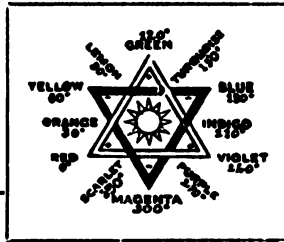

Twelfth Annual Convention

Welcome address by the Honorable Daniel Webster Hoan, Mayor of Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

New Cabinet Spectro -Chrome and Irradiator Exhibited.

A BRILLIANT OCCASION

The Twelfth Annual Convention of the Scientific Order of Spectro Chrome Metrists assembled in the Gold Room of Hotel Wisconsin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, on Saturday, November 26, 1932 at 8 P.M. Notices were originally sent out for the convention to begin on Monday the 28th, but the Mayor of Milwaukee informed our President Colonel Dinshah P. Ghadiali from Washington, D. C. that important business of the city would not permit him to be present on the 28th, so the day was changed to the 26th.

Because of the popularity of the mayor and the unusual character of the occasion, the Gold Room of the Hotel Wisconsin was packed by Spectro - Chrome Normalators, their families and friends.

Mayor Daniel Webster Hoan was escorted to the platform by President Dinshah who said, "It is a point as to whether the Honorable Mayor should give the Welcome Address first or whether the President should speak first as introducing Mr. Hoan to the Convention; however as to speak about him in his hometown would be like endeavoring to gild

gold, I prefer the worthy guest of the evening should have the floor."

As mayor Hoan rose with his gracious smile, the assembly received him with a vociferous applause. He said in his Welcoming Address, "Col. Dinshah and friends, it is not infrequent for me to welcome Conventions. Conventions in this city are very frequent. We have Medical Conventions and others; 160 to 270 conventions a year assemble in Milwaukee. It is a tribute to the people. Milwaukee has several good features; it has many more than other cities; we have good points in our splendid programs. We have a good fire department, health department and we have the lowest rates. We try to prevent crimes; we know that the juvenile ages during the idle hours start to think; 80 per cent of young people need occupation in idle hours; we therefore have a good program to provide for playgrounds. We opened the schools for training the young; they are efficiently managed. There are houses for recreation and night schools to teach anything one wants to learn. Outdoor athletics are provided. Our night schools have a larger program of activities than any city in America of pro rata population. We aim at preventing crime among the youth by keeping them busy. Automobiles have added to the burden of traffic, but I thought

50 traffic officers were plenty; they cost \$2,000 a year each and by our economical program we managed with the least number. I took issue against unnecessary increase. We have a well conducted police department; our burglary insurance rates are the lowest of any. All the result of preventive work. We have a bureau of School teachers who take care of the food program for the nutrition of the children; tons of bad food are destroyed; milk is carefully watched for its purity. There is yet a lot of room for improvements, but we are doing the best. There are Sunday School troubles in large cities. Hundreds of people have insufficient food. Cities do not take care of their people—but, I should not talk on many of these matters. The human family has been on the Earth millions of years; improvement has always been slow. Printing machines turning out 100,000 copies per hour, books and pamphlets and newspapers laid the foundation for progress. Free education solved a big problem. We accomplished much in a century of freedom. Human beings are controlled less by enacting laws; we must fit ourselves into natural conditions. Society as an organization is governed by laws, but we find the World is economically sick. It is passing a great economic crisis; it is a social crisis, like the birth pains of a great revolution. Just as we passed through the feudal stage which broke down, we are now passing a crisis. In spite of millions in grain

we had famine and people starved. They are throwing into the sea millions of pounds of coffee, burning crops—we are so ignorant. It is like a bedbug with small brain. Believe me we have to solve some problems. For different things, there are different kinds of doctors; the doctors let the light shine on some. Let Dinshah shed light on some problems! After listening to Colonel Dinshah, I have to leave tomorrow for a hearing in the Senate about the Canadian Waterways Treaty regarding St. Lawrence River. We hope to endorse it; I am the Chairman of the Great Lake Harbor Association; it is an important treaty. Colonel Dinshah, I welcome you and your friends to the city of Milwaukee. Each time Colonel Dinshah speaks he gives us something new. We are here more tolerant, more liberal; with such spirit, we solve our problems. I wish you success." (Applause.)

The Welcome Address of Mayor Hoan was listened to with attention and interest and the humor with which it was frequently interspersed was highly appreciated. In thanking the Mayor, President Dinshah said, "Milwaukee, through its mayor conferred on us great honor. It is the first time in our twelve years of experience that the Chief Executive Officer of a city welcomed us. Our best and most cordial thanks are due to the gentleman and to the city he represents.

When I came first to this city last spring, I was struck at the

scarcity of traffic policemen, yet, the traffic seemed to flow in a smooth and orderly manner. I agree with the Mayor in his views that prevention is better. Education is better than legislation. We have, in fact, too many laws; he has the right idea; what we need more is proper education.

There is an idea prevalent among the public that the policemen are there to harass us. I know having worked among them for nearly 2 years during the war-time, in the city of New York—that on the average, the police are the worst paid and the most loyal to their duties of any police officers. I am glad Milwaukee has good fire, police and health departments. They are all necessary and when well governed are conducive to welfare. The idea of training the youth is praiseworthy. The Mayor is to be congratulated for the wonderful showing in financial stability made by his city when larger ones are in imminent bankruptcy. The city is to be congratulated for having a mayor who through his ability, honesty and fearless character retained the chair over 18 years, against all opposition.

I thank you, Sir, and your wife for gracing our convention with your auspicious presence. We too believe firmly in prevention and assure you that we shall do our level best to offer what we have in the service of mankind. To serve best by Spectro-Chrome-In Every Home, since my last visit, I designed a new Spectro-Chrome

like a radio cabinet. Here it is.” (Dinshah removed the cover and exhibited the new Cabinet Spectro-Chrome and projected the powerful 1,000 Watt concentrated beam full in the face of the audience.)

