

## Norman Baker's Page



FOR years the champion sheep herder could be found on the mountainsides of Bohemia, but the honor has been snatched from him and is now held by progressive Americans.

There are two kinds of sheep—one the animal that walks on four legs and grazes on grass, but with wool all over his back and with eyes wide open—the other a human being that walks on two legs, devours whatever manufacturers advertise, reads only what the “kept” press permits and allows others to control the gray matter in his bony skull. This kind grows wool over his eyes rather than on his back.

The champion sheep herders in America and other countries are the fellows who control the herd best and mold it to their own way of thinking. We will refer to two conditions that illustrate this—one, the work of the scheming, conniving, selfish textbook publisher, who snatches the almighty dollar from the parents by influencing state officials, school teacher associations and local school directors to buy textbooks that are different from those used in the adjoining county. This means that when parents purchase sets of schoolbooks and move to other counties they find the schools use different school books, thus requiring the purchase of new books. It is a beautiful graft and many state officials, school teachers, school board directors, and executives of school teachers' associations are connected with it, and all are afraid to protest for fear of losing their positions.

The parents sit at home like sheep and vote for members of the schoolboards and state legislatures without raising their voices to demand their rights or save themselves money by bringing about uniform school books. So strongly are the publishers of textbooks supported by officials, teachers and school superintendents that a strong influence is exerted on the press which in turn dares not publish articles or editorials in behalf of uniform school books.

Every voter should force into the platform of every office seeker a plank favoring uniform textbooks. Uniform school books should extend beyond the state lines. Not only should every county in each state use the same textbooks, but this condition should be uniform throughout the entire country because two times two equals four whether it is in California, Maine, Texas or Canada or in any other civilized country. It is obvious that if uniform school books were realized there would be fewer millionaires in the world. For this reason every dollar many millionaires possess will be spent to prevent uniform school books.

I often wonder when the public will awaken to this perpetual graft and demand its rights. I don't believe such a thing will materialize for many years because the public, like the sheep on the mountainsides in Bohemia, is easily diverted from any effort it makes in its own behalf by the “crack of the whip” of the herder.

The other case of successful sheep herding is that done by the medical trust, which through control of the press has forced the belief on the public that vaccination is essential to health; that vaccination should be compulsory, and that unless we hearken to this advice, we may expect a terrible epidemic. Many times a year smallpox, scarlet fever and other epidemic scares are created by

the medical profession through their leaders, the health officials, and through their mouthpiece, the local “kept” press. If every child in the world should be vaccinated it would mean many millions of dollars in the pockets of members of the medical trust. In order to secure these dollars a careful plan has been perfected which reaches like a spider's web over every home. The serum manufacturers, in “cahoots” with the medical trust, also come in for their share. Today we have so many serums that it makes the average physician's head ache to find the proper one for a given purpose. A spokesman of a famous clinic recently stated that he attributed dozens of new diseases to the eating of meats from animals which had been pumped full of serum and poison pus.

The average physician knows that he cannot positively tell chickenpox from smallpox unless eruptions are present. It is amusing to note the thing that influences them most in diagnosing chickenpox from smallpox. They first ask if the child has been vaccinated for smallpox. If told “yes,” they then call it chickenpox. If the child has not been vaccinated, they call it smallpox, because the almighty dollar is in sight for vaccination. The doctor quarantines such cases as smallpox knowing in his own heart he is not sure of his diagnosis, and the local paper screams in black headlines: **SMALLPOX IN CITY; PHYSICIANS FIGHTING TO KEEP SCHOOLS OPEN.** The physician then goes to the school board, principals and teachers and throws the fear of God into their hearts. These sheep hearken to the crack of the whip as snapped by the health physician, the city officials, and the school nurse, who is a functionary we did not have in city schools years ago when children were more healthy. These start the propaganda going full force. The parents are advised by a written or printed notice that their child must be vaccinated before it can go to school. Often this notice is cleverly written to intimate to the parent that the child can never go to school unless it is vaccinated.

As an example of one of these notices we offer the following which was crudely mimeographed on a sheet of white paper and sent to the parents by the principal of a school at Moline, Illinois:

“As several cases of smallpox have broken out in the McKinley School, an order has been issued by the health authorities that every child must be vaccinated by Thursday or produce a certificate showing that he has been vaccinated within the last five years.

“No child is to be allowed to enter school Thursday morning without a vaccination certificate.”

The average parent is intimidated by this threat. However, only several states in the United States have compulsory vaccination, and all the health physicians or school authorities can do is to keep the child out of school for a certain number of days which often saves it from being poisoned by pus from the belly of a sick calf, which may result in syphilis in years to come.

## Cunning Work of the Power Trust

A little incident at Red Wing, Minnesota, startlingly illustrates the manner in which the power trust is circumventing the people, controlling the government and marching to complete monopoly power.

In Red Wing is a progressive publication called *The Organized Farmer*. Not far from Red Wing at Hastings on the Mississippi river the government is erecting a navigation dam. In December, 1928, *The Organized Farmer* began a campaign to have Red Wing secure the power that would be generated at this dam. The plan was to have the city develop this power and sell it to the people and business firms of Red Wing and the farmers and communities of the surrounding country at practically the cost of the service. Thus would have been established an immense public service owned by the people that would have been of incalculable benefit to the people of a large section of Minnesota.

The *Organized Farmer* was soon successful in enlisting the aid of the Red Wing City Council and business interests. Application was duly made to develop this power for the people to the Federal Power Commission in Washington, D. C. Right at this point the trust got busy and it is interesting to note how it works. It approached the manufacturers of Red Wing and offered to reduce the price of power to them 33 per cent if they would oppose the development of the publicly owned power project. These manufacturers who had been mercilessly exploited by the power trust's exorbitant prices fell for this cheap bribe and turned against a project they had formerly supported.

The city council, the big majority of the people of Red Wing and the farmers still stood solidly for the municipal development of the public power project. The next thing for the trust to do was to split and demoralize these ranks. The two Red Wing daily papers, as is usually the case, were quickly enlisted on the side of the trust against the people. The next thing was to win over the city council against the people. One of the aldermen was given a position under the trust and thereafter voted against the municipal project. Later, another alderman switched his vote. It was discovered later that his daughter had been given a lucrative position with the Northern States Power company in Minneapolis. This gave the trust control of the Red Wing dailies, the manufacturers and the majority of the city council.

This breaking up of the local ranks favoring the project by indirect bribery, use of influence, intimidation and under-cover work paved the way for the Federal Power Commission to gracefully reject the Red Wing petition which had been before that body for some time. In doing this, the Power Commission violated the spirit and intention of the Water Power Act, which explicitly states that municipalities shall have first consideration in the utilization of power from government navigation projects, and revealed the Commissioners' partiality toward the power trust. That the Federal Power Commission should lend itself to this smashing of a public project need surprise no one. The trust's methods of winning the members of various federal bodies by pre-

paring comfortable berths for them after their term of public office expires is well known. Mr. Bonner, chairman of the Federal Power Commission, is said formerly to have been the candidate of the Pacific Coast Electric Company for office in California. Mr. Finney, formerly associated with Albert Fall of Teapot Dome infamy, was appointed by the Hoover administration to render legal interpretations for the Power Commission. He has just performed a priceless service for the power trust by declaring that the Water Power Act will not be violated if the proposal of Secretary Wilbur is carried out to give 25 per cent of the power generated at Boulder dam to the Edison Electric Company of Southern California, instead of to the municipality of Los Angeles, which has asked for all of it.

The fact that the daily papers and manufacturers and a majority of the city council at Red Wing finally turned against the proposition furnishes a poor alibi for the action of the Federal Commission in rejecting the application. The people and especially the farmers still demanded it. Public welfare clearly demanded it. The Water Power Act demanded it. Simple democracy demanded it. Against all these overwhelming public obligations the Federal Power Commission turned and rendered a decision that leaves the people at the mercy of trust extortion, trust tyranny and trust corruption. This is just another proof that our government is controlled by the trusts and is being used traitorously, treacherously and crookedly against the people, against the public and against democracy.

This causes further declines in employment. **THIS VICIOUS CIRCLE HAS**

## NO ENDING EXCEPT IN THE REMOVAL OF THE MONOPOLY SYSTEM.

Unemployment will continue to increase with the increasing use of machinery and trust economy. The desperate plight of the growing hosts of the unemployed ready to work almost for nothing to save themselves will finally break down the comparatively good wages in America.

Every step in the trustification of business brings us nearer an alarming crisis. The only remedy for this condition is for the people to assume democratic control of big business. With the people in control, output, wages and purchasing power can be expanded and allocated in a way to make all prosperous instead of a few enormously rich.

## Prohibition on Trial

Several recent events have brought the prohibition issue to the front in a more forcible and direct manner than ever before.

President Hoover's Crime Commission has made a preliminary report in which it recommends that the national prohibition law be immediately strengthened in the interest of promoting observance of and respect for all law.

Acting on the suggestions of this Commission, President Hoover in a special message to Congress has urged reorganization of the federal court structure so as to give relief from congestion; concentration of responsibility in detection and prosecution of prohibition violations; consolidation of the various agencies engaged in prevention of smuggling of liquor, narcotics and other merchandise, and aliens over our frontiers; provision of adequate court and prosecuting officials; expansion of federal prisons and reorganization of parole and other practices; specific legislation for the District of Columbia.

As a preliminary to a re-organized and renewed campaign of enforcement, Attorney General Mitchell has declared that all persons using intoxicants must be weeded out of the prohibition enforcement forces.

These measures hint of appalling corruption and a startling emergency in law enforcement. There is no question but that they place prohibition on final trial. If the nation's forces cannot be marshalled at this time in sufficient strength to

settle once and for all time the practicability and possibility of dry law enforcement, then it can be said and will be said with force and conviction that prohibition is a failure and we will have to turn to some other solution of the liquor problem.

National prohibition has been tried for twelve years. During that time there has been appalling corruption and collusion between official law enforcers and habitual law-breakers; these united forces have developed well established methods of poisoning and drugging the public and dividing the loot. In order to keep the upper hand and preserve their power to extort from the bootleggers to the limit the law officers have instituted and carried out an organized system of intimidation and killing which has resulted in the killing and wounding of thousands of bootleggers and innocent citizens. In order to prevent an utter demoralization of the prohibition forces the federal government has established a system of legal protection over these murderers so that cases are extremely rare in which cold blooded killers are adequately punished or even punished at all.

This partnership of bootleggers, gangsters, hijackers, illicit distillers, thieves, murderers, bribers, bribe-takers, crooked and grafting officers of the law, killers in the name of law, and an obliging and protecting government is going to be hard to break up. It is so well established, so very thoroughly entrenched, its profits amount

yearly into so many millions and hundreds of millions of dollars, of which the officers of the law in all probability get the lion's share; it has so many millionaires and members of high society sharing in these profits and so many higher officers of the law, and finally the government itself is so involved in dirty party politics relating to the liquor question, that it is very questionable if the renewed attack on this question will get very far.

Behind all these evils here listed are two undoubtedly greater evils. First—High society including the rich, the "respectable" and respected, the influential whose influence pervades all American society and whose acts are copied as examples, systematically flouts and disregards the prohibition law. It has never believed in prohibition except as medicine for the "lower classes." The "lower classes" keenly realize all this. They feel justified, even proud, in following such an exalted example.

Worse even than this is the systematic breaking of the prohibition law by officers of the law and government officials from the lowest to the highest. From deputies and constables to the high officials among the prohibition forces, drinking is undoubtedly more common than not. From members of legislatures to members of congress, from governors to the department heads of the federal government, drinking has been revealed. Senator Brookhart recently produced evidence show-

ing that the exclusive Century Club of New York City, of which President Hoover is a member, habitually serves intoxicating drinks. Other members of this club are George W. Wickersham, head of President Hoover's Law Enforcement Commission and William A. Hutcheson of the House Committee. It was recently revealed that liquor was served freely at the Conference of Governors on Mackinaw Island, Michigan, to the majority of governors of the United States. Governor Green, said to be responsible for this, is the official who signed the orders committing five persons to prison for life because liquor was found in their possession. One of these "life for a pint"

victims was a mother of five children. Hypocrisy, cruelty, venality, bestiality, functioning as government can go no further than this. Liquor was served at least up to recently at the banquets of the high government officials in Washington. The lobby rooms at the Capitol are a bootleggers' paradise. In Washington the representatives of the people meet in friendship and good will feasts with the agents of Wall Street and get drunk together to the health of the people they are about to jointly fleece. Most judges who condemn others to prison from a few months to life for selling or drinking booze are drinkers themselves. Senator Borah recently brought out the fact that

a good many healthy drinkers are to be found among prosecuting attorneys who work so hard to obtain liquor convictions.

It is against an organized and entrenched big business, against established collusion, vice, corruption and venality, against national hypocrisy and governmental double-dealing and rottenness that this renewed prohibition campaign must be conducted. The present prohibition attack will probably mark the highest point to which liquor law enforcement can rise. It is no doubt about to receive a thorough and final test. If it cannot win this time, it will be up to the American people to devise a better way to solve the liquor problem.

## *The Real Meaning of Dictatorships*

Recent events in Europe in connection with the struggle between dictatorships and democracy are of utmost interest. In Spain General Primo De Rivera has been forced out of power by the army after ruling for six years. The weapon he used to crush constitutional and representative government turned upon him and crushed him. Another general, Berenguer, was elevated to his place.

In Austria the people won a victory over Fascism, or the dictatorship movement, only to be tricked by their premier. The Austrian Fascists threatened to start a civil war and overthrow Austria's very democratic government unless the constitution was so changed that the Social Democratic party representing labor and the common people would be effectually barred from power. In other words, they threatened to overthrow the government by force if the labor members of parliament failed to disfranchise themselves and sign their own warrant of political slavery. The Fascisti massed an army estimated to be 100,000 strong to carry out this threat. In the face of this danger the labor party members voted solidly and saved in all its essential features

the present democratic constitution of Austria and quietly prepared to meet the armed attack of their foes. The Fascist military attack did not materialize. Democracy had won a splendid victory over Fascism in an hour of extreme peril. But hardly had the people finished celebrating their victory when the anti-labor premier, Schoeber, slipped into Italy in a visit to Mussolini and there signed a treaty of alliance with the most monstrous dictator in the world in defiance of the Austrian people. Austrian democracy is again in peril through this trickery.

