

HOW DO SPIRITS COMMUNICATE?

Do spirits need visible substance in order to recognize and communicate with each other?

The fact that when the vital spark escapes or is dislodged from the material body, the closest scrutiny fails to show that it takes a single material atom along with it, and the still more conclusive fact that in manifestation of intelligence in and through matter—moving articles of furniture, or grouping atoms together in forms of human bodies, called "form materialization"—this intelligence makes its transits to and from the material objects, in and through which it manifests, altogether independently of matter or material conditions, at least, for aught the human senses know to the contrary, give an emphatic negative to the interrogatory.

If spirits could not maintain their individualities outside and independent of matter, or if they would de-entify and cease to be, by becoming entirely disengaged from all the human mind can cognize as matter, would not the dissolution of the material body be equivalent to the annihilation of the spirit that had been ensphered in it?

The question as to whether spirit is or is not highly attenuated matter is not involved in the consideration. Only those manifestations that are through or in ponderable matter, and in manner and method cognizable to the physical senses, come under consideration here. The conclusion is clear beyond reasonable question that the power that energizes by impartation of force the table to tip or rap, or material atoms to assemble into forms of the human body, is independent of and dominant over the material atoms so acted upon. These phenomena, then, being but signs of the real, they go no further, to say the most for them, than to prove in a general way the existence of the disembodied or unembodied intelligence.

We concede the value of such evidence of Immortality. It counts for more, far more than all the external arguments submitted from pulpits since the first one was erected. But in and of itself it will not have a spiritualizing influence. The soul must be touched

by the spiritual light of Love before the being becomes spiritualized.

In the opening of this Soul Cycle, Spirit, in all its omnipresent ramifications, gives evidence of the vivifying inpouring from above. The Dispensation of Light is universal, and all must move upward together. Most of those who composed the early settlement of this country came with ox teams; but my father had horses, and that year there was a train of ninety wagons that my father joined at Council Bluffs and traveled in company with until they reached Foster's—here they separated, and each family went their lone way looking for a home to locate on that suited their fancy.

At that time the Government allowed a man and his wife six hundred and forty acres—half of this was the wife's exclusively. My father traveled the length of the Willamette valley—which is claimed to be the Eden of this world—out into the Umpqua valley, until he came to what is now called "Deer Creek," and here he found the place he was looking for, and he selected six hundred and forty acres, and he and my mother filed on it. In about three years the County Seat was located here and the place was named "Roseburg" in honor of my father, Aaron Rose.

In a very short time after the home was made here I was born. My birth-place was under a magnificent oak tree. No one ever had a lovelier or more commodious birthplace. But, alas! my mother never looked upon me, for she passed to spirit life in a few minutes after I was ushered into this The nearest white person was fifty miles away. But Solomon, an Indian boy, about 12 years old, took charge of me, and no child ever had more tender, loving care. Solomon was my constant companion until I was about eight years old—then he, too, went to the spirit world. He was the most remarkable character I ever heard of; he was an epitome of Wisdom.

WOMAN SUFFRAGE BEFORE CONGRESS

The report of Senator Ashurst to the U. S. Senate, recommending passage of the Chamberlain resolution for a constitutional amendment extending suffrage to women, among other things, says:

"The people constitute the Government. They are its creators and its maintenance; they are the Government.

"That the granting of the elective franchise to women would add to the strength, efficiency, justice and fairness of government we have not the slightest doubt.

"It is archaic, in a free Republic, professedly made up and controlled by and administered for all the people, to deny to one-half of its citizens the right of exercising a valuable function of citizenship, thus precluding that one-half from the right and power to say what law or policy shall be its rule of conduct.

"And this anomaly becomes odious and abhorrent when we reflect that the particular half of the citizenship thus excluded is the identical one-half from which springs so much wisdom, courage, cheer, hope and good counsel."

At the Crystal Palace, London, England, Sir Edward Ward, Chairman of the Council of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, mentioned that the number of schools competing for humane prizes this year was 1728, and the essays on humane subjects written by the children numbered 292,464. The teaching of humaneness is spreading rapidly in the English schools. The growth of humanitarianism is wonderful. There is no comparison between now and thirty years ago.

Seattle.—A moving picture drama illustrating the war of 1920 between Japan and the United States, and introducing Theodore Roosevelt and Woodrow Wilson as participants, which has been extensively advertised at one of the principal theaters, was forbidden to be shown, after the local board of censors had seen the film. It is said to have represented the Japanese in an unfavorable light, and the city officials took the view that it would stir up race feeling.

What the world most needs is good, clean thinkers, not fighters.

A GREAT CASE IN COURT

The English dailies speak of the libel suit brought by Miss Lind-af-Hageby against Dr. Saleeby and the Pall Mall Gazette as one of the great cases of modern times. The libel was against her as the leader of the anti-vivisection movement, accusing her of false-hoods in her statements against the vivisectionists.

