We have put together the following samples of sightings, which are all on file and received by Data Research for 1990

Deddington – Oxfordshire .

A Mr W.C was first attracted by a stationary flashing object high in the sky. The object was much brighter than the stars surrounding it and larger in size.

He watched it as it flashed intermittently for 5-10 seconds then stopped and moved off about 5° and then flashed again for a further 5-10 seconds. The flashes were much brighter than strobe landing lights at the airfield.

He states "It was definitely stationary as I lined it up on the top of an Electricity Pole and in no way did I mistake it for a satellite as I have watched these pass over on numerous occasions".

He was convinced the light came from a definite source and not a reflected light. He proceeded to go indoors to fetch his son and wife to come and have a look but when he returned it had gone.

Seaton, Cornwall.

Mr DM was taking his dog for a walk at 10.08pm and as usual was looking upwards to watch the night sky when he saw two objects travelling northwest to Southeast.

He thought it was unusual, as meteors or shooting stars do not normally fly side by side. "These two went alongside each other beautifully and both were the same size and in view long enough to count seconds".

The description of the objects were as follows: Shape was round, with colour yellowish white and there was no sound, the brightness of the objects were comparable to a flare.

The objects disappeared over the hills and trees.

Belgium Report

Numerous reports of a huge triangular UFO in Belgium during November 1989 had put the country's Air Force on red alert. On March 30th 1990 the pilots found themselves confronted with an "unknown". The Belgian Government has released all the information on this case, which involved ground and airborne radar confirmation plus working in co-operation with a civilian UFO group The Société Belge D'Études des Phénomènes Spatiaux (SOBEPS).

On the 30th March 1990 a Captain of the national police at Pinson reported seeing a UFO to the Belgian Air Force and "Headquarters" decided to make a serious effort to verify the report as in addition they had received numerous calls from the general public. Verification came from two radar installations that also saw the UFO. One radar is at Glons, southeast of Brussels, which is part of NATO defence group and one at Semmerzake west of Brussels, which controls the military and

civilian traffic. The range of the two radars is 300 kilometres, which amply covers the area where the reports were made. Atmospheric conditions were excellent and there was no possibility of false echoes due to temperature inversion.

At 00.05hrs the order was given to the F-16s to take off and find the intruders. The lead pilot concentrated on his radar screen, which at night is his most reliable vision. The F-16s are fitted with very sophisticated equipment, including chase radar, which is not fixed directly ahead of the airplane, but makes a wide search in an arc of 90° left and right of the nose.

At 00.13hrs suddenly the intruders were spotted on their radar screens and the onboard computers pursued the target. As soon as lock-on was achieved the target appeared on the screen (diamond shaped) and they remained tracking the object automatically.

(Before the radar had locked on for six seconds) the object had speeded up from an initial velocity of 273 km/h to 1,796 km/h while descending from 3,000 meters to 1,700 meters in one second! This fantastic acceleration corresponds to 40 Gs. It would cause instant death to any pilot. The limit of what a pilot can take is about 8Gs. The trajectory of the object arriving at 1,700 meters altitude then it dove rapidly toward the ground at an altitude under 200 meters and in so doing escaped from all the radars both flying and on the ground.

It is at this time obvious that the UFO deliberately tries to avoid lock-on. Everything pointed to the fact the object was intelligently directed to escape from the pursuing planes. During the next hour the same scenario was repeated twice.

There were a great number of witnesses on the ground that saw both the F-16s and the object. The encounter lasted for up to 75 minutes.

This case has all the hallmark of a classic UFO sighting and that maybe there is something out there!

Scotland

Mr IW was standing on his doorstep at 10.40pm engaged in conversation with his next-door neighbour.

They were commenting on the amount of stars in the sky when Mr. IW saw an object which he pointed out to the neighbour. As it was much brighter than surrounding stars and they could clearly see through the clouds moving quickly across the sky they were sure it was not just an ordinary star.

They discussed what they were seeing and tried to rationalise it as they scoffed at the idea of a UFO.

The shape was described as Star-like and coloured white. It was very sharply outlined and they watched it for nearly 2 minutes only disappearing from view due to cloud cover.

Bicester Oxfordshire

Whilst walking his dog through the allotments Mr. PCC noticed a bright light in the general direction of Bucknell.

He observed the object for about 10 minutes in which time it remained in a stationary position.

The object, after this time, rose up into the sky and at the same time came towards him for about 20-30 seconds. It was by then a distance of about ½ mile away. It then veered to the right and it was at this point Mr. PCC could see four smaller lights underneath and also as it veered he could see four or more protruding arms.

