Under the above caption, Medical Doctor William Bolton, as the Editor of the said department in "today's health", a monthly publication of the American Medical Association, wrote in its March 1953 issue an answer to an inquiry about:—

"COLOR THERAPY

Question — A friend tells me that a method called color therapy is now being developed by which various illnesses may be treated successfully. Do you have any information about this?

Answer — From time to time, theories are advanced that color may have value as a treatment adjunct in medicine, but we do not know of any evidence that a specific disease ever has been cured through the use of color alone. Various colors may have some value so far as mental attitudes of many patients are concerned, and this idea has been utilized in some hospitals. For example, walls and ceilings of hospital wards or rooms may be painted a light blue or green because such tints are believed to have a soothing effect. In general, colors probably should be considered for their secondary effect in helping a patient to overcome excitement or worry about an operation or illness."

MEETINGS OF JUNE 2, 1955

First Allentown Pennsylvania Studio

N. S. — Before we go into anything else, I like to read a letter from our Chairman offering her Resignation as Chairman, without assigning any reason. So, we shall have to select and recommend a new Chairman.

J. F. — I think C. K. would be good.

E. M. — I nominate C. K.

E. L. — I second the nomination.

(The Vote being unanimous in favor of C. K., she was recommended to the Council of Trustees, under our By-Law 34, Section 2, for appointment to the Studio Commission for the balance of the year. Meanwhile the Vice-Chairman took charge of the Meeting.)

P. H. — I received my Family Health Protector now.

M. B. — May I say that if you want any literature, order through our Reporter. It goes quickly that way.

E. L. — My grandson pinched a Thumb in the car door. Used Turquoise Local; stopped crying after 10 minutes. I also had Poison. Used Green, Blue and Lemon.

E. M. — I had Hemorrhoids for years. While cleaning, I moved the Refrigerator and they came out. I used Indigo Local and it gave me Pain. Used Orange Local.

M. B. — You treated for relief. Go after the cause. It is the Blood Stream. Varicose Veins in the Area. Clear the Digestive Tract and the Blood Stream. I had a man who traveled a great deal; had them so bad he could not sit to drive. Used Orange Systemic for the Circulation, Blue for the Heat and Yellow on 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10. First Detroit Michigan Studio

P. S. — I have been having trouble with my Teeth lately and on going to the Dentist, he told me it was Pyorrhea and they will have to be taken out. He also spoke about an X-Ray treatment, but, it is quite costly. He suggested I should have the Teeth all out at one time and 30 days later, he will begin with the Dentures in sections.

C. R. — Pyorrhea is a common ailment in older people. There is nothing that can take the place of Natural Teeth, so one has to think it over very carefully. Years ago, my wife was troubled with a persistent Backache and finally was advised to have her Teeth out, which she did, but, the Backache stayed. After the birth of the last child, that condition disappeared; it had nothing whatever to do with the Teeth! Personally speaking, just about the time I heard about the Color Therapy, I was having trouble with my Teeth. I was informed that my Teeth were so short that the Nerves were exposed. My Gums were very sore. The Dentist suggested that the Teeth be capped or the Nerves be killed. I thought before I have that done, I should try the Color. J. J. — Lemon is a wonderful Color and is excellent for Broken Bones. They will heal in half the time.

C. R. — If you use Lemon to heal a Breakage, you will never be pothered with Pain in that Area. There is nothing to beat the Lemon.

H. P. — I tonate regularly and feel well; Magenta and Orange.

J. B. — This was quite an experience for my wife and me. Our daughter became ill and we thought at first it was the Flu. Thinking that, she was tonated with the Turquoise. About the third day, she began to complain of Pain in her Right Ear. I thought the Turquoise would take care of it, but instead, she became worse. At times, there was a very high Fever; the Temperature would soar upto 106 Degrees. With such Fever, we switched from Turquoise to Blue. Under the Blue, she would sweat profusely. Later, she was troubled with Chills and we had to use Hot Water Bottles and Blankets to warm her. With the Fever fluctuating, I knew the remedy was on the Infra Side, going to the Orange and soon, the Ear began to drain. She began to feel better, but, she was still a very sick girl and not out of danger. I was not satisfied with my own results, I mean in analyzing the case, so called C. R. and A. G. Both suggested I should call Dinshah and get his advice. I must say right here, if ever you should need help, do not hesitate to call him. I assure you it was very comforting to my wife and me to know he was there. Our daughter was ill with a Double Mastoid condition. We were told to follow instructions implicitly, which we did. I was in close contact with Dinshah, by mail and telephone, all the time. When the Ear started to drain, he cautioned me not to want a condition of that sort to heal too rapidly, because of danger to the Brain. Thanks to the Visible Spectrum she recovered and we were able to make a trip home to Wisconsin last month. I come from a large family and it was the first time in many years that we were to be together. I talked to Dinshah before we left Detroit and if he had said "no," the trip would have been off. I really had something on my hands. I was worried sick about the daughter and on top of that, my father was furious because I did not call in a Doctor. He kept reminding me that I had no right to take such a chance with her life, that the Law would prosecute me for doing so! It became so bad that I began to question if I really were doing the right and yet in the back of my mind, I remembered what happened

