international languages, it has had the further advantage of evolution through daily, everyday use. It is not the stale and lifeless product of "professional linguists," but the result of life itself.

Can a living language actually come into existence this way? Yes, if the experience of history is any indication. Hebrew has been dead as a living language for two thousand years, yet it is today the official language of the modern state of Israel.

Erse is currently being revived in modern Ireland.

Esperanto, spoken by thousands from the Siberian steppes to American college campuses, has the open-voweled lift of one of the Romance languages like Italian, Spanish, or Rumanian. Although

grammatically simple, 1 it is as fully expressive as any other modern language, and it already possesses a literature of its own.

Dozens of international organizations, ranging from religious to professional, exist throughout the world which use Esperanto as their sole official language. These are in addition to the organization, both national and international, which exist for the promulgation of Esperanto. ²

Esperanto is spoken in meetings of local Esperanto clubs. From time to time, Esperantousing organizations have their conventions at which Esperanto is the primary language. National Esperanto associations hold their yearly conventions.

The international organization, the Universala Esperanto-Asocio, has its headquarters in Rotterdam, Nederlands. It sponsors a yearly Universal Esperanto Congress in a different city of the world each year. The 1965 gathering was held in Tokyo, Japan.

Esperanto has already been adopted officially by at least one religious organization, Japan's

Oomoto Kyo. During the first part of the 1920's, Onisaburo Deguchi, co-founder and revelator of the Oomoto Kyo, learned the international language while briefly imprisoned by the totalitarian.

At his instigation, the Oomoto Kyo adopted Esperanto officially, and it has been largely instrumental in spreading Esperanto throughout Japan and southeast Asia.

The Oomoto Kyo publishes an Esperanto magazine circulated throughout the world. The magazine's editor, Tazuo Nakamura, is famed throughout the Esperanto-speaking world as an author and as an authority on Esperanto style and good usage.

What is the ultimate goal of the Esperanto movement? It is the creation of a world civilization based upon individual realization of the unity of humanity. As such, it has been both attacked and suppressed at various times by both Facist and Communist regimes.

How does one learn Esperanto? If one lives in a city where there is a local Esperanto club, there is always the chance of joining an instruction class. If one does not,

a person can always learn through books alone. This is the most common method, and the method by which all the original Esperantists of Dr. Zamenhof's time learned the language.

Isn't there the danger that Esperanto will degenerate into many different dialects?

There is no danger of that, since there are frequent international meetings and the exchange of language tapes. The pronunciation and accent of Esperanto is standard throughout the world, and it is the same in Tokyo or Peking as it is in London or Los Angeles.

Isn't Esperanto "Communist?" For some, anything of Russian

For some, anything of Russian origin is "Communist". Dr. Zamenhof, creator of Esperanto, lived and died (in 1917) a loyal subject of the Tsar. During the early 1930's, Soviet dictator Stalin suppressed both Esperanto clubs and the use of Esperanto throughout the U.S.S.R. Not until after his death (March, 1953) was Esperanto again allowed in the Soviet Union, although on a very limited basis.

Adolf Hitler suppressed Esperanto in Germany because he considered it as a threat to German nationalism, and because the language's creator had been Jewish. Today, Esperanto is represented in Germany by a new and younger generation.

For others, internationalism and cosmopolitanism are automa-



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tically suspect. Since this if for them a matter of pure faith, nothing really convincing to them can be said. It is merely another case of, "My mind is made up, don't confuse me with the facts."

Who controls the Esperanto movement?

No one controls the Esperanto movement, for it is represented by dozens of different organizations, all independent of each other. If anything, it is the Esperantists themselves, in much the same way that those speaking French control the French language. Each Esperantist is an independent entity.

Those speaking Esperanto form, in large measure, a single

community throughout the world, transcending national frontiers. Esperanto has been successful in many ways in bringing to fulfillment the prophetic statement of Baha'u'llah, Persian revelatorseer of the 19th century, "This earth is but one country, and mankind its citizens".