The object then moved away out of sight in the direction of Fringford.

He said the most strange thing about it was there was no noise at any time during the sighting.

Littlemore Oxford

Mr CJT at 09.33 was called by his wife to ask what this object was coming towards them from the south in the sky.

Mr. CJT went outside and saw a large black disc shaped object coming towards them at very high speed.

The object seemed to flutter from side to side. When it reached above and to the left of them it rolled over twice reflecting the sun on the upper part. It then ascended in a vertical flight until it disappeared from view.

They both observed the object for up to 2 minutes. There was no noise and no vapour trail emitted from the craft at any time

Weston on the Green, Oxfordshire

Mr. LKV was watching the flying at RAF Weston on the Green during the mid afternoon.

As he was looking directly upwards he saw a tiny white speck, very high in the sky. It was right over the airfield and the 'planes which were flying over the airfield all day were flying up to 12,000 feet seemed unhindered by its presence and the staff of the station seemed totally unaware.

When Mr. LKV looked at the speck through powerful telemeters he saw the speck as a cluster of bubbles, like 15 or 20 balloons tight together regular and colourless with no other visible features except being transparent.

The cloud was at 2-4 thousand feet and the object appeared to be above them. Due to its apparent great height and unfamiliar appearance he was unable to estimate the size of the object.

Marston, Oxford.

Mrs SCC was called by her son that he had seen a strange orange triangle. She thought it had been a 'plane but he was insistent it could not have been. The time was 10.30pm

A few minutes later she went to look through the bedroom window and saw what she at first thought was the moon, though it was far larger and lower than she had ever seen it. The object shaped globe-like, had an overall orange glow – similar to the orange of street lamps and at first appeared to have some cloud or shadows across, which disappeared, as it got lower.

At first, it was just hanging above the buildings in the direction of the city and gradually sank diagonally to the right, behind buildings and trees. As it sank it changed shape appearing more elongated before it disappeared from view.

It gave her the impression of being like an air balloon but then it would have to have been much larger and there was no flame visible or basket. It wasn't until she'd heard the radio that others were reporting these phenomena that she decided to report it herself and she could verify this with her son's sighting earlier.

Oxford

Whilst driving home along the (A40) northern by pass at 3.15pm Mr. MM saw a bright yellowish light in the Northwest.

It appeared to be over or just beyond Kidlington, Oxford. The lights were stationary and Mr MM viewed it for about a minute.

As he drove on, the light being very bright as the sun he stated, seemed as though it shimmered before disappearing.

It was a muggy day with low cloud base and he concluded that its disappearance may have been due to its covering of the clouds although he couldn't be sure.

Red Ball in sky sparks UFO mystery

Residents of several Co. Down towns have been mystified by the sudden appearance of a UFO.

Witnesses have reported seeing a "red or orange sphere" in the sky above Rostrevor and Warrenpoint.

A pharmacist from Carlingford on the southern side of the border says he photographed the mystery object on Easter Saturday. He had been taking photographs when he was shocked by a sudden noise.

"I heard a terrible loud noise, my first reaction was to cover my ears with my hands. I then saw a dome shaped object hanging and spinning in the sky and there was an orange colour all around it.

After a few minutes it descended down to the ground. There were three bulges at the base of it, and it had turned a bluey/purple colour".

"I am not into UFOs at all and have always been very sceptical about such things but there was certainly a craft of some nature hovering in the sky".

An interesting look-back on the beginnings of crop circle mania for 1990.

The expectations for 1990 were extremely high compared with 1989 and in the event we were not disappointed. By early May, formations began to appear in greater numbers than ever before and by the end of the month incredible new developments were taking place. Circles were now accompanied by rectangular features, multi half-rings, dumb-bells and spurs. In fact some of the formations were now "systems" or "pictograms" as they became popularly known. In spite of all the extra appendages the new shapes still remained perfectly symmetrical. The advent of these new features must have sounded the death knell of the plasma vortex theories promoted by TORRO. In fact this organisation arranged an international conference at Oxford Polytechnic on June 23rd to endorse their Crop Circle theories. From what we hear photographs of the latest formations with the rectangular features were kept well covered up. Later on outrageous claims were made purporting that the rectangles, spurs etc., were added on to the ordinary circle formations by wandering Hippies to make them more interesting! (i.e. The circles were formed by Plasma Vortices but the rectangular extras were added later).

