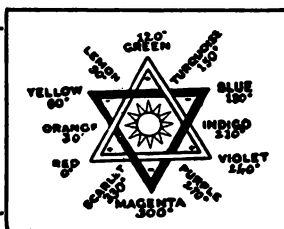

### A Memorable Convention

The Tenth Annual Convention of the American Association of Spectro-Chrome Therapists and the

Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists, was held on Friday, November 28, 1930, in the Adams Room, Hotel Tuller, Detroit, Michigan.

As the joint registration took some time, the assembling was delayed till 11:11 A. M., when the President, Colonel Dinshah P.

Ghadiali knocked the gavel; Members from different parts as Malaga New Jersey, Kenmore New York, San Francisco California, Dunkirk New York, Cleveland Ohio, Windsor Canada, Binghampton New York, answered the call and the meeting started with interest, as an over quorum was present.

The Secretary, Irene Grace Dinshah being absent owing to the close approach of childbirth, the President read the notice:

### First Day Morning Session

Donald N. Allen, Leona D. Burghardt, Bessie A. Hasenau, Isabelle Radcliffe and Oscar C. Keener were introduced as speakers; Dr. Oscar C. Keener, President of the Buffalo Optometric Society took the floor first.

He spoke with a smile of the Buffalo, New York, experiences of Dinshah and how when Dinshah was placed behind the bars there he looked like a "circus monkey"! (Laughter). There were many difficulties placed in his way in using Spectro-Chrome in his optometric work, but, as he worked under the direction of Dr. Welcome A. Hanor, a licensed Medical Doctor, he had no trouble. Spectro-Chrome worked by supplying the Chemical Elements lacking; it worked well. He had a personal experience in the case of his little boy who had 103° fever. He was loaned a Transport Spectro-Chrome of only 400 Watts. In a tonation of one hour, the rash of Measles broke out and the next morning the skin cleared. It was hard to believe!

A man burnt a leg to the bone in two spots. It was six weeks before he went to see Dr. Keener; the leg was then not healed. By the third tonation the Inflammation receded; eleven tonations formed healthy scab; soon the burnt spots were in perfect condition.

A young man was sent to him with a diagnosis of Tuberculosis; he wanted to go West, but a woman brought him to Dr. Keener. One month's tonation changed the outlook. He was no longer tired and sleepy and became a different boy.

Dr. Keener stated further that

the First Buffalo, New York, Center had a meeting on the 17th of the month; Donald N. Allen suggested there that a sanatorium conducted on Spectro-Chrome principles should be started. It was difficult to live and eat according to Spectro-Chrome teachings as common sense would dictate; however, Dr. Keener said, "I quit smoking"! (Applause).

The President explained the principles recommended in Spectro-Chrome system on the ground of the purity of the Human Aura and expressed his pleasure at the good sense exhibited by Dr. Keener in quitting the tobacco habit.

Isabelle Radcliffe spoke a few words of encouragement.

The First Day Morning Session was adjourned at noon.

### First Day Afternoon Session

The Members reassembled at 2:30 P. M. Donald N. Allen gave some of his experiences. He could not do much because of the Buffalo case against Dinshah. Asthma was cleared in two tonations.

His baby of 3 had Bronchial Pneumonia; stayed up all night; in the morning was not better; Dr. Keener had a Transport Spectro-Chrome and the baby was laid on the bed under the Turquoise At-tuned Color Wave. Returning at 1 P. M., he found her playing and breathing normally.

A case of a woman run over by a truck. She had an indentation in a leg with a small hole full of pus. Two weeks of Spectro-Chrome closed the hole and the pain was

all gone. She was happy; she was a woman of 60. He had no proper facilities for Spectro-Chrome service.

He reported a case of a woman of 60 suffering from Cancer, according to medical diagnosis. She was treated by Medical Doctors with Radium and had no operation. She took Spectro-Chrome and was getting along fairly well and would come through if she did not violate the Rational Food System. They could not see the advantage of the Dinshah Food System; he had to knock it into their heads! That was one reason why they felt the need of a sanatorium where the air might be right, the food correct and tonation might be received in the proper way.