to my wife when she was very ill. This happened several years ago. After the birth of our second child, my wife became ill with a Lung Disorder. I called several of the Members and all agreed I had the finest help in the World, but, none had ever handled a case of Double Mastoid. I was about out of my mind with the worry. I felt if I could only talk to someone who had been through such an ordeal and tell me what to expect. I feel if it were possible, cases of this sort should be published with the names and addresses, so that the Members could contact each other when faced with such problems. I feel it would be a wonderful morale booster, because, one's morale can sink very low.

K. R. — But, none can guarantee you anything; not even a Doctor.

J. B. — If we had a place of our own where we can go, we could have there someone qualified to help us.

C. R. — We are not recognized officially; we could not get any Nurse to work with us. It may come some day in the future, but certainly it is not now. You may purchase a Health Library (?) and that lists all Diseases and what to expect.

J. B. — We are all just laymen; we lack experience. The terrible fear that grips one wondering whether we are doing the right, is what troubles. I never saw a case of Double Mastoid before and hope never to see another. I had no idea how such condition develops. I could find no reference to that Disorder in our Text Books.

C. R. — It is a serious Disorder all right. I believe Meningitis is even worse. What is an "Itis"? The Medical Doctors recognize 213 different

kinds. To us an "Itis" is an Inflammation, no matter where in the Body and the Remedy is the SAME! Names of the Disorder play not an important part to us as in other methods of healing. When we become afraid in using Colors, it is because we did not study enough and are not sure of ourselves. That is why attendance in Studio Meetings is so important; here, we talk it over together and study together. You will not get such information anywhere else.

J. B. — We talk about taking the Ratio; when she had those terribly high Fevers, I could hardly count the Kardoscil; it was so fast. Then, after I took it, I was not sure of its accuracy. I feel there should be more co:operation among the Members. When we returned home after the trip to my parents, my daughter woke up during the night and it looked like the Fever was starting again. She was tonated with Turquoise and Magenta. On Memorial Day, she was quite sick and we went back to the Orange. The Fever gradually dropped and she was able to go to school on the Wednesday.

C. R. — Possibly something upset her Stomach. You continue writing to the Institute, until you are told the case is closed.

J. B. — We are expecting our third child in a few weeks and my wife has been going regularly for check-ups. The second last visit she took the little girl with her and told about her having an Earache. The Doctor examined both Ears and reported the Left Ear was all right, but, the Right Ear seemed to be pretty full. He gave her some Pills to take and told her to bring the child the next time she came. The Pills were never used. At the last visit, he examined the Ear and found it had all cleared! No Perforations of any kind.

A. G. — Do not hesitate to put through a long distance call to Dinshah. He will help you and he will tell you when the case is closed.

C. R. — That certainly was an interesting case. (Applause)

A. G. — I know just what he means when he said: "I did not know if I was doing the right thing or not." I had such an experience recently. I have taken very few Tonations, because, I have been blessed with excellent health. I went to bed one night, feeling like my Nose was swollen a little. Next morning, the Swelling seemed bigger, from the Eye to the Jaw Bone. It even affected the Vision. Tonated, but, did not get the results I expected. My daughter wanted to call in a Doctor, but, I decided to call Dinshah instead. He recommended Turquoise and Magenta, saying I must energize the Kidneys. I called him every day, until the Swelling subsided. It was a stubborn thing, but, the Visible Spectrum won. In this work, you have to take a stand and stick to it. What would you say if a man were brought into your office or home with his foot rotting away? The place smelt badly for days and yet, months later, that foot was completely healed, with no evidence of the Gangrene whatever! If J. N. were here today, she could tell you many a tale, so can A. G.