By mid-July the estimates coming in indicated over 300 formations had generated in Wiltshire alone. Unfortunately the excessive temperatures in late July and early August ripened the cereal crops so rapidly this year that the majority of fields had been harvested by August 10th. No doubt a great many formations remained undiscovered but a number of farm workers reported circle sightings while cutting the crop and arranged for the press to photograph these before final harvesting. This was most likely to happen on very flat terrain where it was difficult to see indentations in the centre of the field from the roadside.

As well as the quantity of formations being reported the sheer size of the new "pictograms" was becoming quite mind-boggling by mid July. One in a Ministry of Defence field in the Vale of Pewsey was reported 1/8th mile in length and the formation we discuss later (The Alton Barns giant) was measured by us at just less than 200 yards in length.

The new developments were kept out of the National Press until mid July, but after one of the giant formations was shown in colour in 2 or 3 daily newspapers, there then followed a rash of hoaxes circles for years. The Sunday Tabloids tried to outgun each other in producing the best tall story and photographs. Several organisations offered substantial rewards for anyone who could explain how the Crop Circles were formed. The Sunday Mirror had £10,000 available. It is not known if these monies have been paid out.

On July 25th a hoax was created in a field being continuously filmed at Bratton Wilts. The observers were so convinced they had captured a circle formation, they immediately informed the BBC who put out news bulletins. Two hours later painful retractions took place!

Quite an exciting summer-----

THE WINCHESTER-CHEESFOOT HEAD FORMATIONS 1990

An amazing array of Crop Circles/Systems formed at this well known Mecca for circle creation between May 17th and late June, within a distance of 2 miles from the start of the A272 east of Winchester. It could be called a mini "solar system" with no less than 8 formations – each different – found in various fields along the road. The field known as the "Devils Punchbowl"

with a panoramic view from the top of the hill was "visited" on May 17th. There was what appeared to be a single ringed circle except that the ring was situated almost midway across the circle and could be termed an inverted ring of standing corn in a standard circle. This particular field has been an attention grabber almost continuously over the past ten years with many new shapes appearing there. A week later, May 24th-25th the first formation with rectangular features was born (see diagram A). The other formations then appeared up to the end of June.

A CIUFOR survey of the area took place on Sunday July 15th. The party was accompanied by a psychic. The following comments were made by the psychic who became extremely emotional after spending some time in formation "B".

Psychic's Comments:

- a) Smelt burning immediately on leaving car about 100 yards from formation "B"
- b) Received telepathy inside the circles of "B" but could not point to a source. Telepathy was strong.
- c) Felt very emotional – tremendous elation – like a loved one returning from the war.
- d) In an emotional state cried out "It's not for us".
- e) Felt healing power was present.

During our visit to the formation one of the cameras being used jammed, but freed itself on moving away from this field. Other investigators have also reported this happening.

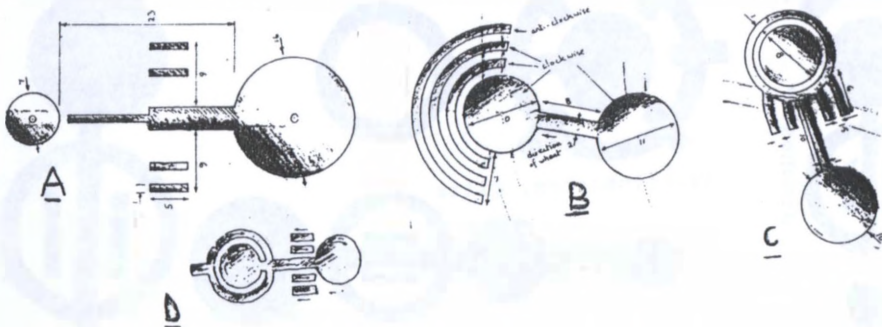
Dowsing Report:

The following notes are from Michael Soper's dowsing of various formations. Four structures were dowsed at Cheesefoot Head. Older looking formations showed no response or alternatively a "threshing" impression (sweep-left, sweep right alternately). Note we cannot tell whether the effects are due to the structure itself and its geomantic placing, or subsequent interest by, say, nocturnal UFOs examining the sites – just as they examine defence, nuclear and power plants.