Mussolini has now perfected an alliance with Austria, Hungary, Bulgaria and Albania. It is essentially a Fascist alliance. It is the beginning of Mussolini's Fascist empire through which he hopes during his lifetime to form a world-union of dictatorships that will ultimately crush democracy throughout the world.

This project is more than a fantastic dream. Fifteen countries, most of them having formerly had representative and constitutional governments, have become dictatorships or partial dictatorships since the World War. They are Italy, Spain,

Portugal, Hungary, Jugo-Slavia, Bulgaria, Albania, Roumania, Poland, Lithuania, Esthonia, Turkey, Russia, China, Chili. Conscious Fascist elements—elements that actively work for military dictatorships as permanent institutions—are active and growing in most of these countries and in many other countries. A war situation might unite most of them into a formidable international alliance against democratic nations.

The chief dictatorship danger in each country, however, is internal. The World War, which we were taught to regard as a war to make the world safe for democracy, demonstrated the invincible power of modern armies against unarmed populations and created the widespread spirit of violence and militarism out of which these many military dictatorships grew. It taught the leaders of armies and the leaders of high finance that the people are helpless before modern military machines AND THAT ARMIES CAN CRUSH AND HOLD DOWN THE PEOPLE WITH EASE. As fast as real crises have developed in various countries military machines wielded by one man have siezed government and crushed the people.

The one man was only the dummy dictator; the military machine was the real dictator. The world-wide spread of dictatorships IS MERELY THE WORLD BECOMING MILITARIZED. The soldiers of the World War were taught that they were fighting to end militarism: the

war they fought ESTABLISHED MILITARISM AS A FORM OF GOVERNMENT.

In the presence of this deadly peril the United States is no exception. We face the same internal and external deadly military foe that every other

country faces. The military machine can crush American liberty whenever the conditions are ripe for such an event. The only path to safety, to liberty, democracy and true civilization IS THE PATH TO DISARMAMENT AND PEACE.

## Choosing a Leader in Education

This magazine is interested in education, not so much in the so-called higher study which is indulged in by the colleges but in the elementary work that is for the millions of children that never go to college. It is interested not so much in the self-styled leaders who draw large salaries for writing books and doing research work as in the thousands of teachers who daily instruct the millions of children in Iowa and adjoining states.

We believe children should be instructed in the fundamentals and thoroughly grounded in READING, WRITING, and ARITHMETIC, so that these subjects will be of life long value. We believe that teachers should be given all the helps possible. Their position should be made as permanent as the nature of the work will permit. They should be given free help in securing a position and not have to pay for a new location.

Such a bureau was established by the state of Iowa when P. E. McClenahan was superintendent of schools. It was used by Miss May Frances and hundreds of teachers received free help. It was abolished soon after Miss Agnes Samuelson came into office. Why? We do not know. Could it be that private agencies had a finger in the pie? Did they support Miss Samuelson? Will some one answer?

We believe the office of State Superintendent of Schools is a most important office; that its work can be mere silence and twaddle or it can be directed by a leader whose work will be of state-wide and nation-wide importance.

We want to support some one for this great office. Shall it be man or woman? If a woman why? Can she give greater leadership or service? If a man, is there one who is big

enough to reflect credit on Iowa and to secure national educational co-operation in our affairs? Write us and tell us what you think. Send us the names of those you think qualified for State Superintendent of Schools and tell us why. Help us to decide.

We believe that taxes should be equalized and lowered. Education now takes more than half of all our taxes. We think we can have better schools for less money. Why not have an educational commission that will study and plan for our system. Why not have it composed of men and women who are outside of the school room and have a view of the state as a whole.

There are over 20,000 school board members, they raise and spend many millions of money. Why not an organization of school boards to plan and execute for the schools?

## America Outlaws Christianity

Professor Douglas Clyde MacIntosh of the Yale divinity school, a Scotchman by birth, was denied citizenship in a decision filed by Judge Warren B. Burrows at New Haven, Connecticut. When he was asked if he would bear arms in defense of the United States in case of war he replied that his first allegiance was to the will of God and that he could not bear arms when the war conflicted with his conscience.

Although Professor MacIntosh is a respected teacher in one of our highest institutions of learning and is undoubtedly a

man of high intellectual ability and moral attainments and would make an unusually good citizen, and although he served in the World War as a chaplain, he has been judged not fit for citizenship because he places his God above his government.

This decision is outrageous. It is worse than the infamous court decision against Madame Schwimmer who was judged as being unfit for citizenship because she, too, said that she could not conscientiously bear arms and kill her fellow human beings. While the Schwimmer

decision placed our government in the role of demanding the right to force women to fight and kill against their higher conscience, this recent decision barring Professor MacIntosh from citizenship does not even allow a man the privilege of using his moral judgment in case of war. It demands that the individual must fight and kill even in violation of what he believes to be the word of God, even in violation of the most sacred precepts of his own conscience. Madame Schwimmer was denied citizenship because

she was against all war. But Professor MacIntosh is denied American citizenship because he is not willing to fight in a war that he thinks is wrong.

Until this abominable decision is wiped out by a higher court the United States government will stand upon the right to compel persons to commit conscious wrong; it will assume the right to nullify an individual's Christianity. It will outlaw all honest and sincere persons who try to follow their religion

and moral conscience. No one can be a Christian and follower of Christ in the true sense, if this decision is allowed to stand.

This case startlingly illustrates the militaristic character of modern governments. Almost without exception they assume the right to compel their citizens or subjects to kill in violation of all moral or religious sense. Essential militarism, the whole process of war and government by brute force, cannot

stand on any other basis than this. Systems of government that require such outrageous violation of all that is high and sacred and precious in the individual have no right to exist: the human race must somehow devise a form of government that is not based upon killing and which can serve and function without violating the human conscience. Let America lead out by wiping out these dreadful decisions.

## *Political Monopoly in America*

A law was passed by the last Florida legislature which makes the Democratic party of that state a complete and unbreakable monopoly, bars any independent political movement, makes the organization of a third party impossible and compels voters if they vote at all to vote Republican or Democrat.

If a man seeks an office as a Democrat, he must swear that he did not vote in the last election for a single Republican. If he seeks an office as a Republican, he must swear that he did vote for a single Democrat in the last election. In other words, it is made a crime that bars one from office to use a little independence in voting and try honestly to pick out the best candidates.

There is another provision in this law that is even worse and effectually compounds this outrage against political liberty. The law provides that a new party, to be recognized, must have polled at least 30 per cent of the total vote polled in the state in the last general election. As a new political party cannot have any votes counted until it is recognized and as it cannot be recognized until it has its votes counted, there is no earthly chance for the people of Florida to obtain relief from this new political tyranny by organizing a new party.

On the other hand, if one of the parties—the Republican party, for instance—should fail to cast 30 per cent of the votes,

it would be outlawed and barred from participation in government. This would leave the Democratic party in complete and permanent control of the state. There would be no way to dislodge it. It could be as rotten, corrupt and traitorous as it chose, but the people could not dislodge it from office. This is as bad as the outrageous tyranny set up in Italy by Mussolini, which allows the Italian people to vote approval of the Fascist government, but makes it a punishable offense to vote disapproval.

It is deplorable and extremely discouraging that there should exist anywhere in the United States a body of men elected to make laws who would pass a law so utterly corrupt and dishonest and so utterly opposed to all principles of liberty and democracy. But it is vastly more discouraging that this law is not unique among state laws. The writer of this article had occasion to visit ten states during the last presidential campaign in the interest of a third party movement and examine the election laws of each state. Every one of them contained features similar to the Florida law, although not carried to quite such an extreme. In fact nearly every state in the union now has on its statute books laws deliberately designed to make air tight political monopolies of the two old political parties and to prevent the people from leaving them

and organizing a political movement of their own.

These parties are owned body and soul, boots and breeches, by big business interests. If it is made impossible for the people to find any political expression outside of these two parties **POLITICAL MONOPOLY WILL BE AS COMPLETE IN AMERICA AS INDUSTRIAL AND FINANCIAL MONOPOLY HAS BECOME.** If this thing is allowed to go on in this country much longer the American people will be in exactly the same condition as the Italian people. They will be allowed to vote **FOR** their Fascist masters, but not **AGAINST** them.

#### Who Is Colonel Gaines?

#### Who Is Joseph B. Matthews?

Joseph B. Matthews is also a native of Kentucky, having been born at Hopkinsville, so that with two fighting Kentuckians as the principals the debate promises to be most interesting. ## Colonel Gaines' Opening Statement

(This is Colonel Gaines' first of three articles in the debate)

To America's debatable question—"Resolved that the World Court and League of Nations are Logical and Desirable Steps Toward World Peace," I answer No, and I will cite something else that is the world's ONLY permissible thing for world peace!

I open my side of this joint debate with my distinguished fellow citizen, Mr. Matthews, with the SAME words that I opened my speech in President Harding's World Peace Conference to which he had invited me, and these words of mine are the quoted words of the supremest authority known to the human race, and, therefore, the bed-rock, all-controlling, mandatory Truth to mankind on this world peace question:

**"My Peace I Give Unto You, Not As The World Giveth, Give I Unto You!"**

And the incomparable power that is proven in these words of the Prince of Peace, and in His whole Teaching of ONLY The Kingdom of God for World Peace, is that all history for the past 2000 years proves that it is just as He foretold: that World Peace is NOT an instantaneous thing, but a continual process (Matthew, 13:31-33); that Nations attain real Peace (and will be enabled to proportionately disarm and reduce the taxation burden thereof) JUST IN PROPORTION as they come into harmony with the Laws of The Kingdom of God, and no sooner! (1) EVERY great State paper in 154 years of our Government recognizes our Lord's Name therein, but the League of Nations and World Court purposely IGNORE God's Name!

When I was invited into President Harding's Peace Conference on December 18, 1920, he agreed with my point which I made against these International compacts, and President Harding that day published in his newspaper, the Marion Star, his agreeing words to me, as follows: "I do not think that any Association of Nations can be successful in which God is not recognized!"

The Magna Charta in 1215 A. D. contained words recognizing God and the Church! Columbus' very first act when he discovered America was to kneel on the discovered ground and publicly render thanks to God! The American Pilgrims and Colonists put their recognition of God in the Mayflower Compact, in the articles of Confederation, in the Declaration of Independence, in the U. S. Constitution and all the 48 States' Constitutions! Our America's greatest—Washington, Lincoln and others—have always recognized God in their papers and even in their speeches! And "In God We Trust" is stamped on our U. S. Coinage.

Verily, every foundation stone of our America recognizes God, and testifies against the fatal League of Nations and World Court which ignore God's Name.

(2) Our U. S. Constitution not only does not allow but it prohibits both the League of Nations and World Court ideas.

If the United States were a member of the League of Nations, then we would have to help DEFEND all the nations in it, because Article 10 of the League Covenant binds ALL the Nation members to provide for the DEFENSE of all the Nations of the world in the League (to defend their "territorial integrity and existing political independence," it reads), but our U. S. Constitution, Article 1 Section 8, LIMITS our Government to expending revenue for providing for the DEFENSE of only one single Country on earth—"The United States!"

As to the World Court: Our U. S. Constitution, Article 1, Section 8, only authorizes our "Congress," which it defines as both the houses of the Senate and the House, to create Courts. Then the Senate, when acting alone in ratifying a treaty as in this case, is utterly without authority to create any kind of a Court—much less the World Court! And again, in all cases in which the United States would be an interested party, because Article 60 of the World Court statute says, "The judgments of this World Court are final and without appeal," which would make the World Court decisions in these cases SUPERIOR to our U. S. Supreme Court! But Article 1, Section 8, of our United States Constitution expressly limits the Congress "to constituting tribunals INFERIOR to our Supreme Court!" Indeed, these bold League of Nations advocates further show that they mean to ruthlessly break down that wise Constitutional pro-

vision; for Hamilton Holt, one of their national big guns, published in his signed article in our country's press this gloating statement—"That when it (the world court) came into existence, it would be the highest Court of Appeals this side of the bar of Eternal Judgment!"

I arraign these so-called intellectuals before the bar of American Public Opinion for THEIR breaking our U. S. Constitution with impunity, while they are at the same time condemning the poor and ignorant to the gallows and electric chair for their breaking another section of our Constitutional law!

(3) These present-day League and World Court advocates are guilty of precisely THE SAME CRIME that our Declaration of Independence charges against King George III: "He has combined with others to subject us to a jurisdiction foreign to our Constitution," it reads! Because they are today combining with other Nations to subject us to this World Court jurisdiction that is foreign to and unprovided for in our U. S. Constitution! Our Declaration of Independence thus condemns the League of Nations and World Court!

(4) There isn't a one of these League and World Court advocates who has the nerve and gall to stand IN Monticello, the precious home of Thomas Jefferson, or to stand down the hill at the grave of Jefferson and read aloud the words of Jefferson on this very question, and then go on and speak their present day advocacy for our America to anyway join in this foreign League of Nations and World Court,—for Jefferson's warning words were, "Our first and fundamental maxim should be, never to entangle ourselves in the broils of Europe. Our second, never to suffer Europe to inter-meddle in our American affairs!" I challenge them to meet me there on this test!

(5) What is still worse for them, George Washington is against the principle of their League of Nations and World Court.

If the United States joined these foreign propositions, then that would mean a PERMANENT joining with all those foreign Nations and, therefore, a permanent alliance with them. But Washington warned against just that in his words—"Tis our true policy to steer clear of Permanent Alliance with any portion of the foreign world!"

I challenge them. I dare these League and World Court advocates to meet me at Mount Vernon and in the solemn presence in front of Washington's Tomb, there advocate turning our backs on the immortal Washington and those words of wisdom of his! I'll wager a thousand they won't do it.

(6) Even our great American safeguard, the Monroe Doctrine, is on the opposite side to this League of Nations and World Court.

Membership in the League and World Court would, under the terms of the Covenant, hook us up to all the foreign controversies and wars of all these foreign European Nations. But part of the very heart of the Monroe Doctrine reads—"In the wars of the European powers, in matters relating to themselves, we have never taken any part, nor does it comport with our policy to do so."

Will you Americans also stand for these League and World Court advocates grinding that great and wise Monroe Doctrine under their feet?

(7) When our U. S. Congress passed the last Act on April 4th, 1818, pertaining to our United States Flag, they made the 13 stripes to remain forever permanent in the Flag—as being emblematic of the 13 original colonies and all of which they had wrought.