C. R. — To suggest a Color with such scant information, would put us in the same category as those "quacks" that fleece the public. First Merrill Wisconsin Studio

W. B. — We think the magazine we receive from the Institute monthly, reaches all Affiliates, while communications to Studios reach only those present at the Meetings.

E. K. — I am still working in the stone quarry. Am using Turquoise on Areas 7 and 8, Lemon Systemic, Magenta on 4 and they help me.

W. B. — I had severe Pain in the Neck for two weeks. Thought it was a Cold in the system and had not noticed it in the first stages. Irradiated Yellow on the Back to begin, but, it did not seem to have good results. Used 2 Yellow, 2 Magenta on 4, then Lemon. For the tightness in the Lungs, used Orange and went back to Lemon. In two weeks I was normalated.

Member — How about taking Hot Baths in the tub?

W. B. — Tub Baths are not sanitary.

G. V. H. — I had overreached in painting. Used Orange on 18. Seemed to help me. Lemon makes me nervous, especially when taken in front. Turquoise, Magenta and Indigo were suggested. I feel heavy and swollen inside. If there be a Tumor inside, it would have to be tonated with Lemon.

W. B. — I advise you to alternate with Magenta to get good results.

I. K. — I had no Cold all this Winter, but, now have one. It was not warm enough to take a Systemic.

W. B. — Use Turquoise on Area 1, as that is better than not taking any if the room is not warm enough.

I. K. — I go sometimes without Elimination for five days. My food is correct.

W. B. — Use Yellow on 8, 9, 10 Areas. If not satisfactory results, use Orange. I shall now read to you about us in the Radio Program and Television from Visible Spectrum Researcher; also about the Salk Vaccine for Poliomyelitis.



Tub splashing is not sanitary, as the water in contact with Areas 11 and 19 has a chance of splashing on Area 1. Use the tub solely as an outlet for the water, but, under the faucets place a pail and with a mug, pour water

from the top of the Head all over. That method is the only sanitary way. G. V. H. never sent a Chart. I. K. sent two Charts stating one Backelim a day, but, is NOT following Rational Food Of Man System. I may teach, but, can not chase the Affiliates and **compel** them to follow instructions.

K. B. — Last month, you asked about the Theory Of Light. I shall read to you from Chapter 8, of the Healing Triangle Of Light, by Dinshah. (After the reading) Let the new Members look through the Prism and notice the Colors of the Spectrum. Did they explain from where they got the Salk Vaccine?

R. S. — It was in the Chicago Tribune.

K. B. — That newspaper prints more than the other papers. I shall read to you from our Visible Spectrum Researcher.

E. T. — Every time it rains, I get Sweating Spells. Why? I can always tell the day before when it is going to rain. The more I use Red, the more I get Sweating Spells.

K. B. — Have her use Yellow on 6, 7, 8, 9, 10; it is very essential.

O. L. — And eat only for one, not for two!

K. B. — I saw in my 22 years in this work, many babies born that were nice and clean, when the mothers lived on the Rational Food Of Man.

O. L. — If they do not have an Instruction Book, they can buy them now.

K. B. — You may take the opportunity now.

O. L. — It is a "gift." One page of it worth the \$2.00 price.

K. B. — Do not say that very loudly. If you have friends who are interested, give them a Family Health Protector, because, new Students have to read it before purchasing a Color Projector.

F. K. — While the Members are thinking of something to say, I like to say that I was down South while they were injecting the children against Polio; 66 of them died and others were paralyzed. Were I a parent and signed to have my child vaccinated, I should be signing my child's own Death Warrant.

T. perspires; it is the warmest Color in the Visible Spectrum. Before selling a Color Projector, we now have the new Member sign that he (or she) read the Family Health Protector, a complete Request For Membership and a complete Personal Research Information Chart showing the case for which the Projector will be used. This is now strict rule for new Members. What F. K. said is true, but, learned professionals say that those cases would have died anyhow! They say the Vaccine did not give them or induce or intensify the Disorder — it was just a “coincidence”! The cousin of I. P. might not have had any Medicine, but, we have no information on the life habits of the person. When buying any packaged Food anywhere, read the Label for the ingredients. That is all you can do to protect yourself. Then? Take your choice and risk.

First New York New York Studio

R. D. — Did you read on our Magenta Wave? It would be good to bring your Text Book with you, so we could study and discuss in the Meeting. Are there any Case Reports?