- 1) Structure "B" Dumb bell shape with triple crest: a) weak threshing impressions in the crest. b) circle with crest – centripetal effect on walking clockwise, centrifugal on walking anticlockwise. Circle without crest – centrifugal effect on walking clockwise, centripetal effect on walking anticlockwise. c) Joining shaft – no impression.
- 2) Structure "A" At bottom of hill in same field as "B" dumb-bell with out riding rectangles. a) Rectangles – strong impression of linear force. b) Circles weak threshing impression in both directions. c) Shaft SW-NE sinusoid but weak.
- 3) Structure "C" Dumb-bell with one ring and double appendages on both sides. a) Appendages –outer upward force, inner downward force. b) Ring – sinusoid all the way round c) Ringed circle anticlockwise increasing sine – then off. d) Other circle; anticlockwise – even out, odd inward force.
- 4) Structure "D" Dumb-bell with one ring and appendages pointing towards ring (4 of them) a) Appendages - strong vertical wave along length. b) Nothing on shaft. c) Un-ringed circle – clockwise direction stronger on outer edge; anticlockwise – blocked. d) Ringed circle – clockwise – sinusoid, anticlockwise – fine detail thrown out.

What can be made of these impressions? The weak "threshing" impression records the mechanical process by which the circles were made. The other, stronger impressions may indicate what the different symbols are intended to represent. The two circles in 1) gave an impression of turbine blades, left-handed and right-handed. 2) was too weak to mean much. 3) appears to represent another kind of machine – but what? 4) also needs thought and I shall report back.

Evidently, much more thought is needed before the exact meaning of the 'impressions', some of them very strong are gained. Note that the symbols which gave the strongest responses also gave a very positive movement of the suspended pendulum regardless of which person held the bob.



Numbers and shapes:

The final tally for circles has been put at 500 counting individually formed separate circles. (i.e. a quintuplet counts as 5) plus 28 of the unique pictograms which appeared for the first time in 1990. This figure of 500 can only be an estimate – others put it at 1000 and we have not established if the hundreds of mini-circles or “grape shots” seen around some of the larger formations were included in the total.

It is apparent that the 1989 figure of 250-300 circles has been doubled at least and this seems to have been the trend over the past four summers.

In terms of shapes, the latterly formed pictograms were breathtaking. More completely new building blocks or components or “skills” were shown. Curved paths and triangles made up a series of 3 bizarre shapes in a field near Beckhampton, Wilts and a strange new combination of the rectangular boxes inside a ring and bisecting path appeared like a new road sign on 3 pictograms at least. A formation was created overnight on August 3rd a few yards below the earlier pictogram denoted in “C” at Cheesefoot Head, Winchester. This pictogram was slotted together in about 20 components with such skill and symmetry that one could describe it as a “Mathematical Dream” – a beauty in very ripe wheat. Further afield large pictograms and enormous rings were reported from Lewes, Sussex; Litchfield, Staffs; Peterborough, East Midlands and Norfolk. A selection of these formations is shown in the diagram on the next page.

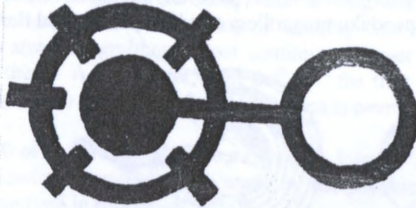
Skills: A list of 18 building blocks has evolved over the last years and now another 3 items can be added to the growing list.

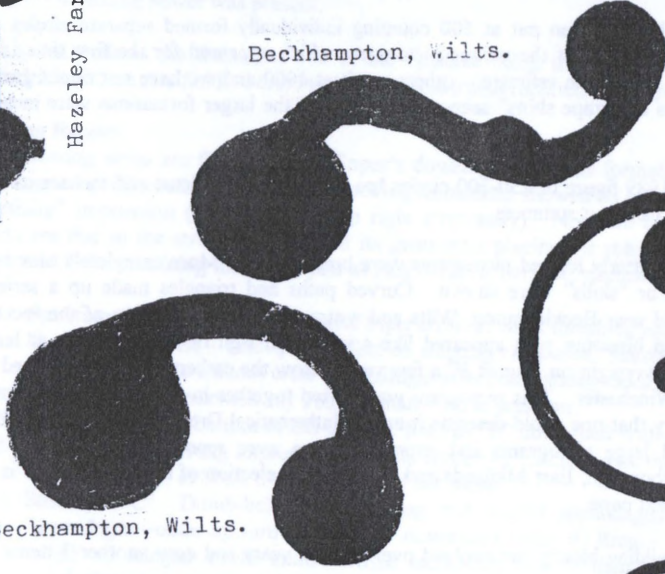

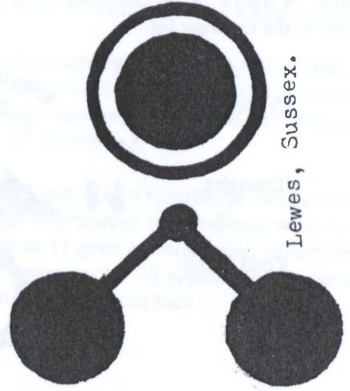