There is much international correspondence done in Esperanto, and marriages crossing purely national barriers are not infrequent. In many such cases, Esperanto automatically becomes the language of the home, and the tongue first learned by the children. Long ago, Esperanto ceased to be an "artificial language".

It is a language through which people meet, fall in love, and marry. Esperanto is the first language learned by many children from their parents. It practically is proved by its mere existence as a living language of everyday life.

Of course, there are still those (some in high academic circles) who insist upon the "artificial" nature of Esperanto, regardless of its demonstrated evolution during the past 77 years. Like the old Kansas farmer, seeing his first circus giraffe for the first time, they persist in their scepticism long beyond the point of common sense.

A young Swiss Esperantist once said sardonically of these skeptics, "Linguists of the world, unite! You have nothing to lose but your irregular verb forms.!"

Esperanto exists as a living language of today, but what of the future?

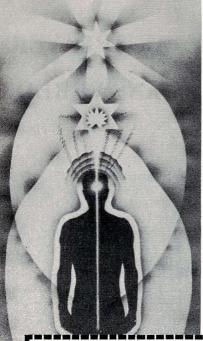
Since the end of World War II, uncounted thousands of a new generation have learned the international language, and are intent upon its spread. From Europe and the Americas, Esperanto has spread to Asia, where it has already won thousands of new adherents.

In Africa, where new nations are coming into being, the problem of language is becoming acute. In many quarters, Esperanto is being considered as a solution. European languages of the colonial past are considered as symbols of a descredited past, yet the traditional tribal languages are unsuitable for nations existing in the 20th century. Esperanto is a serious contender.

Esperantists throughout the world, on both sides of the Iron and Bamboo Curtains, are hoping that the United Nations will officially adopt Esperanto as the official medium of international understanding. But, regardless of what action the United Nations will take, the living fact of Esperanto shall continue to flourish.

When the first visitor from outer space sets foot on our planet's soil, it's likely that his first words will not be "Take me to your leader," but rather, "Chu vi parolas Esperanton?"

ARE PRAYERS ANSWERED?

Wered, and can I prove it? To whose satisfaction must I prove it? If I tell you "Yes, my prayers have been answered," and I truly believe it, how am I going to convince an unbeliever? How can I convince an atheist, such as that teenager, that answered prayer is not a figment of my imagination? All I can do is relate several instances of answered prayer in my life.

I'll pick a year during the depression for the first report on answered prayer, although it is not the first time a prayer of mine was answered. But for this prayer I have a witness, although he may not want to come forward. At the time of which I am going to tell we didn't have money, although we did have sufficient food on the shelf. There was an icebox in the apartment, but never any money to buy ice, so I decided that I would make

a treasure map for the refrigerator. Treasure mapping is putting your prayer on paper in order to keep it before you at all times, and thanking God for giving you what you are praying for, even when you yourself can't see any way for your prayer to be answered.

My son and I started looking in magazines for a picture of a refrigerator that would please me. I wanted a certain brand, but I couldn't find the brand I wanted. My son, who was eleven at the time, chose an illustration of a refrigerator in front of which stood a small boy in his bathrobe, and a shaggy dog beside him. They were raiding the refrigerator. It was not the brand I wanted, but my son said that he had always wanted to raid the ice-box, and the dog in the picture looked just like our dog, so why didn't I use that picture. Well, I did, and shortly after choosing the picture and putting it on the treasure map I saw an ad in the newspaper offering used refrigerators for sale for 50 dollars and up.

I didn't have 50 dollars. I did have fifty cents. Not enough to warrant any expectation of purchase on my part, but because I wanted a refrigerator so badly I decided to go and look at them even if I couldn't buy one. I had a feeling that my prayer was going to be answered, but I couldn't see how. I went and found the make of refrigerator that I wanted. I explained to the salesman that I didn't have a down payment with me, and wouldn't have until I heard from my husband who had gone to look for a job out of town.

The salesman told me that he couldn't give me credit without a down payment, and even if he could, he wouldn't sell me the model I wanted because it wasn't very good, it was too old a model. But he had another brand he would like to sell me when I could get the money, and he showed me another and much better refrigerator for the same price, 50 dollars. I wanted it and I wanted it much more than I had wanted my first choice.