A. M. — I fell and hit my Head and Face. I used Turquoise and Green; the Bruises healed nicely.

R. D. — My little son hit the door with the Head; Turquoise took down the Swelling.

M. S. — My little fellow ate a Lollipop with the paper cover on it. A few hours later, he was sick in the Stomach. He was very much in Pain; his Back was red and hot. I could not give him a Tonation, as he would not stay still. I did not know what to do, so I called the Doctor. When he fell asleep, I tonated him with Turquoise. He had a high Fever for two days. His Bowel Movement was thin and white. I tonated with Yellow, Lemon and Indigo. I had wonderful results with the Light.

O. D. — I got a bad Sunburn. The Blue Light took the Burn right out, while in the Back, where the Color did not reach, I had a good Burn.

M. S. — I burnt my Hand with boiling hot Chocolate. Three Tonations of Turquoise and I had no more trouble.

F. P. — My wife is constipated. She is using S..... Since she is on the raw fruit and juice diet, it is much better.

R. D. — Throw away the S..... Tell her to use Yellow on 6, 7, 8, 9, 10. Fill a complete Chart and send it to the Institute. You are a new Member; you have to change your living habits.

F. P. — We do not eat Meat; we eat Raw Vegetables. We drink Fruit and Vegetable Juices; we do not eat White Sugar; we DO eat Honey. We also drink Herb Teas.

R. D. — You need the Brown Rice and Legumes for your Protein.

F. P. — We eat all kinds of Nuts. I came here to learn.

J. Z. — My daughter's baby is throwing up all the time. She feeds her plain Milk and Baby Food from the jars.

R. D. — Put Brown or Raw Sugar in her Milk. I am not for jar feeding. Tonate with Green Systemic.

A. M. — Lemon is an Antacid; I should tonate also with Lemon.

S. K. — I had similar trouble with my baby. The Doctor told me to give pulverized Barley in the Milk.

M. S. — I gave my 3 month old baby a Banana; it must not have been ripe enough; he became sick from it. I had wonderful results with Turquoise. Does anyone know where to get an Electric Bulb?

F. R. — You can get our Bulb from an electric store. I told you before I have a gadget to remove the Chlorine from the Water. It says:— "Removes Chlorine Taste and Odor from the Drinking Water."

R. D. — It says about removing the "Taste and Odor," but, it does not say anything about removing the Chlorine.

F. P. — I fill a glass gallon jug with Water and expose it to Sunlight for a few days.

R. D. — I heard over the Radio that Dr. Salk was asked about Polio. He said:— "What we use now is better than the field tests. We might not get so many cases." They are just guessing.

(The Chapter on the Magenta Wave was then read by R. D.)

S. K. — Would Magenta help for Hardening of the Arteries?

F. R. — Yellow and Magenta will clean out the dross.

R. D. — I was under the impression Orange is used for Hardening of the Arteries.

S. K. — My mother is very nervous; she has Hardening of the Arteries. I can not stop her from eating Meat.

R. D. — Give her Yellow on 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and Magenta on Areas 4 and 18.

F. P. — I heard that when an Animal is killed, it releases a Poison from the Adrenal Glands and that goes in the Meat.

J. Z. — What Light can one use on a Cross-Eyed child? The Doctor wants to operate on it.

R. D. — Fill a complete Chart and send to the Institute.

F. R. — Use Yellow and Orange. I had a hard time to get a Color Projector. My Introducer's brother had Heart Disorder and the Doctors told him to rest for a few years! He used the Projector for a few weeks; it is unbelievable what it did for him. His mother had High Blood Pressure; since using the Projector, she is so much better.

R. D. — We have had many people who came to the Visible Spectrum as a last resort.



Were Members to study our Text Books and follow them, as directions in their daily life, there would be no reason for those so-called "Drives" to "aid" the various causes in the entire country. Just turn the Radio Button any time day or night and you are bound to hear about "Multiple Sclerosis," "Cerebral Palsy," "Poliomyelitis," "Muscular Dystrophy," "Heart Disease," "Tuberculosis," "Cancer," "Care Food Crusade" or some similar Drive which the way it is blared is bound to drive one unquestionably sympathetic if not nutty. M. S. should have tonated with Yellow on 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and the Backelim would have thrown out the paper. There was no need for a "Doctor," any of our Graduate Researchers would have advised her so. Yes, throw away the S..... The man who makes it, is one of my former Graduates in the Illinois Class of 1922. He and his reputable father took the training together and they were both Doctors! However, the son went after the business end of living and marketed S..... and the like. Such products are not needed in our Science. F. P. is intelligent and inquisitive, but, he should thoroughly study our Text Books he has. Raw Fruit and Juice is NOT the Rational Food System. We