I have shown above that everything and every word of these 13 original colonies condemn the League of Nations and World Court ideas.

Then we have lived to see the pitiful example of these League and World Court advocates attacking the 13 stripes in our Flag—WHEN THEY TURN AGAINST ALL WHICH THE 13 COLONIES WROUGHT, WHICH THE 13 STRIPES REPRESENT!

(8) American common sense which has steered us from a Nation founded in a wilderness to the greatest Nation that the world has ever looked upon, condemns the League of Nations and World Court ideas.

Our common sense from George Washington to today, has shown us that we must contribute our Nation's part to the world's progress, but that we can BEST do that with benefit to the Nations and safety to ourselves, by our example and help rather than by our partnership with them.

The advanced Merchantman of Main Street can continue successfully while extending his independent help to the backward fellow of the Alley, but if that advanced Merchantman takes that backward fellow of the Alley into full partnership with him—how long do you think this partnership would run peacefully and successfully?

(9) There is one fact of history concerning ex-President Roosevelt on this League of Nations question that proves him the world's outstanding man of moral courage!

Upon his retirement from the presidency, he made a speech at Christiana, Norway, in which he advocated the boldest form of a world federation or League of Nations that any world leader has ever proposed! I am quoting from the Louisville Courier-Journal of May 6th, 1910, showing he then advocated "A World Federation," "A World Executive and World Police Power to enforce the decrees of the World Court." The headlines reading, "Roosevelt Would Make Big Nations The World's Policemen!"

Upon his return to the United States I remonstrated with him, receiving some wonderful letters from him during the next few years. Finally in the beginning of 1917, in my desperation to get him to see the Truth because I so loved and admired him, I prepared my Cross Ruled Paper on the subject in which I scientifically marshalled the Truth in incontrovertible fashion. I sent a copy to him (ex-President Roosevelt) and also to President Wilson.

Because of the Truth it makes so plain, I appealed to Mr. Roosevelt to change to against the condemned League of Nations and World Court for world peace to being for the Peace Plan of the Prince of Peace! For the sake and safety of our Country, his party and himself.

HE CHANGED! And when I wrote again urging and begging him to now do still more while he lived against the League of Nations and FOR God's Peace Plan, he wrote me on his Metropolitan Magazine letterhead on Jan. 26, 1917:

"Dear Colonel Gaines:

"I am now doing all I can. I don't see I could do more.

Sincerely yours,  
Theodore Roosevelt."

And thereafter, the Washington Post on August 4th, 1918, in big headlines carried this sensational account—"Roosevelt Flouts League of Nations;" "Nationalism, Not Internationalism, Need of America, Says Roosevelt!"

(10) "My Peace I give unto you, not as the world giveth, give I unto you," is the present world's highest authority for the startling warning that there are two kinds of Peace: the only possible Peace that our Lord gives (St. John, 14-27), and all other Peace plans than the Lord's being the impossible Peace that "the world gives."

(11) (12) An investigation of the Word of God on the subject shows that by no hook or crook can the League of Nations or World Court be proven as God's Plan, because our Holy Bible provides squarely against all world governing bodies of Internationalism for world peace, and for something else for world peace.

(13) World rule, who is to exercise rule over the whole earth, has always been God's supreme question for this world. Hence, through the Holy Prophets God provided for only four world-governments of men (Daniel, 2:1-43; Isaiah, 9:6 and 7, etc.). And thereafter, those four human world-governments arose exactly as foretold! The Roman Empire being the last! No matter whether ignorantly or purposely, opposing the Kingdom of God is for the same reason fatal to ALL: to Napoleon, Charlemagne, the Czar, the Kaiser, Socialism, Communism, Bolshevism, League of Nations, Court-isms, and ALL forms of human internationalism.

(14) Many people are bothered why some Preachers (of course not all) are advocating the League of Nations and World Court for world peace instead of the Plan of the Prince of Peace.

I here wager a Thousand Dollars to go to charity and I bargain to prove that every Preacher who is advocating the League of Nations and World Court is NOT a Preacher of 100 per cent of Christ's Teachings, though Christ commands them to and warns them of the punishment for not—in His Sermon-on-the-Mount, (Matt. 7:26-27) and in His Great Commission to them (Matt. 28:20).

I dare these League and World Court Preachers to challenge me to the proof, when I will prove that ALL of them are themselves ignoring or BREAKING several of Christ's DIVINE Laws in His one Sermon-on-the-Mount, while at the same time they are advocating or condoning the imprisoning, hanging or electrocution of poor ignorant unfortunates who are BREAKING some one of our CIVIL laws.

### Explanation of Right Column—FOR

(1) (2) The Socialist and Communist political parties proposed this SAME internationalism idea that is in the League of Nations and World Court LONG BEFORE Woodrow Wilson and his colleagues did at the Paris peace table, as I quote here from the Socialist Party in the United States Program which they adopted May 15th, 1915, providing for "An International Federation—The United States of the World—An International Congress with Legislative and Administrative powers over international affairs." Result Always failure and disaster, because they are fighting against the Kingdom of God which is the world's only internationalism. (Matthew, 21:43-44).

(3) (4) (5) (6) Charlemagne, Napoleon, Czar Nicholas of Russia and Kaiser Wilhelm of the German Empire, are four of the great world military leaders of different eras who each sought to dominate the world with his different form of world government or world internationalism or world domination—all squarely in the face of the Kingdom of God, which is the earth's only possible internationalism! Result: All of them met failure and fearful chastisement. (Matthew, 21:43 and 44).

(7) (8) (9) (10) (11) (12) Every International leader who gets too big for his National breeches, then launches some new and different form of Internationalism. The Bolshevism of Lenine of Russia, the Fascism of Mussolini of Italy, and the League of Nations and World Court-ism of Lloyd George of England, Clemenceau of France, Woodrow Wilson of the United States and Orlando of Italy—are all different forms of the same fatal human Internationalism, and they are all fighting against the earth's only possible Internationalism—the Kingdom of God. Result: they are all failing and being ground into powder, as is expressly written of them. (Matthew, 21:43 and 44).

# Joseph B. Matthews' Opening Statement

(This is the first of Prof. Matthews' three articles in the debate)

"Resolved that the World Court and the League of Nations are logical and desirable steps toward world Peace."

It is not the purpose of this discussion to maintain that either the World Court or the League of Nations is a perfect institution. On the contrary, an effort will be made to show simply that they are logical and desirable steps toward world peace.

Only a fanatic can be blind to the grave defects in these institutions. The League of Nations in particular has serious counts against it. At a critical moment in international relations when the League had a splendid opportunity to demonstrate its effectiveness, it abdicated in favor of the Council of Ambassadors and thus no credit will be given the League of Nations in this article for brave action in the Corfu incident between Italy and Greece. The disarmament record of the League is most disappointing. Its achievements in this important area of international relations are next to nothing. On the question of mandates it may be reasonably urged that the present system under the League is most faulty to say the least. While there is a Commission on Mandates, it is to be doubted whether this commission has in fact full powers to deal with abuses in mandated territories. The experience of the League at its session in September, 1926, is evidence on this point. Again it may be justly claimed that the League in fact is too much under the domination of the Great Powers. While it may assume a bold front in dealing with countries like Albania and Bulgaria, no one would expect it to be an effective agency in dealing with a situation where one of the Great Powers was directly involved. For example, even though England and India are both members of the League, it is unthinkable that the League would act even in the most serious rupture in the relations between these two members. Another serious lack in the League of Nations as it is at present constituted is the absence of Russia and the United States from its councils—the one because no welcoming hand is outstretched and the other for reasons too mixed to describe briefly. Surely no agency for peace can be fully effective as long as two such important powers remain aloof. Finally, the effectiveness of the League for peace may be seriously compromised by its reliance on sanctions. Peace and reliance on military force are contradictions in terms.

When one has enumerated these and possibly other discouraging elements in the League, it is far from saying that the League is not a logical and desirable step toward world peace. Anyone but a blind patriot can enumerate serious defects in his own government. He may point to inefficiencies, corruption, abuses in the judiciary and other imperfections, but the force of the argument is only to the effect that human institutions are never perfect and are always open to improvement. Both the League of Nations and the World Court are open to improvement and there is a disposition on the part of those connected with them to make them increasingly effective agencies for peace.

In the progress of any community life whether it be in its smallest units or in the international community, two things are indispensable: political organization and the reign of law. Unless there be coordinated activity and accepted standards regulating the basic activities of a community, there can be only chaos. Absolute freedom on the part of an individual in a community is another way of describing anarchy. Absolute sovereignty for the nations of the world is nothing less than international anarchy.

It is sometimes claimed by proponents of the League of Nations and the World Court that these institutions in no way infringe upon national sovereignty. If by this claim it is meant that no denials of freedom are imposed by one nation or group of nations upon another, it may be true; but if it is meant to deny self-imposed limitations upon national sovereignty, it is not quite true. Any international treaty is a self-imposed limitation upon sovereignty. It is for this very reason that the League of Nations and the World Court are logical steps in the development of an international community. They do imply limitations upon absolute sovereignty and they are designed to subject the international activities of nations to the reign of law.

It is this claim to absolute sovereignty on the part of the

Great World Powers that has been used to justify their maintenance of great armaments. These armaments in their turn stimulate suspicion and give birth to fears. Such an atmosphere is not one in which international amity can grow. The freest individual and the freest nation will be those that submit by choice to reason and the institutions based on reason.

In the past there has been a fatal defect in international relations through the inability of responsible statesmen to make personal contacts. International crises have finally gone unsolved because there was no recognized method by which statesmen could come face to face and deal in an intimate personal way with them. Long range handling of intricate international problems is sometimes an impossibility. The League of Nations has provided at Geneva a remedy for this past difficulty. It is still imperfect but nevertheless Geneva has become the seat of international counsel. It is effective to the extent that the member nations send their most responsible and world-minded statesmen to the Council. It is noticeable how much more seriously a session of the Assembly in Geneva is considered when the Prime Minister himself, instead of some lesser figure, attends the session.

Not only does the League of Nations provide a place of counsel where statesmen may resolve their difficulties in personal conversations, but to a limited extent it provides a forum where grievances may be aired within hearing of the whole world. It is not claimed that a perfect forum situation ever existed in Geneva but there has been a genuine development of the idea. Still too often the dominant powers by one means or another compel silence on the part of those who would speak concerning abuses. With the improved mechanisms for publicity in the modern world, it is logical and desirable that there be international agencies where the light of the fullest publicity can be turned upon the dark places of the world.

It is a commonplace that government has become an increasingly complex function of the social community. Questions of the greatest intricacy demand expert treatment. It is unthinkable that any individual or official in a democracy can be informed on all the complicated questions that effect man's social organization. If this is true in the smaller units of community life, it is more impressively true in the life of the international community. To meet this demand of expert knowledge of questions that have world-wide significance, the Secretariat of the League of Nations was established. The development of the Secretariat has been one of the most surprising features of the League. In the minds of many, it greatly outranks in importance the strictly political work of the Assembly and the Council. The Secretariat brings together the work of the political statesmen and the expert social scientist. Intelligent action in political areas can be founded only on the most accurate information concerning man's organized life. The work of gathering this knowledge requires a great staff always on the job. Problems of economics, standardization of terminology, crime and international traffic in drugs are only a few of the fields of interest into which the Secretariat has entered. The world could not well afford to lose, even after so brief a period for development, this institution of the Secretariat which has become an indispensable adjunct of the Assembly and the Council.

The Permanent Court of International Justice at the Hague was authorized in the League Covenant. It is a part of the whole conception which was in the minds of those who established the League of Nations and the International Labor Office. A beginning for the juridical handling of international disputes was made at the beginning of the Twentieth Century when the Hague Permanent Court of Arbitration was established. That institution, which is still in existence, was only a beginning in the establishment of the idea of an international court. More strictly speaking, it was not a court but a panel of judges from which ad hoc committees of arbitration might be chosen. The weaknesses of such a body will be apparent. The Permanent Court of International Justice (commonly known as the World Court) overcomes many of the difficulties of the Hague Court of Arbitration. It is therefore in the strictest sense of the word a logical and desirable step toward world peace. Its judges meet regularly and constitute in fact a court of the most eminent jurists in the world. In its short existence many important

questions between nations have been adjudicated. Like the League of Nations the World Court is open to improvement and only recently the member nations have shown a disposition to move forward in the development of this legal body.

The question of entanglements is usually brought forward by those who are opposed to such institutions as the League of Nations and the World Court. If anything is obvious in our present day world system, it is our interdependence. No nation can live to itself alone. No civilized nation wants to. In the economic life of the world this interdependence is striking. Economic interests cut across all political boundary lines. In the case of the United States, it can be said that we are "entangled" economically to an extent to which no League of Nations or World Court could possibly entangle us. The dollar has become truly international. It is at work in every part of the world. Since the world war we have invested more than \$13,000,000,000 of our surplus capital outside the political boundaries of the United States. Hence the political boundaries and the economic boundaries of our country are no longer the same lines. What is true of our own economic relationship with the rest of the world is true in some degree of all other nations. Only Gandhi, among important world figures, seems to desire a system of economic staying-at-home. Surely it is the part of wisdom to bring political and legal institutions into line with economic facts and since economic facts prove conclusively that we have an international community, such institutions as the League of Nations and the World Court are most logical and desirable.

In view of the obstacles which the League of Nations and the World Court have faced during the past decade, it is amazing that there are today such institutions in Geneva and

the Hague. Post-war chaos, misunderstanding and bitterness would have wrecked any institutions for which a desperate need was not felt. It is an open secret that the existence of these institutions has been a precarious one at times. With returning sanity, however, they become more firmly established. The hopes of peacefully minded peoples all over the world turn at times toward Geneva and the Hague; the need of the people of the world at all times points to these places.

Let it be remembered that these expressions of international organization are only in their beginning. Ten years is a brief moment in the life of nations. If we are to move forward in the direction of ordered community life among nations instead of lapsing into pugnacious barbarism, we must look to the League of Nations and the World Court not as perfectly functioning agencies but as developing institutions progressively incorporating man's desire for peace.

Our generation is at once the most destructive and the most co-operative. With both of these forces at work in the world, there is a constant struggle. Our existing institutions and our needs must be evaluated against the background of this world-wide struggle. Whatever points to the ascendancy of the destructive forces of the world (rivalries, armaments, narrow nationalism, pettiness and misunderstanding, and all preparation for conflict) is to be vigorously opposed; whatever promises victory for the co-operative technique in international relations is a logical step in the progress of civilization and is to be sought with all the intelligence and goodwill we possess.