Dinshah - To serve the sufferer more effectively, besides the external projection, I designed the “Irradiator” which utilizes the beam at the rear and charges water, milk, sugar or similar material with the Attuned Color Waves, used during the tonation at the end of which they are used internally as Irradiated Food. This Internal Spectro-Chrome is my latest humble contribution to suffering mankind and it will be a great help to the Normalators in accelerating the equilibration.

Among cheers, the meeting was adjourned to 10 A. M. of the following day; most all Graduates encircled the Cabinet Spectro-Chrome and watched it in action. Many questions were asked and answered. The Mayor and his wife Mrs. Agnes Hoan, stayed till the close.

Second Day Morning Session

At 10 A. M., Sunday, November 27, 1932, the President's gavel called the assembly to order. Jessie E. Ness, First Vice-President was on a seat on the platform. assisting the President in taking care of details; Marguerita W. Simon, the Secretary of Spectro-

Chrome Institute was in charge of the Register. The Convention was for the entire day open to the public, by registration of names and addresses. It was a gala day, all were in good humor and many flocked around the new Cabinet Spectro-Chrome whose beauty

and simplicity of design was given its share of admiration.

Scientific Order of Spectro-Chrome Metrists.

The President having spoken a few words of greeting to the visitors present, requested the Members to go ahead with their reports.

Verna Wentland- I have no equipment; a friend was sick; took 18 tonations; did not work. It relieved others.

On questioning it was found the trouble was of three years duration and the time was too short for favorable results.

Stanley Wentland- The man was paralyzed many years; he was 65; a \$30 Home Spectro-Chrome was used; however he got his money's value.

President- Well, when I marketed the Home Equipment, I distinctly stated that it was only for acute Disorders; yet the graduates, in some cases use it for Chronic Disorders and then grumble. Whose fault is it? It is not built for heavy duty.

Frank Mueller- I had some success. My sister woke me one night with pain in the Appendix. She said, "Get the Doctor." I gave her one hour Spectro-Chrome; the pain was gone. Four more tonations and she felt so much better, she went to a dance the next day. I gave her water and lemonade.

A gentleman had trouble in prostate. Took 8 tonations, felt better. Now 3 months, had 40 tonations. He had continued Ear Noises and Skin Disorder; all gone. It is good for minor cases also.

I had a woman's case; she would not use food rules; came 5 times in a week; her troubles were 65% gone in 3 months. but no results in Constipation. I feel I am in doubt as to how often I should tonate, how long, when and how. How do I know when to change the color? If I give one-half hour Systemic Front, 15 minutes Systemic Back and 15 minutes Yellow. is it proper? A lady had Rheumatism; shall I give local or Systemic?

President- If someone would not follow Rational Food System, you should not be blamed. The food builds the body and care must be taken not to eat "junk." It appears you are doing the same many others do. Do not try

to mix Attuned Color Waves in too many combinations at the same tonation. One complete tonation must begin at the Favor Time, go through the Junction Period and terminate not less than 16 min. after. That means 1 hour in all. The Auric Vehicle must be given time to alter its Oscillations. Infra-Green and Ultra-Green Attuned Color Waves should not be irradiated on the same Areas at the same tonation. Acute Disorders have a short and relatively serious course; they have one or more of the Four Signals of Inflammation, Rubor, Calor, Tumor, Dolor; Redness, Heat, Swelling, Pain; in Chronic Disorders, the troubles are old and the course is long drawn, the efforts of repair in the process of inflammation being spent or nigh exhausted. Always understand my friend, that there is really no Local Disorder; a disorder might start at a Local Area, but, its effects, its products, will be drawn into the entire system through the principle of Blood Circulation. All Disorders, therefore, must have a short or long Systemic Tonation to clear the aftermaths. Rheumatism, like many similar conditions, is not a prime disorder; it is merely the result of other conditions, in fact, a sign of such existence.

Herman Dietrich- A 68 year old man had a Kardoscil of 63; I did not take the Spiroscil. He went to Mayo Brothers for examination. The report was that "his Lungs had grown to his ribs." He had a High Blood Pressure; much pain; they gave X-Rays on Gall

Bladder. He came to me; I tonated him 8 days according to the Favorscope Chronos, with Lemon, changed to Orange, Systemic, I had him 3 weeks 4 or 5 times a day; gave Purple; Kardoscil came to 61 a minute; gave Scarlet; it went to 68. What of this case?

President- Your information is in your own question. The man had Lung Disorder; his Area 17 apparently did not function properly, yet, you "did not take the Spiroscil." You should not make the same mistake as the Medical Doctors; they take the Kardoscil and seldom the Spiroscil. The Pulse Beat without the Breathing Rate gives little information of value in our work. It is the 4 to 1 or 5 to 1 Ratio between the two that is the Index of Normalcy or otherwise. Without such full information, a consultation in our system is of little value. X-Rays on the Abdominal region are dangerous to the vital organs; read my editorial about it in the Spectro-Chrome of June 1922. The Medical Doctors use them without any regard to their dangers; they are Caustic and of no real value for healing. Give that man Magenta on 4, Green Systemic Front alternated with Magenta on 18 and Orange on 17 and he will be better. The food must be altered to our method. His Kardoscil of 68 fits his age.

Frances E. Tiley-I went on tour this Fall with my husband by automobile; on the way, we stopped at Malaga, New Jersey and saw Colonel Dinshah. Spectro Chrome

Institute is a big place, all just as he told us. It is a complete Scientific Laboratory; it is wonderful, has a well stocked library and the walls are lined with Diplomas and Certificates. We saw the first Cabinet Spectro-Chrome there and bought one right away. It certainly does the work. Our enthusiasm about the work after using the Equipment was so great that we came all the way from St. Louis, Missouri here to this convention. We came to learn more; St. Louis people enjoyed the Colonel's lectures.

