OGDEN CLAIMS GLENN PARTICLES PROVE ADAMSKI'S CLAIMS: In a "press release" recently sent to various UFO investigators, Mr. Richard Ogden claims that the tiny "firefly" particles reported by astronaut Glenn as he orbited the earth proves that contactee George Adamski's claims are true. He points out that in 1955 Adamski claims to have observed a similar phenomena from a Venusian space ship, in his book **INSIDE THE SPACESHIPS** published in that year. Ogden also "used" this press release to announce his forthcoming book, **THE CASE FOR GEORGE ADAMSKI'S CONTACTS WITH FLYING SAUCERS**, which he intends to release to congress during July, 1962.

UFO'S IN THE NEWS: The following articles are reprinted from the Weekly Research Magazine's Look-See, published by ROAP on behalf of the UFO Information Exchange Alliance.

JETS CHASE UFO OVER WOBURN: A hovering orange-colored cigar-shaped UFO was reported over Woburn, Massachusetts at 5:00 A.M. on January 20. The object was chased by a number of jets. (Look-See volume 3, number 1).

STRANGE FIBERS FROM UFO: Mr. Theodore Goff recently sighted a UFO as it shot over his farm in Chadron, Nebraska, last November. He discovered, on his property, a filmy residue left by the UFO sometime later. Other reports of this material were made by people in the vicinity of the Goff farm. The weather bureau was at a loss to explain the event. (Look-See volume 2, number 2).

GOFF OBJECT STILL UNEXPLAINED: The object sighted by Theodore Goff flying over his farm on November 8th is still unexplained. The fine residue left by the object has now entirely disappeared, despite efforts by Goff to preserve it. However, the USAF had opportunity to investigate before the material disappeared, but no reports of their findings has been released to date. Goff, in reference to the Air Force investigators, is quoted as having said, "I have a feeling that they know what it's all about and just aren't saying anything."

CIRAP REPORTS: UFO SIGHTED IN IROQUOIS FALLS: On February 7, 1962, an orange coloured UFO, round in shape, was sighted by Arnold Beaton (In Iroquois Falls, Canada). He stated that he came home from work at 12 midnight, to see a bright light near the back of his home. He stated, "I thought the garage was on fire, but when I investigated, I found a huge round 'ball' over the garage". Beaton called his wife and a nearby neighbor, and they also saw the object. After about 5 minutes the object slowly moved away to the north. Authorities could offer no plausible explanation.

BULLETIN: FEBRUARY 11, 1962: A bright UFO moving at high altitude "As if towards the moon" was sighted at Humboldt Planetarium, Caracas, Venezuela, by staff member Carlos Pineda. The astronomer had been alerted by several citizens in Parque Del Este who saw a group of UFO's flying from east to west between 4:00 and 6:00 P.M. Señor Pineda attempted unsuccessfully to follow the UFO with a telescope. "There is no doubt", he said, "that a body giving off a brilliant light was moving at a great altitude." The sighting was confirmed to the newspaper "El Universal." This sighting was later reported in NICAP's publication, "The UFO Investigator."

POLICEMEN SIGHT UFO THROUGH BINOCULARS: At 8:00 P.M. on January 7, 1962, two policemen observed an unidentified flying object as it swept through the skies of Auburn, California. Seeing the object through binoculars, officer James Stokes reported that he observed six rays of light apparently given off by the object. The policemen sighted the object after Mr. and Mrs. Harry Jenson reported having sighted the object to the sheriff's office.

IBFS REPORTS: UFO OVER HACKENSACK: At 6:55 P.M. on February 12, Jon Nove' states that he sighted an orange disc, flying from the north to the south-east, at about 5 miles per hour. The object weaved in an erratic path through a clear sky. Mr. Nove' noted that some stars were visible at the time of the sighting. The sighting occurred in Hackensack, New Jersey.

(EDITORS NOTE: Notice the number of sightings above that were of an orange colored UFO. Does this have any significance?)