Right there the miracle happened. The salesman asked for my address and asked if I would be home for delivery the next day. I reminded him that I wouldn't have any money for at least a couple of weeks and even so I might not

have the full price. He said he would trust me and so the refrigerator was delivered the next day.

That evening my son put on his robe and with the dog beside him he opened the refrigerator door to raid the icebox as he had always dreamed of doing. The scene looked so familiar that I was compelled to pull out the treasure map to see just what kind of refrigerator we had in the picture. You're right. The one we had been picturing in our minds through the treasure map was the one I had bought. That is prayer number one.

Another answered prayer was for my daughter. She had contracted tuberculosis and the doctors had told me that she would never leave the hospital alive. This time I knew that I needed someone to pray with me for her cure, so I wrote to Unity School for Christianity and asked them to pray with me for her cure. In time she left the hospital and came home, but she still continued under the doctor's care. That was in 1941, and hers is what the doctors call an arrested case. But she is no longer in a hospital and hasn't been for 23 years. Yes, she still lives; she is well and healthy.

Another answer? My Dad, at 83 fell and broke his hip. That in itself was bad, but to make matters worse he was suffering from pneumonia and in his delirium he got out of bed and slipped on a throw

rug, fell and broke the hip bone. He was operated on and a steel pin was used to hold the hip bone together. With the broken bone and the pneumonia the doctors told us that it would be a miracle if he pulled through.

At the time he was in St. Luke's Hospital in San Francisco, St. Luke's is an Episcopalian hospital and on the first floor they have a chapel for the use of anyone who may feel the need of prayer. You may know I felt the need, so I went in and sat in one of the pews and prayed. I thanked God for healing Dad and for his quick recovery, and then I waited for the answer to my prayer. I waited for the conviction that God had heard me and was healing Dad right now. All of a sudden the most wonderful feeling of peace and love seemed to envelop me and I knew that my prayer was answered. Within three days he was able to get up out of bed and sit in a wheelchair and in a short time he was moved to a convalescent home and from there he was sent to the home of his oldest son. He was able to walk with the assistance of a cane and continued to live until he was 93 years old.

Yes, I have had many prayers

answered. Some of my prayers were for healing, some for money and some were for the luxuries of life. But I want to state right here that when I prayed I believed that God would answer my prayer and because I believed, I thanked Him for the thing I prayed for. That is the way to answered prayer; believe and give thanks. And one other thing, until your prayer is answered, tell no one about it. The reason for this is that unbelievers often try to undermine your faith, and if your faith is weak the unbeliever tends to weaken it further. In prayer, belief is the foundation stone Jesus told his followers in John 14:14 "If ye shall ask anything in my name, I will do it." Elsewhere He has said; "According to your faith be it unto you." And in Matthew 21:22, "And all things, whatsoever ve shall ask in prayer, believing, ye shall receive."

If your prayers have not been answered to date, try believing that you will get an answer and I promise you the answer will come. In faith, 'seeing is believing' is not the thing; it is "Believing is seeing!".

My prayers have been answered, but how can I prove it?

1967 MONETARY CRISIS?

Dear Editor:

You might be interested in my own views. As you know, I am unobtrusive forces studying the that influence the destiny of mankind. I find many groups are also studying these elusive forces, but each for some specific and special reason, and so far as I know few are trying to get the overall picture I am after. My studies so far have tended to make me believe (subject to confirmation by further study) that our destiny is the interaction of numerous forces which act upon each other.

Now many of these forces have cycles, but contrary to popular opinion they do not have a measureable periodicity. That is they have sufficient consistency so as to measure a repetition of the same point on the cycle at a precise pre-

Here is another experiment you may be interested in: As you know, I have predicted a monetary crises

in the near future. I have said that the forces that would bring this to a crisis probably would be at their peak during the latter part of this year. I also said that it will make the 1929/1932 crisis look like a picnic by comparison. Here I might point out that I am referring to the magnitude of it. We will fall further because we are up higher. The percentage fall may not be any greater nor will we fall so low, but the magnitude of the collapse will be so great as to be beyond the average person's conception at the present time. Fortunately it is possible, (although not probable) that this won't happen.