The President spoke a few words of appreciation and said, "When Mrs. Tiley came to the Central Office, she told me she did not like to spoil the beautiful appearance of her husband's bedroom by placing in it a steel Systemic Equipment. I promptly took her upstairs into the Cabinet Shop and said, 'Well Madam, here is the Cabinet apparatus and you can paint it to suit your husband's handsome furniture!'" She gave me her order at once!"

Second Day Morning Session adjourned at 12:30 P. M.

Second Day Afternoon Session

The Convention reassembled at 2 P. M. The President was in the chair.

Greeta O. Peck—We came as far as anyone else, from Sandwich, Ontario in Canada. It was a sacrifice, all the greater because of the depression affecting the exchange; 17 per cent discount in dollars, but, we so fully be-

lied in Spectro-Chrome, we could not stay away. We attended the Class in Detroit last Summer and got an equipment. It has been in constant use since; it is now in my mother's home; it is not deprived of its use. I had my sister's case. Before Spectro-Chrome, she was operated for a very serious condition. Friends did not think she would pull through; but Spectro-Chrome soon changed her condition; today, she is a picture of health. It is a pleasure to hear the enthusiastic reports of the people. Medical Doctors who performed the operation had told her she was not good insurance; she should take "lots of light." She had a lump develop in her breast and they wanted to remove it. Dr. Bryant wanted to remove though it was smaller. My mother was in a collapse; she slumped. Sister went on vacation; came back six weeks later; she could not sleep. In 2 weeks of Spectro-Chrome she was a different woman. She comes in a street car; preserves health; she knows Junctions; she is enthused. My husband and I took tonations; the whole family is talking Spectro-Chrome; there is little opportunity for outsiders to say things. We had 2 or 3 remarkable cases. A friend had an infected wisdom tooth; my husband invited Ivy to come; she came at 8 with a bundled face swollen; could not wash lower jaw was just paralyzed. I gave her Turquoise; I leave our sufferers; each case goes to sleep. Her jaw opened in 20 minutes; after an hour, she told my sister

she would punch her face! Next day the Doctor could not understand what had happened; she gave a dramatic recital; he will get a surprise when he finds out. (Laughter)

A friend was suffering from Hives. She said the children looked at her; Dr. Bryant said there was no help. Three tonations were given. We said, "Janis, we have a light, if you like come." She came on Saturday; again on Sunday; it broke in 2 tonations; no fresh Hives came. These two girls—one with the infected tooth and sister, were two worthwhile cases. Colonel said the Vital Ratio should be 4 to 1; or 5 to 1; here was a Kardoscil of 61 and Spiroscil of 22, which was close to 3 to 1, another was 68 and 9, which was close to 8 - 1; both were teachers; they were fainting in school and taking a year's leave. I suggested "give me a chance." Orange on Front and Red on Back was irradiated. In 10 days, Kardoscil rose to 84, Spiroscil to 25; she has zest and pep. Sister was so delighted! She had Diphtheria, Scarlet Fever and Appendicitis when young; was poked full of serums. In 8 tonations, she now feels like new. Her Kardoscil is 82. No success about menstrual period. Before I married, I taught 1,000 children a day and was feeling the effects. Now, since I took Spectro-Chrome, the friends remarked, Mrs. Peck, you look better." Credit should be given to Spectro-Chrome.

President - Thank you Mrs. Peck; that Spiroscil of 9 with Ka-

rdoscil of 68 must be an error. The Menstrual Period will be impeded by defective circulation, as any function may. Always the Ratio must be duly watched for proper results.

Albert W. Peck- When Mr. Mueller spoke about threatened appendicitis, I made some notes. How about eating salt?

President- There is a movement on foot that eating salt makes for Cancer. Salt, as the chemically treated and devitalized material Sodium Chloride (Na Cl) is not good, but, the real salt of the ancients was not such. That was either Rock Salt, produced from the ground containing the percolated deposits of ages and full of various minerals useful for the body or was sea salt containing the evaporated solids of the sea, without any addition or subtraction. Realizing the need of such proper Salt as food, Spectro-Chrome Institute now has "Lavan" or All-Salt Sea-Salt which is genuine evaporated Sea Salt, ground in our Laboratory and packed. It costs only 25 cents for a large cartoon of about 1½ pounds and if you taste it, you will find it saltier than any salt you ever ate! Lavan contains all the Chlorides, Fluorides, Iodides and Sulphates that are normally in the sea and is beneficial for body nutrition.

Albert W. Peck - I want some of that salt. For years, I had a wonderful digestive track, but my Area 8 troubled me for 20 years I had much distress and spells of gas caused it. I used to carry on a

month with spells. Spectro-Chrome removed my distress. I also had a sort of Arthritis; an attack in the wrist; it is gone too. My sister-in-law had injury; it is remarkable how it healed; the scar is hardly visible.

Dr. Jaroslav Premysl- When Colonel Dinshah came last here, I attended his lectures. I had over \$6,000 of electrical treatment machines of all kinds. I had been fooled by others, so I doubted Spectro-Chrome, but I bought one. A case of Inflammatory Rheumatism came; it was a bad one. I gave Spectro-Chrome twice, it got rid of it. I had 4 cases of Tuberculosis. Many cases of Tonsillitis, three tonations and they were well. It removed Abdominal Obstructions. It worked well on so many people, I bought 4 Spectro-Chromes and an Itisometer. I paid \$1,740 to Colonel Dinshah. It is wonderful; I feel well. People like Spectro-Chrome. I have so many people coming to me I can't take care of all. I speak in favor of Spectro-Chrome.

President- That is very kind of you, Doctor Premysl, you need more Spectro-Chromes; we need more money! (Laughter)

Dr. Jaroslav Premysl- I have no space to put them in.