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# When Will the Doctors Awaken?

## Cancer Is Being Cured While Physicians Hunt Poison Pus

### Article IV

**T**HE series of articles pertaining to the treatment of cancer which commenced in our December issue has created a stir in the medical profession. No series of articles will mean more to humanity than these in our columns regarding the cancer situation. To have your physician diagnose your case as cancer is a polite way of learning your death sentence. About the only difference between being sentenced to death by a court for committing murder and being a victim of malignant cancer is that in the former case one knows the date of death while in the latter the date is not definitely set.

For hundreds of years the medical profession found no cure for cancer, and its many years of effort which ended in naught have thoroughly imbued doctors with the thought that it is useless to expect a cure, so that when a cure is found it will require a dozen years for that giant octopus, the medical trust, to awaken and realize the fact.

Few have been censured more or received more insulting letters than has the staff of this magazine in the past few months from doctors throughout the country who read our series of articles entitled **CANCER IS CONQUERED** which commenced in the December issue and continued in the January and February issues.

#### Gross Medical Ignorance

A special display of ignorance was made by doctors from Ottumwa, Sioux City, Clinton, all in Iowa; from Milwaukee and Madison, Wisconsin, and Rock Island, Moline and Rockford, Illinois. Their letters came in response to solicitations on the part of this magazine for subscriptions and in all these cases the doctors were not fearless and courageous enough to sign

their names, but instead sent anonymous letters.

The public has known for years of the gross ignorance of many doctors who would be flattered considerably by the complimentary name of "guessers"—doctors who continue to administer their drugs not knowing anything worthy of mention regarding the human anatomy—doctors who know nothing about how we see, hear, smell, feel or taste, or how the muscles or the nerves or other tissues of the body receive the nourishment from the food that enters our stomach—who do not understand even the rudiments of the theory of digestion. They are so ignorant they tell the patient that the removing of the appendix is immaterial to health and that it performs no important function. They do not know even how the blood is replenished by the food we eat, or how the few ounces of brain matter performs its work. Such doctors spend a few years at some university studying how many bones, muscles, glands and organs there are in the human body and how to administer a few hundred medical compounds divided into groups for certain ailments. For instance, if the group for "bellyache" consists of ten medicines, a doctor has them numbered from one to ten and starts you on number one with instructions to come back tomorrow if you don't feel better; then number two is prescribed, and on down the line. If you still have the "bellyache" after the last number is administered to you, they start all over again. All of this at \$1.00 plus.

#### Refuse to Investigate

Consider the fact that doctors like those who stand on the sidelines and jeer at the possibility of a cancer cure are now yelling "quack" **WITHOUT EVEN INVESTIGATING OR AS MUCH**

**AS SPENDING A TWO-CENT STAMP TO INQUIRE FOR FURTHER INFORMATION!**

There can be no greater display of ignorance than that. And sympathy should be extended to the people of such communities as are served by such doctors. It proves they are not interested in the health of their patients beyond the almighty dollar, and are content to prescribe their little pills or to follow the path of least resistance by injecting some poison pus serum, leaving the rest to the undertaker.

While all of this is going on, this magazine stands ready to prove statements made in our former articles that cancer is curable; that it has been cured by the treatment investigated by this magazine which is now being used at the Baker Institute, Muscatine, Iowa.

This Institute extends to all doubting physicians or otherwise, a cordial invitation to visit it, to talk to the patients, to investigate the records, and if that is done, they will go home convinced of the fact that the giant octopus, the American Medical Association (which by the way, should be investigated by the U. S. Senate) has turned a deaf ear to the greatest discovery in behalf of mankind that has come forth in the past two hundred years.

This does not mean that all cases of cancer can be cured, but we believe that cases which have not advanced to the stage where no worthwhile vitality remains can be cured or at least benefitted so as to extend the life of the patient many, many years.

#### Shun Natural Cures

One reason why cancer societies, cancer organizations, state or government investigating committees, medical colleges and universities, have not progressed further in their search

for a cancer cure is because they have deviated too far from nature. Instead of their researches being confined to the more natural things that surround us, they have cut open a cow, a horse, a sheep, a goat, and practically every known animal with the hopes of finding some kind of "juice," which when shot into the blood streams of a human being is expected to cure cancer.

For instance a great deal of first-page publicity has been given to some California physicians who have been experimenting with the glands located above the kidneys of sheep. After much was said about it the articles ended with the information that the world should not grasp at the discovery as a cure for cancer, but that it would be tried on a few rabbits or rats and the outcome studied. Why bother the glands located above the kidneys of a sheep in an effort to find a cure for cancer when grim old Nature placed around us somewhere, a weed, a root, an oil, a mineral, or some other substance that will kill cancerous growth?

It has been known for a long time that the medical trust exerts a powerful influence upon the press. If the reader lives to be a thousand years of age, it is doubtful if he will ever read in the press of a cure for cancer, even though it is a positive cure unless the source of news comes from the American Medical Association, whose membership includes over ninety thousand doctors from a total of about one hundred fifty thousand in America. The Press will eagerly circulate articles like the following:

#### Typical Blather

Des Moines, Feb. 1—(UP)—Cancer "cures" are fakes, and the only way to assure oneself against death from cancer is periodic medical examination, Dr. Lee Alton Oschsner, Tulane university, New Orleans, told members of the Iowa-South Dakota branch of the American college of surgeons at the closing meeting of the annual convention last night.

Absence of pain in early stages of the disease, he said, is largely responsible for its spread and high death rate.

The only way to determine presence of cancer while still in a stage where it will react to treatment, he explained, is the discovery of lumps in the body, unhealing sores, and portions of the body subject to chronic irritation.

Cancer, he told the surgeons, causes 500,000 deaths each year, with women more susceptible than men, and the greatest toll coming among those who have passed 40.

Cancer may be checked, he explained, in its early stages by immediate removal of infected tissue, and for this reason periodic examinations are urged.

Research as to the effect of heredity of cancer susceptibility has been unsuccessful, but experiments indicate heredity may predispose a person to the disease, he said.

Can one imagine grosser ignorance than that displayed by Dr. Lee Alton Oschsner of the Tulane University at New Orleans? Can any physician blame anyone but themselves for gross ignorance regarding cancer, when they delight in assembling in a conference known as the American College of Surgeons and have such inexcusable ignorance preached to them? The above article states that the only way to assure one's self against death from cancer is by periodic medical examination. Ye Gods! And that was swallowed by members of the American College of Surgeons.

#### Treating Symptoms

If one did go for periodic examination and a cancer were discovered in a woman's breast, what would they do about it? The answer is obvious—they would recommend operation, radium or X-ray: three things that they know have never cured cancer, but have only retarded the growth and generally does more harm than good. If the College of Surgeons or the medical trust would be fair to the people and tell them that X-ray treatments scatter cancer, that radium treatments may retard the growth, but it is not certain that it will not come back, or that operation does not permanently cure, they would be deserving of more respect.

Dr. Oschsner states that the toll of cancer is one-half million deaths per year with the women being more susceptible. He says nothing of the fact that the ma-

ajority of cancers in women are of the breast and female organs, or most cancers of the womb have been caused by improper use of instruments at childbirth. If those who scoff most at treatments that are benefitting cancer would be more careful with their instruments at childbirth, there would possibly be another half a million women who would be living today. Such physicians still continue to TREAT THE SYMPTOMS and disregard the cause. If a lump is found, to the operating table the victim goes to be relieved of a couple of hundred dollars, in many cases to have his life shortened, with the result that the same condition of the system that caused the cancerous lump to form, still exists in the body to cause another lump, much as bad blood will cause a boil. The public should know that in an operation to remove cancerous tissues it is impossible to remove them without cancerous cells falling into the fresh wound, which grow again, which soon means another operation. The greatest crime fostered upon humanity happens when a physician who operates upon a patient for cancer of the abdomen, finds such a large cancerous mass that it would mean death to attempt to remove it, but still goes ahead with the operation while pretending that he does not know whether it is tumor or cancer. Instead of telling the patient truthfully that the cancer or tumor is too large to be removed; that the patient will die anyway, he still insists upon cutting the patient open, taking a slice of the growth for microscopic examination while the only satisfaction the patient has is to know whether he is to die of cancer or tumor. Such procedure merely sends the patient to the grave quicker. What does a patient care, whether it is tumor or cancer? Either one kills.

#### How Cancer Is Cured

This type of physician condemns cancer treatments that are curing cancer, and attacks cancer institutions that use var-

ious treatments including chemical processes that have positively cured many patients who are living today. **The Baker Institute cures by means of an intra-muscular injection which kills the diseased cancer or tumor tissue and enables the blood to carry it away as waste.** All this is done without the use of the knife, without loss of blood, without radium or X-ray burning, without confinement to bed.

Any physician who would raise his hand to suppress publicity of such a wonderful treatment, who refuses to investigate, who yells "quack," should be deprived of his license to practice on the grounds that he does not have the best interests at heart of those cancer and tumor patients upon whom he has pronounced the death sentence by advising the patients that their cases are incurable. The medical trust, that giant octopus whose tentacles reach into every home, into every schoolroom, factory and to every individual,

sucking the lifeblood of the victim as a leach upon a fish's back, deserves a senatorial investigation. But we fear that such will not come to pass until we find some courageous senator who is fearless enough to "buck" the powerful lobby and influence of the medical trust.

**More Proof of Cure**

So positive are we in our statements that cancer is curable that we urge our readers to disregard statements of those who have condemned and censured without investigation, and ask them to investigate the treatment now prescribed by the Baker Institute. As further proof that our treatment cures cancer we call attention to the following recent cases at the Baker Institute: Mr. George F., Wall st., Beardstown, Illinois, had cancer of the lip and refused to let the physician cut it out. 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# Mussing Up Our Bread Basket



## Article II

 HERE is a case plainly demonstrating the source of disease in serum inoculation. Doctor M. J. Scott, Julian London, J. W. McCormack and T. J. Glover

wrote in the Canada Lancet and Practitioner that they produced tissue cultures of chicken sarcoma (tumors) in over 300 Plymouth fowl. The original material, tumor germs, was injected into the breast muscle of several chickens with the result that sarcoma developed in every case in from two to three weeks.

On the other hand, here are figures that show that despite the fact that the use of serums and vaccines is increasing rapidly animal diseases are increasing as never before. The United States Department of Agriculture Year Book shows that in 1921 there were 7,951 outbreaks of hog cholera reported to veterinarians of the Bureau of Animal Industry and 67,295 hogs were treated in the same year. In 1927, **six years later**, there were 11,500 outbreaks of the same disease reported and 97,917 hogs treated.

**Vaccination Increases Disease**  
The following is taken from

a letter written by Harry F. Collier, nationally known poultry breeder of Tacoma, Washington, and publisher of The Reliable Poultry Journal: "I have watched with more than passing interest your reports of the part being taken by several of the colleges. We had an experience here last year in the form of the baby chick embargo. I feel sure it cost me a thousand dollars as a poultry breeder besides 17 cents for each bird tested for B. W. D. I know of one big poultry plant that had an increase in percentage of birds affected after three years of B. W. D. tests."

Dr. A. H. Quinn, D. V. A., in the June, 1923, issue of the North American Veterinarian, said: "Great interest has been stimulated in rural districts in regard to swine diseases and vaccination. There was more serum used by the farmers in 1922 than ever before."

The Year Book of the United States Department of Agriculture shows that in the 1921 tuberculin testing of cows **28,709 were reactors**—that is, showed that they had tuberculosis. While in the year 1927, after six more years of rapidly increasing vaccination, **285,361 reactors were found**—A **TEN-FOLD INCREASE IN SIX YEARS**.

### Infecting Healthy Animals

Arthur D. Galhaft, V. M. D., recently revealed this important fact in The Poultry Item: "One attack of fowl pox (chicken pox) whether it is due to a natural or an **ARTIFICIAL** infection, **apparently** results in permanent immunity. I would recommend that **HEALTHY PULLETS BE VACCINATED** between 12 and 16 weeks of age. Where it is possible, I would advise that all hatches be vaccinated at the same time, **AS VACCINATED BIRDS MAY**

**TRANSMIT CHICKEN POX TO NON-VACCINATED BIRDS.**

"Yearling hens (year old hens) that are in good egg production at vaccinating time of pullets may contract chicken pox. During our vaccination program this past spring and summer **we did not vaccinate the culls and the cockrels, and from seven to fourteen days after vaccinating the pullets all non-vaccinated birds and cockrels developed chicken pox lesions on the comb, wattles, ear lobes and eyes.** It has been reported to some of the poultrymen that **following pullet vaccination many of the yearling hens developed chicken pox accompanied by lesions of the head, a decrease in egg production and some mortality.**"


Dr. Galhaft further stated that his work in poultry vaccination started back in 1920 and since then he had collected various strains of chicken pox virus from different breeds of birds. The doctor said, "Our vaccination experiments have been conducted on 350,000 chickens to determine the duration of immunity."



Turkeys under experiment by the author, who has demonstrated that vaccines and serums are not necessary to keep turkeys healthy. Clean and natural feeding, drinking and living is all that is necessary to keep them from catching diseases.

The Poultry Tribune states that a new method of vaccinating poultry has been developed. It is known as the cutaneous method. This vaccination was first used in Holland a number

of years ago. From there it came to this country where investigators "perfected" it. It consists in applying the virus of the chicken pox by removing several feathers from one leg and rubbing the virus over the opening. **Typical pox results and runs a course of three or four weeks. Some investigators say that if chicken pox has not been present during the past few years the virus should not be introduced.**

#### How Food is Polluted

Dr. J. E. Salisbury wrote in the *Leghorn World*, "Tuberculosis of fowl should be stamped out. It is closely related to the human disease and **seems to be on the increase.** The existence of tuberculosis in fowl is more common in farm flocks. The method of eradicating tuberculosis by the tuberculin test is done by **injecting tuberculin into the wattles.** If the injected wattle has a swelling about twice as large as the other wattle, which has no injection, **WE CALL THIS A REACTION AND THE BIRD HAS TUBERCULOSIS.** If tubercular birds are found, it is advisable to **re-test the whole flock in 60 days and repeat the test until the flock is clean.**"

The *O. K. Poultry Journal*, in an issue in 1924 in its poultry disease department discussed fowl typhoid, stating that this disease is very common in some parts of the United States and that it is an infectious disease caused by the germ, bacterium sanguinarium. "All birds of the flock should be vaccinated with a vaccine made from the germs of the disease. Each

year the young chicks as they reach the size of partridges should be vaccinated."