The reason is that there are also in existence forces that would tend to prevent this happening. However, these favorable forces are very weak and the forces bringing on a crisis are very strong. The difference is so great that we have no problem of measurement as we do not have to split any hairs.

Here is the experiment: Among the astrologers you have confidence in, you might ask them to make a prediction as to whether or not they foresee a coming monetary crisis. If so, have them describe its nature and its timing. There isn't too much time left, as within a few months even the most poorly informed will be aware of it as the cracks that are now beginning to appear become so large that there will be no secret about it any long-

er. I haven't seen a paper since Saturday nor heard the radio, but up until then everything was looking all right to the masses that depend upon them to tell them what to think.

I hope the two experiments I have suggested will interest you. NAVIGATOR.

Here, another question comes to mind: Were the people of hundreds of years ago more advanced spiritually, than we are now? If so, how? It seems that man should become more advanced spiritually as time goes along, for his leisure time has definitely been increasing, therefore; he should have more time to try to become more spirit-

ually advanced should he not? Our civilization has, as a by-product, produced more sparetime for us to comtemplate in, consequently; it would'seem that our civilization is not a destroyer of spirituality, but on the contrary, it gives us a chance to become more spiritual; if only we will.

I totally agree with your definition of civilization as being spirituality, but is there a good spirituality and a bad spirituality? There must be, for there are certainly good and bad civilizations. • I doubt if the I.Q. is indicative of "spirituality". Also, I think educators today hold the value of I.O. tests in rather low esteem. They can be very misleading. You seem to speak of spiritual as being the opposite of corporeal. I am speaking of "spirituality" in the sense of our philosophic development. Jesus put it more simply by saying, "Love one another". During our stay on Earth (countless civilizations), we have progressed not one whit in that direction. We still fight savage wars, kill and torture one another. Maybe I even mean that lack of spirituality is simply lack of "growing up". The more "adult" a person gets, the more spiritual (or so he should, due solely to experience).

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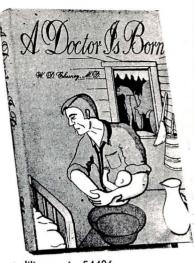

Then he added more technology and made himself a rifle. Tomorrow he will hunt with a laser beam. Each step upward in "civilization (technology)" has resulted in a step down (or at least no progress) in spirituality. The savage had to eat meat or starve. The "civilized" man, having no need for the meat, and having the rifle, would show advanced spirituality if he REFRAINED from performing the actual killing, being fully capable of demonstrating that he COULD have killed easily - and instead, had done his hunting with a camera (the photo would be as good a trophy as the actual head of the deer!).

We have advanced in our civilization to a point where we have so tremendous a technology that we can be as very "gods" in performance. But we simply are not sufficiently experienced in the business of living (and loving!) to be able to put this technology to any sort of "spiritual" use, only to materialistic and even savage use. How can we claim to believe in the spiritual principle of "do unto others as you would have done unto you' and then invent napalm and use it against human beings to consume them in fearful agony and terror? Would YOU like to be napalmed to death? Of course not. But you have no compunction to napalm any other human being to death. Thus, I say that your spirituality has not kept pace with your civilization-technology.

What do I think mankind is working toward in his race to get to space? He is simply learning the lessons of the corporeal. The moon is no different from Earth. IF man were keeping spiritual pace with his rocket science pace, he could go to that moon and be entirely consistent with his pri-

mary purpose of being placed on Earth in the first place. But if the moon (or Mars) were to be inhabited, and he landed there, he would war upon the inhabitants, and take his world from him by force, by sheer banditry and murder. If the Martians "resisted", we would "defend" ourselves, Especially if, because of over-population, we NEEDED this living room! We are not spiritually advanced enough to respect the rights of others! Then, when he gets his highpowered car, he will understand that it obeys the same laws of corporeality, and will DE-