President- That is easy; move into larger quarters. You must have one of the New Cabinet models; all others you have. The Secretary will please book Dr. Premysl's order. (Laughter)

Premysl- I shall think it over.

President- There is no thinking to be done; I thought for you.

book his order, please, Miss Simon. (Laughter)

Jessie E. Ness from Detroit, Michigan was then introduced as the First Vice President. She spoke with enthusiasm.

Jessie E. Ness- I need more time than ever to speak about the merits of Spectro-Chrome. A lady came for a Spectro-Chrome on hire. Her Brindled Bull Dog had some trouble. The Veterinary Surgeon called it Double Pneumonia. It would not live, he said. She brought the dog to me; his temperature was high; it was breathing hard. I turned on the Spectro-Chrome; he gave a grateful look. He sneezed and long things came out. I gave him another tonation; the next day he was frolicing. We must have an animal Spectro-Chrome! I wrote to Colonel Dinshah; he told me the same Spectro-Chrome applies to animals as well.

I had great success in bad cases of Pyorrhoea. A lady was suffering from it. She was told her teeth should be removed; Spectro-Chrome normalated her and no teeth were extracted.

I had a case of Goitre; it was surprising how it came down.

A lady came screaming with pain; they had told her she had Gall Stones. She was given Spectro-Chrome. In three weeks she was right; she was delighted.

My second daughter, Deanne, works in a hospital. There are lots of Doctors and lots of talk. My children are trained to independence. She runs around and dances. She did not feel well; went

and got care in hospital; got worse in Doctor's care. Then she said, "I shall take Spectro-Chrome." In 3 tonations spots came out.

I hired a Spectro-Chrome to a man in a bad accident. X-Rays showed he had three large spots in the lungs. They gave him medicine; he took Spectro-Chrome and poured the medicine down the sink. A month ago, he had another X-Ray examination; there were no spots. Some Spectro-Chrome Normalators think it is not possible, but I know Spectro-Chrome works in and out of season. The Human Aura takes it. I am no man's fool. The body builds by Spectro-Chrome. I will not allow any one to speak against Spectro-Chrome. Some cases need longer tonations. I was saying in Detroit, "We lose all, but we shall not lose Spectro-Chrome." For the inventor of Spectro-Chrome? I shall not allow anyone to speak against him. A man like him to stand prison life? Beyond question is Spectro-Chrome.

Dr. James W. Lewis- I record the same way as Mrs. Jessie Ness, though my knowledge is in a different line. My work is exclusively in Dental Surgery. My wife was in poor health. We had quite some talk about Spectro-Chrome. It gave wonderful results. She had a heart with 95 to 100 beats and many more peculiar symptoms. She was usually tired. Now, after using Spectro-Chrome, her Heart is 78 and she sleeps well. There are many convincing arguments in favor of Spectro-Chrome. In many cases I had phenom-

enal results. In the extraction of teeth, where it is necessary to do certain dental work, in the past there was considerable after-pain. After feasible experiments, I found that I can prevent 100 per cent after-pain. I used Spectro-Chrome on hundreds of sufferers; I should like them all to testify. I took all of Mr. Unruh's teeth and used Indigo; it stopped the bleeding. I saw him here; his case was one in particular. I use Spectro-Chrome where people have Focal Infections. Some time, I use it for the Heart. We eliminate Poisons by it. I can say that Dental Work heals quicker when Spectro-Chrome is used.

The Second Day Afternoon Session was adjourned at 5 P. M.

Second Day Evening Session

The Second Day Evening Session was called to order at 8:19 P. M. owing to the crowd surrounding the New Cabinet Spectro-Chrome, asking questions to Dinshah like the volley of a machine gun. They received their answers with genial smiles as usual.

The question was asked from the visiting audience about our method of taking care of Diabetes Mellitus. The President asked whether the visitors wanted to hear about the medical humbugs in the name of Diabetes and the audience answering with vociferation, a lecture on the subject was given *ex tempore*.

President- Diabetes is not the name of the Disorders to which it is generally applied. All Disord-

ers in which Sugar passes in the Urine, are not all Diabetes Mellitus. To be true Diabetes, it is necessary that the Sugar eliminated must be Grape Sugar, otherwise called Dextrose, which must be thrown out of the body for weeks, months, even years and such excretion should increase after the ingestion of Carbohydrates. Any deviation from this formula, brands the Disorder as mere Glycosuria or Sweet Frontelim. It is said to be the result of Hyperglycemia, but a sensible study of the subject shows that it is not Hyperglycemia or Excess Sugar in Blood, but truly is a shortage of the Sugar or Hypoglycemia.

This way of looking at the Disorder is not novel to most students of Diabetes. They are taught of the passage of the Sugar; therefore, believe that as the Sugar went out in quantity, there must be so much in the blood! It is the contrary. Take an example: If a tank of water holding 100 gallons has a leak of 10 gallons every hour, in 10 hours the tank will be empty. However, while the emptying is progressing, if one pours in every hour 10 gallons, the tank will stay full while the repairing is proceeding.

A similar action goes on in the body. Carbohydrates, which are materials rich in Carbon and Hydrogen, like Starches, are converted into Sugar before being taken into the blood Stream. As Energy is demanded for work being done, the storehouse of this Sugar called Glycogen, is signaled to throw it into the Blood for

burning in the tissues. That storehouse is the liver—Area 7, which responds to the call with the disengagement of two Sugars, Dextrose and Levulose. Both these Sugars as well as a third one Galactose or Milk Sugar are known as Hexoses, because they have 6 Atoms of Carbon in their composition. They all have the same empirical chemical formula which is $C_6H_{12}O_6$, although the structural arrangement of the same Atoms in each one of those Molecules is different. Galactose is Milk Sugar, Dextrose is Grape Sugar, Levulose is Fruit Sugar but the last two have a peculiar property by which their difference is known.