The following is by Prof. James Dryden in the *Pacific Rural Press*, 1929: "After the flock becomes infected with chicken pox and shows scabs and canker, vaccination is not very effective. Some poultrymen, however, do use it, but it is better to use the preventative vaccine before the flock has become infected. **THIS GIVES THE BIRDS A MILD DOSE OF THE POX and afterwards they are immune.**"

Dr. H. W. Graybill, former government man and now director of the Poultry Pathological Laboratory of Los Angeles, has this to say in a national farm publication of recent date: "**Our laboratory is assisting in putting before the poultry public the advantages of vaccination. Last summer and fall it is estimated that 250,000 pullets were vaccinated with the new chicken pox vaccine developed by Dr. J. R. Beach of California.** A detailed record of the vaccination of 2,500 turkeys was also kept. The vaccine works exceedingly well in turkeys. Birds already having chicken pox were also vaccinated and showed no ill effects. **Indications are that the new vaccine develops immunity and that its use is justifiable.**


#### Reasons of Disease Increase

The writer desires to be fair. He has not suppressed the parts of the statements of these quoted that express strong belief that the vaccination of farm animals produces immunity from disease. But because these men indorse and use vaccine does not prove its worth, as good men ever since the beginning of time have been mistaken. The big fact remains, a fact undoubtedly much bigger than their opinions—**DISEASES HAVE RAPIDLY INCREASED WITH THE RAPID INCREASE OF VACCINATION!**

The reader must be convinced by this time of the real reason for the increase and spread of

livestock diseases. But to make sure that no one fails to get the full significance of these indisputable proofs, let us briefly summarize the other fellows' records and statements. We are told that the use of vaccines and serums on farm animals began about 1910 and that up to 1920 much of these products were used. Then in 1925 there was a decided increase in the number of farm animals vaccinated, and that animal vaccination has increased rapidly from then until the present time until millions and millions of farm animals are being injected with these products.

Secondly: prior to 1910 livestock was increasing in numbers in America; disease did not cause undue concern and the death rate was not large. From 1910 to 1920, however, there was a marked increase in livestock mortality, and from 1920 to 1925 livestock diseases spread in all sections of the country and the death rate mounted to very high figures. Then from 1925 to the present time contagious diseases broke loose and became so widespread and so fatal that new records were established in the number of diseased animals,

deaths from diseases and slaughterings on account of disease. **THESE OFFICIAL FIGURES CLEARLY SHOW THAT ANIMAL DISEASE AND MORTALITY HAVE IN-**

CREASED IN ABOUT THE SAME RATIO AS THE INCREASE IN THE USE OF VACCINES AND SERUMS DURING THE SAME PERIOD.

Third: authorities agree that vaccination of livestock not only gives the animal vaccinated the disease it was vaccinated to prevent, but it infects other healthy animals in the same flocks or herds. This undoubtedly explains the tremendous recent increase of animal diseases.

#### Vaccinators Self-Convicted

Fourth: we are told that originally vaccines were used that contained only one kind of virus or germ, and that later when these were found ineffective vaccines were substituted containing mixed germs or virus. As the animal body must throw out each and every disease germ thus injected into the system by natural methods, this method of mixing vaccines has undoubtedly placed three and four-fold work on the bodies of farm animals in the maintenance of their health and without doubt is another important cause of the present alarming spread of disease among farm animals.

Fifth: from 1910 to 1925 vaccination of farm animals was employed mainly to CURE disease. When this failed an intensive propaganda was started for the TESTING and VACCINATION of farm animals to PREVENT disease. What excuse is there for taking healthy animals and thus filling their bodies with filthy disease germs? This rapidly growing practice beyond any doubt is the final cause of the rapid increase of diseased farm animals. It is undermining and menacing our food supply as nothing else is.

If the above conditions do not fully account for the present unusual spread of farm animal diseases, then what does? Will someone explain why in the name of common sense these diseases spread rapidly as the practice of vaccination spreads? What can the medical and vet-

erinary professions show for all their work in attempting to stamp out these diseases? After so much and such long stamping why is it still necessary to stamp so hard? There is only one answer: Their method is wrong. **The people's money has been consumed to spread disease and not to stamp it out.**

You can fool some of the people some of the time, but you cannot fool all the people all of the time. The following will bear out this statement and also substantiate the writer's contention that it is now time to outlaw vaccines and serums.

#### The Testimony of Doctors

Dr. Eugene Underhill, M. D., Philadelphia, says: "In spite of

the Herculean efforts put forth along the tuberculin testing line, there are good reasons for believing that the test itself may be a factor, if not the chief factor, in the spread of disease."

Dr. George Starr White, M. D., Los Angeles, says: "Inasmuch as I have had thirty years of practical experience in studying the vaccination question from all sides, I can say that it is so unnatural that the system of the normal animal will rebel against it. While in one animal it may cause one disease, in another it may cause another disease."

In "Diseases of Domesticated Birds" by Dr. A. R. Ward, B. A. Galligher and V. A. Monroe we find these interesting facts:

**"Bird Pox and Diphtheria:** We made experiments with vac-

cine prepared from the exudates and pox nodules of affected fowls which did not sustain the immunizing value of vaccine prepared by this method. Fowls which have been vaccinated and later artificially inoculated with virulent material have developed characteristic internal and external lesions of diphtheria with accompanying fatalities.

**"Fowl plague:** Attempts to immunize by vaccination with diluted red corpuscles have failed. A slight measure of success by vaccination with virus killed by ether has been obtained. Birds with two vaccinations were protected to a slight extent in that death was delayed."

According to a recent report from the New Jersey College of Agriculture, the poultry experts there hold that **chicken pox vaccination is still in the experimental stage.**

Dr. J. F. Baldwin, A. M. M. D. F. A. C. S., addressed the Ohio Medical Association, June, 1920, and among other clean-cut statements to doctors he said: "The treatment of diseases or their prevention by anti-toxins, serums and vaccines is still very largely in the experimental stage, with grave doubts as to the value of the vast majority."

Holland in January, 1928, abolished compulsory vaccination.

Dr. B. A. Beach of the University of Wisconsin recently addressed an open letter to Mr. Samuel L. Althouse of Poultry Item magazine, which was in part as follows: "While hesitating to throw out the present blood test without having a better system to substitute for it the Wisconsin station has discontinued it greatly and recommends that it should not be considered seriously in connection with state and national plans for bacillary white diarrhea eradications. The California, Minnesota and Colorado experiment stations obtained results similar to ours. We realize that white diarrhea infection is of considerable importance. It

is not as important, however, as most people think inasmuch as most chicks from reacting hens if brooded properly will survive alright."

### Food Pollution Goes On

J. D. Roberts, nationally known poultry breeder and former editor of Poultrycraft, says: "Poultry are being vaccinated for a multitude of diseases. Why not go to the root of the evil of disease and eliminate the cause rather than have birds suffer the miseries of inhuman torture by sticking them full of holes and injecting deadly poisons with which the market is so full these days? Those of us who went through the last war in uniform remember the shots we had to take. **How many died in the hospitals from "shots" that were never fired from a gun?** You remember how they shot us full of anti-flu serum during the flu epidemic; **but did you read about the death rate?** Vaccination is a fiendish procedure."

Prince T. Woods, M. D., one of America's ablest livestock authorities, recently stated in a leading poultry journal, the following: "The profitable life of a fowl is brief—only a few years at the most; usually not much over two years. There is no time to spare for disease. Domestic fowls when given half a chance are naturally healthy and hardy. Normally they have great powers of resistance to disease. The same is true of well-hatched baby chicks. They are born to live and thrive, and with common sense and care and management they will do so. For almost a lifetime I have been in close touch with successful poultrymen. **When any group of educators with salaries paid by the taxpayers spend the greater part of their time harping on and broadcasting details of loathsome diseases with grisly illustrations which tend to sicken the public and are of value only to pathologists; when they discuss, ad nauseum, many elaborate methods of treatment; when their own station flocks**

**are far from being examples of freedom from diseases; instead of being qualified to preach doctrines of health, vigor and vitality, it should be obvious that they are lacking in certain essentials necessary to teach others.** The poultry journals can help by cutting out most of the stuff about poultry diseases, particularly **the horrible illustrations which are enough to make folks decline to consider eggs and poultry as fit for human food.** Why not eliminate this sickening stuff? **Let the veterinarians have it in their own special publications, and give us something more wholesome and useful."**

Long ago I began to specialize in nutrition and found that there are no better or more wholesome foods for supplying animal protein to mankind than fresh milk, new laid eggs and prime quality poultry meat from well-fed, healthy stock. But for many years most of our so-called instructors and investigators seem to be playing the devil with the sale of all three.

### Government Admits Failure

Dr. P. D. Dunbar, Assistant Chief of the Food, Drug and Insecticide Administration of the United States Department of Agriculture, a short time ago said that there are no known remedies for contagious abortion in cattle, hog cholera, influenza of dogs, horses and other animals; tuberculosis of cattle and poultry; distemper of dogs, cats and foxes; bacillary white diarrhea of chickens; fowl cholera, roup, diphtheria and chicken pox, and blackhead of turkeys.

This official has placed himself in a bad hole any way you look at it by this statement. If there are no remedies for the above known diseases, why does the government continue to permit, sanction or ADMINISTER serums and vaccines as alleged cures? On the other hand, if there are remedies for these diseases, why does not the government with its costly departments and scientific equip-

ment for finding remedies, find them? May the writer ask Dr. Dunbar, why does the government issue licenses to thousands of firms that make and sell serums and vaccines? If it is to prevent diseases, why, then, does the government continue to issue these licenses when the vaccines and serums fail to prevent them?

### Let Nature Do Curing

On the other hand, Dr. Dunbar and all others who believe that most livestock diseases can't be cured, either are very badly informed or don't know any better, **and it's just too bad,** because many of the diseases that Dr. Dunbar listed CAN BE and ARE cured. Personally, the writer has cured roup, diphtheria, chicken pox, canker, pneumonia and blackhead in chickens and turkeys, and several other diseases of cattle and pets. He admits that it is difficult to help animals that have been vaccinated once or twice and are literally rotting to death from these serums, but even in such extreme cases he has successfully treated and cured flocks—not just experimental pens of six or twelve birds, rats or guinea pigs, but real flocks of 6,000 to 10,000 birds owned by individual farmers on the verge of financial ruin as a result of too much experimental science and not enough common sense advice and help. If government officials do not know, or honestly believe, that diseases can't be prevented or cured without vaccines and serums, why don't they study the facts and learn the truth?

In conclusion let me call the reader's attention to the fact that not only has there been a tremendous increase of diseases and death among poultry, cows and hogs, but our entire agriculture is bordering on destruction from insect pests. Fruits, nuts, vegetables, cotton and other important crops are in grave danger from these pests. God made birds to keep down

# The Medical T

## Article I

### The Author Makes 18 Serious Charges

**F**OR more than a quarter of a century the cry has been raised that the nation's health is in the hands of an unscrupulous medical trust. And for 25 years the mocking answer has been: "Prove it."

It never has been proved. Here and there individuals stifling in the grip of the trust pointed to a fact here and a fact there—enough to convince themselves, perhaps, but not enough to convince others, including the legal authorities with power to start prosecutions.

In the following articles we will present proof in the form of facts and documents that the American Medical Association with headquarters at 535 North Dearborn Street, Chicago, is the most powerful trust ever organized in the history of the world.

We will show that its power and influence menace the public health and endanger the constitutional guarantees of freedom.

In these articles we can touch in a cursory manner only the "high lights" of this amazing monopoly. In the evidence to be presented in this series will be found proof of the charges made. The organization is so vast, and its ramifications so interlocked that it is necessary, if the scope of this series is to be presented even in a fragmentary form, to make broad statements proof of which must be given later.

To support some of the charges we offer incidental proof, sufficient in itself to startle the country from its lethargic attitude toward the trust. We will present facts and documents to prove:

1—The American Medical Association controls virtually all medical and health activities in the United States.

2—We will name the state medical societies which have achieved complete monopolies in medical and health matters, and present the laws in these states which forbid monopolies.

3—We will show that the code of ethics of the American Medical Association, to which all members bow, is little less than a conspiracy against the public, and that it tends to obstruct the true course of justice.

4—We will present the cleverly worded contracts, signed by thousands of physicians throughout the country in which they agree not to testify against fellow members who are sued for malpractice.

5—We will show that the American Medical Association tells governors of many states whom to appoint to health supervising posts.

6—We will present documents to prove the shocking and menacing extent of commercialism in the sale of drugs and medicines.

7—We will show that United States Government officials help to maintain and extend the monopolistic power of the American Medical Association.

8—We will show that thousands upon thousands are spent by the American Medical Association lobbying, and that political officials who do not obey its dicta are terrorized by threats.

9—We will show that physicians who do not conform to the American Medical Association's plan of things are hounded and persecuted.

10—We will show that this association, having secured a stifling grip on all things medi-

cal in this country, is now extending its power into other countries.

#### Other Serious Charges

These few points are sweeping in scope. To these will be added many, many other items too numerous to be detailed in a summary, but sufficiently startling to amaze the nation.

We will show that from its very inception, the American Medical Association planned to secure a complete monopoly under the pretense of doing it "for public welfare." In the prosecutions of the most powerful trusts and monopolies in the world the defendants invariably claimed that the stifling grip was actuated solely by a desire to benefit the public. The courts declined to entertain such pretense, but this old threadbare alibi has been used by the American Medical Association and used well to achieve its goal; but when one digs a little under the veneer of "public service" one finds selfish interests seeking their own ends. This is not theorizing; we shall present evidence in support of these statements.

The development of this organization, which has grown in the past 25 years to the point where it menaces the health, life and liberty of the American citizen, is a fascinating tale, for it discloses the machinations of a group of shrewd men who took an inconsequential society and spun a gigantic spider's web from it that now casts its shadow on the entire nation. The details of how this web was spun, how the organization operates, its extent, ramifications, influence and power are astounding, for this trust not only works through its own branches but also through the most wealthy and influential "independent" organizations active in health work.