A baby's case of 19 months of Eczema; the specialists could not do anything; they rubbed ointments; then the family heard of Spectro-Chrome. Children are generally afraid of lights, but, we put the Equipment and left. For several days he cried for "the light" and was lonesome without it. It was all a red mass of sores and raw like beefsteak; he had two pairs of mittens tied. In two weeks, everything returned to natural condition and there were no patches. At the end of three weeks, all cleared except the arms; he was digging in the arms, but Turquoise removed the trouble; the normalation was finally made with Lemon. Donald N. Allen looked at Spectro-Chrome from the service angle, the service it rendered to humanity.

Dr. Harry Meixner asked Allen how he knew that the woman had Cancer. Allen replied it was the diagnosis of the Medical Doctors;

he followed solely Spectro-Chrome methods on Areas 10 and 11.

Dr. Meixner said he was in Spectro-Chrome for two years. One case came with good Sinus trouble; in four months of tonation the trouble disappeared. In some cases, he had no results. In a case of a paralytic he could do nothing. Cases came out fairly well in two tonations in Eczema. Spectro-Chrome must be handled rightly.

In case of Constipation in a woman of 54; none could do anything, medicine could do nothing; he gave Orange an 8-9-10-11; he used the objective lens of his Graduate Spectro-Chrome for 15 minutes; it responded.

Dr. Edward D. King was then introduced. He said he was only a beginner in Spectro-Chrome; he had a variety of cases; recently, one or two were spectacular. There were three conditions in one sufferer; the woman was under his care two years; at 1:30 on a Saturday night there was an automobile accident; clipped a fender and teeth were knocked off. The room was cold in the police station; she developed a severe Broncho-Laryngeal trouble; she wanted irrigation; he gave it to her; he told her of Spectro-Chrome. She was given Green on Areas 1-2-3-4-5; also Turquoise; she sneezed only once; she called him at 4 in the afternoon; she was coughing less and was raising phlegm; before that she had a tight Cough; she was rocky on the Sunday, but, the following week was her menstrual time when she would have terrible headaches. Before, he had used on her several modalities; he would relieve her

in 3 days; she would have boring, lancinating pains; her build was well proportioned, vital and emotional; she was an executive of over 30 girls. He gave her 20 minutes of Green and the rest of the time 30 minutes of Scarlet. She had a Spiroscil of 18 and Kardoscil of 68 or 70. Magenta was given on 4 and 18. When she came next, her menstruation was normal and free she told him, one hour after she left the office. He gave her Green systemic, 35 minutes of Blue on 1 and Magenta on 18; she went smiling. That was 3 weeks ago. She called a week ago and said something terrible happened. She had a lump—a tumor in the breast; the diameter of the mass was  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches and it was 1 inch thick. He gave 1 hour of Indigo; she could touch its lower surface and the redness disappeared; soon the soreness disappeared, the lower part was gone and the upper not prominent enough to distort.

Dr. King had a case of green apple Cramps; relieved in 20 minutes.

One tonation knocked out an Acute Cold. Some cases were stickers; one woman was on the verge of a stroke; he detoxicated her by fruit juices for a week; her Blood Pressure was 200 to 240; she was a heavy meat eater; she said, "Ruby, I like that bright light;" her condition was blood poisoning. After 10 days, her Blood Pressure was 150; it was formerly so great that the Abdominal Aorta shook the whole body.

Alexander L. Spence next took the floor. He was a Customs Officer in Canada and his Spectro-Chrome experience was small. A window-washer in Windsor, Onta-

rio was burnt and was a mass of scars after 2 years; he thought of Grace Shirlow then, how she was normalated without complications.

