

REV. THEODORE PARKER'S ANALYSIS OF THE RELIGION OF SPIRITUALISM

"This party has an idea wider and deeper than that of the Catholic or Protestant; namely, that God still inspires men as much as ever; that he is imminent in spirit as in space. For the present purpose, and to avoid circumlocution, this doctrine may be called Spiritualism.

This relies on no church tradition, or scripture, as the last ground and infallible rule. It counts these things teachers, if they teach not masters; helps, if they help us—not authorities. It relies on the Divine Presence in the soul of men—the eternal word of God, which is Truth, as it speaks through the faculties he has given.

It believes God is near the soul as matter to the sense; thinks the canon of revelation not yet closed, nor God exhausted. It sees him in Nature's perfect work: hears Him in all true Scripture, Jewish or Phoenician; feels Him in the inspiration of the heart; stoops at the same fountain with Moses and Jesus, and is filled with living water. It calls God, Father, not King; Christ, brother, not redeemer; Heaven, home; Religion, Nature!

It loves and Trusts, but does not fear. It sees in Jesus a man, living man-like; highly gifted and living with blameless and beautiful fidelity to God—stepping thousands of years before the race of men—the profoundest religious genius that God has raised up; whose words and works help us to form and develop the native idea of a complete religious man. But he lived for himself, died for himself, worked out his own salvation, and we must do the same; for one man cannot live for another, more than he can eat or sleep for him.

It lays down no creed, asks no symbol. reverences exclusively no time nor place, and therefore can use all time and every place. It reckons forms useful to such as they help. FOLLOW THE GOOD EXAMPLE.

The following bill was introduced into the Florida legislature by Hon. A. M. Wilson, and is known as House Bill No. 710:

"A bill to be entitled an act to provide for the inspection of all private or public hospitals, reformatory homes, houses of detention, convents, asylums, houses of Good Shepherds, sectarian seminaries, schools or institutions, by the commissioners of the county in which such institutions are situated, by the grand jury thereof, or by any person or persons appointed by a judge of a court of record, upon a petition signed by twenty citizens of said county."

[Every State Legislature in the Union should enact into law a bill similar to the above. No institution that is carried on honestly and properly can object to it.—Lucy A. Rose Mallory.]

The most remarkable thing about the women in the suffrage states where they hold official positions that as jurors, judges, mayors, etc., they nearly all fill their positions to the entire satisfaction of the male officials over them, and in many cases better than men in similar positions. They are proving that women not only know enough to vote but without any great experience to judge wisely and govern well.

(Special to the World) PRISON REFORM.

Washington, Aug. 9.—What prison schools are doing for men and women who have been placed behind bars for offenses against society is told in a bulletin issued by the Federal Bureau of Education. In this bulletin A. C. Hill of the New York State Education Department is quoted as follows:

"The lockstep has been abolished; cropping the hair is no longer practiced; stripes have been discarded; contract labor has largely ceased; the parole system has been inaugurated. Schools in prisons are the expression of the highest conception, yet formed of the proper way to deal with men and women segregated from society for violating its laws. They are an outgrowth of the belief that the door of hope must never be closed to any human being, and of the conviction that the reformation of even the most degraded and vicious is still possible. They stand for opportunity."

The bulletin gives statistics gathered from fifty-five prisons for adults in the United States and Canada. It shows that there are forty-four schools in as many prisons, eleven of them open twelve months in the year.

"It has been found," the bulletin continues, "that prison bars and stripes, foul air and poor food are not deterrent in their effect. Since these have proven largely failures, the effects of education are now tried. The prison schools indicate a popular notion that intelligence has in itself an inhibitory influence upon impulses of crime, and that mental capacity, rightly directed, is a powerful incentive to reform."

PONDER ON THIS.

In these days when the members of the American Medical Association are demanding a monopoly of healing the sick, and are prosecuting Christian Scientists for malpractice, it might be well to ponder on this:

"William Cornell staggered into Bellevue Hospital August 8 in an almost unconscious condition. He was treated for ten days for 'aphasia,' and then died. The Coroner's physician who performed an autopsy found that there was a fracture of the skull across the man's entire head. This could easily be detected through the scalp.

"Yet the man had been treated for aphasia for ten days and the man is dead of a fracture of the skull. Now, are we going to have the responsibility fixed? This is a public institution. Who is to blame? Who diagnosed this case, and how many other injured persons are likely to come under his intelligent observation?"—From the Sunday N. Y. Herald, Aug. 24, 1913.