# Trust Unmasked

## Controls Medical Education

Medical and health activities are indissolubly bound with the practice of medicine, and to gain control of these activities the American Medical Association had to dominate medical practice at its sources: the medical schools and the subjects taught there. If to this could be added the power to revoke the license of a physician already in practice, then the control would be complete from beginning to end. That the American Medical Association achieved such control will be shown; more, we will present evidence to show that this autocratic organization has been the means of putting out of business those medical schools which did not obey its dictates.

From its very inception the American Medical Association discoursed frequently and exclusively about "promoting the science and art of medicine" as its motive for existence; actually, and the records still exist, which we will show, the chief objectives of this society was to better the finances of its members, to join them together in closer bonds for self-protection. And these motives are dominant today despite all the pretty phrases that the nation is stifled for its own good.

In those early days when guided by a group of shrewd men, the A. M. A. set out on its swashbuckling career to dominate the nation, it incorporated as a non-profit making association and received the benefits of such incorporation. That it is a profit making corporation we will show with figures from their own books, figures which the A. M. A. keeps under lock and key.

This association with its branches known as state medical societies, its councils, sec-

tions and committees, extends into every state in the union, into every city, town and hamlet in the United States. In those few places where the control is not yet complete, the organization is fighting grimly to obtain the power necessary to complete the control that can be used to stifle competition, though federal anti-trust laws ban associations that can stifle competition. We shall show that this monopoly operates in restraint of trade, though federal anti-trust laws forbid combinations in restraint of trade. We shall present details to support these assertions. We shall name the states wherein monopolies have been granted to the American Medical Association, and present the laws of these states which forbid monopolies.

## Conspiracy of Silence

What is the talisman which enables this trust to foist itself upon the nation and "get away with it?" This very natural question leads us to the much-talked-of code of ethics of the American Medical Association. So much has been written about this code and so little is known about it; yet this is the talisman, and its strength lies in just one word: Silence! The secrecy engendered by this pall of silence keeps the public in ignorance of vital facts which threaten its very life. Physicians universally adhere to the code for many reasons, chiefly, because it protects them from the consequences of their ignorance or carelessness.

From under this blanket of silence has come all the blather which the medical trust has spread far and wide; with this protection it has achieved its present high pinnacle. This astounding document, the code of ethics, will be presented to the reader, for it plays an im-

portant part in the operations of this menacing monopoly.

But startling as this document is, it is not so startling as the second line of defense the medical trust erected in its desperate effort to protect itself from the consequences of its ignorance. We shall show that almost half the doctors in the United States are bound by agreements not to testify against their colleagues who may be sued for malpractice. We shall exhibit photographic copies of the contracts that you may see for yourself the situation existing in anti-trust America; more, we will name the states where physicians are bound by agreement so that you may know exactly what chance you have of the justice guaranteed you by the laws of your state, if the attending doctor should maim or kill the one nearest and dearest to you.

So terrific is the force of silence, so fearful is the average doctor of becoming a pariah among his fellow practitioners if he breaks the code, that the truth of what happens in the sick room seldom leaks out. The code enjoins upon the doctor a "public-be-damned" attitude. "We cannot disclose that a man's leg has been amputated needlessly because of a wrong diagnosis. He could sue us and the public would lose confidence in our ability to treat. Our interests first; our protection first: the public be damned."

## Protects Malpractice

We shall present evidence of this attitude; for among other things we shall show that the most noted surgeons in the country have placed themselves on record in their own hand writing as having amputated legs and arms needlessly—and

## Article III

### Why Play the Game to Lose?

 HE wise man insures his life against loss by death to provide the earning power taken away from those dependent upon him in the event of his premature departure; to cancel or offset the mortgage on the home; to pay indebtedness, as a protection against the deprivation of comforts or luxuries of life which by custom have become a positive necessity.

The wise man insures against

this unforeseen loss adequately, therefore, he must carry the greatest amount of pure protection for the least possible premium. He does not confound investment with insurance protection. He does not sign blindly on the dotted line for he knows that there is no type of insurance that is worthy of being called investment. In the purchase of his insurance protection he keeps as close to the "natural premium" as possible. In order to do this he has to know a little something about the article he is purchasing, therefore, we are now going to discuss rate-making and take up the different types of policies later. There are going to be but few types of policies the writer cares to recommend, but undoubtedly you will want to know how rotten the rest of the mess is when analyzed with a degree of intelligence.

### Fact and Theory About Rates

To make clear the process of rate-making and what is meant by "natural premium:" At age thirty the American Experience Table of Mortality calls for 8.43 deaths out of every one thousand persons. Now if we want to insure one thousand persons as of age thirty and each in the sum of \$1,000, all that we have to do is to collect \$8.43 from each of the one thousand individuals. This gives us an insurance fund of \$8,430 which naturally will allow the payment of \$1,000 on each of the 8.43 theoretical death claims. Excuse the use of the word theoretical, for this word has been chosen advisedly, especially since the ratio of the actual to the expected mortality is as one is to two. In other words the insurance companies allow two funerals for each death. Now that I have had this little fling at the insurance practices, I guess I had better proceed with rate-making.

In the same way and continuing to use the same antiquated and unfair American Experience Table of Mortality, we find at age forty there will be 9.79 deaths in each thousand, and at age fifty 13.78 deaths, making the "natural premium" or actual cost of insuring these respectively \$9.79 and \$13.78.

Now perhaps it is beginning to dawn upon you that rate-making and insurance computations are not as obtruse or profound as you have been led to believe. Perhaps you are not half as dumb as the insurance companies have made you think you are. You can understand insurance and you are going to understand insurance by the time you have finished these articles. Further, you are going to know how to purchase insurance protection intelligently.

### Very Easy to Understand

It is harder to compute the cost of a loaf of bread or a pound of butter than to compute the cost of life insurance, unless we combine all sorts of ridiculous side contracts with our insurance protection, such as endowment and insurance combined. When you combine these two distinctive elements it is like purchasing a horse and getting a chance to win a set of harness with the proviso that if you win the harness you have to give back the horse. Well this is another story we are going to tell further on when you start to learn how foolish some of the insurance policies really are. The writer is impatient and wants to tell the whole story at one time for he fears that you will not have the patience to continue until the last, but you must, for it means thousands of dollars to you. It means protection to your family instead of a little coffin money. For the sake of your loved ones and for the sake of horse sense, do not miss a single paragraph or a

single article. Read them twice or three times if necessary to make them percolate through your brain, then see that your friends and fellow-sufferers have a chance to get insurance-wise.

### Cold Facts About Premiums

Let us get back to "natural premium." Surely you have followed this simple explanation and interpretation. Now let me ask you a question. Do the premiums charged by the insurance companies bear any relation in uniformity to the "natural premium?" Not by a distance. This is where the trickery and the finely spun insurance theories come in to befuddle your brain.

Here are some of the premium rates for \$10,000 of insurance protection, as of age 35 and in some of the best known and largest Insurance companies in America:

Kind of Policy	Yrly. Premium
Five year term	\$ 89.50
Ten year term	119.10
Twenty year term	162.40
Ordinary Life (Whole Life)	268.11
Twenty Payment Life	383.40
Fifteen Payment Life	458.72
Twenty Year Endowment	519.11
Fifteen Year Endowment	695.22
Ten Year Endowment	1,058.76
Single Premium (Paid once only)	4,115.50

Now let us look this cost sheet over and we will find that the prices range from \$89.50 per year for the \$10,000 worth of protection to \$4,115.50 for the same protection. Some difference; What the —? Why the —? How the —? Who the —? It should be as clear as mud that if the insurance companies can and do carry the first listed protection for ten years at a yearly cost of \$89.50, any policy-holder carrying any of the rest of the poorly selected policies who chances to die before the end of the tenth year and has thereon paid in excess of the \$89.50 for the aforesaid \$10,000 protection, has made a juicy donation to the benevolent insurance company. Well why kick? The insurance companies must need the excess premiums they extract from the gul-

lible public, or otherwise they could not be so benevolent.

### The Premium Graft

Now take your pencil in hand and for yourself compute the value of the overpayments for a period of ten years. You will gasp. When you have caught your breath do a little more figuring and let us add 6 per cent compound interest, which the victim would have received had the excess payments been placed in some guarantee building and loan or other good security. Make this last mentioned computation slowly for the net result may affect your heart action unless you have prepared yourself for the shock.

The difference in premium between the first type of insurance, namely the term insurance and the ten year endowment, is just \$969.26 each year. This sum if paid in advance into some guarantee building and loan or other reliable investment, the same as you would have to pay in advance to your insurance company, but earning compound interest at the rate of 6 per cent per annum, at the end of the tenth year would amount to exactly \$13,540.56. Some difference! Why the —? What the —? Who the —?

### Forfieted Policy Graft

The first thing I know I am going to get ahead of the story and show you how poor an "investment" endowment insurance is, therefore, back we must go to rate-making. It certainly is interesting, isn't it, to see how simple this supposedly complex subject is when we begin to use our think-tanks a little bit and do not allow the smooth-tongued insurance agents to tell us all about it in their well selected language which uses the words "INVESTMENT and THRIFT" without regard to the facts in the matter? Lest we get too cynical, let us remember that after all the insurance companies are looking after the public good and they realize that the average man can not and does not save without being forced

to do so and naturally he should be penalized. This is where the benevolence comes in the strongest with the insurance companies. Just how much the insurance companies are hogging through this unfair profit and this deplorable condition of affairs permitted by law, may be indicated by figures taken from the report of one of our outstanding insurance companies. "In July, August and September, 1922, the company paid 2,398 claims of deceased policy-holders, as follows:

108 died in the first year of insurance.  
125 died in the second year of insurance.  
403 died between the third and fifth years.  
397 died between the fifth and tenth years.  
809 died between the tenth and twentieth years.  
556 died between the twentieth and fifty-sixth years.

2,398 Total"

It is again perfectly evident that the great majority of the above listed deaths occurred before the twentieth year. This great majority forfeited all payments made to the benevolent insurance company which were over and above current cost of insurance.

### Figures Authentic

Some of these dry figures were necessary in order for you to get the full picture and not take anything for granted. Remember all figures quoted are taken from United States government reports or from the reports of the insurance companies themselves. We are not dealing with theories in these talks but actual facts. As we proceed, we will learn further how overpayments are collected and extracted from the dear public that the insurance companies may herald to the insuring world their benevolence and their deep regard for the character of the funds collected and the general welfare of widows and orphans. Until these cheap tricksters are exposed and driven from the field of psychological experimentation confusion will reign in that field of research. With charlatans and tricksters out of the way there may then be an opportunity for honest science to open the doors that lead to the Great Beyond. That is why TNT is exposing the Tricks of Mediums.)

## Article IV

### A Famous Trick in Slate Writing

**M**EDIUMS practice many slate writing tricks. Famous among them is one I will now attempt to describe and explain.

This is what the sitters see: they are ushered into a room wherein the medium sits at a table on which repose six or eight small size slates and another slate somewhat larger—about two inches longer and four inches wider. On the table is a dish containing water.

The medium gives the sitter a piece of writing paper about five inches long and four inches wide and asks him to write his question or message for the spirits and then fold the paper three times with the writing concealed inside.

While the sitter is writing his message for the particular spirit of the departed with whom he wishes to communicate and folding the paper the medium strolls away in apparent unconcern and does not

seem to see what the sitter is doing at all.

When the sitter's message is written and the paper folded the medium takes an envelope from a drawer and holding it in his left hand with the front side of the envelope toward his palm, asks the sitter for the letter. The sitter gives the letter to the medium, takes it in his right hand and slowly inserts it in the envelope. This is done in such a way that the sitter sees every movement. He sees the edge of the letter he has just written and folded after it is in the envelope. He has never had his eyes off from this selfsame letter and is positive it is the same letter.

The medium now seals the envelope in plain sight of the sitter. Nothing has happened in this whole process that would suggest the possibility of sleight-of-hand performance. In order to completely satisfy the sitter that the selfsame letter is in the envelope he calls attention to the fact that the envelope is semi-transparent and holds it up to the window light for inspection. The sitter sees his letter plainly inside of the envelope.

#### Burns Up Message

"I am now going to burn this envelope and letter," the medium tells the sitter. At this the medium reaches into one of his pockets and takes out a match, still holding the envelope and letter in the other hand. He strikes the match and applies the flame to a corner of the envelope and holds the burning envelope and letter over the dish of water until the fire has burned almost to his fingers and then drops the charred remains into the dish of water.

"The answer to your message will appear on one of these slates," says the medium, taking up the slates. He then instructs the sitter to take the slates and examine them and satisfy himself that they contain no writ-

ing, and clean them to his own satisfaction. After the sitter has examined the slates and found them free from writing the medium instructs him to stack the small slates in a pile with the large slate on top of the pile. While the sitter is doing this the medium calls to an attendant outside to bring him a drink of water and leaves the room to meet the attendant and get the drink.

Returning to the table the medium takes one hand of the sitter and places it on top of the pile of slates and at the same time places one of his own hands on top of the pile. After the lapse of a few minutes he examines the slates for a message from the spirit, but finds nothing. He then piles them together again. A few minutes later seeming dissatisfied with results, he takes up the large slate and slowly writes on it, medium fashion, with his eyes half closed and his body going into occasional slight convulsions. He then opens his eyes and reads aloud the message. The sitter informs him that it bears no relation to the message or to the spirit written to. Then, seemingly dissatisfied, the medium moistens his fingers, erases the writing and places the slate on top of the stack.

#### Marvelous Result

He now places his hands on the stack of slates again and after a time examines the larger slate for writing; but it is free from writings. He now lifts up some of the smaller slates and examines them for writings; but as he finds none he scatters the slates over the table and stacks them up again and places a cloth over them, instructing the sitter to place his hands over the pile. The medium walks away to another part of the room and after a few minutes says: "I am sure you have your message."

The sitter unstacks the slates and examines them one at a

time while the medium looks on from a distance. Finally, somewhere about the middle of the stack on a small slate the sitter finds a most marvelous message. It is not only signed by the spirit that the sitter has written to, but it answers his questions in a wonderful manner.

Naturally, the sitter is tremendously impressed and in most cases believes that the writing could have appeared only through the intervention of a supernatural agency. Did he not see his letter to the spirit burned to ashes before his eyes without anyone in the world besides himself knowing its contents? Did not the answer come on one of the small slates which he had examined and found no message on before and which the medium had not touched further than to pick up and place in the stack of slates? How then could this message have come signed by the very spirit addressed and answer the identical questions asked, unless the spirit had written it?