are not Ruminating Animals like the Cow, to live on Raw Grass. Let him study page 90 from our "Family Health Protector" for full information about Food Chemistry. He is a new Member and never sent any Chart for self or wife, since receiving the Color Projector. Honey should be avoided; it is the Vomit of the Bee and Herb Teas are truly Chemical Concoctions. He "came here to learn" and he will learn, but, he has to put that acquisition into use. J. Z. should avoid all so-called "Baby Foods." Refer to our Instruction Book under page 85. She should have stated the baby's age. It was inconsiderate of M. S. to give a Banana to a 3 month baby. Females, before being married, should be given a complete Course on what Marriage, Pregnancy, Childbirth and the like entails. It would mean much happiness. I shall have to write a separate volume on those important subjects, away from age-old, erroneous concepts. The Institute will supply the proper 1,000 W. Electric Bulb for \$7.00, which includes postage and insurance. That Chlorine gadget should be let alone; use Spring Water. F. P. is going on the old Babbitt System of charging Water with Sunlight. If mamma will **not** stop eating slaughtered material give her **no** Color. I wrote enough in the past about such obstinacy. It is quite true that most cases which come to us, do so as the last resort and then expect us to perform normalation like MAGIC!!! We are not Sorcerers!

First St. Louis Missouri Studio

The Chairman being absent, the Vice-Chairman conducted the Meeting.

W. B. — Any questions or Case Reports?

R. B. — When taking a Tonation in a certain position, is it necessary to remain in that one position for the whole hour? Suppose you get a Cramp; may you turn over on the other side?

(Considerable discussion ensued. W. B. and C. S. stressed the importance of the letter R. and L. and their meaning in the Respiratory Rhythm Guide. Lying on the wrong side might disturb the Rhythm.)

A. B. — I thought we were instructed not to lie on the Left Side, as that would be hard on the Heart.

(Many Members did not agree with her.)

W. W. — I have an acquaintance who had a 22 year son who had Epilepsy. He was found dead in bed. What Color could have been used for it? I searched through our Text Books and found no information.

C. S. — It would seem to be a Nerve Condition. I suggest Yellow, a Motor Stimulant and Green, a Cleanser and Pituitary Stimulant or combine those and use Lemon. Watch the Pulse and Breathing and use Magenta on the Heart.

W. B. — Does anyone have information on this Disorder?

(O. S. read a chapter from the Chiropractic Symptomatology, which confirmed his comment that in this Disorder, the Stomach, Spleen, and Heart are involved.)

W. B. — According to that, Ultra-Green would be better.

O. S. — If there be extreme violence, Blue will have a calming effect.

F. B. — I had three Teeth pulled Tuesday and am still in Pain, especially in the back of the Neck. I used Indigo 2 hours and that did not help; I bled profusely.

(Discussion arose. Some thought Purple would be effective. It was pointed out that the Color depended on the method of Extraction. If an Injection were used, Green would be better.)

W. W. — I do not think it advisable to tonate until a few hours after. Then Lemon or Green could be used; also it should be used at the proper time.

F. B. — I did not consider it; I just used the Light as soon as I came home.

J. S. — I had good results using Lemon for my Eyes. About a year ago, I was overcome by Gas from my Refrigerator. I had Gas Poisoning. My Nose is still sensitive and there is still a slight discharge. My Eyes were Blood Shot and Lungs were affected. I used Green and Lemon and Magenta with very good results.

R. B. — I found that if one has the patience and takes the proper Food, Lemon will do the work in almost all Disorders.

W. W. — In that Gas Poisoning, as the Lungs were affected, would not Orange have been advisable?

J. S. — I did take this with good results.

A. K. — What would you suggest in this case? I picked 18 rows of Strawberries one day and spent 3 days in bed! As big as I am, I stooped all day doing the picking. I took Orange and Magenta.

Members — She took the right Colors; she should now select another position or repeat the exercise. (Laughter)

R. B. — I have a neighbor, who tried to trip me by asking what I should do with a case of Mumps. I said if there be Fever, I should give Turquoise; then, Magenta on Areas 4 and 18. After that Yellow.

