

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SOUL FORMS

The Soul of Souls feels the world of physi cal pains and pleasures through the mediumship of its physical bodies. Thus the various Soul Forms experience these during that time only in which they have personal life. Thus each Soul Form at the cessation of its bodily appearance returns in consciousness to its nature as spiritual thought form. All that is felt by the embodied soul as physical reality is felt by the soul in its forms of disembodied souls in the nature of mere thought; just as the feelings of two persons in the flesh are felt by one another, otherwise than in sympathy.

The Soul of Souls in all of its forms of sensation is rooted in the world of material manifestations. The physical form of life is the most closely defined—the most confined and limited. How, what, where, I don't know. . . And I told the Bishop that I knew what the end would be—that after the work was done which my living could do, I should be killed, and my killing would do more good than my life, and a lot more."

New Haven, Conn., Saturday.—Organized for the purpose of furthering the world-wide movement in the interest of international peace, the Cosmopolitan Club, of Yale, is one of the oldest institutions in the university. The annual meeting of the club was held a few days ago, followed by a meeting at the home of Anson Phelps Stokes, Jr., secretary of the university. At this meeting seventeen countries were represented.

In England there is an "Association for the Right Understanding of International Interests." It was founded in January, 1913, its prime movers being a group of young graduates, the membership is now over 200 and the roll is increasing weekly. Its ideal is the disarmament of all nations. The members are drawn from all classes of society and represent all nations.—The New Reformer.

A World Conference of Ministers interested in the Peace Movement has been called by The Church Peace Union for the first week in August (3d to 8th) in Switzerland, The Church Peace Union (founded by Andrew Carnegie) offers the churches five thousand dollars in prizes for the best essays on International Peace. For particulars address the Secretary of The Church Peace Union, Rev. Frederick Lynch, D. D., 70 Fifth Ave., New York City.

While presiding over a meeting of the Universal Brotherhood at Rome, Mrs. Mary Wright Sewall, honorary president of the International Council of Women, predicted that through the efforts of women a Reign of Peace would be attained.

ELECTRICAL FORCE.

OLD AGE PENSIONS FOR HORSES.

One of the progressive movements that concerns the welfare of animals is the scheme still in its infancy—for pensioning old horses.

Up to the present time, most people are in favour of painlessly destroying an old horse when his working days are over, their attitude being that, when an animal is unfit for work, continued existence is undesirable. If we accept this premise the argument is unanswerable, but I do not believe that anyone who really loves and understands animals, much less a veterinary surgeon, would accept this premise.

If we consider the old age pensioning of horses in a free and impartial spirit, we shall see that what at the first glance appears to be pure sentimentality, is, after all, only a matter of simple justice in return for all the pleasure and profit our enslavement of the horse has given us. With the commercial motor, as yet a somewhat doubtful proposition, a great part of our industry still depends upon the horse. One moment's thought is sufficient to convince us of this, as all our daily necessaries are in nearly every case brought to our door by the horse, while most of the articles by which we are surrounded have at some stage or other of their production and distribution been dependent on the labour of the horse.

Very few ever give one thought to the lives of these faithful creatures, although they play such a vital part in our existence.

Consider for one moment the life of any horse in the street—think of his long hours of labour—often ill-fed and ill-lodged at the mercy of any cruel owner. What is his life but absolute slavery, dying, as he often does, literally between the shafts. Then, when his working days are over, even the professed animal lover tells us that the knacker's bullet is a fit and proper ending to his life of slavery.—Mary R. Morrish in The Animals' Friend.