### Trick Envelope

Here is the explanation of the trick. **THE MEDIUM USES A TRICK ENVELOPE.** This is the way he does it. After the sitter has written his message and folded the letter the medium comes forward with the trick envelope in his left hand. The envelope is an ordinary envelope in which has been placed a piece of writing paper folded three times identically like the piece of writing paper containing the message to the spirit. This folded paper is stuck by a very little paste to the inside of the back wall of the envelope. About the center of the front wall of the envelope is a horizontal slit large enough to allow a paper of this size folded three ways to go through.

When the medium is ready to put the letter written by the sitter into this envelope, he holds the envelope in his left hand with the slit side next to his palm so that the sitter can not see the slit. He can not see the folded piece of paper

inside the envelope as it is close against the wall of the envelope next to him, and the envelope is held in such a way that it is invisible to him when the flap is raised to put his letter into the envelope. The medium takes the sitter's letter in his right hand, raises the flap of the envelope and inserts this letter in the envelope. But what he really does is to shove the lower edge of this letter through the slit next to his palm while the upper edge remains visible just inside the envelope. Looking at it carefully, the sitter sees the identical letter he wrote inside the envelope, while the blank paper of the same size and kind which had been put in the envelope before the seance can not be seen. The medium now seals the envelope with the real letter sticking through the slit into his palm and the blank paper in the proper position in the envelope.

He now holds the envelope up before a window to show the sitter that his letter is still there. The two letters are in corresponding positions in relation to the envelope so that the light shining through the window reveals what looks exactly like one letter in the envelope. The sitter is sure that this is his letter. The two letters conceal the shadow of the slit.

Announcing that he will now burn the envelope and letter, the medium reaches toward his left pocket for a match. In order to do this he has to transfer the envelope to his right hand. He keeps his own eyes carefully on the letter as it is transferred to his right hand. By a well known principle of suggestion this causes the sitter's eyes to follow the envelope in its journey to the medium's right hand, and permits the medium to perform the real trick.

### The Real Trick

**The real trick consists in the medium's slipping the real letter out of the envelope through the slit with his left hand and**

**transferring it to his pocket while he gets his match.** As the letter is part way through the slit this is not hard for a practiced medium to do. Ninety-nine sitters out of every hundred will follow the envelope closely, since it is the center of interest and the medium also keeps his eyes on it all the time. This gives the medium ample opportunity to take out the real letter through the slit and put it into his pocket while getting a match without being caught doing it.

Now as the medium burns the envelope and fake letter to ashes the sitter, who does not suspect the existence of the slit in the envelope, fully believes that he sees his own letter to the spirit burning up.

At this juncture the medium finds an excuse to leave the room for a minute or two for water or something else and while away reads the message to the spirit which he takes from his left hand pocket. When he returns he has only one thing to do—get the answer to that message signed by the proper spirit on a slate. All the slate juggling that follows is for the purpose of getting this done.

### Slate Writing Explained

This is the way he does it. You will remember that after he has the sitter stack up the slates with the larger slate on top and wait for result a few minutes, he examines the slates and finds nothing on them. He then piles them up again and after waiting for results takes the larger slate and writes on it an answer which he then reads aloud. Finding it has no relation to the message or spirit addressed, he moistens his fingers and apparently erases it. **He really does not erase it. It is the answer to the letter in his left hand pocket, AND IT IS NOT WRITTEN ON THE LARGER SLATE.**

When he picks up the larger slate he picks up closely pressed underneath it one of the smaller slates. He keeps this next to

## Do You Know?



### Why One's Hair Stands Up During Fright

You often see pictures of the hair on a person's head standing up in the comic strip. Do people's hair really stand up when they are frightened? It is scientifically known that on rare occasions of extreme fright that there are muscles at the roots of the hair that tighten and become tense and in doing this they sometimes cause the hair, if it is not too long, to stand straight up.

### What Happens When a Ball Bounces

It flattens and then regains its shape so quickly that it throws itself a considerable distance off from the ground or floor. The side of the ball flattens that strikes the floor and as it flips back immediately into its real shape it flips itself up into the air with considerable force. Every solid thing has a force within it tending to hold it to the shape it happens to be in. This force is called elasticity. The elasticity of solids varies greatly. A rubber ball is so elastic that if it is dropped a considerable distance to a floor, its own weight will cause it to keep bouncing back a considerable number of times. But this is nothing compared to the elasticity of atoms. Invisible gases are composed of atoms so small that you cannot see them. Their elasticity is so perfect that they are kept apart indefinitely in the form of gases by bouncing against each other.

### Why Lamps Burn Brighter With Chimneys On

Because lamp chimneys create a draft that feeds the flame with oxygen, the substance that causes things to burn. One-fifth of the air is oxygen, an invisible gas that causes fires when it unites with other substances. Composing only a smaller frac-

tion of the air, oxygen ordinarily cannot come in contact with substances it is burning fast enough to accomplish fast and complete combustion. It has to be carried through the fire more or less rapidly by a wind or a draft to accomplish perfect combustion. When the lamp chimney is off, the air around the flame is still. There is not enough oxygen in the flame. The carbon in the kerosene does not burn at all, but is turned loose as smoke. The moment the chimney is put on an artificial draft is created through the flame. This supplies plenty of oxygen. The carbon is all burned. The fire immediately becomes hotter and brighter and there is no smoke.

### Why Hair Grows After Body Stops Growing

At a certain age one stops growing, but the outside covering of the body keeps on growing as long as we live—namely, the hair, skin and nails. Why? Because the outside covering of our bodies has to keep on growing to replace the wear and tear, while if the rest of our bodies grew all our lives we would grow too big for our own good. For instance, if the skin did not grow underneath as fast as it wore off on the outside, it would soon grow thin from wear and after awhile the flesh would be exposed and we would die. The hair and nails would wear off our bodies if they did not grow. On the other hand if our bodies continued to grow throughout life they would become unwieldy, cumbersome and difficult to feed and clothe in the struggle for existence. We would never become adults. Feeding our growth would prevent putting our energies to better purposes. If we became as large as elephants or whales we would not depend so much as

now on our wits and intelligence to exist. The fact that we stop growing at a certain age and remain as small as we are is one of the conditions that developed our intelligence and placed us at the head of the animal kingdom. Nature keeps our outside covering growing throughout life in order to prevent it from wearing out, and at a certain age stops our bodies from growing in order to secure the best results in our development.

### How the Pen Got Started

The cave men learned that some rocks are harder than others and were better to mark with in the making of their pictures. Later, they learned that a hard rock, like flint, with a sharp edge made picture drawing easier. Incidentally, they learned how to flake and sharpen flint. Then they learned that a sharply pointed piece of flint was the best thing then existing to draw with. Pointed flint as a drawing instrument was the father of the bronze and iron stylus, which came after men learned to smelt copper, zinc and iron.

The stylus was a long metal pencil with a sharp point on one end, which men used with which to write on mud and wax tablets, before paper was invented. With the invention of parchment, papyrus and paper came ink or paint for writing on these. The Chinese solved the problem of applying ink to parchment or paper by developing a slender, pointed brush which they use to this day. The Europeans invented the reed, which is the father of the pen. The reed was a slender piece of cane or coarse dried grass cut on one end like a pen. From the reed came the quill, which was a large feather cut on the large end the shape of a pen. The modern steel or brass pen is merely a copy of the quill in metal.



# Things Worth Knowing



## To Prevent Freezing of Meters and Pipes

Add glycerine to water in the proportion of  $\frac{1}{2}$  pint to 1 gallon of water. Glycerine does not affect the metals of which the meters are composed.

## To Prevent Soot from Coal Fires

Mix chalk, 2 oz.; salt, 7 oz.; dried magnesium of sulphate, 1 oz. and put in fire.

## Protect Walls from Dampness

Mix three-quarters of a pound of mottled soap with 1 gallon of water and lay over brickwork steadily and carefully with large flat brush so as not to form a froth or lather on the surface. Let remain for 24 hours to become dry. Mix  $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. of alum with 4 gallons of water. Let it stand 24 hours and then apply the same as the soap over the coating of soap. Let this be done in dry weather.

## For Window Freezing and Sweating

Dissolve 55 grams of glycerine in one liter of alcohol to which a little amber oil has been added for scent. As soon as the mixture is limpid rub inside surface of window with it using window chamois or linen rag, which not only prevents the freezing but also the dimming and sweating of the window. This mixture will slowly collect dust, so that it has to be rubbed off and renewed occasionally.

## To Make Ceiling White

Ceilings that look rough and manifest a tendency to peel should be gone over with a solution of 1 oz of alum and a quart of water. This will remove the superfluous lime and render the ceiling white.

## To Find Hole in Pipes

Ignite soiled cotton waste and sulphur and blow the smoke in-

to the drain or pipes. If the leakage exists in the latter inside of the house the smoke and smell both issue forth and generally tell where the fault lies.

## Keep Windshield Bright in Cold Weather

An onion cut in half and rubbed over windshield of your auto will keep it bright and clean in cold weather.

## To Clean Potatoes for Baking

A piece of steel wool is better than a brush for cleaning potatoes for baking. It cleans them better and does away with the water and spatter.

## To Open Windows Easily in Cold Weather

If in the winter you sprinkle salt on the ledges of the windows you want to open during cold weather, you will find that they will open easily.

## To Prevent Runs in Silk Hose

When the threads in your silk hose catch on chairs or in putting them on, pull the caught thread through to the wrong side and brush on a small amount of liquid nail polish. This will prevent runs and will not wash off.

## Easy Way to Wash a Quilt

Examine the quilt and if you find soiled spots soap them and rub with a brush. Hang the

quilt on a strong line and turn the hose on. When one side is washed turn and wash the other. The water forces its way through covering and cotton or woolen batting inside, making quilts as light and fluffy as when new. Squeeze the corners and ends as dry as possible.

## Keep Refrigerators Clean

Refrigerators tend far more to become unsanitary and unhealthy than most people suspect. See that the sides and walls of all refrigerators are occasionally scoured with soap, or soap and slaked lime.

## To Remove Fish Bone from Throat

A raw egg taken immediately will carry down a fish bone that has lodged in the throat.

## To Save Tablecloths

To save your tablecloths from being soiled at mealtime by the children or careless members of the family, put sheets of wax paper under the plates.

## To Make Oven Heat Quicker

In case you have a gas or electric stove, open the oven door two or three minutes after you light the stove and let the damp air out, leaving it open a few seconds. The oven will heat in a much shorter time than otherwise.

Melt butter in skillet. Add sugar and cook until it bubbles. Add fruit and nuts, and then prepare the following cake mixture and pour on top of above and bake 40 minutes:

- 1/4 cup of butter or lard,
- 1/2 cup sugar,
- 1 egg,

## Nut Bread

- 1 cup sugar,
- 1 cup grape nuts,
- 1 cup nut meats (walnuts are best),
- 2 cups sweet milk,

Take large head of cabbage. Remove as much of stump as possible. Soak in hot water 15 minutes. Turn bottom side up and soak in hot water another 15 minutes. When it is wilted so that you can press the leaves apart, take 1 lb. of ground sausage, 1 small onion chopped fine, 1 cup of rice washed clean and mix together with salt and pepper to suit taste. Press leaves of cabbage apart and lay this mixture inside; then press cabbage into shape of head and tie with cloth and cook in salt water 2 1/2 to 3 hours.—Mrs. Marguerite Garlock, Clinton, Iowa.

### My Huskies

How many boys here in the United States have seen a "husky?" Right this minute I long for my team of huskies but I left them up there in the ice and the snow. Why? Because I knew they would not be happy down here without their beloved snow, their sleds and the familiar smell of spruce trees and the taste of their favorite dish—frozen white fish.

My huskies were my sled dogs. Daddy taught me the difference between huskies and other sled dogs. They have wolf blood in their veins—that is the reason they are called huskies. Up in Alaska they are called malemutes.

How I loved those animals! Maybe you have read somewhere that these dogs chew persons up, but that is not true at all. I loved them as much as I did human beings and they returned that affection a hundred fold. When daddy and I made the rounds of our traps we took the dogs and the sled, and my team always shared every last bit of white fish we took along for food.

Many a time it was 60 degrees below zero but my dogs had great, bushy, shaggy coats of fur and when you looked at them very closely, you could discover another crop of short fur close to their hides. When I couldn't find any spruce boughs for the dogs and daddy and I to rest upon, the dogs would lie right down on the ice and snow and take long naps without so much as getting cold or wet.

The dogs have coarse fangs and they are squat and wide in build. But the strangest thing I discovered about them was that they cannot bark. Yet what

they lacked in barking I found they made up for in howling. Their mournful howls can be heard for miles and miles. Their huge, bushy tails, which they carry arched high over their backs, give them a majestic carriage.

Out of harness my team could scarcely be told from real wolves although most of them weighed between eighty and a hundred pounds. One of my Athabaskas was so pale a fawn during the winter that he was called a white dog while the other one had enough white markings to distinguish him from a real wolf. I love dark colored dogs but I always favored my pale dog more than the other.

Dad gave me the pale one when he was just a pup and I broke him to harness. He disappointed me, though, for he was too much wolf and not enough dog to stand the long trips. He was also quarrelsome and always picked a scrap with the other dogs. But one day when we were out on a tributary of Big River a pack of real wolves closed in on us. Trusca, my pale dog, proved the best fighter I had. He had played out long before we had reached the river and I had unhitched him and let him ride the sled. As though he were very grateful for the rest, he vanquished the very last wolf and saved our lives.

Here in the United States I watch boys hitch their dogs to little wagons and endeavor to drive them. Those are times when I wish I had my dogs with me, but they are far away in northern Canada. They pull their weight in skins, fish, meat and any other freight. When we traveled light, they made 80 to 90 miles a day, but when the

trails are unbroken and deep, the dogs could make only about 25 miles a day.

At times when the trail was unbroken, we had to go ahead of the dogs and break the trail with our snowshoes. One day father accidentally speared himself while catching some fish for our meal and I had to go for the doctor at the clearing about 50 miles away. I was about two days on the trail going, but our return with the doctor man was made in less than a day, even with his extra weight, just because the trail was broken.

I have seen pictures in books of men with whips lashing their dogs into obedience, but no good team of sled dogs ever feels the lash. There is too close a comradeship and dependence between a driver and his huskies for any such cruelty. Every real dog team driver sees that his dogs have their meal before he thinks of preparing his own supper.