A. K. — My daughter had the Mumps. I gave her Green and Magenta and Yellow to keep the Bowels open.

(Two items from the Editorial Remarks on page 94 of our Visible Spectrum Researcher about Television and from page 108 about Poliomyelitis were read; some brief discussion followed.)

A. K. — Is there anything harmful in brewing a tea from the blossoms of the Linden Tree? We have some trees in our yard and enjoy the tea made from the blossoms very much.

Members — If there be no harmful elements in the blossoms, it would be all right. It were better if the chemical composition be known. The main objection to the ordinary Tea is the Tannic Acid in the leaves.

(Discussion about the inadvisability of pulling the Hair from the Nostril took place. It was thought advisable to lubricate the Nostrils with Vaseline or V.....)

C. L. — Back in 1940, a Doctor told me not to use that V....., as it eats the Nostril Tissues and might cause Cancer.

C. S. — I like to know Dinshah's opinion on this matter. What is the value of drinking Water in which Green, Leafy Vegetables were cooked? As there is considerable Salt in these Vegetables, would it be as effective as taking Salt Water?



The position depends on what Area is to receive the Irradiation. R. and L. refer only to which Nostril starts on 4 Fingerwidths at Sunrise and is purely a guide to find the correct Breathing at any specified time. Epilepsy is a Chronic Disorder, in which there are Fits or Attacks with loss of Consciousness and with Convulsions, lasting a few minutes. Its root is mainly in the Generative Organs, hence restoring the Circulation is necessary. While we do not deprecate other Healing Systems, leaving each to its own privileges, reading from Chiropractic Symptomatology to justify about some Disorder mentioned during our Studio discussions is out of order and should not be permitted. Refer to our By-Law 57, Section 7. The methods and views of other Systems are not those of our Science, which is totally different from others, because, we have NO DIFFERENTIAL DIAGNOSIS by naming Disorders. Overexertion of one's own powers is not recommended; penalty will have to be paid under the Law of Cause and Effect. Linden Tree is a type of Basswood. Its flowers are Stimulant and Demulcent (Soothing). Drinking its Infusion is like taking a Medicine or Drug, because, it is medically used as a remedy for Catarrh of the Respiratory Passages, in Headache and in the preparation of sedative baths for irritable conditions. Pulling Hair from the Nostrils is liable to produce Inflammation. Vaseline is a Petroleum product. The best Oil for lubrication of the Body or the Nostrils is Coconut Oil or Olive Oil. That V..... has no business in our work. In cooking Vegetables, any Water in which the Vegetables are cooked, should **not** be discarded, as it picks all the soluble Salts from the edible material.

THE TRUTH ABOUT SMOKING (A Review)

X-RAYS AND ADOLPH HITLER

This is what the late Charles Lyman Loffler, a noted Medical Doctor, a Member of the American Association For Medico-Physical Research wrote in his views about Cancer and the use of X-Rays and Radium in its treatment:— "X-Ray, because of its power to destroy cancer tissue, gave hope to the physician and the patient, but the continued use proved its failure, as it also destroyed normal tissue as there was no known means to control, or means to protect normal tissue against the X-Ray destructive penetration. Furthermore, X-Rays lowered the general vitality of the patient and often that of the X-Ray operator by destroying the blood's power of resistance and of repair. It is a well known fact that many X-Ray operators have lost their lives because of its destructive forces and many records exist of those operators having developed Cancer, without a doubt due to the effects of X-Ray. Sane reasoning does not permit one to believe that an agent that will destroy normal tissues and cause Cancer would be the proper agent with which to hope to cure that disease." He speaks in the same strain that "Radium has proven as dismal a failure as X-Ray." In our Science we do not handle such dangers. Here is another proof of our opposition. While I was last in Berlin, Germany, Adolph Hitler was the Chancellor. He had among other Rules a strict penalty that any person, male or female, guilty of sexual crimes should be submitted to the power of the X-Rays on their genital areas and thus permanently rendered sterile. I well know the power of the X-Rays, being the first one in New York to speak about them in 1896.

OPEN DECLARATION FROM THE EDITOR DINSHAH P. GHADIALI

Since in June 1922, I became the Editor of a similar monthly magazine, controlled by another Corporation (now dissolved), I had complete records of all Case Reports and personal matters in my files.