As you well know, the Gyrotory Oscillations composing a beam of White light move in two different planes—Horizontal and Vertical. When they are separated by a Polarizer, one rotates the axis of the beam to the right, the other to the left. Crystals have singular properties in relation to light; Dextrose rotates the plane to the right, Levulose turns it to the left. It is the Grape Sugar or Dextrose that passes out, the Fruit Sugar or Levulose is mostly consumed for Energy by the tissues. Thus, on call the one part is used as energy while the other is wasted, truly speaking unabsorbed. Diabetes becomes simply a Disorder of Nutrition in which, although there is plenty of Sugar in the Blood, it cannot be utilized, hence if the sufferer be denied the feeding of all Carbohydrates — Starches and Sugar—he finally dies of no-

thing but Carbohydrate starvation.

The average Medical Doctor is woefully ignorant of Physics; he has little knowledge of light and its potency; he knows scarcely anything about Polarized Light. He has no idea of the extent to which we go for precision. In Blood, ordinarily there may be 1 part in 1,000 which may rise in Diabetes to 3 or 4 and in some cases to 7 or 10. The entire trouble is merely lack of Lymphatic Activation. Though bathed in Sugar-bearing rich fluids, the tissues are unable to utilize the potency and starve to death.

What do we do? We do not stop the ingestion of Carbohydrates or any Starches or Sugars. We stimulate the Lymphatic Activation by flooding the body with Yellow Systemic, both Front and Back and place the sufferer on our Vegetarian Rational Food System as in all other cases, without any restriction as to Starches or Sugars. We let him eat as much Brown Sugar or Raw Sugar as he likes and—he recovers! I do not care about how much Sugar passes out, all I care about is how much is utilized inside, till the sufferer gains equilibrium. Instead of feeding him as Medical Dietitians do on Meat, Fish, Eggs, Tea, Coffee, Wine and such other useless stuff, we shut down on all these, including the injection of that abominable humbug called Insulin and in all cases under our observation the sufferer recovers the Equilibrium of Basal Metabolism.

The remarks of the President about Diabetes gave rise to lively comments. At 10:50 P. M. the audience dispersed, well impressed with the value and accuracy of Spectro-Chrome in the so-called "incurable" ailments. The sessions open to the public were over and their aims for enlightenment were served.

Third Day Morning Session

The last day's work began at 10:15 A. M. Only Members or Provisional Members with current Affiliation Cards were admitted, no strangers being allowed. The President spoke about the Members adhering to the Collaborator System to avoid someone framing them by co-operation with the Medical Octopus.

Jessie E. Ness emphasized this by describing how a certain person tried to get her into saying certain things, but she compelled him to sign the Collaborator Blanks, after which he just disappeared. "I live by Spectro-Chrome," said she, "we must be cautious."

The President read a letter from our esteemed and beloved friend Surgeon Kate W. Baldwin, in which she breathed her loyalty. She said, "There are so many things I would like to tell you about Spectro-Chrome I would possibly weary you with even interesting reports; so will sum them all up by saying that Spectro-Chrome is the most worthwhile contribution ever given to the healing art. Get it! Use it! and be sure it will never disappoint you. Just the cases on my list at the

present time ought to be sufficient to convince any right minded person of its value. I would close my office tonight if I was obliged to give up Spectro-Chrome. Here are three cheers for Spectro-Chrome!!" The audience received Surgeon Kate Baldwin's letter with three cheers.

A telegram from Frank E. Kaufman, of Baltimore, Maryland was read: "My congratulations and best wishes for successful convention."

A letter from Dr. Grace Dodge Elwell, from Hollywood, California said, "Wish I could bridge the miles between us and be with you in person. My love to you in the work and blessing for your continued service in the welfare of suffering humanity."

A communication from Minnie F. Guenther, Marie Ida Smaltz, Howard N. Smaltz, read in part, from Cleveland, Ohio, "We are having good reports from the Spectro-Chrome operators and getting the Favorscope which is a great time-saver."

Bessie A. Hasenau, of Cleveland, Ohio, one of the Trustees, wrote, "This is the first time in ten years that I have been unable to attend the Spectro-Chrome Convention and I cannot express how greatly I regret my inability to be with you and our devoted co-workers this year. I have waited until tonight to write this letter thinking that it might yet be possible for me to come, but, such is not the case and so the only thing left to me is to write and tell you that I hope this will be

the best Convention we have ever had and to ask the blessing of the Benign Powers to rest upon you and guide you through this Convention and the coming year of Spectro-Chrome activity. May this birthday be the happiest and the most successful one you have yet enjoyed and may you live in this World many years yet to preach the gospel of Spectro-Chrome Metry, the one tangible solution of the physical miseries of mankind and the unmistakable proof of our relationship to an Almighty God and this is my endorsement after ten years' active service in Spectro-Chrome Metry. I am yet hoping to see the best of all Spectro-Chrome Conventions held in Cleveland, Ohio and may that one be our next."

Dr. Maude B. Crans sent report on Infantile Paralysis, where the hopeless case of Barbara de Bride was benefited by Spectro-Chrome. Dr. Crans after giving the history, states with deserved pleasure, "Today, Barbara is a gloriously beautiful baby. She has marvelously big brown eyes and is an adorable child, who will always attract attention. When she came two months back, she was a frail, sick, paralyzed, pathetic baby, beautiful and sweet then, but, one to whom pity went out. Now she gets around everywhere, climbs, has gotten upstairs alone, goes down with her hand braced on wall and the other held. . . . We expect in a few months to have every trace of the trouble gone." This case received much publicity; even Hospital Doctors

credited Dr. Crans.

Dr. Maud B. Crans reported also her own case, where various Medical Doctors advised an operation, saying it was "impossible" without it. She resisted the opinions, used Spectro-Chrome and here is what she says, "Either every diagnosis was incorrect or Spectro-Chrome did; and Spectro-Chrome did it."