Did you ever know that sled dogs that are being worked eat but one meal a day? If they eat in the mornings or eat more than one meal a day, they can't travel fast so their one meal has to be so strengthening that they need only it. I fed my dogs meat and scraps and boiled rice and bacon fat, or frozen white fish, but the latter was usually their sole diet when we were on the trail.

You have heard of the Kentucky derby where horses run to set a speed record—just so do the dogs race in northern United States and in Canada. The dog derbies are far more interesting than horse-racing, for at the derby of dogs you see dozens of different types of dogs. You see the stag-hounds, the police dogs, the collies, the great Danes, the St. Bernards and

Resolution carried unanimously. Immediately a wet from Wisconsin addressed the Speaker.





# Facts for Farmers

## Tests Show Flushing Increases Lamb Yields

The practice of extra feeding of ewes at breeding time to increase the number of lambs by increasing the number of twins is called flushing. Government experiment just completed with 20 lots of ewes with 18 ewes in a lot showed an increase of an average of 18.7 lambs per 100 ewes by flushing.

The most pronounced results occurred with Lot 18 of unflushed ewes and Lot 20 of flushed ewes, the latter gaining an average of 8.15 pounds in weight or 6.6 pounds more than Lot 18, and increasing the number of lambs dropped by 47 per 100 ewes. The experiment showed that in order to produce the largest number of twins, ewes should gain at least 7 pounds per head during the breeding season.

Comparing grain with pasture as best feed for flushing, the experiment indicates that there is no decided advantage in the kind of feed used other than the saving in labor and expense when sufficient good pasture is available.

The influence of the age of the ewe on twin production shows a gradual increase up to 6 years. The rate of lambs dropped by ewes two years of age was 111.4 and at six years 161.2 per 100 ewes. The four best breeds of breeders were the Dorset, Lincoln, Oxford and Southdown. Mating rams and ewes that had been born as twins did not seem to increase the proportion of births. However, there seemed to be some increase in per cent of lambs produced by ewes from twinning strains of a given breed.

There is no material difference in the size of twins and singles when fully developed. Although at market age twin lambs do not weigh so much as singles, the difference in weight is so small compared to total weight of the twins that twins are far more profitable than single lambs.

## Protect Pigs in March from Roundworms

(From "A Calendar of Livestock Parasites" by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.)

In your spring farrowing operations follow the system of swine sanitation developed by the Bureau of Animal Industry. This will enable you to avoid large loss from such parasites as roundworms and from kindred conditions associated with dirty hog lots, such as bullnose and similar troubles. It will not prevent losses from bad breeding, bad feeding, bad management, bad judgement, chilling, accidents and similar causes; you will have to prevent these by appropriate measures. However, the system of sanitation has paid big returns to the men who have used it. It will pay you. Write to the Agricultural Department,

Washington, D. C., for Leaflet No. 5 (18).

Don't leave your scattered straw stacks to breed stable flies. Plow straw under or burn it. Write for Farmers' Bulletin No. 1097 (3). Scatter manure on the fields to prevent fly breeding. Write for Farmers' Bulletin No. 1408 (10).

Dip that tick. The cattle or fever tick transmits Texas fever, reduces beef and milk production, makes costly and annoying quarantine necessary. Ticky cattle sell from one-half to 2 cents per pound less than tickless cattle. Southern cattle owners in areas quarantined for the fever tick should begin now and by dipping every 14 days until November eradicate the pest. In regions where the blue bug or fowl tick occurs, spray henhouses, and especially the nests, with anthracene oil. (See Farmers' Bulletin No. 1070 (2)).

## Fleas Can Be Killed At Breeding Sources

Fleas, those unmitigated household and farm pests, can be exterminated far more easily than generally supposed according to valuable recent findings of the U. S. Department of Agriculture. The scientists engaged in this work have traced fleas to their breeding places and have succeeded in eliminating them from the places tested by destroying the breeding places.

If breeding places receive proper attention, says the report of the experiments, the premises often will be cleared of fleas, even though little or no attention is paid to the animals themselves.

Fleas breed in greatest numbers on soil or in dust containing vegetable and animal matter protected from wind, rain and sun, but at the same time furnished with a certain amount of moisture. All animals and poultry should be prevented from going beneath buildings, the vegetable and animal matter carefully cleaned up, the infested areas sprayed with creosote oil, and the ground where the immature fleas are developing covered with salt and thoroughly wet down. House infestations may be prevented by eliminating pet animals and applying gasoline to the floors after all rugs have been removed and the floors thoroughly scrubbed with soap and water. Applying derris powder to pet animals or washing them in a comparatively weak solution of saponified creosote or kerosene emulsion will destroy the fleas upon them.

## How to Make Your Fence Posts Last

The government forestry service has been conducting experiments with non-durable woods for several years and has definitely determined that the farmers can save much money by buying

preservatives and preserving these woods before using them. The forestry service has proved conclusively that with proper preservatives woods that rot in two or three years can be made to last from 15 to 30 years.

Straight creosote was the best preservative found, but as creosote is rather expensive, it was found that coal-tar creosote mixed half-and-half with some cheap oil like water-gas tar, water-gas tar creosote, gas oil or spent crank case oil would serve. In mixing oil with creosote it is best after stirring the oils together very thoroughly to allow the mixture to settle and then use only the liquid portion.

Only sound wood should be selected for treatment. This should be thoroughly peeled. It is best to peel off the inner bark also as this often prevents the creosote from penetrating the wood. The wood should then be seasoned as the water must come out to let the creosote in. The wood is best seasoned by open piling. The seasoned wood is then treated by giving it first a hot and then a cool bath in creosote.

Fence posts and other posts to be set in the ground are treated in the following manner: The ends that are to go into the ground are set upright in a large kettle, tank or vat of creosote heated to 180 to 220 degrees Fahrenheit and left there an hour or more. They are then transferred to another large kettle or tank of creosote heated to about 100 degrees Fahrenheit and left for an hour or more. Another way is to set the posts in a large kettle or tank or vat of creosote heated to 180 to 220 Fahrenheit and after an hour let the creosote cool and leave them in the cooler bath an hour. Enough of the posts should be treated so that when they are set in the ground about six inches of treated wood will extend above the level of the ground.

## Late Plowing Best to Kill Parasites

The later fall plowing can be done the better. Late plowing kills the worms and parasites in the soil. Don't harrow your fall plowing in the fall. There are four decided advantages in fall plowing. First, it gives a man a better chance to distribute his work and his hired help as work is less pressing this time of year than in the spring. Second, if the land is covered with sod, weeds, or other growth, plowing this under in the fall gives it a chance to decay, and thus add valuable plant food to the soil. Third, fall plowing is the most efficient way to destroy many insect pests and their eggs. Among insects destroyed in this way are the European corn borer and the white grub. Fourth, alternate wetting and drying, freezing and thawing of the soil during the winter will improve the tilth of the soil. This is especially true of heavy soils.



### To Cure Horses of Colic

Give the horse the following to relieve the pain, which is a full dose for a large horse: tincture of opium, 1 oz.; tincture of ginger, 1 oz.; sweet spirits of niter, 1 oz.; chloroform, 1 oz. For a small horse or a slight attack less may be given. After relieving the horse of the pain with the above give as a purgative 1 pint of castor oil or 1 quart of linseed oil. A dram of oil of turpentine should also be given.

### How to Increase Yield of Cow's Milk

Feed three pounds of silage for each 100 pounds liveweight of the cow; all of the hay she will eat, and in addition approximately .4 to .45 pounds of grain for each pound of milk over 16 pounds produced for Holsteins, and .55 to .60 of a pound of grain for each pound of milk produced over 10 pounds for Jerseys. Feed legume hay—alfalfa or clover, etc.—if possible. If you have no legume hay and have to feed grass hay, feed more grain. This system of feeding will cause your cows to produce to their limit, if they are kept warm, comfortable and in good condition.

### For a Kicking Horse

Put on the harness and trip ropes. Take a stick about four feet long; wrap a gunny sack around one end and tie it. Allow the horse to examine it with his nose. Then rub it over his body and legs. After he becomes submissive to the pole, tie sacks of hay to the traces and breeching. Then continue this lesson until he pays no attention to them. Here is a good lesson to give before driving single. Fasten a long pole on each side of the horse with one end to drag on the ground, the other to be

fastened to the shaft carrier. Drive him around with these. If he attempts to kick, command, "steady," and pull him to his knees. Continue the lessons until he submits to the poles dragging between his legs and all around him.

### Quick Gape Cure for Chickens

Take a wooden box a little bigger than a biscuit tin and divide in two by means of a piece of wire netting. Place half of an ordinary brick, heated in a fire, on one side of the wire netting, and the chicks on the other side. Cover the whole box with a cloth, and then insert under the cloth a tablespoon containing carbolic acid. Pour the liquid on the hot brick and withdraw the spoon. Take out the chicks before they are apparently suffocated. Usually the fumes will cure the chicks in about two minutes. If the chicks are not cured keep them in the fumes a little longer. Be careful to keep the hands and face away from the liquid when it is poured on the brick, as it will blister the skin.

### A Cold Box for Use in the Summer

Make a wooden frame the size of the refrigerator you want. Hang a sash on hinges to fit the front for a door. Have shelves of poultry netting placed inside. Cover whole frame with burlap or duck or heavy grade of osnaburg sewed together to fit the frame. Have flap in front to cover and fit door so that refrigerator can be opened and shut without taking cloth cover off. The refrigeration is produced by keeping the cloth covering damp, the evaporation of water in the cloth cover often producing a temperature as low as 50 degrees in the summer.

The cloth covering is kept wet automatically by the following method: The cold box is set in a pan of water in such a way that the cloth covering touches the water and draws the water up by capillary attraction. A square pan of water is fitted down on top of the refrigerator and kept nearly full of water. Wicks run over the sides of this pan on the cloth covering and by capillary attraction draw water into the covering.



# Chats With Our Doctor



## Acidosis: Its Cause and Cure

What is acidosis? It is a condition of excessive acidity of the blood and tissue fluids resulting, among other things, in chronically sour stomach, indigestion, constipation, headache, nausea, auto-intoxication and the sickness, dizziness and mental confusion that accompany auto-intoxication. It breaks down the system and prepares it for the more devastating and deadly diseases of mal-nutrition, such as ulcers, tumors, cancer, rheumatism and tuberculosis.

Acidosis is literally a modern scourge arising from wrong habits of eating. It has become an alarming widespread menace. Many people nowadays complain of chronically sour stomachs. They are victims of acidosis or they are on the way to this condition.

In many cases the victim treats sour stomach or "heartburn" with an alkaline compound like common baking soda in order to affect an immediate removal of the discomfort. The soda quickly neutralizes the acid and the person feels almost instant relief. But the acid condition returns soon with an onset as bad or worse than the first. The dose of soda is repeated; the acid attack again repeats itself and this hopeless fight goes on while the victim slowly gets worse. As a matter of fact, soda and similar alkalies immediately neutralize the acid in the stomach and form neutral salts but these salts later tend to increase the acid condition in the system. The unfortunate person who once gets into this vicious circle is surely on the way to an early grave.

## Cause of Acidosis

The only way to remedy acidosis is to treat the cause. What is the cause of acidosis? The cause of acidosis is eating more proteins or more starches than the system needs. The proteins are the muscle building foods such as meat, eggs, cheese. Modern man has fallen into the deplorable habit of eating too much protein. He has developed a false appetite for this class of food. Protein merely repairs the tissues—machinery—of the body that wears out. It does not require a large amount to do this. When a person eats more protein than is necessary to do this, this excessive amount of protein cannot be stored in the system; it has to be eliminated through the kidneys. This often overworks the kidneys and delays elimination. This delayed waste matter tends to sour and poison the system.

Carbohydrates (starches, sugars, and fats) supply the heat and energy for the bodily machine constructed out of the proteins. We need more carbohydrates than we do proteins because carbohydrates are continually burned in the body to supply heat and energy; but an excess of carbohydrates, especially an excess of starches, produces an acid condition in the stomach and blood. Nature has made provision for the storing of carbohydrates in the body, but when this storage capacity is reached the excess has to be eliminated and tends to turn into acids and poisons.

## Normal Blood Alkaline

Healthy blood is mildly alkaline, which is the opposite of acid. **The alkalinity and purity of the blood is the foundation of health. Acid blood is a dangerous and destructive condition.** Blood can be restored to its nat-

ural alkalinity and acidosis cured by (first) reducing your protein diet—meat, eggs, cheese, etc.,—to the natural requirements of the body, (second) cutting down your consumption of carbohydrates, especially starches, to the natural requirements of the body, and (third) by eating more green vegetables, especially raw green vegetables, such as lettuce, celery, radishes, onions, and more fruits that have acids which turn to alkalies in the body—acids of lemons and oranges.

When you get down to a healthy diet you will be surprised at the small amount of proteins required. For instance, if you eat two eggs each morning for breakfast you soon get tired of eggs, showing that two eggs provide an excess of proteins, whereas if you eat one egg for breakfast, eggs will continue indefinitely to taste delicious to you. The same is true of meats. The American people are destroying themselves more by excessive meat eating than by any other dietary practice. If you eat meat sparingly you will enjoy your meat more and it will not poison you. Eat meat with vegetables rather than with starches, such as white bread.

Many people have cured themselves of excessively sour stomachs by merely cutting down their starch diet. It is very important in maintaining the alkalinity of the blood not to eat too much starchy food, especially white bread. **Eat whole wheat bread.** It contains more mineral salts, more vitamins and more roughage to assist in elimination. Don't eat too many potatoes. Potatoes are good food if not eaten immoderately, but they are largely composed of starch.

Dear Mr. Baker: Just why do so many housewives lose a lot of their home canned or bottled fruits and vegetables. I have had friends tell me they lost all their cherries, peaches, raspberries, tomatoes, etc. And they continue to explain why as follows: "Maybe I fail to sterilize the jars, or have poor lids or rings. Maybe the season was too dry or wet," whichever it happened to be. "Maybe it was the poor sugar the grocery company sold me." "Maybe it was just my poor luck."

Now pages and pages of literature may be written on the above subject, but I will tell you in just a few words what I think caused me to throw away quarts and quarts of fruit and vegetables—it was the aluminum kettles I used in which to prepare the fruits and vegetables. Since discarding the aluminum for granite, out of 289 quarts of fruit and vegetables I canned last summer I think only two quarts spoiled. Is that just luck? Or is it lucky I changed from aluminum to granite?