Spence had a violent Headache one night; he took Blue and in 15 minutes went to sleep, with the Headache gone. Using Magenta on 4, he felt his own activity improved; he was getting results. His brother was using Spectro-Chrome on a boy whose face was cut, the teeth pushed in and who was swollen in appearance. The pain vanished; the boy wanted Spectro-Chrome to be applied. Spence was glad he got the Spectro-Chrome.

Leo A. Lefave said he had no opportunities in wide ranges yet, but had a spectacular thing happen one month ago. A terrific Headache came one afternoon; the head choked; he drank coffee though he should not have done so; 30 minutes of Turquoise and the head cleared; he felt as if born that day. He liked to get the success common to older Normalators; he spoke of his work with a boy having Tonsil Trouble.

Dr. George A. Smith reported many cases where he used Spectro-Chrome. Two weeks ago a man was burnt by a gasoline explosion; his neck was burnt 2 inches wide; they brought him to Dr. Smith from hearing lectures. Spectro-Chrome was used; in a few minutes the burning ceased and the pain subsided totally in 1 hour. The neck healed soon on one side. He feared there would be scars, but, there were no scars.

A man was hurt by a flywheel flying off from the shaft. The injured spot was inflamed and bare. one tonation removed the swel-

ling; he expects to go to work soon.

He found it to work quicker in acute cases. Arthritis responded to Spectro-Chrome. A woman had been doctoring 4 years and was feeling worse at the end of one month because she was eating white bread and the like. She was to the Ford Hospital and other places; she felt better after proper service with Spectro-Chrome.

A woman had Uterine Ulcer; pain subsided by Spectro-Chrome.

A woman had Sciatic Neuritis; she had a lump on a finger; the lump and swelling and pain all went under Spectro-Chrome.

A woman had a Goitre; she was normalated in a month.

A man had a hard stony Goitre; in a month it was gone.

Colds, as some spoke of before, disappeared amazingly. A woman at a party had Sore Throat; Turquoise cleared it.

A child, a few days ago, vomited for 48 hours; an hour of Orange stopped it and in two tonations, the child was well; it was sick from its infancy, but a few tonations with Spectro-Chrome started it building rightly.

It was surprising how the skin built by Spectro-Chrome. He spoke with emphasis about disorders of the Stomach; he had such trouble, for which he used unlimited medicine and chiropractic. He thought using Spectro-Chrome would be a waste of time, but, the Orange in 20 minutes took out the gas. The results of Spectro-

Chrome were remarkable; they could not have such success without Spectro-Chrome.

Dr. Oscar C. Keener asked the President about the Junction Period in the Occult Operation Of the Great Sympathetic Nervous System; Dinshah explained it.

From Dr. Simon Weissberg:

Greetings best wishes to our teacher and President Dr. Dinshah and all assembled. May all bars down policy make way for a bright dawn for Spectro-Chrome Metry. Let the spirit of service to mankind be the soul of this Convention. Though absent, am with you in spirit. Fraternally yours.

A letter of congratulation was

read from Lazar J. Krivokapitch; he regretted his absence.

Dinshah exhibited several "joke" Slides. They were favorably received, because, they portrayed some phase of human character.

The First Day Afternoon Session was adjourned at 5 P. M. for the Spectro-Chrome Banquet, which was served in the Ball Room at 6 P. M. It was prepared on strictly vegetarian principles and had no meat, fish, eggs, tea, coffee, tobacco or intoxicants. Many visiting ladies and gentlemen, members of the families of Spectro-Chrome Normalators and others were present. A few of the visitors grumbled because no smoking was allowed, but, the majority pronounced the banquet a success. Dinshah was greeted on his birthday. He thanked all for their friendship.

#### First Day Evening Session

The Evening Session being open to the public, the Adams Room was crowded from one end to the other. Among the Graduates of Spectro-Chrome Institute, there being many talented singers, the program provided entertainment with variety. Katherine L. Slagle sang "Mother Of Pearl" and "Be The Best Of Whatever You Are." This was followed by Agnes Patterson with "Love Comes Creeping Into My Heart" and "Oh, Lovely Night," with a duet, "Awake Dearest One," by Miss K. L. Slagle and Miss A. Patterson. Jean Theodore sang "Oddio dell Passoto" and Mr. Arnoni sang "Sleep In the Deep." Professor Paccini was at the piano-forte and gave excellent interpretation of the music. Dante Bor-

ton sang from La Traviata. Each singer was given voluminous applause and the appreciation of the audience was very effusive.