Dr. Lettie Allen Ward, formerly of the Cooper Hospital, Camden, New Jersey wrote, "A little girl of 6 years was sent home from school as a Diphtheria Carrier, October 31. Child confined to one room, house quarantined. I have treated the throat and nose by all means possible for 3½ weeks with no results. Twelve days ago, I put my small light in the house and the child has slept under green for 12 successive nights from 9 P. M. to 7 A. M. I took another culture on Thursday the 17th and was called up on Friday A. M. the 18th by our Board of Health and told the child was negative. How about that for Spectro-Chrome?"

President—It will ever be so. No matter what we do, they never give us credit. Dr. Ward's Diphtheria case proves the value of Spectro-Chrome for so-called "infectious" troubles also. What human lives are sacrificed under the guise of the healing art! Yet they will not investigate Spectro-Chrome.

The election of Trustees being declared open for nomination, the same Board of Trustees was re-elected for 1933. The President

said that owing to the absence of Irene Grace Dinshah and Bessie A. Hasenau the appointment of the Council of Governors will be postponed till after the beginning of the year.

The Third Day Morning Session was adjourned at noon.

Third Day Afternoon Session

The President promptly opened the Third Day Afternoon Session at 2 P. M. He devoted part of it to giving the new students and members an idea of how Spectro-Chrome in over 12 years made its headway against severe oppositions from without and within, yet, all work in the Conventions was done by unanimous vote—a genuine tribute to the devotion of the Members. He enumerated the various quick changes he had to make in the policies of sale, lease, hire, finally letting **All Bars Down** to protect the interests of suffering mankind. He said further, "When I was last in this city, they told me that I should go to Missouri; if anyone could carry his message through Missouri and convince the Doubting Thomases there, all America was open for him. So I took the advice and went to St. Louis, Missouri. I did not find the people any different there; they looked the same, laughed the same and I had a class of over 80 students. There, I received invitation from the Missouri Institute Of Homeopathy for the State of Missouri, to speak at their Convention in Kansas City, Missouri. They chose the subject

of my address "Medical Liberty!" (Laughter). I went there and one of the Medical Doctors present delivered a speech on "Chromopathy." Then I was recommended by Dr. L. M. Ottofy, one of their members as the one man really qualified to speak upon Colors. They gave me the floor again and after hearing about Spectro-Chrome, expressed their desire to study the science. I returned to St. Louis, Missouri, conducted another class of over 120 students (all free of course) and went to Kansas City, Missouri. A class of about 80 studied there. Then I opened a class in Atlantic City, New Jersey and two in Vineland, New Jersey, but, everywhere though great enthusiasm was created, very few seemed to have escaped the depression in finance enough to purchase a Systemic Spectro-Chrome of \$150. The outlook for business appeared justly gloomy, because, it costs about \$1,000 to open a new Class in a new city in a new State and unless a few Equipments be placed, there would be heavy loss in each locality.

"On returning to the Central Office from Missouri, seeing the trend of the time, I decided that it was imperative to find some way to build an inexpensive yet efficient full power Equipment. Till then, our assembling was done in New York, where primarily the Central Office was located, but I was resolved upon cutting out the heavy expenses and middlemen's profits and do all the manufacturing ourselves.

"I had numerous machines for such manufacture lying idle and rusting since years. The gap in my life produced by my incarcerations needed to be refilled, so after long thinking and many wakeful nights, I designed a new model built like a Radio Cabinet, and exhibited that to a select number of our loyal Graduates, in Malaga, New Jersey, on Sunday, September 18, 1932. It was this Cabinet you see on the platform. It has double insulation of plasterboard and air, 1,000 Watt concentrated filament projection bulb and Shuffling Slide-Carrier, with the Slides fixed in to avoid accidental breakage. The apparatus is mounted on a special designed table with tilting arrangement. The material of the Cabinet is 3 ply wood and the whole forms an attractive and serviceable apparatus, which can grace any house by painting it to individual artistic taste. The price of this Spectro-Chrome, is purposely kept low to reach the home and I feel sure you will agree with me that it is a long step forward in selling it complete for \$65 only. with free tuition, free consultation or advice and no extra charge for taking the Examination when ready and getting the Diploma if passed! It certainly proved a move in the right direction.

"Then I took another step forward, knowing that the Irradiations of Light are capable of being utilized through the process of Reinforcement and Interfer-

ence by Etheric pick-up, a fact well investigated by Dr. Edwin D. Babbitt in the last century and amply corroborated by Professor Henry Steenbock of the University of Wisconsin in Madison, Wisconsin. Professor Steenbock recently irradiated milk in the form of a flowing sheet, passing before a battery of 12,000 Watt arc Lamps, evolving Ultra-Violet Rays and the effects of such irradiation were declared to be wonderful. I say the same about my new introduction, the Spectro-Chrome Irradiator. As you note, it is a small box with the 5 genuine Spectro-Chrome Slides, through which the Light radiated from the rear of the bulb of the Cabinet passes onto a set of phials which may be filled with either just ordinary water, milk or sugar, prior to beginning the regular tonation. As soon as the tonation is finished in one hour, the contents of the phials are ready for use. Use the three Primary Colors singly, by taking the contents of the Red, Green or Violet phials as indicated or making with the combinations of the Yellow or Blue, the desired Secondary or Tertiary Attuned Color Wave products, charged with the requisite potency, in accordance with the mathematics of Spectro-Chrome Metry. I used this so-called 'Internal' system for decades and produced startling results even without the Attuning Process of Spectro-Chrome; what then the results will be with the genuine Slides with the powerful bulb, you may conjecture.

"The one beauty of this new Irradiator is that it prepares the potency fresh all the time of tonation and each phial is just one draught. For domestic use, the method will be very valuable; for Spectro-Chrome purchasers who have the Systemic, the same Irradiator will be of similar service. It will be supplied so as to fit either the Cabinet or the Systemic model at the same price."