Tacoma, Wash., Sept. 2.—(Special.)—Temporarily paralyzed in the lower limbs to an extent that prevents him from standing, Dr. Charles McCreery, well-known physician, is confined to his bed as a result of accidentally inoculating himself with the pasteur emulsion used in treatment of rabies. He was preparing a treatment for two children several weeks ago, when he pricked himself with the needle containing the emulsion.

[This doctor thought that he was going to benefit humanity, and by this "accident" he will no doubt learn that there is a better way.—Lucy A. Rose Mallory.]

ADVOCATES VOCATIONAL SCHOOL.

Chicago, Ill.—Miss Jane Addams, head resident of Hull House, last night advocated before the annual conference of the Western Economic society, vocational and industrial training as a means of safeguarding young girls in the city and breaking up "boy gangs" that are the training schools for criminals.

Miss Addams expressed surprise at teachers losing sight of boys and girls as soon as they leave school, and added:

"At the age of 14, any boy or girl who can read and write English may be turned on the world and left to shift for himself, according to the laws of the State of Illinois. Under these conditions the fate of a defective girl is too horrifying to describe even before such an organization as this. The boys fall into gangs and are allowed to cultivate any criminal ways that may tempt them.

"The vocational school would curb these tendencies, give the boy or girl something to look forward to and turn him out prepared to cope with the world as an efficient worker.

The Norwegian women have been granted, full suffrage.

THE TRUTH ABOUT INDIANS.

Portland, Aug. 3.—(To the Editor.)—In The Oregonian a few days ago I saw in large display type the following: "Indian Dances Forbidden—Medicine Men Said to Have Too Much Influence Over Chippewas—L. F. Michel, U. S. Inspector for the Indian Office at Washington, D. C., Has So Decided."

Any man who has made a study of Indians and their religion, together with their ways of life and their social customs, who would permit such an order as that to go unchallenged, should, at least, be severely censured. A man who would make an order of that nature, is not qualified to hold the office of Indian Inspector.

He informs the public that it is a custom of these Indians to give away practically everything they have to their medicine men. In proportion to the population, the Indians have one Indian doctor, where white men have ten. The compensation that is paid to the Indian doctors is not equal to the amount paid to any one of our white doctors. The Indian doctor makes no charge for his services. He accepts anything that the friends of the sick Indian think best to give him.

Mr. Mitchel informs us that the Indians are really impoverished by giving everything they have to their medicine men. Such a statement as that is not worthy of consideration. He also says that the Indian doctors exert such an influence over the Indians that they will not go to the agency physician, even when they are seriously ill. I often attend meetings at the Christian Science Church, where I hear statements of that same nature. Why doesn't the Indian Office issue orders like it did many years ago? I was ordered to stop the rations of the Indians if they would not attend the white man's church. But, thanks to Carl Schurz, Secretary of the Interior, the order was countermanded.

I would most respectfully ask permission to refute statements that are calculated to prejudice the public against our native Americans.

First, it has been a custom among the native Americans from time immemorial, to have an annual gathering of their tribes or clans, which occurs every year in the seventh full moon. That gathering is, in a way, like unto our Christmas gatherings. The men and women, yes, and even the children, prepare presents for months ahead that they wish to give to their friends. Just the same spirit is manifested that we show at the Christmas tide.

They go loaded with presents to these annual gatherings, and they return home in the same way. The greatest delight that an Indian has is to give and receive presents. In that way he manifests that spirit of love that pervades in their hearts. It is not right to give out such a statement, that everything is given to the medicine men. They give to them in times of sickness, the same as we are supposed to pay our doctor bills.

One word in regard to the health of the Indians. I will admit that many are dying of tubercular trouble and syphilis, but I can say that they never knew such diseases until white men came among them. When white people get sick they adopt the ways of the Indian to affect a permanent cure. We go to the sea shore and the mountains, remove our surplus clothing, eat and sleep like an Indian. use nature's remedies and we are strong again. I would rather see a man with a clean mind that a clean shirt. The Indian had no word in his language, before the advent of the white men, that he could use to curse the Supreme Being (Great Spirit). He knew nothing of intoxicating drink until white men introduced it in their country. Their wives and daughters were pure and virtuous; were as little children, happy and they simple in their ways. Their religion was the same as the Essennes of 2000 years ago: Mine is thine and thine is mine-they held everything in common."

Agency physicians are oftentimes young men right out of our colleges who take the place to get practice. At one time in the '70s my agency physician reports to me that smallpox had broken out at our agency. He wanted some vaccine to vaccinate all the Indians on the reservation. As I had some 8000 Indians there, and they positively refused to let the white doctor put any of the white man's poison into their blood, I thought best to consult with one of their doctors. He informed me that it was a false report; that it was what they called the scabby-horse disease; that when Spring came and his people could get fresh roots to make tea of, and fresh pumblosh they all would get well. Experience later on proved that he was right.

