Tolerance is the vision that enables us to see things from another person's point of view. It is the generosity that concedes to others the right to their own opinions and their own peculiarities.

THE SPIRITUAL MOVEMENT.

The spiritual movement analyzed and boiled down, not only in New England but throughout the United States, will not amount to a world power in the religious field until we, as an aggregate body, can slough off the decayed body politics, such as backbiters, slanderers, and those Scribes and Pharisees and hypocrites who write righteousness upon the hem of their garments, have a part of Godliness, but deny the power of the spirit thereof. They preach the doctrine that they are looking for justice, when in fact they should be looking for mercy. If they had equal and exact justice meted out to them they would be in the penitentiary or on the gallows. Also that they want freedom. It is not freedom they want, but license to do just as they please, and slavery for the other fellow. Freedom is for the non-evasive individual. I am all right myself. but we need a policeman for the other fellow. Well if they do not need a policeman for themselves they do not need one for the other fellow. Spiritualism is not only a religion, but it is an exact science; that being so, it is a scientific religion. Therefore, every cause brings its own corresponding effect. Our premises being correct, our conclusions will be right.

In the past we have sent out, as everyone knows, the thought vibrations that our mediums are practitioners of Legerdemain, which has surrounded them with a positive opposing vibration, shutting out to a large extent all free and uplifting truths from unseen realms. This interference in the spiritual vibrations, comes from within the ranks of Spiritualism and not from without. Can we by any known natural law, send out hatred and get in return—love? Can we by

any known physical or spiritual law put out the light with darkness? Or would we rather turn on the light and dispel the darkness? Movement, like an individual, is saved by the faith possessed that the right thing will be done. The great Spiritual Teacher, Jesus, 2,000 years ago said in the twenty-third chapter of Matthew: "But he that is greatest among you shall be your servant and whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abused; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted." The spiritual movement in New England has been based upon the man system of power of material force to make all spiritual manifestations square with their materialistic conception of things, regardlesss of the voice from the great spiritual organizations, or from the spirit side of life. "The mills of the god's grind slow, but they grind exceedingly fine.' Some of these days, when the great Spiritual Powers that have this earth in charge, are ready to raise the earthly vibration high enough to reach the heavenly spheres, some of these earthly organizations will be thrown into outer darkness, where there shall be no weeping and gnashing of teeth. To reason correctly we must reason from spirit out—out into gross matter, and not from gross matter out—out into spirit. When our spiritual organizations are based on the solid foundation of seeing the good in everything, we shall draw to us the whole religious world. Like the Man of Galilee when walking through the streets of Jerusalem, seeing a dog in the last stages of decay, His disciples turned in disgust, commenting upon the nauseating nature of the sight; but Jesus looked at the dead body and said: "Pearls are not whiter than its teeth."

In closing, would state that constructive criticism which points out defects and the means of remedying them is the basis of progress; but destructive critcism which vandalistically demolishes good and bad alike without aiming at any higher attainment, is an ulcer on the character of the organization, and must be eradicated. Gossip and idle talebearing are clogs and hindrances. While it is not required that we shall say black is white and overlook manifestly wrong conduct, criticism should be made for the purpose of helping, not to wantonly besmirch the character of a fellow being because we have found a stain. Remembering the parable of the mote and the beam, we should turn our most unsparing criticism towards ourselves. No one is so perfect that there is no room for improvement. The more blameless the man or organization, the less prone they are to find fault, and cast the first stone at another. If we point faults and suggest ways for improvement, it must be done without personal feeling. We must always seek the good which is hidden in everything. The cultivation of this attitude of discriminaton is partciularly important.

We would do well as Spiritualists to adopt Mr. Lisemer's prayer for our very own, and to live as it expresses desire to do.

Sorrow for wrongdoing is the very first step toward reform, and is, in itself a form of prayer, and prayer is answered (by) in accordance with

our desires, as expressed in practice.

No Spiritualist would commit murder as the means of ridding himself of an adversary or opponent; murder is neither the end, nor the means to an end; it is but the BEGINNING. It is only a poor, ignorant fool who resorts to the gun, the knife, the bottle of poison, or to the brutality of his own hands to force another spirit out of its body; he becomes like Hercules writhing in the embrace of the Nessus shirt that he has put on, rending his own flesh in an attempt to escape its poisonous web.

The murdered one feels that he has been outraged, and generally has his fancied revenge by making life miserable for the killer—except in a case where the Spirit is very far advanced; in that case, he will have no enmity, and in many cases will try