A Member—What is the price?

President—Fifteen Dollars complete. I also already designed an office model Irradiator, which will serve the purpose of a constant charging apparatus with Spectro-Chrome Attuned Color Waves; it has many original features, making it fool-proof. Thus, I perfected both the External and the Internal Spectro-Chrome and a larger scope of handling Chronic Disorders or distance service will result from their combination.

Several years ago, I made a Dentifrice and sold to students in our classes. Since then, owing to travel and expansion, I stopped making it; now because of the insistent demand for it from older students, I resumed its manufacture. Everything pertaining to Spectro-Chrome is now housed in one plant, where on a 23.23 acre estate we have our printing plant, cabinet shop, research laboratory and the administration offices, auditorium and resident quarters. Spectro-Chrome Institute is not a fly-by-night affair, where the headquarters are in the head of the President and the manufac-

turing is done elsewhere! There is an investment of about a quarter million dollars there in land, buildings, labor and machinery and it is only a beginning; watch us grow.

This steady growth of Spectro-Chrome Institute is not to be all credited to my labors. It is the result of the tireless efforts of my darling wife Irene Grace and the devoted and loyal services of the staff composing the assistants of the Institute. I do not hesitate to express to them my most cordial thanks.

Since the origination of Spectro-Chrome, one great drawback to the proper time for tonation was noticed by the Graduates. It was the determination of the Sunrise and Sunset periods and the Junction of the two chains of the Great Sympathetic Nervous System in conjunctive operation with the motions of the Sun, Moon and the Earth, in relation to the breathing process. For that reason, I invented the Sympathometer. It was a very intricate process, making the astronomical relation of the orbs to conform to the peculiar changes in human vitality. Building a clock system to suit all possible conditions, was not an easy job. Being born of a clockmaker's family, it was simpler to me than to another, but, difficulties of a commercial character beset my path. I made train after train of clocks until I reached the goal and thought I was ready for manufacture of the Sympathometer. I had barely

made my commercial contacts for it, when the clock company wound its business and another concern had to be sought. Barely had I started again, when the company consolidated with another and the new concern changed the train calculation, annulling my clock labors. Then the 1927 disaster came on me and I came out in 1929 March; by that time, the day of spring wound clocks was gone and Electrical Alternating Current synchronous timepieces were in vogue. I contacted after much inquiry a big clock concern, whose Electric Clock train suited my Sympathometer; then, they too changed their motor and I had to start anew. I reached the solution finally and soon the Electric Sympathometer may see the daylight.

Meanwhile, the Graduates clamored for the time of Sunrise. They could not realize the difficulties lying in my way. Were the Sun, Moon and Earth always moving in the same manner, the work might have been easier; but, the Earth moves on her axis at an inclination of 23 degrees and 27 minutes, hence, the various seasonal changes need accounting. Then again, the Moon rotating on her axis and around the Earth, is not constant in her time, because her orbit too is elliptical. The Earth in revolving around the Sun carries the Moon with her. Thus, numerous factors which might otherwise be left out, come into existence. The Moon moves around the Earth in 27 days, 7 hours, 43 minutes, 12

seconds, but in consequence of the Earth moving around the Sun in her orbit, this time is lengthened; it becomes on an average 29 days, 12 hours, 44 minutes, 3 seconds, from one New Moon to the next New Moon. Even this does not end the story. The Sun and Moon both regulate our vital processes, as I demonstrated so often experimentally in the Classes. The Earth butts into both, making more intricacies. The Sunrise and Sunset for different places is not only different according to their position North or South of the Equator, but, even in the same place it changes day to day and season by season. To supply a simple monthly Calendar that would without deep calculations be available to Spectro-Chrome Normalators in all parts of the World, was a problem. I thought I solved it one way, when some other difficulty leading to a potential complaint loomed on the horizon of research. Finally, after 12 years of silence, I began to deliver that service from October 1932; several people wrote me, "we counted our Favorscope according to your instructions; please, check on my work!" (Laughter) That was the very thing I aimed to obviate; the Favorscope added to my work.

Further thought showed a glimmer of simplicity. All the World over, the astronomical calculations are made from the Longitude or East to West positions of a locality from Greenwich, England. We gave the gate to England from here, but, we still use

the English foot, which was the measure of the actual foot of an English king Henry the Eighth, the Henry with his eight wives. So also the meridian of Greenwich, England. Our Almanacs are built around the Latitudes or North-South Locations of Boston, Massachusetts, New York, Washington, District of Columbia or Charleston, South Carolina, without regard to an American Standard of fixed decimal position and their calculations are subject to correction from the American Ephemeris and Nautical Almanac built around the Longitude of Greenwich, England. No student of Spectro-Chrome can be expected to learn as much as a ship captain, to tonate sufferers at the proper time. Therefore, I set my mind to find some real and final solution. I found it at last!

Our Central Office is situated very close to the Longitude of 75 degrees from Greenwich East. Thus our Eastern Standard Time is just about correct to within a few seconds, for Malaga, New Jersey. It occurred to me that if I standardized my astronomical calculations to a due Malaga, New Jersey time, it would be necessary to compute monthly only by Latitudinal variations and each locality where the Spectro-Chrome Normalator is needed on-ly information of what to add to or subtract from the stated time (Chronos). So I standardized the whole by the Spectro-Chrome Meridian and began to give the necessary variations to be added to or subtracted from in terms of a

Mean Time, which generally would be precise to the minute. The Favorscope Chronos gives the Spectro-Chrome Meridian Time, by adding to or subtracting from which the minutes indicated, the Sunrise and Sunset Time for your locality is easily attained. Where the Day of the Moon is unfavorable at Sunrise, the Initial Tonation Favor is attained by adding 1 Hour, 28 Minutes; then each subsequent Favor follows every 2 Hours and 56 Minutes. In the entire Favorscope, each computation is made to suit the practical needs, in regard to the sufferer's tonation and all Seconds, Fractions and Decimals are obviated. It works admirably and letters of commendation indicating the fulfilling of a great desideratum and the accurate results produced by its intelligent use, are on file; we hear every week from someone or another. I sincerely hope the members will comprehend what was done and feel that we are always doing our best to serve their interests. (Applause).