The hearing in court last sixteen days, and though the jury decided against Miss Hageby, a great victory was won for the anti-vivisection cause by the widespread interest that the press and people took in the case, entirely due to the high standard of intellectual ability displayed by Miss Lind-af-Hageby. The lady conducted her own case in court, "Daily Telegraph" of London, expatiates on "the astonishing physical task of which she acquitted herself. Taking into account her opening speech, which extended over nine hours, her concluding speech which occupied over three hours, her examination, and her cross examination, she was speaking for thirty-two hours out of the total eighty which the trial absorbed. Throughout the whole of this trying time she was dealing for the most part with highly technical and controversial matters, that demanded uncommon research and knowledge, yet she was never at a loss to meet the most difficult situation, or lacked material to turn to her defense. Her manner and her language provided a lesson in sober, graceful conduct."

The Daily News got up a public subscription to reimburse Miss Lind-af-Hageby for her outlay at the trial and in three days \$6,500 were subscribed. It is the intention of the lady to publish a full report of the trial. We take the above information from a publication, "The Anti-Vivisection Libel Action," published by The Animal Defence and Anti-Vivisection Society, 170 Piccadilly, London, W. England, G. B.

THE LIGHT WORLD WIDE

Mrs. Carrie Chapman Catt, in her presidential address at the Women's International Congress, at Buda Pest, Hungary, said:

"I was astonished at the wonderful strength and growth of the suffragist movement in countries where I did not suspect that a sentiment for it even existed. I found a distinct women's movement in every part of the world I visited, mainly seeking educational improvement, but it was surprising to learn of the large number of women, especially in the Far East, who have espoused the idea of the vote, and who look forward confidently to the time when it will be enjoyed equally by both sexes in their communities. It seemed to me as if these people were suddenly being evolved from the tallow candle age to the electric light age, without having gone through the oil lamp and gas periods. They were making for the same ideals exactly as the more enlightened women of America and Europe are contending for.

'The movement has progressed so far in China, for instance, that I had the pleasure in the Province of Canton of sitting in the assembly, a kind of state parliament, where there are nine women members. Just now the women of China are carrying on a most aggressive campaign for the national vote."

FAIR TREATMENT FOR INDIANS

We are glad to hear that President Wilson and other officials of the Government have promised to give the North American Indians fair treatment in the future.

Nancy Lane, little daughter of the Secretary of the Interior, speaking in the phonograph after President Wilson and her father had made addresses to the Indian wards of the nation, added her assurance that hereafter the red men will have fair treatment at Washington."

But the Indians will have to see the promises materialize before they will believe, for not one promise has the white man kept with the Indians.—Lucy A. Rose Mallory.

OBSESSED BY STUDYING DISEASES

"When I was attending medical college," said a New Orleans physician, "our old professor of materia medica and general practice told us one day that he had a remarkable case which he proposed to exhibit next morning in clinic. 'I have persuaded the man to allow you to examine him in the interest of science,' he said, 'and you will each make an independent diagnosis in writing.' day the patient appeared. He was a big strapping fellow, and, without any preface, he peeled off his clothes and took his place on the table. We examined him in squads, thumping his chest, listening to his lungs, feeling hs pulse, taking his temperature, and doing everything else we could think of. I soon discovered valvular disease of the heart in an advanced stage, but said nothing, according to the rule, and sat up nearly all night writing my diagnosis. When the professor took his place on the platform at lecture hour his desk was heaped high with our written reports. 'Well, gentlemen,' he said blandly, 'I find here forty-six diagnoses, each describing a different disease. I consider the variety of your discoveries very remarkable, especially'—here he paused and deliberately polished his eye-glasses—'especially, gentlemen, as there was nothing whatever the matter with the patient.' The silence that ensued was so thick you could have cut it with an ax."-New Orleans Times-Democrat.

HUMANITARIAN INTERCEDES FOR RATS

Washington.—There lives in New York a man so humane that he would not have the public health service kill plague infected rats by the method laid down by the government. The method is efficacious, but somewhat painful. The New Yorker wrote to Surgeon General Blue as follows:

"Why cause them to die in agony? Neither you nor I would care to die in that way. This is an appeal for humane treatment."

Dr. Blue declined to make public his correspondent's name, but the humanitarian was assured if an extermination process, as efficient and less painful could be found, the government would adopt it in its rat crusade.

[Many years ago we came across a lot of rats in a cellar that were almost starved and we used to take food regularly every day to them. There was one blind rat among

them and it was wonderful to see how tender they were to the blind one. They would fight to take the food from each other, but they would never take the food of the unfortunate rat, no matter how much we would give to that one, and they were very careful not to hurt it in any way, and they would show it the way where it could get water.—Lucy A. Rose Mallory.]