After Dr. Oscar C. Keener made a short speech, Bessie A. Hasenau of Cleveland, Ohio, reported the case of a girl who fell from a porch; she had no organic damage, but, she could not walk for 3 years; she had fallen face down and her right hand was helpless; she talked jerkily; Spectro-Chrome normalated her; at 10½ in age, she walked straight and her speech was good.

A man of 50 had High Blood Pressure; came with 170 and in 7 tonations was reduced to 152; he had Angina Pectoris, which also was remedied.

A case of Fibroid Tumor as big as two fists and another on top; Medical Doctors had promised her relief by Radium, but, the husband was against it. Mrs. Hasenau placed a Spectro-Chrome in the home. There were decided hemorrhages, but they stopped; slender fibres were passed out and the tumor gradually passed away. Since July, the sufferer did all her housework and though 7 months elapsed there was no recurrence. Bessie A. Hasenau emphasized that she used the Itisometer for all cases.

Jessie E. Ness spoke about the next class on "Occultism and Higher Life." She said in effect, "Dinshah brought the Science of Health to the Western World. The students wanted teachings; they never had such an offer; no teacher can teach the way Dinshah does. Ontology is the science of why and where; men and women want to know; come along and join

in this intellectual feast! Those who passed through his hands know how he chases the ego away. We are grateful; it is a course not to be surpassed. Sign up for it, as it will do his heart good; if you do not, you will be the loser."

A poem written by Thomas Ness to the 61st Class of 1930 in Spectro-Chrome Metry, was then recited by Dr. Frank L. Richards:

Congratulations members all,  
You have passed the final test,  
Ready now for Duty's call,  
Keen are you to do your best.

Just a warning from a friend,  
When to Normalate your ache,  
To the mind this message send,

The First Day Evening Session adjourned in a round of mirth and applause.

### Second Day Morning Session

The Second Day Morning Session opened at 10:15 A. M., on Saturday, November 29, 1930. Dinshah explained at length the Occult Operation of the Great Sympathetic Nervous System, in accordance with recognized astronomical phenomena, gravitational influences and the potency of Light.

Piro Murshida Rabia A. Martin, President of the Sufi Society said she was pleased at the thought of taking the Healing Triangle to California and invited Dinshah to take the work again to the Pacific Coast. Dinshah thanked her for her inspiring presence.

Isabelle Radcliffe spoke of a case of Stomach Ulcer in a woman who was to Buffalo, New York specialists. She came to Mrs. Radcliffe in the March of 1929. She had 2 or 3 tonations a week and had 6 weeks of tonation in all. An Equipment was placed in her home; she was normalated.

She tonated a number of sufferers and relieved them some way or other. An old woman had a Medical Doctor for a week; she was given Spectro-Chrome and she was up and around.

Rabia A. Martin desired to know about the Medulla Oblongata and the decussation of the fibres in its pyramids. Dinshah explained how

that affected the breathing process.

Recess was declared at noon.

### Second Day Afternoon Session

Activities were resumed at 2:30 P. M. Frances Renny asked about a woman of 35 having Shaking Palsy. Bessie A. Hasenau told her to irradiate with Violet; Harry Meixner spoke of Green Systemic Front and Back with Violet as needed; Oscar C. Keener supported the Green with Magenta on 4.

Leo A. Lefave asked, "How shall we correct the Constipation?"

Dinshah said, "By stopping the eating of junk." (Laughter).

Question after question was fired at the Originator about various disorders and complications. Oscar C. Keener asked about Diabetes; Frank J. Weiland questioned about Deafness; both were answered by the President by giving details customary in the Class.