The Third Day Afternoon Session adjourned at 5 P. M.

FINAL SESSION

The Final Session of the Convention assembled at 8 P. M. The Gold Room was well filled by the Members and the Provisional Members. Long distance Members from New Jersey, Missouri, Michigan, Canada, Illinois, Indiana, were still at their posts.

The President announced that the 83rd Class in Spectro-Chrome Metry would commence from Monday, December 5, 1932, at 7 P. M. in the Colonial Room, Hotel Wisconsin, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. No fee or admission charge was to be made. The tuition of 10 nights was as before, free. Repeating students or students who took the free work before were not to be admitted, for lack of space; only 150 new students could be accommodated. Many desired to repeat, but, were told the rule applied to all. They would serve better by sending new students; minors under 21 years of age, would be admitted by getting the consent and approval of their parents on the Application for Enrollment. The admission was by Reserved Tickets, numbered and dated; they were issued to the accepted applicants only and were not transferable; the students were bound to take the full course; absence on more than a single night acted as a cancellation of the studentship.

After various small items of less general interest were discussed, the President stated that if sufficient Members would join in 1933, he would resume the publication of the official monthly Spectro-Chrome. This called forth an outburst of cheer.

At 10:30 P. M., the Convention was dissolved amidst hearty greetings and cordial wishes for success of the next Class. All went satisfied, the twelfth Annual Convention was memorable indeed.

MAKING MORE MONKEYS

In 1926, Serge Voronoff, a Medical Doctor known as the champion of Gland Therapy (for the rejuvenation of worn out old fogies by inserting in their body interstitial monkey glands so they may make more monkey shines), made some wonderful experiments in biology, by injecting human semen into the body of a female chimpanzee. The French and Belgian Governments considered these experiments so necessary and marvelously useful, that they subsidized them. Newspapers rattled gleefully about the expected results and the whole World was set agog about the benefits to accrue—when without warning the chimpanzee “woman” died.

I had my suspicions about what was actually done and believed that no injections were made but actual contacts were produced. A similar report now trickles from Atlantic City, New Jersey, through the 91st Convention of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. There, Dr. Howell S. England of the Michigan Academy of Science, Arts and Letters revealed that he knew Dr. Elie Ivanoff of Moscow was making much progress in that line of work on nine female chimpanzees and expected to marry the products to actual men and women in a few years. The idea is to produce more powerful “working men.”

Poor working men! They are unemployed enough now; what

will happen when instead of machinery which needs some men, actual ape-men will do their work, is hard to say.

Spectro-Chrome is steadily ousting the Medical Doctors; the above is a new occupation for them.

- Instruction 3—Refer to Initial Sunrise Favor column for further correction; if none, the Correct Sunrise Time will be the First Day Favor for beginning Tonation; otherwise, add the indicated 1 Hour 28 Minutes for the First Day Favor to begin Tonation.
- Instruction 4—Thereafter, subsequent Favors to begin Tonation follow at every 2 Hours 56 Minutes.
- Instruction 5—When the Concluding Day Favor overlaps into the Sunset period, omit Tonation during that Favor.

TO FIND NIGHT FAVORS FOR TONATION

- Instruction 6—Take column marked “Sunset” for the desired Date, in the Chronos.
- Instruction 7—Add to or subtract from the Chronos, the number of Minutes indicated in the Sunset Correction column of your locality; the result will be the Correct Sunset in your Local Standard Time.
- Instruction 8—Refer to Initial Sunset Favor column for further correction; if none, the Correct Sunset Time will be the First Night Favor for beginning Tonation; otherwise, add the indicated 1 Hour 28 Minutes for the First Night Favor to begin Tonation.
- Instruction 9—Thereafter, subsequent Favors to begin Tonation follow at every 2 Hours 56 Minutes.
- Instruction 10—When the Concluding Night Favor overlaps into the Sunrise period, omit Tonation during that Favor.

TO FIND JUNCTIONS

- Instruction 11—A Junction of the Occult Operation Of The Great Sympathetic Nervous System, occurs 44 Minutes after each Favor Time; a Junction must be included within a Tonation period.

COMPLETE TONATION

- Instruction 12—A Complete Tonation must begin at a Favor Time, include a Junction and terminate in not less than 16 Minutes after a Junction, but, may exceed it.

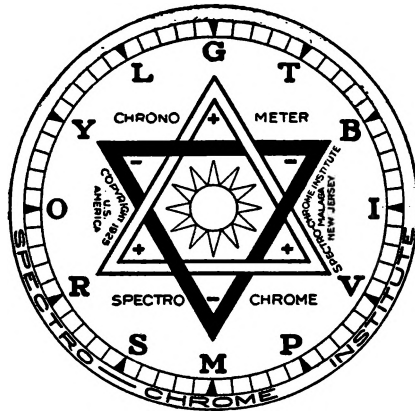
PRECISION

Seconds, Fractions and Decimals are omitted purposely in the foregoing computations, but they are all precise to the Minute for Spectro-Chrome Tonation.

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FAVORSCOPE TIME



In Sympathometry, the Time of Day or Night is reckoned in Spectro-Chrome terms. The Time is called CHRONOS, the Hour is represented by the initial of the Attuned Color Wave at the indicated position, the Minutes are designated in figures, the A. M. as White Triangle is shown by White, the P. M. as Black Triangle is marked by Black. The Months begin at Red for January and go around clockwise.