The change that the native Americans are passing through, trying to adopt the ways of the white man, is killing them off very fast. I urge upon the readers of our newspapers and magazines, do not allow reports of that nature to prejudice you against the native American. CICERO NEWELL,

Mrs. Stoner insists that her daughter is no genius, "Just an ordinary healthy child," she must really have been a fairly bright baby to speak distinctly when six months old and recite Tennyson's Crossing the Bar, and that with feeling and emotion, at the mature age of one year.

Before she could read she had learned more from pictures that most children absorb from text-books in primary schools; and in playing with her dolls—more than 100 there were, all properly costumed—she gained a first vivid knowledge of Bible lore, mythology, ancient history and the characters of Shakespeare's plays. They introduced her to the typewriter when she was three. She was fascinated by this new toy, and in playing with it not only easily learned to spell, but also made advances in the field of classic literature by copying various selections in prose and verse.

Through her typewriter keyboard she also learned Esperanto and won a gold medal for a poem in that international language. At five she published her first book a translation of Mother Goose into Esperanto—and at six issued her first volume of original verse. Her later and better verses are to be collected and published under the title "The Little Folks' Book of Verse."

KEITH PUTS STOP TO CHEAP JOKE.

B. F. Keith has issued peremptory orders to the managers of his two score theatres throughout the United States to suppress all ridicule of the woman suffrage movement.

Mr. Keith has become a zealous believer in votes for women, and in his order to his managers points out that it is time to put an end to the disrespect habitually paid women by American comedians. As President of the United Booking Officers, Mr. Keith will use his influence to secure the co-operation of vaudeville managers throughout the country.

VIGOROUS HEALTH UNDER ARCTIC

CONDITIONS

Our Swedish namesake The Vegetarian gives in its last number the following interesting letter from a conscript:

"I never liked meat, and of late years I have totally abstained from it, living on a quite simple Vegetarian diet. From 5th September, 1911, to 3rd April, 1912, I served my time in the army at Boden (a fortress on the Finnish frontier about fifty miles south of the Arctic Circle) as a ski-runner. (In the winter skis afford practically the only means of getting about on the hard, frozen snow.) I lived on such Vegetarian food as the government provided. When one of the captains learned this he said, 'Well, this will be an interesting experiment," and so it proved. Sometimes I had to content myself with potatoes and bread, but not very often; and then, when I got a better meal, it made up for the more scanty one. I cannot say that I was starving; almost every day we had a sweet fruit soup (a common Swedish dish), barley soup or something similar; but the best thing of all was the coarse homemade bread (rye whole-meal).

"One day all my comrades got poisoned by meat off a cow-skeleton. They all suffered from diarrhoea, and congratulated me, saying that after all it might not be so bad to be a 'grass-eater.'

"The officers always arranged that I got the hard work that was going, and I managed first-rate. On one occasion when all but four out of forty had to give up, exharsted, I was one of the four exceptions. The cold was very severe. During a whole week the temperature varied from 50.8 degrees to 54.4 degrees below zero (Fahrenheit), but I felt it no more than the others. --rather less."—The (London) Vegetarian.

CLEANING HOUSE.

Mrs. Florence Howe Hall, daughter of Julia Ward Howe, speaking in New York recently, asked the question:

"How many men on the street know that women vote in New Jersey? Well, they do. I do. This is what happens: I live in a small New Jersey town, where the women have the school franchise. We had to go to the schoolhouse to vote. Now, on most election days the schoolhouse was so disordered by the men that there could be no school the next day. It took the janitor all day to clean the floors and clear out the ink wells.

"Since the women became interested in politics and went to vote there has been school the next day in a sweet, clean room, and the polling place is just as decent as the church. And yet they say the polls aren't fit for women!"

Political housecleaning follows the advent of women with ballots in one hand and brooms, if needed, in the other—F. M. A., in The Woman's Journal.

AS THE JAPANESE SEE US.

Dr. Wm. H. Watson gives the following article, translated from one of the leading Tokio papers, in the Progressive Thinker of August 23: "We are grieved at the selfishness of America in excluding the Japanese, who are not of the Mongolian race. Calmly speaking. America is composed of immigrants, dating from the time of Washington. From farmers they have become speculators, exploiting the labor of others. We are moral, as we take care of our women, who never become outcasts. Most of us are Buddhistsmeaning Vegetarians-and believing there are many gods (spirits) ruling us. Latitude only has made us small, but more healthy than the Caucasians, who are big meat eaters and unhealthy.