Leo A. Lefave spoke of trouble in the Tonsils; it was 6 years old. After one month's tonation, hard putrid matter came out of the nose in chunks. Frank J. Weiland became over-stout 20 years ago. He had pneumonic trouble each year; Spectro-Chrome helped him materially.

Dinshah cited the case of a 13 year old girl of 210 pounds whom her mother called "my darling little baby doll"! She had Extract of the Pituitary Gland given by the Medical Doctors for about 2 years. She was practically a born moron and could not talk. Spectro-

Chrome started her on the proper track by Green Systemic and in a few months she began to talk back to her mother. Soon she went to school; then she menstrated and the last he heard from her mother was that she was keeping company with boys! Just a healthy, normal girl.

Alexander L. Spence reported of a woman with heart trouble; it was both organic and functional. Spectro-Chrome benefited her.

John H. Adams said he was not married, but, had Palpitation and Scary Dreams. (Laughter). Yes, but, they were gone after Spectro-Chrome.

The Minutes of the last year's (Ninth) Convention printed in the Spectro-Chrome of 1930, were presented and on motion of Bessie A. Hasenau seconded by Leona D. Burghardt were unanimously accepted as correct.

The Second Day Afternoon Session was adjourned at 5 P. M.

### Second Day Evening Session

The Second Day Evening Session was the culmination of the Convention. The President delivered an address and drew the attention of the members to the important fact that the existence of the American Association of Spectro-Chrome Therapists and the Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists was found to be unworkable and complicated as two distinct organizations and recommended the advisability of merging them under the name of Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists.

Moved by Dr Oscar C. Keener and seconded by Dr. Frank L. Richards that the two organizations be consolidated as Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists. Unanimously passed.

The following Resolutions were unanimously carried:

(a) Moved by Donald N. Allen and seconded by Jessie E. Ness that the Provisional Membership be abolished.

(b) Moved by Frances Hogan and seconded by Mary White that the Article 8 in the Constitution of the Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists be amended to read, "Fellows and Members shall extend aid and relief by Spectro-Chrome Metry, to affiliates of this Corporation or as otherwise provided in the By-Laws."

(c) Moved by Oscar C. Keener and seconded by Bessie A. Hasenau that the "All-Bars-Down" policy of Spectro-Chrome Institute be heartily endorsed.

(d) Moved by George A. Smith and seconded by Frank J. Weiland that the restriction regarding Members of the Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists using no other science for aid and relief than Spectro-Chrome Metry, be removed.

(e) Moved by John A. Adams and seconded by Frank J. Weiland that the Annual Fees and Dues of Members be reduced from \$12 to \$6 and partners and members of the same family domiciled or practicing Spectro-Chrome together pay half fees; further that the said reduction as already made by the Board of Trustees, be approved.

The above unanimous resolutions being passed, the Board of Trustees was authorized to take steps to put them into effect immediately.

Oscar A. Keener raised a point that the Collaborator Blanks be sold; Carl Engel said that more equipment must be sold. After long discussion, recommendation was made that the Collaborator Blanks for 10 Collaboratorships be sold for \$3. The President explained that Members were becoming disloyal to their pledges of not giving aid and relief except to Collaborators, because of the current rule of charging \$3 for each Collaboratorship and sending \$1 for fee to the Principal Office. He preferred to make no charge than to encourage dissatisfaction and probable dishonesty.

On motion of Jessie E. Ness and seconding of John H. Adams, Dinshah P. Ghadiali, Irene Grace Dinshah and Bessie A. Hasenau were re-elected as the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees being duly affirmed, they selected Dinshah P. Ghadiali as the President and Treasurer and Irene Grace Dinshah as the Secretary. The Board of Trustees then appointed Jessie E. Ness as the First Vice-President and Isabelle Radcliffe as the Second Vice-President. Both were promptly affirmed and installed by the President, thus completing the Council of Governors.

There being no unfinished work, the Tenth Annual Convention was dissolved in peace and harmony at 10:45 P. M.

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
